

Nazareth tour a success for CPI, DKD, and A&M

Nazareth's recent Canada-wide tour was a collaboration between the Toronto-based Concert Productions International, headed by Mike Cohl, and Donald K. Donald, headed by Donald Tarlton and based in Montreal. They report the tour was seen by more than 100,000 fans, and that it grossed \$625,000. The four-member Scottish group came away with an estimated \$250,000. The tour hit 13 cities between Vancouver and Halifax, including Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg, Regina and Edmonton.

In Edmonton they were presented with gold records for their A&M LPs Rampart, Hair Of The Dog, and Close Enough For Rock 'N' Roll; and platinum for their greatest hits package. The awards represented Canadian sales of 600,000 LP units. They also received a gold award for the single Love Hurts, which sold 150,000 in Canada.

The group sells unusually well in Canada. Recently, they've also been recording here, at Le Studio in Morin Heights near Quebec. The LP Close Enough For Rock 'N' Roll was recorded there, as was their newest LP, not yet released and as yet untitled.

Moody replaces McGraw as VEEP of A&A stores

Dick Moody has been appointed Vice President and General Manager of A&A Records & Tapes. He replaces Rick McGraw who will be leaving the operation the end of October.

Also submitting his notice is buyer Brad Weir, considered one of the best in his field. He was brought into the A&A fold by Bruce Wilson who exited A&A to become involved in group management. Weir joins Capitol-EMI in Ontario sales.

Wireless debuts new Atlantic group

As part of their commitment to foreground programming, Toronto's CHUM-FM recently aired a special on new WEA artists, Wireless. The special was unusual in that it made an attempt to demonstrate some of the work that goes into recording a single - a typical example being the Wireless release, Spend The Night With Me. For the special, Mike McCoy and Wireless producer Jack Richardson sat in the Soundstage studio and took apart the single, played around with each track, then put it back together again, track by track.

A reception entitled Wireless On The Wireless was held at Soundstage the night the special was aired. The band was in attendance, as was Jack Richardson, Sound-

stage personnel, WEA promotion people, media reps, CHUM-FM staffers and industry guests. All were able to hear the special in an appropriate atmosphere.

A large cake was provided by Sammy-Jo for the occasion, and those in attendance received commemorative T-shirts with the Wireless design backed with the CHUM-FM logo. Guests were guided to the studio with the aid of a spotlight stationed outside, which has become the Wireless trademark.

The group has just completed a Maritime concert tour, where they shared the bill with Rush. They'll be playing Ontario and Quebec until the end of the year, when they'll kick off an extensive national tour. Their debut LP is on Atlantic.

Cummings heading for gold and major Canadian tour

Portrait's first signing, Burton Cummings is currently rehearsing in Winnipeg for a major Canadian tour to kick off in Winnipeg Nov. 8. Other dates will be confirmed at a later date.

Cummings' album, under title of his own name, enters the RPM 100 at No. 80 with a bullet this week. His single, Stand Tall enjoys a jump up the RPM 100 to No. 63 with a bullet (after only two weeks). Ontario Sales Manager for CBS, Ken McFarland, told RPM that the Cummings album is showing every indication of making gold before the middle of November.

The Cummings' album was RPM's Feature Album the issue of Oct 23/76 in which it was noted: "while his (Cummings) piano is now the dominant instrument instead of the guitar, he's rarely sounded so consistent

and in focus", and "The oddest and perhaps most surprising cut is a version of Randy Bachman's You Ain't Seen Nothin' Yet, done slowly with a light cocktail jazz flavour, supplemented with a horn section."

New 12-inch T.H.P. release features Wayne St. John

RCA Vice President and General Manager (Record Division) Ed Preston has announced the release of a 12-inch disco pressing of the T.H.P. Orchestra's Fighting On The Side Of Love, featuring vocals by Wayne St. John. The song was written by European composers Bugatti and Musker and produced by Willi Morrison and Ian Guenther for Three Hats Productions. The session was produced at RCA's Toronto studios.

The single will be released next week as a regular 45 disc.

The bookings have been arranged through Tom Dalby who recently added to his Copenhagen-based Tajmer Booking Agency with offices in Chicago. The latter is managed by Carol Comprda.

Teaming with the Stampeders will be The Walkers a well-known Copenhagen group currently on release with their Philips' single, *Cinderella*.

The tour will include major centres in Switzerland, Germany, Holland, Denmark, Sweden, Norway and Finland.

tributors in Toronto told RPM that a screening had been confirmed for Toronto and eight to ten American cities, all of which are among the first in North America to run the film. The screening in Toronto will take place Oct. 21, the day before the film's official opening. Dubin said that tickets, which went on sale a week before the screening, would all be sold at usual prices, which means that even industry guests invited to the screening by WEA will have to be accounted for.

Proceeds from the Toronto showing will go to the Canadian Save The Children Fund, while proceeds from the U.S. screenings will go to the Save The Children Federation. Dubin said that other charity screenings will likely be held, as more cities begin showing the film.

The film was three years in the making, and it centres around extensive footage from a performance by the group at Madison Square Garden in 1973.

WEA plans to release the soundtrack LP the day the film officially opens.

The CHUM chain is also planning a special in connection with the film Oct. 21, a one-hour documentary on the group featuring exclusive interview clips. The special was produced at CFRW Winnipeg by Rick Halson.

Lenny Solomon returns with new group

Lenny Solomon, one of Canada's foremost rock fiddlers and the Lenny of the late Juno winning Myles and Lenny, is ready to return to the concert and club scene. His entry back into the business will be with a new band set to open for a week at Toronto's Gasworks Oct. 25. They follow with a week at the Carrousel in Oshawa, week of Nov. 1 and return to Toronto for a week at the Midwich Cuckoo (25).

There are no plans for recording at present but the group is working primarily on originals with material from producers Maribeth Solomon and Mickey Erbe.

Renewych to mgr Chappell of Canada

Jerry Renewych has been appointed manager of Chappell of Canada with headquarters in Toronto. The announcement was made by Norman Weiser, president of Chappell Music.

As chief operating officer of Chappell-Canada, Renewych will be responsible for

the management committee which comprises Bill Trench, financial officer, and

John Loweth, director of print publications. Renewych will continue to handle creative projects.

Renewych has been a member of the Chappell staff for seven years beginning in the firm's early Montreal creative office, serving as professional manager. He is currently working with Chappell artists and groups including Brussel Sprout (MCA), Coyote, Copper Penny and Sylvia Tyson, all of Capitol and Quality's Bryan Way as well as many others.

Renewych has also been associated with several Canadian/American chart items including Susan Jaks' You're A Part Of Me (Mercury) penned by writer/artist Kim Carnes and Lovin' You Baby, which was written by Elton John and Bernie Taupin and recorded by Wednesday (Skyline). He has also been involved with Chappell's writer/producers Chuck Jackson and Marvin Yancy's hit, It's All Right, which was recorded by Crack Of Dawn (CBS); Suspicious Love by Copper Penny (Capitol) written by British recording artist/producer Biddu; and If You Want A Love Affair which was recorded by Mighty Pope (RCA) and written by H.B. Barnum.

Prior to joining Chappell, Renewych was a staff member of Peer Southern for three years. He graduated from Sir George Williams University in Montreal and also studied classical music at Montreal's McGill Conservatory.

DKD Canada tour for U.A.'s ELO

A cross-Canada tour is now being negotiated by the Montreal-based Donald K. Donald Enterprises for United Artists' top money makers, the Electric Light Orchestra.

WEA's in-house computer set for April 1

WEA Records of Canada is buying its own computer to bring in-house the marketing and manufacturing information processing previously jobbed out to computer services - and to fully computerize all WEA departments by the end of 1977.

WEA's president Ken Middleton told RPM that he has already hired data pro-

cessing manager Robert McCormack and Frank Gibbs to develop the program, and the hardware has been ordered from IBM. There will be a data department staff of five.

They plan to implement the first phase of their in-house computer system April 1, and Middleton expects that WEA customers will notice the difference immediately - with computerized invoices and faster filling of re-orders, as the computer program will handle WEA production control more efficiently than the current system.

"The main purpose of WEA's installation of the advance computer system," Middleton said, "is to vastly improve customer service. All incoming orders by phone will be fed through the computer system at the time the order-desk clerk is talking to the customer. It will give accurate access to stock provisions for immediate information of customer requests."

WEA has been using outside computer services for nine years and, Middleton explained, the volume of WEA product turnover has merited in-house operation for some years; but with a 30 per cent increase in sales this year and the new less expensive and more efficient computers on the market optimal conditions for the change exist at present.

Middleton expects the equipment and the program being created by his staff will be satisfactory for projected WEA operations for at least the next five years, and updated whenever feasible. and

MTL's Lavender Hill signed to United Artists

Robert Nickford, the man who brought the industry Mahogany Rush and his Kot'ai label, has discovered another Montreal group, Lavender Hill. Selling the group to a major label was comparatively easy with United Artists picking the group up almost immediately to release their initial album simultaneously in Canada and the U.S.

The session was produced at Andre Perry's Le Studio in Morin Heights, Quebec with Rob Stevens of Cashman West flying in from the U.S. west coast to produce. Eight of the nine cuts are originals from the group with one cut, Boogie Woogie Chibogamu (a northern Quebec town) with lyrics in French.

Stan Kulin, president of U.A. Canada, is pleased with the production and will be laying on a heavy promotion to bring the album home. A single, not yet determined at press time, will be released as well.

Dan Hill breaking nice and easy

In an RPM feature story printed just over a year ago, Dan Hill had just released *You Make Me Want To Be*, which he had written two years earlier, and was just finishing recording his first LP. The focus of the article then dealt with how long it had taken him to convince record company reps that *You Make Me Want To Be*, an acoustic ballad, would be a worthwhile single release. "Things have changed rather rapidly in the last 12 months," Hill told RPM. "I was comfortable playing coffeehouses, and suddenly I'm in the middle of making the transition to concert halls."

Hill has embarked on the largest tour of his career, which will take him through the U.S. opening for Gino Vannelli - at Vannelli's personal request, according to Hill's co-manager Bernie Fiedler.

"It's gonna be very interesting", Hill told RPM a few days before he left to start the tour. "I've never opened for anyone like Gino Vannelli before, and I'm sure there's gonna be all sorts of varied reaction, depending on what the audience wants from Vannelli."

For the first time, the tour was to include headlining gigs in Canada including Toronto's Massey Hall in December.

The tour kicked off recently, in Mississippi.


Fiedler and Finkelstein are confident of Hill's drawing power as a headliner. Fiedler cited an example of a recent solo concert at Kingston's Grant Hall. Last year, 450 tickets were sold for the event. This year, the 900-seat hall was sold out fast enough to warrant a second show, which also sold out. That's 1,800 seats, and Hill received standing ovations for both shows.

Bernie Fiedler told RPM that they're hoping the new LP will go gold by Christmas. The first LP sold approximately 35,000 units. The *Hold On* LP, however, had reached sales of 15,152 by the tenth day of its release. They are optimistic that the single may also go gold by Christmas. It has been picked up by the influential Moffatt chain in the west, and by CFTR in Toronto, and it is being playlisted at several large MOR stations, including CFRB, CHFI-FM, CKFM-FM in Toronto, CFPL London, CJAD Montreal, and CFQC Saskatoon.

Just recently Hill's LP and the single were both released on 20th Century in the U.S.

Hill and Mathew McCauley had produced the essence of Hill's first LP on their own and had taken it around to the record companies. *You Make Me Wanna Be* had a tentative release date, and when it proved itself, GRT picked up the option on the LP. Things began to roll further when Hill was picked up by the Finkelstein - Fiedler management team, after playing many times in their Riverboat coffeehouse in Toronto.

"More than anything else I'm concerned with developing myself as a songwriter,"

Hill said, "because I feel my main strength is as a writer. I think people come to see me for my music and my lyrics, so at this point that's what I'm working on more than anything else."

Hill admitted, though, that "performing is the final stage of songwriting. It's when you say to yourself: you think you've finished the song, now go out and see if people are interested in it or not. In a lot of ways that's the most exciting stage, and I

think without performing I could never be a complete writer. The two are different in many ways, though... There are a lot of performers who are great performers and mediocre songwriters, and vice versa. I think at this point my songwriting is a little ahead of my performing, but I've been writing for eight years and performing for maybe two. I feel very comfortable on the stage now and as I continue to perform I'll grow and develop in that direction."

Hill pulled off Vannelli U.S. dates


What had expected to be a lengthy and important tour of the U.S. for GRT's Dan Hill with A&M's Gino Vannelli has been scrapped. After a few dates in the Southern U.S. (Mississippi, Atlanta and Louisiana) Bernie Fiedler of Hill's Fiedler/Finkelstein management firm, pulled Hill from the tour. Fiedler cites the primary reason as "the crowd was too left field for Dan." Originally, Fiedler had been quite happy with the tour and its dates which would have run from Sept. 15 through Nov 19 after which the two factions would take stock of the value of the tour and to consider continuing until Dec 15 which would have also covered Canadian dates. Fiedler obviously

had second thoughts soon after the tour got underway.

Hill is considered top potential as a solo artist and will be headlining his dates at Ottawa's National Arts Centre (Dec 3) and the following evening at Massey Hall in Toronto as well as several other concerts.

Fiedler also reports that the recently released second Hill album, *Hold On*, has now sold in excess of 24,000 albums, cassettes and 8 tracks. His first album release for GRT is now nearing the 40,000 sales mark.

Hill's recorded product is released in the U.S. through 20th Century.



It features nine originals by various band members. Guitarist Buddy Caine seems to have a commercial touch in his songwriting, as his Take It Or Leave It is gaining airplay. FMers and heavy rock fans will no doubt be attracted to the songs of Earl Johnson, some of which are the strongest on the LP, like Through The Storm and One More Heartbreak. Vocalist Buzz Shearman shines on those two cuts in particular, although that voice can be heard over any din the band strives to create.

The production is mainly by Ed Leonetti, with Jack Douglas, an old pro at this type of thing, acting as executive producer for Waterfront Productions. It was recorded at Soundstage in Toronto and mixed well at the Record Plant in New York, so all the cuts still qualify as four parts Canon.



King, Stanley Turrentine, Esther Phillips and Ike and Tina Turner have all given shows in the popular Back Room (capacity five hundred people). More esoteric artists like Gary Burton and Charlie Mingus have displayed their wares in the Upstairs Jazz Room (capacity two hundred people).

Part of the success of Oil Can Harry's has been the organization of a Jazz Club by entertainment director Al Shimokura. The club presently boasts a membership of

over 1500. Members receive an admission discount on weekdays and are kept informed of coming events through direct-mail brochures. Shimokura notes that record label support has been fair, with Columbia and Fantasy coming in for the most praise.

The David Y.H. Lui Theatre opened earlier in the summer. A former record warehouse for Taylor, Pearson and Carson, the theatre has done well in establishing itself. Run by the impresario of the same name, the Lui Theatre has drawn impressive crowds with musicals like *Company*, *Cole Porter* and *Olympiad*. Lui has recently introduced Sunday evening music events. There was a presentation of the Newfoundland folk artists festival. Jane Mortifee did a fine evening's work there with the able assist of Brett and Joel Wade, Graham Coleman and local sessioners Lou Hoover and Wayne Kozak.

Lui wants more promoters to hustle some musical concerts. "The policy of the theatre is to house my productions and there is a minimum of half a year devoted to them. The rest of the time is available for rentals. Music brings in a totally different audience. Hopefully they'll discover up and coming talent like Joani Taylor".

The classiest place in town is the Old Roller Rink. Located in North Vancouver, the Roller Rink opened in July. Owners Jeff Ehrlich and Drew Delanty came across the Roller Rink five years ago, when a cabinet shop was on the premises. In the ensuing years, they raised capital and brought in a partner, John MacLaren.

The Roller Rink is unique. It is a wooden masterpiece, the sort of palace one would expect to find in an old west saloon. As a "nightspot of wood" it contrasts splendidly with the current glut of metallic competitors. Room acoustics are good and a sound engineer called David Faison has been hired to make them stay that way.


Jeff Ehrlich has one big goal for the Old Roller Rink. He wants it to become a worthwhile place for record companies to send their up and coming artists to.

"A nightclub like this builds headline

acts. Artists can't go from woodshedding to the concert hall. We give people a chance who are going somewhere. It's not a criteria that an artist have a recording contract to play here. What's important is their quality, sincerity and professionalism."

The Old Roller Rink has helped eastern Canadian artists like Dan Hill, Shirley Eikhard and Ken Tobias to gain a local toehold. It's been no bed of roses and Ehrlich, along with his publicity and booking assistant Margaret McGraw, has had to fight for record label support. Many companies were wary at first. Now some (like GRT and Attic) are recognizing the value of the place.

In all, the Old Roller Rink is doing fairly well. The support from customers is good.

CKLG-FM, under the stewardship of new program director Roy Hennessy, is helping out by airing shows taped at the club. Some of the bigger artists like Roger McGuinn and Long John Baldry have decided that at 300 people a show, it's worth their while to play the Roller Rink. And of course, Vancouver listeners are the real winners. Things could be worse.

RCA's Porgy & Bess team Laine & Charles

In the next few weeks, RCA is planning to release the two-record set of *Porgy and Bess*, featuring the teaming of Ray Charles and Cleo Laine in the title roles. The recording was produced by jazz impresario Norman Granz, who is known for a long career in jazz, including the founding of the Pablo label, which handles artists such as Joe Pass (who's guitar work is featured on the LP) and Oscar Peterson.

The folk opera was originally composed in 1935 after 20 months of work by George Gershwin. It was a musical adaptation of a play called *Porgy* which opened in 1927, and which was based on a novel by DuBose

Heyward. Heyward collaborated on the lyrics of the musical with Ira Gershwin.

The new version is arranged and conducted by Frank De Vol, who's had a long career scoring movies (*Guess Who's Coming To Dinner*, *Dirty Dozen*); composing TV themes (*My Three Sons*, *Family Affair*); and as arranger and conductor for various singers (Tony Bennett, Ella Fitzgerald).

On paper, at least, it's a platinum combination of talents.

RCA hasn't yet planned their promotion and marketing campaigns, but Johnny Murphy told RPM that special attention would be directed to the LP.

Cloud Burst's Haig bows tavern circuit

Heather Haig, Cloud Burst recording artist, is now ready to tackle the tavern circuit. She turned 18, Sept. 18 and manager/producer George Petralia has lined up a few dates including Toronto's El Condor for Nov. 4 through 6. She will be appearing with The Country Edition, nominees in the recent RPM Big Country Awards in the category of Best Country Group.

Haig's initial single for the label, Make Way For The Children created a national niche for the young singer. Her follow-up release, Out Of Order, was written by Don Grashey and produced at Grashey's DMG Sound Studios in Thunder Bay. The flip, It's Late, penned by Carroll Baker, was produced at Toronto's Sound Canada.

Rebel reopens in Canada: seeks acts for distribution

Rebel Records has reopened in Canada. Formerly dealing with artists including Grant Smith, Mainline, Jackie Shane, Tom Connors and others in the 60s, Rebel now will work mainly with bluegrass and country. The Rebel U.S. and King Bluegrass labels will be manufactured and distributed here by Rebel Canada. Acts signed to Rebel include Seldom Scene and Country Gentleman, and on King Bluegrass are Larry Sparks and J.D. Crowe.

In making the above announcement Rebel president John Irvine also indicated his interest in contacting groups that have recorded on their own labels and are seeking Canadian distribution. The Rebel Canada offices are located in Willowdale, Ontario.

One example, or result of the trend in country-pop crossover success is The Good Brothers. They started in Toronto many years ago as a folk group, turned to electrified bluegrass, met up with James Ackroyd,

Gordon Lightfoot, and Jerry Garcia along the way. But only now are they really making a dent with audiences in general, with an RCA LP, two singles (That's The Kind Of Man I Am and Midnight Flight), and a growing following who find magic in their live presentation.

They played the Troubadour in Los Angeles, (Oct. 12-16) a most prestigious venue, where they shared the bill with John Hammond and Tracy Nelson. The Dixon-Propas management team out of Toronto arranged extensive promotion for the date, which included made-in-Czechoslovakia official NHL Hockey pucks emblazoned with, "From the land which brought you hockey, the Mounties, and beavers . . . we proudly present the Good Brothers at the Troubadour, October 12-16/76." These were sent to key Hollywood industry reps.

The Goods also played Grossingers, the second largest Catskills resort, October 26, during the National Entertainment Conference in the U.S.

Crowds have been known to become frenzied during their unique version (featuring fiddler John Allen) of the perennial Orange Blossom Special, such as at the Sunny Days Music Festival near Peterborough this summer. They've also played to ovations of thousands at the Carlisle Bluegrass Festival and appeared at dozens of Ontario folk, country and bluegrass festivals. This year they won RPM's Big Country award for Best Performance by a Country Group.

Much of their material is original or written with them in mind, but they also do crowd pleasing versions of Fox On The Run, The Pea Soup Reel, an occasional spoof of

Dueling Banjos, the aforementioned Orange Blossom Special, and others. Critics and fans agree that the band is winning fans because it combines the most enjoyable aspects of pop, country and bluegrass.

Twins Brian and Bruce play guitar and autoharp respectively, and are joined by younger brother Larry on banjo, Mike McMaster on bass and Karl Kees on fiddle. Recently they filled out their sound with a permanent drummer, Bohden Husko.

The Goods' music has been called newgrass, goodgrass and even glittergrass. Per-

haps the latter description isn't quite accurate, but there's a desire to call the Goods' music unique. Their audiences are mainly in their twenties, the same kind of crowd that's found escape from the excesses of rock in bands such as Asleep At The Wheel, and the Charlie Daniels Band. No other group, however, has used bluegrass, modified as it is, so extensively so successfully. Many have doubted the recorded commercial appeal of such a sound, but sales and airplay of the two singles and the LP are making those doubts disappear.

The album has been released in Australia, Britain, Italy, Germany, Denmark, Holland, and Sweden as well as in Canada. U.S. release arrangement hasn't been made yet.





The Programmers

How do you promote records to the CBC?

CBC radio's move to attract bigger and younger audiences is directly reflected in the network's music policy.

Some have asked: "Does that open new avenues for Canadian music industry record promotion?"

CBC radio variety chief Ron Solloway told RPM that the programming policy shift in favour of pop and non-highbrow music - exemplified by scheduling changes this fall which present the weeknight strip of more-popular music shows in the better prime-time evening hours, and the addition of a weekly top-40 radio show - will continue into the 1977-78 season.

In an interview following a two-day Toronto conference of the network's variety producers from across Canada, Solloway said that the department's producers are generally happy with the changes and expect to learn a lot from the fate of CBC's new programming steps.

Solloway expects to double the audiences for CBC radio shows like *Touch The Earth*, *The Great Canadian Gold Rush*, and *Country Road* in their new 8:30-10:00 p.m. slots. Last year in the 10:30-midnight slots these shows averaged under 100,000 listeners.

CBC English-language radio reaches a potential audience of 99 per cent of the English-speaking Canadians. But the actual CBC audience is not typical of the Canadian population.

In recent years CBC AM listeners have been older than the population at large - 33 per cent of Canadians are over 50; 44 per cent of the CBC listeners are. Twenty-three per cent of adult Canadians have managerial or professional jobs; 40 per cent of the CBC listeners do. Twenty per cent of the population have attended university; twice that proportion of CBC listeners have.

Almost one out of every 10 Canadians listens to a CBC owned-and-operated radio station in the course of a week.

But certain trends will alter those figures.

The network is opening more owned-and-operated stations in areas previously served only by CBC affiliates - which don't have to air most network shows.

The FM network, opened last winter, is being reserved for more-esoteric and special-audience programming, freeing more time on the AM network for more-popular programming.

How important is CBC radio to the record companies?

Most Toronto-based CBC programme producers polled by RPM report they rarely hear from most labels' promotion departments.

Attie's Tom Williams, who was singled out as a promo man who used to visit CBC producers regularly, told RPM: "I don't physically go in there as much as I used to - the problem with the CBC is that there are so many people to keep in contact with; but they're all on our mailing list."

There is a record library in every major CBC production centre.

John Lawrence, chief music librarian at CBC's Toronto record library, told RPM that his library adds about 100 records a week to its collection - almost all ordered by them. About 400-500 records a week are taken out of his library by CBC producers to be aired on CBC shows or used in radio and TV theme and soundtrack productions.

Lawrence explained that most of the producers and announcers get some promo records sent directly to them. He feels the library is too often neglected.

Only two Toronto promo men visit Lawrence regularly - WEA's Jim Campbell and Capitol's Scoot Irwin.

Irwin thinks the CBC stations across Canada should be regarded by record companies, individually, as at least as important as the strong secondary-market, block-programming stations: "If I service them and nobody else does, they're going to play my product."

The CBC network shows, he added, featuring jazz, rock and folk programming are an important radio outlet: "They use every kind of music in our catalogue."

Capitol promo chief Bill Bannon explained: "We handle CBC quite extensively - it's simply another good outlet for music in this country. To ignore them is a mistake."

His experience is that CBC exposure doesn't effect top-40 radio or trade charts very much, and that "from a rock point of view" the network doesn't do that much. But in some areas of Canada they are the only outlet for new material."

He's had quite a bit of success with the French-language CBC net. He cited a programme done in Montreal with co-operation from Capitol featuring Capitol's Beau Dommage: "We had to deal with just one station; they produced the show and serviced eight other French-language stations

with it."

Bannon added that perhaps the older record companies have more respect for the CBC: "Going back many years, we are used to handling anything that has a CRTC licence."

RCA Ontario promo man Johnny Murphy says they used to visit CBC producers more often and mail much more product to people at the network - something he feels they should be doing a lot more of now.

"Talk about alternatives," Murphy told RPM, "CBC is the best."

RCA's Jack Feeney pointed out that the CBC is especially important for exposing jazz and classical recordings. Feeney, who is responsible for jazz, classical and Canadian product at RCA; says they don't specially promote those records to the CBC producers because they keep very current with their own orders.

Feeney pointed to the Sunday morning Gilmour's Albums - the most popular CBC non-news show, hosted by The Toronto Star's Clyde Gilmour: "That show definitely sells albums."

Outside of some private stations' local shows, Toronto's CJRT and some campus outlets, Feeney added, it is the only exposure for most of the more esoteric styles of music:

"Classical and jazz sells through radio

Transmission changes for 3 radio stations

The CRTC has approved changes in broadcast specifications for three radio stations: CKSO, Sudbury; CINQ-FM, Montreal; and CING-FM, Burlington.

CKSO's current 10,000-watt (day) and 5,000-watt (night) power will be increased to 50,000 watts day and night, and their antenna site moved.


CINQ-FM will switch frequency from 99.3 MHz to 102.3 MHz and increase its broadcast power from 7.2 watts to 36 watts.

CING-FM will be permitted to increase "significantly" the height of their broadcast antenna; but the commission warned that this should not change the station's local orientation to its programming. The improvement was granted on the condition that CING-FM does not solicit advertising in the neighbouring cities of Hamilton and Oakville.

CBC Sunday Morning to open with Murray

CBC's Sunday Morning, the new AM radio network magazine show, will feature the singing of Anne Murray on its opening show November 7. Sunday Morning music director Sharon Keogh told RPM that the performance will be taped in the CBC studios.

Sunday Morning runs on Sundays, 9:00 a.m. to 12 noon and will air current affairs documentary, and entertainment features. There is no fixed budget for music performances, Keogh told RPM, but folk, rock, jazz, and classical music will be an integral part of the show.

because people don't hear particular cuts too often otherwise."

SRO's Tom Berry, who deals with all-Canadian and mostly-rock music finds the few CBC national rock shows very important.

"Major progression (a Winnipeg-produced rock show) was instrumental in breaking Max Webster nationally," Berry told RPM: "You can't really hype the CBC producers; but they get behind what they believe in."

"It doesn't directly help me sell many records," Berry added, "because rack jobbers and dealers don't pay attention to what's being played on CBC. But, for many small markets these CBC rock shows are the only rock outlet radio listeners have."

Berry explained that he gets feedback through SRO bands who travel to the smaller centres and find that people are aware of them through CBC exposure alone.

"CBC's big problem is that they haven't done a major promotion campaign for their shows in the major markets - they're not communicating with the rest of the industry, let alone the general public."
