No Miracles

Although this is the second time the American Record Manufacturers And Distributors Association is holding a national meeting, the one this year in Atlantic City has caught the imagination of the trade as has no other action taken by the record industry to date.

While the opportunities are many, the pitfalls of over-enthusiasm must, at all costs, be avoided. Even the best resolutions, without significant patterns of activity, can lead only to further frustration and desiccation.

The hopes of the industry are largely centered on the will to accomplish a unified command that can speak for the industry with words of intelligence as well as strength. In this connection, one of the more important decisions the convention will have to make is for proper and adequate representation in Washington.

We do not see the necessity for a czar to rule over the business of making music, since music — all kinds of music — needs to obey only its own inner laws and not the dictates of a super-umpire. Proper representation in Washington requires the capacities of a person of serious concern — and, most particularly, one who knows the music business and knows how to defend its interests as well as the challenge it presents.

Of course, the down-to-earth problem of sheer economic survival for the small independents operating on high hopes and low budgets is a factor that will not be overlooked either. Nor will the major independents or the so-called major labels themselves be shortsighted enough not to wish their smaller brothers the best of luck. Perhaps because of their greater mobility and freedom of action, the indies have been able to come up with artists and a kind of music that has been absorbed by the major labels to their profit.

Thus, while much will be accomplished by ARMADA in Atlantic City, we do not look for miracles. To seek for miracles is to indicate the need for action. Then you need only sit and pray. What is necessary is to fulfill the meaning and the significance of this great meeting with the high purposes for which it has been convened.

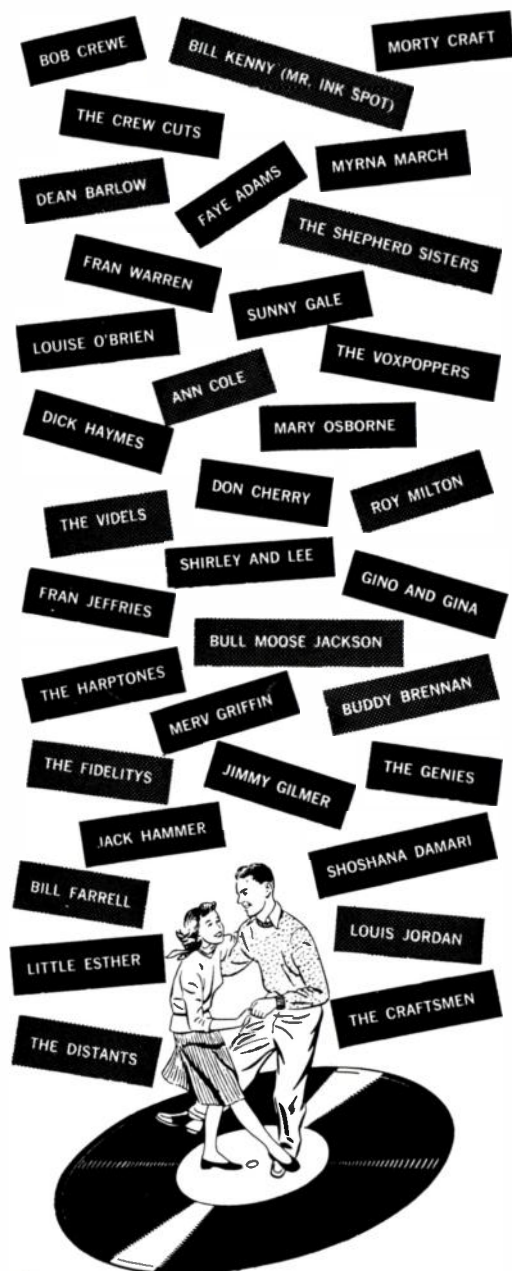

All the distributors were accused by the commission of giving money or other valuable consideration to disc jockeys to have their records played to help increase sales.

The six distributors named by the FTC are: Musical Suppliers, Inc., Boston; Record Merchandisers, Inc., St. Louis; State Record Distributors, Inc., and Whirling Disc Record Distributors, Inc., Cincinnati; Indiana State Record Distributors, Inc., Indianapolis; and Herman Lubinsky, operating as the Savoy Music Co., Newark, N.J.

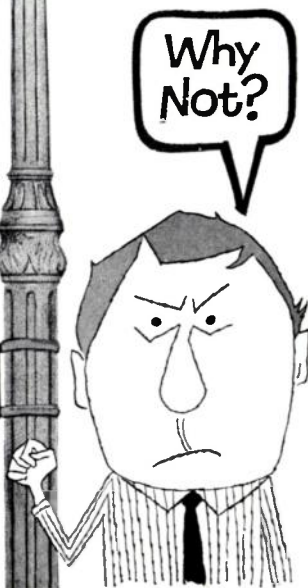

Indies Showing Strong As ARMADA Confab Opens

With the convention of the American Record Manufacturers And Distributors Association at hand, a check of the Music Vendor charts shows the independent labels scoring on sixty per cent of the hits on the top 100 charts. ARMADA is composed primarily of independent manufacturers and distributors.

If success on the charts is any indication of strength, ARMADA has certainly demonstrated enough power to send a representative to Washington who could speak with authority for the majority of the record industry.

An ARMADA spokesman would represent more than three hundred record manufacturers and distributors. Ewart Abner Jr., the organization's president, has gone on record in favor of a rep as opposed to an industry czar advocated by other delegates to the convention.

The feasibility of keeping a permanent representative in Washington will be one of the most important items on the agenda at

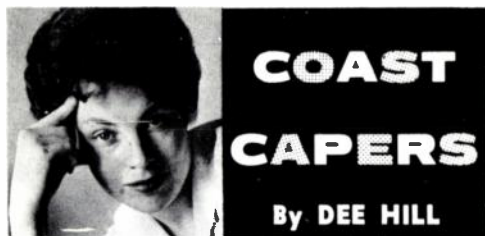

N. J. Uncovers Wide Bootlegging Ring

■ Evidence collected in the cracking of a nation-wide record bootlegging operation centered in New Jersey will be turned over to a grand jury next week according to Bergen County Prosecutor Guy W. Calissi's office.

The DA's men would not discuss what charges the grand jury might level against the bootleggers if they found the evidence sufficient for prosecution.

New Jersey authorities swooped down on the nation-wide ring last week with raids on a Fort Lee distributor and a Newark jobber. The name of both are being withheld pending formal charges.

Prior to the raids, Calissi's men said they made a local shopping tour which showed that at least half of Cameo's Bobby Rydell discs on sale were bootlegged. Music Vendor two weeks ago reported excessive pirating of Rydell's "Swingin' School."

The prosecutor's office said Cameo and an unnamed New York manufacturer were the hardest hit firms discovered so far. Over 45 singles are involved, he said.

According to Calissi, the bootlegged records were made in California and shipped by air freight to the distributor in Fort Lee. The Fort Lee raid led to the investigation of a New York bakery where 6,000 pirated discs were discovered in a refrigerator. Another raid was made last week by Essex County authorities on a Newark jobber.

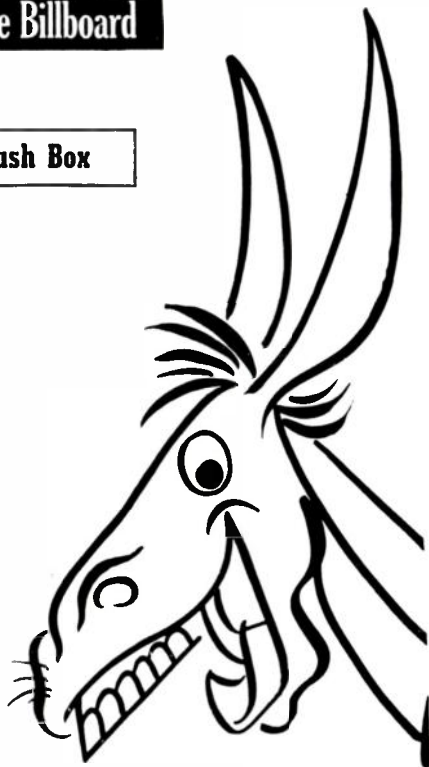

Police Cool Beatnik Album Stunt

■ NEW YORK—A cluster of "cats" plugging a pair of beat albums in the window of the Record Hunter last week drew a large crowd including the local fuzz who promptly put an end to the stunt. The two albums, "Beat Generation Folk Lyrics" and "Bizarre," are waxed on the Musitron label.

The beats were swingin' in the window of the Fifth Avenue Record shop until a square from the Fifth Avenue Association thought they were too far out and blew the whistle.

When the law arrived they found the cats writing poetry on a blackboard, running around barefoot, painting and meditating. The cops told store officials that this was definitely the end and backed it up with a summons. The Record Hunter was charged with violating a law which makes a live demonstration in a store window a misdemeanor.

However the promotion idea has not gone to pot completely. Talat Sait Halman, the store's vice president said that "if we are convicted we will take the case to the Supreme Court."

Political Spoof Sent To Both Parties

■ Copies of the new Hanover-Signature political spoof "Anyone for President"/"Unequal Time," waxed by Eddie Lawrence have been sent to leaders of the Democratic and Republican parties. Buddy Robbins, the label's vice president, says that among those who acknowledged receipt and a few chuckles are Vice President and Mrs. Nixon, Senators Lyndon Johnson and Jacob Javits, and Governors Nelson Rockefeller, Abraham Ribicoff and G. Mennen Williams.

Lester said that Lu Ann's first record for Top Rank, *Mark My Words/One Girl, Two Boys*, has just been released.

Super-disc Set For Industry

The record industry may soon acquire a disc guaranteed to stand the test of time—physically. A new all-weather record which will bend but not crack may soon be supplied by the Dupont Chemical and American Vericose companies.

Though the disc can be twisted, heated, frozen and played thousands of times without showing any wear, it is still vulnerable to the fluctuations of the charts.
