JUNE CHRISTY ... songs

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For this album, June Christy has hied herself off to the country - musically speaking - and the warm and easy mood of the countryside brings a sparkling feeling to June's performance of these relaxed ballads. The Christy voice is bright and airy as a soft summer breeze - as cool and tresh as a clear spring.

How is it that the cityfied Miss Christy is communing musically with nature? It's simply that June has added a new dimension to her delivery. During her Kenton days, of course, she appealed to a large core of jazz enthusiasts, who took eagerly to her warm, throaty style. Now, like the proverbial pebble thrown in the pond, the Christy charm has reverberated over the land, to encompass all who respond to vocal purity and lyric sensitivity.

This album illustrates the great and long-standing musical rapport between June and arranger-composer Pete Rugolo. Pete uses three distinctive instrumental groupings here – a large string orchestra, a smaller string and woodwind group, and a third ensemble that features trombones, rhythm, vibes and xylophone. His backing complements to perfection these performances by Miss June Christy – who, for an enchanting interlude, has locked the door and "Gone For The Day."

The big band that's every dancer's delight recreates the bighlights of its great musical career.

Everybody in the music business hopes to record a million-seller sometime in his career. With Harry James it's almost the rule rather than the exception. He has more of them than any other bandleader today. In this album, for example, *elet en* of the fifteen tunes are hi-fi recreations of his single records that went over the million mark. Furthermore, here for the first time are all those hits captured in the modern high-fidelity that presents the Music Makers with the band's warm and brilliant sound intact.

Three facets of the James aggregation are spotlighted by this album. First, there's Harry's golden trumpet riding high on essays like *James Session*. Then there's the band's swinging beat long identified with the James group, as evidenced in the band's title song *Music Makers*. Third, the great soloists from the groupnames like Willie Smith and Juan Tizol-are present to lend the color and variety of their work to these selections.

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Helen Forrest joins Harry and the Music Makers on many of these tunes, including *I'm Beginning To See the Light*. As the most famous big band vocalist of all time, she has demonstrated a lasting power virtually unknown to her usually insecure profession. Her presence on the session makes the vocals swing just like the band, which zings through melodies that are as completely Jamesian as *Circhiribin*. Altogether, HARRY JAMES IN HI-FI is that special kind of record: the biggest playing at its best.

Tchaikovsky's symphonic masterpiece was acclaimed at its first performance in St. Petersburg, the composer directing, only a few weeks before his death. For over three decades, the Duke's band has been a soloist's ball of fame. Here, superb soloists are presented in their showcase concertos, custom-made in the royal Ellington manner.

One of the reasons that Duke's band has developed so many name jazzmen is Duke's special knack with that concerto of jazz, the showcase : arrangements custom-made to show a soloist at his best. Usually these Ellington concertos are so form-fitting that they are wedded to a particular soloist for eternity. Witness those created for Bubber Miley, Sam Nanton, Cootie Williams, and Barney Bigard.

Names like these testify to the Duke's greatness of the past, but here is evidence that his is a self-renewing vigor. For this album contains testaments wrought with the same skill of old, with added touches of modernity. And, as before, the showcases exhibit not only renowned soloists, but fine songs (mostly by Ellington himself) and the band itself.

Spotlighted in this set are such Ellington standbys as Harry Carney, whose baritone sax diesels through *Serious Serenade;* Jimmy Hamilton, whose clarinet mastery is revealed in the varied movements of *Clarinet Melodrama;* the Duke himself, whose delicate piano is featured on the soft and lovely *Blossom;* Cat Anderson, whose high-altitude trumpet has a hearty time with the bullfight's *La Virgen de la Macarena.*

Riverboat Dandies

(F877, \$3.98)

New Orleans street parade, fireman's ball, jazz concerts—good jazz can be found in many places. But there's something extra special about the traditional riverboats which makes the best setting for jazz.

Nappy Lamare and Ray Bauduc here capture the wonderful music played on those riverboats. Lamare and Bauduc both were born in New Orleans and became jazzmen there. Later, they were prominent members of the Bob Crosby Bobcats, and two of the tunes in this album, *South Rampart Street Parade* and *Big Noise from Winnetka*, hark back to those happy days. Their separate careers since have included all the musical stops—metropolitan nightspots, TV, movie work, hotel engagements, and recording dates. Reunited several years ago with the Bobcats and featured on the first Jackie Gleason video show, "America's Greatest Bands," they decided to organize their own Dixieland group and met with immediate success.

In RIVERBOAT DANDIES Nappy Lamare and Ray Bauduc send out music that croons, shouts, and whispers the stomps, spirituals, and marches that rocked the decks in the days when riverboat travel was for real. It's a delightful musical accomplishment sure to make a lot of people happy.

Filling out the Bauduc-Lamare combo are Don Owens, piano; Ray Leatherwood, bass; Eugene Bolen, clarinet; Rolly Furnas, trombone; and Martin Peppie, trumpet. Traditional jazzmen all, they blow up a storm of authentic Dixie, the liveliest music ever devised.
