



### **Editorially Speaking**

Once again, it is World Series time . . . and time, too, when the record companies are in full promotional swing for the brisk season ahead. According to all surveys and reports, the coming season will indeed be brisk in sales.

The singles picture is brighter than it has been in a long time, and there is a trend on the part of manufacturers toward greater promotional effort on this product. The album picture shapes up as the best ever. And it appears that phono sales will continue their upward spiral, with three stereo units currently being sold for every mono, although sales of the mono LP are accounting for the major share of total album sales in just about the reverse proportion.

What does it all add up to?

That the record business looms bigger than ever, despite the many changes it has undergone, and indeed, will continue to undergo in common with other industries in this up-tempo'd world.

Among many promotions launched this month are Roulette's Count Basie Anniversary jazz push and RCA Victor's Red Seal opera package drive.

These and other promotions underline the fact that here in America there is a market for music of every category, from jazz to opera.

The music market is as vast as its appetite is varied. The men of the record industry will continue to feed that appetite. Some of their musical viands will be more attractive and satisfying to the consumer than others, and the intelligent or lucky purveyor (change the order of these adjectives, if

you will) will be amply paid in coin.


The months ahead are challenging. To many if not all in the record business, there is every indication that they will be exceptionally fruitful. The outlook for October, November and December-added to what has been one of the best summers in some time-makes an outstanding entry for an all-time high on the sales charts . . . True, there will be individual soft, spots, and some sore spots too, but the industry as a whole moves into the final quarter of '60 with a jauntiness that denotes good health.

To all its readers, contributors, advertisers and friends in general MUSIC VENDOR extends appreciative greetings and best wishes at this most

## **Count Basie Ann'y Themes Roulette's Biggest Promo**

Highlight of Roulette's October sales program is a month-long celebration of Count Basie's 25th anniversary as a jazz artist, with a special bonus offer of any LP in the diskery's Birdland series to be given away free with every two packages purchased from the Birdland catalog. Included in the offer, being made to dealers and consumers as well as Roulette distribs, are three new Basie LP's: "The Count Basie Story," a 2-disc "cavalcade" of the Basie career, with notes by Leonard Feather and documentary photos; "String Along With Basie" (a first for the Count with strings); and "Just The Blues" with Joe Williams.

With over 3,500 window display kits distributed to retailers, ad space purchased in a dozen top consumer publications, and an all-out public relations drive, the Basie Silver Anniversary adds up to Roulette's major promo effort ever. Prexy Morris Levy tags it a "truly momentous occasion."

On the pop front, this month's releases are: "Banjo And Calls-Sing Along"-The Dozen; "Civil War Almanac" (2 vols., "Yankee Songs," "Rebel Songs")-The Cumberland Three; "Italy" (vol. 2)-Di Mara Sisters; "It's Christmas Time Again"-Jimmie Rodgers with Joe Reisman's Orch. and Chorus" (a re-packaging of last year's release); and "St. Patrick's Cathedral Choir Sings Christmas Songs."

On Roulette Gold Classics is Handel's "The Complete Messiah" (4 LP's)—the London Philharmonic conducted by Frederick Jackson. On the Roost label are "Stittsville"—Sonny Stitt; "Let's Go Latin Cha Cha Cha"—Herb Zane Orch.

#### Massler Eyes German Equipment

Al Massler, prexy of the Amy-Mala Record combine, jetted to Germany Oct. 1 to examine highly technical new recording and pressing equipment. While in Europe, Massler will also coordinate foreign activity for Amy-Mala's Aim Music.

This is the latest in the Command LP series of true stereo discs produced by Enoch Light. At this session Lew Davies combines the wide range of two pianos with a mixed chorus which he employs as musical instruments. The effect is a pleasing one and the entire package is musically sound. Album includes such evergreens as Cheek To Cheek, Let's Put Out The Lights, April In Paris, and I'll Never Smile Again. A must for all stereophytes.

#### PARIS IMPRESSIONS - Erroll Garner - CO-LUMBIA CL 1212 Vol 1, CL 1213 Vol 2

 A double treat for the many Gamer fans throughout the world. Both LP's are a pot pourie of French accented tunes that Erroll associates with his 1958 trips to Paris. As usual his jazz interpretations on the 88 are refreshing and scintillating, and as an added listening pleasure he switches to the Harpsichord for a couple of tracks. At each session Mr. Garner was accompanied by his regular personnel, Edward Calhoun on bass and Kelly Martin on drums. Highlighting both volumes are Garner's own Don't Look For Me, Cote d'Azur, When Paris Cries and Paris Blues. Others included are I Love Paris, The Song From Moulin Rouge, La Vie en Rose and The Last Time I Saw Paris. Garner at his greatest.

Real teen appeal.




