Cassette market share surpasses albums

Toronto: Last year for the first time in history, more pre-recorded cassettes than record albums were shipped to stores in the U.S. according to estimates from CBS Inc. Record company officials and store managers point to the pervasive use of portable tape players, and the improvement in audio quality as reasons for the figures.

In Canada, Don Oates, CBS Vice President of Sales and Marketing, commented on the situation here. "Our gross shipments would indicate virtual parity between LPs and cassettes at this point. In category country, specifically, initial shipments out the door would be higher in cassette than LP. With a new act, a Nena or Cyndi Lauper for example, LPs would initially be higher with the cassettes 'catching up' once the LP has found its share at retail level." For the

first three months of 1984, Oates estimates the average to be as close as 52/48 in favour of LPs.

Garry Newman, Vice President Sales at WEA Music Canada, indicates a trend which would see tapes surpass LPs, possibly in the course of this year.

"Toward the end of 1983, cassette sales started catching up quickly; the trend continues in 1984, with some acts running one for one. I have the feeling that we could see a 55/45 ratio sometime in the course of '84, perhaps with a ZZ Top or Van Halen."

CBS Direct readies major Chicago package campaign

Toronto: The Direct Marketing division of CBS Records Canada is currently preparing a major campaign in support of a two-record Chicago greatest hits set titled, Chicago - The Ultimate Collection.

The deluxe package, featuring a book design cover, contains an entire decade of the band's top-charted hit singles including Colour My World, Questions 67 & 68, Old Days, If You Leave Me Now, Make Me Smile and Wishing You Were Here - 20 tracks in all.

The package will be test-marketed in Calgary and will also cover the Red Deer, Medicine Hat and Lethbridge markets from April 16 through May 20. If successful the campaign will expand to the rest of the west and hopefully into the East by fall.

Charges are laid over pirated Iglesias product

Toronto: Police have laid charges against a Weston, Ontario man as a result of a year-long investigation into the illegal manufacturing of product bearing the CBS trademark. Recording equipment and product, valued at an estimated \$350,000 were seized in the course of the investigation.

Commenting on the action, CBS Director of Administration Services Ray Pollard pointed out that the case is singular in that prosecution concerns trademark, with CBS being a registered trademark.

Charged with fraud and forging the CBS trademark is Antonio Crispino.

Spitfire Band & WNEW satellite date to Canada

Toronto: Basking in the obvious success, both as a performance band and as a recording act, The Spitfire Band is scheduled to perform at the Metropolitan in New York City (March 30). The performance will be broadcast live by WNEW and picked up by satellite by CFRB in Toronto and goes to air at 10:10 p.m. Morning man Wally Crouter will host the historical event.

The band was asked by the provincial government to do the show in connection with Ontario's Bi-Centennial celebrations. Leader Jackie Rae indicates the band is popular in New York where their albums received heavy exposure by WNEW, so the date is certain to further Spitfire Band's already extensive reputation.

John Nathan to represent St. Tropez Video Festival

Paris: John Nathan has been appointed North American representative for the 1st International Music Video Festival, to be held in St. Tropez from October 8 through 11. Mr. Nathan is President of Overseas Music and Video Services, a New York-based company representing foreign companies in the record, music publishing and home video field.

Mr. Nathan is well-known in international music circles having been instrumental for the on-going U.S. and Canadian support of MIDEM, an organization he represented for 12 years. He was also responsible for much of the North American interest in MIP-TV and VIDCOM.

The announcement of Mr. Nathan's appointment was made by Rupert Schmid, President of RS Communications, the Paris-based organizer of the St. Tropez Festival.

Mortifee and Spitfire Band firmed for Imperial Room

Toronto: Two impressive Cancon acts have been firmed for the spring lineup of the Royal York's Imperial Room, continuing a policy of presenting nationally-acclaimed domestic names.

Ann Mortifee, who recently signed to WEA Music Canada, returns to the big room from May 21 through the 26th. This West Coast music surrealist, drew rave reviews on her last date here and has since released a new album, Born To Live. Are You Lonely, the second single from the album, is currently on release.

The Spitfire Band, featuring Jackie Rae, Micky Erbe, Laurie Bower and 19 of Toronto's top professional musicians will follow from May 28 through June 2. This marks the third appearance for the popular group who have released three albums through the Canadian Talent Library. Their latest, Flight III is available on the Columbia label.

More CRTC stories!!!

Family Brown scores first at RCA - Cathy Hahn

There's a lot of excitement about Eurythmics . . . RCA will present them with platinum for Touch, even before the release of the second single. This will take place at Toronto's Massey Hall, as part of their Canadian debut on April 2.

Parachute Club's Rise Up was voted the

No. 1 Canadian single in the Annual Radio Programmers' Music Poll (RPM) . . . meanwhile their follow-up, Boy's Club, is being charted nationally, and a new video of the single has just been completed by Bob Fresco, who also produced the Rise Up video.

Alabama was voted Favourite Group at the American Music Awards where their The Closer You Get was also chosen Favourite Album, and Dixieland Delight was honoured as Favourite Video. Here at home, Midnite Rodeo Band (MRB) has been recognized as Top Country Act for the third consecutive year at the CARAS West Coast Music Awards in Vancouver. Family Brown have just completed their video of Repeat After Me, put together by Bob Fresco. Perhaps this is a first for Canadian country music. It's certainly a first for many members of the RCA team, moonlighting as extras!

Attic acts on tour trail to support new releases

Toronto: Several Attic acts have set out on major tours of Canada to promote their latest releases, a policy that will follow through into the sun months.

Killer Dwarfs have played several Ontario dates and move west to Winnipeg (March 26-31), Calgary (April 2-4), Edmonton (5-7), New Westminster (9-11), Vancouver (12-14), Victoria (16-18) and back to Winnipeg for the end of April.

Perfect Affair have also played Ontario dates through March along with several dates on the prairies. They are currently in Lethbridge where they will wind up the month. April dates see them in Regina (2-7), Vancouver (9-14), Winnipeg (16-19), London (23-25) and back to Toronto (26).

Still waiting for their album release, the comedy duo, MacLean & MacLean have softened up the Ontario, Quebec and Maritime markets with several successful dates during March.

Kamahl, who has had much success with his album, *This Love We Share*, is currently at Vancouver's Plaza International.

A Western tour for Lee Aaron is now being pencilled in, designed to give a major boost to her *Metal Queen* album and *Shake It Up*, the first single taken from the album.

A cappella quartet, The Nylons, who entered the RPM Contemporary Adult chart this week with their *Stepping Stone* single, will be heading west during the summer months.

Says Ralph Alfonso, Attic's Manager of National Promo & Press, "This will be the first time that Attic will have six of our acts out West, all at the same time."

Judas Priest sets Canadian dates in support of album

Toronto: Judas Priest is preparing a Canadian tour in support of their new Columbia album, *Defenders Of The Faith*, already past the gold mark in Canada after only a month on release.

Some Heads Are Gonna Roll was taken as a single from the Tom Allom produced album. The previous album release from this British heavy metal unit, *Screaming For Vengeance*, recently surpassed the platinum mark here.

Band members K.K. Downing and Glen Tipton recently completed a promotional tour of several radio stations, which gave an added boost to the album which has enjoyed 8 weeks of action on the RPM 100.

Dates firmed at press time are Montreal (March 28), Quebec City (30), Ottawa (31), and Toronto (April 2).

Pan-Canadian has rights to Rough Trade video

Toronto: Pan-Canadian Film Distributors, a division of the Cineplex Corporation, has acquired the home video cassette rights to



Rock Alert - *The Making of Rough Trade's Territorial*.

Territorial is from the *Weapons* album, released on *True North* and distributed by CBS. The release will include a bonus video of *Crimes Of Passion*.

Hancock's Rockit finally hits charts

Toronto: After bubbling under on the Canadian market for some months, *Rockit*, the Grammy-award winning single from veteran progressive jazz artist Herbie Hancock, has only recently indicated signs of making chart moves. The single entered the RPM 50 last week and continues to climb the chart this week.

Awarded a Grammy as Best Instrumental - R&B, *Rockit* was taken from Hancock's latest CBS album, *Future Shock*, somewhat a departure from his previous releases and a shock to his hard-core fans and some jazz critics.

CFNY-FM, Toronto's new music station has been airing the *Rockit* single since its release and there has been much support coming from the dance clubs and much of the sales centred in the downtown core.

There has also been a breakout in the West. "For some reason the Herbie Hancock single has suddenly taken off, request-wise in Calgary," notes CKXL Music Director, Steve Olson. "It was my third most requested single of the week, being beaten only by a small margin by *Thriller*, and a rather larger margin by Yankovic's *Eat It*."

Olson speculates the reason for the sudden popularity of the single could be attributed largely to the video, his appearance on the Grammys, or a number of smaller factors. CKXL debuted the single at No. 15.

"Even though the song is a few months old, it will be interesting to see how it does," adds Olson.

Wayne Mancuso, owner of Wheelie's Roller Centre in Whitby, reports that when Hancock's video is shown on his wide screen, skaters create a traffic jam, grinding to a stop to watch the *Rockit* robots in action.

with television work. Her TV credits included *The Juliette Show*, *A-Go Go '66*, and *Singalong Jubilee*. She was a regular on the latter for more than ten years, sharing the popular series with her sister Catherine and Anne Murray.

Like many Maritimers, singing and performing was a natural evolution for Patrician Anne. Her parents discovered her vocal chords were made for singing at the age of three and by the time she reached 15, she had become a member of ACTRA and a Jubilee regular.

"I was very lucky in the beginning," she notes, "and I think I would still have been in (the business) if I hadn't been diagnosed as sick for so many years."

She recalls that she hadn't realized at first that her illness would mean she would have to stop working. "I was let go (by the Network)," she continues.

It was a frustrating time for the young hopeful on the threshold of stardom, and she responded to the dismissal with a move to Ottawa, where she worked for several years on *Shhh . . . It's The News*, her brother-in-law, Don Harron's show.

Says McKinnon, "It (the show) gave me something that I could do, and be involved in - and not feel that death and dying was the only thing to look forward to."

She moves quickly from the past to the present and the excitement of her new record release, with eyes sparkling and a youthful urgency in her voice as she explains some of the technical aspects of the recording session.

"It's like having a new lease on life, going into the recording studios with a producer/arranger like Micky Erbe and such great and professional musicians and background singers. They really made me feel at home. On top of that, of course, I had song material that I could easily

relate to with a lot of confidence."

Suddenly was written by Gordon Henderson, well-known B.C. writer and a former member of *Steamer*, a group that gained national recognition with their Jackie Rae productions. McKinnon's session was produced at Toronto's Eastern Sound.

In addition to the single release, Erbe cut several tracks to be used on an upcoming album. "Each of the songs I recorded are slightly different in their feeling," noted McKinnon. She finds it difficult to classify the songs, but she is sure of one thing, "I like good songs, and I think all of this material falls into that category."

Returning to the recording scene after so many years, lends itself to an uncertainty about her future and what her next move will be. "It all hinges on the single, but I really do want to get back to work. I feel well, and I think I can manage (it)," she says. "I'm doing interviews now and I will be doing a television show in May."

"At the moment, it's just delightful to know that I will now be able to go in and do an album," concluding with, "then I'll be in the middle of the lottery and I'll see what happens."

With the cancer now in full remission, McKinnon is working in conjunction with the Canadian Cancer Society, lending her years of experience and anxiety to help others who could only gain by the progress made by McKinnon who successfully fought and won her battle with cancer.

Ed Preston, President of Tembo, reports the McKinnon single now showing a pattern of wide acceptance by contemporary adult programmers, many of whom have expressed their enthusiasm over the release.

Announcement of the project was made by Harold Redekopp, who heads up CBC Radio Music. Digital recording is now underway, running through until June, engineered by Anton Kwiatowski.

Kuerti's recordings of the complete sonatas were released on the Aquitaine label in Canada and on CBS/Odyssey in the U.S. to rave reviews. Germany's *Die Welt* exclaimed, "There is no Beethoven cycle with a comparable inner tension."

Highly praised in Canada and abroad for both performances and sound quality, the CBC's SM 5000 series offers music lovers a first-class Canadian alternative in orchestral repertoire. A recording of Bach's *Brandenburg Concertos*, with the CBC Vancouver Orchestra and numerous Canadian soloists will be released near the end of 1984. Like most trends, Pawley doesn't see the pop-country movement lasting much

longer.

Pawley and Stewart also revealed they plan to form another partnership, this one in a management/publicity firm, which would be handling both country and rock acts. However, Pawley stressed that he still plans to continue performing.

It's also expected that news of a label change is in the offing for Pawley.

Heaven: Dance videos in the heart of the city

Toronto: If 26-year old Gareth Brown wasn't keeping an eye on things at Toronto's Heaven dance club on weekends, he would probably be out and about like any other young man. In fact, Brown does enjoy heading out to other clubs when he has the time, keeping in touch with what's going on and what people are listening to currently.

"My personal favourite is Graham Parker, he was part of that new wave of music which came out of England in 1977. My taste in music has expanded considerably since then however, due to my exposure to dance music and some of the top live acts around the city."

Heaven's concept is deceptively simple: book popular live acts on Thursdays with the sponsorship of Toronto's Q107 FM station; play the best in funk and other dance music on Friday and Saturday nights; and finally, encourage theme parties, such as the recent CFTR bash, on the remaining nights of the week. Heaven may also be credited with aiding considerably in the popularity of break-dancing.

"We were the first club in Toronto to get involved with the break-dancing phenomenon", says Brown. Heaven's programming can afford to ride on the leading edge; music videos essentially obviate the need for bands performing top 40.

The real story however, is in the gear. Two live cameras; five video screens, as well as a monitor in the lounge; sound equipment to the tune of \$500,000; a video system

Use of music clips could create future rights battle

Toronto: Yet another facet of the ongoing video revolution is the trend toward playing portions of feature films and other programming on the screens of rock video clubs. Industry sources say this business could represent a significant dollar factor to the industry by the end of 1984.

Even though the industry is in its infancy, as many as a hundred clubs may be using video nationally. Apparently money is no object, because the right video mix will keep clubgoers in the club, and consequently drinking at the bars. The problem arises when clubs insist on making unlicensed use of almost anything that has gone out on a video signal. A high percentage of video clubs are using footage illegally, according to an industry source. Since only 25% of currently released songs come equipped with music video clips, the clubs are obviously hard up for material to maintain a steady flow of images in their establishments.

Another industry source indicates that footage doesn't have to be of a cult or classic nature in order to be snapped up by the clubs; it just has to be unique. Apparently, many video clubs are aware of the potential legal pitfalls, but can't foresee any other way to keep their screens filled. A number are staying away from the business until the situation is clarified. Rights owners and industry organizations are uncertain about the situation and unsure as to technicalities of the copyright violations involved.

worth \$100,000, and enough square footage to house an army of dancers. Brown is quick to point out that there isn't a place in the club where you can't see a screen.

Brown works in conjunction with general manager Morton Victor, whom he has known for a number of years. DJ Colin Frank, who is responsible for all the music played in the club, and VJ Helen Young are two of the staff mentioned in the course of the conversation.

"That's a big reason for our success," continues Brown, "we have a great crew here, and when customers are treated nicely, they have a good time."

The club's set-up permits a number of functions: mixing from video to record and vice-versa, mixing from video to video, as well as filming the DJ at work, which Brown claims adds to the overall atmosphere created by the music. The music is programmed with that evening's particular clientele in mind.

The club's relationship with Q107 has been a rewarding association. "Q107 has been good to us," concludes Brown. "They've been very supportive and the club has become quite well known." - K.W.

Robinson's Rockbound debuts across Canada

Vancouver: Rockbound, The Radio Show, debuted the weekend of March 3, 1984, a two-hour syndicated radio show hosted by veteran rock radio and TV personality Red Robinson.

The series is based on Rockbound, Rock 'n' Roll Encounters, a book written by Robinson and Peggy Hodgins. A montage of hit music from 1955 through 1969, the series features weekly clips of taped interviews with legends including Elvis Presley and The Beatles.

The show is written by Hodgins and produced by Bob Morris of Phase Four Communications of North Vancouver. Morris is a recognized radio programmer and was formerly Program Director at Calgary's CHQR and has been associated with CKDA in Victoria and Vancouver's CKLG.

Three Canadian dates firmed for Clash tour

Toronto: The Clash are firmed to play Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens (April 30), the Montreal Forum (May 2), and Ottawa's Civic Centre (3).

As a result of the Sept./83 departure of guitarist Mick Jones, the band recruited guitarists Vince White and Nicke Sheppard. Joe Strummer (guitar/vocals), and Paul Simonon (bass), remain from the original Clash, with drummer Pete Howard replacing Topper Headon immediately prior to last year's appearance at the U.S. Festival in California.

An album is not expected from the band until late summer at the earliest.

Teenage Head to Ready Live album shipped

Toronto: Teenage Head has signed a recording deal with Ready Records, an independent label distributed by A&M.

The 12-song album, titled Endless Party, is the group's first live project and has been specifically designed for the band's cult-like following. El Mocambo - Toronto - March 17/84

Perhaps one of the brightest talents to emerge from England since Elvis Costello, Paul Young's CBS debut, No Parlez, has generated sufficient interest in the man to be able to pack the El Mocambo. His stylish reworking of Marvin Gaye's Wherever I Lay My Hat has met with good response and would spell success for the subsequent single, Come Back And Stay.

The band he has brought with him is certainly up to the task; an evocative collage of soul, funk, and a little Philly thrown in for good measure. The selling point was the inclusion of two female vocalists who moved through tightly choreographed dance routines, and displayed real vocal strength in the course of harmony with Young's raspy delivery. A promising career for this vocalist is off to a strong start.

GIRLSCHOOL

El Mocambo - Toronto - March 8/84

Easily one of the more underrated metal bands, perhaps because of the all-female line-up, Girlschool played to a very enthusiastic audience at the El Mo on Thursday night. Already very popular in England as a result of support slots on Uriah Heep and Black Sabbath tours, the band shows real tightness and that intangible spunk which characterizes the British bands. Although the Hit And Run release attained gold status in Canada, Solid Gold would no doubt be very happy to have the current Play Dirty put this group into the big leagues in North America. Playing pretty well anywhere they can get a gig, the band shows the payoff of heavy touring and the input provided by ex-Slade members Noddy Holder and Jim Lea in the course of producing the new record.
