PRO Canada award to Montreal lawyer

Toronto: The Performing Rights Organization of Canada (PRO Canada) reports that 23-year-old Montreal native Sylvi Plante has been awarded the 1983 PRO Canada Copyright Award of \$2,500 for a paper dealing with mechanical licensing in Canada.

The company introduced the competition four years ago to encourage a greater understanding of copyright by those entering the legal profession. The deadline for the next competition is May 31, 1984.

Written in French and titled Discussion sur la licence obligatoire de reproduction mécanique, the paper analyzes the weakness of the present system of compulsory licences for mechanical reproduction in Canada, while suggesting changes to improve it. Her paper will be published in French, available from PRO Canada.

Plante, who is a law graduate of Laval University where she studied copyright with Victor Nabhan, is presently with the Montreal legal aid office of Lord, Lefebvre & Goulet. She hopes to continue in the field of intellectual property at the international level.

Toronto: Winnipeg-based Troubadour recording artist Fred Penner is currently on tour in support of his third and latest children's album, Special Delivery.

Produced by Ken Whiteley with song arrangements by Whiteley and Penner, the album jacket features the design by Scott Thornley based on the "special delivery" concept. The jacket has been designed as a large envelope, allowing space for an autograph by the artist or the name of a child recipient.

Material on the LP from the two-time Juno nominee include Polly Wolly Doodle, There Are No Strings, The Marvellous Toy, Mail Myself To You, and Holiday.

The album also features such noted Canadian musicians as Ben Mink (fiddle, mandolin), Jody Golic (saxophones), Scott Irvine (tuba), and Bucky Berger. In addition, the Firgrove Public Schools singers contributed to the LP under the direction of Cathy Ambrose.



The Junos were open to the public two years ago at the O'Keefe Centre and it wasn't a full house. Apparently a great many of these decisions will be made in the next few days and anything you've heard is premature.

When the going gets tough . . . !

Speaking to an American record man recently, he told me that "everything helps" to make a hit! I thought what a great business philosophy. It doesn't exist in Canada. We do like to pick sides and fight battles that have very little to do with doing our jobs. It's amazing how this industry likes to kick doors closed and how we really dwell on personal likes and dislikes. It really boils down to the bottom line.

Wasteland is wasting away!!

Say what you want, and I've said it many times before, CITY-TV makes all the other networks and stations look pretty bad when it comes to covering the showbusiness and rock scene. Jeannie Beker and J.D. Roberts seem to be everywhere with their television cameras and they do very thorough reporting on stage, screen and music entertainment. The Toronto showbusiness community should take off their hats to CITY-TV. They do a lot more than report "a local rock band played . . ." they cover the events and it makes for good television.

Pump Boys And Dinettes - a traveller's delight

Toronto: The Pat Rose directed Pump Boys And Dinettes supplies an entertaining musical look at a typical day in the lives of the Southern highway convenience people - a diner and a filling station. The mood is service with a smile, or at least an acceptable excuse. The dialogue is what you might expect from a group of laid-back Southerners, a major plus for Toronto's acting community as portrayed by six Northerners. The Dinettes, Pamela Shilton and Dawn Atiken and the Pump Boys, Tom Gallant, rhythm guitar; Ed Henderson, lead guitar; The Great Speckled Bird's bassman Randy Kempf; and Mark Kersey, piano and accordion, ease into their roles with a confidence that belies their newness to the acting profession.

The entertainment factor, of course, is the "country hick" approach that reveals a sincerity and humbleness that immediately energizes an audience - and that's what this group of fine actors/musicians/vocalists accomplish. It's a fun show with each player doing their own "thang", and it really doesn't matter if the storyline is lost. There's an intimacy and a sharing of secrets that keeps the concert cum musical alive and vibrant through it entirety - never a dull mo-

Get with the '80s???

It's a silly expression and sort of insulting to the Canadian industry to imply that we aren't with the '80s, but what can you say about a country where we spend so much money "tracking the top ten"? Well you can say "Get with the '80s" When we should be interested and absolutely possessed by breakouts, we seem to track the top ten. It's like guiding the guided lily. When something is established and going at full rate, why do we want it to go even faster? Really, how much faster can it go? Is it an industry with people so insecure that we take what is already happening and say, "look how well it's happening". I think it would be much better if we concentrated on breaking records. as one record industry heavy told me, "It's hard to break a record in Canada." Right! So we track the top ten and even the top twenty. That's what you do when you can't break a new record. Okay! Let's get with the '80s.

It's 983 issues later!!

Do you believe that we have put out 983 issues of RPM in the last 19 plus years and in 17 weeks (or 17 issues) we will hit 20 years of RPM and approximately 1000 separate issue. Feb. 24th 1984 is the big day. We hope to make this a memorable occasion.

A standout is Mark Kersey and his version of The Night Dolly Parton Was Almost Mine and Farmer Tan, both of which emphasized the odd-ball entertainment qualities of the "look the right part" Kersey, an obvious crowd pleaser.

Tom Gallant, who is a veteran of country music, is a powerful storyteller with a vocal projection that demands attention. Pam and Dawn aren't too short in attracting attention either. Categorizing or pigeon-holing this production would be a disservice, it's simply a highly entertaining musical experience in a unique setting of a dinner theatre, the latter adding to the entertainment value. The dinner menu is also an experience: salad, beef vegetable soup, five alarm chili (and they mean it); Rhetta's (one of the Dinettes) Southern fried chicken 'n chips, Prudie's (the other Dinette) pecan pie, and coffee and tea.

CBS has generously donated 1,000 original Broadway cast albums and tapes of Pump Boys, available at the Variety Theatre and at CKFM, for \$10. the proceeds from which will be turned over to CKFM's Toronto Children's Hospital fund - a fund the station has been supporting for many years.

Jackson's Thriller spawns a 6th single

Toronto: Michael Jackson's Thriller album has had so much singles action it can be classified as a "greatest hits" album.

"It could certainly be called that," said CBS Records Canada President Bernie DiMatteo. "It's the best-selling album I've ever seen since I've been here. I don't think I've ever seen an album of this calibre which has had this many singles so well received."

Thriller is now well over the 800,000 mark in Canada, eight times platinum, enjoying RPM Top 100 Album Chart for over 40 weeks and still selling like an album from a mega-star that has just hit the streets. The LP has become the biggest-selling album in the history of CBS.

Compared to the company's other smash

album Business As Usual from Men At Work, Jackson's LP has surpassed the sales of Business in about half the time, which translates into a staggering progression.

CBS has just released Pretty Young Thing, the sixth single from the LP, Thriller already has the dubious title of being one of the first of a regular LP to have enjoyed five top 10 singles, which could become six if the immediate programmer acceptance of the new single is any indication.

While sales of Thriller are now in the region of 15 million worldwide, in the U.S. the superstar was recently presented with more than 40 record awards from 20 countries representing platinum gold and silver awards. The sales of the singles worldwide

are now well over 11 million units.

Thriller is expected to reach the million units sold mark by the end of the year, a rare accomplishment in Canada.

In summing up the Jackson sales phenomenon DiMatteo noted "In my personal opinion, I think a lot has to do with the fact that Michael's a tremendously visual artist and much has to do with the videos. Michael's are the best around and he's an incredibly dynamic artist. Of course, the music is fantastic and kids still like to dance although they don't consider it disco anymore.

"Michael hadn't received this type of radio play before. This album was pretty much across the board. But I think he was also the beneficiary of a loosening of airplay, especially with the single Billie Jean. The first single was well received but not as much as the record."

With the Jacksons' album soon to be released, the group is expected to tour with Michael beginning in January with the possibility of Canadian dates by March.

In addition to the new single Pretty Young Thing, a video is also being produced of the title track Thriller which will include a guest appearance by actor Vincent Price.

Panelists and speakers include CTV's Lloyd Robertson, Superchannel President Steve Harris, CHUM's Dick Smyth, CKFM's Jamie Crookston, CKEY's John Youannou, CFNY-FM's Peter Goodwin, David Shatsky of CBC News. PolyGram's Bobby Gale, the Toronto Star's Carole Gault and RPM's Walt Grealis.

Lionel Richie - a nine year overnight success

The climb to overnight success has been a long time in coming for Lionel Richie. It all began in 1974 when, as a member of the Commodores, they released their first album, Machine Gun, the title cut of which went on to attain U.S. gold. Actually Richie's love affair, or involvement with music began back in his college days in Tuskagee, Alabama. Much

of his musical influence however, came from his grandmother who was a piano instructor of the classics. Says Richie, "With the piano teachings of my Grandma, the Southern country music that was prominent on radio and the music of the Temptations and The Supremes, popular on campus, it all just came together for me and it taught me a beautiful lesson in songwriting."

His music foundation worked well, however slowly, for Richie as he and the Commodores crossed the country from ocean to ocean and with the belief of the Motown label behind them, released one or two albums a year. The first release that scored a platinum for them was their self-titled album released in 1977 and which set the pattern for more metal releases including their Commodores Live set that same year, their Greatest Hits and Natural High in 1978 both achieving gold status, their Midnight Magic of 1979 that went platinum as did In The

Pocket released in 1981.

Although he was becoming popular within the industry as a writer, it wasn't until the single release of Three Times A Lady, when Richie began to witness his real power as a writer and vocalist. It was at Canada Jam at Mosport (just east of Toronto) in 1978 when he first moved into the solo spotlight. The Commodores were billed with several heavy metal and rock groups yet stole the show when they performed Three Times A Lady and Richie emerged as a rising solo star. He then teamed with Diana Ross for the soundtrack of Endless Love the longest running No. 1 single on U.S. charts and enjoyed five weeks at the top of the RPM singles chart, a record that has yet to be matched.

Richie remained with the Commodores until last year when he launched his solo career with Truly, taken from his self-titled album. He describes his debut album as "a survey of all the kinds of music I'd made up until then."

The Richie roll continues with the release of his latest album Lionel Richie Can't Slow Down, the title of which is a fairly accurate description of what he and James Anthony Carmichael co-produced. There's a Canadian angle with this album with Richie teaming with Victoria, B.C. native David Foster to co-write and co-produce The Only One track, which unfortunately does not qualify as Canadian but is one of the better tracks on the album.

Richie has also entered the world of video

which is now available on his All Night Long single. The video was directed by Bob Rafelson, his first music video venture, a project that was commissioned to him by the video's producer Michael Nesmith. The video has already scored well in the U.S. where Richie's brand of soft rock and soul has been established as his recognized musical signature.

Larry Macrae, National Promotion Director for Quality Records, distributors of Motown product in Canada, reports that Richie's solo debut album is approaching triple platinum in Canada. "We're now at about 290,000 pieces," says Macrae. "When Lionel was here recently (Montreal and Toronto) we gave him double platinum for the album which includes his singles Truly and You Are."

Can't Slow Down looks like a winner from its release date. "The album shipped platinum (100,000 pieces) on release," said Macrae, "and his single, All Night Long is the fastest rising record we've had since the Stars On days. It's moved quickly up the RPM chart and it's expected to be the No. 1 record in the U.S. and the U.K. within a couple of weeks, which is quite an amazing feat for Lionel, separate from The Commodores."

Richie is quite the showman, on and off the stage and always has time for interviews, no matter how rushed he is. He was mixing his new album in Los Angeles and went right down to the wire, just making it in time for his Montreal date. The media were apparently impressed with him. In spite of lost time, he arranged for television and press interviews in his dressing room, making it necessary to hire a private jet to get him to Toronto on time for his concert, where again he fulfilled interview commitments even though there was a time problem. "He's more than a gentleman, when it comes to cooperating with all the media," notes Macrae.

PolyGram releases new single from Prototype

Montreal: Behind Your Eyes is the latest single from the Calgary-based band Prototype and comes from their self-titled debut album produced by group member Dan Lowe.

A follow-up to their first hit single Video Kids, Behind Your Eyes is a re-mixed version of the LP track and has been released in a limited edition picture sleeve featuring the album cover graphics.

With sales of the Prototype LP already over the 30,000 mark boosted by Video Kids, PolyGram expects the new single to propel the album to gold.

Released on the Mercury label, distributed by PolyGram, the new single was written by guitarists Lowe and Brad Steckel. Both members are guitarist. The flip, Money Talks, was also written by the duo.

Lowe is currently working on new material, about 30 new songs in all, of which ten are expected to be included on the band's second album to be recorded at Calgary's Thunder Road Studios in February.

KIM MITCHELL

Hanbridge Hall - Regina - Oct 12/83

Kim Mitchell is one man who is never at a loss for words. His fans obviously enjoy his rather straight ahead bizarre humour as witnessed by the 400 or so that turned out for his Z99 Rocktober Festival. Mitchell had the crowd in the palm of his hand right from the start of his two set show. Not one to play in front of a dancing crowd, he expertly manoeuvred the seating arrangements by having the crowd rearrange the seating. Mitchell then took full advantage of the intimate tightly packed hall. His rapport of one liners like "Dry as an Arab fart", kept the crowd amused and cheering the whole night. Mitchell mixed the old and the new; the first set made up of mostly new material from his latest self-titled mini LP. He kept the crowd around for the second set by holding off on his classic Max Webster material.

One of Kim Mitchell's big drawing cards is that he plays on the bizarre and outrageous. Not only is his appearance different, with his long straight locks, rather loud clothes against his long thin body, but his lyrics and song titles are, to say the least, different. "Decisions to make about lager and beer", "You can't do to a woman what you can do to a man", "Only your nose knows" and "High class in borrowed shoes". But what's in a song title? It's the feeling in the song that counts, and Kim Mitchell certainly delivers lots of emotion with his music.

There's not a lot of originality in the music business today, but Kim Mitchell may be offering rock fans an alternative.

JEAN LUC PONTY

Massey Hall - Toronto - Oct 4/83

It is rare when an artist can inspire true and sincere warmth, as a result of his integrity and a subtle but compelling display of his talent. Jean-Luc Ponty has never been one for hyperbole; just a dedication to produce innovative and ultimately relevant music which draws on numerous influences.

Tuesday night was no exception. Several of the newer songs were artfully melded with audience favourites from previous records. The band, particularly drummer Rayford Griffin, was very fluid, never losing touch with Ponty or the direction in which he cared to take the music. Keyboard player Walter Afanasieff, apparently influenced greatly by Ponty's work a number of years ago, is a good foil to the leader's violin work, and frequent keyboard interludes. Scott Henderson (guitar) and Baron Browne (bass) fill out the current lineup, as well providing a discreet foundation on which Ponty can build a melodic idea. Using one of several instruments, he shows a genuine ability to embellish the outline of the song, without resorting to the histrionics so favoured by numerous less talented fusion musicians. All in all, a talented man for whom the future is as broad and promising as his personal vision.
