

## Record Pool & Amour promoting Cdn image

The Canadian Record Pool, one of the country's most aggressive disco information centres has joined with Amour Records in a unique disco promotion. The group produced an album they hope will "close the existing communication gap between Disco Discjockeys, record outlets and the general public."

Distributed through Trans Canada Music Service of Montreal, the album features Robert Lee's penning of Are You Ready To Love Me, produced by Theme Variations and published through Theme Variations (BMI). The special disco mix was created by George Cucuzella, Michel Daigle and Dominique Zgarka. The cuts are 9:32 and 3:44 in length.

## Motown adds Memorex, drops Mushroom label

Motown (Canada), which recently began servicing all Ontario accounts directly from their Scarborough warehouse, announced they will also distribute Memorex blank tape product here.

Motown president Ron Newman appointed two new Ontario promo men, Jerry Hochberg and Cliff Johnson, and Debbie (Ti Ti) Hoita will anchor on the phone lines.

Newman also announced that his firm will no longer handle Mushroom records, "Which means," he said, "we will no longer accept returns on Mushroom product."

## Richardson producing Capitol's Michael Bolotin

Nimbus 9's Jack Richardson has just capped his latest production venture, an album by Michael Bolotin for RCA. The session was produced at Soundstage with mastering at JAMF. Initial single culled from the set will be the Burton Cummings and Randy Bachman penning of These Eyes, giving the New Haven, Connecticut native a three-part Cancon single (MLP).

Horn charts for the lush session were arranged by Doug Riley with string arrangements by Allan Macmillan. One of the more interesting cuts on the set is Rocky Mountain Way which features a 16 bar fiddle solo by Pappa John Creech who was playing Toronto's El Mocambo during the taping of the production and was recruited as a sideman by Richardson.

## Michael J. Kernahan, Moxy goes World Wide, new Capitol ad chief

Michael J. Kernahan, formerly sales and promotion coordinator with Mallory of Canada, is Capitol Records' new director of advertising and creative services.

Kernahan, who came to Canada from Scotland in 1969, has a wide-ranging background in packaging, merchandising and in-store techniques.

Moxy manager Roland Paquin recently signed a deal with World Wide Artists for world-wide representation for the Toronto group.

The band's debut LP, "Moxy, has been released in the U.S. by Mercury, and Moxy is now finishing the mix of their upcoming LP in New York. World Wide is working out a U.S. tour for the group to coincide with their new LP release there.

## Sweeney Todd splits, John Allan salutes two seek U.S. deal U.S. Bicentennial

As their current single climbs the RPM national chart, Vancouver's Sweeney Todd has broken up.

Leader and lead singer Nick Gilder, Passiton Publicity's Barry Samuels reports, is pursuing an offer from a U.S. major label to sign as a solo act. He's taking lead guitarist Jim McCulloch with him. The pair wrote all but one song on the Sweeney Todd London LP; Gilder sang all vocals and McCulloch played all guitar parts.

The group was recently offered an international deal with London.

Columbia's Cape Breton gem, John Allan Cameron, has been firmed to host and perform at the Canadian salute to the U.S. Bicentennial May 27 in Philadelphia. John Allan has just completed a successful tour of the prairies and will kick off his two week tour of the Maritimes in Woodstock, New Brunswick June 1st. Other dates include Saint John (2), Fredericton (3), Moncton (4), Wolfville, Nova Scotia (5), Sydney (6), Antigonish (7) and Halifax for two days (9-10).

Columbia's director of sales, Bert Dunseith, reports exceptional national action on Cameron's album, Weddings, Wakes & Other Things, which enters the RPM chart at No. 97 this week.

## Marsden's shot spots solid radio promo

David Marsden's Lip Service Productions Ltd. are currently producing radio commercial "shot spot" packages for Polydor Records (Moxy), Axe Records (Major Hoople's Boarding House, Gail Dahms) and concert promoters, Martin Onrot Inc.

Through a recent press release, Marsden has indicated that a survey (conducted by Lip Service) had found a large proportion of radio's listening audiences, were unaware of artist names and record titles, due to "radio increasing to downplay artists and titles, and emphasizing the continuing music, minimum personality aspect, both on AM and FM."

Marsden concludes "it seems essential that record companies back up their air-play discs with good solid promotion."

# COJO's last chance Your "official" Olympic Song by Alan Guettel

If you wrote a song about the Montreal Olympics, it would be charged with the drama of a race against the calendar, coloured with the public suspicions of COJO (the Olympic organizing committee) and sparked with the ironies of miscalculations and official, Ron Ziegler-like statements.

A good opening verse would highlight Montreal Mayor Drapeau's statement that the Olympics could no more show a deficit than a man could have a baby. Drapeau is already wearing maternity clothes to cover up a \$1 billion deficit.

But COJO has done the songsters one better; they're now hurrying through their second attempt to have an "official" Olympic song (with an eye on music as one of many COJO fundraisers).

committee, to provide opening and closing themes and background music during the games.

There were complaints that COJO should use works of a living Quebec composer; but the deal had already been sewn up by COJO legal advisor Pierre Thibault, who also manages the estate of the late composer. Thibault is part owner, as well, of Les Productions Centrum, the firm which publishes all of Matheau's material used in the Olympics, including the welcome song.

Words to the theme, arranged by Victor Vogel (contracted by COJO to arrange all official music) were penned by Claude Lacombe with a credit also to Rene Simard.

At the record's press unveiling, in Octo-

late April. The contest deadlines May 23; the games are in July.

Most publishers ignored the call, noting the short time involved and the high production standards for submissions: all must be produced in a studio on 15 ips mono tape, with three to five union musicians accompanying a vocalist.

COJO is prepared to reimburse participants up to \$100 for studio costs, based on their estimated \$200 total session costs. No one polled by RPM thought \$200 was a realistic figure for such a production; Estimates ranged from \$300-\$600 for a quality, competitive production.

In return for COJO's \$100 per applicant support they want, according to the contest form, for each of the 10 finalist songs, "half the royalties normally paid to the publisher. COJO will take part jointly with the publisher, with the same rights and liabilities, in all negotiations involving the song. Normal business procedures for the song shall be the responsibility of the publisher."

Al Mair, who heads up the Attic Publishing group and administrates Gordon Lightfoot's Early Morning Music, exemplified the response of most publishers polled by RPM: "I don't see any justification for COJO becoming part owner of the copyright. The prize is not a creative fee or a commission. I'm dead against any government body taking a share of the ownership of the copyright when they will not be fulfilling any functions of copyright ownership."

Venne told RPM the publishing rule was his idea, and COJO intends to set up a publishing firm to administer their interests. Though the procedure is unusual, Venne thought it necessary to assure the contest, costing \$125,000 would be self-financing.

## "fix"

The first "official" song, Welcome To Montreal written by Claude Lacombe to a contata by the late Andre Matheau and sung by child-star Rene Simard, stiffed. Stations refused to air it and music industry people cried "fix"; there was no open contest (as with some contracts without tenders on other Olympic projects).

Music for the song came from the works of the late composer, chosen by COJO, and approved by the international Olympic

ber 1975, reporters questioned the propriety of COJO selecting Lacombe, an assistant to Andre Morin, COJO's director of official ceremonies, to write the lyrics.

Nevertheless, COJO ran with the song until it clearly stiffed.

They demoted it to "official song of welcome" and announced a song contest for a new "official song of closing" late in March. Actually, it can't be an "official" song of closing because of contractual arrangements (unless it uses music by Matheau); it will be aired on the Olympic broadcast just after the flame is extinguished, to an audience of more than 1 billion viewers.

COJO formed a reputable jury to select a winner and appointed Stephane Venne to coordinate the contest.

Venne, a director of CAPAC, won the 1967 Expo song contest with his Hey Friend, Say Friend.

Venne, who had nothing to do with the first song, told RPM that no one on the committee was familiar with the music business. The Simard song, he says, should have been used as a jingle (background for radio promo spots) and not a single.

Contest forms and rules were mailed out to BMI and CAPAC (Canada's two performing rights societies) affiliate publishers in

## "sham"

COJO's concern for copyright part-ownership stems also from a desperate attempt to finance the games, which may not be in tune with the music industry's interests (best served by a broader, anybody-can-win songfest.)

John Pozer, who runs both BMI and CAPAC publishing firms, feels the contest is a sham, and not accessible to all of Canada.

Pozer, a bilingual Francophone from Montreal who now works out of Vancouver, explains: "If they wanted to run a Quebec contest, why didn't they just put it in French and say 'Quebec only'. But, they have mailed this right across Canada." Pozer adds that a Quebec contest would be legitimate since the province, not Canada, is hosting the games.

He suspects the composition of the jury; only two of the more than 20 listed on the form, are Anglophone (and one of them is from a French-language newspaper).

Venne explains that it is "politically impossible" for COJO to limit the contest to Quebec and defends the ability of Montreal programmers and music writers to pick

## The sound of music: What's up, Doc?

"Now we come to the loud part of the show," said music satirist Bill Spooner, lead guitarist/composer for A&M's Tubes, who played Toronto's International Centre, April 28.

"As we begin to turn up the sound," he said, "we kindly insist that all pregnant women move towards the far end of the hall, and don't anyone be dismayed when you start to notice a slight bleeding around the ears."

Through their intended parody, the Tubes targeted a documented effect, that threatens the goodhealth of the \$7.70-\$9.50 ticket-buying concertgoer: according to various medical reports (and reams of consumer magazine heresay) loud sound levels, a common feature of the heavy-metal rock act, sometimes can inflict upon its listener, permanent hearing damage.

"It is quite possible that people who attend rock shows and are seated in the front rows for long periods of time, listenings to sounds over 90 or 100 decibels are definitely risking damage to their hearing," said David Hunter of Levitt-Safety Limited, Canadian distributors of the E.A.R. Plug, a polymer product, squeezed between the fingers and inserted into the ear.

"Some bands don't even realize how loud they really are," said Gary Stevenson, manager of Toronto rock club, the Picadilly Tube tavern.

"Some of these musicians who come in here are constantly telling their sound people that they want the volume turned up louder, because they (the musicians) can't even hear how loud they're playing anymore."

"A lot of the rock bands today, are playing louder than is necessary," Westbury


RCA have made two new appointments in their western region. Jim Fotheringham has been named sales manager for Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba. He'll be working in the label's Calgary office. Jim Maxwell will work out of the Winnipeg office and will be RCA sales and promo rep for Manitoba.

A&M has added Jean-Marc Corbeil to the firm's Eastern Canada sales force. Corbeil has four years' experience in the business, including work as French territory promo rep for MCA Records.

Sound's David Bennett told RPM. Westbury have set up sound equipment for CHUM-FM's Toronto outdoor summer concerts.

"What I really take offence to," he said, "is that some bands are turning up their volumes louder, so that they can cover up their musical limitations and obnoxious behaviour. Although I can see a certain excitement in getting your stomach shook up by a low bass, I wouldn't even bother to risk putting my ears through any pain. But then there's younger audiences who will endure the sound, because they probably feel its the 'in' thing to do."

Brendan Lyttle, road manager for the Stampeders (who've played in many school auditoriums) has made mention of the fact that teachers are constantly instructing students before rock music concerts, not to sit too close to the amps, which is an ironi-

cal contrast to the "vegged out" young rock fans, seen to ingest great quantities of psychedelia and liquor in order to numb and "get used to" the front row music levels at the big concert halls.

"The only way that you could determine exactly what the decibel level of the sound equipment is," said Levitt-Safety's Hunter, "keeping in mind that the 'threshold of pain' or damaging decibel level, is up around 120 decibels would be to do on the spot tests with a sound level meter."

The Picadilly Tube's Stevenson also agrees that there should be a form of sound regulation, possibly through the mandatory use of sound level meters. MD

## Boys in the banned a key to success?

A&M's Tubes band, utilize sexual overtones in their theatrical music presentations, via chorus girls flashing pasties, g-strings, and a highly suggestive manner of erotic rock and rolling.

The Tubes Canadian debut at Toronto's Massey Hall, October 18, 1975, continued as planned without interference from Toronto's Morality Squad.

Four months later, February 16, 1976, Music Shoppe booked the Detroit band, Curved Stone Beateaze into Toronto's Penthouse Motor Inn . . . a band considered by Music Shoppe's John Stainton to be a "spinoff of the Tubes."

The band played, but were pulled off the Penthouse stage two nights after their opening, "through a mutual agreement between the Morality Squad, the clubowner and the band," said Stainton.

Penthouse manager Bill Mack, told RPM that Curved Stone Beateaze, showcased "a very gross act. Specifically," he said, "they had a chick and a plastic doll on a mattress up on the stage, and they began shoving a baloney in and out of the doll. I personally thought it was obscene, and the Morality Squad said, that if we didn't pull the band off, then they'd charge the club, and the band with permitting the act to go on."

February 23, Music Shoppe booked Curved Stone Beateaze into Toronto's downtown Yonge Street "core" tavern, the Picadilly Tube. After a few nights, the Morality Squad intervened, and the band were pulled off once again.

"If a club is full of young kids, and they don't dig what's playing, then they usually go down the street to another bar. The band weren't really doing anything that wrong, but it just seems that its not yet the right time for Curved Stone Beateaze to play the Toronto market," although "getting busted is the best thing that can happen to an act."

A&M's Tubes have since played Toronto's International Centre, April 28, many people buying tickets, hooked by the lure of the band's rock music erotica.

Ironically, the Penthouse Motor Inn, have billed for their second Penthouse appearance, the Miss Nude Canada Show, featuring male/female frontal and backside nudity (May 3-8). In manager Mack's opinion, the show is "tastefully done", also considering that to be the Morality Squad's position as well.

# Ian Thomas' audience has caught up to him by Boyd Tattrie

Ian Thomas' Painted Ladies single, from a few years back, will no doubt someday be remembered as one of the classics of Canadian pop. It was Thomas' first release as a solo performer, and it launched him as a national act.

But the success of that single also brought him a problem: the audience that loved the flow of the melody and simple lyrics seemed unwilling to expand and grow with Thomas as he continued to develop. Only now, with the success of Calabash, his new album, can Thomas say that he is being accepted the way he wants to be.

"Painted Ladies was a good ice-breaker," recalls Thomas:

"The only problem was that everyone wanted to hear more of the same, and by the time it was released (which was a year after it was recorded), I'd already compositionally evolved past that, or what I thought was past that. Basically it's taken me two years of doggin' it to finally get accepted on the grounds that I want to get accepted on, and that is being able to say more than 'oohoo, feelin' fine mama.'"

Thomas' first audiences were 'mostly of 13-to-16-year-olds', presumably the people who were buying the single. And although the same production and musical sophistication were involved in Thomas' follow-up releases, Long, Long Way and The Good Life, that audience didn't greet them with the same enthusiasm.

"We get so many requests now for Long Long Way in concert and it didn't do all

that well. Now we're getting all sorts of people saying, 'Long Long Way was one of your best songs ever!' . . . Everybody's a retrospective genius, everybody's saying it's a great song. Why didn't they say that when



it was out? They weren't ready to let me progress at that point."

Thomas' abilities as a producer stem from his two-year stint as staff producer for the CBC, following his stay with the now-defunct Toronto band, Tranquillity Base. During this early period, Thomas also learned about orchestrations and arrangements; one of his first performances following Painted Ladies was with the Hamilton Philharmonic.

Ian Thomas was the name of his first GRT LP, followed by Long Long Way, then by Delights. There were not any singles successes from that album, but it wasn't intended for AM. "The third album broke a lot of ice for album listeners and album buyers," explains Thomas.

Delights is still selling in the States. Since there is no American distribution deal as


yet for Thomas product, a sale there means that someone has gone through the trouble of putting in an order at their local record store and waiting two weeks or so for its delivery: a sale based on word-of-mouth and across-the-border FM airplay only.

Helped along by the AM success of Liars, Thomas' new Calabash LP has placed him in a position where he sells well without artistic compromise. Featured in RPM April 10, the album "is filled with dreams, illusions and allusions to old-time Hollywood stars." Right Before Your Eyes may become one of those classics Thomas is known for. It is only one of the cuts being played by several progressive stations, particularly Toronto's CHUM-FM.

The LP is officially by The Ian Thomas Band; Thomas feels that a new plateau has been reached with them: "They're super guys to work with and excellent musicians. Not only are the songs saying something lyrically but musically everything is achieving a certain level which I don't think ever could have been achieved using just sidemen."

Live performances have also gained in entertainment value, Thomas believes, because there is less self-indulgence and carelessness.

As is too often the case, only the lack of an international distribution deal keeps Ian Thomas from being a success outside Canada. But, GRT is currently negotiating for the American release of Calabash and those pop classics.


It's produced by Brian Ahern who caught wind of him when Pringle was writing songs for Mary Travers and Anne Murray a few years ago. This LP shows some of Ahern's best production work ever. Then, there's the participation of people like Mason Williams (on guitar) and Emmylou Harris, Linda Ronstadt, and Canada's Dianne Brooks, singing background vocals.

Listeners may be reminded of other singers, but Pringle possess a range and quality that makes his voice unique.

Included on this LP are two songs he wrote for Anne Murray, Drown Me and Please Don't Sell Nova Scotia, which receive interesting treatments.

There's material here for everyone; FMers, MOR, and, although no definite plans for a single have been made, there's AM potential with several songs. All LP cuts are three parts Cancon (MAL). It was recorded in the U.S. on the Enactron Truck, though some mixing was done at Toronto Sound.

The LP has a chance for heavy promotion in the U.S., since Pringle has spent so much time there. Hopefully he will continue to qualify as a Canadian.



## Rockabyeing baby can retard development

"The development of children was measurably slowed up in homes where they were constantly exposed to loud noise from TV, radio and recorded music," said Dr. Theodore Wachs, associate professor of psychological sciences at Purdue University.

Wachs recently administered a detailed two-year study involving 40 babies from varying backgrounds. Infants ranging in age from a few weeks to 12 months were found, after being exposed to loud noise, to be suffering in three important developmental areas: speech imitation (the ability to copy certain key words and recognize them); anticipation of consequences (the ability to guess what will happen if events are patterned in a specific way); and causality (which involves the child learning how to make events happen, such as crying to receive attention).

"We also discovered that boys were more vulnerable to these negative effects than girls," said Dr. Wachs.

Dr. Kathryn Barnard, professor of nursing at the University of Washington, recently carried out tests on 200 babies within a one year period. She insisted "... never use a switched-on television as a babysitter, and don't turn up the volume of a TV, radio or phonograph, so as to hear it in another room. It can be almost deafening to a baby."

It was discovered that babies inundated by loud noises, react by ignoring all sound.





Catch A Rising Star is providing 6 weeks of TV exposure for relatively unknown Canadian talent. Each week, Hunter hosts two special guest stars and a few others. Upcoming guests include: May 21, Dinah Christie, Jack Duffy, the Molly McGuires, John McNab, Myles and Lenny, Gabriel Bujreau, Steve Shuster, Peterson and Knelman, Roy Kenner and Delphia, Worrack and Sommers, Shawn Lawrence and Mandy Morrison.

June 4, Juliette and Al Waxman star with Donna and Andrew Best, Keath Barrie, Bonnie La Clair, Simone Dina, Barbie Camron, Maurice Marshall, Manley and Whittaker, Robbie and Cherrill Rae and Barry Van Ellen.

June 11 stars Billie Van and Catherine McKinnon with guests including Paul Christopher, Kerwin Massey, Carroll Baker, Wes Overholt, Par Three, and Crack Of Dawn.





Music You Can Ride On has been making gains in the U.S. at disco-level, and Morten said the band may be set for a tour which will co-bill them to the Andrea True Connection.

## Homemade Theatre target on disco craze

Producer Fred Mollin (Dan Hill, Tom Cochrane), brother Larry, Phil Savath and Barry Flatman (Vancouver-born) are A&M's Homemade Theatre, 1975 Juno nominees for the novelty single, Santa Jaws.

November 1975, the "anarchistic, satirical, improvising" troupe, (together for seven years), sessioned at Toronto's Manta Sound, with Fred Mollin and Manta's Andy Hermant producing.

A&M's Gerry Lacoursiere, who took the single on "spec", considered Santa Jaws to be timely to the Christmas season, and timely to the furor aroused over Steven Spielberg's Jaws. Toronto's Slic Brothers were immediately assigned to create the 45 jacket, deciding on a man-eating shark, bearded in Santa Claus whiskers. Release date was early December.

"Lacoursiere carried the single with him wherever he went," noted Larry Mollin, "and that belief from A&M, coupled to the programmers playing a novelty single, generating phone-in excitement for their stations, had a lot to do with the Santa Jaws success."

"The kids just loved it," explained Barry Flatman, indicating a market that buys singles product not only for sensual music rhythms, but for silliness and laughter-provoking images. A&M responded to Santa Jaws success (80,000 sold in Canada), by signing Homemade Theatre to a four-year contract (also planning to re-release Santa Jaws during Christmas of 1976).

Shortly after the Santa Jaws phenomenon, John Kennedy, executive producer for CBC's children's television programming "became a fan", said Phil Savath; Homemade Theatre were asked to pilot a series. Homemade Television ran from February 27-March 26, placing third in overall ratings for children's programming.

April 30, A&M rush-released the second Homemade Theatre novelty single, Disco-Tech, the story of detective Joe Saturday, who seeks to smash the scourge of disco-dance fever that threatens to spread across North American high schools and pollute the educational system.

Unlike Santa Jaws, Disco-Tech is "not

## Laurie Marshall bows his GRT disco single

How do you break a sexy, new disco record in stuffy Southern Ontario? One way to find out is to do it yourself; that's what Laurie Marshall is doing.

Marshall, who recently came here from Britain and is a landed immigrant, cut All Day All Night with producer Ralph Murphy and licenced the disc to GRT, who pressed it on their label. The moment it came off the press he was running it around to many of the hundreds of discos and disco record stores from Toronto to Detroit before the official May 7 release date.

Marshall, a music publisher and producer in Britain (a staff producer with Pie for a time), left the Isles because he was "depressed with British Radio." He wrote All Day and tracked it in New York.







### Spring BBM survey shows Toronto listener gains

The BBM springtime audience ratings for Toronto-area radio stations, released May 4, support the fall survey's findings, which indicated people in Toronto are listening to more hours of radio than was previously realized. Before the fall survey procedure became practice, surveys were compiled by asking select individuals to fill out questionnaires, lumping radio and television together. The two media are currently being surveyed separately.

BBM measures audiences by the number of people tuning into a station (at least once a week), and total number of hours that station listeners tune in (within a week).

MOR giant CFRB maintained their lead in both categories, with top-40 CHUM and CFTR, running close to each other for second and third place positions.

In total number of hours (listeners tuning in during one week period), CFRB registered 17,009,000 to CHUM's 7,463,000 CFTR, 7,087,000 and CKEY, 6,468,000.

Among adults (aged 18 and over), CKEY held their position of most listened to station, behind CFRB.

### World meet in Ottawa to discuss 80's radio

Hundred's of radio people from all over the world will be meeting in Ottawa's Chateau Laurier Hotel (June 6-11) for the Second International Symposium On Radio In The 80's. It is a follow-up to the initial symposium on the topic in Belgrade in 1974.


CBC, in association with the European Broadcasting Union, organized the meet, which will deal with the future of radio, especially public broadcasting.

The symposium opens Sunday June 6 with an address by Alfred Sauvy, French sociologist and demographer and "futurologist".

Working sessions throughout the following week will deal with issues of radio's place in the social and media environment of the 1980's, the effect of new technology, information and arts programming, and managing new creativity.

good English songs: "It's part of their everyday job."

It would be different, he said, if the contest were in Vancouver with a predominantly English-speaking jury.

BMI's Wes Wilson told RPM that most complaints he's received have been from songwriters without publishers. The contest rules state that every entry must be published by a BMI or CAPAC publisher. In general, though, Wilson hasn't received as many complaints as he expected.

BMI and CAPAC spokesmen say they mail announcements of contests to all affiliates as a matter of course, and allow the individuals to read the rules and decide whether to participate or not.

Answering complaints about the short time allowed for the contest, Venne simply says, "What can I do, postpone the Olympics?" He may yet decide to push back the contest deadline two weeks.

Response is "slow", Venne told RPM, but he expects a rush at the end. He submitted his Expo-winner on that contest's final day.

It is hard to say what kind of song will win, and become the first Olympic lyrical music ever to be selected by a contest. Official music was used in only three previous Olympics: Rome (1960) and Japan (1964) used instrumental music and the Munich games chose My Sweet Lord for the finale.


