

Top Arc Pop Artists To Appear In Toronto

Toronto: Bill Gilliland, Vice-President Arc Records, announces the finalizing of plans for Patrician Anne and Terry Black to headline an Arc production March 4 at Toronto's Club 888. Patrician Anne's single of "Blue Lipstick" has made her a favourite of the Maritimes, her home is Halifax, and has served to introduce her to the rest of Canada. Terry Black has been a consistent chart winner with each of his releases. He is presently making a strong bid with "Rainbow", a P.F. Sloan production. The pair will also make an appearance on CTV's A Go-Go 66.

Gary Buck To Capitol (Canada)

Toronto: Paul White, Capitol's Director of Artist and Repertoire announces the signing of Gary Buck, Top Male Country Singer (RPM 2 years running) to the roster of Capitol artists. This signing gives Gary the distinction of being Capitol's only Canadian country male singer. His first release "If That's All You've Given" a Harlen Howard tune, is skedded for release the latter part of February.

CFGM Makes Bid For Country FM

Toronto: Gord Symonds, Programme Director of Canada's most successful country station — CFGM, is presently drawing up plans for an FM attack on country listeners. Although still subject to approval, it is fairly certain the application will go through, which would give CFGM a 100,000 watt non-directional signal. Certain broadcasts would be simulcast from their AM outlet. The big country sound would make up for much of the programming. Symonds points out that country music by Fiedler, Kostelanetz and the Norman Luboff choir to name a few, have added a great deal of listening power and class to the country sound which now boasts a good 40% of all records sold in Canada.

Donovan To Appear At O'Keefe Feb. 20

Toronto: England's great folk singer, Donovan makes his only Canadian appearance at The O'Keefe for a one niter Sunday Feb. 20. It was erroneously reported here last week that his O'Keefe appearance was set as Feb. 8.



First Negro Country Singer On Major Label

Nashville: The Tandy Rice Advertising and Promotion company announces the signing of Charley Pride to a long-term contract with RCA Victor Records. Although negroes have always played a part in country music, Grand Ole Opry and some of the top country bands, this is the first time they have been given a go-ahead in such a formal manner. We are also reminded of the fact that the banjo, Country music's trademark, was introduced to mountain folk by Southern Negro workers who were the principle working force in putting railroads into the Southern Appalachian Mountain areas. Negro minstrels carried sound and song into modern times, until a Memphis youngster named Elvis Presley combined the Southern Negro jazz beat with country music and came up with "Rock-A-Billy. Charley Pride's first RCA Victor release "Snakes Crawl At Night" and "Atlantic Coastal Line" were co-written by Cedarwood Publishing Company's Mel Tillis and Fred Burch. The session was produced by veterans Chet Atkins and Jack Clement.

New National Songs For Canada's Centennial

Winnipeg: Using Canada's Centennial, The song-writing team of Rose and Robert Hinze and Robert Liddell have penned a new version of "Oh Canada" which they call "Our Canada—Centennial 1967" and "Our Maple Leaf Shall Reign". Free copies of these songs will be supplied to those interested if they drop a line to Mrs. Rose Hinze, Box 22, Station "F" Winnipeg.

Who Will Be First With Canada's 4 Track?

Toronto: A shroud of mystery seems to have enveloped the history making advent of Canada's first four track recording studio. RCA Victor's Ed Benou would not commit himself other than to say that a four track was contemplated and would perhaps be operational by the Spring. Arc Records, would allow only that their engineer Wally Jones and the McKirdy Industries are working on a four track system which should be ready by April. Arc will concentrate mainly on label work whereas RCA Victor accommodates both commercial and label clientele. Hallmark Studios, the leader in pop label work in Toronto, have not publicized any plans for the future.



Capitol Execs, Ed Leetham, Harold Burr, Brian O'Shea, Taylor Campbell and Paul White recently returned from a get acquainted trip to Tower Records, Capitol's subsid, in Hollywood. While in the west coast music centre, they met Al Martino who expressed a great deal of gratitude for Canadians in helping him get "Spanish Eyes" off the ground. It was in Montreal where the radio stations were playing the cut from Al's LP. It was this action that made the single take off nationally and internationally. The Capitol boys sat in on a recording session of Nancy Wilson which was conducted by Billy May. A very strong item from Tower is "One Of Those Days" by the Blueberry Hill Players which should be released in Canada shortly. /// Joey Hollingsworth, London Ontario resident has been signed by The Compo company. Joey hopes to

have a release soon. He has just completed a series of appearances in Winnipeg which included 2 TV shows. An appearance on the Juliette Show is skedded for sometime in March. He goes on to Halifax for a TV appearance and then to Japan to kick off his third tour of the orient. /// The Munks, popular Montreal based group are setting out on a promotional and publicity trip to tout their new Regency release of "Long Time Waiting" and "Heartaches Over My Head". The group had experienced some difficulty because of their garb. They are actually costumed as monks, sandals and all. /// The Shondels are skedded for an appearance on "A Go-Go '66" March 3. While in

Toronto the boys will be making appearances in and around Toronto including other TV shows. Arrangements have been set up by The Bigland Agency. /// Ray MacLeod, showbiz columnist for the Halifax Chronicle notes that after 12 years of professional singing with her sisters, Margie Hames is finally soloing. Viewer reaction has been so great that it necessitated the return of many groups and artists. Les Baronets, one of Montreal's top pop groups is foremost in those being returned by popular demand. The show is seen every Friday night on eleven television stations affiliated with the CTV network across Canada. /// CKDM's "Write In Dedication Club" originally skedded for one hour has been given such a boost by Dauphin listeners that it has been extended to two hours. The club now boasts 3000 members and is hosted by Ron Waddell, known to his listeners as "The Ugly One." /// Recent happenings in the Kootenay area has prompted an excited note from Bill James, teen spinner at CKLN Nelson. Teen dances have been growing in popularity. The local Club 65 Citations are consistently drawing good crowds with each appearance. Visiting groups have also been given good support. The Saints recently looked after the entertainment for the University Snow Fiesta. Calgary's Peter and The Pumpkins moved into Nelson with equal success. CKLN held a pumpkin hunt the week the Calgary group were in town which added to their popularity. /// Big news from Chris Thomas at CJRW Summerside is the telephone reaction to "The Joker" by the Young Canadians. The management at CJRW will be interested in knowing that RPM will be putting out a special issue which will list every Canadian LP available. /// Graham Wyllie at CKCL Truro would like to know why so many radio stations who had supported Terry Black in the past haven't followed up on his latest releases. Big record, naturally, at CKCL is Terry's latest "Rainbow". The Staccatos are also getting good exposure with "Poor Baby". /// CJCA's Bob Stagg has been having good success with his record store The Groove Spot. One of the changes the Groove Spot is making is ordering the records before they are charted thus giving the buyers the chance to experiment and send in their comments on records that weren't normally available to them until the item was charted. The King Beez are a perfect example. Their Quality record of "She Belongs To Me" has been selling well. A tour of eastern Canada is now in the negotiating stages. Bob Stagg has turned newspaper columnist. He will be writing a column for the newly organized weekly the Edmonton Gazette and its sister paper the St. Albert Gazette. /// Though, wind and rain, snow and blizzard puts a stop to most activities, not so in the radio industry. The recent blizzard that completely stalled everything in Regina couldn't keep the on-air personalities from fulfilling their duties. They rented a Ski-do from a local dealer and with DJ's hanging on for dear life made it, just two hours late. /// The new cash give-away contest, "Who's Singing About You" has been causing quite a stir with Oshawa listeners. The CKLB people have lifted the word "you" from various records which they play on the air. The first listener to name the singer wins the jackpot. /// With the "Peg" in a cold spot, CKRC is attempting to warm things up a bit by running a "June In January Contest". Listeners identify a song of June and simply phone in for a prize. Nite man Ron Legge is currently running a drawing contest. His nite time character Louis Puma is the subject of the contest. The best drawing of this mythical character takes the prize. /// The CKPT "Landmark Limerick" contest has been gaining much popularity in the Peterboro area. Clues are given in verse form as to a specific location, monument, etc. The game is played five times daily with the jackpot increasing with each incorrect guess. /// Joey Cannon is the new "Wake 'Em Up" man at CJSS Cornwall. Bill Osborne takes over from Joey until 2 PM. Country Cousin Keith Clingen takes the listeners home in rush hour and Tom Iley swings to midnight.



It could be the first major hit for the company and easily make CHARLIE FOX a hot arranger Meanwhile TOM NOONAN at Date Records tells me that the company will go all out on the new DISTANT COUSINS release, "No More You". HERB BERNSTEIN arranged

the date whereas CHARLIE CALELLO wrote the song with BOB CREWE SID BASS, who arranged S/SGT. BARRY SADLER'S "Ballad Of The Green Berets" tells me he just arranged an LP for ROY HAMILTON LARRY BROWN and ROY BLOODWORTH (The Distant Cousins) wrote GEORGE McCANNON'S new one, "Look For The Rainbow" CHRIS and PETER ALLEN (The Allen Bros.) wrote "The Answer To My Prayer" by NEIL SEDAKA HOWIE KANE (one of the members of Jay and The Americans) is co-producing THE GOODTIMES for Kama-Stura. The boys will have an album release before their first single Tin Pan Alley is talking about the decision of the publishers of "The Batman" comic books to stop the sale and radio play of all Batman records other than those of the theme from the actual TV show. Expatriates Carry Canada Around The World

Canada's expatriates have been successfully boosting the name of their country throughout the four corners of the world. Lorne Greene, probably the most successful, besides starring in television top rated show "Bonanza", released several successful records on the RCA Victor label, the hottest being "Ringo". Robert Goulet took the opposite way around. Establishing himself as a top recording artist on Columbia he now stars in his own TV weekly "Blue Light". Don Grashey, now heading up his own record company Gaiety in the US is banking a great deal on the potential of another Canadian Jerry Palmer who is presently making good inroads with his "Walking The Dog" released by RCA in Canada. Terry Black, formerly of Vancouver and one of Arc's top pop artists is signed to the very hot label Dunhill in the US. Ray Griff, one of the finest country singers in the business is now located in Nashville where he has put his songwriting abilities to good use. Many of the top US country artists have used Griff material. Ray records for RCA. Jerry Martin, onetime Torontonian, has been having much success in the UK with powerful interests behind him such as EMI and Norrie Paramor. Dennie Dougherty formerly with the Halifax Three is now experiencing North American fame as one of the Mama's and Papa's and their RCA release of "California Dreamin'." R. Dean Taylor, another Toronto boy, is working with the Tamla-Motown people out of Detroit and is experiencing good Toronto action on his Tamla recording of "Let's Go Somewhere". Andy Kim now making his home in New York, got his start in his hometown of Montreal and is now signed to the Kama Sutra label.

Meanwhile the Canadian industry continues with many artists still working out of Canada in an effort to create a stronger domestic music industry.



Warner Bros. announces the signing of folk singer Judy Henske to an exclusive recording contract with the Reprise label. English composer-arranger-producer, Tony Hatch, brings his instrumental arranging talents to the Warner Bros. label with his debut album "The Down-

town Sound Of Tony Hatch." /// Ren Grevatt, touting news from Acuff-Rose, has it that Roy Orbison has been signed for a return to Great Britain. The tour, which has been set by Acuff-Rose Artists Corporation, and will commence March 25. The Walker Brothers have been included in the package. Hickory Records currently has the hottest record in the UK on release in the US. "Michelle" by the Overlanders has been on top of the British charts these past weeks and marks the group's biggest success to date. Tom Jones returns to NYC for an appearance on the Ed Sullivan show Feb. 13. After a week of one-nighters he returns to New York to tape the Sammy Davis TVer for viewing March 1. Jones' new release on Parrot is titled "Promise Her Anything." Bob Marcucci has been having much success with Barry Young's "One Has My Name" LP and "Lightnin Strikes" by Lou Christie. Another Marcucci discovery Clairette, a 16-year-old from the San Francisco area should have a record release the latter part of February. /// The Tandy Rice advertising and promotion company are currently touting a country singing dentist from Middle Tennessee. Dr. Paul Moore's K-Ark release of "Della Joe" was written by Roger Miller.



The Canadian Downbeats are experiencing good regional action with their Soundaround release of "That's The Way". The Downbeats hail from Regina and are set for a U.S. tour the latter part of February.
