

CBS launches new Music Video program

Designed to capture a chunk of the Christmas video market, with their new program, *The Best In Music Video*, which showcases their top selling releases: George Michael, Terence Trent D'Arby, Santana, and Folkways: A Vision Shared.

The Faith video, which is 35 minutes in length, is of prime importance in view of the 7-times platinum status of the album. This is a 5-clip compilation of the hit singles from the album, including exclusive interview footage with Michael. Also included is the uncensored version of *I Want Your Sex* and his highly popular music clip of *Monkey*.

The D'Arby video, *Introducing The Hardline . . . Live*, clocked at 65 minutes, is a

Grey Cup theme written by Toronto's McKeown

Toronto songwriter/composer Terence McKeown was chosen by the Canadian Football Network (CFN) to write the theme song for this year's Grey Cup telecast. The game will be seen across Canada on CKVU Vancouver, CITV Edmonton, CFAC Calgary, STV Regina, CKND Winnipeg, CFPL London, CKNX Wingham, CHCH-TV Hamilton, and ASN throughout the Maritimes. *Keep This Spirit Alive*, the winning song, will be featured in the pre-game show as well as at the close of the program. The Theme's vocals are sung by David Roberts. McKeown produced the track which is not commercially available, although it could be through demands from fans.

McKeown recently wrote and performed the soundtrack for *The Boys On The Bus*, the Gemini-nominated documentary about the Edmonton Oilers. He also scored the soundtrack for *Strangers In A Strange Land*, a film about the production in China of the feature film, *Bethune: The Making Of A Hero*, voted Best Arts and Humanities Documentary at the Chicago International Film Festival. As well, he scored the soundtrack for the documentary *Les Canadiens*.

Arpin releases album of Anne Murray Favourites

The latest from well-known keyboardist John Arpin is an album of his *Anne Murray Favourites*. The 10-track release, produced by Arpin, is released on the Home Choice Recordings label (Mississauga), and includes *Snowbird*, *You Needed Me*, *Daydream Believer*, *Danny's Song*, and *I Just Fall In Love Again*, to name a few.

Executive producer credits go to Frank Lynch and Ray Osborne. Criss Skene handled the board duties along with assistant engineers Richard Benoit and Martin Golboun. The session was recorded at Toronto's Cherry Beach Sound.

Mills set for CTV Christmas Special

Frank Mills, currently on tour of major Canadian cities, will mount a Christmas show at Toronto's Roy Thomson Hall (Dec. 11). The special, *A Family Christmas With Frank Mills: A Magical Evening Of Holiday Music*, will be taped for a broadcast on the CTV network at 10 pm (ET) December 22.

Mills will be joined by the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Eric Friedenberg. His musical guests will include Robert Pilon, The Leahy Family, The Elmer Iseler Singers, and boy soprano Jeremy Nasmith. Robin Ward, well-known in film and theatre circles, and once a member of The Allen Ward Folk Trio, will act as emcee.

The special will be produced by CTV's Toronto affiliate CFTO-TV. Gerry Rochon is executive producer, Ian Murray is the show's producer/director, Murray Sherman is associate producer and Jeremy Burke is the production manager.

"Industry ignorant about sponsorship . . ." Owens

In conjunction with Q107 and Labatt's, Joe Owens' new company, EMG, produced the recent Toronto Music Awards and the show is a shining example of how the advertising community, its clients and the music industry can appreciate each other respectfully. Sponsorship packages have lead times many months in advance and expensive tour deals are the exception, not the rule for bands these days.

As a matter of fact, says Owens, the days are now long gone when a group can approach a major corporation and simply ask for a sponsorship package and expect to get one. "Sending proposals blindly to corporations these days will achieve nothing," he adds. "You never score with a 'throw it against the wall and see what sticks' approach." Currently, sponsorship deals are client driven and companies such as EMG, Hollis and Rockbill operate as matchmakers.

With yearly campaigns totalling millions of dollars, the stakes are high and decisions are made in the corporate community based on what will happen, not what might happen. Unfortunately, the music industry invariably finds itself stuck between a rock and a hard place when trying to convince anybody, let alone a corporate executive, that a band's record will be a top seller and their tour a success next year.

"The record companies understand lead times and the retailers understand lead

time. The video, timed at 70 minutes, includes the home video solo performance debut of Bruce Springsteen, a strong sales point in itself. Also included are several live performances and many songs that aren't on the album.

Viva Santana, at 70 minutes, is billed as "An Intimate Conversation with Carlos", and features what is considered "the best melodic, guitar based hard rock ever performed." There is footage from the Ed Sullivan Show, Woodstock and other notable concerts over a 20-year span.

Dana Sayers, Manager Catalogue Marketing for CBS Music Video has found "very positive" early reaction to these first four titles. It's expected that in the new year, CBS will release two to three titles each month, "tying in with releases of music product," Sayers points out, "so they will be as current as possible."

times," Owens affirms, "but a lot of the event producers, especially managers, always come at us at the last minute. Because they get this idea. They finish the album, they put it out, they start to get a little airplay, they get ready to go out on tour and all of a sudden they say 'Well, if we did a syndicated radio and television satellite world cure-cancer broadcast, then Molson's would give us 12 million.' That's when I get the call.

"There's a speech to be made or a presentation that needs to be given to the music and arts world about sponsors. No longer can artists or their managers call up and simply request sponsorship to coincide with their tour or event which is taking place in six weeks time. No one can find a sponsor in six weeks; not me, not Rockbill, not Jesus Christ."

Including established artists like Rush and Bruce Cockburn with new artists like Brighton Rock and Blue Rodeo, the Toronto Music Awards satisfy the stringent requirements of their respective sponsors as well as promoting local bands, both with and without recording contracts, which extends benefits throughout the music industry obviously. But, as Owens says, it takes months of preparation and planning, together with the cooperation of all participating parties. "All the major corporations are planning well into next year," he concludes, "while the music industry works on tomorrow."

Last year his company, Helping Others Incorporated, distributed some \$42,000 in toys, candy products, cassettes, movie posters, soft drinks, entertainment vouchers and clothing items. Randall personally distributes these products across Toronto to a number of organizations including The Scott Mission, The Salvation Army, Covenant House, Humewood House For Girls and The Children's Aid Society.

MIDEM expected to take on a new lease of life

Organizers of this year's MIDEM are claiming the Cannes, France location will "take on a new lease of life," and will not only play host to regular visitors, but also to newcomers such as the California independents and to majors that attended in the past, and in particular, EMI. Part of the festival's new look will be what is described as "a new generation of concerts," with performances at both the Palais and in the city itself. Showcases, held in conjunction with SBK Songs, will be held evenings at the Martinez in a club atmosphere, each evening from January 20th through the 24th. Arrangements have apparently been reached with 15 participating countries.

As Valerie Normand explains, joint Managing Directors Xavier Roy and Bob Bingham are "at the root of this new vitality, with their attentiveness to market trends and music industry professionals' expectations, and receptiveness to development and change," concluding with "The music industry is on the move, and so is MIDEM."

With You.

There weren't too many believers in Cancon back in the early seventies, but the Stampeders' manager, Mel Shaw, was confident he had a world class band, even before that expression became popular. He did, however, find one believer, Donald K. Donald, Canada's top concert promoter, who "put his money on the line", (RPM - July 14, 1973) for the "biggest rock tour in the history of Canada." DKD guaranteed the band an unprecedented \$125,000, with percentages for the tour, the highest guarantee ever paid to a Canadian group. As well, he presented the band with a bonded cheque for the sum of \$65,000, the largest advance payment made to a Canadian group, and he did it on television, on the final taping of Musical Friends (CTV), hosted by Jim McKenna, which starred the Stampeders.

The connection Shaw made with Donald K. Donald was the door-opener for this Calgary trio. They went on to become the darlings of the Canadian recording industry

Elton John's Greatest leads metal certifications

Leading the way for CRIA's October certifications was the MCA release of Elton John's Greatest Hits Volume 1. He also scored certifications in each of the categories running from nine-times down to three-times platinum. As well, Polydor's Def Leopard certified for nine-times platinum for their Hysteria album, and George Michael's Faith album rang up a seven-times platinum certification.

Triple-platinum certifications were registered for Bon Jovi (New Jersey) and for the More Dirty Dancing Original Motion Picture Soundtrack.

Solo platinum awards went to Robert Palmer (Heavy Nova), Crowded House (Temple Of Low Men), Stevie Ray Vaughn and Double Trouble (Couldn't Stand The Weather and Texas Flood), Daniel Lavoie (Tension Attention), The Judds (Christmas With The Judds), Pat Benatar (Wide Awake In Dreamland), and Dire Straits (Money For Nothing).

There were six Cancon gold certifications out of field of eighteen: Joni Mitchell (Chalk Mark In A Rainstorm), K.D. Lang (Shadowland), Claude Dubois (Dubois), Ginette Reno (Ne m'en Veux Pas), Colin James (Self-titled), and Barney Bentall And The Legendary Hearts (Self-titled). The others were The California Raisins (Sweet, Delicious & Marvelous), Bobby McFerrin (Simple Pleasures), Crowded House (Temple Of Low Men), Bruce Springsteen (Chimes Of Freedom), Hothouse Flowers (People), D.J. Jazzy Jeff And The Fresh Prince (He's The D.J. I'm The Rapper), Dire Straits (Money For Nothing), Anthrax (State Of Euphoria), Melissa Etheridge (Self-titled), The Judds (Greatest Hits), Joan Jett And The Blackhearts (Up Your Alley), and Ozzy Osbourne (No Rest For The Wicked).

This year's certifications show a significant increase from 28 to 38. Last year there were two diamond certifications, three double platinum, and six solo platinum certifications plus sixteen gold albums.



INXS KICK

The band and the album of 1988? Not much doubt that it's INXS and KICK. "Kick" just celebrated its first anniversary on Canadian charts; and it's still in the Top Ten with 750,000 units sold.

Four singles "Need You Tonight," "Devil Inside," "New Sensation" and "Never Tear Us Apart" have already made their mark; none has charted lower at CHR than number three. And the radio story continues with the PR CD of "Mystify" now at AOR.

A greatest hits package? 500,000 Canadian consumers already think so!



Eddie Money campaigns again . . . for sobriety

It doesn't take much to get Eddie Money talking. The former Gotham cop was back in Canada recently promoting his new album and praising the virtues again, of his sobriety. As he was following the release of his last album, Can't Hold Back, Money is apparently really sober now and readily admits the hard times are all behind him. Today, he realizes, the image of rock 'n' roll's "bad boy" is no longer admired or even wanted.

Money has, many times, quit his assumed bad habits but, true to the adage, success was elusive and he tried and tried again. With a new girlfriend and his first child in tow when he tours in the new year, the gutsy singer says there certainly is more to life than the nightly debauchery and foolish irresponsibility that nearly had him killed several years ago. On his latest album, Nothing To Lose, he has recorded another anti-drug song.

Titled Dancing With Mr. Jitters, Money explains the song was not written, in fact, as a message to young people but for himself and one he has wanted to put on his last two albums. "Now I can sing it," he adds, "and not as a hypocrite because I wrote it when I quit, then I went back out. Now that I'm straight again, I put it on the record." As well, he feels it is one of the most important songs on the album. However, not necessarily believing that kids actually listen to artists anyway, Money quips it was merely written as a warning.

"Being strung out is no fun," he con-

tinues, "and you don't have to be rich and famous to drive your car off a bridge and kill yourself. I'd like to leave a more favourable impression of myself. I don't want to be known as the man with 'no control' anymore or the bad boy of rock. I don't want to leave that impression with my daughter while she's growing up, like Elvis Presley's kid. Stoned or strung out and having a heart attack on a bathroom floor or some handball court, isn't for me."

The new album was produced again with Richie Zito, who was also at the helm of Cheap Trick's Lap Of Luxury album, and it's a partnership which Money considers an asset. Even though there were problems during the sessions with Can't Hold Back, their friendship actually survived intact, fortunately. "We had a lot of fights," Money recalls, "a lot of ups and downs on that first record, but we got all of that out of the way."

"I was going through a lot of emotional trauma at the time: quitting using, breaking up with my wife, then my girlfriend being pregnant. I mean . . . I was a mess for a while. The last album did well but I had a lot of debts to pay and I want to finally get myself into the black . . . and getting separated from my wife is definitely going to help."

Having gone through all those changes, he has returned with an album substantially better than its predecessor. Another aspect that concerns Money is touring and he's more eager than ever to get out on the road in support of this seventh album. But the band will

Vancouver law student receives PROCAN award

PROCAN sponsors the competition annually and offers a \$2,500 cash award to law students for a paper dealing with copyright as it relates to music. Now in its tenth year, the competition attracted a record 14 entries from across Canada in both English and French.

WEA preparing to introduce TELDEC line

With the acquisition of TELDEC by WEA, a full-scale introduction into the North American marketplace is being planned for the complete catalogue of this major European classical label. The line has never been widely available outside of select importations and domestically released titles, which makes TELDEC "one of the best kept secrets of the North American classical aficionado," the label's Canadian manager, Ralph Alfonso, points out.

He goes on to inform that TELDEC was founded in 1951 as a joint venture between Telefunken of Berlin and Decca of London (hence TELDEC). "Its high standards and meticulous supervision of all production facets led to TELDEC's development of the Direct Metal Mastering process, considered the ultimate for sound reproduction," suggests Alfonso.

TELDEC's mid-price Colour CD line "produced domestically using the German CD 'mothers' to maintain optimum quality" will be released before the end of the year, along with 50 select imported CD titles, "an even mixture of back catalogue and new 1988 release," says Alfonso. Cassettes and selected vinyl imports will follow in 1989, "as will the opportunity to special order titles from the full German TELDEC catalogue," he concludes.

be learning material from all the albums because Money also believes that way his ardent fans, including the new ones, will be getting their money's worth at his shows.

"Recently I've been checking out the older songs," he informs. "As a matter of fact I was listening to I Wanna Go Back and I want to change the bass line and make it a little brighter. I want the band to sound a lot like the record. Fans get ripped off a lot today. The first time I saw Led Zeppelin I loved them, the second time though, they were ad libbing too much and I was disappointed. I don't want my fans to be disappointed at my shows. I record my records the way I want them played live."

"And before I record them I play them live, like the songs from this album. It's a band feel and a song like Walk On Water (the first single) will be a big hit because radio's changing, thanks to bands like U2 and Guns 'N' Roses," Money concludes. "They've helped me out and put me back on the charts and it feels great."

This date follows a successful series of similar performances by both Canadian and internationally-known recording acts. Just recently The Razorbacks and Pursuit Of Happiness were showcased.

"The reaction from our customers has been terrific" says Chris Liber, a consultant with Peckham, McGirr Consultants, a PR firm which handles the HMV account. "This type of appearance by groups and artists, takes down the barrier between these acts and their audiences. This is a great showplace, and it's incredible to see an artist live . . . for free."


Toronto restaurant hosts unique talent search



New York honours for Adams/Vallance video

The Bryan Adams video, Remembrance Day, which he co-wrote with Jim Vallance, won the Bronze medal in the Music Video Category at the recent International Film and Television Festival held in New York City (Nov. 11). The video was originally presented as a tribute to the recipients of the Victoria Cross, a medal awarded for bravery in battle.

The video was financed by the Department of Defense and produced by Crawley Films in Ottawa, and distributed to 8,000 highschools in Canada to be broadcast during their Remembrance Day ceremonies. Featuring the raspy vocals of Adams (he does not appear), the video is made up of old films and photographs of some of the Canadian soldiers awarded the Victoria Cross. Out of 1,352 Crosses awarded, 93 went to Canadians, and 31 of those were awarded posthumously. The video also shows footage of Canadian troops at Vimy Ridge, Dieppe and Normandy.

A Canadian Press report (Nov. 10) quoted Adams as saying, "The freedom we have today is a direct result of the sacrifices made by the men who fought and lost their lives for our future," concluding with, "The song 'Remembrance Day' is for them, especiall: as it does not glamorize war."

The CP report also pointed out that the Defense Department had offered free copies of the video to 1,800 Royal Canadian Legions, but they apparently declined when they discovered there was a rock song involved.

Placing first in the Music Video category was Flames Of Paradise by Elton John and Jennifer Rush with second place going to Mike Oldfield's Magic Touch. Remembrance Day beat out Skin Trade by Duran Duran and When We Were Fab by George Harrison.

Hawkins and his band are coming directly to the Grey Cup after a tour of the southern U.S. where he was also researching material for his biography titled Last Of The Good Old Boys, being written by Peter Goddard. He was also scouting locations for The Black Hawk Story, a movie representing a period of his career from 1956 and 1957. Hawkins is currently charting with his latest Columbia single, appropriately titled Living A Life I Can't Afford.

The Family Brown, one of the Ottawa Valley's favourite bands will be performing many of their past hits, including Town Of Tears and Til I Find My Love, two of the fastest moving chart singles in their career.

Joe Coughlin, a rock artist from a few years ago, has mellowed his tone and will host his own TV variety show in January of next year. Although details aren't complete, it's expected his show will guest a wide variety of Cancon pop and rock artists.

Coughlin has also been in the studio putting together a single titled It's The Way I Feel. He penned the lyrics with Gino Salvador writing the music. However, because of the pressing problems with black vinyl, the release of the single has been put ahead to January. "I would rather wait in line for Canadian pressings," says Salvador, President of Jaggar Records, an independent Canadian label. "It would make me feel much more satisfied with a record that is all Canadian."

Traditional Southern nod to Capitol's Anne Murray

Anne Murray's popularity in the heartland of America's country music continues to flourish. CROSBY, STILLS, NASH AND YOUNG - Pop
American Dream
Atlantic - 78-18881-P

Here is the perfect album for 1988. After the revival of early/mid-sixties pop over the past few years, it is natural that a late '80s revival should be close on its heels. American Dream contains everything for the baby boomer dollars to chase this Christmas: some excellent ballads with all the CSNY harmonizing you could want; some heavier numbers featuring Neil Young's trademark electric guitar; and some throw-away synthesizer pieces. Radio has jumped all over the title-track single with its catchy rhythms and melodic hooks. Without a doubt, AOR should immediately pick up on Don't Say Good-bye and Feel Your Love, tracks containing the classic CSN&Y sound. Although Young sings lead on only three tracks, his strong presence on this effort, and the CSN&Y name, should keep this item in heavy demand for Canadian retailers.



QUIET RIOT - Rock
Quiet Riot - Pasha - FZ-40981-H

Two years and two member changes later, Quiet Riot still retain their anthemic "Bang Your Head" sound, guitarwise, while making some refreshing changes, especially in the lead vocal department. The newcomer is Paul Shortino, formerly of Rough Cutt, whose raspy crooning is fondly reminiscent of Rodney The Tartan in his finest, most polished moments. Quiet Riot have combined many positive forces for what may be considered their comeback album. Songwriting credits include Trevor Rabin of Yes, and Spencer Proffer who also handles the mixing and production duties. The old fans will not be disappointed, and the retailers will likely be pleased. The ballad Run To You is surely worthy of radio play.

DICKEY BETTS BAND - Rock
Pattern Disruptive
Epic - BFE-44289-H

The contributions of Dickey Betts to the success of the Allman Brothers Band are probably a lot better known in the U.S., especially in the South but make no mistake, this album smokes with the fire of a genuine "quick-on-the-draw" guitarist. Country, jazz and bluesy swing influences all appear on key cuts like Rock Bottom and Stone Cold Heart. Through constant touring, the band has developed to a point where they can breeze from style to style. AOR should receive both barrels of Pattern Disruptive and return the hottest shots to their listeners.



MURRAY McLAUCHLAN - Pop

Capitol - C4-91298-F


One of the early troubadours of hard rock and country/folk, Murray McLauchlan has survived the battles of format and music changes to quietly move back into the fray with an album that perhaps can only be described as vintage McLauchlan. The vocals are crisp and beautifully projected displaying that growling musical signature so easily identifiable, and he covers rock, pop and country with a folksy magic that makes this release, his debut for Capitol, a unique entertainment package. My Imaginary Tree, the first single, is being picked up by both pop and country programmers, and should make moves to crossover, considering the season ahead. Also key are the title track and The Natural State. Great programming material, and a natural for a front-rack position. Produced by McLauchlan at Kensington Sound.

ROMEO'S DAUGHTER - Pop
Romeo's Daughter - Jive - 1135-1-J-N

The fact that studio svengali's Mutt Lange and John Parr actually offered to produce Romeo's Daughter's debut speaks volumes for the commercial potential of this talented English trio, naturally, the music says the rest. In their two year history, they have spent many more hours in the studio than the clubs, consequently, they compiled a backlog of strong material to choose from. Vocally and visually, Leigh Maddy makes an ideal front woman. Radio should have a field day with Don't Break My Heart and Heaven in The Backseat.

CORLEE BUELL - Country
My Heart's At Home With You
Lady Slipper - LSR-001

A newcomer from the Maritimes, Corlee Buell has already made her presence known nationally through her recent single, You Make Me Crazy, included here. Now, the real vocal magic of this young talent blossoms with this package produced by veteran Larry Coad. There are some Cancon tracks here, but they aren't identified, and that could be crucial for airplay. Key are Coad's penning of Hey Mister Wind and Jean Langley's When I Fall and You Make Me Crazy, but don't overlook the title track, co-written by Skip Ewing and Jerry McBe, which is definitely not Cancon, but a great track. Recorded in Nashville.




ROBBIE NEVIL - Pop
A Place Like Manhattan

With the exception of Here We Go Again, a mellow jazz number, this album is filled with an upbeat sound containing more than a hint of funky R&B. Love And Money sounds almost like the Pointer Sisters' I'm So Excited. Nevil's clear high vocals are reminiscent of a wide range of stars, all the way from John Cougar to Prince. The single, Back On Holiday, displays a slight reggae influence and is picking up speed at radio. This album certainly has the makings of a success story provided it gets the chance it deserves at this time of very heavy release schedules.

BOY MEETS GIRL - Pop
Reel Life - RCA - 8414-1-R-N

The veteran songwriting team of George Merrill and Shannon Rubicam, who penned the Whitney Houston hits How Will I Know and I Wanna Dance With Somebody, deliver more excellently crafted, pop songs on this thoroughly solid release. Waiting For A Star To Fall has met with a very warm reception both at radio and in the dance clubs, and is definitely suited for A/C, AOR and CHR. Programmers wishing to go deeper into this project should consider Bring Down The Moon, Stormy Love, Is Anybody Out There In Love and No Apologies, tracks which manage to stand out despite the high level quality of the entire album. With time-honed songwriting skills and enjoyable well-produced performances, who can complain?



BOYS CLUB - Pop
Boys Club - MCA - 42242-J

Sprung from the teen-idol mold (you can write to Gene and Joe at...), Boys Club combines pop accessibility with a paucity of adventurousness ending up with a package that should suit radio perfectly. The first single, I Remember Holding You, is off to a good start on the airwaves. Two other tracks stand out as having potential for success: the ballad Time Starts Now should take off

at A/C and perhaps elsewhere, while Dancin' On A String, slightly R&B tinged, comes closer than any other song to having an edge.

CANDI - Pop
Candi - IRS - IRS-42260-J

As a successful vehicle for the waning hit single, Dancing Under A Latin Moon, this album will probably do quite well at retail. Under Your Spell, the second single, is performing well during the early stages. Of the other tracks, Independent stands out as a clear choice for future single release

There is a temptation to write this off as yet another Whitesnake sound-alike, in light of the band's first single, I Wanna Be Loved. On listening to the whole disc however, one can assume that the band is attempting to evoke the pomp and circumstance of knights in shining armour. Trumpets, strings and classical guitar blend with the modern day crunch to create a sound that can be categorized as regal rock. Veterans Gregg Giffuria (ex-Angel) and Chuck Wright (Quiet Riot) have long been on a quest for a home, and it looks as though they have found it in the House Of Lords. Gene 'Bat Lizard' Simmons of Kiss is at the helm as executive producer.



The single was produced by Mike (Pepe) Francis at Toronto's Inception Sound. Session people included Francis, Kim Brandt, Barry Keane and Lou Pomonti.

Harnden is donating the publishing royalties from the new single to Toronto's Children's Hospital. He will be performing the single at the Christmas Opry North Show, a benefit for the Children's Hospital (Dec.11) at the Birchmount Tavern.

Canadian broadcast pioneers honoured

Nine broadcasting pioneers, including one of radio's first female personalities were inducted into the Broadcast Hall of Fame at the annual conference of the Canadian Association of Broadcasters (CAB) in Winnipeg (Nov. 8). The late Jane Gray, who started a daily radio show on CHML Hamilton in the twenties, was inducted posthumously. Also inducted posthumously was Real Therrien, a popular Vice Chairman of the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications (CRTC), who died last year.

Other new members of the Hall of Fame are Allan Waters, who purchased CHUM, Toronto in 1954 and now operates 30 radio and television stations across Canada;

Blair Nelson, winner of the 1988 Western Association of Broadcasters' (WAB) Broadcaster of The Year Award, and who is president of a company formed by Baton Broadcasting to operate four stations in Saskatchewan;

Jean-Joffre Gourd, who began his broadcasting career in 1948 as one of the founders of Radio-Nord, a company which acquired three radio stations in the Abitibi region;

Atlantic Canada pioneer J. Arthur Manning who began his career in 1938 as a transmitter operator with CHNS Halifax and who founded CKLC/CKTO-FM Truro and later introduced Canadian radio's first computerized traffic system;

'Cactus' Jack Wells, one of the most listened to broadcasters in the West, and who began his sportscasting career with CFQC Saskatoon in 1937;

J. Fred Weber, Chairman of Okanagan Skeena Group Limited, the British Columbia Association of Broadcasters' (BCAB) 1986 Broadcaster of The Year, who began his career as an announcer/engineer with CKOV Kelowna in 1940 and who later founded

Cariboo Broadcasters and Skeena Broadcasters and established CFTK-TV Terrace in 1962; and

Orville Kope, the retired head of Monarch Broadcasting, who joined Medicine Hat's CHAT as an announcer in 1946 and who also served several years as a Director of the Canadian Association of Broadcasters.

There are now 79 members in the CAB Broadcast Hall of Fame which recognizes "in perpetuity Canada's broadcast pioneers, innovators and entrepreneurs whose ingenuity and dedication helped develop the Canadian private broadcasting system."

Both the plug side and the flip (*The Sky Shall Open*) were penned by Saddlestone's president Candice James.


