Every year or so, along comes a motion-picture musical that provides great entertainment from the first scene to the last. As millions of enthusiastic viewers already know, "Pal Joey" is just such a show.

And no wonder! First of all, the film stars the incomparable Frank Sinatra as Joey Evans, who sings, wisecracks and loves his way through one escapade after another. As both actor and singer, Frank is truly sensational in his role. Glamorous Rita Hayworth shines as Vera Simpson, the stripper turned socialite, and lovely Kim Novak makes temperatures rise as Linda English, star chorine of the "Sextets."

The Rodgers and Hart music, of course, has been hummed, whistled, and applauded from New York to New Mexico ever since Broadway first made a smash hit out of "Pal Joey."

NORRIE PARAMOR and his Orchestra

Norrie Paramor is a Londoner by birth and by preference. He understands the moods, the appeal, the lovers, of London Town as few others do. What's more, as one of England's most talented arranger-conductors, he has a wonderful flair for capturing the city's charms in smooth listening music that's not quite like any other. How does he go about it? Well, take this album, for instance. For one thing, there's the famed Paramor Orchestra: a huge choir of lustrous violins, violas and cellos, plus the mellow accents of French horn and guitar, along with bass, druths, solo piano. And, that enchanting Paramor trademark — the haunting soprano volce that shimmers through his distinctive arrangements of such familiar ballads as The Touch of Your Lips, Deep Purple, The Nearness of You, Stars Fell on Alabama, and The Very Thought of You.

Whatever the melody (and whatever your mood, for that matter). Paramor's eloquent interpretation is a delightful invitation to relax and perhaps to dream. Some music was written to describe a scene, to take you on a musical journey, or simply to tell a story. The story might have begun as a fairy tale, a legend, or a play. But whatever its origin, good story-telling music is among the most beautiful ever written and the longest remembered. Tchaikovsky's familiar music for "The Nutcracker," in fact, is much better known than the original story — one of the tales of Hoffman, which tells of a little girl who dreams that a nutcracker turns into her Prince Charming. The music, first written for a ballet, is pure enchantment: sparkling, bright, and filled with brilliant instrumental color. The Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairy, for instance, features the delicate sound of the celesta in one of the composer's most beautiful melodies. The Russian Dance, in contrast, pulses with a grand, rumbly vigor that builds to a mighty climax. The Suite ends with the incredibly lovely Waltz of the Flowers,

Almost everyone, married or single, can hum the Wedding March, but many may not realize that this is only one of the familiar sections in Mendelssohn's music inspired by Shakespeare's "A Midsummer Night's Dream." For sheer melody, for rich harmony and buoyant rhythm, Mendelssohn has few peers, and all of the composer's most appealing qualities find wonderful expression in this music. The Overture (written when the composer was only seventeen!) gleams with marvelously deft humor, with the sort of puckish rhythm that suggests a moonlit dance of good-natured elves. The Nocturne is a captivating description of a warm and drowsy midsummer night. The Scherzo, a marvel of playful, flashing sound, is just one more of the highlights in this thoroughly enjoyable masterpiece of Romantic music by one of the world's most popular composers.

Georges Enesco was born in 1881, on a small farm in Rumania, and from his birth, he began to absorb first-hand the rich legacy of his homeland's folk music. At the age of three, he was already improvising songs on the violin, and at eleven, he won the Violin Prize at the renowned Vienna Conservatory. He was eighteen when his first orchestral work was performed, and he then decided to devote himself to composition. Of his many works, the two Rhapsodies in this album are by far the most familiar. Incorporating Rumanian gypsy songs and peasant melodies, they paint a brilliantly hued portrait of a sensitive, emotional people. Though the themes are traditional, their treatment is fresh, for Enesco gave his material new inten ity with splashes of modern color and dramatic orchestration. The music is by turns poignant, high spirited, expansive and vigorous, and it is fired throughout by the composer's deep sincerity.

"Dvorak has written in all possible styles. Decidedly, he is a very talented man. Besides, he is poor. Please take this into consideration." Thus Johannes Brahms recommended to his publisher the work of Anton Dvorak, then an obscure young Czech composer. Shortly thereafter, the publisher commissioned Dvorak to write a set of Slavonic Dances. The composer chose the most characteristic of Czech dance rhythms, and gave them his own melodies and harmonies. He succeeded admirably in combining his own talents with native folk music, for his Slavonic Dances fully capture the passion and humor of the Czech people. The orchestrations are glowingly alive, and every selection pulses with vitality and warmth. In this album, Fabien Sevitzky and the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra present the four best known of these Dances, in performances revealing all the high spirits and fiery excitement that have won worldwide fame for this music.

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"Rare Moment in Jazz"

BOBBY HACKETT and his All-Star Jazz Band

COAST CONCERT

(No. F692, \$3.98)

A lot of the best jazz just seems to "happen"—whether on records or in person. COAST CONCERT is an exciting example of both. It all started when Bobby Hackett, in New York, received a phone call asking him to hurry out to the West Coast to take part in the big annual Dixieland Jubilee in Los Angeles. A few hours later, Bobby was stepping off the plane at LA's International Airport.

As soon as Bobby could get to a phone, he started rounding up a band for the concert. And what a band! Jack Teagarden and Abe Lincoln on trombone, Matty Matlock on clariner, and a rhythm section to match. The boys got together for a few run-throughs before the concert, and then they were on. Everything clicked just right. Their music soared high, wide and handsome, and the crowd just couldn't get enough. Capitol was also in the audience, and almost as soon as the concert was over, Bobby and his band had agreed to start recording an album at 5:30 the next afternoon. The recording session went straight through to 5:30 in the morning, and again, the jazz rolled as smooth and easy as a new sports car.

COAST CONCERT captures the proceedings in crisp high fidelity, and it's all a joy to hear. The lyrical Hackett horn blazes the way for Mr. T's mellow trombone, for Abe Lincoln's aggressive solos, for Matlock's fleet clarinet. The rhythm section, sparked by drummer Nick Fatool, lays a foundation you could build a skyscraper on, and now and then, Phil Stephens swaps his bass for a tuba, thereby adding a wonderfully staunch bottom to the band's sound. Guitarist Nappy Lamare and pianist Don Owens round out the rhythm.

This recording, incidentally, is the first full-length album teaming Hackett and Teagarden. And speaking of the whole group, Bobby says: "You couldn't find a better jazz band anywhere." Yes, COAST CONCERT is indeed a rare moment in jazz.

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Here's the power-packed Octet that rocked Las Vegas, that rocks throughout every selection in this recording. The unusual instrumentation of the group—two trumpets, bass trumpet, tenor, clarinet and rhythm—creates a remarkably big, almost full orchestra sound. All eight of the musicians are impressive soloists, and thanks to the compact size of the group and the setting of a full-length, hi-fi album, every one of these Herdsmen is showcased at his best.

Woody himself, urged on by the others, is in top form all the way.

Cy Touff, the only bass trumpet star in jazz, wails mightily. And very much present also are such jazz greats as Richie Kamuca, Dick Collins, and the dynamic Chuck Flores. The tunes include standards such as 920 Special, Broadway, and Jumpin' at the Woodside, plus go-for-broke originals.

Woody's comment about the album pretty well sums it all up. That's the way any jazz fan will feel about the cascade of swinging sounds in JACKPOT! also included: Bags' Other Groove • The Boot • Wailing Wall • Bass Face • Junior
