"BACK ON" TOP

MTV at the Movies

MTV and Geffen Pictures will jointly develop the award-winning MTV live-action animated short, "Joe's Apartment," into a feature-length motion picture, to be distributed by Warner Bros. The agreement marks MTV's first venture into theatrical filmmaking.


The short, written and directed by **John Payson** is about a young man's efforts to cope with a big-city apartment infested by talking cockroaches which take over his life. It has won an Ace award and a Houston World Festival Award, among other honors.

MTV will supervise development of the script, to be written by Payson and will executive produce the feature, with funding provided by Geffen and Warner Bros.

In an effort to assure an alarmed public, the channel announced that Kennedy would not appear in the film.

Commented MTV Chairman/CEO Tom Freston: "It's only fitting a cockroach movie should mark our entry into the film business."

Gold Rush

More good news for the music biz.

The RIAA's latest announcement of gold and platinum album awards for the first six months shows a marked increase from last year's totals, indicating the record industry is in fine health.

Gold albums were up to 104 from 82 last year while gold single certifications remained steady at 37. Platinum albums rose from 66 to 72, while million-selling singles leaped from 15 to 28, mainly boosted by the 19 certifications this January of mostly catalog items. Multiplatinum albums fell by one unit to 66 from '92's total while multi-platinum singles mushroomed from two last year to 18 this year, again largely due to back catalog.

And if that ain't enough to make you do backflips, the RIAA busted three more flea markets outside Lincoln, Nebraska. The industry is saved.

Finally, we'd like to take this opportunity to thank Bruce

Haring of Daily Variety for yet another fine, concisely written story that we were able to lift and rewrite so we wouldn't have to deal with the incredibly boring press release issued by the RIAA, where Jason Berman is excited and the sheep are nervous.

The Real Last Action Hero?

Avant-garde performance artist cum punk rocker GG Allin died last week (28) on New York's Lower East Side of an alleged drug overdose. The 36-year-old performer, whose real name was Kevin Michael Allin, was known for his on-stage confrontational antics, which included throwing feces at his audience and jumping through glass doors.

The night of his death, Allin had played with his band, the Murder Junkies, at local club the Gas Station, where his set was cut short after two songs when he threw himself through a drum set and had the sound turned off by technicians.

"He truly believed he was the rock and roll messiah," said his brother Merle, who played bass in the band. "He was by far the most outrageous performer who ever hit the stage."

Allin, subject of the filmed documentary, "Hated: GG Allin and the Murder Junkies," which plays weekly at N.Y.'s Anthology Film Archives, was arrested 52 times for his various onstage activities. Raised in Lancaster, NH, Allin recorded 18 albums with different bands, including the Jabbers and the AIDS Brigade. His latest record, the aptly named "Bloodshed and Brutality For All," comes out in September.



or the first time in a quarter century, Steve Miller has released an album that's not on Gapitol. In the frenzy to sign bands during the San Francisco Sound pinnacle in the mid-'60s, Miller held out for complete artistic control and won. He

the electric guitar while swaying an audience from I-Bone Walker, the man who developed the style. Stevie "Guitar" Miller paid his dues by backing Buddy Guy in Chicago when he was still in his teens. He gave Boz Scaggs his start in the business. And only the Grateful Dead sell more concert tickets regularly — even without an album to promote. He's been known as the Space Cowboy, the Gangster of Love, and some people just call him Maurice. Miller's two greatest hits compilations have gone platinum more times than Madonna's 'do and he's just set out on his annual summer sojourn to pound out the classics as well as selected cuts from "Wide River," his first all-new CD in nearly five years on new label Sailor/PLG. Steve took some time out from his busy schedule to waste an hour with HITS' resident acid casualty, "If I Only Had A" Brian Griffith.

Did you have to shop this project around very much?

My contract with Capitol expired in 1988 when I gave them "Born 2B Blue" and I didn't really want to re-sign, so I left things the way they were. A couple of years ago, I decided I wanted to make a new deal, make some new records, go out and tour

and go back to work steadily. I did some exploratory work with a couple of labels and found they were totally out of the picture. The stuff they were offering was so low and so silly, I had no interest. I started developing a relationship with some of the folks at PolyGram, and they came to see me play a couple of times. When I finished some music, I had playback parties at my studio for a couple of different companies, where I invited some executives in with their staff and played them the record. We created a little bit of a bidding war, which was healthy for me, but I got everything I wanted from PolyGram. No money actually changed hands... it was a real winwin situation for the company and me as well.

promotion of this record?This will be the biggest and most professional promotion the Steve Miller Band has ever had. Without a doubt.

You've always been a huge draw on the road, even without a record to promote. I'm lucky...

Can you get those ticket buyers into the record stores?

I think they both feed on each other. It's always much stronger to tour to support a record, as opposed to just touring. I've toured every summer since '88.

example, they're told about the new album right then and there. We're selling the record through the same services as the tickets... Ticketmaster, Ticketron, etc. About 80% of our tickets are bought that way. This is one of the ways PolyGram is going to sell "Wide River." We're playing in 50 cities this summer, so those folks, when they call for tickets, can buy the record as well, right over the phone. We're trying a lot of innovative approaches like this, and we'll see what's gonna happen.

You're a lover of the blues, starting your career playing that kind of music. What is it about the idiom that keeps it alive generation after generation?

I was mesmerized by the blues immediately as a kid.

years later, everyone was saying he saved the blues and it's true.

First blues player I ever heard was Les Paul. All that echo and reverb, that great-sounding guitar, and all those vocals, that pretty much is what the Steve Miller Band is, right? When I was nine, T-Bone Walker came over to the house to play. He showed up in a flesh-colored Cadillac convertible with leopard-skin seats. He had a great piano player with him, a string bass player, a little amp. They played from six that night 'til five the next morning. He became great friends with my dad, and came over a lot. I'm working on my box-set right now and I have tapes of him from 1951. He showed me how to play guitar behind my head and do the splits. He captured

my funny bone, my imagination, and he also implanted this melodic sense. I play a lot like T-Bone. I also found a tape from when I was about five and on it, Les Paul says, "You know, Stevie, if you practice, you could be a good guitar player one day."

Your first album came out 25 years ago. What do you remember about 1968?

Those were some really amazing times... the politics, civil rights, Dr. King. The country was in chaos. San Francisco was really happening; people from all over the world were coming to see the hippies. There was a lot of street theater. Emmett Grogan and the Diggers. Then came a lot of hucksterism, a lot of bullshit. After that Scott MacKenzie song, 200,000 kids moved into the Haight from Omaha, and it began to look like Calcutta.

Where did you fit in with everything that went on?

I came out in '66. My first night in town, I went to the Fillmore and saw Paul Butterfield and the Airplane, I sat in with Butterfield for a couple of songs, then introduced myself to Bill Graham. Everybody said that I just had to move out to the Bay Area. I think I even announced from the stage that night, "We're coming!" I put a band together, played at the Matrix, then the Avalon Ballroom right away. After a few shows at the Avalon, we went right to the Fillmore. We played all the time... free gigs in the park, the music festival, and before we knew it, we had 14 record companies offering us contracts. The music was spreading, so I went to London to make my first record. I ran into the folks around the Stones, recorded with Paul McCartney and saw the whole psychedelic scene from the other side of the ocean.

When did you leave the Bay Area?

About 1976, I bought a farm in Oregon. I had it for ten years, then moved up to Seattle and lived there for five, six years.

Do you find it somewhat ironic the music that's coming out of there now?

There was always a great music scene happening up there. Robert Cray used to play around Seattle all the time. These guys today, they grew into talents.

Do you listen to a lot of the new stuff?

I really like Pearl Jam... I think they're great. I try to keep up on new stuff, to see what everybody's doin'... I listen to a lot of blues, a lot of jazz, lately, a lot of Nat King Cole... I love the way he sings. I've been listening to Lenny Kravitz, Robert Plant, Paul Rodgers. Everyone keeps bringing me the Spin Doctors and telling me they're ripping me off.

Do you think they are?

Naw, I feel ripped off when somebody samples my stuff and builds a song around it. It's happened maybe 50, 60 times. We had a lot of problems with the Geto Boys, but we finally straightened that out, then everyone else fell in line. In one sense, it feels great that people are listening to what you've done and like it enough to steal it, but you have to explain to them, if you build a song on my sample, it's my song. I'm not gonna stop them from doing that, but I am going to make them give me the publishing. They are going to have to pay for my performance. Heavy D's single was "Fly Like An Eagle," Vanilla Ice had one... now there's a great talent. In the hiphop world, all I have to do is sing the "do-do-do-do" [from "Eagle"] and everyone knows who it is. And I make 'em pay heavy.

You recorded "Wide River" at your new studio up in Idaho.

It's a wonderful working tool, the studio. The equipment is great; it's as good as they get. I have to

do a lot of homework to stay up on all the new studio software and stuff.

Your records are all pretty warm-sounding, as opposed to some of the techno-stuff that comes out these days.

I learned something when I was mixing this record. This album was all digitally recorded, and I mixed it into a computer. When you do an analog recording, you try to saturate the tape with as much as you can. Right up to the edge of distortion. The computer is set to take everything to its highest level automatically. It just smacked you so hard, but I found an icon that allowed me to adjust the input of each track. I listened to the mix on headphones. As I

routine in the Blues Brothers was Curtis' routine. Curtis did all those dances... he's a dancing fool.

Curtis toured with you last summer and this year, it's Paul Rodgers. You played on his album... how'd you like it?

It was a great record until they mixed it. I was absolutely livid when I heard the mix they made of my song. I got a slave master which had a huge fuzztone guitar, an English bombastic approach. It had a harmonica on it, too. There wasn't an inch of space in the song for anything, so I took it out. I wanted to show them what I would do with it. We did this really nice track for them and I sent them a mix. When I heard the record, they had mixed my



backed some of the stuff off, I didn't lose any volume, and it got warmer and clearer. I always strive for quality in my work... that's part of the fun.

You mentioned that you once lived in Oregon, and I noticed that some of the Salgado Bros. Band plays on the record. Did you meet them up in Eugene?

No, actually, I ran into them in Idaho. I was driving into town and heard this cool song on the radio. They announced the band would be at a club that night. I told my wife we should check it out. At the break, I introduced myself, got right up onstage, started playin' with 'em and haven't stopped. Curtis [Salgado] is one of those guys I love to play with. We don't even have to look at each other, man; it's just there. Belushi's

guitar part with this other guy's, the harmonica was just blowing all the time and there was no depth. I called up the record guy; I didn't talk to Paul. I told him it was awful; what they did was terrible. I don't know how the other guys felt, but I spent a lot of time on the track. I sent them a great piece of music... why treat it like that?

The idea was sincere.

Oh, man. Artistically, Paul Rodgers is one of the best blues singers there is, really and truly. I can't wait to jam with him on the road. The record was just the business; the guys runnin' it fucked it up. I told 'em, you couldn't buy this for a million dollars. Look at the guys who agreed to be on the record just because of Paul's reputation and ability to sing.

The perception in the biz is that "Connected" is doing much better than "Supernatural." Are you guys living large?

ROB B: We're busier. We've been doing interviews at better radio stations than usual. At some of these stations, the people just can't calm down.

Yeah, some of those DJ's are pretty hyper. They all go, "H!!!!" NICK: And we're like [in monotone], "Hi." I hear your music at parties and on the street a lot more now.

NICK: I think a lot of people know us now, and hopefully we'll have an audience that's into it. It would be nice to do well over here, but the most important thing is that we feel good about what we're doing.

Does marketing you as an alternative group negate the real funk foundation you have?

NICK: It might be different here in America, but to me, alternative music means any music that's very difficult to be formatted. Take the urban stations. You could just make any old fucking New Jack swing record and it would get played on those stations, but who gives a shit and what does it mean? You're just making a good record. But it's difficult for us to get

airplay on those stations because they're not really adventurous. I don't think any of the radio stations in America are adventurous. Even the alternative ones. It's been hard getting our records on all different stations and the fact that we have is good. Hopefully, it'll make it easier for some other people who've got a record that doesn't fit into all those categories to get played.

Even though you don't have much acceptance in the hard-core rap community, you still acknowledge your rap roots.

NICK: Yeah sure. If those people took the time and were open-minded enough to get into our music, they would like it. Y'know, things are pretty basic out there and everybody has their little slots and that's life. You've got to be realistic. There's no point in trying to push ourselves into an area where it's gonna be like bashing your head against a fucking wall.

ROB: We're just putting our records out to whoever wants to check it out. It would be stupid for us to start coming on like, "Oh yeah, we're rap," because we're not that kind of group. Our roots are in rap music and I'm proud of where we come from. As far as I'm concerned, our music's essence hasn't changed since we

started. Yeah, sure, the music's evolved and our sound's evolved, but it's still the same thing.

NICK: With "Connected," we've just developed what we're doing, it's as simple as that. It's less easy to spot the influences now. This is a more streamlined record and things are more integrated. And by integrating everything, we've brought something out of ourselves.

It's real cool and refreshing to see women on-stage in any form of rap or R&B, especially when they are true participants, the way the women in your group are.

NICK: We could never do something where we get three girls to stand there and just dance or something. That's bullshit. A real cheap shot. We're not about just doing things to sell records. We are about doing things we want to do. Which will make what we do better for ourselves.

Have you started getting the prerequisite backlash from the U.K. press now that you're big over here?

ROB: Some little digs, but nothing

najor yet.

NICK: They just like doing that, don't they? As soon as you become successful, they start looking for dirty things you've done in your past. That's how it is in England. On the other hand, we have had a lot of support, so I don't want to slag them off or anything. But you just get sick talking about yourself all the fucking time. There are more important things in the world, aren't there? That's why we just make our records and put them out there.





AN EXCLUSIVE HITS RADIO DIALOGUE WITH CAT THOMAS, PD WZYP HUNTSVILLE, AL

Cat's MEOW

ood ole boy Cat
Thomas has toiled
at WCOG in Greensboro and G105 in Raleigh before seguing to K92 in Roanoke as Asst. PD/MD. After that, he was MD/Nights and then PD at Power 108 WPHR (now WENZ) Cleveland. After a few down books, WZYP in Huntsville, AL brought Cat in as PD/Morning Personality, and he's now got the station on the rebound. Cat Thomas gives the lowdown to ex-colleague, HITS' "Downtown" Ed Brown, with whom he spent three long years at Power 108 until the two were run out of town.

Tell me about the staff you've assembled at WZYP.

My APD/Midday personality is Nikki Nite. She's verv talented on the air, and I think she's gonna be a major market PD somewhere, someday. In afternoons is Sky Phillips, whom I worked with at K92. He went on to work in Pittsburgh, St. Louis and Baltimore and was here when I got here, for which I'm glad -he does a terrific job. We just hired Wally B from WENZ for the night shift. Give this guy some time and he's gonna be in the big-time soon. Overnights is Robert "Rock & Roll" Johnson, who's been here for years and is the quintessential overnight jock. Bill and Mary Dunnavant run the place. Bill is the GM and Mary takes care of the money. Bill is a broadcaster and the station has been in his family since the late '40s. It's really nice to work in that kind of environment.

We've worked on some amazing promotions together in Cleveland. What are you up to these days?

Were tailoring the promotions for this market, but the essence of the two stations are similar. The same principles that I applied to promotions in Cleveland, I'd apply in Roanoke, L.A., N.Y. or anywhere. It's a Barnum & Bailey "dazzle 'em" type of thing... not where ya gotta listen to the radio endlessly just to win \$100. I've always liked to do promotions with flair. Recently, we raised over \$12,000 for the St. Jude's Children's Hospital through a "Celebrity Memorabilia Auction."

As far as music goes, what's working for your station these days?

[Laughs.] Ballads... nothing but ballads. There's no real single type of music that works for WZYP. What's not working are things that are of one extreme or another. What we look for are mainstream Top 40 hits. That's what this audience has always expected and that's what we're gonna get back to giving them — just the hits. And it appears to be working. In the first phase of the spring book, we've gone 9.3-11.0 12+ and we're up to a 15.6 18-34.

Who are a few of your core artists?

Whitney Houston, R.E.M., Michael Bolton, Janet Jackson, Bryan Adams and Phil Collins. But we play a great many new acts as well. Not that we go out seeking new bands; we seek out hits and if they're by a new artist, so much the better. I've even had record guys come in and play new songs on the air before they're released. The reps have a good sense of humor, and it lends a "product knowledge" that listeners like to have with their station. To the average listener, a promo rep is someone who's connected to the stars. It's a big deal to them.

What do you see in the future for Top 40?

Well, in order for the format to survive, it has to be what it was in its heyday — mainstream. Not this niche or that niche. Unless you're in a big market, it's tough to have success programming that way. Stations should be playing the biggest hits of the Top 40 spectrum. The ones the majority of listeners want to hear.

Any pet peeves?

Formerly fantastic PDs, who didn't make the move to GM, opting to form consultancies instead. I understand wanting to own and run a business your

own way, but until programming people start learning about sales and how to be a GM, radio is always gonna be run by the sales department. Why don't some of these smart guys become GMs and change some of the things they always gripe about?

Turn it around now... anything in your radio past that you'll always laugh about?

I used to come on the air at G105 at midnight. Chuckie "Boo Boo" Baron did 7-12. I lived in Greensboro, the station was in downtown Durham — a 60-minute drive. I'd start out early enough to give myself some flexibility. Chuck's last two songs were always "Stairway To Heaven" and "Free Bird" live. You know what that meant?

A bad half-hour of radio?

It meant, when I heard "Free Bird," that he had left the building! He was gone! And I'm thinking, "Oh my God, I've gotta hurry before the record ends." There were many times the song would be trailing off as I entered the studio and he was gone — never saw the man. [Laughs.] And he'd never cue up the first record for me either!

Any changes you've gone through since coming back to programming?

I don't worry about ratings as much as I used to. It's any GM's prerogative to fire a programmer over ratings — just the same as a baseball manager gets fired over a losing streak. It's either gonna be a good or bad book, right? What I'm going to do is put on a great-sounding station and if it's what the listeners want, they'll come. If it doesn't work, it won't be because I didn't try hard enough.



On the new album, there's a story order to the songs. Is this a concept album?

STEVEN DRAKE: Oddly, this was never meant to be a concept album. We just came up with that silly idea while we were sequencing songs.

CRAIG NORTHEY: If anything, the songs just fell into place. There are a great many happy accidents on the album... that's what it's all about. You get inspired and move to places you didn't expect or plan.

That's what seems to happen with the

STEVEN: There's always an internal battle for complete spontaneity and some kind of structure to hold it together. Spontaneity is great until it falls flat and then you're just spontaneously boring.

CRAIG: We've always carefully wrote songs. They may have come from the shambles of inspiration, but we made them right before we recorded them. We never gave ourselves as much space as we do now. That's some of the rewards of playing together... cutting each other more slack, discovering, seeing what happens, letting it grow.

You did some touring with the Gin Blossoms recently. Do you find more audiences knowing your songs?

CRAIG: It's fun to look out there in

some remote place and see people mouthing the words and you wonder if they're just good lip-readers.

STEVEN: I like it when you go to a town you've never been to before, look out and see pretty girls singing, "I was fucking Wendy under the stars, the night that Elvis died" and you're thinking, "You were probably like three when that happened."

The '70s riffing that sometimes gets tossed out between songs is fun -Zeppelin, Skynyrd, "Rock'n'Roll Hoochie Coo"...

STEVEN: All those riffs are classic because they're great.

CRAIG: You can ride them.... they're really physical things. It announces, "I am loud, I am dumb, I am great...'

STEVEN: There was a period in Canada when every single bar band played Kansas' "Carry On Wayward Son." It's just one of the most monstrous dinosaur arrangements, with a hundred little parts going on at once and everybody covered it exactly or tried to, so it became this thing of "How well can they play 'Carry On Wayward Son'? What kind of musicians are they?"

What if a beer company approached

you to use "Heterosexual Man" in a commercial?

CRAIG: It certainly would be an evolutionary step back for humanity. Beer commercials are about the most sexist, most horrible things that you've ever seen and that would be even a more Neanderthal interpretation. I hope they realize they'd be poking fun at themselves if they did.

STEVEN: In Canada, people know it's a joke. People in the U.S. don't know as quickly; it takes a moment for them to figure it out.

CRAIG: Maybe it's just that veiled Canadian humor, like SCTV or "Kids in the Hall." A lot of the humor goes to a place where I'll be laughing, but feeling uncomfortable about it at the same time... STEVEN: Suddenly, the social climate is such that it somehow offends people hearing the word "heterosexual" - like saying "I like girls" is on the edge of sexist. It never even says in the lyrics that the person in the song actually scores. He wants to. Women all know men think like that constantly and men oftentimes just don't want to admit it. People are going to measure up where we're coming from in the video.

Where you're all in drag.

CRAIG: And you have a fake plastic chest like Ricardo Montalban in the "Star Trek" movies.

STEVEN: If that was the video, then we'd have our heads up our asses. But I hope people can figure out our song is a joke. And in case you don't know, it is... a joke.

"Yes means it hard to say no" hooks with the title before you even hear it.

CRAIG: It's a twangy universal sentiment that turned on its face and landed there. That's why this ended up being a concept album. I thought it would be a country song, then it took on other qualities. There's no set form when we write songs. Everybody has a role... it's a symbiotic relationship.



Verve, "A Storm In Heaven" (Vernon Yard): On their second American release, these ambitious Brits soar confidently through their kaleidoscopic soundscape, alternating between alarming corner-of-the-eye revelation and total aural dissolution. Awash in the chilling echo of shimmering guitars and

slippery feedback, "A Storm In Heaven" resonates moments of such unnerving sensuality that it seems as though the music passes directly into the listener's nerve endings. Richard Ashcroft's vocals are positively tingle-worthy.

Moonshake, "Eva Luna" (Matador/Atlantic): There's nothing safe or comfortable about Moonshake. Each song on the album sounds so wholly distinct in composition from its siblings that each demands to be regarded as an entirely individual entity, unbound by any concept of thematic repetition, a



veritable tossed salad of sonic deception and hallucination. This UK band addresses topics like urban decay, pregnancy and serial killers with a backdrop of guitar ballast, thumping rhythms and jarring samples. Bold, atmospheric brilliance.



David Gray, "A Century Ends" (Caroline): With a voice as powerful and affecting as Van Morrison's and a gift for weaving captivating verse the size of Paul Kelly's, David Gray's gentle and elegant album of little slices of life in living color makes for one of the most surprising and rewarding lis-

tening experiences of the year. Gray's warmth and lack of pretention provide his explorations on the essence of romance and other mystifying relationships with an accessibility that is as rare and treasured as the profundity of his insights.

Dwight Twilley Band, "The Great Lost Twilley Album" (Shelter/DCC Compact Classics): Maybe it was indecision caused by the pressure to follow up "I'm On Fire," their out-of-nowhere 1975 debut hit, but it's hard to fathom why Shelter didn't release these 25 transcendent songs when they were



recorded. Label hassles and internal band problems conspired to prevent Twilley and Phil Seymour from building the audience they deserved, leaving them stranded somewhere between Big Star's cult credibility and the Beatles' world domination. This is the great lost pop band of the 70's. (Jim Barber)





Over the past few months, PGD has made no secret of the fact that they would not enact a policy against used CDs. Then came the now-infamous "Curt Eddy Memo," which stated that PGD, far from being passive onlookers, were going to take full advantage of the situation and try to fill the void left by the four major distributors that had stopped advertising with most independent stores. True to their word, they are doing just that. They have recently reduced the "minimum order" from 120 pieces to 60 (a more than negligible perk to most independent stores) and are also now relaxing the current return policies for opened product. CEMA's latest policy against used CD sales was not to accept any returns of open product from stores selling used... Here's an interesting twist (I guess you'll be the judge of that). Don Kulak of IMRA (Independent Music Retailers Association) tells me that a number of indie store owners that were, not too long ago, loathing Wherehouse for getting into the used business (and forcing the distributors to enaer releasement policies) would now like to see Wherehouse join the IMRA. Join? Wherehouse just bought a chain larger than any current IMRA member.

"Maybe we have to re-define what an independent store is," says Kulak. Well, people have been trying to tell me my entire life that size isn't everything (especially my wife), but Wherehouse an independent? Mark Cerny of Record Revolution in DeKalb, Illinois, thinks: "People who are selling used product seem to be the common bond between stores in IMRA and Wherehouse would add some real firepower to our movement." Wherehouse's Bruce Jesse said: "We have not been contacted by anyone at IMRA concerning joining. But we have never felt any animosity towards the indies. In fact, we salute them. We have seen their entrepreneúrial success and have been trying to adopt some of their policies. We are all just trying to better serve our customers." Would Wherehouse consider such a move? "We don't feel that we need a separate organization other than NARM," says Jesse, "because we think that this issue affects all retailers. But that isn't to say we wouldn't be willing to engage in a discussion with them."... Rumors continue to abound that Wherehouse is going to bring suit against the four distributors with anti-used policies. And Wherehouse continues to neither confirm nor deny these rumors. (Now is that some hard hitting journalism or what?)... Frank Lipsius, Universal One-Stop's top dog, wasn't the only one calling to tell me how phenomenal last week's Universal Convention was. Over 750 people were wined and dined at the Meiji-en Restaurant overlooking the Delaware. Performances included sets by UNV, Cheryl Pepsii Riley, Young Black Teenagers, Force MCs and V (on Up and Up Records, distributed by Universal). 
