Mosport's Hudes and Notzel not Woodstock II partners

An article in the Jan. 16, 1993 issue of RPM revealed that Barrie, Ont. promoter Peter Barrowcliffe, president of Woodstock Entertainment '93, had plans for a "super concert" to be staged at Mosport Park, which is just east of Toronto.

Under the heading "Mosport to be setting for Woodstock II Festival," Barrowcliffe indicated that he had ongoing talks with all levels of government: federal, provincial and municipal. He also named Harvey M. Hudes and Peter Notzel of Mosport Limited as being partners in his project.

CARAS announces new category for '94 Junos

The Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS) will have a new award category for the 1994 Junos: Music Of Aboriginal Canada.

The new category will embrace all forms of aboriginal music -- traditional, contemporary and fusion. A national advisory committee, headed by Elaine Bomberry of All Nations Talent Group, will be working over the next few months to finalize criteria for the category. A national jury, selected by the advisory committee, will vote for the eventual winner in two rounds of voting.

"We are very excited about this new category," says CARAS president Dave Charles. "It will spotlight music that has been out there for a long, long time and deserves recognition.

"We are one of the first national awards systems in the world (Australia, with its 'Indigenous Award' category, is the only other country) to recognize aboriginal music and we are proud to be in the vanguard in preserving and encouraging this important music form."

Canada's Jane Bunnett to play NYC's Sweet Basil

New York City's Sweet Basil, a Bleeker St. jazz club, is the setting for a Feb. 16-21 engagement by Canadian saxophonist Jane Bunnett and her post-bop quintet.

Bunnett's quintet comprises Larry Cramer on trumpet, pianist D.D. Jackson, bassist Kieran Overs and Cindy Blackman on drums.

Bunnett began her musical career as a classical pianist. She credits a performance by Charles Mingus as "the inspiration" for her becoming a jazz flautist. However, after hearing Steve Lacy, she decided the soprano saxophone also had potential. She has since received a fellowship to study with Lacy and soprano saxophone is now her primary instrument.

Bunnett made her recording debut in 1988 with *In Dew Time* (Dark Light Music). The album featured Don Pullen on piano and tenor saxophonist Dewey Redman. New York Duets with Pullen (Music and Arts Records) was released in 1990, followed in 1991 by *Live At Sweet Basil* (Denon Canada).

Bunnett's fourth album, *Spirits Of Havana* (Denon Canada), was recorded in Cuba. It is described as a "cross-cultural collaboration" with several Afro-Cuban

Canadians in Bangkok for Thailand charities

Jannetta and Debbie Johnson, the support team for Thai recording artist Manee, are in Bangkok for a series of concerts for the King and Queen of Thailand's charities.

The pair are fresh from a hectic concert schedule in the south of France, where their support for Manee on her showcases "was invaluable," says Steve Thomson, president of Backstage Productions International.

Thomson staged the European showcases, which took place at Monte Carlo's exclusive Jimmy's and the Carlton Casino Club in Cannes during MIDEM. On hand for the Monte Carlo date was: the Princess of Saudi Arabia; John Martinotti, executive producer of the World Music Awards; and Jacques Duhost, a director of the Monte Carlo Casino who, after taking Manee on an exclusive tour of the casino, requested that she perform a command performance at the casino's Opera nightclub.

Thomson kept Manee and the Canadian team upfront at many of MIDEM's galas. Her

Last year she was selected as Soprano Sax Player Most Deserving of Wider Recognition in Down Beat's 40th annual International Critics Poll.

Bunnett's company, The Spirit of Jane Bunnett, tours internationally through the assistance of the International Cultural Relations Bureau, External Affairs and International Trade Canada. Bunnett recently returned from a six-month tour of Europe.

Bonnie Fedrau has been promoted to the position of A&R assistant for Warner Music Canada. The announcement was made by Kim Cooke, vice-president A&R.

Fedrau joined Warner in February of last year in the capacity of A&R co-ordinator. Prior to joining Warner, she worked in the royalties department at CMRRA.

In making the announcement, Cooke pointed out that Fedrau's promotion "reflects what the street already knows -- that her work ethics and dedication to music are unparalleled."

Junior Jug Band gold for Golden Music

The Junior Jug Band, one of Canada's leading children's music groups, has been awarded a gold record for selling more than 50,000 units of its self-titled 1981 Golden Music album.

The Junior Jug Band is headed by two brothers, Chris and Ken Whiteley, who began performing jug band music as teenagers almost 30 years ago. They formed the Junior Jug Band in the mid-'70s and, during the past few years, Chris' two children, Jenny and Daniel, have also joined the band.

Chris and Ken Whiteley have received three Juno nominations, an American Library Association Notable Children's Recording Award and a United Way Gold Communication Award. They have also performed across Canada and the United States and have helped shape the work of Raffi, Fred Penner, Sharon, Lois and Bram, and many other children's artists, having appeared on more than 80 recordings.

Is a retailer about to go . . . ? I recently asked Sam Sniderman if he was interested in buying his neighbour. "No," he said, "I like competition like that." That competition he mentions, as everybody knows, is in trouble. One of their early PR people kept proclaiming that they were the largest chain in the business, and that big is better. Not so! It's too bad they can't cherry pick their best locations -- and they have quite a few -- like 30 stores in the maritimes, and a few peppered here and there across the rest of the country. Then all they have to do is get a credit rating, but that's the rub, isn't it? It may be too late. *(EC: It's never too late . . . !)*

Anyone for a new organization??? Just look at the number of record and record related industry organizations we have in Canada. FACTOR, CIRPA, CRIA, CARAS, SOCAN, CMPA, CMRRA, CCMA, ARIA, PMIA, SRIA,

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MARIA, MIANS, NLMA and, if I left some out, I'm glad. What do all these people do? That's an industry in itself. An industry insider suggests yet another organization: How about FART . . . Fuck All Retailers Today . . . ? *(EC: The timing couldn't be better . . . !)*

He'll remember it well . . . ! MCA's Rick Wharton was one of the seven people on hand to see Half Way Home at Toronto's Horseshoe. Says Rick, "The lead singer (Jennifer Barry) sounds like Janis Joplin, the band sounds like The Red Hot Chili Peppers. When the band is big and famous, I'll be able to say I was there when it all started." *(EC: With six others!)*

True story . . . ! There was Sam Sniderman on the phone at the Variety Club Telethon and he gets a call. The lady begins to spell out her name, which was FREIFELD, and Sam asks, "Is this Adelyne?" She got all bubbly, "Sam! Is that you?" Isn't that a coincidence? Adelyne has been working for Sam (The Record Man) for 50 years. *(EC: I'll bet it's the first time she's spoken to Sam on the telephone . . . !)*

David Mirvish zaps critics . . . ! There's a small group of actors, friends of actors and a critic or two who take great delight in shooting down the efforts of the few who have been successful in building Toronto as one of the leading cities in the world for theatrical musicals and dramas. When the casting call went out for the Mirvish's Miss Saigon, the flag was up. "All the actors should be Canadian," they wailed. Well, after looking at and listening to more than 2,000 eager hopefuls from coast to coast in Canada and a couple of cities in the U.S., they made their decision. Of the 47 actors selected, only seven are non-Canadian. That's a mammoth chore in itself. Miss Saigon, as the very title suggests, calls for a large Oriental cast and, although Canada has erupted into a melting pot of sorts for all cultures, there certainly isn't a large Oriental population that's visibly involved in show business. Better they should have the real thing than a bunch of white people made up to look Oriental. *(EC: They'd hear from another bunch of critics . . . !)*

Guess who's softening up . . . ? Stompin' Tom Connors, just this side of being a recluse, has finally relented and will attend an industry function. Sam Sniderman *(EC: What's this love affair with Sam? That's twice you've mentioned his name!!!)* was able to twist Stompin' Tom's arm and he's apparently promised to attend the East Coast Music Awards. That's a nice connection, being that he's from Prince Edward Island. *(EC: He's not there yet . . . !)*

A Bruce Allen attack . . . ? I never heard of such a thing. A Canadian . . . or American broadcaster, for that matter, taking on Canada's enfant terrible? I had a conversation with Bruce Allen last week . . . and a good interview, I have to admit. Bruce used up a bit of my nickel with his usual ranting about one of his favourite targets. But that's the stuff for tabloids, so I ignored it. But not Steve Warden,

who does the six o'clock Rock Report on Toronto's Q107. From what I heard, he went up one side and down the other of our west coast grizzly. Bruce should get a tape of that one. It's still the talk of the trade in Toronto. *(EC: I wonder what his source was . . . ?)*

I can't believe it . . . ! When you're in trouble, who do you call? A lawyer, of course, if you're still alive. If it has to do with contractual problems, a beef over being fired, or any number of problems that can face people in the record and broadcast industries, the help call goes out to a lawyer. Then comes the hefty fees *(EC: I know a showbiz lawyer who carries a stop watch -- a big one -- in his pocket!!!)* and court appearances, remands et cetera, et cetera, et cetera. So along comes a lawyer, who is fed up with being a legal gunslinger, and he comes up with a way to conciliate problems to the benefit of all parties. He calls his company Neutral Ground. He got a lot of newspaper and magazine coverage, but no calls. The timing should be perfect. There are a lot of problems in the music business, and an easy way out would be welcomed. Obviously we're still hung up on what this lawyer calls the "dog eat dog, winner take all, let someone else decide mentality." Hey! If you've got a problem, and you want to bounce it off him, give him a call. His name is Boris Freesman, and you can contact him at 416-512-8965. *(EC: What's a legal gunslinger . . . ?)*

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Walt Disney Records has entertainment for all ages

Phrases like family values, cocooning and nostalgia have become common in modern-day North America and the Walt Disney organization is taking full advantage.

Recent films such as Aladdin, Beauty and the Beast, and The Little Mermaid have done big business in theatres and have spun off into platinum-selling soundtrack albums.

"Families are doing more cocooning and are looking for family entertainment," says David Greig, director of marketing and sales for Walt Disney's Canadian publications, computer software, and records and audio entertainment department. "Disney has music that appeals to everyone in the family."

Greig's associate, Todd Maki, agrees that Disney films, albums and audio products have multi-generational appeal. "The animated classics, which are usually thought of as being for children, are also for adults," says Disney

Canada's national accounts representative for records, audio entertainment and computer software.

"There's a lot that adults appreciate. Everybody, without exception, has a favourite Disney film."

High volume sales of compact discs in addition to cassettes back up Maki's point. "It's not just for children. In a lot of cases people won't buy CDs for their children because they don't want them playing around with the CD player."

And as older Disney films are constantly being re-released, music and other audio products connected with them remain consistent sellers. Sales of such products peak when a particular film is re-released, so look for some impressive numbers when Snow White comes out yet again in June.

But aside from the blockbuster success of the film soundtracks, Walt Disney also chocks up sales for a number of other audio products and related merchandise, including watches, books, videos, toys and computer software among other things. "The catch phrase at Disney is synergy," Maki says, in explaining how sales of one product complement those of another.

The company's Music Box Artist Series features children's releases from Craig 'N Company, Parachute Express and Vancouver's own Norman Foote. The label has released an album and video from Dinosaurs, the ABC-TV weekly comedy series. The Official Album of Walt Disney World and Disneyland features the most recognized music from the theme parks. Mitsou loses nomination for not enough Francon


The Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences has revoked Mitsou's nomination for Best Selling Francophone Album.

It keeps going...! The top of the Hit Tracks chart is wide open. I Will Always Love You barely held on for an eighth week. It will be replaced next week. It's tough to predict which song will take over though. All of the next five songs are within reach. Houston's follow-up release, I'm Every Woman, bullets to No. 11, indicating that she will have two songs in the Top 10 next week. Name the only other artist in the 90s to accomplish that feat.



Among artists being programmed on the station are Bryan Adams, Madonna, Genesis, Whitney Houston, Michael Bolton, Rod Stewart, and more.


After the free-wheeling weekend, the station was officially launched at 6 a.m. on Feb. 8.

It's Friday Night! with Ralph Benmergui

Friday Night! with Ralph Benmergui was one of the most eagerly awaited new television shows in recent memory when it went to air on Oct. 30. The CBC-TV show, which airs nationally every Friday at 11 p.m., has had its detractors, but there's no denying that the show has given a shot in the arm to the Canadian music industry. RPM talked to host Ralph Benmergui and musical director Matt Zimbel about the show.

Benmergui's pleased to promote Cancon artists

Ralph Benmergui used to dress up like Paul Revere while singing in a '60s cover band called The Stingers that played the southern Ontario bar circuit more than a decade ago. Today, however, he's quite content to sit back in more conservative duds and let others do the singing as guests on his Friday Night! with Ralph Benmergui show.

Friday Night! is just the latest development in Benmergui's ongoing involvement with music. "I've always loved music and being involved with programming it," he says. "At parties in 1973 I was the guy who would get up and put on The Moody Blues or Quadrophenia."

Benmergui's interest in and knowledge of music led him to work at CKLN-FM, the campus/community radio station at Toronto's Ryerson Polytechnical Institute. Benmergui's broadcast bug convinced him to leave Ryerson before completing his journalism degree to become a researcher for CBC Radio Current Affairs in Winnipeg. That position soon led, in the early '80s, to hosting Night Lines, a national late night alternative radio show which was broadcast out of Winnipeg by CBC Radio. From Night Lines he moved back to Toronto to host Prime Time, a CBC Radio variety show. These experiences have helped the 37-year-old Benmergui to develop a keen appreciation of the kind of Canadian musical talent that is now promoted each week on

Friday Night!

"I think people are being exposed to just how good Canadian talent really is, with no apologies and no qualifications," he says of the show. "It's for the people who are at the top of the game in the country to come on and do something, but it's also for the people who are slugging it out anywhere in the country."

A run-through of the musical acts which have appeared on Friday Night! since its premiere illustrates the variety of talent which has graced the show's stage. Barenaked Ladies,

Sass Jordan, Papa Mambó, Mitsou, Prairie Oyster, Leslie Spit Treco, Kashtin, Holly Cole, Moxy Frivous, Bruce Cockburn, Kaleefah, The Shuffle Demons, Kurt Swinghammer, Mother Tongue, Buffy Sainte-Marie, Meryn Cadell, The Rankin Family, Richard Seguin, Maestro Fresh Wes and Leonard Cohen are just some of the names that have appeared so far.

The House keeps crowd pumped and enthusiastic

Matt Zimbel wanted to be the musical director of Friday Night! with Ralph Benmergui, but he also wanted his band, Manteca, to be included in a package deal.

The show's producers, however, insisted that Manteca's sound wasn't Canadian enough. Zimbel finally relented and hastily assembled a diverse group of talented musicians to do a 20-minute audition of original material. The producers were wowed and The House was born.

"We won it strictly on the music and the energy of the group," Zimbel says.

The House consists of Zimbel on percussion, Doug Wilde on keyboards, Janet Munson on fiddle, Neil Chapman on guitar, Colin Barrett on bass, and Charlie Cooley on drums. Tabby Johnson contributes occasional vocals.

The band's energy and enthusiasm in warming up the audience before the show and during commercial breaks, as well as providing the theme and stingers, can't be denied. But Zimbel makes sure that it doesn't try to steal the thunder from the rest of the show.

"Our objective is to be a great band on that show and provide them with the support they need. We're there to support Ralph and the bones of the show, and that's what we do.

are booked for the show, so he immerses himself in music by playing tapes of Canadian artists in his Walkman as he walks to work each day. Benmergui admits that the show might have gotten off to somewhat of a slow start, but he says that's to be expected since almost everyone connected with the project was basically learning on their feet and feeling

their way along with each show. But he believes Friday Night! has now settled into a groove and will only get better.

"Now we have more of a relationship with the record companies and the people involved with particular artists. That's really starting to pay off."

Friday Night! seems to have levelled off at a weekly audience of half-a-million and, despite criticism of the show by some in the media, Benmergui is confident the show will be renewed. He says he looks forward to introducing more Canadian talent to national audiences for years to come.

And though he's now pretty shy about singing in public, there are still times when he will get involved with the show's band, The House. "I like going in there every once in a while and blowing a percussion lead and then leaving," he says. "It's fun."

And we do it with great enthusiasm because we really, really believe in this show.

"I think this show is going to be one of the tools that will help artists in this country to gain access to the country's theatres in ways that they have not had before. The producers of this show have taken a tremendous stand of belief in their own country's performing artists.

"I love the idea that artists who do not have record deals are getting on the show. That's courageous booking."

This is more than just a TV show. This is a milestone in Canadian entertainment.

"I love the idea that artists who do not have record deals are getting on the show. That's courageous booking. They're not going for big numbers all the time, they're crafting shows. There's a lot to be said for that."

Luckily, the network head honchos have also equipped the Friday Night! studio in the new CBC building with expensive, state-of-the-art equipment. Most other variety shows only have two musical numbers per night, but Friday Night! usually has three and sometimes four. Zimbel credits Simon Bower, who has been nominated for a Gemini Award for his behind

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the scenes work at the audio board, for the success of the show's musical segments.

"This is one of the biggest productions in North America. It's pretty complicated audio. There are 96 channels of automated audio on this show and we're very proud that our audio department does such a great job.

"In this country we tend to forget that the CBC is a leader in live audio production. We've been able to put together some pretty impressive evenings of live music on television in this country. I think it should be celebrated a little more often than it tends to be."

Zimbel isn't involved with booking acts on to the show, but when artists such as Leonard Cohen, Buffy Sainte-Marie or Kurt Swinghammer need musical accompaniment, he and the rest of the band are there to help. What makes all of this much tougher is that while the rest of The House is now based in Toronto, 36-year-old Zimbel still lives and works in Montreal. He comes to town every Wednesday for production meetings and then composes material with Wilde before rehearsing with the band, and the guests if necessary, for the next two days.

"Most of the other television bands in North America are not doing original material," Zimbel says. "But we're always

writing. That sets us apart quite a bit from our peers.

"The producers have given us complete and utter artistic freedoms to execute our vision of what this group is. That's such a rare thing to find and we cherish that autonomy."

If the group of self-admitted "show-offs" wasn't given that freedom, it could be in trouble, because The House plays a style of music that even Zimbel finds hard to describe. "There are underpinnings of funk, with the instrumentation of both rural and urban Canada," he tries at first, then offers, "You can take a traditional tune and make it almost a hip-hop funk thing."

Though The House has recorded some demo tapes and plans to play at least a couple of live dates outside of the show, Zimbel concedes that the eclectic nature of their music could make it tough to translate into a commercially viable entity.

"I doubt if we'd get booked to a jazz festival because it's not jazz. I doubt we'd get booked at a folk festival because it's not folk. I don't think anyone in radio is going to start playing this music because it doesn't fit their rigid vision of what radio listeners like or what advertising people like to buy. So the group is really a black sheep.

"The band has been very celebrated in what it does, but in terms of it going to the next step -- from a marketing standpoint, I don't know what this is and where it could play.

"It's such a strange kind of music," Zimbel says while still fumbling for the essence of the band's sound. "It's instrumental fusion funk-folk."

Nirvana and Bodyguard lead metal parade

William Morris will also try to raise trio's profile on television and in book publishing.


April Wine signs with The Agency for new tour

 Scott B Sympathy is Brantford, Ont. native Scott Bradshaw and a select group of Toronto's finest independent musicians. This album was recorded in three sessions over two years at Wellesley Sound with Bradshaw and Walter Sobczak producing. The players include Gord Cumming (The Lawn) on slide guitar, Ian Blurton (Change Of Heart) on guitar, Alisdair Jones (No Mind, Thumposaurus) on fretless bass, John Borra (Thumposaurus) on Fender bass, Don Kerr (Dinner Is Ruined) on drums, Patrick Gregory (The Lawn) on banjo, Willie P. Bennett on harmonicas and Anne Bourne (Thumposaurus, Loreena McKennitt, Jane Siberry) on cello. This follow-up to the folk-rock sound of 1990's Neil Yonge Street displays the full range of both Bradshaw's and his players' talents. Blurton lets go on guitar and gets the album off to a rocking start on the title track. Can't Hold On That Way was the first single and video from the PolyGram distributed Moose Lodge compilation. The song is a rootsy folk-influenced ballad featuring Bennett on harmonica. Hiatus is highlighted by Bradshaw's incisive lyrics and Cumming's slide guitar. Lester Bangs Stereo Ghost reflects Bradshaw's earlier punk influences. Something's Burning, Baby is a cover of a mid-'80s Bob Dylan song. Ending the album is Sense, a funky guitar-driven rap number that's a live favourite. Speaking of live performances, Bradshaw has finally put a full-time band together so he can take his music across the country. The new lineup includes longtime drummer Dave O'Sullivan, Gary Robertson and Ron Bock of The Ground on guitar and bass respectively, and Bradshaw on vocals and guitar. - SM



 This is a collection of songs from two previous albums from Aardvark Records that were only released in small quantities on vinyl, as well as two songs that appeared on European compilations, and one previously unreleased track. The first eight tracks, taken from 1989's This Whole World, are the cleanest sounding and most restrained on the album. Kill Your Parents ridicules the Canadian Young Offenders Act. Praise Education is about how the Japanese education system and corporate structure has made their economy more effective than ours. It's not too tough to figure out what the letters stand for in S.O.L. Subway Suicide is another recommended track from this period. Songs from 1985's Take Our Flag album include Pull The Switch, which apparently hit #19 on the Polish charts in 1988. The title track from


the album deals with the cozy relationship once held between Brian Mulroney and Ronald Reagan. Drunk Driving is about the perils of DWI, and Stealing Food rips apart the concept of the rich getting fat at the expense of the poor. A hidden bonus track at the end of the album is the worst version of The Lion Sleeps Tonight you'll ever hear unless you're condemned to an eternal lifetime in karaoke hell. Through the years, bassist Mudd and guitarist Rusty Talent have been the only Random Killing constants. V. Dumpster, Rodney Wastelands and Drool have been the vocalists, while Deadbeat and Billy Clubz have been the drummers. The music is repetitive, the lyrics may offend some, the album won't sell much, and radio -- except campus stations and perhaps late night CBC -- won't touch it, but this is still a worthwhile collection of vintage Canadian hard core punk from Random Killing's pre-fluorescent days. Even if you don't like it, the 16 tracks only last half-an-hour. - SM



GENE LOVES JEZEBEL - Rock
Heavenly Bodies
 Savage - 74785-50210-2-N
 This group had some alternative/dance success through the mid-to late '80s up to 1990's Kiss Of Life album. Now they're aiming for more mainstream success but, with Heavenly Bodies, they seem to be a band that doesn't quite know what to be musically. Josephina is the first single. Two minutes after this album ended I couldn't remember anything from it. - SM

 Some more of that loud, heavy guitar music that every second or third new band seems to be playing these days. This quartet from New York City signed to Geffen through a connection to Sonic Youth (drummer Keith Nealy used to be their guitar tech). Fall and the slow, brooding Bad Day are my two picks from the album. These guys still have their day jobs so Slo-Blo better do well for them. - SM



CHIP DAVIS - Pop/Easy Listening

 Just in time for Valentine's Day, this is the

latest addition to American Gramophone's Day Part series. The label's founder, Chip Davis, gained inspiration for this album from the masters -- Beethoven, Debussy and Ravel -- as well as from his own love affair with Oriental culture. Davis was also inspired by Canadian classical guitarist Liona Boyd. Romance includes her Lullaby For My Love, which inadvertently gives this album a Cancon track. Also key are a couple of Michael Hoppé compositions, Through The Window and The Children's Waltz Theme. Claire De Lune by Jackson Berkey is also a standout track. 


RIK BRAUN - Instrumental/Pop




THE WISEMAN BROTHERS - Country/Pop

 This album proves there's more in Gander, Nfld. than just an airport. Shawn and Perry are The Wiseman Brothers, a duo which has had an impact on the music scene in Newfoundland since they officially formed in 1982. The two brothers share songwriting and lead vocal duties and have been voted best group on the island for the past three years by The Newfoundland Herald. This is their first album and, with the help of some talented backup musicians, they've made a good one. This is country music with a lot of crossover potential, so both country and AC radio stations are being targeted. A ballad, 'Settin' Myself Up For A Fall, is the first single. Shawn takes a good-natured poke at his girth on Love Handle. Stay A Little Longer is a country shuffle with a bit of honky tonk piano thrown in for good measure. Subtle strains of accordion add to the genuineness of Last Goodbye, a tribute to Newfoundland. Al Brisco's steel guitar playing makes It Ain't Easy Looking Back the most authentically country track on the album. Two Broken Hearts, It's So

Hard and I Can't Help It are also worthy of investigation. - SM

 The follow-up to this British band's platinum-selling second album, Doubt, fails to deliver songs like Real Real Real, International Bright Young Thing and Right Here, Right Now which made that album so popular. Perverse utilizes keyboards, computers, sequencers, drum machines, midi guitars and samples which were recorded at singer Mike Edwards' house on to floppy disc-Virtual Reality in music form. Warne Livesey then produced the album. All of this technology results in rock music that may be danceable but isn't particularly inspiring. The Devil You Know is the first single and has made good strides in its three weeks on the chart. Get A Good Thing and The Right Decision are other possibilities. Magazine, perhaps the most aggressive sounding song on the album, is my pick. - SM

 This five-piece Montreal band released a three song EP last September which gained airplay at 100 radio stations across Canada. Those three songs -- Set In Stone, Everybody Knows and Bury Me -- are also included on this 10-track independently released album. The group also covers Lulu's 1967 hit, To Sir With Love. The vocals are shared by Irene Marc and principal songwriter and guitarist, Howard Forman. The music tends to be middle of the road corporate sounding pop/rock with occasional dashes of white folk soul and R&B. AC radio stations should find something to their liking. - SM

WEEN - Pop/Rock

 Dean and Gene Ween (not their real names, I hope) comprise a prolific young duo which has already written more than 1,000 songs. Of course only a small portion of those have made it on to records, and many might ask why these 19 experimentally wacky cuts made the grade. This is Ween's major label debut after two independent releases and the group's previous reputation has already landed Pure Guava in heavy rotation at campus radio. All the songs were written, performed and produced by Ween. The group takes a minimalist approach which veers all over the place. As a reference point, Ween could perhaps be loosely compared to Half Japanese or Eugene Chadbourne. Even the three most accessible songs on the album feature out of the ordinary vocalizations. On The Stallion Pt. 3 it's an adolescent Marianne Faithful. On Push Th' Little Daisies it's a bratty little punk. And Don't Get 2 Close (2 My Fantasy) harkens early '70s David Bowie. - SM

Norm and Robert Brunet dropped by RPM's offices last week, promoting Norm's latest single, *It Ain't Right If Nothin's Wrong*. The track was taken from his Brunetunes album, *Me And My Guitar*. The Brunet band is also making inroads into other parts of the country. They recently played the Corral in Oshawa, Ont., and were in for four days (Feb. 11-14) at Wildside, a new Toronto country showplace. They return to the Ottawa area where they have become popular on the club circuit.

Rena Gaile is in chart contention with her new RDR CD single, *Let's Not Call It Love, Yet*. The music and lyrics were written by Cyril Rawson and Byron Hill, and the song was produced by Albert MacDonald. The session was recorded at Kinck Sound in Scarborough, Ont. with Fred Petersen at the board, and Ted Carson doing the mastering chores. Gaile had an impressive lineup of session musicians on board: Steve Pitocco and J.K. Guley, both on electric and acoustic guitars; drummer Bill Carruthers; bassman Eugene Falbo; John Dustan on piano and synth; and Steve Smith on steel and dobro. Al Van Wart and Neil (Don Neilson) Donnell provided background vocals. The single is available through RDR at 1-800 JOE-RADIO.

BMG's David Lindores was right when he picked *Hard Workin' Man* by Brooks & Dunn to be a hit for the Arista pair. The single was the most added this week and enters the chart at No. 60. 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
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
