Chimo Launches New Single

Native classical sets from London

Jacques Druelle, manager of the Classical Division, London Records (Canada), announces the release of five Canadian content classical recordings. The release is a joint venture by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation and Lon-Records.

The release comprises:

'Recital''. Sung by Lois Marshall with Weldon Kilburn at the piano (SDD 2155). Miss Marshall performs several art songs by Schubert, including "Where Is Sylvia" and "Chanson Triste" by the French composer, Henri Duparc. Side two is made up of compositions by Toronto surgeon, Dr. Welford Russell, including "Who Is At My Window, Who?", for fourpart chorus, which has become established in the choral repertoire. The session was taped at Toronto's Massey Hall by producer Richard Coulter with Stanley Horobin as technician;

"Violin Recital". Played by Betty-Jean Hagen with Leo Barkin at the piano (SDD 2157). Miss Hagen is a native of Edmonton and studied music in her hometown, Chicago and Calgary and was a student under Toronto's Geza de Kresz. Side one is devoted entirely to Schubert's "Duo in A major, Opus 162". Side two is shared by Shumann's "Sonata in A minor, Opus 105" and "Three Hungarian Dances" by Johannes Brahms. This set, under the production guidance of Richard Coulter with Stanley Horobin credited as technician, was recorded at the CBC's Carlton Studio (Toronto);

"Recital" (SDD 2158) by John Boyden with Mikael Eliasen at the piano was produced by Michael Cass-Beggs with Lionel Parent taking technician credits. Boyden was born in Stratford, Ontario and was discovered by Madame Schwarzkopf during the 1955 Summer Festival in Stratford. He was awarded scholarships to study with her at the Royal Academy in London, the Salzburg Mozarteum and the Vienna Academy. In 1957 he began intensive studies under the distinguished Montreal baritone and teacher, Bernard Diamant. Side one contains Schumann's "Liederkreis" Opus 24 with words by Heinrich Heine and points up the effect this poet had on Schumann. In fact, it's Heine's "Buch der Lieder" which forms most of the lyrics for Schumann songs;

"Concert" by Le Petit Ensemble Vocal and Montreal Consort of Ancient Instruments. Le Petit Ensemble Vocal was founded in 1956 by George Little primarily to present choral and quartet works to radio and concert



audiences. They have given frequent concerts on CBC radio and television as well as in cities from coast to coast in Canada. The Montreal Consort of Ancient Instruments was formed in 1958 by Otto Joachim and a group of local musicians. They have become internationally known through concerts, broadcasts and recordings of their unique performances on instruments considered obsolete. Some of these instruments have been constructed through information from old manuscripts and paintings; Michale Cass-Beggs produced with Claude Morin as technician at L'Ermitage, Cote des Neiges, Montreal (SDD 2159):

"Symphonies 44 And 49" by Haydn as performed by the McGill Chamber Orchestra conducted by

Alexander Brott. (SDD 2160). The McGill Orchestra is supported by the Montreal Arts Council; by the Province of Quebec for its student concerts in schools and convents, by the Canada Council for its out-of-town concerts and by the Performance Trust Fund and the Montreal Museum for its series of Museum concerts. The Orchestra is administered by a volunteer Committee. Their tour of the Soviet Union in 1966 drew rave reviews from critics and they were referred to as a "team of virtuosi". Conductor Brott was tagged: "a sensitive musician of excellent taste and faultless sense of style".

The above releases are available on the Ace of Diamonds label and carry a suggested list of \$2.98.

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Tomorrow's Eyes Looking Good

Tommorrow's Eyes, a Vancouver based quartet, have made definite chart moves with their London release, "Hallelujah". Produced by Winnipeg television personality, Bob Burns, the session was cut in Vancouver with engineering chores being handled by Tom Northcott.

Burns is one of the original boosters of the Canadian disc scene and is responsible for the launching of many groups, several who have gone onto national and international success.

"Hallelujah", a traditional folk song, is the first record release by the group. The flip, "The Way



That I Feel' was written by group member James Schoen. Other members are: Dana Andrews, Andy Sutthes and Jeep Vandebundt.

South African Quebec Top Seller

Roger Whittaker, born in Nairobi Africa (Kenya), has gently but firmly infiltrated the French Canadian disc market, and would appear ready to explode across the rest of Canada.

RCA has released two albums, one French, "Mon Pays Bleu" (PCS 4009), and an English set, "New World In The Morning" (LSP 4340). The French LP has chalked up excellent sales and is regarded as one of the top sellers for the label. Several stations throughout the Province are charting "Mon Pays Bleu" and the flip, "Mistral". (75-1021) which RCA culled as a single in view of the exposure being given the cuts by major stations in the Province. The powerful "Radiomutuel" has both sides listed at No. 8.

The titler from Whittaker's English set has become top fare for MOR stations in several major markets.

It was during his appearance at the Rio de Janeiro Festival when he introduced his "New World" penning that he became an explosive new act and much in demand. RCA signed him almost immediately and, despite a clamour for this composition by some of the world's top recording acts, it was Whittaker who waxed "New World In The Morning" first. His "Durham Town (The Leavin')" also contained on his "Great New World" set, became a top tenner on the English charts shortly after release.

Whittaker is unique with languages in that he can communicate with a sincerity usually reserved for the native tongue. He also performs with phenomenal ease in several of the difficult African dialects — and his whistling, as evidenced on his albums, is a very interesting and welcome addition

Graham/Williams to Share Bill

Mike Graham, Rodeo recording artist, has been skedded to share the bill with Hank Williams Jr. at Toronto's Horseshoe, Sept. 19. Graham and Williams will appear on the matinee show as well as appear for two evening performances.

Graham has been booked to play the Horseshoe from Sept. 7 through the 19th. His second release for Rodeo, "These Things", a self penning, has now been tagged a hit in several areas with Toronto's CFGM including it in their "Million Dollar Weekend" (8). Several other major stations across Canada have also playlisted and charted the single. His first release, "No Pity For A Fool" is still enjoying good sales and chart action.

Hank Williams Jr. has bounced onto the chart scene with his

MGM deck, "All For The Love Of Sunshine", which enters the RPM Country Fifty at No. 37 this week.

September 13-Locarno Kick-off Date

Irene and Dave Ralston, top boosters of the Canadian country scene, have set Sunday, September 13th at 8 p.m. as the kick off date for their Sunday night jamboree at the Locarno Ballroom in the east end of Toronto. Some of the acts lined up for the giant all-Canadian show include: Gary Buck, Donna Ramsay, the Chaparalls, Stompin' Tom Connors, Betty Vidal, Al Hooper, Gary Hooper, Jimmy Simms, Graham Townsend and Johnny Berdard.

Northcott Running Again With "Jane"

Tom Northcott, riding on the wave of his current hit single "Crazy Jane" on the New Syndrome label, recently made an appearance in Calgary at 'Summer Town '70'. This teen fair, held in conjunction with the Calgary Stampede, drew over sixty thousand people to the site. Because of Northcott's tight schedule, Acklands Ltd., the distributor of the MCA-handled New Syndrome, brought George Kelso of CFRN FM Edmonton to Calgary to interview Northcott for radio and television airing in Edmonton.

Tom Northcott is a quietly successful performer/composer/producer who at times looks like John Lennon. Tom, a native of Vancouver, was not always in the folk bag, but coming from a musical family, did the rounds of bands and school

choirs--even some country and western concerts. It's only after a year down in Tennessee that Tom be-

came 'folk'. During his stint at Warner Brothers, he gained experience working with a diversified roster of performers from the Jefferson Airplane to the Everly Brothers. He also worked with the Guess Who. Producers and co-producers of his records have been just as diverse, just as respected.

Following this -- a bit of time in England, then back to Vancouver to establish his own recording company-Studio 3 with Jack Herschorn and Ralph Harding. He also worked with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra on a rock symphony. With the success of "Crazy Jane", a winner on the RPM MAPL Chart, Tom Northcott's next step will be a steady stream of personal appearances and more recordings.

When Chimo first released on the Revolver label, they created an excellent image for themselves throughout Upper Canada. Their bookings increased and with the major markets they picked up with "Quicksilver Woman" U.S. interest began to run high. The Compo Co., who distribute the label across Canada, pushed hard on the single and although it didn't break nationally, it did serve to set the group up for a strong follow-up.

"Silken Silver Melody" has already indicated it is that strong follow-up. Initial reaction has been strong and with a hefty push, could break out. A U.S. release is pending.

The Canadian music industry has reached a new plateau and the motto should be something, like, "Make a hit!" After the work in the studio is completed, the real work begins. Nimbus 9 Pushing Production Effort

Richardson came in as the world's 4th. ranking producer in the Billboard Hot 100 Chart analysis, based on the first six months of 1970. The Guess Who picked up fourth place in the same performance report.

Nimbus 9 has also signed Noah (formerly Tyme and A Half) to RCA in the U.S. They have just completed an album slated for fall release, and are currently listed on the RPM MAPL chart at No. 35 with their "Cassandra" deck.

The co-production by Nimbus 9 and the Music Company of the Toronto Together project for the taping of a folk rock concert at St. Paul's Church (Toronto) has been sold to the CBC for telecast sometime in January. This session featured Tobi Lark of "Northward Hair". A cut from the session, "We're All In This Together" is being rush released by Atlantic in the U.S. The plug side was penned by Mike McQueen, who has come up with four new com-

positions for the Nimbus pubbery arm. Sunspot Music.

Other Sunspot news includes the signing of writers Kurt Winter and Greg Leskiw, the Guess Who's

Sha Na Na Puts It All Into Perspective

Saturday (8) at Stanley Park Stadium in Toronto, Sha Na Na, Kama Sutra's answer to Gene Vincent et al. put the whole rock, heavy, blues, acid, supergroup music scene into perspective. They came out with greased ducktails. combs, undershirts, gold suits and belches. They performed the lasting favourites of the degenerate generation, 'Teenager in Love', 'Teen Angel', 'At the Hop', 'Chantilly Lace' and other heavies from yesteryear. They wa-wa-ed, be-bopped, gyrated, wept, writhed and did all the other groovy things. If Iron Butterfly, Traffic, Led Zeppelin, Jeff Beck, Frijid Pink, Grand Funk Rail-Road, Eric Clapton, The Doors, Mountain, Steppenwolf and Lawrence Welk had all been jamming at the opposite end of the field, they would have gone begging for an audience. Sha Na Na plays the real nitty gritty music, the kind that has lain beneath the crankcase of a '56 Ford soaking up the oil. Sha Na Na is where it's at.

Nobody can share a bill with Sha Na Na and come out on top, so Procol Harum. Melanie, Icarus, Poco and God & I didn't really get a fair trial. Procol. through a series of misadventures with the sound system, were delayed with the start of their set, which was past midnight anyway, and fell victim to the disenchantment of the crowd. God & I. Icarus, Poco and Melanie only served as a warmup to Sha Na Na. Any of the

performers could have, under other circumstances, headlined, they were all well received. The promoters provided great sound, courtesy of Festival Productions, and a free vegetable and fruit dinner. Long live the happy con-







Brewery to Sponsor Music Championships

The 1970 North American College Music Championships will be held Saturday, August 29, at Man and his World in Montreal. Participating in the international championship, sponsorship of which was announced last week by the O'Keefe Brewing Co. Ltd., will be the national college music champions from Canada and the U.S. These groups wil compete in two categories - pop/rock and folk. The championships will be held at the Place des Nations bandstand and on the same bill with the collegiate performers will he a feature presentation by Jose Feliciano. The Feliciano concert, which will follow the championships, is one of the summer-long series of free pop shows presented at Man and His World.

Representing Canada in the poprock category will be the Phoenix, an organ/guitar duo from Laurentian University in Sudbury, Ontario. Phoenix combines a mixture of contemporary and standard arrangements. Les Goelands, a folk quartet from University Laval in Quebec City, will be the Canadian entrants in that category. The Canadian participants were selected during the 1970 Canadian college music championships. The United States national champions will be named during the national finals of the Intercollegiate Music Festival, to be held this month on the campus of the Southern Illinois University.

When they meet the U.S. winners at Man and His World, Les Goelands and Phoenix will be after a repeat of last year's all-Canadian win, when the pop/rock honours were captured by Cornelia Boucher of the Nova Scotia Teachers College; and the folk championship by

Les Contretemps from the College Jean de Brebeuf in Montreal. Les Goelands were, in fact, runners-up in the 1969 Canadian college music festival held at the Toronto Fair and won the 1970 honours over a total of one hundred and twentyfive entries.

The judging panel for the North American college music championships will be made up of outstanding personalities from the world of music in both Canada and the U.S. In addition to sponsorship of this year's event, O'Keefe will also sponsor the 1971 championships for both Canada and North America. The Canadian competition in 1971 will provide students at post secondary schools throughout the country with an opportunity to enter regional provincial competitions which will select the finalists participating in the nationals. Regionals are skedded for this spring with the nationals set to take place next August.

Warners Acquire Elektra

Effective immediately, Warner Brothers Records of Canada Ltd. will take over the manufacturing and distribution of Elektra records and tapes. All Warner Brothers policies pertaining to exchanges and sales will now be extended to the Elektra line. Any previous commitments with Allied (the former distributor) with regard to singles will be honoured on those released prior to August 15th, until September 30th of this year. The Nonesuch classical/budget line will be taken over as of September 1, 1970. Allied however, will have the right to sell their existing stock until February of 1971.

Allied's Jack Boswell, when contacted with regard to the takeover, advised that he was "very happy to have been associated with Elektra over the past seven years", and extended best wishes to Warner Brothers for continued success. Allied has been placing heavy concentration on domestic recordings of which they now have over one hundred in the album department. These include productions from the Canadian Talent Library, Sound Canada and Paragon. Other

lines handled by Allied include: Asch, Broadside, Conversaphone, (languages) and others including Recoton Phononeedles and accesories.

Cap Appoints Gagarin

Arnold Gosewich, Executive Vice President and General Manager, Capitol Records, has announced the appointment of Jim Gagarin to the position of General Manager, Retail Division. Gagarin has been in the retail record business for ten years, most recently with Discount Records Inc., a chain of twenty five record stores throughout the United States where he held the position of Regional Supervisor. Gagarin was educated at the University of Detroit and Wayne State.

The Clinch Agency is in the process of finalizing several engagements for top name recording acts for the fall season. The Moody Blues have been confirmed for a Nov. 13 date at the University of Western Ontario and Nov. 14 at the Guelph University.

Kent Bows Caprio (Gospel Rock) Agency

Hal Kent, who formerly headed up Cross Country Enterprises, has announced the formation of his new agency, Caprio, to deal with the growing need for gospel rock groups. He is presently negotiating with Don Light of Sumar and Skylight (Nashville).

Caprio is the first gospel music agency in Canada, and will be handling the bookings for the famous Churchmen. This group will be appearing at Toronto's Peoples Church in September.

Kent's wife, Linda, who released an album of country selections last year and who became well established through her many television appearances as well as engagements on the club circuit, has also moved into the gospel field. Set for release is her album "Just As I Am" on the Paragon label.

Donn and Cindy on U.K. Tour

Donn and Cindy Reynolds have been taken over for management by David Whitfield and have embarked on an extensive tour of the UK and Ireland. They have also been skedded for several appearances on television shows in Glasgow and Dublin.

After completion of their tour they will return to Canada and a recording session with Kenny Harris' new Vancouver based K.H. Productions. Their initial release will be in the pop vein on the VAN label, distributed in Canada by Polydor.

MCA Execs into New York

August 3rd and 4th saw Red Roberts, George Offer and Lee Armstrong, MCA top brass, into New York for the first joint MCA National Sales and Promotional Meeting at the Americana Hotel. Execs from Kapp, Uni and Decca were also in attendance. Each label came up with an audio-visual presentation featuring new releases and highlights from the label's catalogue. MCA discussed its plans for the future and gave an idea of their new approaches to promotion and marketing of product.

I'm getting a bit tired of reporting about all of the trashing of festivals that's going on, and the bad scenes between the authorities (whoever they may be, usually the government), and kids attending rock concerts. But it contin-



ues, and I have no idea of when it will all end, unless the people who make the laws allow the kids to have their music, or the whole thing stops altogether and we are forced to hear music only inside the house.

This past weekend another bit of theatre of the absurd occurred in Gooselake Park in Michigan where Iggy and The Stooges performed. Rather, they attempted to perform. Being a member of the press in New York gets one invited to a lot of press parties to hear new groups. This week brought forth an unbelievable rush of invitations to hear a number of fairly obscure groups. Each invitation reads more embarrassingly than the next, and they all seem to be trying to outsmart each other in the wit category. One from United Artists for a group called Damnation of Adam Blessing, came rolled up, a little transparent piece of paper that announced it would self-destruct within 48 hours. It hasn't yet, but I did have a terrible time trying to open the rolled up piece of paper which was fastened so securely with

scotch tape that I ripped it all apart in the process and have no idea where the party is to be held. It also carried the message that you don't have to be Jewish to love Damnation.....

The next goodie was from Tonsil Records, a record company whose logo is a huge mouth opened wide to show a lot of teeth and presumably, tonsils. The name of the group is Gas Mask, and the card asking us to come to a "good party instead of all those rotten ones" is so "hip" that the rest of the message is unprintable.

Invictus Records is having a party at the Playboy Club (that sexist haven) for Freda Payne and the Chairman of the Board.... Atlantic is debuting Tamailpas Exchange in the Village.... Chicken Shack is here this week, so is Ornette Coleman and Uncle John's Dirty Hot Dog Band was cancelled. Of course, I will attempt to get to as many as I can, and report on the findings, next week. But it's not easy doing this, folks.....

Janus Records rushed Mungo

Jerry's first album out this week. I have a test pressing and it's really great. The whole album is like their huge hit single, "In The Summertime" - happy, goodtime, jug band type music, very much in the vein of Jesse Fuller. In fact, they do "San Francisco Bay Blues" on the album - Fuller's tune. A sixteen millimeter film of the group singing was also distributed to television stations all over the United States. It was on Dick Clark last weekend and just shows the group singing that single.....

"Ride Captain Ride" is a million seller, and the first gold record for the **Blues Image**. The group is currently on a national tour and will be at the **Fillmore East** in late August.
