

Gosewich and McKnight head up Colbert Agency

Macmillan of Canada Publisher Linda McKnight and President Arnold Gosewich have concluded purchase arrangements with The Colbert Agency Inc. They will leave their posts to become the new owners and Managing Directors of what is described as

2 cent mechanical rate upgraded to 5.25 cents

The major record companies and major Canadian publishers signed an historic agreement (March 21, 1989), upgrading the 2 cent per track Mechanical Royalty to 5.25 per track. The signing is historic in that this is the first negotiated agreement, in Canada, between the publishers and record companies. Talks got underway between the two factions in 1982, but the intense negotiations began in June of last year.

The deal was signed by the Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency (CMRRA), representing the publishers, and the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA), which represents the major record companies.

There will be ongoing discussions regarding adding additional publishers and record companies to the agreement. The two-year deal is effective from June 8, 1988 to September 30, 1990.

status. Several key stations have moved Hangin' High And Dry and Can't Stop The Earth From Shakin' into heavy rotation, and One More Try, the current single from their LP, continues to bullet up the RPM 100 Singles chart.

The band recently played to what was described as "an overwhelming packed house" at Montreal's Club Soda, which was followed by several other dates in Quebec, including Sherbrooke, Levis, Alma and Rimouski. Their Maritime tour includes dates in Moncton (March 13), Saint John (14), Fredericton (15), Yarmouth (16), and Dartmouth (17-18). They begin the Western leg of their tour in April and are off to the U.K. for a series of dates in May.

Sherman to CRTC as Acting Chairman

The CRTC has appointed Louis R. (Bud) Sherman to be Acting Chairman of the CRTC, effective immediately, pursuant to provisions of the CRTC Act which allow the Commission to authorize one of the Vice-Chairmen to act as Chairman should the office of Chairman be vacant.

Sherman was appointed a full-time member of the CRTC in April of 1985, and Vice-Chairman (Telecommunications) in September of 1987. He is Chairman of the Tariff Committee, the standing committee on telecommunications matters of the Commission. In 1987-88 he chaired a Federal-Provincial-Territorial Task Force, commissioned by the Minister of Communications, which examined the subject of Long Distance Telephone Service Competition in Canada.

Sherman was a federal Member of Parliament from 1965 to 1968 where he served on the standing committees on Broadcasting and Transportation. In June of 1969, he began a 15-year career in the Manitoba Legislature, where he held various portfolios, including those of Minister of Health and Minister of Community Services and Corrections.

Born in Quebec City and raised in Western Canada, Sherman is a graduate of the University of Manitoba with a B.A. He has been involved in journalism, broadcasting and politics. In 1960, he was appointed Director of News and Public Affairs for CJAY-TV in Winnipeg.

Sherman replaces Andre Bureau, whose resignation became effective Feb. 28/89.

Columbia to release USSR's Grebenshikov LP

Columbia Records made a historic move with the signing of Soviet rock artist Boris Grebenshikov, whose initial LP release, Radio Silence, is scheduled for early spring release. Performed primarily in English (with certain songs in Russian), the LP was produced by David A. Stewart (Eurythmics), at various recording studios in Montreal, London, New York and Los Angeles. Featured on the LP are members of Aquarium, Grebenshikov's band, along with Stewart, Annie Lennox, Chrissie Hynde (Pretenders), Siobhan Stewart (ex-Bananarama), and Ray Cooper.

Rather than translate material from his native Russian, Grebenshikov wrote songs directly in English, which he did during and after several trips to the U.S. over the last year. He made these trips in order to familiarize himself with the country where his rock 'n' roll originated. Interestingly enough,

form a new Canadian publishing company and manage the newly-named distribution company for Harper and Collins books in Canada."

In addition to overseeing sales and marketing strategies at Macmillan, he spurred development of the publisher's paperback imprint and enlarged the company's subsidiary rights activities, with special emphasis on television and film sales.

As President of Capitol Records-EMI Canada, and Chairman of CBS Records Canada, from 1970-1981, Gosewich helped launch the careers of such artists as Anne Murray, Liona Boyd and Loverboy, and was active in the recognition of Canadian recording artists through CARAS and the Juno Awards.

McKnight, currently Executive Vice President as well as Publisher at Macmillan, and formerly President of McClelland & Stewart, has been in Canadian publishing for more than twenty years, and has worked closely with a broad range of authors, publishers and agents, both in Canada and abroad. Included are such authors as Margaret Laurence, Pierre Berton, Margaret Atwood, Peter Newman, Robertson Davies, Farley Mowat, Neil Bissoondath, George Jonas and Eddie Greenspan, and Scott Young, to name just a few.

Information with regard to the financial arrangements in the ownership transfer is not available. However, the new partners confirmed that the full agency staff, which has been operating the business in the four weeks since the Colberts removed themselves from day-to-day activity, remains intact. The agency will shortly relocate its offices and subsequently undergo a name change.

these trips marked the first time an "unofficial" Soviet musician, without sanction by or obligation to the state, was allowed to visit the West. Grebenshikov is regarded in the USSR as the poet laureate of his generation, and is credited with having been the guiding force in Soviet rock for the last ten years. When Aquarium's first official album for the state-run Melodiya label was finally released, the first 200,000 copies reportedly sold out within hours. To date, Aquarium's three albums have sold a total of more than 3 million copies.

Airey reaches new heights with release of K2 LP

As a keyboard player with the Ozzy Osbourne band, Blizzard Of Ozz, Don Airey was responsible for the ominous sounding background chords for rock anthems like *Over The Mountain*. Unbeknownst to Airey, at the time, that particular song title foreshadowed his latest work, titled *K2: Tales Of Triumph And Tragedy* (see review RPM March 20-25/89).

K2 is the name of a mountain located in the Karakoram range, approximately 300 miles east of Afghanistan. Strangely enough, it's the only peak out of 21 in the range to retain its numerical designation. Its namesake is the recently released MCA

Jeff Healey Band wins Holland's Edison Award

The Jeff Healey Band, although unsuccessful in this year's Juno Awards, discovered their popularity on the international market had reaped success. Just prior to the Juno Awards, they were advised they had won a Dutch Edison Award in the category of Best Rock Of Foreign Origin. The Edisons are Holland's equivalent to the Junos.

Following is the translation of the jury's award announcement: "The irony of the album title - Jeff Healey became blind at the age of one - cannot conceal that Healey's unique guitar style and searing voice bear witness to his insights in the way blues and rock and roll should be played. With this debut album, Jeff Healey follows in the tracks of great people in the history of rock, like Jimi Hendrix and Eric Clapton. The compositions and choice of covers (ZZ Top and John Hiatt) show a lot of experience, which makes the record a masterpiece."

Healey and his band were unable to attend the Holland award show as they were touring the U.S., a tour they interrupted to perform on the Junos. They were also seen performing two songs on the Arsenio Hall Show, which was televised on March 15.

Judges rap knuckles of CRIA's Fox

A 2-1 ruling (Mar. 16/89) by the Ontario Court of Appeal reversed the decision of a lower court that had ruled charges of copyright infringement were improperly laid against London disc jockey, Wilfred Roch and his company, Miles of Music Ltd. There were 42 counts of violating the provisions of the Copyright Act laid against Roch and his company. The trial judge had concluded that there had been an abuse of process, which was sustained in the Supreme Court of Ontario.

However, in granting the appeal, all three judges expressed criticism of the behavior of CRIA's Director of Investigation, Pat Fox. Mr. Justice Duncan Blair criticised Fox for misleading the police during the investigation, and also for leading Roch to believe the CRIA would consider his request to be licensed to produce material for disc jockeys. "It was Fox's purpose to intimidate Canadian disc jockeys by the example made of Roch and, as a result, to enforce compliance with the planned licensing system," the judge wrote, concluding that Roch had been unfairly treated and abused.

Roch's company, which went out of business shortly after a raid by the RCMP, was apparently one of several producing compilation tapes for use by disc jockeys.

McLachlan's Touch LP dressed up for U.S. date

The Vancouver-based Nettwerk Productions and Capitol Records have re-released the Sarah McLachlan *Touch LP*, cassette and CD. As Nettwerk's President, Terry McBride, points out, the re-release is "in response to the upcoming U.S. release", (Mar. 30) by Arista Records/BMG.

The re-release features a remix of *Vox*, a new track of *Trust*, the extended mix of *Vox* (on cassette and CD), new full colour packaging, inner sleeve with lyrics and graphics, plus a long box for the CD.

Canadian sales for the release have topped the 15,000 mark, 12,000 of them in the last seven weeks.

Almost a year ago, Blue Rodeo were scooping up their Big Country Awards one after the other, bestowed upon them by RPM's readership, and thanking the industry for their kind votes, support and belief in their debut LP, *Outskirts*. Relatively speaking, it took a long time for sales of the album to surpass double platinum, primarily on the strength of their Try single, although initially, all sectors of the Canadian music industry were uniform in their aversion to the band's unique sound, except country programmers.

"When the first record came out, it was pretty dismal for a while," concurs Greg Keelor. However, their new album, *Diamond Mine*, will certainly be welcomed with open arms across the country, especially in the wake of last week's Juno Awards and their performance with Robbie Robertson and The Band. In spite of the accolades, countless awards and a seemingly endless tour (over 250 dates last year), Blue Rodeo still managed

Bennett: folk music great in concert at Free Times

Toronto's Free Times Cafe will be the setting for a series of live concerts by Canadian folk music legend, Willie P. Bennett. He will be appearing with one-piece accompaniment (guitar and harmonica) for three evenings, March 30 through April 1 and will be performing both new and previously released material.

Bennett, who has released three albums and one limited edition cassette, has been performing since 1972. His compositions have been recorded by such artists as Colleen Peterson, Sneezey Waters, Peter Pringle and Garnet Rogers, among others.

Bennett's last release was in 1985, and since then he has written new material which will comprise his new release set for later this year.

3" CD Dance Classics available through Power

Power Records has made available the first in their series of 3" CD Dance Classics, with releases from Eria Fachin, Man 2 Man and Phyllis Nelson.

The Fachin CD contains Savin' Myself (blaster mix), her 1987 door-opener to international recognition, along with her follow-up, *Your Love Just Came Too Late*, both the blaster mix and radio edit.

With the Man 2 Man release, these U.K. dance leaders teamed with Man Parrish, resulting in what is considered a "dance classic" of *Male Stripper* (dance mix). The 12" single sales for *Stripper* makes this record one of the strongest titles in Powers' Dance catalogue. The CD single also contains the *Energy Is Eurobeat* track.

The Nelson 3" CD contains *Don't Stop The Rain*, *Tapps*, *Runaway* (original version), *Crystal In The Pink* and *Back To You* (original mix).

Power is distributed by Electric Distribution.

to record their new album, at an old, unused cinema in Toronto's east end, all in the space of three weeks.

"We really didn't have time to actually go into a studio and start writing," Keelor continues, "We had lots of stuff kicking around anyway." So, together with producer Malcolm Burn, they set up their equipment in the Donlands Theatre, banged out nearly two dozen songs, and recorded them with Comfort Sound's mobile studio parked in the back alley. "It's not on the same scale as U2 renting a castle and moving in," he adds, "but it's close and comfortable.

"When we first went in to do it, we all thought 'Three weeks to do a record, can we pull it off?' But it was such a comfortable way to record. We could just set up our stuff and leave it there. We didn't have to worry about somebody coming in to do a jingle or anything like that. We're still not at the point where we can block book a studio for three weeks . . . it's too expensive. But this place, it was just a dump, and cheap. It was a nice way to record."

The interesting correlation that the music industry has to take into consideration these days, especially the Canadian "movers and shakers", is just how much money a band spends recording their new album,

PROCAN sets deadlines for composer awards

PROCAN, the performing rights organization, which licences, for performances, the music of 23,000 Canadian composers, lyricists and music publishers, has set April deadlines for two sponsored composing competitions. As encouragement for the creation of new works, PROCAN awards \$14,000 annually in the competitions.

A \$2,000 prize is awarded to a composer for a work that is suitable for big-band jazz ensemble. The deadline for this competition is April 15.

In the Young Composers Competition, \$12,000 is the prize for composers under 30 years of age for works composed for orchestra; solo instrument or chamber ensemble; voice(s); electronic and computer music. An April 30th deadline has been set.

Proulx and Manx launch Cesspool Of Lust Music

Toronto musicians Ron Proulx and Kathryn Manx, the principal songwriters of *Picture Comes To Life*, have launched a new record/publishing company flying the banner of *Cesspool Of Lust Music/Records*. Electric Distribution will distribute.

Initial release will be a nine-song LP by *Picture Comes To Life*. *Cross My Heart*, the first single from the album, is also being readied for release along with an accompanying video.

which includes the preparation of adequate demos and pre-production time, and how many units are subsequently sold by their record companies domestically. Due to the quality of equipment available today, as well as the competition among the studios, recording takes less time and hence costs less. However, production still remains an overblown factor that bands are really starting to take to heart, as they should. It's their money after all.

Consider a few current examples: prior to their deal with RCA, the Cowboy Junkies' independent release of *The Trinity Session* has probably outsold the majority released by the majors; as has the under-budget, and now gold, album by *The Pursuit Of Happiness*, in the wake of their successful indie single, *I'm An Adult Now*; and, of course, the *Risque Disque Blue Rodeo* debut, that simply puts to shame many highly touted records the Canadian taxpayer has had to foot the bill for over the past few years.

"We're not particularly comfortable in a studio," Keelor continues. "It's not really our forte, as we're not technicians in any sense. Although you do learn every time you do a recording, and you learn to speak up for what you want, and not to be intimidated by the technicians.

"The way Malcolm (Burn) worked (with friends of Keelor's in a band called *Crash Vegas*) and the way he approached sound was very much the same way that Blue Rodeo had always talked about sound. So, we did a demo in the room where we make our videos. We'd just plug in our monitors and start playing, and it was great, and everyone really liked Malcolm. We decided to do the record the same way and it turned out to be a very pleasant collaboration.

"It's not live sounding, like raucous rock and roll, but it's live in that you get a visual image of a bunch of musicians just playing in a room when you hear it," he concludes. *Raucous rock and roll indeed!* In fact, Keelor picked out four tracks that he hoped country programmers would be playing in forthcoming months. Among his choices for country hits are *Girl Of Mine*, *Fall In Love*, *House Of Dreams and Now And Forever*. But before they embark on their next cross-country tour, the record should also be released in the U.S. and Europe, and *Diamond Mine* will be an international hit anyway.

Lulu's celebrates 5th year with collector album

To commemorate its fifth year of operation, Lulu's Roadhouse, a major North American rock, pop and country showplace, will release the first edition of Lulu's Collector Album. The album will supply an illustrated account of five years of Lulu's history, and will be distributed at Lulu's and throughout the Kitchener-Waterloo area. It's expected the album will reach well over half a million local, national and international patrons per year. The first edition will run a minimum of two years.

Lulu's is Canada largest Roadhouse and vies, in size, for any similar club in North America, boasting the largest and the second largest bars in the world.

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




