

"Moody Manitoba Morning"-Centennial Caravan Theme

The Rick Neufeld deck "Moody Manitoba Morning,", a self penning, on the Warner Bros label, has been selected as the theme for the Manitoba 100 Caravan, a joint sponsorship of the governments of Canada and Manitoba. The Caravan, an audio and visual presentation of Manitoba yesterday, today and tomorrow, has been launched to help celebrate Manitoba's 100th year in Confederation.

Neufeld's composition, "Moody Manitoba Morning", gained him top honours in the 1969 Moffat Broadcasting Awards, because of its "expression in depicting Manitoba today". The young composer also picked up a BMI (Canada) Certificate of Honour for his composition, one of 75 he has penned in the past few years. Flip of the "Manitoba" lid, "Boissevain Fair" is a tribute to his hometown.

So pleased were the Warner Bros

(Canada) execs over the 100% Canadian content of this Bob Hahn production they requested permission to use the RPM MAPL logo. This logo was designed specifically for use in RPM to supply easy identification of a Canadian content single and the parts necessary to meet CRTC regulations. Both sides of Neufeld's disc proudly display the MAPL logo.

Manitoba's travelling exhibition, having a total budget of \$300,000. began its 2400 mile trek through the Province July 1, and by Sept. 25 will have made 41 stops and portrayed the Province's history to almost a million Manitobans and visitors.

The single is an exceptionally lush production already receiving important play on MOR stations as well as those having a top 40 format.

Daffodil's "Official Music" Making Gains

The recent signing of a distributorship deal for Love Production's Daffodil label has resulted in what could be another hit album for the Sounds Canadian company. The Love production by King Biscuit Boy with Crowbar, has already been given the nod by internation al music critics. The group was formerly backup for Ronnie Hawkins. Taping for the album took place at Toronto Sound Studios. The Capitol/Daffodil deal was consumated by Capitol's vice president and general manager. Arnold Gosewich, and Frank Davies, vice president of Love Productions.

Chilliwack Borrows from Past

Borrowing from the past, and in keeping with their new found image, Chilliwack, Parrot recording unit, have adapted a strikingly beautiful Indian mask for the cover of their initial album release for the label. The colourful mask was supplied through the courtesy of the Museum of the American Indian, NYC.

Formerly the Collectors, this Vancouver based group are making good strides up the national charts with their single "Chain Train" penned by group member Claire Lawrence which is contained on their album

Second U.S. Release for Poppy Family

London's Poppy Family are experiencing top radio and distributor interest with the bowing of their single, "That's Where I Went Wrong", a strong follow-up to their million selling (RIAA-RPM) single release, "Which Way You Going Billy?". This record became a top of the chart item in the U.S. trades (#2 Cash Box)—the first wholly Canadian produced single to attain such sales and popularity power. Their album, under the same title, is now climbing the U.S. trade charts.

The Family have just returned home to Vancouver after a few days of fishing and relaxing at Campbell River, B.C. Prior to this short rest they appeared at Expo '70 in Osaka. They have now put the finishing touches on their new single, to be issued in the fall and have completed negotiations for a tour of Eastern Canada, to commence the latter part of September.


Record Club Boosts Native Product

Lawrence Graner, who along with Seymour Iseman heads up the Record Club of Canada, reports top interest in their subscribers for Canadian content recordings. The Club Magazine, which has a circulation of almost 200,000 across Canada. recently ran a Canadiana special with six well-illustrated pages, including the front and back cover of the mag. An added incentive for domestic record buyers was a free record with the purchase of any three records listed on those pages devoted to "Canadian Sounds". Some of Canada's top talent are available in recorded form for \$ 2.99 including all Gordon Lightfoot product, the Great Speckled Bird. Steppenwolf, Lighthouse, Edward Bear, and Joni Mitchell.

GRT Canada to Mould Module 8

GRT of Canada has now completed manufacturing plans whereby they will mould their own Module 8 stereo cartridge, in Canada. In the short span of one year, GRT Canada has moved from distributing imports to assembling, to duplicating, and now completing their all encompassing domestic operation with the moulding of its own cartridges, in Canada.

In releasing the information on GRT's Module 8, their national A&R promotion and advertising manager, Ed Lawson, revealed that the Module 8 was designed by GRT in an effort to further improve quality while at the same time increase manufacturing efficiency. The new cartridge has been proven to have better than double the life of any other cartridge on the market, according to Lawson. It is also compatible with all makes of 8 track tape players, and reportedly eliminates quality problems experienced by some manufacturers of 8 track cartridges.



Module 8 will undergo an extensive promotion campaign by GRT for their custom manufacturing, in which they are heavily involved. Lawson pointed up the fact that the Module 8 cartridge can be tailored to the needs of any company and can be moulded in any colour and incorporate any logo. The cartridge will be offered to other Canadian duplicators at a very competitive price.

Green & Stagg Release Strong Follow-up

Anthony Green and Barry Stagg, the first English-Canadian artists to release on the Gamma label, show strong chart possibilities with their single 'Face of the Sun'. This is another selfpenning and because of programmer demand, was culled from their album 'Green and Stagg'. The popular duo show their best folk side with this offering, a strong follow-up to their first single, 'To Love Means to Be Free',

which remained on the RPM 100 for several months. This composition, which was awarded a BMI (Canada) Certificate of Honour, also holds a record for the number of countries in which it was released. Daniel Lazare, who heads up the Montreal-based Gamma label, negotiated for release in almost every country in the world, for which effort he is now receiving good returns.

Talent Find on Increase in Atlantic Provinces

With Canada's geographical problem now beginning to shrink to manageable size there has been much concentration on talent in other than the large centres. Canada's Atlantic provinces have jumped into the recording news of late with the success of Capitol's Pepper Tree and the recent signing by Much Productions of April Wine. Both groups are from the Halifax area.

One of the agencies having confidence in the potential of local talent is the St. John-based Roscoe Productions. Doug Kirby Sr., who heads up the agency, has been prepping several local groups for future recordings and finding much interest by local record men. Two very popular units set for recording dates are St. John's Killer Egg and Fredericton's Naked Lunch.



GX Funtimers Present Buck Show (Special to RPM)

The CJGX Funtimers believe strongly in the promotion of Canadian talent, not only on the air, but in person, and because of this, Ron Waddell, CJGX promotion manager, was able to arrange a six day tour of the CJGX broadcast area with three of Canada's top country acts. Through negotiations with Gary Buck of Beechwood Music of Canada, Waddell brought in the Gary Buck Show, comprised of Buck, Donna Ramsay, and the Chaparrals, all Capitol recording artists.

The six day tour covered five Saskatchewan centres: Melville, Wadena, Round Lake, Moosamin, and Yorkton, as well as Swan River in Manitoba. All shows were tied in with local service clubs which proved beneficial for each community.

The Chaparrals, who have just returned from a tour of the far east (Japan, the Philippines etc.), opened each show with tremendous impact on the audiences. Earl Fries, bass player and lead singer, showed a terrific vocal styling and warm personality as he sang and talked about how Canadian talent is being accepted in the far east. Carl Keys. lead guitarist, showed exceptional talent on guitar but seemed to stay in the background until he was featured on two show stopping fiddle tunes. Fred Emberson proved to be one of the greatest drummers in the business and then proceeded to steal the show with his fantastically funny comedy rou-

After 45 minutes of the Chaparrals, 19 year old Donna Ramsay, of Sault Ste Marie, delivered a fine female vocal presentation. She shows immeasurable talent and personality. Her latest Capitol release, "Cool Green Waters",

is currently #3 on the CJGX Country Top Fifty.

After a brief intermission, GX Funtimer, Ron Waddell, opened the second half of the show with his rendition of "Let's Think About Living", backed by The Chaparrals. He then introduced the show's headliner, Gary Buck.

Buck's part of the show is filled with his many Capitol recordings. Besides his strong vocal performance he is personality plus and seems to bring the stage and the audience together. As well, he spotlights the Chaparrals during his performances, brings Donna on for a duet and does some very comical and entertaining impersonations of other top country stars. After watching Buck on stage, it's easy to see why he has been twice voted Top Country Male Singer in the RPM Weekly Annual Awards. His latest Capitol release "Don't Hate - Communicate" is currently #9 on the CJGX Country Top Fifty.

During the tour, a very successful autograph party was held at Zellers, in Yorkton, with Buck, Donna Ramsay, The Chaparrals and Waddell, and the impact is still showing in record sales for the artists.

London Signs Distrib Deal With R.B.S.

Adrian Bilodeau, national sales manager for London Records, announces the resigning of a distribution deal by London with Steve Grossman's R.B.S. Studios of Vancouver. Initial release, on Coast Records is a single by Vancouver's Spring, "New Day" and "She's A Woman". Another local group, Seeds Of Time, have bowed their Spring lid, "My Hometown" and "Muskrat Ramble".

So successful was his visit that Toronto programmers, both AM and FM particularly CKFH gave important airplay to his current single, "Back In Love Again". This is an exceptionally fine 100% Canadian content single, and should receive national play". The single. a self penning, was produced in Montreal by Compo's A&R man, Ron Dykhof, and has shown slow but steady gains on the RPM MAPL chart.

Two Hundredth "Hair"

With their two hundredth performance safely by (June 23) and the addition of new cast members, the Toronto production of 'Hair' continues to play to better than average houses. The two hundredth performance was a charity bit. Royalties from that performance were turned over to the Longhouse people of the Iroquois Six Nations Confederacy. The money is to be used for the extablishment of a craft workshop on the reservation. Crafts and languages will be taught to the children of the Longhouse people. Members of 'Hair' have already supported the Longhouse people by purchasing items of bead and leather work which they wear in the show. Members have also visited the reservation and bought leatherwork. The plight of the Iroquois was brought to the attention of the 'Hair' cast during a sing-in at Toronto's city hall this past spring. Chief Joseph Logan, Faith Keeper of the Longhouse People, was an honoured guest and revealed the need for a craft workshop. 

Many juke box operators and one stops have given full coverage to the record with a 'pull all stops' from the powerful Palmer Record Service. Damron and his boys played Calgary's Westgate Motor Hotel during Stampede week and lent themselves for on-air interviews with Lorne Ball and Jim Hughes of CFAC and D'Arcy Scott of CFCN.

Cochran and C.C. Riders Triumphant Return to NYC

The Schaeffer Music Festival in Central Park presented a very strange show this past weekend. Wayne Cochran and the C.C. Riders and Little Richard, on the same bill! It was a double bill of

high camp, crowd hysteria, and a lot of good old rock and roll from Macon, Georgia.

Cochran and his Riders have not appeared in New York for some time, and they proved to be a very tight, loud band, accompanied with a lot of soul. The Southern musicians are a special breed, especially the white Southern musicians - and Cochran is no excention. Flamboyantly dressed in a simulated leather outfit with huge belled sleeves and pants, he has a platinum wig (?) that is surrounded by a jeweled headband. Well.....the effect was spectacular. Backed by a large orchestra and three singers of the gospel variety, Wayne did "Higher", "Dance To The Music", "Feelin" All-





right", "When Something Is Wrong With My Baby", and a lot of rapping about the blues. He excited the crowd — everyone was clapping along and singing — but it was mild compared to the frenzy that Little Richard whipped up.

Mr. Penniman is most definitely the high priest of rock and roll showmanship, but I feel that this time his ego trip got the best of him. He was wearing a blue outfit that was decorated all in glass squares, and he had no sooner delivered two numbers when he proceeded to take his clothes off and entice the crowd with them. Finally, after the crowds were all up by the stage, screaming and begging for the articles of clothing, he threw them into the crowd. Very dangerous, to throw glass into a crowd like that, and it certainly does not bring out the best in the audience. The kids were ripping the pieces of clothing from each other, and scrapping to get a piece of the performers threads. People were cut from the glass, and the whole thing was most unpleasant. Then Richard sang one more song and left. Extremely disappointing, and one wonders how much longer he can get away with this.

The Guess Who played for Tricia Nixon's dance for Prince Charles this past weekend, but had to omit "American Woman" because of its satirical lyrics about the United States. Hmmmmnnm.... Blood, Sweat and Tears received certification of a gold album three days after their third album was released. They will be at Madison Square Garden this weekend (July 25) with Miles Davis on the same bill......New bootleg albums expected out on the West Coast this week are: Traffic, and Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young, with a Leon Russell one due shortly. This is all the work of the "Rubber Dubber", a sound technician, who is reportedly plugging into the sound......systems at concerts and recording the albums. He also does not sell them for anymore than the price of a concert ticket.

Randall's Island turned into a farce. The community groups such as the Young Lords, Gay Liberation Front and White Panthers, who were to have received a portion of the money collected, may not have received anything. By Saturday, people were being let in for free, very few of the groups showed up (probably because they hadn't been paid in advance), the sound system was bad, the kids were mad because each night the microphone was given over to the political groups for

a time, and the audience really just wanted to hear music. The entire Festival turned out to be a joke, with many, many complications, and finally — just fell apart.

Heft Lays on Red Carpet for Peer II
