

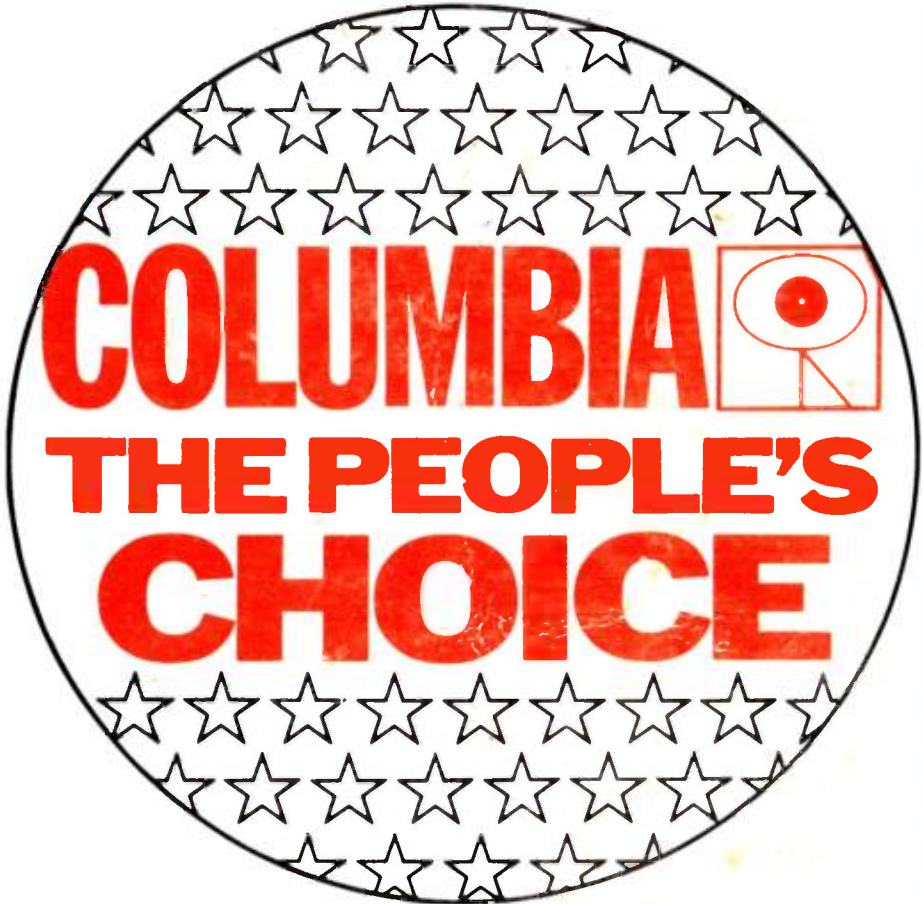

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Like April In July

April is the cruellest month, according to T. S. Eliot. But to the popular mind April means Spring, and Spring is the season of new beginnings. And suddenly the sound of music on singles is again being heard through the land.

After this flowery introduction we would recall that last week in this space we said that the record industry was bound to do something "about the so-called declining singles market."

Then we recorded RCA Victor's tie-in promotion with Remington-Rand typewriters on the theme "Be A Hit At School."

This week we are glad to report that Columbia Records, cognizant of the importance of singles as the backbone of the record industry, is announcing a major campaign built around the 33-speed monaural single.

We are, of course, in accord with Goddard Lieberson when he says: "Single records continue to be the most significant media for the introduction and development of new popular music, talents and personalities."

This accent on singles by two of the giants in the industry is sure to be reflected in a spurt of singles activity throughout the trade. The confidence inspired by these new promotional techniques and new ideas must result in a widening of the market from its past limited appeal to the teenager market alone. This is especially true of the 33-speed single.

As is well known, the mechanics of playing a 45 rpm record have usually confined them to the younger set in the family; while the long-playing record or album has been left for Mom and Dad as a finer property. Now, with the 33-speed single, home programming will be made easier for every member of the family. That is why we envision a wider market for singles of all speeds in the future.

But singles are not an end in themselves. They are also the means of introducing new personalities, as Mr. Lieberson says, and of serving as the basic material from which hit albums are made.

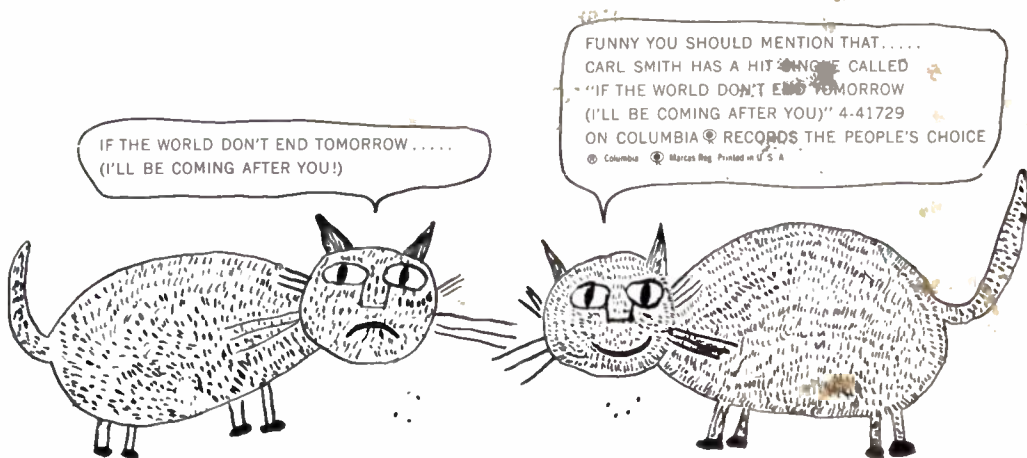

MGM Unveils 'Starpower' Display

Orlando Beach, P. R. MGM Records unveiled its new "starpower" albums for 1960 at its convention here last week.

The label packed the following punch into its fall promotion campaign aimed at distributors: a 20 per cent bonus in album merchandise (buy 5,000 records and receive an additional 1,000 at no charge), the regular 6½ per cent return in addition to the bonus, a 100 per cent exchange privilege on the "starpower" releases, a liberal new extended dating plan, and a 2 per cent cash discount on orders placed at the convention.

Another highlight of the convention was label vice president Sidney Brandt's statement that MGM now has the strongest team of independent distributors in the country.

Label president Arnold Maxin made the welcoming address outlining the tremendous growth of the label during the past year.

Convention delegates were also addressed by other label execs including A & R staffers Ray Ellis, Jesse Kaye, Jim Vienneau and Eddie Heller; advertising and publicity manager Sol Handwerker, and sales manager Charles Hasin.

Joe Linhart Joins Victor

■ The appointment of Joe Linhart as music director of popular A&R at RCA Victor Records has been announced by Robert L. Yorke, division vice-president, commercial records creation department, RCA Victor Records.

As music director, Linhart will be responsible for all Broadway original cast albums as well as East Coast movie and TV soundtracks. He will look for new talent and new Broadway shows for recording purposes and will audition both and produce the final product on LP himself. In addition, he will also produce LP's for a specially-selected roster of artists.

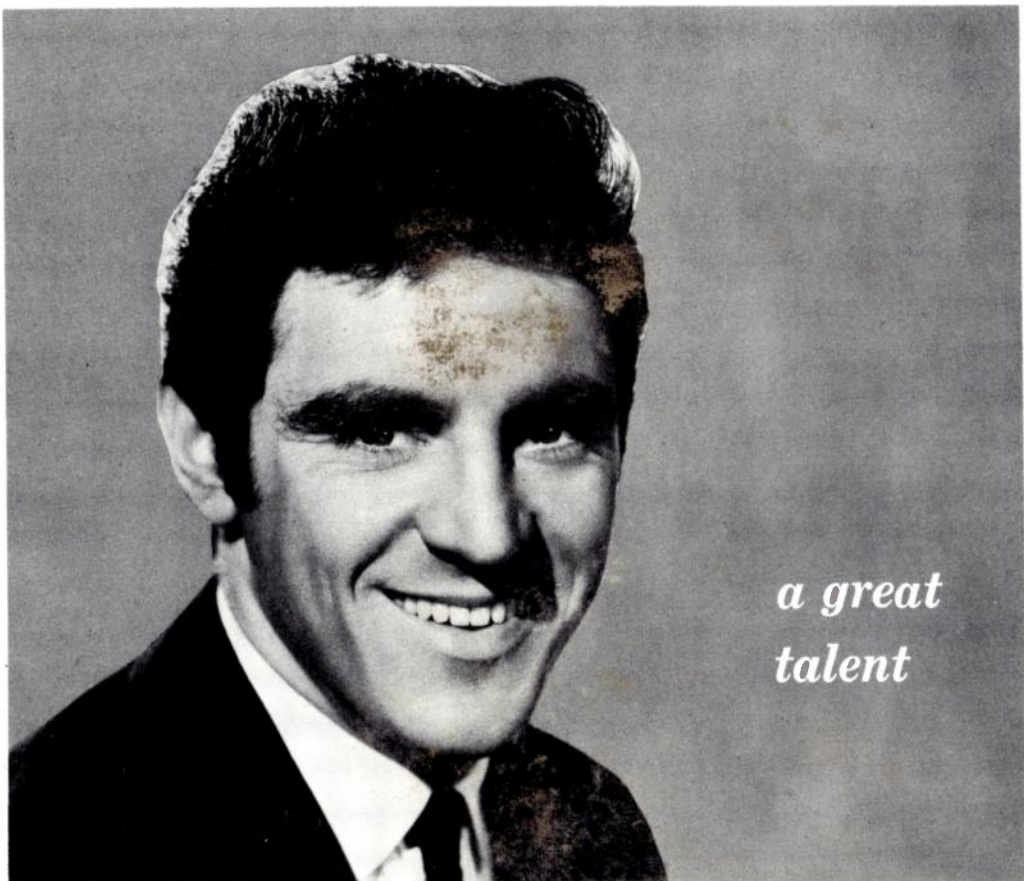

Columbia Convention Spotlights Mono 33 Singles and 4-Track Tape

MIAMI BEACH—Columbia Records announced at its convention here last week that it has entered the 33 1/3 monoaural singles field. In addition to the introduction of the 33-speed monoaural disc, other highlights at the parley were the unveiling of four-track stereophonic tape releases, and a new market development program.

More than 400 Columbia executives, distributors and distributor salesmen, including representatives from 15 countries, gathered at the preview of the label's new fall product and merchandising program.

LIEBERSON BOOSTS SINGLES

Announcing Columbia's decision to manufacture and market the 33 mono single, Goddard Lieberman, label president, said that the company decided to issue its single 33 as a stimulus to the singles market.

"Single records continue to be the most significant media for the introduction and development of new popular music, talents and personalities," he said.

"Today, Lieberman continued, "an ever increasing majority of adults purchase only 33 rpm album packages. As a result, singles have become the domain of the very young. And now, even they are turning to albums in increasing numbers and show a reluctance to buy both with the mechanical difficulty of interchanging 45's with LP's.

"The 33 rpm single record which automatically interchanges with 12" albums, offers the most promising avenue for recapturing this vital but diminishing market. The first step in this direction was taken exactly one year ago when Columbia introduced to the stereo phonograph owner the stereo seven 33 single. Despite a limited market, the 7" 33 concept received gratifying consumer acceptance—and even more, immediate acceptance in the juke box industry.

"Now, reaching out to the broadest possible phonograph ownership market, Columbia introduces its monoaural 33 single record.

Starting with our next release, each new Columbia single will be released simultaneously in both 45 and 33 monoaural. In addition, our top selling singles will continue to be released in stereo seven.

"In introducing stereo seven, Columbia took a bold step—alone. This time other manufacturers, seeing the urgent need to revitalize the singles market and agreeing with Columbia that 33 singles are the media with which to do it, have already announced their intention to produce monoaural 33 singles. However, I am pleased to say that again Columbia will be the first major company to actually market these records and have them available in stores."

FOUR TRACK STEREO TAPE

Lieberman also announced Columbia will begin releasing four-track stereophonic tapes in September. All subsequent new tape releases, as well as selected earlier hit albums, will be available in both two-and-four track stereophonic editions.

Convention business also included Columbia's fall marketing program for its distributors. During August and September, Columbia will offer its distributors re-stocking incentives pertaining to all items in the current catalog. Stocking incentives will also cover all Columbia new releases scheduled to be in stores during those months. Columbia's fall program also includes special dating terms which will be in effect October, November and December.

PRODUCT PROMOTION

In order to continue its policy of selling product through, rather than to, the dealers, Columbia will equip its salesmen with a new and improved "profit pack." The profit pack, first introduced at last year's convention, proved highly successful in stimulating sales through the dealer. This year's additions to the new "profit pack" will include special tools, equipment and materials designed to make Columbia's salesmen merchandising specialists.

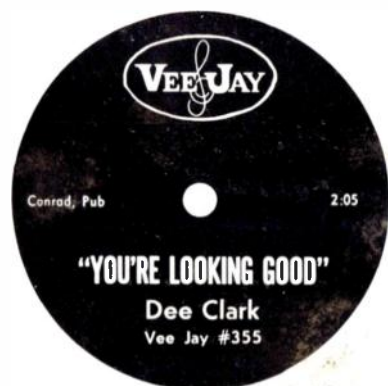

Victor to Issue 23 LP's In 'Best Buy' Campaign

RCA-Victor will release 23 new albums in its "best buy" program this year according to George R. Marek, vice president and general manager of the label's record division.

The program was initiated by company executives in four regional distributor meetings throughout the country held recently. These conferences were followed by local dealer meetings held by most of Victor's distributors.

The new LP's — 11 pop and 12 Red Seal — will be released during August and September. They will be promoted under the theme, "The New Sound America Loves Best," a variation on the RCA slogan, "Music America Loves Best."

Victor claims a 26 per cent increase in the time invested in creating the albums, and a 35 per cent increase in the cost of producing them. Every album is available in both monaural and stereo. All the stereo albums contain the new anti-static ingredient, "Miracle Surface."

The promotion campaign for Victor's "best buy" program will cover television, radio, national magazines, trade publications and newspapers. It will be highlighted by:

- A joint promotion with John H. Breck, Inc., manufacturer of hair preparations, following up last year's successful joint-promotion with Breck. Consumers who send in one dollar plus a Breck box top label or facsimile from September 1, to the end of the year, will receive a special Victor preview LP containing 15 pop and Red Seal selections from the 23 "best buy" albums.

- A discount on all three and four package operatic releases. All 4-LP opera sets will sell for the price of 3, and all 3-LP opera sets will sell for the price of 2.

- A money-back guarantee offer on the keynote LP of the 23 albums, the John Klein-Sid Ramin LP, "The New Sound America Loves Best." Consumers will get their money back if they don't agree that this album "offers the most exciting sound yet."

Also included in the campaign will be ten new albums on the RCA-Camden label.

● That peerless pair return with a lovely rock-a-ballad done in the good old r-n-r style. The kids'll love it.
