



A&A files for bankruptcy in attempt to restructure

Sound Insight Limited, owner and operator of the A&A Records and Tapes chain and wholly-owned subsidiary of Sound Insight Enterprises Limited, has filed for bankruptcy under the Bankruptcy Act.

The decision by Sound Insight Ltd. to do so stems from the company's inability to support the "aggressive expansion program" it undertook in 1989, when, during the following two-year period the chain opened close to 100 stores, bringing A&A's national total to 259.

Garth Mitchell, President and CEO of both Sound Insight Enterprises Limited and Sound Insight Limited said that with the retail climate being in fair shape at best, the "current economic environment has critically impacted the A&A chain's operations," but he adds emphatically that the sole purpose of filing for bankruptcy is to enable the company to "restructure, become financially stable, come out of the bankruptcy and be able to function in that restructured form."

Mitchell notes that Canadian laws make it difficult when a business runs into difficulties because there are no provisions to restructure

International release for PolyGram's Medley debut

Sue Medley's self-titled debut album has received much praise since its release last May, including Best Debut Recording and Female Vocalist Of The Year at Canada's West Coast Music Awards, and gained her the opportunity to open for Bob Dylan on the Canadian leg of his international tour. Now PolyGram is hoping that the enthusiasm will run over into three new territories, the U.S., U.K. and Germany.

The interest that she has generated has left Medley breathless and very busy: "I was excited by the whole thing when the album was released," she says. "But I didn't think that people would respond to us as strongly as they have." And of her tour with Dylan she states that the experience was the "highlight of the year."

The first single has already been released in the U.S., U.K. and Germany, and in Canada we can expect a fourth single from the album, *Maybe The Next Time*. Of her career, Medley says she is going for longevity rather than one-hit wonders: "My goal is really to start building an audience that will be with me for the next ten years."

At this point, Sound Insight Limited is preparing a proposal to present to creditors regarding outstanding debts, and if it is accepted, the company can come out of the bankruptcy.

The proposal must fulfil three primary requirements: the closure of certain stores that have proven to be unprofitable, the deferral or conversion of the existing shareholder debt of over \$9 million, and an "injection of new capital."

Mitchell says this new capital is expected to come from one of a "series of interested investors who are currently quantifying their positions" with regard to the company. He estimates that they will have a proposal ready

Previous to that he was Executive Vice President of Marketing and Sales at PolyGram U.S. During his extensive career in the music industry, Jamieson also worked for a time at CBS, with whom he took up posts in Australia and Europe.

Gassner said of the appointment that he is "extremely pleased that Bob has decided to join BMG by taking the helm of the Canadian operations. His global experience in the industry makes him most suitable for the job, and he also brings a very welcome quality to BMG internationally."

And Jamieson states that he is "excited about the challenges and opportunities ahead working for BMG in Canada. I sense a real commitment and dedication to excellence in the local staff and look forward to working with everyone worldwide to help break more local and international artists in Canada."

CRIA begins to make video sales certifications

With the growing impact of video sales on the industry, CRIA has recently released the first ever certifications for long form video sales, and they reflect sales from the year ending December 31, 1990.

The criteria for video certifications are different from those of audio configurations. To make Gold, a video must sell 5,000 units or be in excess of \$150,000 in sales value. Platinum is 10,000 units or \$300,000. From there on in multiple platinum certs are \$300,000 higher than the last in sales value and 10,000 higher in units sold. Diamond requires 100,000 units to be sold or \$3 million in sales value.

"We are not doing this to shut down," says Mitchell. "We are trying to get rid of those components that have made the company unhealthy. It would be a very good business if it was a little smaller than it is, and that is the purpose of (this action). I am confident that the restructured company will remain Canada's largest retailer of pre-recorded music."

Two O'Keefe shows added to Rita MacNeil dates

Toronto promoter B.C. Fiedler has added an extra two shows for Rita MacNeil's Toronto O'Keefe Centre stint. Three performances were originally planned for: March 14, 15 and 16, but Fiedler said they sold "the fastest of any show I've promoted in the last 20 years."

The additional shows are slotted for Tuesday, March 12, and Sunday, March 17. Tickets are available at the O'Keefe Centre box office and Ticketmaster outlets. Some seats are available for the original dates as well.

MacNeil's latest album, *Home I'll Be*, is rounding the corner to five times platinum, making it one of the fastest-selling albums in Canada.

Aside from attaining outstanding success on the home front, MacNeil has also done extremely well in other territories. In Australia, her album *Reason To Believe* figured on the top 100 for 1990 alongside the likes of U2 and Bruce Springsteen.

Gold certifications go out to Ozzy Osbourne's *Wicked* video, *The Cult* for *Electric Love*, Bon Jovi's *New Jersey*, *Cinderella's* *Night Songs*, Def Leppard's *In The Round*, *In Your Face*, Andrew Lloyd Webber for his *Video Quartet*, *The Who* for *Who's Better*, *Who's The Best*, Paula Abdul's *Straight Up*, *The Doors Live* video and *Dance On Fire* and Milli Vanilli's *In Motion*.

Getting radio airplay in a saturated music market

One thing that could make or break a new artist is getting radio airplay. Traditionally, product is serviced to radio by record companies, but over the last two years the newest trend has been the CD compilation. This system allows an artist to purchase a spot on a compilation CD without having to put out a complete album, and they can feel around for interest through minimal expenditure. Companies that make CD comps also track the song for a specific time and pitch it to relevant radio stations, and the system has become a popular one.

Unfortunately, as the number of CD compilations has grown, the likelihood of Programme Directors taking the time to sift through the multitude of CD comps they get to find a particular track is getting slimmer and slimmer. The ever-increasing influx of CD comps has made it necessary for it to have a well-known name attached to it, a lot of promotion and perhaps a small miracle.

Q107, Toronto's leading AOR station's Music Director, Joey Vendetta, says that it would be pretty unlikely for him to put a track from a CD comp into any kind of rotation. "I generally give precedence to music that is already on a label," he states, adding that if the track is not available to the consumer he sees little point in playing a CD comp song except on a feature programme.

Frankie D. is a solo artist from Toronto and decided on another route to gain airplay. Although he has an album ready to go on his and partner Mike Cecere's own label, Stallion Records, they decided to put out CD singles, an unconventional and expensive method.

"Our main goal right now is to get airplay, and we think doing the CD single is the best way. If we get a good response from the first, second and possibly third single, then we will put the album out." Explains Cecere.

This strategy enables Frankie D. to retain optimum control over his project. "We did look for a deal at one point," he says. "But we never felt the companies were willing to give us the 100 percent that we wanted." Frankie D. also notes that if and when enough action happens

on the songs, they will have better bidding power when it comes time to get distribution.

Currently, Frankie D.'s first single, I Wanna Go To Heaven, is getting good response from radio stations nationwide. Many have proposed a feature for the song, and some secondary market stations have added the song to their playlist. It's a positive start, and enough enthusiasm has been shown to convince Frankie D. that he chose an effective method.

Another band, Two Thirds Water, won a spot on Toronto alternative station CFNY's Modern Music CD compilation. Because the radio station will give air time to the winners, endorsing them as artist worthy of attention, this is a productive means to gain exposure.

Since the compilation came out, Two Thirds Water has generated a lot of interest, and

Annihilator create buzz on European Priest tour

Canadian band Annihilator has been creating quite the stir in Europe, where they were picked out of dozens of bands to be the opening act on the Judas Priest tour, which includes 45 dates throughout Europe and Britain. Annihilator will also be doing their own headline dates in Athens and at the Marquis Club in London.

Having sold a total of 350,000 units with their two albums, Alice In Hell and their current release, Never Neverland, Annihilator have established themselves as world class metal rockers, and have generated a lot of interest throughout North America, Japan and now Europe.

In response to suggestions that tour should be cancelled or pared down because of the Gulf War, Annihilator stated simply that "the show must go on!"

These are only two methods to get all-important airplay for music. The common thread is imagination and perseverance. When asked what it would take to get a station to at least listen to a tune by an unsigned artist, one Music Director put it this way: "If the artist called me a lot and hassled me about it, I'd give it a listen."



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Children's Group/Hammond take Classical Kids gold

A&M distributed label, The Children's Group, has just put two of its releases past the 50,000 units sold mark, an accomplishment label President Glen Sernyk feels "would indicate we're doing something right!"

Beethoven Lives Upstairs, winner of the 1989 Juno Award for best children's recording, and Mr. Bach Comes To Call are the two initial albums of the Classical Kids series by musician Susan Hammond which have gone gold in Canada. The third release, Mozart's Magic Fantasy, is already shipping in high numbers, and has been on release in the U.S. since the end of January.

Hammond, a pianist and music teacher, has long wanted to take on a project that would make classical music listener-friendly to youngsters.

"I knew that I could excite kids about classical music," said Hammond, recently back from a North American promo tour for the series. "It's not the music that's boring, but the way it's presented."

Hammond also cites children's love of storytelling as inspiration for the albums, which combine classical pieces of music, narration and colourful sound effects. The project has proved to be appealing not only to the initial target audience of 6-10 year-olds, but also to younger children and especially educators, who use the recordings to teach music history to young people even at high school level.

Hammond hooked up with The Children's Group close to its inception under a year ago, and is excited at the enthusiasm the project is generating.

Label-owner and President, Sernyk is no newcomer to the genre. During his university days he met Canadian children's entertainer, Raffi, and became his manager. He also helped create Troubador Records, the label that carries

True North reactivates with new Toronto signing

True North Records, the label which carries Bruce Cockburn and which is owned by manager Bernie Finkelstein, will be releasing the debut album by Gregory Hoskins and The Stickpeople later this month. The release marks the first signing by the label in five years.

Jehanne Languedoc, True North's Director of Promotion/Publicity as well as Director of the label's publishing arm, said that "it was decided that we would begin signing new acts again, and we are also looking into licensing foreign product for Canada." In the fall of 1990, the label secured a licensing agreement with Sony Music, who will look after all the manufacturing and distribution responsibilities.

Produced by Jon Goldsmith of Bruce Cockburn and Jane Siberry fame, Gregory Hoskins and The Stickpeople's album is entitled Moon Come Up and is set for release on February 25. The lead single, The Neighbourhood, is being serviced to radio on the 14th.

True North has been a staple of the Canadian music scene since 1981 and in the past has released such artists as Rough Trade, Murray McLachlan and Johnny MacLeod.

Raffi product. Sernyk's association with Raffi lasted for ten years until 1988, during which time he also managed Fred Penner of Oak Street Music for five years.

Sernyk is a firm believer in the children's genre, especially in Canada. "The children's product here continues to be the best in the world," he asserts, but he does feel that the industry could use some education in the field.

"It is an area which by and large many retailers don't know much about. Children's product sells for reasons which are not quite evident. For a pop album you can tell the retailer that the video's on rotation at MuchMusic, or that it's such and such a number on the charts. With children's product you might say that Peter Gzowski loved it on Morningside. Now to our audience that is very important, but to the retailer you might be speaking a different language."

Sernyk says that having A&M as distributor is a major plus, and helps overcome these hurdles because "A&M is the dominant distributor in children's product" and so has a solid understanding of how to go about treating the product.

Along with Hammond and her Classical Kids series, The Children's Group's roster boasts the talents of Torontonian Jack Grunsky, and American Red Grammar among others.

Currently Red Grammar and Classical Kids are the two acts that are being distributed through BMG in the U.S., and other artists are getting exposure through the Children's Bookstore Distribution, an independent distributor run by Michelle Henderson which specializes in getting product to relevant bookstores and other institutions.

Although he doesn't feel he can describe an exact recipe for signing acts, Sernyk does know what he's looking for from new artists. "Children have a right to culture," he explains, expressing concern for the fact that children's

December CRIA stats slightly disappointing

The Canadian Recording Industry Association statistics for December show that whereas the decline in vinyl LPs, 7 inch single and 12 inch/cassette singles has slowed dramatically, CDs and cassettes declined in sales and shipments for the month and year-to-date figures.

The steady of the vinyl configurations and singles is due to the phase-out of these at the manufacturing level. As less product is shipped to the marketplace, the decline in sales will reduce as well.

Overall, year-to-date numbers for shipments remained the same from last month with a nine percent decrease, but they dropped into the red for the month from a one percent increase to a seventeen percent decrease in shipments. For monthly sales there was a ten percent drop to a four percent increase, with the year-to-date number staying constant with a less than one percent gain.

Individually, the cassette fell from a nine percent decrease in November shipments to a 20 percent decrease this month, and the CD dropped from a 59 to a 20 percent increase in

Banham joins MCA after a three and a half year stint with Warner Music, where most recently he worked in the promotions/marketing division.

Of his new appointment Banham says it is "very exciting" and notes that he has long wanted to be involved in the marketing aspect of the business, especially Black Urban Dance. Banham will move to MCA on February 11.

Shipments. Sales for the CD and cassette are also far from impressive this month, with cassettes staying at a six percent decrease and CDs dropping to a 32 percent gain from November's 56 percent increase.

Two on-going trends that are causing concern among the industry is the decline in shipments overall and the fact that the CD is the only configuration flourishing. Brian Robertson, President of CRIA, says that "it would not be healthy for the industry to depend on a single configuration" to thrive.

The stats are a bit of a disappointment for the industry, there was hope that the market would bounce back from the summer and fall slump, but Robertson states that one encouraging factor is the actual dollar figures: "it is remarkable that we have maintained our 1989 sales figures considering the health of the economy, especially when most other retail areas have shown a drop."

These figures cannot be expected to improve for the next month or so as the industry enters the slow post-holiday period.

World On Edge take it slow and steady in the fast lane

Emerging from Montreal, World On Edge is a band that have entered the untraditional business of making music in a very traditional way. A steadfast professional approach has always been a primary component to the band, who after following different possibilities were signed to Virgin under a year ago. Now the band is watching the follow-up single to their successful Still Beating climb the charts.

Consisting of guitarist Peter Hopkins, keyboardist Jon Daniels, Steph Thompson on bass and lead vocalist Rob Meyer, World On Edge boasts a very sophisticated sound, one which Hopkins attributes to the group's hard work and determination.

The idea for World On Edge was conceived by Peter Hopkins, guitarist for the group over five years ago. Eventually, Hopkins met up with Jon Daniels at an audition and they began pursuing their ambitions together. All World On Edge members joined the band by auditioning, and through a "process of elimination" it arrived at its current lineup.

"Like any other band, members came and went until we found people that were dedicated to the music." Explains Hopkins.

Eria Fachin shopping for a new record deal

Eria Fachin, the singer who made the Vincent DeGiorgio song Savin' Myself a hit in 1988, is currently looking for a new record deal.

Fachin recorded Savin' Myself in 1986 on DiGiorgio's Power Records label, and it quickly became a club hit in Canada. Soon the song made it's way to the U.K. where it stayed at No. 1 on the dance charts for 14 weeks and by 1988 it had rebounded to North America where it gained tremendous airplay and peaked at number 50 on the Billboard Hot Singles chart.

After Savin' Myself did so well, Fachin was signed by American label Critique and recorded her debut album, My Name Is Eria Fachin.

"We were just lucky that we had a lot of material ready to go," remembers Fachin, who says the recording was completed in only thirty days. The process was a whirlwind one, but at the time it was crucial to get the album out while Savin' Myself was still fresh.

The album also spawned two other hits, I Hear A Symphony, a classic remake of the Supreme's hit and Your Love Just Came To Late.

Currently, Fachin and husband/manager and songwriting partner, Louis Bartolomucci have been steadily writing more tunes. "We have more than enough material for an album," says Fachin. "Our stuff isn't rap, but it's very funky, and it's a challenge vocally."

In the interim between writing and shopping for a deal, Fachin has a busy performing career with an eight piece band. Often she goes down to the States for track dates, where Savin' Myself is still well remembered.

"We're moving carefully," says Fachin, who's steady determination should bring more success in the near future.

has been clearly mapped-out; once the lineup was in place they quit their day jobs and began rehearsing and writing up to twelve hours a day four to five days a week. "We got a lot of encouragement to keep at it," says Hopkins. "We all knew that this is what we wanted, so we worked very hard." The band also decided against doing any club dates, feeling that it was more important to concentrate on their own sound, as opposed to becoming proficient "at doing other people's songs."

With the attitude and the philosophy established, World On Edge put a demo together and literally sent it all over the world. "The most interest we got was from CBS Switzerland," recalls Hopkins, so the band picked up and moved to Europe where they pursued the lead. During their travels they met Christian Schudde, publisher and songwriter who had written Still Beating (the band's first single) and was looking for the right band to perform it. They soon recorded the song started shopping it. The relationship with Shudde, meanwhile, developed into a songwriting one, and he was a large contributor to the debut album.

The deal with CBS Switzerland never panned out, and gradually it became clear that the politics for a European label to sign a Canadian band were unsurmountable, and the foresome returned to Canada with a complete demo album and started shopping on the home front, and they were signed by Virgin.

Produced by the band and Mike Jones, the album is very close to the original demo. Hopkins states that Jones was "very impressed" with the demo, and used it as a fundamental guideline for the recording.

In mid-January the album was released in the U.S. on Charisma and in the spring, World On Edge will be taking to the road for the first time ever, something they are very anxious to do.

As to what they hope the future has in store for them, Hopkins says that after coming this far, there is no rush.

"We're doing what we love to do most, and we're going to take it one step at a time."

Carol Medina to appear at Yugoslavian event

Marigold A/C artist Carol Medina has been invited to be the representing Canadian guest at this year's The Golden Palm concert in Dubrovnik, Yugoslavia. The show is a much publicized event in that country, attracting all the top recording acts, and will take place February 8 and 9 with live television coverage.

Medina will perform her current release, So Good For You and the Pretty Poison tune Catch Me I'm Falling as well as two Croatian songs that she wrote herself.

Medina, whose ancestry is Yugoslavian, was invited to attend the event after a representative of The Golden Palm saw her perform one of her songs at a Croatian songwriting contest in 1988, where she was awarded Best Female Vocalist.

Earl Jive will also retain his DJ duties, appearing weekday mornings.

Kitchener's CFCA-FM and AM 109's hearts are going out to people who are finding the new Goods And Services tax a little hard to handle. To soften the extra financial blow, the stations are inviting listeners to send in bills showing the GST, and daily draws will be made where lucky winners will have the amount of GST shown on their bill repaid to them. If listeners happen to be listening at the time their name is chosen and they call in in the allotted time, the amount will be doubled! How's that for value?

Justin's Blackpool up for five East Coast Awards

Although the band's debut release isn't due until late February, Halifax band Blackpool, signed to Justin Entertainment, has already received five nomination for the Canadian East Coast Music Awards.

The ones that Blackpool is in the running for are Song Of The Year, Album Of The Year, Recording Band Of The Year, Pop/Rock Artist Of The Year and Live Artist Of The Year. The nominations are due in great part to the fact that their debut album, *We The Living*, was released independently in Halifax. Producer Terry Brown heard the band at the music industry seminar, and offered his services to act as producer for the album. Once the album was complete, the band continued shopping for a deal and signed with Justin in December, 1990.

The band is comprised of four men, and their sound is described as being reminiscent of The Band and CCR. Already they have established themselves as solid performing acts, opening for the likes of Blue Rodeo and Billy Bragg. The first single from *We The Living* is *Days And Days*, and it will be released as of February 4th.

Who will challenge? Madonna continues to lead the way on the Albums chart and, for the fourth straight week, the Top five albums all remain in the same position. You have to go back eight weeks to find a different album in the Top five. Sting appears ready to crack that trend though. The Soul Cages leaps to No. 10 in just its second week.

Jackson joins elite club. Janet Jackson's *Love Will Never Do (Without You)* becomes her second No. 1 hit. It brings the total of female solo artists who've had multiple No. 1 hits to 17. Madonna heads the list with 12 chart toppers. Only three others have had more than three No. 1's (not including duets). Can you name them?

Another first! Janet Jackson also makes news this week because *Love Will Never Do* is the first song to hit No. 1 without ever being released as a single in Canada. Just last year, a few artists hit No. 2 without releasing a single here, but Jackson becomes the first to go all the way to the top. It has also helped the album *Rhythm Nation - 1814*. It climbs 10 spots to No. 62. That is its highest point in 19 weeks. *Rhythm Nation* has also been on the chart 68 weeks, that's longer than another other album on the chart.

Collins top add . . . After four No. 1 songs last year, Phil Collins' failed to make it five in a row when *Hang In Long Enough* peaked at No. 9 two weeks ago. This week, he has the top add with *Who Said I Would*, taken off the *Serious Hits . . . Live* album.

Controversial Concrete. *Concrete Blonde's Tomorrow Wendy* enters the Hit Tracks chart at No. 93. It's controversial lyrical content has made CHR stations shy away from it, but AOR and Alternative stations are letting freedom of expression rule. Even *Much Music*, which has been known to ban videos in the past, is playing it in medium rotation.

Other notable entries . . . The Knack returns to the chart almost a dozen years since they first hit No. 1. *Rocket O' Love* debuts at No. 88. Acosta-Russell is getting a good reception by radio. *Never Gonna Change My Mind* enters at No. 84. Ex-Bangle Susanna Hoffs' solo career is off the ground. Her first release, *My Side Of The Bed*, debuts at No. 77.

It took a while! It took David Lynch to give it a boost, but Chris Isaak's music is finally catching on. *Wicked Game* climbs into the Top 10 on the Hit Tracks chart, while *Heart Shaped World* hits the Top 20 on the Albums chart.

Top female solo acts! After Madonna, the next three women with the most No. 1 hits in a solo career are: Olivia Newton-John (6), Anne Murray (5), and Donna Summer (4). Whitney Houston will probably soon be passing a few of those people. *All The Man That I Need* this week becomes the singers 12th Top 10 hit in a row, although only three have made it to No. 1.

BOOKS

THE OTHER SIDE OF LENNON - Sandra Shevey - McLelland & Stewart Inc. - \$29.95. McLelland & Stewart Publishers have recently put out a most interesting, if slightly unsettling account of John Lennon's life. Written by Sandra Shevey, the book is entitled *The*



Other Side Of Lennon, and serves to uncover the myth of the "greatest rock star" in the world.

In the first paragraph of Chapter 1, Shevey writes that Lennon was "ashamed of his contributions to the greatest rock band in the world." For those of us who have nurtured the godliness of John Lennon over the years, this is rather like a kick in the face, as it was for me. From then on I read with scepticism, words that seemed malicious and bitter, perhaps written by an obsessed "groupie" who was suffering from a bout of unrequited love. Tales of Lennon's depraved stage antics and coarse attitudes came as a surprise, but I considered them to be wildly exaggerated.

As the book progresses, however, Shevey

does succeed in gently turning things around to her favour. Because Shevey avoids any politeness from the very beginning and simply states the truth as she sees it, the first few chapters do seem over-zealous. But the tone of the book is evened out and it becomes clear that the point of view is a legitimate one.

The writing is cutting and this is a good feature, Shevey is not apologetic about telling the other side of things. But at times she does tend to get a little gleeful when there is undeniable proof that her facts about a certain Lennon atrocity are straight.

The book is filled with a plethora of quotes, and although they are a main hook in the books appeal they do not always validate facts with the authority they are intended to, rendering some to be heresy.

It is undeniable that *The Other Side Of Lennon* is a very meaty read. There are no elements of tabloid researching methods, Shevey is complete and covers all the bases, effectively tracing Lennon's career from start to finish. Although the it serves to uncover different truths about Lennon than the media traditionally presents regarding the artist, *The Other Side* does not paint a negative picture, but performs the necessary task of establishing Lennon as an ordinary working class man who happened to be a part of the greatest phenomenon in the history of the music industry. Lennon's talent as a songwriter and musician is addressed in the book, but is something no one can put a scale to. For the most part, Shevey provides the reader with facts with which to make their own conclusions.

The information about the climb of the Beatles, Lennon's reaction to it, their relationship with Brian Epstein and their record deals is all fascinating. *The Other Side Of Lennon* will be highly entertaining for Lennon fans and others, it is a revealing look into the life of a historical personality and an insight into a figure that we have epitomized to obsession in every way possible. - AM

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
