## OVERWORK HITS GROUP

LONDON — The Rolling Stones, second most popular group in the world, have been forced to cancel all personal appearances due to complete exhaustion and illness among all members of the group. Although none of the Stones are, now in serious condition, their doctors have confined them to complete bed rest for at least two weeks.

### BRIAN ILL

Brian Jones was the most seriously ill member of the group. While in New York, he came down with a cold, but refused to cancel out on any of the Stones' personal appearances. By the time the group was ready to leave New York, Brian's cold had turned into pneumonia, and he was rushed to the hospital.

### KEITH COLLAPSES

The group was scheduled to do a show the next day, even though Brian couldn't make it. While they were rehearsing, though, Keith collapsed from complete physical exhaustion and the show had to be postponed. Keith was put into the hospital for a rest, and will be out in a few days. After Keith's collapse, Andrew Oldham, the group's manager, insisted that Mick, Bill and Charlie each have a complete physical examination. The doctor who examined the boys said that they were all overworked and should have at least two weeks rest before continuing their grueling 3 month personal appearance tour. Although the boys were anxious to get back on the road, their manager insisted the boys relax for the two weeks. "If it were up to them," Oldham said, "They'd keep going till they all dropped. They don't want to disappoint anyone, and they never even think of themselves when there's a show to do. I've seen those boys go on when they haven't slept in days,
