

MOA Should Take Progressive Actions, Not Just Defensive

Enough time has elapsed since the last MOA Convention in Chicago to begin plans for the 1959 convention.

One of the chief issues at this year's convention, as at many past conventions, was the recurrent effort by ASCAP, BMI et al, to change the Copyright Act of 1909 and inflict performance fees upon juke box operators. At one convention, when it also seemed that a proposal to amend the law might pass Congress, conventioneers were told that MOA would be more important than ever if ASCAP won its point. MOA would then have to see to it that collection of performance fees did not become usurous, and that the percentage to be collected not be raised.

Regardless of what happens to S. 1870 – whether it is reported out of committee or isn't – MOA should take positive actions in other directions. This is the consensus of reports reaching MU-SIC VENDOR.

Delegates inform us that extraneous speeches at conventions are dull and repetitious. We are also told that forum meetings on public relations and taxation have taken on a kind of staleness through the years.

"When are we going to have a national tax council?" readers ask.

"When will we have a real public relations program?" others ask.

Many want to know if MOA has only one issue—the perennial struggle to thwart ASCAP's efforts to collect performance fees. Nobody argues with the importance of this issue. Efforts by MOA to prevent passage of S. 1870, or whatever designation a similar bill will have next year, are applauded.

But let's do more than just that, say the operators.

A national program of public relations is needed, the operators point out.

Working with the PAL is fine, on a local level. Disc jockey shows and tie-ins are great. Cooperation with the March of Dimes and the Heart Fund are wonderful. But they do not constitute a national program of public relations. Most trade associations implement or arrange public relations programs as part of their function, say the operators. Let's have one.

While death and taxes are inevitable, it's debt and taxes for most operators, and the combination can mean the death of a route. Apart from Federal and State taxes, many operators are now being faced with local taxes than can destroy them.

"We need a national tay council," say the operators. "We need it for a variety of reasons." Operators point out that in some state and area associations, tax advice and counsel is part of the association function. Why not with MOA?

Problems aired at many forum meetings at the conventions are usually local. Delegates will speak of their own problems. But they are aware of the bigger problems. Results of the efforts by the Massachusetts operators to overcome the tax burdens imposed by the state and the city of Boston will affect all operators everywhere. Similarly, the results of the action taken by the Music Guild of New Jersey against a proposed ordinance in Jersey City that would impose a \$2,500 "occupation" tax on vendors, will affect operators everywhere.

With a good national program of public relations, it is felt, that operators would not be prey to lawmakers seeking additional tax income.

Regardless of whether we pay performance fees to ASCAP, say many operators, we will always need public relations and a national tax council. Both should be established and provided by MOA.

Mercury Says It's First Major With Stereo Albums

CHICAGO — Mercury Record Corp. claims to be the first major label in the industry formally to announce the creation of stereo-disc, long playing albums.

Included in Mercury's initial release will be seven popular and five classical albums. Selection of the first 12 packages was based on sales of each, when previously merchandised as pre-recorded stereophonic tapes.

Highlight of the release will be a three-record, deluxe package, featuring Maria Meneghini Callas's interpretation of Cherubini's opera, "Medea," recorded "live" at La Scala in Italy. Other numbers will feature Paul Paray, conducting the Detroit Symphony; Antal Dorati conducting the Minneapolis Symphony; Howard Hanson conducting the Eastman-Rochester Symphony; Patti Page; David Carroll; Sarah Vaughan and Billy Eckstine; Richard Hayman; Clebanoff and his Echoing Strings; Griff Williams and his Orchestra and Dick Contino.

Irving B. Green, Mercury's president, indicated that an early July release was anticipated, and that production is currently being geared to handle the expected heavy consumer demand.

Mercury will include in each album, to aid the neophyte stereo record buyer, a guide containing stereo information. Mercury will print record session data, including the equipment used in a special "Hi-Fi Facts' box on the back of each album. Each stereo long-play album will be designated as "Stereo" by a brightly colored identification strip, located at the upper front section of the album cover.

Mercury's stereo-disc sound was produced using a Westrex Cutter and the 45-45 system. Certain "technical modifications" were developed by Mercury's engineers.

Hefti Masters

Neal Hefti's latest venture is making masters and selling them to established labels. Latest such sale was a platter of "Kiss Me" by the Five Grands, which Hefti sold to Brunswick.

RCA Introduces Stereo Cartridge

NEW YORK — A stereophonic tape cartridge was introduced by RCA Sunday, June 1.

The cartridge, a flat plastic unit about 5 inches wide, 7 inches long and a half-inch thick, holds two small spools containing 600 feet of four-channel tape. When placed in an RCA player, the unit is started by pressing a button.

RCA claims the tape will play stereophonically for an hour, and monaurally for two hours. Tape speed is 3.75 inches per second. Most comparable stereophonic tapes now available revolve at 7.5 inches per second. RCA is pricing the tapes at \$4.95 to \$8.95.

Coincident with the introduction of the stereo-tape cartridge, RCA also unveiled a full line of playback equipment.

While the stereo tape cartridge, when used on RCA playback equipment, eliminates threading problems, some engineers feel the 3.75 inches per second speed may be too slow for the best in high fidelity sound reproduction.

RCA engineers state that the stereotape cartridge has a frequency range of up to 15,000 cycles per second, which is comparable to the best LP disc now available.

Development of its stereo-tape has been made available to the rest of the industry by RCA, in hopes other manufacturers will adopt it.

Several competing manufacturers, however, said they would "wait and see" before making any moves.

Camden Pop Piano Album Introduces Achille Scotti

NEW YORK—Newest Camden poppiano album, recorded in New Orthophonic High Fidelity sound, "Somebody Loves Me", features some of the greatest tunes of Gershwin and Porter plus one Irving Berlin favorite "Let's Face The Music and Dance."

The album introduces a bright new European pop personality, Achille Scotti, bling, italian-born musician now working out of Geneva, Switzerland, where the album was recorded.

Sir Louis Sterling, New York-Born Head Of EMI, Dead at 79

LONDON — Sir Louis Sterling, head of Electrical and Musical Industries combine, died here Monday, June 2, three days after his 79th birthday. The combine, one of the largest phonograph and recording enterprises in the world, owned Capitol Records. Sir Louis had resigned from his post in 1939.

Born on the Lower East Side of New York, Louis Saul Sterling went to London as a salesman for the Columbia Phonograph Co., and helped form its British subsidiary, the Columbia Gramaphone Co. In 1931, British Columbia was merged with Gramaphone Ltd., manufacturers of His Master's Voice Records, to form EMI, with Sterling as managing director. The former East Sider who was born on Orchard St., and became a member of the Grand Street Boys, was knighted by George VI in 1937.

One of his earliest record successes was with the team of Moran and Mack, billed in vaudeville, as "Two Black Crows." Many thought it foolhardy to make a recording of comedians, rather than singers, but the Moran and Mack disc sold seven million copies.

Sir Louis, a naturalized Englishman, landed in London with \$30 in his pockets. In his lifetime, he gave millions to employees and charities.



Capitol's Albums for June Tabbed 'Holiday in Hi-Fi'

HOLLYWOOD — Capitol Records, Inc. has labeled its new high fidelity popular and 'Capitol' of the World albums for the June "Holiday In Hi-Fi." All of the new packages, 14 pop and six 'Capitol' of the World, were released last week.

The new pop LP's feature performances by Gordon Jenkins, Glen Gray, Guy Lombardo, Jackie Gleason, Joe "Fingers" Carr, Bobby Hackett, Page Cavanaugh, Mickey Katz, Don Baker, Paul Smith and The Jordanaires with Bob Bain's music.

Making their premiere appearances on Capitol is The Kingston Trio in an album simply tabbed "The Kingston Trio." Also on the June pop release is Volume 16 in the label's "Just For Variety" series, this one featuring the talents of Les Paul and Mary Ford, "Tennessee" Ernie Ford, Margaret Whiting, Nat "King" Cole, Woody Herman, Nelson Riddle, Milt Buckner, Harry James, The King Sisters, Glen Gray, Joe "Fingers" Carr and June Hutton.

Rounding out the pop release is a new rock 'n' roll album displaying the talents of a dozen different rock 'n' roll artists and groups, called "Everybody Rocks." Artists featured are Nat "King" Cole, Bob Bain, The Beavers, Big Dave, Nick Greene, Sonny James, The Five Keys, Johnny Otis, The Four Preps, Tommy Sands, Ray Stevens and Gene Vincent.

To introduce him as Capitol's "Artist of the Month" for June, the label presents "Joe 'Fingers' Carr Goes Continental". More appropriately "Fingers" might be referred to as Capitol's June "You Auto Buy Carr" month.

Cromer, Till Signed By Roulette Records

NEW YORK—Roulette Records has signed two new artists, Austin Cromer, former vocalist with the Dizzy Gillispie band, and Sonny Till, one time lead singer with the Orioles. Cromer's first single is a two sided ballad, "I Think Of You"/"On One Finger Of One Hand." Till's first release pairs "Shy" and "First Blush."

CAESAR ABDICATES

Petrillo Steps Down As AFM Boss

PHILADELPHIA — James Caesar Petrillo, who admitted that he played a lousy horn, but tooted his own, retired Tuesday, June 3, as president of the American Federation of Musicians.

Although he had won many points for musicians through the tumultuous 8 years of his reign, Petrillo did not succeed in collecting performance fees for musicians who played recording dates.

The 66-year-old Petrillo used no standby as he delivered his 45-minute farewell here at the AFM's 61st annual convention. He asked the members to elect Herman D. Kenin, 56-year-old Portland, Ore., lawyer, and West Coast representative of the AFM, as his successor. Kenin and Al Manuti, 48, head of the federation's New York local, were nominated as MUSIC VENDOR went to press.

Petrillo, himself, was nominated, despite his resignation. But Petrillo has said that he would not reconsider the decision he had made last month to retire.

Harry Chansom of Santa Barbara, Calif., nevertheless nominated Petrillo, and said he did so for the good of the union. This detonated a five minute demonstration that brought tears to the retiring union head.

"Little Caesar is bowing out," he said.

"Goodbye, Little Caesar."

Petrillo, who became one of the best known officials in the country during his tenure, will continue as head of the 10,000-member Chicago local, at a salary of \$26,000 a year.

Cavallero Tours

Carmen Cavallero, Decca recording artist, is becoming quite an international figure. He leaves July 18 to appear at the Sporting Club, Monte Carlo, Monaco. From there he will fly to Puerto Rico to make a series of appearances from Aug. 27 to Sept. 8.



"His Master's Voice"

Nipper was an alert, black-and-white fox terrier who belonged to an unknown London artist named Francis Barraud. One day Barraud wound up his studio talking machine, put on a record, and a few minutes later spotted Nipper with his head cocked and listening attentively. Barraud snatched up a brush and palette, sketched the scene, then painted it.

Success came almost immediately. Public demand for copies of the painting soared. Barraud spent the rest of his life painting the scene to meet requests for it.

But this was nothing. An official of the Victor Talking Machine Co. bought trademark rights to the painting and promptly adopted it as the symbol of Victrola phonographs and records. From that day to this—over half a century—it has been exploited as one of the world's most famous trademarks, with an estimated \$50,000,000 spent to promote and advertise it. Today, it's the priceless possession of RCA Victor.

The name of the painting was pinned on it by Barraud, and remained unchanged through the years: "His Master's Voice."

Juke Respectability

For years, the juke box was a subject of ridicule by comedians and editorialists. They poked fun at the garish designs and the refulgence of its neon flashings.

Today's juke boxes, however, are models of contemporary functional design. As their complexity has increased, the mechanisms have been refined and miniaturized. Styling has improved. Like all good design, the modern juke box performs its mechanical disc jockey function in a minimum of space and is a handsome instrument.

Most recent recognition of the juke box has come from Popular Science. In its June issue, an article titled, "How a Mechanical Disc Jockey Works," describes and pictures the functioning of a machine. Operators will be pleased with the sub-head on the article: "Here, in Five Easy Stages, Is What Happens When You Drop a Dime into a Coin Phonograph to Hear our Favorite Hit Tune."

Boxes pictured, include Rock-Ola and Wurlitzer, with diagrams and photos of innards.

The article is also instructive for operators interested in learning how their equipment works.

Boone Continental Hit, Reports De La Viez

WASHINGTON — Pat Boone is a favorite American artist with juke box operators in Switzerland, France and Italy, reports Hirsh de La Viez, of Hirsh Coin Machine Co., who returned with Mrs. de La Viez Thursday, May 29, from a six-week tour of Europe. Last year's Amermican favorite, Jody Sands' "Love Me Tonight," is going strong in many continental locations, says Hirsh.

Robbins Music has a big hit in "Nel Blu Dipinto Di Blu," on the Vogue label. The tune, selected at the Cannes Festival, will be a big hit in America too, Hirsh believes, if the publisher promotes it here. Kalin Twins And Toni



Harold and Herbie Kalin always wanted to be singers, ever since they entertained at the Fire House Christmas Banquet in their home town of Port Jervis, N. Y., when they were five years old.

Toni's father, Phillip Ardizzone, who sang at the Met and La Scala, would have preferred his daughter to follow an operatic career. But Toni chose the pop field instead of pop's field, to the delight of many fans who like her big voice.

The "size" of Toni's voice is due to the operatic coaching she got from her dad. But when she was 16, some classmates urged her to sing with a band during a dance. This led to an audition with Al Trace's orchestra and launched her on a professional singing career. She later sang with Shep Fields and Joe Reisman. After an appearance on the Ed Sullivan show, she was booked into New York's Copacabana. Another break, almost wasn't. She was booked into the Capitol Theatre but had to cancel because of laryngitis. No trouble since them.

The plans of the Kalin Twins were interrupted when Uncle Sam sent Harold to Japan with the Air Force. But Herbie and Harold continued to collaborate on songs via tape records shipped back and forth across 8,000 miles. After some night club appearances in Washington, where they had moved after the war, they came to New York with a demo, but nothing happened. Back home in DC, they met songwriter Clint Ballard Jr., who eventually became their personal manager. Ballard took the demo to Jack Pleis at Decca and . . . you know the rest.


