Beatles' August Tour To Include L.A. Show

We can't give you any offi-cial word yet, but negotiations are almost completed to bring the Beatles back to Los

bring the Beatles back to Los Angeles for another live con-cert spectacular.

Word of a final agreement is expected to be announced any day now . . . and KRLA and the Beat will be first to an-nounce it, naturally!

They are expected to do two concerts this time, so that a lot of people who missed out on their first performance will have a chance to see them in

The boys have expressed a preference for Los Angeles, and they have reserved two open dates on the schedule for open dates on the schedule for their American tour this sum-mer — Aug. 29 and 30. Revealing his plans for the Beatles for the rest of 1965, Brian Epstein indicates they will make the third of their

three-picture commitment for United Artists this year. The Beatles are starting their second film this week. They have flown to the Bahamas for location shooting which will take almost three weeks. Then they fly to Austria to film ther for about ten days before re-turning to London to complete

turning to London to complete the picture.

They will begin their European tour in July with a major concert in Paris, likely to be combined with a TV show over the Eurovision link from the French capital. Other concerts will follow in Barcelona, Madrid, Milan and another Italian city to be named later.

He knows most people. I'm also happy to be working permanently with Bob Eu-banks. I met him first in his Cinnamon Cinder Club at the

Beatle press conference. A straight man, and he did a great promotion job for the Beatles . . . and for Tommy Quickly when I came over with Tommy just before Christmas. Tommy sends his love, by the way. Hollywood "knocked him out." he said.

Talk of Tommy reminds me of England . . . and his home town and mine . . . Liverpool. The beat scene is still swinging in Britain but something awful just happened to the man who owns the Cavern Club where the Beatles got their start in Liverpool.

He is "in the red." In debt. No one knows how or why. It seems the kids aren't as Cavernminded as they were. That was where it all started in 1960 but somehow the scene there isn't as lively.

One of our top groups now, far and away, is the Animals from Newcastle. The Beatles admire them tremendously.

The Rolling Stones continue to run the Beatles not too close as second group. They don't sell nearly as many discs but they have a massive following And they're good. The US thinks so too, I'm told.

That's about it for now Thanks for having me with you If there's anything you want to know about England, write and let me know. I'll do my best to tell you.

Goodbye for now.

Righteous Bros Soar To Top As New Hit Tops Them All

THE RIGHTEOUS BROTH-ERS' "You've Lost That Lovin' Feelin'" has set a record at KRLA for holding the top position on the KRLA survey longer than any other record during the history of the survey.

They are now one of the most famed "brother" teams in the world – and they aren't even brothers.

Bob Hatfield and Bill Medley are, in fact, just good friends who happened to get up in a club in Orange County one night two years ago and sing together.

Both boys had their own groups at the time and it was just by chance, or fate, that they discovered they had a good blend and a tremendous amount of "soul."

Their first professional appearance was at the Rendezvous Ballroom in Balboa Beach and they were an instant success. Soon over-flowing crowds were pouring into the Rendezvous to hear the Righteous Brothers and appearances in other Orange County clubs and ballrooms and the Cinnamon Cinders followed.

At the Rendezvous they attracted the attention of Ray Maxwell of Moonglow Records which ultimately resulted in their recording of "Little Latin Lape Lu." which was penned their recording of "Little Latin mark was black suits with preacher-like collars. The success of "Latin Lupe Lu 'led to an appearance on Dick Clark's American Bandstand in Philadelphia — their

In success of Latin Lupe Lul ed to an appearance on stand in Philadelphia – their first national television exposure. After "Latin Lupe Lu" came a succession of West Coast hits such as "My Babe" and "Koko Joe," and their popularity grew in leaps and bounding their popularity grew in leaps and promise their proording artist – including the big names from the East coast.

When the Beatles made their first appearance in the United States (in Washington, D.C.), the Righteous Brothers were on the show and created a great deal of interest among young

and old alike. The Beatles and Brian Epstein were also impressed, and the boys were igned for the 30-day U.S. tour. Prior to Jack Good making

Prior to Jack Good making the rock and roll pilot for the proposed ABC Shindig tour, he witnessed an appearance of the boys in Hollywood and immediately signed them for the pilot, along with Little Richard and Jody Miller.

and lody Miller.

Although this show was never shown, the ABC executives in New York were also quite taken with the Righteous Brothers and they were signed for the next show.

The rest is history, as they

are now regular performers on Shindig and are tremendously popular with viewers throughout the country.

Dick came to KRLA from the frozen wastelands of New York, where he did a daily show over the Mutual radio network which was broadcast over 105 stations. He was the first modern radio dice jockey ever to be given a show by a major network.

Before that he worked at WLS in Chicago, where he earned some of the higest ratings ever recorded in a major city. For two years in a row he was named the nation's top deejay of the year in popular music.
