

Packing a serious commitment to Post Modern artists, Z100 New York took a monster 3.8-4.7 jump in the Summer Arbitron book, recapturing the #2 12+ position overall in the market.

What were they saying about the death of Top 40?

"It's a tribute to the entire staff who really believed in the direction we were going," said Z100 VP/Director Operations & Programming Steve Kingston, who stated the station's change in programming philosophy was an effort "not to cave into 25-54 disease."

Kingston recalled once-sizable pressure by forces outside the company to turn Hot Adult or Adult Top 40. "As far as I'm concerned," he stated, "the new book is confirmation of our efforts."



We've been touting it as our #1 Vibe-Raters wimner and now everyone is catching the VIBE. Album sales explode to #24 this week as MTV moves into Buzz Bin rotation. Z100 and WENZ add prerelease and join 99X #8, KITS #1 and KROQ #2, KRBE, WDRE, B97 and KWOD as early major market supporters. Now the volume tonnage will fall as "Linger" begins to linger in Top 40's mind (?).

Polly Drives 550

Epic Records announced the launch of a new label, Sony 550 Music, naming "Good Golly Miss" Polly Anthony as the label's GM, reporting directly to Epic President Dave "Beavis & Butt-Head Like To Sniff Rubber" Glew. Ms. Anthony will oversee the marketing, sales and promotion activities for the new label, which will be based at Epic's N.Y. headquarters.

Six artists will make their debuts on Sony 550 Music, including Eve's Plum, flop, Funky Poets, Clive Griffin, Culture Beat and Grammy Award-winning singer Celine Dion. In addition, Deep Forest will segue from Epic to the new imprint.

"Epic's mounting success has led us to a new label with which to accommodate the needs and developments of each artist," commented Glew. "As part of the Epic team, Polly Anthony's contribution to our success in introducing new artists to a wide public marked her as well-suited to head the new label." (Ed. note: She threatened to hold her breath until she turned blue otherwise.)

Anthony previously served as Sr. VP Promotion for Epic since 1990. She joined CBS Records in 1978 in the West Coast promotion department of Portrait Records, becoming Mgr. Adult Contemporary Promotion for Epic in '81, Associate Director in '83, Director Nat'l. Adult Contemporary/ Trade Liaison in '84, Director

National Promotion in '87 and VP Pop Promotion in '88.

Added Anthony: "Sony 550 Music will echo Epic in its focus on a wide variety of music united by its quality and passion. That means breaking boundaries by balancing great patience and belief in our artists with the relentless effort necessary to bring their talent the attention it merits." (What She Really Meant: "Book as many ads in HITS as you want. I won't pay for them.")





Camelot Sale

An agreement has been reached for the sale of Camelot Music to InvestCorp, an international investment firm, it was announced by Camelot Chairman/President/CEO Paul L. David. The sale is expected to be completed by mid-November.

The privately held Camelot operates 366 stores in 34 states



AROUND THE HORN

Nirvana and MCA's Meat Loaf continue to dominate the sates market. While Nirvana's #1 position was expected by all, Meat Loaf's surprise ascension proves to be no fluke as sales remain solid and the single, "I'd Do Anything For Love (But I Won't Do That)," jumps into the Top Ten on its way to a long-term run at the top. Country acts are enjoying the fruits of "Country Music Awards" national television exposure as MCA's George Strait, Reba McEntire and multiple award-winning Vince Gill soar this week. Strait and McEntire debut strongly this week at #'s 6 and 9, while Gill returns to the chart at #42.

However, the most surprising and intriguing activity concerns Arista's Toni Braxton, who is enjoying a second week in the Top Ten with her selftitled album, buoyed by the success of the album's first single, "Another Sad Love Song." It is the first album to hit the select ten by a black female soloist since Uptown/MCA's Mary J. Blige soared in the fourth quarter last year. The album is deep with follow-ups and should be surging for months to come, as a second

hit, "Breathe Again," is already developing while the first continues to gain.

The top two Vibe-Raters picks to click - Island/PLG's Cranberries and Geffen's White Zombie — are picking up speed as both jump into the 20's nationally with no end in sight. MTV support, long-term patience and marketing development have been the key for both. We're predicting platinum results on each, with White Zombie's sales currently in the lead, and Cranberries ready to roar with the release this week of the smash single, "Linger."

And finally, rap records continue to do big first-week business as live's Spice 1 and KRS-1 explode on at #'s 11 and 30, respectively. But, while few show long-term legs (DR/Pr/Interscope's Dr. Dre being the year's only previous exception), the real rap success story is Ruffhouse/Columbia's Cypress Hill, which continues to sell Top Ten months after release thanks to their smash single, "Insane In The Brain," and massive exposure on television, including saturation video play and their performance this past Saturday (10/2) on "Saturday Night Live."

SLEPLESS

An exclusive HITS radio dialogue with Michael-Jack Kirby, PD KFFM, Yakima, WA, by Connie Breeze

This L.A. native spent his formative years listening to the area's great radio stations and personalities of the '60s. Kirby's own broadcasting career got underway in 1979, and since that time, the

well-travled veteran has worked at 10 stations, starting with popular belief, white people a stint at community station KBOO in Portland, OR. Kirby went on to do oldies at various stations until getting his big break in 1986 at Q105 in Salem, Oregon, which moved to

Portland the following year. By the start of 1989, Sean Lynch hired him to do overnights at KKRZ Portland. Michael then segued to KISM in Bellingham, WA in 1990 where he was MD and afternoons until he went to program KFFM Yakima, WA earlier this year. The guy's career went downhill faster n'

> you can say "Washington Huskies" when he was confronted by the Pacific Northwest's own most famous expatriate, HITS' resident chorus girl, Connie "Every Little Louise Seems To Whisper" Breeze.



What made you leave a major market station like KKRZ in Portland to go to Bellingham?

After a year or so at KKRZ, it became obvious that a programming opportunity was not going to develop there for me. The chance came up for me to do afternoons at KISM in Bellingham. The market was about 200 sizes smaller than where I'd been but I'd been doing overnights and I had to get out. I became [PD] Allan Fee's Music Director at KISM within a few months. When management wanted to make music changes there, I felt it was time to leave. That's when the opportunity to come to Yakima came up.

In 1989, when [KKRZ PD] Mark Capps told you to go somewhere small like Yakima if you wanted to program, what did you say?

I said, "Yakima? Yuk! Ain't no way I'm going to Yakima!"

Now you love it.

Yes, and not only the station, but the people, too. I'm really glad that I jumped at the opportunity.

Just when you had gotten your staff together, your old PD Allan Fee [now at KFBQ] stole away your night talent. Were you upset?

Not really, because I got his night guy from KFBQ. Everybody has to do what they have to do, and it all worked out in the end.

What musical changes have you made at KFFM since your arrival?

I got rid of a lot of oldies and got my ear in tune with what's happening in town. They're screaming for Urban music here, although reactive records seem to work well.

For awhile now, HITS has been screaming about rap records that may not get airplay on many stations, but have huge sales. Do you have those records on your playlist?

Ice Cube, Wreckx-N-Effect, Cypress Hill and 2Pac are all testing and selling very well here.

But people perceive Yakima as the Great White Northwest.

A large percentage of the audience in our market is Hispanic. We have a very diverse listenership and, contrary to popular belief, white people like black music.

Who gave you your biggest break in radio?

I'd have to say that Jim Ryan at KXYO gave me my biggest break, but Eric Norberg was a tremendous influence on me as well.

You're pretty much a music fanatic. I've seen you beat Guy Zapoleon at music trivia contests and he knows a lot. I grew up in the '60s in L.A. listen-

ing to KRLA, which was awesome.

I've got all the hits in my record collection. Need a song? Call me and I'll send you a tape.

Who do you listen to in your off-time?

Sarah Vaughan, Elvis, Nat King Cole and, of course, Prince!

What's the hardest thing about being in one of these music trivia contests?

Sometimes it's the easy questions! Those contests are hard to do when there are a bunch of guys up there just staring at you. Sometimes I go blank, and I kick myself later for the easy questions that I missed.

When you have a quiet moment to think about where you're going, what do you wonder about?

If I'll ever capture that feeling again! When I was at KKRZ, I lived in a beautiful area, I had a great girlfriend and we all had a lot of fun. Z100 is a heritage radio station with a vibe of its own. The bottom line for me right now is to successfully program this station and discover new music because that's what I love to do most.

Does your own high profile help or hurt you in the job?

I never wanted to be a personality myself, but because it made it easier to work with artists and to meet girls at shows, I enjoyed it. But it has its drawbacks. Like not being able to go see a show in L.A. or New York without being tortured. It's a funny phenomenon. Unlike stars like Steven Tyler, Sammy Hagar or David Coverdale, my fame doesn't apply to the rest of the world. lust if I'm going to a place where musicians are.

In recent interviews, you've seemed disappointed at the direction rock & roll is going in, away from the acts you have championed in the past.

I can keep pace with what's going on, if what's going on is Stone Temple Pilots, Pearl Jam and Alice In Chains. That I understand the first time I hear it. If you ask me if I can keep pace with the gangsta rap crap teenagers seem to enjoy — which is their prerogative — I couldn't.

You've been quoted as saying you don't get rap, and yet it appeals to the same rebelliousness in kids that rock & roll once did.

That's obvious. Which is why kids like Ministry and other bands that could questionably be called music. It's just not discernible as songs to me.

Despite the fact you've worked with a lot of hard-rock, metal bands, you're basically an old-fashioned song man.

Sure. If I had been lucky enough to have my way, I would've made "Court & Spark," "Eli & the Thirteenth Confession," "Rubber Soul." I love songs. I simply took what I observed Clive Davis doing, because he's a song guy, then being with Ahmet, I saw how he worked with bands and now with Geffen, I've had the freedom to apply that in my own way. And it seemed to work. Also, I dealt with great managers like Tim Collins, Howard Kauffman and Andy Gould, who really allow you to work with their bands quite heavily, so I was able to develop that style. My characteristic approach is to take that song orienation and apply it to really hard music.

When you see a colleague like Gary Gersh go off to run Capitol, does it cause you to reassess your own goals in the music business?

I would never want to be President of a company or run anything. I like the fact Eddie Rosenblatt runs Getfen Records and that I work for him. When my deal is up in a little less than two years, I would always work for David Getfen, if he wanted me to. But I could see being an A&R person for another company interested in having an A&R person like me. I'm not really sure

who that is. I'm one of the few people left who can sign a band, make a record and take the brutalization from the artist. And also then work with the people in the company to promote it. Jackyl is a good example. If you ask people, no one really wanted to know about Jackyl. And now they've sold over 750,000 records.

You haven't signed a Seattle band yourself, but that scene has certainly provided a shot in the arm for the kind of traditional hard rock you champion.

There are only two bands I think are great — Pearl Jam and Stone Temple Pilots, and the latter don't even come from Seattle. Alice In Chains is another great band, but we'll see if they self-destruct or not.

Were you surprised when Stone Temple Pilots turned down the Aerosmith tour?

I was surprised, because it had never happened before. I thought they made a mistake then; I still think they made a mistake now. They had a myriad of reasons, which they change for each particular interview. Ranging anywhere from the fact they didn't like Aerosmith's sexist image to the fact they wanted to do their own thing and not have to ride on anybody's tour. They wanted control over their own ticket price, that kind of

stuff. I'd love to see what kind of control they had on the Butthole Surfers tour. They can think what they want, but they had an opportunity to play in front of their audience at these Aerosmith shows... 15-20,000 kids a night.

You resisted punk-rock from the start and now you're opposed to rap. Both are unmusical. And if the music business isn't careful, by promoting some of these ultra-mean gangsta rappers, things could get a lot worse. It could be the forerunner of this neo-Nazi music that's coming over from Europe. Our business would be very stupid to overlook these early warning signs.

Do you see a large difference between, say, Guns N' Roses and the Geto Roys?

Guns N' Roses is rock, sorta mean, but it's mostly about music with sexual overtones, while many of these other artists are severely degrading women, gays and whites. I always heard in Guns N' Roses a wild, anti-social singer who is confused about these :ssues, but no more so :han any normal teenager. That's

what kids pick up on. The frustration.

A lot of people would say your remarks about rap are racist.

Now if you don't like something, you're a racist? I'll run that risk because I'm not racist and never was, and my comments don't apply to R&B, which is some of my favorite music. What can I do? I don't want everything centered around my remarks about rap music. The subject touches on my own musical mortality. I'm more worried about my own place in a business that's made up of rap music.

For someone against rap, Aerosmith's "Walk This Way" with Run DMC was perhaps the single mest important element in their rejuvenation.

And I loved it. I was the ultimate proponent of that pairing.

Did it hurt you personally when Aerosmith decided to return to Calumbia?

No. It was business. They got offered a big deal from one of the greatest labels in the history of recorded music. I don't think musicians perceive personal relationships the way other people do. They think I exist mostly to service them.

As an A&R executive, is it frustrating to always be subservient to the artist's needs?

I've never felt that way. The people who know about making records know what I do. And that's what matters to me. I don't need public acclaim. I learned how to do this job a certain way and I still think that's the way to do it. I just signed Zakk Wylde and I'll do whatever I have to do to work with him to make the best record he wants to make — no matter what it is or how long it takes — because I totally believe in him.

Still, the ultimate job for an A&R man is to be able to pick hits.

That's exactly right. Any A&R person should be worried with the way things are today. The first time I ever heard Stone Temple Pilots, I said, this is going to be a big band. I still feel I have the ability to pick 'em, but if the market continues to get more narrow, who knows? Music always goes in cycles. There'll be another rock era, but I don't think the rock & roll musicians of the '80s will be around for it.

Any thoughts about Gary Gersh's move to Capitol?

I think Gary will do really well over there. His interest in music, despite any disagreements we've ever had, will be a big help in transforming that company.

What shape will the Geffen A&R department take now?

We're going to hire a bunch of A&R people who Tom [Zutaut] and I will try to work with and some additional scouts. Not necessarily from other record companies, though. Things will change here.

What are your own future plans?

I really don't know what's going to happen. In my seven years with Arlantic and 13 with Geffen, it's the first time it's ever crossed my mand. A great deal has to do with the way the music business is going. Radio is in a funny state right now, also. And you can't really blame the corporations. Take Infinity Broadcasting. They have the most interesting station around in KROQ here in Los Angeles and the dullest, most boring station in WBCN in Boston, which was the premier rock station for years.

The people programming KROQ really seem to listen to music and for an A&R person, that's your dream. And it's not even my kind of music. It's not just based on what's going to offend the least amount of people. Take 'BCN, where they play a lot of the acts I signed over the years. That's great, but what about the future?

The classic rock format has sort of destroyed Album Radio.

Classic rock stations are not a good thing, but in every city, the stations are different. It's hard to label them because at some stations, the programmers really listen to the music, so they put new records in interesting spots. That's all I'm trying to say.

How do you feel about metal radio?

Obviously, I wish it would be huge and there was a Z-Rock in every city in the country. I think a lot of metal kids want to hear really hard music and new music. But they don't want to hear pussy music. The Lemonheads can't be played next to Van Halen. You could play Nine Inch Nails and Whie Zombie, but not alternative pop music. For me, any development in alternative metal stations would be the greatest thing that could happen. There are too many A/C stations out there.

Were you pleased with the results of the Coverdale/Page record?

I was very happy how it started. Obviously, it was a very big disappointment that the band didn't come on tour this summer because the whole purpose of me killing myself was that Jimmy Page was going to come play Led Zeppelin songs with David Coverdale singing them. That's what he told me. He wanted to do a record and play these songs live one more time, since Robert Plant didn't want to do it. It would have been nice for the younger kids to see them. The whole point is, here is the guitarist who's the hero of the guys in Alice in Chains and Pearl lam. He's the originator.

How do you feel about Foreigner coming back?

I signed them and it's really sad to me. They obviously want to play together again — whether for the money or the music — but the younger audience doesn't want to know from it. It's hard. You don't want to see that happen to people. I don't want to see that happen to me. Which is why I try to go with the times and not get caught in my own bulkshit.

What about bands like Rage Against the Machine. Primus, Red Hot Chili Peppers, et. al., who combine the hard-rock mentality with rap beats?

I hear it. I love Rage Against the Machine. I just go by the music.

What's happening with Nelson?

We're still working on the album. They have to make a record that has good songs and its own identity, not just an imitation of hair bands that are long gone, which I'm sure is on their minds. Obviously, if I had my way, they'd make an Eagles record for

1994. Their first record was the right one for the time and if their music doesn't evolve, they'll go the way of all those other acts. But I'm doing the best I can not to let that happen. They're working very hard on their record right now and I am very involved. I know what they're not going to do... and that's make a Poison or Warrant record.

You don't really go to clubs anymore, do you?

I don't want to be a street guy anymore. It's too hard for me to go to these places without everyone handing me their tapes. That's why I'm hiring people who are really good at that. And I'll listen to what they bring in. I did that for too many years. But it's still where it's at. Which is why I have to address it.

You never wanted to be a producer or a manager?

I don't think I have the talent of a Brendan O'Brien or a Bob Rock. Nor do I have the patience of a Tim Collins or a Bud Prager. I'm an A&R person. That's what I am and I'll go out that way.

Do you have a wish list of artists you'd like to work with?

I'd like to find a couple of young bands who are as talented as Pearl Jam. I don't think this will happen, but I'd love to try to make a good record with Paul McCartney.

Can you still listen to music for pleasure?

I listen to oldies radio, like K-EARTH. It brings me back to the times when I was a teen, so that's relaxing for me. Obviously, when I travel around the country, I listen to the rock and alternative stations all the time just to hear what they're playing. I spend a lot of time — which many executives in the music business don't do — in the malls and record stores with the kids. That's one of my big secrets. I can relate to that 17-year-old. And they still relate to me. Maybe because I'm not married and I don't have kids, which gives me the freedom and ability to do that. They'll always talk to me and tell me what they think. Which is the greatest gift they can give you, right?

Why haven't you ever gotten married or had children?

I never thought I had the time and attention to give to a wife and children and do my job the way I wanted to do it. Perhaps that'll change in the next few years. But I still want to do A&R the way I've always done it.

Do you ever tire of the John David Kalodner persona now that's it's been appropriated by the likes of Rick Rubin?

I didn't know this was an issue. He has his own thing, which is different from mine. I like this image. It's all organic. I wear white because 10 years ago some girl in the Geffen parking lot said I looked good in white because it was summer and I was wearing white. And it started to build more and more as more people commented on it. All of the stuff happened completely by accident. It's pretty hilarious, actually.

WHEELS&DEALS

ALL THAT GLITTERS: Hollywood stories like this don't seem to happen much anymore. Maybe it's the demise of the studio system or maybe the rags-to-riches saga has been deromanticized by the seemingly constant repetition of what usually turns out to be myth in the media. But consider the case of Jewel, the singer/songwriter who has been the focus of an unusually sensitive yet hotly contested battle for her services by the industry's elite. The 19-year-old Homer, Alaska native lives in a van with her mother, surfs all day and picks up a few dollars by performing some of the most personal and genuinely emotional songs you'll ever hear on

the beach and in a small San Diego club. She cites no references and doesn't seem to need any. She's innocent, naive and uncontaminated by concepts of artist positioning and competitive bidding. Yet, as evidenced by the endless train of Lincoln stretch limos that lined the streets outside and the fawning-room-only industry crowd pressed together inside N.Y.'s Siné club for Jewel's last performance. the best and brightest of Atlantic, RCA and Epic which funded her trip — are pulling out all the stops to

land this deeply affecting artist. Although it is certain when the heads of majors are mired in a stare-down like this that the dollar figures being discussed are of rarified valuation. the label that does win over Jewel will do so by proving to her that it views her as a long-term career artist who's only just started to realize her potential. That said, let's look at what insiders have to say about the contenders. RCA: Despite well-coordinated efforts to bolster its Alternative and Rock roster, the label remains a dark horse. Atlantic: A&R Rep Jenny Price was under the wire first — due to her superb advance work — made the Robb Bros. demos and is strongly supported by Danny Goldberg. With those two, Atlantic's proving formidable. Epic: Alan Mintz, Roger "Snake" Klein, Missy Worth and Judy Ross, who are all savvy and sensitive, and among the best, present an impressive united front. Would manager Inga Vainstein feel more comfortable signing with Atlantic, where her band Rust already resides? Does Jewel feel any personal obligations to one label or another? This one is just too close to call. Stay tuned... 'SUP: The Cramps sign with Medicine in the U.S. Kudos to Kevin Patrick... April's Motel Room signs with Immortal. Speaking of Immortal: Buzztone, Buzztone, Buzztone... Boston's Gigolo Aunts blew industry minds at L.A.'s Palace last week. Who'll nab 'em?... INDIE GROOVERS: Alcohol Funnycar's "Time To Make The Donuts" LP on C/Z, Sunny Day Real Estate's self-produced 7". Heavenly's "P.U.N.K. Girl" EP on K Records... BUZ-ZIN': God's Child, Rob Gordon, Eggs, Pay Back Sunday.







Jimmie Dale Gilmore has been playing his brand of country music since the late '60s and for a dedicated group of followers, he is nearly mythic for his rootsy take on the idiom, as reflected on '72's legendary "Flatlanders" release with

cohorts Joe Ely and Butch Hancock. Born in Amarillo, Texas 48 years ago, Gilmore now makes his home in Austin when he's not touring. He talks in thoughtful, if halting, speech and seems a little shy about using some of the bigger words he knows.

Despite his reputation as a purist, Gilmore is completely open to other types of music, like rock and folk, and he often wanders into lyrical territory more cosmic than usual for the C&W genre. Gilmore's distinctive vocal style is twangy yet ethereal, his voice high and wavering. His latest release, "Spinning Around The Sun" (Elektra), incredibly his first for a major label, features a mix of covers and originals, and he's hitting the road to support it. Unfortunately, his first stop was having to put up with the incessant ramble of HITS' city slicker, Chris "Kanga" Rubin.

Did you ever want to escape from the confines of country music?

I never rebelled against country music. I did go into rock a little, but I never left country. I always kept that connection.

Where did your interest in music come from?

My dad played in bands. He was one of the first electric guitarists. He still plays as well as he ever did. He taught me my first chords. I like a whole lot of stuff he can't relate to, but there's a certain kind of old-time country music that I know my dad's gonna like 'cause I do — it's a shared thing that's so deep and a big part of what I'm about.

Do music and songwriting come naturally to you?

I never felt like a real musician. I have to learn harmonies; it's not natural for me. I don't hear a melody in my head and duplicate it with my voice. I wish I had more training, more insight. I learned to read music, but not much theory, from a book called "Music Theory for Folk Musicians."

You're regarded as something of a country purist.

Hank Williams was one of my biggest influences. My style is so reminiscent of Williams and Lefty Frizzell. Some other female singers, like Rose Maddox and Kitty Wells, were massively influential to me. Maybe that's why I'm perceived as a purist.

What do think of the country music scene in L.A.?

I love it. I'm close with Rosie [Flores]; we've done some writing. I love Dwight Yoakam's music. There was a period two or three years ago with Lyle [Lovett], Dwight and a couple of others that opened a whole bunch of doors. I think it paved the way for the explosion in country music's popularity.

Speaking of that explosion in general, and Garth Brooks in particular... is it real country?

To speak for myself, I don't care if something is really country. All I care about is if I like it — that's the only category I've got. I really love some of Garth's stuff — not all of it. But it's always like that. To say this is or isn't country, that's meaningless. I don't approach it in that way. The future of country music, for me, is irrelevant. The future of music, that's the issue.

What rock artists do you respect?

I really love R.E.M., the 10,000 Maniacs,

Talking Heads. I toured with Cowboy Junkies.

With artists like Peter Gabriel, Sting and Paul Simon, do you think rock is just as capable of addressing adult themes as country?

It's moving in both directions, with some country music going adolescent, some rock going mature. My friend owned a club that was the most popular in town from the late '50s to the early '70s. He was the only person who hired Buddy Holly before he was big. He noticed that kids started liking country music when they got into their 20s and started having problems with divorces and stuff.

Are lyrics the most important part of a song to you?

In a sense, although it's a big thing to me to have the feeling that the song is really conveying a feeling — and that includes the melody, the whole overall gestalt, the aura.

How do you write?

Almost always a phrase comes first. A lot of times it's the chorus, or both the chorus and verse. That phrase with a melody is the thing that comes first. I'm not prolific. I edit subconsciously. If an idea hangs around, I'll get around to working on it.

You don't play electric guitar live or on record.

I play acoustic... always regretted that I didn't learn to play electric. It's the most important of all instruments.

How do you select your cover versions?

It's easy for me to interpret someone else's songs because I love that song. It doesn't matter whether I wrote it or not. For some reason, I can use the song to express something about me equally, if it's a Hank Williams song or one of my friend's songs. Butch [Hancock] writes so many songs where I go, "I should have written that."

Are you comfortable on-stage?

I'm more of an actor and the songs are my lines. Joe Ely always knew that music was theater, that you're "on" from the moment you go on-stage. I'm just learning that. People want to be entertained. I used to have a stupid, purist view of it, throwing the baby out with the bathwater. You are a performer, so it's a little myopic to ignore the performing aspect.

Bono and his mates were an influence on The Ocean Blue, but that was early on... now the musical motivation comes from folks like Kierkegaard. "Beneath The Rhythm And Sound" is TOP's third release for Sire/Reprise, and amongst its tomes is a nod to the Danish philosopher's fine existential conundrum, "Either/Or." Although Dave is earnest, he's also polite. He gently asks if HITS would remember to refer to his band as "THE" Ocean Blue. Recording in the Bahamas at Compass Point Studios kept the boys in Blue away from their home base of Hershey, PA for the cold winter months, while the shooting of the first video took them to the far-flung shores of Iceland. The guitar-driven popsters see themselves as more of a recording unit than performers, yet they are preparing to embark on what they hope will be their grandest tour. Between rehearsals, David Schelzel made the mistake of matching IQ's with HITS' own Not-So-Grand Dane, Brian "Clueless In Los Angeles" Griffith.

What was it like developing a band in the musical hotbed of Hershey, Pennsylvania?

Surely you jest. Actually, it's a great place, but musically speaking, it's not what you would call a hotbed. There's no real scene, which was actually a wonderful thing — we could pick and choose our own influences. It was difficult because there were no clubs for original music. It allowed us to develop our own sound. We didn't have to compete with anyone else, or be like anyone else. So the only real influences we had were the records we bought or got from friends.

We met each other in junior high and became friends. We decided to form a band, but our playing experience for a long time was pretty much confined to each other's basements. It wasn't until we had a chance to do some recording that we thought it would be fun to take the band to the next level. So we started playing out. It was pretty rough at first because you had to be a cover band. Our goal was to get a good record deal because all the bands we liked we'd never even seen live. We realized that making records was where it was at. That's what we focused on.

So you didn't start the band to meet girls?

[Laughs] No, I can say it was really for the love of the music. But we were into the artistic aspects beyond the music, also. Most of the bands we liked had a strong persona, an image if you will. Bands like the Smiths, early U2, R.E.M., Aztec Camera, the B-52's.

Someone said your CD reminds them of Haircut 100.

It's really funny. I'd never heard of Haircut 100 until we started playing out and a lot of people started saying that we reminded them of Haircut 100. So I went out and bought the record and we don't sound anything like them — they had horns and disco beats. But as years have passed, I can see how people might have thought that. We actually met Nick Heyward when we recorded the first record in England. We were going to ask him if he needed a back-up band, but figured we'd be better off on our own.

I have a smile on my face. I'm glad you picked that up. Two island nations that are so distinctly different. Surrounded by the ocean blue as well, I might add. I'm really drawn to the Nordic climate, but both are great countries and wonderful places to work.

So why Iceland?

The song "Sublime" called for a fantastic, romantic, larger-than-life and very foreign-looking natural landscape. You can do so many things with video technology and computers to make things look weird, but we wanted to capture a really intense visual landscape using something that actually existed. And although some may disagree with me, we are a very organic band, not overly processed, with a natural sound.


Certainly "Sublime" is about the natural experiences in life that are sublime, so I felt it was important to get to a real amazing natural landscape that would be very foreign to most people's experience. I was thinking originally of the Swiss Alps, but [keyboardist] Steve [Lau] had suggested Iceland because he had been there. It turned out to be everything we thought it would be and more. We filmed on a glacier, amongst icebergs in a little boat, at a geo-thermal power station that doubles as a spa. The Icelandic people are very unique and very hip. And proud of their culture.

Not many songwriters use Kierkegaard as an inspiration.

I finished my college coursework as I was writing songs for this record, so many things were inspired by my studies. I was reading Kierkegaard's "Either/Or" because I was fascinated by the subject matter. The appeal to me about putting Kierkegaard's ideas in a pop song was that the majority of the folks who turn on the radio wouldn't give the ideas a second thought unless they really heard the lyrics. The contents of a pop song can be so mindless that I wanted to put something in that was a little more profound.

How would you feel about having a Top 40 hit?

For quite some time, we were very concerned about being perceived as too poppy. Our music really walks the line between so-called alternative and pop music, but I think the format has stretched, so I don't feel uncomfortable being there. Many of the bands I listened to growing up I hear on the Top 40 station here in Hershey — New Order, U2, R.E.M. Why shouldn't they be playing The Ocean Blue as well?



How do you explain the rampant diversity of "Perfect Teeth"?

Mark Robinson: If you listen to the early Unrest records, the variety is even more drastic. The new record sounds really cohesive to me... all the songs have a similarity. We just listened to it last night.

Phil Krauth: At 11:30 at night, it sounds great. *Bridget Cross*: Yeah, it sounded damn cohesive.

Did you have any weird early musical experiences which prepared you for Unrest?

Bridget: My mother forced me to take piano lessons, then I played trumpet for a long time. I always had to play "Taps" on Memorial Day while standing in the graveyard, with all these totally old VFW men in their little uniforms running around in wreaths. Weird. Pbil: In high school, I played in a jazz band. We'd play at a Mercedes Benz dealership in front of a bunch of rich people. A charity hoopla with hors d'oeuvres. I did a drum solo. It's funny — the crowd kept moving back. Guess it was too much jazz for them.

How would you describe Unrest's live show?

Phil: It's hard to say. We do different shows depending on the venue.

Bridget: The smaller clubs are pretty exciting.

Phil: We played a great show at this laundromat in Cincinnati that had a bar.

Bridget: I think they called it Sudsy Malone's. **Pbil**: That was a great atmosphere. Just kooky.

How do you like touring?

<u>Bridget</u>: It's weird. I hate it when I'm doing it, but then when I'm home, I want to do it. I just don't like doing whatever I'm doing at the time. I get angry at really stupid things. I have a very short fuse. I can blow up and be a crazy person onstage.

<u>Pbii</u>: If we do a three-week tour, I like the first week and the last week. It's always that middle week that's so hard — it seems like you're always playing the tough crowds during that week. Then, by the last week, you don't care any more.

Do you feel part of a D.C. scene?

<u>Bridget</u>: It's just a bunch of bands from the same town who happen to hang out together. I didn't know any D.C. bands until we started touring and then we got to be friends with Fugazi, Pitch Blends and Tsunami.

<u>Phil</u>: There used to be something called DC Space, which was a good place to see bands. But there's not a place like that anymore. Ten years ago, when I first started going out to see bands with Mark, it was a lot different. Everything was crazier then. You didn't have "alternative" music — there were all these hardcore and new wave bands and nobody knew what they were all about. So you'd go see a band and the show would be totally crazy. It was inspiring — you were totally unprepared. It really changed my attitude about bands and music.

How do you like playing with Fugazi?

Bridget: I love Fugazi because I think they're all cute.

<u>Phil</u>: They're fun to play with. We played this show in Omaha with them in front of 4,000 people. People were stage diving and passing each other around while we're playing these ballads. It was funny. Then Fugazi came onstage and were yelling at people for

stage diving.

Bridget: It's so funny

— they give the same speech every show.

How do you get on with 4AD chief Ivo Watts-Russell?

Bridget: He doesn't like any of us.
Mark: He thinks we're making fun of him all the time, so he's so defensive. Of course, we are making fun of him.

Bridget: It's all in love, but now he's on this huge insult streak. He says stuff like, "You're ugly and your mother dresses you funny." PEACE

An hour spent with the members of Unrest is like an hour spent with comic strip characters Calvin & Hobbes. Vocalist/guitarist Mark Robinson, bassist/vocalist Bridget Cross and drummer Phil Krauth tend to careen through a conversation, leaving a trail of non-sequiturs, barbed comments and wry humor in their wake. The group's banter mirrors their music, constantly keeping the listener off balance. Unrest's new album, "Perfect Teeth" (4AD/Reprise), offers a perfect case in point; the sublime follow-up to the deservedly extolled 1992 opus "Imperial ffrr" demonstrates why the group has long been considered a national treasure — right alongside their Washington, DC hometown icons Fugazi and the Lincoln Memorial.

Still recovering from a video shoot the night before, the trio foolishly agreed to take a ride with HITS' own Spaceman Spiff wannabe, Jon "Astro Dork" Levy, in a flight simulator at 4AD Records' L.A. offices.


I understand one of your musical heroes is Sammy Davis Jr. How did you get into him?

Mark: The first time I remember getting into Sammy was when I went to visit Caroline Records and the guys in the distribution office had this amazing Sammy Davis Jr. record cover on the wall. And then I went to college and found his stuff in a used record store, so now I have like, 40 of his albums. Sammy is the top of the pyramid and I'm just one of the masses down there at the bottom.

What was it like working with Simon Le Bon as your producer? Bridgel: A pain in the ass.

Mark: He drank a lot. He just came by, went into the studio and said, "Yeah, it sounds good," and went back to drinking.

How can one band have both Sammy Davis Jr. and Kiss as their musical icons? Mark: They're not really that much different if you listen closely. ■

Afghan Whigs, "Gentlemen" (Elektra): Cincinnati pop demolition experts the Afghan Whigs hammer out genuine R&B-influenced garage rock on their major label debut, which follows their meteoric rise to PoMo prominence on indie landmark Sub Pop. Greg Dulli's husky pipes deliver the

most eloquently disturbed lyrics since Jim Morrison's and Lou Reed's. With the corrosive "Be Sweet" and the distorted cabaret that is "Fountain & Fairfax" this stunning LP is a lock for critics' Top Ten lists everywhere.

Redd Kross, "Phaseshifter" (This Way Up/Mercury): Possibly the only band that could share stages with Sonic Youth and Kiss, Redd Kross returns with their first new album in three years. Since their late '70s pre-teen punk beginnings, brothers Jeff and Steve McDonald, now with three new



band members, have combined punk attitude with metal riffs and bubblegum melodies. Now musically matured, Redd Kross still rock like kids. Just turn on "Jimmy's Fantasy," bang your head, hum along, and "freak out!" (Chris Carey)



Green Apple Quick Step, "Wonderful Virus" (Medicine/Giant/Reprise): Decidedly more metallic than their Seattle/Tacoma bloodlines would suggest, G.A.Q. purveys towering riff-rock and heady, even abstruse lyrics that stand them apart from the Northwestern sonic family. Produced by Daniel Rev

(Ramones, L7), the band's early 70's rock roots are allowed to flourish in their natural, unadulterated state. Drop the anthemic "Bottle," the soon-to-be-huge "Stereo" and "Ludes And Cherrybombs" onto your brainstem and groove.

The Wonder Stuff, "Construction For The Modern Idiot" (Polydor): The always pissed-off, always hummable, always amazing Wonder Stuff deliver their most ambitious and fully developed opus of snotty brilliance on this fourth full-length offering full of irony and mirth. Stuffie frontman Miles Hunt bridges hamfisted anger ("I Wish"



Hunt bridges hamfisted anger ("I Wish Them All Dead") and cautious optimism ("Swell") with a constant swirl of infectious melodies and swerving, distorted guitars. This Wonder Stuff's the stuff pop history's made of and you are there.



Growing up together in upstate Potsdam, N.Y., the Gigolo Aunts — guitarist Dave Gibbs, brothers Phil and Steve Hurley on guitar and bass respectively, and drummer Paul Brouwer — have been playing together since they were kids, but they took their current shape after moving to Boston in 1987. With all four members sharing vocal duties, the band developed their sound after years of listening to every great, and probably quite a few terrible, '70s pop bands. Borrowing the songwriting style and sound of Big Star and Badfinger and the vocal harmonies of the Byrds, the Gigolo Aunts stand alongside the Posies and Teenage Fanclub as the current champions of pure pop sensibility. Having just finished touring with Suede and the Cranberries, and preparing the release of their major label debut (destination still up in the air), "Flippin' Out," Dave and Steve decided to risk their good fortune and reputations by speaking with the Priestess of all things PoMo, Karen Glauber, and her faithful Sancho Panza, Chris "Cash &" Carey.

WHAT IS THE BEST LIE YOU'VE TOLD WHEN AN INTERVIEWER DIDN'T KNOW THE ORIGIN OF YOUR NAME?

DAVE GIBBS: The best lie is the Freddy Mercury story. Steve and Phil were kids. We had the band, and they were on vacation in Barbados with their folks. They were running down the beach and Steve said, "Oh my God, it's Freddy Mercury!" So they went up and started talking to him and Steve said, "Well, Freddy, we have this band, so what should we name it?" And Freddy sa.d, "Well, deanes, I would say Gigolo Aunts." It wasn't until later that we realized that it was also a Syd Barrett song.

HOW DID YOU DISCOVER SOME OF THE BANDS, SUCH AS BIG STAR AND BADFINGER, THAT WOUND UP INFLUENCING YOUR SOUND? DAVE: When I first moved to Boston in 1984, there was a guy I knew who was a Big Star-head, Spike Priggen, from the band Dumptruck I worked with him in a used clothing store. He would play these compilation tapes of Big Star, weird Monkees outtakes and Badfinger. Then, when I came back to Potsdam, Steve and I had this shift on the Clarkson College radio station. They had this thing called the dead file. It was all of the records you weren't supposed to play, and they were going to be chucked out. They had mint condition copies of the first two Big Star records. They must have only been played once, and the PD had a comment on one that said, "Sounds like a bad Beatles." So I stole those records immediately.

YOU GUYS SEEM TO APPRECIATE ARTISTS THAT FIGURED OUT HOW TO MAKE THEIR MUSIC LAST EVEN THOUGH THEY WENT NO-WHERE. YOU DON'T SEE TOO MANY BANDS LIKE THAT TODAY.

DAVE: That stems from the fact that we're all music fans. None of us were popular kids in high school, and we weren't popular when we moved to Boston, so we would just sit in our bedrooms, practice guitar and listen to records all day long.

YOU WENT TO ENGLAND TO GET A RECORD DEAL?

DAVE: One of our goals was for the four of us to go to England, whether or not we were successful. Steve and I always wanted to be on an English record label. They still let you put out things like 7" singles and gatefold double albums, so it was one of our goals to sign to one. At first, we didn't know how to do it, but when I started playing in Velvet Crush, I saw how they did it, so Steve scouted out Fire Records.

WHAT WAS THE FIRST SONG YOU KNEW ALL THE WAY THROUGH? DAVE: I used to watch repeats of the Monkees, so I could sing all of their songs, but the first record that I remember making my Dad buy for me, and then learning all of the way through was "I Think I Love You" by the Partridge Family. I also remember trying to learn Davy lones' dance steps to "Daydream Believer."

EARLIER THIS YEAR, THE POSIES WOUND UP IN BIG STAR. WHAT LEGENDARY, OR SEMINAL BAND, WOULD THE GIGOLO **AUNTS LIKE TO INFILTRATE?**

STEVE HURLEY: The Kinks. The bass player they've had since the '70s is a real pud. So all of their new stuff has this real draggy feel to it.

DAVE: Badfinger. I'd love to back up loey Molland for a couple Badfinger tunes.

STEVE: We tried to do that once, too. We had a friend that worked at Rykodisc, and we tried to get him to approach loey Molland and have us be his band for a tour, but he ended up getting all of these older guys that all looked like they used to be in Bad Company.

DAVE: I wouldn't mind backing up Eric Carmen for a Raspberries tour. We'd have to kick Urge Overkill's butt to get that one.

BEING IN THE MIDDLE OF A BIDDING WAR, WHAT IS THE POINT OF SPENDING A WHOLE LOT OF MONEY RIGHT NOW ON A HUGE ADVANCE INSTEAD OF DOING THINGS ON A GRADUAL LEVEL?

DAVE: We don't need a huge advance. We don't want that kind of pressure put on us. We've tried to make it a point through our whole little history, and sometimes it's a mistake, but we just kinda like to work with people that we get along with and would hang out with anyway.

STEVE: I think we're pretty concerned with making something that will last. And to make something last, it has to build up over time, so we definitely don't expect anything really big to happen suddenly.

What had it had lift Chris (Stain) since

What has it been like working with Chris [Stein] since the romantic portion of the relationship ended?

It's fabulous, I guess. We know each other so well. We're like brother and sister now. There are no conflicts... it's not uncomfortable at all.

Is it hard to age gracefully in this business?

I don't really know how to answer that question. I don't know that I am thinking about it that much. Age isn't relevant... I have different attitudes. I've matured, so I see things with a different perspective. I guess I just don't have as many hormones to worry about. That's it. I still get PMS... I just don't have that teenage rush anymore.

Do you miss the media attention as the pop pin-up queen, the rock cover girl?

I don't really miss it because I still have some kind of popularity with photographers. It's nice having people pay attention to you. If I stopped working all together, I would really miss it, but I'm not completely out of the picture yet.

How do you feel about the Madonna phenomenon? Do you feel that you paved the way for her? In some ways, yes, but it's not for me to comment about.

What's the idea behind having different producers on each track of "Debravation"?

I wanted to become involved with the production more, so I worked with different songwriters and producers. That's how the

record first developed. Initially, I worked with Chris — he was producing and I was involved with putting in my two cents every now and then, but I basically wrote the lyrics. From there, it just went on and developed into a more collaborative effort.

Are you still a big rap fan?

Rap is fabulous. I love it. I don't like all of it, but I think it's really like the folk music of the '80s and '90s. It's very hypnotic.

How would you describe a cyberpunk?

A futuristic, android humanoid, like the million-dollar man. Some body parts are replaced with fiber optics so they become like superbeings. Cyber is the futuristic part and punk is just the style or attitude.

How's your acting career progressing?

It's sort of troubling along. I keep trying to do it. I did a few things this summer. I did a film for an interactive video game, and I also did a movie called "Phony Perfector."

On the song "Communion," you sing about the ritual as if you were seeking martyrdom.


I didn't mean that at all. It's based directly on the act of Communion, a symbolic sharing of the body and blood. That's what it's about. It's expressed in a modern way except for that chorus. which is a direct quote from the Bible.

Many know her simply as Blondie in the hey-day of '70s punk-rock, playing regularly at the music's unofficial birthplace, that hole in the wall on the Bowery known as CBGB's. Yes, she was the archetype of the blonde beauty with a sexy seductive pop voice, an inspiration for the likes of Madonna and Cyndi Lauper. Almost 20 years later, Deborah Harry is still evincing effortless pop style with the release of her latest album on new label Sire, "Debravation," an apt title considering it has been four years since her last effort, "Def Dumb And Blonde."

This new disc is a collaborative effort in which Deborah teams up with longtime friend and cohort Chris Stein for some vintage Blondie rock & roll, Anne Dudley (of "Crying Game" and Art of Noise fame) for the jazzy, slow "Mood Ring," songwriter Allee Willis (Pet Shop Boys, Pointer Sisters, et.al.) for the worldweary but humorous rap on "Stability," and cyberpunk cult hero William Gibson, who provides lyrics for the futuristic "Dog Star Girl." Even R.E.M. makes an appearance on the album, performing on the Patsy Cline-like rendition of "My Last Date (With You)," about — like many other songs — the guises of love.

At the startling age of 48, Deborah Harry has shed the blonde hair and pancake makeup, opting instead for a soft, short side-parted, brunette body-wave that makes her almost unrecognizable but as alluring as ever. She cuddles up on the couch with her dog, Chi-Chin, at her manager's office, dressed in a black lace tunic over white leggings behind cyberpunk wraparound sunglasses to answer a few questions from HITS' correspondent lanet "He's Not Heavy, He's My Brother" Trakin. When Harry found out she was the sister of this magazine's Senior Editor, she offered her condolences and sympathetically suggested that it must have been a "torturous childhood."





you should generally avoid talking across record-to-record segues. If the upcoming song in a sweep has more than, say :04 seconds intro time, confine your talkover to the intro of that song. If the intro time is :00 to :04, briefly talk over the fade of the previous song. For example: "Here's (artist) on (call letters)." [Punch] In the case of a song with :01 to :04 intro time, it's okay to talk across the segue if you're tight on the vocal. Example: "Here's [punch] (artist) on (call letters)." (Vocal) If you have plenty of intro time, it won't hurt to let the song establish for a beat or two before you talk. The upcoming song should clearly overlap the previous song so that the segue will be solid, not mushy. More on momentum next week. Later.


