
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



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Trends and Bends

The current vogue for arranging standards and new tunes as cha-chas has even intrigued Lewis Nichols, columnist in the book review section of The New York *Times*. He suggested recently that titles of books would lend themselves to cha cha suffixes. One we liked that he suggested was "Aku-Aku Cha Cha." That sounds similar to the Mc-Guire Sisters' 'Achoo Cha Cha" for Coral.

Another vogue is still not quite passe. It's the one that gives a rock beat to standards. While some arrangers can give a Latino lilt to standards such as "Tea for Two," others take Latin tunes and give them a Norte Americano rock, such as the instances of "El Rancho Rock" and "Mexican Hat Dance Rock" The question of what this does for hemispheric and international relations we leave to the pundits.

The question about origins and development of trends, we leave to various claimants. But we do take the stand that trends are a vitalizing influence, lending new excitement to the record industry. Usually, when the public fancies a style, others are sure to follow. If the public did not evince interest, the trend wouldn't develop and continue.

Ultimately these fads or trends wane. Fortunately a new one takes over even as the old one lingers.

So let's click those heels and cha cha, as cha cha records click up sales.

'Smoke' On Official Hit Parade Smith-Keely 'Black Magic,' Platters'

TO KNOW HIM IS TO LOVE HIM, recorded by The Teddy Bears on the Dore label continues as the top single in the country, according to the survey authenticated by the Music Guild of America. The week's two new entries in the Top 10 are THAT OLD BLACK MAGIC by Keely Smith and Louis Prima on a Capitol disc, and SMOKE GETS IN YOUR EYES by the Platters on Mercury.

Fifteen new records ascended to the Top 100, with the most phenomenal leap taken by ROCKHOUSE by Ray Charles on Atlantic. It's now 90th and was 156th a week ago on the Music Guild of America's survey in depth.

Six popular, three C&W, four R&B, one EP and one LP qualified as Hit Paraders.

New to the Top 100 are:

THINGS THEY DON'T TEACH YOU IN SCHOOL, (Connie Freed, Challenge); TEACH ME TONIGHT CHA CHA (De Castro Sisters, ABC); ORGAN GRINDER'S SWING (Sam Taylor, MGM); DON'T PITY ME (Dion and the Belmonts, Laurie); WHOSE HEART ARE YOU BREAKING NOW (Johnny Love, TP); ADESTE FIDELIS and SILENT NIGHT (Bing rosby, Decca); C'MON EVERYBODY (Eddie Cochran, Liberty); TILL THE END OF TIME (Nobles, ABC); JINGLE BELL ROCK (Bobby Helms, Decca); DONNA (Richy Valens, Del-Fi); I'LL SEE YOU IN MY DREAMS (Seymour, Heartbeat) and THE WEDDING (June Valli, Mercury).

The Crosby and Helms Decca records have become Yuletide perennials, and constitute smart programming for deejays and juke box operators.

SHOULD DEEJAY PROGRAMMING BE MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSIBILITY?

'Controlled Music' Formats Are Needed, Declares KWK's Mike Ruppe Jr.

(From all indications, the deejay is in a period of transition: Is he to be a free agent, selecting the records he plays on the air? Should he be bound by a Top 40 format? Should station management select the records? Should the deejay be relegated to the role of an announcer? Should he be a personality, who uses recorded music as an ingredient on his variety show? These are some of the questions confronting the deejay today. Mike Ruppe Jr., who is designated as "circulation director" for KWK, St. Louis, Mo., the station with the "Great 38," has issued a bulletin which presents one view of the situation. He titled it, "Why Controlled Music Formats Are Needed!" The exclamation point is Mike's.—Ed.)

The trend, as Mike Ruppe Jr. of KWK sees it, "is for more and more stations to develop an overall music image — on that takes into consideration current music trends and those responsible for selling it on the air — the disc jockey!"

It is up to a program director — Ruppe thinks his designation should be changed to "Program Controller" — to control the music policy of the station to insure this

overall musical image.

Taking the premise that "station management is fully capable of charting its program pattern," Ruppe says "the disc jockey's main responsibility is to management because the station has the responsibility with the listeners."

Management has to consider its particular market. In one or two-station areas, Ruppe feels, the top 40 format is unwise. That's because the average listener will remain tuned in for a longer time, and will, therefore, require more variety.

Ruppe claims that listening habits have changed in recent years and that more time is spent in listening. There is evidence that the amount of time spent in listening is in-

creasing constantly.

"This means," he says, "that the job of the station to come forth with programming that will sustain their (the public) interest gets bigger."

Need 'Compatible' Policy

The stations must achieve a compatible music policy, since music is one of the basic

ingredients of radio programming today. By "compatible," Ruppe means "one that takes into consideration the station's physical and other facilities."

While much of the music policy of a station used to be determined by the dee-jay staff, several factors have dictated a change. Not only have listening habits changed, but so have the requirements of deejays during their working hours. No longer can the deejay be concerned merely with worrying about the records he plays during his air time. "The personality must continually be out in public, must have sharp production on his programs, must get himself involved in so many activities, that he's practically a promotion corporation wrapped up in one," observes Ruppe.

As a result, despite the increase in the number of records released by manufacturers, the deejay has less time to spend listening to new recordings.

Logically, this then becomes manage-

ment's responsibility, says Rupp.

The program director, in effect, becomes the program controller. "Many major market music stations solve their problems by channeling this through a full-time staff member, who is responsible for the administration of the music policy and serves as liaison between the station and the music and recording industries."

Here the trade publications, with their charts, and various surveys guide the selection of music. This selection may be modified by local surveys "plus particular favo-

Carlton Sets Up Special Juke Dept.

NEW YORK — A new department is being established by Carlton Records to deal directly with juke box operators, it was reported last week. Lenny Meisel, eastern district manager for the label, will head the department.

A special premium will be offered to operators who put new Carlton discs on

their boxes.

Reason for the move indirectly "proves" that juke boxes remain a prime means of exposing new tunes since Joe Carlton, president of the label, believes top 40 radio programming can constitute a barrier against newer releases.

Activities of the new department will in no way lessen Carlton's endeavors with distributors and one-stops. Hits and new releases will be involved in the new plan.

Pertinent questions inquire as to the length of time an operator has been in the automatic music business, number of employees and number of dependents.

Stereo Cartridges Must be Compatible

LOS ANGELES — Few stereo phonograph cartridges are fully compatible, declares a local operator who has experimented with several. "To me, a fully compatible cartridge is one that will reproduce a monaural or single channel record as well as a good monaural cartridge can," he says.

Inadequacy of some stereo cartridges in reproducing sound from monaural discs is often camouflaged or obscured by the fact that two amplifiers and two speakers are bound to improve the quality of the sound. "But when the stereo phonograph cartridge is truly compatible," he says, "the improvement in sound is more definitely marked, and it can reproduce a single channel recording without distortion."

During the transitional period, from monaural to stereo, it is most important to use a stereo cartridge that does not distort monaural discs while reproducing the stereo discs properly.

The operator points out that all stereo cartridges should be tested. "Some I've tried have been fair on stereo and poor on monaural," he reports. "There are some which are excellent on both. Improper selection of stereo cartridges for compatible play can spoil the effect of monaural and stereo programming."



rites of the disc jockeys on your staff."

When a station's budget will not allow the hiring of a full-time program controller, says Ruppe, the station must come up with a policy that's "bound to be safe." That, according to Ruppe, is 'C. M." (controlled music). "C.M. is the answer plus strong outside promotion."

Ruppe takes cognizance of the fact that many listeners tune in for segments of time. "So if station A is featuring a close group of 60 hits throughout the week, the majoriaty of its listeners would hear a specific tune only two or three times during that week's period . . . most people would rather hear a 'good' hit tune than a 'bad' programmer."

Why do stations in medium-sized and small market areas adopt a C.M. format?

"One reason," Ruppe answers, "might be due to lack of experienced musical programming personnel. 'Let's play it safe' becomes the motto. Maybe an inflexible budget does not permit addition of a music man to the staff. But I'm sure the basic reason why so many stations in smaller markets have become C.M. conscious is because of reports on what has been achieved" elsewhere.

"But," declares Ruppe. "It was more than a music policy that achieved these high ratings—it was also due to continuous strong promotion!"

Ruppe notes that the number of stations increases yearly and so does the number of disc jockeys employed. Yet there has not been an appreciable increase in the number of "good" air personalities. With smaller stations going in for format programming, Ruppe says "it's going to become harder to find persons who have had a chance to develop an individual air personality.

The solutions to this problem vary with the stations. "Whereas it might seem ideal and very 'community minded' to become a pioneer in popular music exposure," and get on the 'middle of the road' kick," Ruppe points out "it could also lead to financial and other difficulties."

Ruppe would like to see leaders of the broadcasting, music and recording industries and trade journals take more active interest in current programming problems.

While much of the contact work done in the past by trade journals has been on the disc jockey level, Ruppe feels that the trade publications should reach management since management is taking a more active interest in programming.

Ruppe believes the controversy over programming will not be solved immediately. He invites an exchange of opinion and asks that opinions pro and con be sent to him at KWK, 800 N. 12th Blvd., St. Louis, Mo.

His Mercury Disc Spells 'Dollars'

Tony Dalardo's Mercury version of "Come Prima" is the top one, according to our survey. Originally, the performer was designated as "Tony and his Friends," when the hub was sent last spring from Mercury's

affiliate in Italy, Gurtler & Co. He has lots of friends, who put coins in the juke boxes to hear the record, phone their favorite deejays to program it, or buy the disc from retailers.

The signor pictured on our cover is 22 - year - old Tony Dallara, but his name on the record was spelled "Dalardo." After Mercury's A&R staff listened to the dub, the label obtained American rights to the mas-

ter and began pressing it on May 16. The impact of Modugno and Carasone had not become manifest in this country so reaction to "Come Prima" was sporadic.

Then Mercury president Irving Green went to Europe on business in August and returned to Chicago in September enthusiastic about "Come Prima," which had become the top tune on the continent. To capitalize on the Italian trend sparked by "Volare," Mercury decided to re-issue the record spelling out the singer's name in full. But the cable from Italy spelled it "Dalardo" instead of "Dallara." which is correct. So the record went out listing "Tony Dalardo."

Several weeks later, when legal contracts arrived here, it was found that Tony's right name is "Dallara." Reissues of "Come Prima," starting with Nov. 21, make the correction in the spelling.

Whether it's by "Tony and His Friends," "Tony Dalardo" or "Tony Dallara," the title of the record is spelled "Come Prima" and all the gags about it are obvious.

● LPackage of tunes about marriage, love, shoes and rice. Group, a top vocal act, presents good, danceable numbers with occasional organ and guitar backdrop, plus standard rhythm section and piano. Relaxed sound, good close harmony with accent on modern, and small doses of humor here and there give this opus wide appeal. The Charles vocal versions have been widely accepted on Radio, TV, and disks. This should get the same good reception.

Die-cut "T" on cover, exposing part of the picture, should help move this one.

Choir voices are recorded at slow speed and then-re-recorded to get the "Mouse" effect. Great cover for children and attractively priced.

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
