

Sounds For A Summer Night

Some weeks ago in this space we said that what was needed in the industry was a new sound, something novel to spice up what was getting to be a pretty routine output. Well, the new sound is here and it's the sound of the novelties.

It is not surprising therefore, to find "the Bikini song" by Brian Hyland on Kapp in the number one slot on the charts this week, while such gimmicky arrangements as "Yogi," by the Ivy Three on Shell; "Bongo Bongo," by Preston Epps on Original Sound, and "Kookie Little Paradise," by Jo Ann Campbell on ABC-Paramount are on the way up.

And now a new novelty-"Robot Man," by Iamie Horton on Joy-threatens to scare its way to national attention.

If one adds to these such novelty songs as "I Shot Mr. Lee," "Hot Rod Lincoln," "The Twist," and "Cholly-Oop," it becomes all too clear that there is a trend-although this trend seems to have been influenced in some cases by midsummer madness.

What all this proves is that <u>\(\)</u> usic business, spurred on by the great success of "Alley Oop" and "Mule Skinner Blues," has gone all out to produce more novelties, some imitative of earlier hits, but many interesting and original numbers in their own right. Of course, the first great novelty of the year was Mercury's "Running Bear," by Johnny Preston.

However, a word of caution. There can be too much of a good thing, and this is especially true of so perishable an item as a novelty. Nothing palls as quickly as the third carbon copy of what must, by definition, be a one-shot success. The wise record exec will be judicious in his choice of offbeat material, and, above all, will strive to originate rather than to imitate.



Terry Snyder Signed By United Artists

Art Talmadge announced the signing of Terry Snyder to an exclusive recording contract with United Artists Records. The label's Vice President and General Manager said that final arrangement with Snyder have been completed by David V. Picker, Executive Vice President and Don Costa, Director of Artists & Repertoire. The signing of Terry Snyder signals the kick-off of a new Sound Series to be released series will be released on a new label Ultra Audio (using the initials of the parent label) a product of United Artists Records.

Snyder is credited with being chiefly responsible for the huge success of the Command line. Snyder's "Persuasive Percussion" album on Command is the top selling album on the Music Vendor charts. Snyder developed the ideas for other strong selling albums on the Command label including "Provocative Percussion."

The first album in the new Ultra Audio series will be "Mister Percussion" by Terry Snyder and the All-Stars and will be released as one of five albums to retail for \$4.98 in mono and \$5.98 in stereo.

Johnny Angle Leaves Ace; May Form Own Label

Johnny Angle has announced his resignation as sales and promotion director for Ace Records, and has indicated that he may form his own label soon. Angle served in the executive post with Ace for two years.

Five More Labels Hop On Promo Bandwagon

Five more labels have announced their new fall lines as one of the most concentrated sales campaigns in the trade's history continues. The latest quintet of diskeries climbing on the season's promo bandwagon are Mercury, Warner Brothers, London, Decca and Coral.

Warner Brothers is releasing 10 new mono and stereo albums during this month and September. James B. Conkling, the label's president says, "by releasing fewer albums but ones with higher potential, we are giving our distributors a better opportunity to promote and sell each item." Conkling attacked what he termed the "buckshot method" of releasing albums charging that it tended to glut the market.

LONDON ACCENT ON DEALERS

London's sales campaign this year is attuned to the dealers. The label is offering them a 100 per cent paid ad program, a series of special double-pack LP's, a group of selected premium offers and availability of gift wrap material at reduced cost—all this in addition to the usual dating and discount plans.

The program was presented recently at the label's distributor meeting in New York's Hotel Manhattan.

It gives dealers a 10 per cent discount until September 30 on all London Records including the new August releases of twenty classical and four pop packages. Dating calls for one-third payments Oct. 10, Nov. 10, and Dec. 2, with a two per cent discount.

Each of the double-packs consist of two albums, poly-bagged together with front covers facing out. Dealers get 11 of these for the price of 10, plus the extra 10 per cent discount.

The premium offer includes many gambits. For instance, the consumer will receive a new American flag for two dollars plus the coupon enclosed with Mantovani's "American Scene" album. In the ad campaign, dealers will receive a sum for local advertising equivalent to 10 per cent of their purchases from the label until September 30. The money must be spent ex-

clusively on London product or the lines of any of its subsidiaries. To bolster this deal, London will undertake a \$150,000 advertising program encompassing 23 consumer magazines.

MERCURY STRESSES STEREO

Mercury's fall releases include 13 albums, 12 of which preem in stereo and monaural simultaneously. The LParade is led by Clyde McPhatter's "May I Sing for You," the rock 'n roller's first collection of standards. The lone exclusively monaural release is "Country Church Time," a C&W album by George Jones.

DECCA, CORAL ANNOUNCE PLANS


Decca outlined its "Rainbow of New Products" campaign at a recent meeting at the Hotel New Yorker. It consists of 30 albums, all but 2 of which are available also in stereo. At the same meeting, Coral previewed its fall program, highlighted by 13 new packages. The label is emphasizing heavy shipment of display pieces to dealers to help the new line. In addition, the entire Coral-Brunswick catalog excluding tapes, is being offered to dealers at a 10 per cent extra discount plus 2 per cent for cash providing a minimum order of \$50 is placed. Both the Decca and Coral deals expire Sept. 16.

Dot Plugs Billy Vaughn This Month

August will be "Billy Vaughn Month" at Dot Records. The label is fashioning a sales campaign around 18 of Vaughan's albums.

The drive will be highlighted by a discount plan offering a free LP for every 10 albums purchased, and a similar deal for EP's.

In addition to promoting Vaughan, Dot is also accenting several singles this month including Pat Boone's "Candy Sweet," Debby Reynolds' "I'll Pretend," Dodie Stevens' "No," Keely Smith's "Close," and Bobby Reed's "Monkey's Wedding."



Juke Box Industry Asks US For Favorable Trade Terms

As we go to press, the jukebox industry is scheduled to ask the government to maintain tariffs on imported juke boxes and press other countries to lower their tariffs on American coin machines.

Hearing the appeal will be the U.S. Committee for Reciprocity Information which is securing the views of American businessmen prior to negotiating new international trade agreements in Geneva this fall.

Represented at the hearing are the Secburg Corp., the Wurlitzer Co., Rock-Ola Manufacturing Corp., the AMI Division of the Automatic Canteen Corp., and United Music, Inc. The appeal is being made by Perry Patterson of the law firm of Kirkland, Ellis, Hodson, Chaffetz and Masters.

The trade feels that the government should defend its interests since it contends that the jukebox industry has never been an overly prosperous one. Of a dozen companies involved in producing coin machines during the past 20 years only 5 have survived.

Those remaining in the field argue that their survival is due mostly to increased concentration on exports, diversification of

'Artist of Week' Promo Upping Profits for Ops

Music operators in the northeast have reported as much as a 20 per cent increase in gross earnings since subscribing to Seeburg's new "artist of the week" promotion with its accent on 33% singles. This was revealed at a meeting of 75 operators at the Waverly Inn in Cheshire, Conn., sponsored by Atlantic New York Corp., Seeburg distributors for Connecticut.

The operators were addressed by Gene Weiss of Columbia, Joe Mathews of Capitol, and two Seeburg officials, Jack Gordon, vice president in charge of phonograph sales and Bill Prutting, district manager.

Seeburg is presently engaged in a nationwide tour selling operators on its new machine which handles all seven-inch records, 45's, and monaural and stereo 33%'s. Columbia and Capitol are the only labels which production, and in one case, diversification through absorption by a larger concern in a different area of manufacturing.

American juke box manufacturers are worried over the decline in their exports which fell by 1,502 last year down to 15,640.

have announced production of 33% singles in both stereo and monaural.

According to Meyer Parkoff of Atlantic, in addition to the increased gross profits reported by "two-speed operators," more than 100 operators in the metropolitan New York area have already adopted the new Seeburg jukeboxes which play 33½ singles in addition to 45's.

This may help allay the fears of some manufacturers who are wary of entering the 33-speed singles field because they doubt that operators in large numbers will start purchasing 33½ jukeboxes in earnest.


These doubts were reflected by one marufacturer who said, "as long as the teenagers still identify with the 45, and I'm not convinced the operators are really starting to buy the two-speed jukeboxes, why should I rush in and invest extra money in producing 33% singles at this early date. I can afford to wait a little while longer."



NARM Attacks 'Jack Robbers'

The National Association of Record Merchandisers issued another warning to its members to maintain a constant vigil against the inroads of "jack robbers"—individuals engaging in unfair business practices while posing as legitimate rack jobbers. The NARM warning was accompanied by a letter which John Edgerton, of Record Supply, Inc., in San Francisco has sent to all his customers.

Edgerton cautions them against the "jack robber," and proposes that they ask him the following questions if they are ever approached by one: "How often does he service? What size inventory does he propose? How does he handle special orders? How many titles does he maintain in single 45's? What type of fixtures does he recommend? How about display materials and title cards? What are his other installations where his service can be checked? Is he a member of NARM?"

Edgerton believes that "most 'jack robbers' will leave before the list is completed, or they will be at a loss to answer intelligently, because they won't know the answers."

"This is due to the fact that the 'jack robber' is not a record man," Edgerton says. "He's simply out there trying to get the gravy without paying for the meal."

After quoting Edgerton's letter, the NARM statement went on to charge "jack robbers" with having "no interest in establishing sound and ethical business practices for the industry." It recommended that members of NARM distribute literature similar to Edgerton's to their members.



MOA Starts Early On '61 Convention

Hardly three months after the last convention held by the Music Operators of America in Chicago, the organization is getting off to a headstart on plans for its parley next year. The convention will be held at the Deauville Hotel in Miami Beach, May 15-17.

MOA exec Willie Blatt cited several reasons for what he hoped would be "the most successful meeting ever held under the auspices of the Music Operators of America"

First he said that with the tremendous strides made by the Coin Machine Council this year, the industry has a better public image, and coin men are now more interested in attending trade parleys.

Also making next year's convention more attractive, according to Blatt, are the economical accommidations "which will suit everyone's pocketbook." "In fact," he said, "rooms and meals will cost less than what we have paid for rooms only, at some of the hotels in Chicago during past conventions." This is the first MOA parley ever held in Miami Beach.

Blatt said that coinmen would have the opportunity of "making this both a business trip and a vacation for their families." He felt that this "would bring back the spirit and enthusiasm which we enjoyed years ago."

Blatt emphasized that "all types of amusement device manufacturers will be invited, to attract many more of the vending machine people." He said the MOA was doing this "since we realize that today, music operators throughout the country have diversified their businesses to the extent of operating just about everything in coin operated equipment.

• Cabin is a real country flavored side with subdued chorus background. Porter sings the sad tale of a son returning too late and finding the cabin, old oaken bucket and well for sale. Flip side is upbeat country tune with nice piano and drum work. Pick 'em.

This album showcases Johnny's talent in a combination of ballads and up-tempo songs. Three different instrumental combinations—a jazz group; a light rhythm combo; and a strong orchestra each provide backing for four numbers. Selections include That's My Desire, Together Lost In A Trance, Alone Together and other tunes to think and dream by along with Johnny Nash.

STRING ALONG WITH THE KINGSTON TRIO - CAPITOL ST 1407

• Sure to climb the charts is this newest package by one of America's favorite vocal groups, The Kingston Trio. They lead off with the two sides of their latest single, Bad Man Blunder and The Escape Of Old John Webb and continue with ten delightful ballads such as Leave My Woman Alone, Everglades and Colorado Trail.

RALLY 'ROUND! - The Brothers Four - CO-LUMBIA CL 1479

• This is the second album for the boys. Their first entitled *The Brothers Four* was a national best seller and contained the smash hit single *Greenfields*. This LP includes *My Tani*, their current chart rider, and a host of folk ballads, love songs and tongue-in-cheek novelties. DARIN AT THE COPA - Bobby Darin - ATCO 33-122

 Bobby Darin's opening night at the world famous Copacabana was an SRO affair and so was his entire engagement. ThisLP recorded in its entirety at the Copa is an excellent sampling of his night club act. Bobby's two chart smashes, Mack The Knife and Bill Bailey are featured as well as Clementine, You'd Be So Nice To Come Home To, I Can't Give You Anything But Love, and Alright O.K. You Win. Mr. Darin proves that he not only is a singing star but a night club showman as well.

THE BLUES AND THE BEAT - Henry Mancini -RCA VICTOR LSP 2147

• Henry Mancini and a long list of top musicians provide modern, listenable music comprising the blues and the beat which are in essence the structure of jazz. A blue feel is inherent in After Hours, Smoke Rings, Mood Indigo and the others on the first side. The jazz beat is preserved on Sing, Sing, Sing, Big Noise from Winnetka and the others on side two. The overall pack offers fresh, new and appealing musical sounds in the form of jazz.

HITS FROM THE HILLS - The Merrill Staton Choir - EPIC LN 3703

• A first for the Merrill Staton Choir—an album of popular tunes with a vigorous beat, presenting a dozen country-flavored favorites in up-tempo danceable arrangements by Merrill Staton and Earl Sheldon. The choir lends itself beautifully to the rhythmic accents of a dancing mood. Billy Hill, one of the great country-and-western songwriters wrote seven of the pieces represented among which are: In the Chapel in the Moonlight, The Glory of Love, Have You Ever Been Lonely and The Old Spinning Wheel.

STUNNING TURENDOT LEADS OFF FALL RED SEAL SERIES

Leading off RCA's Red Seal fall series are two operas. The first is a three disk set of Puccini's last opera, the magnificent Turendot (LSC-6149) with a dream cast of Sopranos Brigit Nilsson and Renata Tebaldi, Tenor Jussi Bjoerling and Basso Giorgio Tozzi in the leading roles. The second, a three LP set is Verdi's Il Trovatore (LSC-6150) with Soprano Leontyne Price as Leonora, Tenor Richard Tucker as Manrico, Bass Giorgio Tozzi as Ferrando and in his last operatic recording Leonard Warren as Counti di Luna. Both LPackages contain complete librettos in Italian and English. Also included are biographical notes on each of the performers and a synopsis of the opera. These two thrilling performances were recorded in the Rome Opera House and produced by Richard Mohr. For the first time these complete sets are available at new popular prices. Formerly sold at \$14.98 for Regular LP and \$17.98 for Living Stereo, they can now be had for \$9.98 and \$11.98 respectively.

Additionally, RCA Victor's fall lineup of classical recordings includes the very beautiful Scheherazade (LSC 2446) which after numerous recordings continues to fascinate us all; the Nutcracker Suite (LSC-2328) by Tchaikovsky which remains a perennial concert favorite; the Pines of Rome and Fountains of Rome, the two most popular of Ottorino Respighi's three tone poems are brilliantly performed by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra directed by Fritz Reiner and finally Morton Giuld and his orchestra play brilliant excerpts from Bizet's Carmen (LSC-2437), while the enticing cover should add considerable sales appeal.

SPECTACULARS FROM MGM

An imaginative series of Spectaculars In Sound produced by MGM A&R executive Eddie Heller comprises five LP's devoted to Sound for the true Hi-Fi enthusiast. The enormous talents of Roger King Mozian were called up to help create both Spectacular Percussion (E-3845) and Spectacular Brass (E-3844). The first fea-

tures top percussionist Willie Rodriguez, with Eddie Costa on vibes, alto and flute solos by Dick Meldonian, and jazz trumpet solos by Phil Sunkel. Selections include South Of The Border, Carioca, and two originals by Roger King Mozian—the crackling Repercussion and the sinuous Asia Minor. The latter, Spectacular Brass, encompasses show hits, wonderful standards and a pair of originals by Roger (Journey's End and Blue Brass). King Mozian adds more excitement to the package with his own trumpet magic.
