The two Stones spent several days in jail before being released on bail, set at \$19,600 each, pending appeal. Jagger seemingly un perturbed at the sentence told



LOS ANGELES—The Four
Seasons came to the West Coast to
perform in the area for the first time
and completely conquered all who
saw them. In two different concerts, the accomplished group received the phenomenal standing
ovations so rarely given a pop

Cornering the group at a beach party, they talked openly and freely about their music, their future, and the changes they've gone through.

The group has been going strong since 1962 and when asked how music has changed, Frankie Vall offered his thoughts, "I think there has been a lot of protest music. The world situation has had a great deal to do with the change in music. 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
