"DeeJay Week In Tenn." **Proclaimed by Governor**



It's National Disk Jockey Week in Tennessee Nov. 10 to 16 inclusive, by offical proclamation of Gov. Frank Clement.

The proclamation, issued concurrent with the National Disk Jockey Festival in Nashville Nov. 14 through 16, marks the first time that the Tennessee governor's office has stepped into the celebration with a state-wide observance.

Governor Clement who is well known as a music lover and who has expressed his readiness to help the fight for liberal licensing policies to the end that artists, publishers and writers may find a wider market, will welcome the deejays to Tennessee at a meeting in the War Memorial Auditorium at 10:30 a.m. Friday.

In proclaiming "Disk Jockey Week," Governor Clement presented a scroll to the MUSIC REPORTER as representing "the best interests of music." The presentation was made in the Governor's office and was accepted in behalf of the MUSIC REPORTER by Charlie Lamb, publisher and managing editor of the REPORTER; and by Mark Bates, Editor.

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

Deejay In Best Spot To Put Hits Over


If the record buyer, by exercising his choice of what to buy or what to reject, is king of the music business, then the disk jockey, abetted of course by the labels, publishers and promotion men, is his prime minister.

And like a lot of prime ministers and their political counterparts over the world, he has a lot to say about what his king will see and hear. His judgment may not be infallible, but it carries a lot of weight and that's why he's such an important cog in the musical establishment.

There could be no better proof of the weight he carries than by the way the pubbery personnel, label executives and promotion men seek him out by trade journal advertising, direct mail pieces, and free gifts of new records to be spun.

They all realize that the tune that hits and perhaps sells a million is an elusive thing. There's no red tag on it at the beginning to distinguish it from its fellows. It needs spins to see if the record buyer—king of the musical world—will veto it or give his nod of approval.

And the king, being a capricious fellow himself, may feel different on a Monday than on a Thursday, and different in (Continued on Page 10)






BMI Composer, Stevens To Attend Louisville Premiere of Latest Work



December than in April. You can't stand the king in front of a cluroscope and anticipate the inner workings of his heart and mind . . . if he has a heart and mind . . . which some disappointed promotion men say is doubtful.

The next best thing is to let him taste that musical pudding by exposing it on the air. That's the disk jockey's job and it's the label representative's job to induce him to do it. One deejay in a northern state said so many label reps dropped in that he finally resorted to letting his secretary tape an interview and promise to use it on a future show. It has happened that the record buyer who is king didn't go for the pudding on its first serving. But the accommodating deejay brought it back next meal and the next, and soon the king was smacking his lips too because his fellow-diners liked it. It must be a pretty good dish to start, cooked up by artist, label and publisher but the disk jockey, often overworked, often underpaid and unheralded, should often get the credit for putting a tune over by repetitious spins.

Merged Singing Styles Now Bring Joy To Music Feudists

The Hatfields and the McCoys of the music business are again on speaking terms.

What's more, they've married into each other's families so that it's difficult today for feudin' families to tell who is or was... a Hatfield and who a McCoy.

We're referring, of course, to the pop artists and the C & W artists. The former until not very long ago looked down their noses at the C & W artists, if not down their rifle barrels, and the C & W artists who thought the pop people were acting mighty uppity didn't like it.

The marriage of the two musical fields was achieved when artists of both types successfully combined the two singing styles. It all happened within a few months so that today it is often difficult to determine whether a tune is all pop or all country, or a little of both.

In the forefront of the peaceful revolution were such artists as Elvis Presley, Sonny James, Ferlin Husky, Jim Reeves, Tommy Sands, Faron Young, Bobby Helms, Patsy Cline, Brenda Lee, Jimmy Newman, Bonnie Guitar, Marty Robbins, Jerry Lee Lewis and many others.

The merger of the styles was promptly approved by the record-buying public and both C & W'ers and the 'pop' people were happy again.

For a long time the musically unsophisticated liked to think that the C&W artists moved from "Podunk" to "Hollow Hill" by mule train as they played for the Saturday night "hoedown" in farmer Jones' barn, while the Pop artists with their ruffled-shirts flew from metropolis to metropolis to perform at the higher-crust hotels and golden-gilded niteries.

Only a blind man would have that conception of the music

business today. C&W artists have appeared at the finest clubs in New York, on a multiplicity of 'Pop' shows, numerous network TV shows, in Hollywood's million dollar movies—and most important, they have been selling records from Canada to the Gulf and from the shores of Maine to the Mountains of California and around the world.

The "sociological-psychological barrier" has been broken. C&W music is now receiving its belated acclaim as an integral segment of American music with a world-wide appeal. Only the prejudiced and "deaf and blind" can fail to realize that this revolution has taken place.


It is a healthy development and a just one. Creative music, whatever the style, deserves to receive proper recognition for its contribution to the American music world.


