

Promotion veteran Zayac resigns CBS post

Kim Zayac, a veteran of the record industry and recognized as one of Canada's best in the promotion field, has been offered and has accepted a partnership in the Einstein Brothers, a multi-faceted entertainment company. Although his resignation from CBS is effective virtually immediately, he will remain available until his replacement has settled in properly. CBS has not yet announced a successor.

Colero, formerly with Avenue Road Publishing, formed the entertainment company several years ago and are looking to move in "new" directions, says Zayac. "My mandate is basically to try and move them into some other areas," he adds. Currently involved in jingle work ("They get more airplay than my records do," quips Zayac), as well as publishing and production, the Einstein Brothers are now gearing towards television, videos and the record industry.

"It's a big move," Zayac continues, "but I've done this for five years and if I do it for another five . . . I'll never get out, I'll be doing this for the rest of my life and I don't want to do that. Part of this job is always

difficult, it's always hard to a degree, but then there are parts of it that are really autopilot." He concludes with, "I don't like the feeling of coming in, in the morning, and half the day is just pushing the right buttons. I want to get out there and struggle in the real world . . . and make it all happen from scratch."

Ertegun is first MIDEM Man of The Year

Nesuhi Ertegun, a firm believer in the importance of MIDEM, has been honoured as the first recipient of that music market's Man of The Year Award. The award ceremony will now be an annual event honouring leading music industry executives, recognizing their "contributions to the advancement of the international music community". Ertegun received the award in Cannes, France on January 22nd, as part of this year's overall MIDEM festivities.

Ertegun was the first choice because of his numerous anti-piracy campaigns, which he waged around the world, as well as what is described as "his strong love of music and his flair for creative leadership."

Currently serving his second term as President of IFP (International Federation of Phonographic Industries), Ertegun has held such posts as President of NARAS (National Association of Recording Arts and Sciences), owner and international head of Atlantic Records, founder and President of WEA International, Chairman and Co-Chief Executive Officer of WEA International, and most recently, President Special Projects of WCI Record Group and founder of East-West Records.

Value Priced CD series announced by A&M

A&M Canada has announced the launch of its Value Priced Compact Disc series, which the label's Vice President of Sales & Marketing, Bill Ott, describes as "a tremendous opportunity for the retailer to satisfy the consumer with well-known repertoire at the bargain value prices they are in search of."

The series is unique in that the packaging, posters, header cards, shelf-talkers and buttons will be entirely coordinated.

More than 100 titles are due for inclusion in the series by year's end. Titles presently available include: Greatest Hits or Best Of packages by Herb Alpert, Joe Cocker, Cat Stevens, Gino Vannelli, Joan Baez, Nazareth as well as top titles by Rick Wakeman, Chris De Burgh, Bryan Adams, The Police, Chuck Mangione, and more.

Madonna gets Pepsi nod for sponsorship deal

Pepsi-Cola makes another major move into the world of rock with the signing of a worldwide sponsorship and advertising deal with Sire recording star Madonna. A major ad campaign is expected to premiere in March through what is described as "an unprecedented worldwide prime-time media buy."

The one-year deal calls for Madonna to appear in a series of Pepsi-Cola commercials, including a long-form ad in which Like A Prayer, the title song from her upcoming album, will be aired for the first time. As well, Pepsi has announced it will sponsor Madonna's world concert tour. Scheduled to begin later this year, dates and cities will be announced shortly.

The Madonna spots, now underway in Los Angeles, will be directed by Joe Pytko, who did the same for Michael Jackson's Pepsi ads last year. Besides Jackson and Madonna, Pepsi has featured several top names in the business including David Bowie, Tina Turner, Lionel Richie and the Miami Sound Machine, to name just a few.

Madonna's first album was released in Canada in August of 1983. To date she has released four albums, selling a grand total of two million units. Worldwide, she has sold in excess of 75 million albums.





Hold those rumours . . . ! Put a hold on all those rumours you've heard lately. A couple of them were very close to becoming fact, but there has been a "gathering of the clan" to short-circuit one of them, and another, that's closely related, has even been shoved off the back-burner. (EC: *What goes around, comes around . . . !*)

Ritchie's sting felt across ocean! For those of our readers who weren't around during the Ritchie Yorke era, chronicled in the pages of RPM, you missed a very exciting time in the history of the Canadian music industry. Since Ritchie has been back, writing a column from Brisbane, Australia, he's receiving a lot of mail from Canada. Even government people have requested issues in which his column has appeared. Ritchie has a way with words, and, coming from an Australian, he can still inject a sense of Canadianism in an industry that's on the brink of destruction. (EC: *It's time to stand up and be counted again . . . !*)

Ambiguity stretches the imagination! At the risk of sounding ambiguous (EC: *You're kidding . . . YOU, ambiguous . . . ?*) there's more shocking news for the industry, some of it on page two this week. Another has to do

with Andre Bureau stepping down as Chairman of the CRTC, but that's been well covered by the dailies. What hasn't been covered however, is some of the controversy that's going down on the hill, and the shocking news that will be the result of it. (EC: *What goes up, sometimes disappears!*)

Good news . . . ! It's always nice to hear from people who got their start in the business through working at RPM. I received an interesting note from Christine Dyck, who worked at RPM a few years ago, and who is now the Music Director at CFRB in Toronto. (EC: *There's a pretty impressive list of former RPM employees who have succeeded in the entertainment field . . . !*)

Free trade controversy . . . ! Well, if you're looking for GREAT comments . . . for and against Free Trade, take a look at the January/February issue of PROCAN's Music Scene. The item, titled Probe, and put together by Peter Simpson and Nancy Lanthier, contains some pretty outspoken condemnations of Free Trade from leaders in Canada's recording industry and allied fields. Obviously, there'll be a close eye kept on what goes on that will affect the industry, and, fortunately, nothing is etched in stone. A watchdog committee should be able to short-circuit any American demands that would create hardship for Canada's recording industry. We could score some points with Free Trade as well. (EC: *Tell it to the Marines . . . !*)

On the new Mechanical Rate . . . ! While you're in the mood for reading . . . check out Volume 1, Issue 1 of The Bridge, published

by the Songwriters Association of Canada. Included is a very interesting piece on the new Mechanical Rate, written by lawyer Stephen Stohn. This is one of the "quiet" battles that's going on between the songwriters' organization and major record manufacturers, with no settlement in sight.

Just a few more weeks! In just a couple of weeks, the big CARAS and Variety Club charity event to celebrate RPM's 25th Anniversary will take place. The dinner, at the Inn on the Park, has already raised a significant amount of money for the Variety Club. The cause, to help needy kids, is one of the best in the world, and the event is one of those once-in-a-lifetime happenings with many important artists and industry people attending from all over the world. I intend to be there. (EC: *Oh what the hell . . . if you aren't, we'll just carry on without you . . . !*)

Country music in trouble . . . ! Picking up a Juno was once one of the prize awards for a country group, but this year, there will be no such Juno given. Meanwhile, the country music industry in Canada is riddled with politics. There are a few hotshots, who are nickle and dimeing themselves to the bank, while the industry boasts of a highly rated yearly TVer and no industry to back it up. The biggest winners in that TVer are the foreign acts, who come up to Canada to promote their Nashville productions. The other winner is the TV network that comes up with one of the best Cancon productions on TV, and a brewery that sells suds . . . but the industry doesn't sell records. Everybody wins but the artists. If there was ever a time when Cancon country was ripe . . . it should be now, but alas . . . politics has taken its toll! (EC: *Somewhere along the way, someone erred . . . !*)

Lame duck Junos . . . ? Too bad the dailies are able to portray the Junos as being lame duck. The papers find it clever to poke fun at the record industry in Canada and some of the navel-gazing scribes have a field day with the Junos and the people who try to put it together. My advice to the Juno organizers is to attack the media problem and solve it. The Junos seem to end up as some kind of an embarrassment every year. Perhaps a few less cooks, fewer catagories and more of an industry event would make better television than another "super special" which is neither super nor special! (EC: *On the other hand, Mr. Walt Says, what do you know about staging an award show . . . ?*)

Scruffy The Cat doin' just fine, thank you!

"We're about as independent as you can get, basically," begins Scruffy The Cat's founding frontman Charlie Chesterman. "A lot of people haven't even heard of the label, let alone us, and yet folks still manage to find our records." Prior to their latest release, *Moons Of Jupiter*, in Canada that would have been quite difficult as Relativity, their label stateside, has only recently signed a distribution deal with WEA.

In the U.S., the independent labels together, are regarded as "the seventh major" and Relativity, due to the immense success of guitarist Joe Satriani, has now sprung to the front of the pack. This turn of events has shed new light on Chesterman and the band, together since 1981, and their new album, released just before Christmas.

Produced by Jim Dickinson, who also produced the last *Replacements* album, this album "cost a lot more than we were supposed to spend," reports Chesterman. "But, in the long run, it was far cheaper than most are produced for these days." The present recording situation, where various production teams are dominating the upper echelon of the charts, is certainly making the lower end much more intense and competitive.

"This is actually the first time we've worked with somebody who we can say 'produced' our record," he continues. "Instead of in the other situations, for our other records, where the producer would say, 'Well, what do you think?' or 'Which way do you want to go?' Jim just took it and did it." Although the label has had some success at the college and alternative level, both mainstream radio and retail are only beginning to notice the album's potential, something that might not have happened, if they were signed to a major label.

The album is certainly their best to date,

yet Chesterman believes they would still be recording demos, if they were signed directly to a major. Capturing the moment, the energy and all of their creative impulses, was the Dickinson signature, he adds. "I think it's good enough to compete with anything that's on the radio right now, but I really don't care.

"The whole point of this is to enjoy myself to try to make music, which I think is going to be important to other people as well, and not because it got charted somehow or that it racked up some numbers on someone's statistical sheet. Sure, I would like to see it go someplace and be really successful and make us really successful, but at the same time, that's not my personal goal.

"But then that's just the nature of this industry. There's so much good stuff that people are never going to hear, ever. Because radio programming, for one reason or another," he comments, "shuts so much of it out. Ninety percent of everything that's released doesn't get played on the radio and yet that just makes room for college stations to play the weird shit, the punk rock, the industrial and even bands like us.


"It opens up cracks for other people to step in and do things . . . I mean, Tiffany, who cares? But if this were ten or fifteen years ago, I swear our record would be in the Top Ten. The industry's different now. But I also think if we spent too much time thinking about that, we'd drive ourselves insane. It's not for me to worry about anyway . . . it's up to the label.

"If the label wants to push it, try to get it up there, sell it and promote it, then let them, because that's what they're supposed to do, so they can make their money. For us, we were really happy to go to another city (Memphis), record with a really famous guy and come up with something that we think is

going to last, and being able to listen to it and not cringe."

So, for all bands there is obviously a different reason as to why they record. Naturally, it seems, all bands though come to a point in their careers to make sure they are indeed writing and recording for what they consider all the right reasons, as did Scruffy The Cat. Chesterman assures they made the right decision to remain on their charted path.

"We sat down recently and took stock of our lives as a band," he concludes, "We came to the realization that we've had it pretty good for the past couple of years. We've been able to travel, and tour, and make enough money to support ourselves. We've been able to put out three good records that have sold reasonably well; the last two actually getting quite a bit of airplay. So, we've gotten away with something quite tricky, working with a label that has been so supportive and been able to live a very casual and carefree existence."



Murray's gross ticket sales for her three Fox Theatre dates in St. Louis (Oct 21 & 23) came in at US\$244,672.00. She drew an audience of 11,689 for the three days, giving her a No. 19 on the list of 25. Total capacity for three shows at the Fox is listed at 12,894, a very healthy percentage.

Fox, who was teamed with WEA labelmate Travis, scored a No. 10 on the list with gross ticket sales of Can\$410,810.00 (US\$341,692.00), drawing a total attendance of 16,788 for two shows at Calgary's Olympic Saddledome (July 14). The two shows were presentations by CPI, DKD, Perryscope Concert Productions and Special Moments Promotions. Total capacity for two shows at the Saddledome is 22,954.

Murray is currently charting in Canada and the U.S. with her Capitol single, Slow Passin' Time, taken from her LP, As I Am. Fox, who recently scored chart action with his Long Distance single, is following this up with RBJ, both taken from his WEA self-titled debut LP.


