

MCA's rising young executive — Richard Bibby



Richard Bibby, regarded as Canada's rising young record executive, has actually risen. His recent appointment as vice-president and general manager of MCA Inc. (Canada), has put him "at the top", and at the age of twenty-eight is the youngest such executive in the Canadian recording industry. It wasn't too many years ago that Bibby was clerking and window dressing a London, Ontario record bar and now he heads up one of the most aggressive major record complexes in Canada. His duties encompass all Canadian operations for the label which includes: the company's six Canadian branches and two warehouses as well as their pressing plant in Cornwall, Ontario.


The climb to the top of the Canadian operation began for Bibby in 1965 when he joined Apex Records (part of the Compo complex which later became MCA Canada) as sales representative. Five years later he was elevated to head up Ontario Sales and shortly after to the post of national sales manager. He familiarized himself with every function of the operation from sales, promotion, marketing, artists relations, A&R, licensing of product and sales programs. Because of this vast knowledge, Mike Maitland, president of MCA Records Inc., appointed Bibby vice-president in charge of marketing for MCA (Canada) in 1973 — after only eight years with the company.

Bibby has developed a huge appetite for the recording industry and, in particular, the Canadian aspect of the business. He has set and maintained policies regarded as "too

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MITCHELL, ANKA & YOUNG ARE CANADIAN CITIZENS

Enquiries over the past few years have been growing as to the citizenship status of recording artists, born in Canada but now living abroad. A recent article in RPM, questioning the citizenship of Paul Anka, resulted in receipt of a letter from Mr. Andrew J. Feinman of the New York-based law firm of Feinman and Krasilovsky, P.C., which indicated that Anka was still a Canadian. Mr. Feinman noted: "Mr. Anka is very proud of his Canadian citizenship and we would appreciate your clarifying any doubts that may exist in your magazine".

In the case of Joni Mitchell and Neil Young, WEA's Larry Green advises that: "Elliott Roberts' Management office has advised WEA that both Neil Young and Joni Mitchell are, in fact, still Canadian citizens living in the U.S. That is their status and can be counted as such for the qualifications necessary to form and fill the requirements of the CRTC thirty per cent Canadian content ruling".

It should be noted that most of the enquiries have come from programmers who rely on the MAPL logo to supply them with immediate identification of Cancon product, thereby alleviating some of their housekeeping in keeping tally of their Cancon percentage. It should also be noted that the MAPL logo was designed for use in RPM only and it was only through the

With your new position do you see a change coming in regards to Cancon?

No, at least not immediately. We will continue to be very selective and look at acts we feel have international potential.

Do you see any drastic changes in MCA in Canada?

This is an industry built upon change. I don't see any "drastic changes" forthcoming because that is what we have been doing for the last two years.

Last year we switched from a distributor

PROMO & BRANCH MANAGERS MEET TOGETHER — LONDON

London Records of Canada combined their branch managers meeting with a national promotion meeting. The latter was presided over by the label's product exploitation manager, Ken Verdoni. Hosting the overall meeting were Fraser Jamieson, president and Alice Koury, vice-president.

Verdoni concentrated on discussing "artist exposure related to existing avenues and new avenues of exposure in the market place". Taking part in the meeting were Dan Lazare of Gamma Records, Terry Fludd of Aquarius Records and Andy and Joe Kim of the recently formed Ice Records.

Company policies and future plans for expansion were among the points touched on during the branch manager's meeting. A seminar was held between head office manager, branch managers and promotion representatives during which time they discussed the merchandising and marketing campaigns for fall releases.

Branch managers attending were: Adrian Bilodeau/Calgary, Fred Reffca/Montreal,

Gerry Young/Winnipeg, Orm Jones/Vancouver, Armand Beaudin/Toronto, and Deram branch manager, Alain Guillemette.

to a branch operation which resulted in a "drastic" increase in our market penetration. Scott Richards and I set up a promotion team across the country which is unique in that six out of the nine promo reps have sales responsibilities as well. And, it works.

How do you view the present state of the music industry?

First of all, speaking for MCA, I would have to say that it has never been better. Sales are up dramatically in all configurations. I think that the industry was apprehensive about the \$1.29 single but our own figures show a unit increase of 85% over last year. Our product has been stronger but I think country singles are a good guide and sales are up in that area.

Now, in terms of the Canadian music industry, a look at your own chart would indicate that we are in a soft period with only six Canadian acts in the top, 50. Included in those six are Anne Murray, Andy Kim, Terry Jacks, Gordon Lightfoot and B.T.O., who are not exactly new on the scene.

What changes would you like to see to assist the industry?

I'd like to see less bastardization of our product. Some companies feel the only way to market their goods is to give them away. It doesn't matter if it is the hottest record on the street, they will give an extra 10% or more, as is the case today.

Do you see problems confronting industry for the balance of 74 or 75?

The vinyl situation has improved but there is still concern.

Has inflation had any affect?

Costs have gone up in every area of manufacturing and distribution which, of course, resulted in increased list prices earlier this year. However, sales would indicate the public are willing to pay these prices because as I mentioned earlier, our sales are up in all configurations. Singles are up 85%, albums 52%, tape 35% and even cassettes 23%. These are unit figures, not dollar figures.

How do you feel about deletes?

I hate them. But we have no problem. Last year less than 2% of our total production ended up as a delete. Now the problem facing our industry here is the deleted product coming across the border which is eating up the record buyers dollars.

How do you deal with deletes?

A list is sent to every account and they are available on a first come, first served basis.

Do you feel young executives are beginning to control the industry?

Yes.

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In the sixties, the Canadian Radio and Television Commission came under fire many times. Throughout that same period the record companies were constantly badgered with criticism. In the early seventies, the broadcasters were criticised and programmers were targets of much criticism.

Over those many years, we have learned a great deal about the problems of each of these areas of "the industry". With time and age... comes wisdom.

Today we have become comparative moderates in overseeing the trade.

No one knows the problems of the broadcaster better than the broadcaster, and he responds to any threat in the same way as any businessman.

No one can appreciate the difficulties of the CRTC better than the members who have been given a job to do, and that job is well defined by the Broadcast Act and the mandate of the land.

No programmer knows better than other programmers, the difficulties of programming a radio station against the competition.

VANCOUVER PREMIERE FOR "THAT'S ENTERTAINMENT"

Vancouver's Stanley Theatre played host recently to a premiere of the MGM movie, "That's Entertainment". The premiere for local press representatives was arranged through the MGM distributor in Vancouver and MCA Records which holds rights to the soundtrack.

The movie, which is a collection of snips from many of MGM's great movies, places particular emphasis on the large scale musicals of the thirties, forties and fifties. The resulting soundtrack is rich in popular tunes sung by such well-knowns as Crosby, Garland, Chevalier, Durante and Kelly.

COLUMBIA'S WILLIAMS PRESENTS CANCON AT CBS CONVENTION

John Williams, A&R Director for Columbia Canada took a bundle of Cancon to the annual CBS Convention held in Los Angeles this past week. He was part of the Canadian entourage headed up by the Canadian operation's vice-president and general manager Terry Lynd and includes the label's vice-president Jack Robertson, director of national sales, Bert Dunsieith, director of merchandising, Julian Rice and Charlie Camilleri, director of national promotion.

Included in the Williams' presentation is the new Danny McBride single, "Good Day Tomorrow" and "Standing Alone"; single product by Bearfoot, "Passing Time" and "She Comes To Me"; and Cliff Edwards' next single, "Where Do We Go From Here" and "I've Been Alone Too Long".

New artists to the Columbia fold were also introduced to the international gathering. They are Myles and Lenny, who rushed a sample taping of their talents (taped at Eastern Sound) specially for the Los Angeles meet. This duo has already been tagged "the find of the year", and are expected to be on release with an album by mid-September. Another new artist, Marc Jordan, a native of Toronto, was given the red carpet listening treatment for CBS delegates. Single and album product by Jordan should be on release for the fall season.

In the case of the record companies, they were welcomed into Canada when the record business began. Their know-how and foreign financing was applauded because they were adding something to Canada, culturally and economically. No one dreamed that the surge of nationalism of the late sixties and early seventies would create new unwritten rules for the record companies. Those rules are unwritten and invalid. The questioning of foreign-owned record endeavours in this country is a series of accusations that are unjustified in view of the fact that in the beginning there were no rules and, to make them up as we go along is wrong.

Each faction of the industry are only looking out after their own interest, and that is the whole jist of free enterprise.

Another aspect of free enterprise is the function of the press to criticize all and anyone who might not agree with a particular point that seems reasonable and beneficial to the industry as a whole. On the other hand, one can disagree with your freedom to respond to such criticism.

What is being discussed here is the basic rights of every individual in a free society.

At this moment, the criticism of the press regarding Watergate is mellowing in that the press did fulfill its obligation to expose the wrongs of the government in power.

The press is subject to as much criticism, as broadcasters, record companies, the CRTC and programmers. Let the chips fall where they may.

Criticism can cause change, and in the long run it can be of benefit to everyone.

We aren't apologizing for our years of comment and criticism, we are only anxious to set the record straight by saying that no one knows the problems of a trade newsweekly better than the publisher... and at the moment I wouldn't wish this position on my worst enemy. So what's new???

ATTIC'S WILLIAMS MAKES WESTERN PROMO SWING

Tom Williams of Toronto-based Attic Records left that southern Ontario town two weeks ago on a swing through major cities in western Canada to promote the label's two current singles, "Brother and Me" f/s "Piece of Alright" by Fludd and Ron Nigrini's "Letters". Williams visited stations in Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton, Regina, Saskatoon and Winnipeg on the promo tour.

Fludd is the well known Ontario group formerly with WEA and Daffodil. Nigrini is a Toronto boy, recording for the first time with Attic. The label is distributed in Canada by London Records.

CHILLIWACK DATES COINCIDE WITH NEW ALBUM RELEASE

As London distributed Goldfish Records releases Chilliwack's debut album for the label, the west coast group embarks on a brief western tour. Next week Chilliwack plays Sylvan Lake, B.C., Calgary and shares billings with Santana in Edmonton and Vancouver. A tour of eastern Canada is currently being set up for the month of September.

The album release, "Riding High", comes hot on the heels of the group's success with their "There's Something I Like About That". A new single, "Crazy Talk", is expected to be released shortly. Negotiations for U.S. release of Chilliwack product are now underway.

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

NFB MOVES WEST TO WINNIPEG

September 15th is the target date for the opening of the National Film Board's Winnipeg offices - to serve Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and the north and north-western Ontario.

The Peg' office will be managed by Allen Palmer, presently stationed in Montreal as chief of the NFB's prairie provinces district. It's hoped that with the establishment of these offices there will be more western Canadian input to the Board's production efforts and to establish a stronger sense of regional individualism.

There are three films being planned for production by April of next year, at a total cost of \$350,000.

The NFB now has offices located in Montreal, Halifax and Vancouver.

Cocktail parties, press receptions, opening nights

Someone once referred to a record company cocktail party as "a boxlunch with booze". I was at that party and I agreed wholeheartedly.

When a record company hosts a cocktail party, they should put on their best bib and tucker, but cocktail parties should be

very special occasions and a great deal of planning should go into this type of event.

Obviously there is a reason for a record company to entertain the trade, the media or friends of the company. Often there is an artist or a new product to be promoted, or the celebration of an achievement. A cocktail party can be a good way to bring attention to an interesting happening, but it should be a good party that is well planned.

Sometimes I think that the people behind the events aren't sure just how to arrange a cocktail party. The pure booze concept (with a few sandwiches) doesn't really impress those you are trying hard to impress. A party that is papered with personal friends of the staff can be a little confusing to those who attend. Why hasn't the promotion team got a good list of who should be there?

Invitations sent too late (often arriving the day) of the event show a definite lack of organization.

Everything from the place you pick to the kind of drinks and food that will be served, the list that is invited and the presentation itself . . . indicate a good party or a bad one. You should know how to throw one, or get someone who does.

A media person (daily paper) walked up to me at a recent party and asked me who the hell arranged all this. The next question was, "Is the record industry on its last leg?"

So cocktail parties can defeat their purpose.

CANADIAN TALENT LIBRARY — 12 YEARS OF RECORDING

Saturday July 27/74 marked the twelfth year of recording for Standard Broadcasting's transcription service — The Canadian Talent Library. There were many doubters in the beginning as Standard's vice-president, Lyman Potts, points out: "Our associates in the broadcasting industry said it couldn't be done", adding "However, we were able to break down a few road-blocks and to demonstrate that Canadian artists and studio technicians were every bit as qualified in the recording field as their counterparts in the United States and abroad".

That first day of recording back in 1962 resulted in two albums containing twenty-four selections each — both taped in two three-hour periods. Johnny Burt, arranger-composer, conducted the orchestras for "The Strings Of Johnny Burt" (1001/5001) and for "Johnny Burt And His Orchestra" (1004/5004). The latter featured Teddy Roderman. Burt went on to supervise many sessions since then.

The Canadian Talent Library sessions in the beginning cost around \$200. per album, less the musicians' costs, of course. Today, the studio costs of a comparable album, less talent costs etc., ring in at about \$4000. The

Too many can become a bore and a poor reason to throw one can also become a negative.

Strangely enough, I personally feel that cocktail parties reflect the character of the host. I also think they are reviewed just like a performance of a group or an artist. The media can be left cold by a bad gathering and in the same way walk away from a good party with a good feeling.

Often someone says we owe the trade and the media a cocktail party. This is one of the best reasons to throw a party. It's a way of saying thank you to the people who are cooperating with you on a day to day basis.

I seldom eat or drink at these dos, but I always like to see what kind of food is served and what kind of liquor is available. I look at the people who have attended to judge whether the company has had the know-how or the power to attract the "right" people (and there is such a thing). I often refer to them as "the power people" meaning that they are in a position to

GEORGE NICKOLAU PRODUCT DISTRIBUTED BY BERANDOL

George Nickolau and his Orchestra's fourth single release on the Honeycomb label is being distributed nationally by Berandol Music. His current release, "Never Say Good-bye", with arrangements and production by Paul Zaza at Zaza Sound Productions in Toronto, has been receiving good play on Toronto's CKEY and CFRB.

A Canadian content single, the Nickolau offering is instrumental with Greek flavouring and has brought much attention to the production. Apparently talks are now underway between Nickolau and Dave Mazmanian of Capitol Records.

Nickolau is well-known in Canada's Greek community where his previous releases have been widely accepted. He is now attempting to break through the ethnic barrier and into the English speaking market.

Library has just completed taping its 185th album — bringing its total number of selections recorded to 2186 and increasing the number of Canadian compositions recorded to 567.

Initiated by Standard's CFRB/Toronto and CJAD/Montreal, both of whom still underwrite half the costs, the Canadian Talent Library "has played a major roll in providing Canadian content material to Canadian radio stations". There are now 240 radio stations across Canada as well as the BBC in England, subscribing to the Canadian Talent Library. These subscribers as well as royalties received from masters leased to commercial record companies etc. go toward alleviating the costs of the sessions and packaging.

The Canadian Talent Library offices are adjacent to CFRB in Toronto and continues to be administrated by Potts. Mal Thompson joined the Library as A&R manager in 1970 and has served as executive producer on many sessions over the past four years.

Most recent album success from the Canadian Talent Library comes from a new discovery, eighteen year old Cathie Stewart. Her album, "Country Downs" (the title is a self penning) is distributed by Quality Records and, because of programmer response, has forced the single release of "M.R.A.", also a Stewart original.

further the endeavour of the record company.

There aren't too many cocktail parties thrown in the trade. There are a lot of "join us for drinks and see the show" type of parties and the "box lunch with booze".

There's no use pretending that a good cocktail party can be done without spending money. It costs, but it can really pay off. What you are buying can't be bought for money. Good press, the public's attention is something that has to be manipulated.

Don't think that cocktail parties are something that occur only in the music industry, I have been to many that are arranged by book publishers, movie companies, fashion designers, art gallery owners, broadcasters and theatrical people. In New York, Los Angeles and London, business is done over a drink and some hors d'oeuvres.

You have an artist coming into town, throw a cocktail party. You have a new label or a new artist, you wish to give an award, you are hyping a soundtrack . . . throw a cocktail party.

Press receptions with drinks and food fall into the same category and opening nights should be highlighted with a cocktail party. It pays, and if it didn't, there wouldn't be any. It's just that in our business . . . there are very few because they don't come off well. You've got to create excitement.

You can learn to make them come off (or hire someone who can) and don't forget to hire a photographer.

Can we "take you to our leader"?

Do you have a leader for the Canadian country association? Is there someone out there who can round up and organize everyone in Canadian country?

So far, Canadian country music has suffered from a lack of leadership and even more, from a lack of a unified cause. Over the years, every faction of country music has been split on even the most simple issues.

As soon as an attempt is made to get country people together, the result usually ends up in a great deal of bickering about how to fight the country music that comes into Canada from the outside.

No effort is made to organize and promote the Canadian sound of country, and very little heed is paid to the fact that Nashville was built by the unified effort of artists and songwriters and all the allied areas of country music. There was no competition in Nashville except with the talent of performers.

As country music grew, it became possible for Nashville to do a public relations job on the world to prove that the only country

sound was the sound from Nashville.

Canada could very well rip a page out of the Nashville book and do the same.

We really need a leader and especially one who has the polish and personality to guide Canada's country music into respectability.

Where in Canada can we find that refined elder statesman of country music who can promote himself to the press and the media and finally the public to prove that our country music can compete on the world scene?

The Nashville movement was a combination of the country gentleman and the country bumpkin and in the end the product was entertainment. The countryfied atmosphere that Nashville created and friendliness and cooperation made possible the money that was later spent in propelling the Nashville sound into the world market.

Canadian country at present has the reputation of a moaning, griping few who have been led in some fashion by the bleating and complaining of those who had only a few in mind as they promoted what they called "Canadian Talent".

What comes first? The successful working country artist or the success of Canadian country? It becomes a case of what comes first, the horse or the cart, but does it matter when you don't even have a driver?

"STAMP OUT PARASITES" — CRIA PRESIDENT REYNOLDS

The Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) has obtained two judgements for copyright infringement in the Supreme Court of Ontario. The CRIA was acting on behalf of thirty-three Canadian copyright owners.

The judgements were against Emile E. Klein and Libra Importing Co. Limited, carrying on business as Stirling Importers and Benny Klein and Sam Berkel carrying on business as S & B Associates, Radio Import Limited, Tradeco Imports, Triangle Importers and Cantrade Limited.

Through the judgements, dated Dec 1973 and June 1974, the plaintiffs obtained a permanent injunction against the defendants "restraining them from producing or reproducing in whole or in substantial part, or importing copies of 8-track stereo cartridge tapes and the copyrights in which are owned by any of the plaintiffs, without first having the express consent in writing by the owner or owners and from advertising, distributing, exposing or offering for sale or selling in Canada copies of 8-track cartridge tapes that infringe the copyrights owned by the plaintiffs.

Costs amounting to \$3000 were awarded to the plaintiffs with 1394 tapes, originally seized by the RCMP, being turned over to the plaintiffs as well.

In commenting on piracy, CRIA president Ross Reynolds stated: "Tape piracy and infringement of copyright is not Canada's problem alone, it is a worldwide sickness. However, in Canada we will do our utmost to stamp out the parasites who feed off the legitimate recording industry".

Hammerin' those heavy hits down your throat *by John Watts*

Not many people have much faith in the methods used for rating broadcast popularity in North America. Even those salesmen who a day after the ratings come out hustle around to all the accounts hyping the fact that the book says that WILT has 49,000 albinos of Portugese descent listening between 5:45 and 6:00, don't really take it seriously. I only ever met one guy who got a rating book, and he sold it to the manager of his station.

The reason I bring this up is because I've been doing a little survey of my own. I'm a CBC buff as far as radio goes. Oh sure, they do some pretty stupid things and sometimes get a little pretentious, but on the whole they do some pretty good numbers. CBC in the morning is always good for an interesting interview, and not with Ronnie Rivulet, rock superstar with a life-span of two months, but with people who have interesting, thought provoking things to say. And strangely enough, many of these people are Canadian, with things to say about the Canadian condition.

Anyway, regardless of all that, after gradually getting hooked on the CBC, it occurred to me that something this far ahead of its competitors on a quality basis couldn't really be doing so badly in the ratings. If one were to believe the BBM, no more than thirteen people are listening to the CBC's hundreds of transmitters at any one time.

What I did was to ask about twenty people what radio they listened to. Although I

FIDDLERS' CONTEST FINALS TO BE BROADCAST LIVE ON CBC

Shelburne, Ontario, will be the scene of the 24th Canadian Open Championship Fiddle Contest, August 9 and 10. This is the biggest annual event of its kind in the world. As has been customary since 1951, CBC Radio and a number of top entertainment personalities, among them Myrna Lorrie, The Rhythm Pals, former winner fiddler Al Cherney, and emcee Harry Brown, will be on hand to present listeners across the country with the finals of the two-day contest. CBC Radio co-sponsors this event, and this year, for the first time, will present a new trophy to the winner of the Open class. The trophy is a modern sculpture by Jack Sullivan of the Ontario College of Art.

Approximately 10,000 country enthusiasts are expected to be present to hear performances by North America's top professional and amateur fiddlers. Canada and many American states will be represented in the contest. Last year's winner was Rudy Meeks, making it his second consecutive Grand Champion title. Primary objectives of the contest are to stimulate public interest in old time and folk music, encourage the development of fiddling talent, and raise funds for approved charities.

suppose it was one of the more unscientific surveys of the twentieth century, I got a wide cross-section of people. I had university graduates and high school drop-outs. Professional people and housewives. Kids of fourteen and pensioners.

A couple of them listened to CBC every day faithfully for many hours at a time. Many of them were partial to a particular program, particularly mornings and evenings. Others turned on only the news. Five didn't listen to CBC at all.

What occurred to me at the end of it was that many more people listen to CBC Radio than a) are willing to admit to the BBM or b) the BBM is willing to admit to us. More than half of the people judged CBC to be better in quality than the private stations and therefore they listened more often for greater lengths of time to it.

One could say that my sample was prejudiced for some reason or other. If it was, I can't see it. Of course twenty isn't one of your larger survey samples, but surely it must give a rough indication of some kind or other.

The conclusion I draw from this is that the CBC Radio audience is significantly larger than the ratings would have us believe. Possibly people who listen to CBC are allergic to rating books. Maybe the BBM has a vested interest in enlarging the audiences of commercial stations, who knows?

Assuming my little sample means something or other, a couple of things come to mind. If the CBC's audience is bigger than the ratings indicate, then the CBC approach may be usable in private radio. I think this could be applied particularly in the area of music programming where repetitiveness could be reduced and in news where that guy who screams and tells you nothing

could be replaced by someone articulate who tells you something.

It seems that many decisions made about programming are based on a couple of assumptions. Firstly that the American experience can be transported wholesale to this country and secondly that the more cerebral offerings of the CBC have proved unpopular in the ratings and therefore should be shunned. The first one is a load of crap and I pray that some day it will be put to sleep forever. The second one is harder to put to rest, but it seems to me that CBC style programming doesn't do anywhere nearly as badly in the ears of the listeners as it does in the columns of the BBM.


THE "CANADIAN FRONTIER" ALBUM



Against the background of Indian Nations weakened by white diseases and Whiskey Traders, the Northwest Mounted Police were born. During the summer of 1874 they marched across Canada's great plains toward the very heart of the Blackfoot Nation. And, in doing so, the force began a century-long walk across the pages of Canadian History. This album tells the story of some of the major steps they took along the way.

"Scarlet and Gold" was created by a group of young Canadians. When they finished recording it there was a ripple of excitement no one needed to explain.
