





International perspective for Canadians at meeting

A high Canadian turnout was on hand for a symposium on the impact of digital technology on copyright and neighbouring rights which was held at Harvard University in Cambridge, Mass. from March 31 to April 2.

Representatives from the federal government, the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA), the Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency (CMRRA), the Society of Composers, Authors and Music Publishers (SOCAN), Union Des Artistes (UDA), and L'Association du Disque, de l'Industrie du Spectacle Quebec de la Video (ADISQ) were all in attendance at the event, which attracted speakers from around the world.

Although the symposium's focus was not limited to the music industry, papers were presented on such relevant topics as: The Music Industry and Technological Development: Are We Winning the War?, by Jason Berman, president of the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA); The Music Industry: Electronic Delivery and Copyright, by Nicholas Garnett, director general and chief executive of the International Federation of the Phonographic Industry (IFPI); Digital Technology: A Critical Crossroad in International Copyright, by Robert D. Hadl, vice-president and general counsel of MCA Inc.; Digital Technology, Sound Recordings and Protection of Performers, by Bruce York and Arthur Levine of the American Federation of Television and

Radio Artists (AFTRA); and The Challenges of Collective Administration in the World of Digital Technology, by Gloria Messinger, managing director of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP).

CRIA president Brian Robertson says that although there wasn't much material covered that the Canadian contingent hadn't already discussed among themselves, he believes the symposium was worthwhile. "I think it was beneficial because it highlighted and focused on the issues and gave our government representatives a bit more of a global perspective, because they tend to get isolated in the Canadian scene."

Janet Jackson release gets Virgin red carpet treatment

Janet, Janet Jackson's debut album for Virgin Records, is scheduled for a May 18 release.

The first single, That's The Way Love Goes, described as "a seamless blend of hip-hop, jazz stylings and melodic pop," is now at radio.

Jackson produced the album with Jimmy Jam and Terry Lewis. She co-wrote all the songs, which are comprised of her own lyrics and melodies. Besides her own lead vocals, Jackson supplied the backing vocals on all tracks except What'll I Do, where she worked with some members of Sounds of Blackness.

Jackson's guests on the album aren't too shabby either. They include opera great Kathleen Battle and rapper Chuck D of Public

At least four chains out to pick up pieces of A&A

The bankrupt A&A Music and Entertainment Inc. chain of stores is gradually being sold off to a number of buyers.

Although no deals have been officially closed, Pindoff Record Sales has offered to buy 16 stores from receiver Coopers & Lybrand. Four more stores are to be purchased directly from developers who had taken control of them when A&A failed to pay its rent.

"We picked what we thought were the best of the stores," says Kroum Pindoff, the owner and president of Pindoff Record Sales and Music World.

Pindoff is ready to stock the new stores now but doesn't expect all the paper work to finalize the sales to be completed for another couple of weeks. The A&A signs will be replaced by those of Music World over the next 90 days and, one by one, the stores will be refitted, remodelled and, in some cases, fully renovated. "Eventually all the stores will be converted to the image of Music World," Pindoff says.

Meanwhile, Records On Wheels president Vito Ierullo says his company has agreed to purchase 18 A&A stores and is involved in negotiations for up to five more. With the purchases, Ierullo says his chain will sew up most of the east coast stores as well as some in the Ottawa region. "We're in this to become champions," he boasts.

As reported in RPM last week (Walt Says, April 17/93), Total Sound/Top 40 from Edmonton has also agreed to buy five A&A stores, and Rock Entertainment of North Bay,

Ont. is looking to buy six.

Stock from shut-down A&A stores has been shipped to the flagship location on Yonge St. in Toronto, where it is being sold at bargain prices. The A&A stores that have remained open under receivership will close down if buyers can't be found.

Wild T's Bowie connection pays off with U.S. TV dates

Tony 'Wild T' Springer's association with David Bowie will land him three television appearances in May.

Wild T played guitar on Bowie's new Black Tie White Noise album and he will appear with Bowie on the Arsenio Hall Show on May 6, The Tonight Show with Jay Leno on May 10 and Late Night with David Letterman on May 12.

The Toronto-based musician has just completed recording his second Warner Music Canada album, tentatively titled Givin' Blood.


Enemy, who contribute the mixing of different sounds and visions to the album.

"I think it's just a cool collaboration," says Jackson, "What interests me most is trying to do things that haven't been done before."

Jackson's Virgin debut follows her eight million-selling album, Rhythm Nation 1814, which charted for 79 weeks on the RPM 100 Albums chart through 1990-91. The success of this album was due, in part, to her first-ever concert tour in 1990 which played to audiences estimated to be in excess of two million.

As with Rhythm Nation, Jackson will mount a world tour later this year as a promotional vehicle for her Virgin debut. The tour is expected to cover several "uncharted territories."

Jackson is also set to make her movie debut in Poetic Justice, a Columbia Pictures film, this summer. She will portray Justice, the female lead in the film. Poetic Justice is being directed by John Singleton (Boyz N The Hood), and features the poetry of Maya Angelou.

Alternative marketing strategies beefs up rap and dance sales

As CHR formats decline, rap mounts new offensive

With Top 40/CHR stations becoming an endangered species, rap, dance and even some mainstream rock and pop artists are relying more and more on alternative means of marketing for survival.

"It's becoming more difficult at radio," says Ron Robles, EMI Music Canada's product manager for black urban dance repertoire. "We tend to go more to the streets and the clubs and the high schools."

One A&R representative, who wishes to remain anonymous, suggests that there is concern among some in the business that large corporations may be avoiding advertising on radio formats that lean toward rap, because of the messages of violence that have been associated with this music form.

"Unless a rap or dance record crosses over to Top 40 in the U.S., Canadian radio would hardly look at it, and even then they would wait until perhaps it's a Top 20 or Top 10 record."

Rap music has been at the centre of controversy since it first made a major impact on the market in the early '90s. Word of mouth

Several benefits scheduled for Figgy Duff's Noel Dinn

A series of benefit concerts are scheduled for Toronto, Vancouver and St. John's for Figgy Duff's Noel Dinn.

The co-founder of the popular Newfoundland folk band has been temporarily sidelined with throat cancer. He is now recovering in Toronto after a series of treatments in a Mexican clinic.

The Toronto benefit will be held at the Horseshoe on April 19 and will feature an all-star lineup of Newfoundland artists currently working in the city.

Confirmed for the Toronto benefit are: Thomas Trio & The Red Albino, a rock/soul band; the Irish Descendants, currently putting the finishing touches on their second album; the Hynes Brothers, a new duo who recently moved to Toronto; actor/comedian Andy Jones; Ron Hynes, whose new EMI Music Canada album is scheduled for a July release; and Figgy Duff's lead singer Pamela Morgan.

Freedom, Figgy Duff's new single released on the Hypnotic label, enters the RPM AC chart this week at No. 37. The song was written by Dinn and is included on the band's Downstream album. The Hypnotic label is distributed in Canada by A&M.

Dates and lineups for the St. John's and Vancouver concerts will be announced shortly.

played a large role in its popularity, resulting in phenomenal record sales in the United States, which has had a spillover effect in Canada.

Some American programmers immediately shifted to a format that accommodated rap and dance, and which in turn affected CHR and Top 40 radio.

Black music, primarily rap, took hold at mainstream radio. Although it had a shaky start in Canada, its presence was nevertheless potent. Initially, Capitol's MC Hammer was perhaps the most popular and successful purveyor of the form.

Hammer made the biggest impact with his album, Please Hammer Don't Hurt 'Em. The album eased onto the RPM 100 Albums chart almost unnoticed, entering at No. 86 (March 10/90). After six weeks it dropped off the chart. Radio hadn't accepted Hammer's single, U Can't Touch This, and only word of mouth created sales.

When the single took off at radio, Hammer's album began registering an impressive sales pattern at retail, and re-entered the chart at No. 80 (April 28/90). The album topped the chart on August 18/90, holding that position for three consecutive weeks, and was back at the top once again on Oct. 6/90. The album charted for a total of 73 weeks.

Alan Triger promoted to Warner Music sales team

Alan Triger has been promoted to sales representative of Warner Music Canada's Ontario branch.

Triger started with Warner International Services in production in September 1989. He then moved to the Ontario branch as a field representative, before earning his promotion.

Jeff Healey Band grows to launch Canadian tour

The Jeff Healey Band is no longer a power trio after adding three new members.

Keyboardist Washington Savage and vocalists Mischke and Tuku Matthews joined the band's three core members (Healey, Joe Rockman and Tom Stephen) while recording the current BMG/Arista album, Feel This. The three have since received positive reviews while the band opened on Bon Jovi's North American tour. They are now playing dates in Europe.

The Jeff Healey Band will launch a Canadian tour with shows in Halifax on April 29 and 30. They will then hit the following cities as they travel westward: Quebec City (May 3), Ottawa (4), Montreal (5), Kitchener (7), Toronto (8), North Bay (9), Sault Ste. Marie (10), Thunder Bay (11), Winnipeg (12), Calgary (15), Vancouver (17-18) and Victoria (19).

The Phantoms will open the tour. The blues-rock band's current album, Raw, was released on the Jeff Healey Band's own Forte label. Forte is distributed in Canada by A&M.

Canadian rap artist Maestro Fresh-Wes was even ahead of Hammer. His Symphony In Effect, released on the Attic label, entered the RPM 100 Albums chart at No. 96 on Jan. 20/90. The album enjoyed 33 weeks of charting, fuelled by radio play of Let Your Backbone Slide and Drop The Needle.

When Fresh-Wes' single, Black Tie Affair, the title track of his next album, scored follow-up radio play, album sales kicked in. It jumped to the Top 20 (July 13/91) in only four weeks of charting.

Rap was hot, but unfortunately, some of the rappers took advantage of their expanded audience and turned in some pretty violent material. The decline of rap music on mainstream radio was underway. In Canada, where there are no rap radio stations, the decline was even more obvious.

"There's good rap music," Robles insists. "Take Arrested Development as an example. Their lyrics are clean and intelligent. They were one of the surprise bands of '92. Their first album is over platinum in both Canada and the U.S., and their second album is platinum in the U.S. and has sold over 20,000 in Canada."

Robles is hopeful that new albums by MCJ & Cool G and Devon will click in, but he admits to some obstacles.

"We don't have that many Top 40/CHR stations in Canada. That's a problem. So we are gearing for the youth market -- dance clubs and high schools where they perform live to track.

"We don't have rap radio stations in Canada, but college radio has been filling the void, and where some retailers play rap in-store, there's a definite increase in sales. Consumer-type magazines also help by informing readers of new and established rap acts.

"Unless a record becomes a novelty song overnight, I don't think we're going to hear it. And it doesn't necessarily have to be rap, it could be a dance-oriented song. It has to have that mainstream influence."

With radio turning a blind ear to rap and dance music, some in the industry believe there is a reluctance by some labels to consider new signings.

"Our A&R department believes in Canadian talent, be it rap or rock or dance," says Robles. "They haven't changed their policy. But what has changed is our method of marketing. We have to still concentrate our efforts on whatever radio is approachable. Radio is still very important.

"We now attach even greater importance to retail exposure, the press and, of course, national exposure of videos. We're getting more exposure for rap and dance releases on television than we ever did, be it MuchMusic, Electric Circus, Extend-A-Mix or Soul In The City. If YTV or CBC goes on a rap or dance video, that's all the better.

"Mind you, we do need radio for everyday play. Unfortunately it's getting scarcer and it's frustrating, especially with a lot of Canadian talent that's now available. There's only so much that can be done, and only so much budget to do it."

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couple of luncheons... big time, over the last couple of weeks. The tribute to former Toronto mayor Allan "Lampy" Lamport on his 90th birthday was a barrel of laughs. CFRB's Wally Crouter hosted the show and he brought out the best in Lampy, not that he needed any persuasion. The Crout also had the big guys, Al and Reg, take a bow, and broke the house up with, "Take a look at those two turkeys. You can tell they've been to a couple of luncheons." Lampy disputed a few of the historical items the Sun's Mike Filey quoted from his book on the former mayor, fracturing the room with a new Lampyism: "I'm just kidding... but I always tell the truth." There were over 700 admirers of Lampy on hand for the luncheon. (EC: *I like that... the big guys!*)

Variety salutes Blue Jays!!! Also a memorable luncheon with more than 1,800 fans jamming the ballroom of the Sheraton Centre was Variety's annual nod to the Toronto ball club. A bit of a yawn, but raising money for Variety's Kids was the main goal. How come Toronto fans can't get excited over the Leafs like that? When the Leafs win the Stanley Cup this year, besides a parade up Bay Street and cufflinks presentations from the mayor, how about a Variety Club salute to the greatest hockey team in the NHL? (EC: *I thought the Vancouver Canucks were the best...!*)

A cute package of nostalgia... but!! The Good Times Are Killing Me, playing at Toronto's Royal Alexandra Theatre until May 29, was a bit of a boil, but lacked the steam necessary to make it memorable. What was memorable however, was the awesome performance by Edna Arkins, who portrayed Renée Allison Harper, the 13-year-old white girl who acts as the interlocutor. There are some in the industry who will applaud, in fact do flips, over the changes which will obviously follow... at the top. (EC: *Is this a business to make money or be a nice guy...?*)

Credit, where credit is due...! Al Dubin reminds me of some of the people in the industry who haven't forgotten Variety. And there are a bunch who have. Every year, Neill Dixon cooks up some scheme to get bucks for Variety. The last couple of years, he's organized the Rock 'N' Bowl in association with CARAS, which makes money for Variety. This year he turned over \$3,500. I remember he was the spark that got the 25th anniversary celebration of RPM in gear... and that raised more than \$50,000, which went to Variety. Dubin also remembers Warner Music's Stan

Kulin, who, at a Variety Salute to Sam Sniderman, pledged \$5,000 to Variety in Sam's name and asked Sam to match it, which he did. Remember when we reported in RPM that one of Sam's ex-employees had a conscience spasm over sticky fingers and sent Sam a cheque for \$1,000. Sam turned that over to Variety. What a great industry this is. (EC: *The unsung heroes...!*)

A message in a bottle...! I ran across what I thought was a specimen bottle for an elephant. In fact, it was a bottle that contained a message on Ships, a new single from Big Country, but someone removed the message and left the cork in the bottle. A nice conversation piece... the bottle, that is. Virgin's Doug Caldwell already has some pretty good feedback... on Ships, that is!!! (EC: *I'm confused!!!*)

The axe continues to fall!!! All kinds of speculation about who is in and who is out. (EC: *When will it all end...?*)

Confirm or deny!!! That a certain nationally celebrated editor and publisher was once involved in a Canadian porno magazine... in his early days when he was poor. A few people still have copies and might be willing to share them. (EC: *Nobody comes to mind. Sing a few bars!!!*)

Uzeb's L'Integrale released via Distribution Select

Uzeb, a jazz fusion band which originated in Drummondville, Que., has released a seven-album boxed-set entitled L'Integrale that covers material from the past 10 years.

After 17 years together, Uzeb broke up after a final performance before 96,000 people last July at the Montreal International Jazz Festival.

During its career Uzeb sold almost 400,000 albums and toured the world.

Alert Pinheads out now with more soon to follow

Alert Music Inc. has just released its first album of the year and promises at least two more in the coming months.

The Good, The Bad and The Pinheads by The Pinheads was released April 16. The first single, Hands Off, will be aimed at both rock and campus radio.

On May 28, the Holly Cole Trio will release Don't Smoke In Bed, the follow-up to the highly successful Blame It On My Youth. The album, which was produced by David Was and engineered by Leanne Unger, is geared for CHR, AC, jazz and campus radio. The band will do a national tour in July.

The trio recently won prizes for best jazz album and best new artist at the Grand Prix '93 Golden Disc Awards in Japan, where they have become a big hit. Blame It On My Youth was also named best album of 1992 by Japan's leading fashion and music magazine, Ad Lib. Cole will appear on the cover of the magazine's May issue, making it her second cover appearance within a year.

Finally, Kim Mitchell will once again hook up with lyricist Pye Dubois to write a new album which will be recorded in May. The album is tentatively scheduled for an August release, while Mitchell will be playing selected festival and concert dates throughout the summer.

Some songs show up in quite unlikely places

Credit Jeff Prytula, afternoon drive host of Swift Current's pop/rock 94FM, with persistence of belief in a band.

Change Of Heart, a mainstay of the Toronto independent music scene for the past 11 years, released an album called Smile last year which is now distributed through Cargo/MCA. The album's current focus track, There You Go, hasn't received a big push and was only being played on Toronto's "leading edge" station, CFNY-FM.

However, Prytula, a big fan of the group, lobbied hard for his station's program director to add the song. There You Go proved to be so popular that it went into heavy rotation and, during the week of March 31, it made the station's Top Five list behind The Tragically Hip, Peter Gabriel, Boy Krazy and Madonna.

If more radio jocks were as passionate, and more program directors were as open minded as these two at 94FM, perhaps radio wouldn't be as stagnant as it is today.

Included among the awards the band captured over the years were nine Félixes, a Géméaux prize, a SOCAN prize, a MusiquePlus prize and an Oscar Peterson prize.

Uzeb's members are now pursuing solo music careers.

L'Integrale was released by Les Disques Avant-Garde and is distributed through Select.

A new No. 1. Lenny Kravitz makes it to the top of the Albums chart. Are You Gonna Go My Way replaces Eric Clapton's Unplugged album, although it may be back again. Unplugged has reached No. 1 three separate times. It stayed at No. 1 for two weeks the first time, then returned for five weeks, and just ended a six-week run.

Biggest ever! Sting's If I Ever Lose My Faith In You becomes the biggest hit of his career. It has now logged three weeks as the No. 1 song in Canada. All This Time hit No. 1 for one week in 1991 and he had three No. 1 songs as a member of The Police. Name those three songs.

Big movers. There were several big movers on the chart this week. April Wine's If You Believe In Me leads the way with a 56 spot jump to No. 27. Chris Isaak's Can't Do A Thing (To Stop Me) also made a big splash as it climbs 52 spots to No. 28. Almost lost in those numbers are three other songs with very impressive numbers. Harbor Lights, Flying and I Put A Spell On You each jumped 49 places.

To the moon Alice . . . ! After just a couple of days on the shelf, David Bowie's Black Tie White Noise is already high on the chart. It enters at No. 22. LL Cool J has also returned to the chart, debuting at No. 43, while the latest compilation from Chris Sheppard also cracks the top half of the chart. Trip To The Moon rounds out this week's new entries at No. 50.

Just a thought. Do you suppose it is just coincidence that The Cult's album Pure Cult came out around the same time as this David Koresh mess in Waco, Texas?

CBC-TV's George Anthony reveals music strategies

Though some of his music/variety shows have been criticized, and others may have sub-par ratings, George Anthony is confident that music can play an important role on CBC Television.

"The stars of the (music) industry can give us great shows, but I think we can give them great shows too," says the CBC's creative head of TV arts, music, science and variety from his seventh floor downtown Toronto office. (He's one of the lucky ones with a window in CBC's new broadcast centre.)

The annual Juno Awards presentation is the one time of the year when all the biggest stars in Canadian music assemble to celebrate their accomplishments. And for the past decade-and-a-half, television viewers have also gotten the chance to take in the event from their living room couch. Some Juno telecasts have been more successful than others, but Anthony believes that this year's show was both a ratings (2.2 million viewers) and artistic hit.

"I was very happy with the show. I thought (producers) John (Brunton) and Joan (Tosoni) did a wonderful job. To be able to mount a show like the Junos and execute it that way is really uncommon.

"Some things didn't work for me but I liked the idea of them. Pirate TV didn't work for me and it didn't work for a lot of people, but I liked the idea that they were going for it, because it's much easier not to. They were putting in another layer that they believed would make the show better and richer. I would rather see them doing that, and I would support them doing that and failing, rather than playing it safe."

Anthony has a lot of input into the Juno telecast in association with the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS). He says the collaborative process has become easier since Dave Charles was named CARAS president, since Charles is able to understand the requirements of television in addition to putting forth his own ideas of what the show should entail.

"Our major mission is to build a star system in this country. In the music industry, there's the same goal. So when you both have the same mission you can both learn a lot from each other. But you have to be open to it. He knew that I have no interest at all in numbers, that I'm interested in the human quotient of the audience sitting there, and I want to make shows that are just so wonderful that they wouldn't dream of grazing. That way our stars are exposed to that audience."

The next awards show slated for the CBC is the RPM Big Country Awards. The awards presentation will be taped May 30, edited down to a one-hour special overnight, and will be broadcast nationally on the evening of May 31. Last year was the first time Big Country went to television and, after the low budget show drew 700,000 viewers, Anthony is looking forward to this year's event.

"I like the idea of these things starting small," he says. "If you have people who are

worthy of giving awards to, let's celebrate it. It just adds to the interest and awareness out there. I think it's really a fun show."

A show with a considerably higher budget than Big Country is Friday Night! with Ralph Benmergui. Its steep costs, lower than anticipated ratings, and victimization at the hands of some members of the media has put its future in doubt for next season. But the show's presentation of 100 per cent Canadian talent has done a lot for the domestic music industry.

"We know what kind of impact the show has had musically already because of the sales impact," Anthony says. "The sales impact after Leonard Cohen's appearance was amazing."

Friday Night! has featured such promising acts as the Leslie Spit Treeo, Sloan, and Thomas Trio and the Red Albino, but has also featured bigger names like Cohen, Céline Dion and Buffy Sainte-Marie. Artists have been eager

to appear on the show for the exposure, the gracious treatment they're accorded backstage, and the high sound quality the show's crew is able to produce.

"Our problem has been so little time and so many guests," Anthony says. "There's such a gold mine out there. The talent gets scale. It's not a money show, but I think they understand that they'll be presented properly."

While the fate of Friday Night! is still in the air, CBC's two music video shows, Video Hits and Good Rockin' Tonite, were both cancelled earlier this month. But Anthony insists it wasn't because of a lack of ratings.

"Video Hits, especially in the last year, I thought was just terrific. They broadened their base a lot and Dan (Gallagher) did some really fun things. There were a lot of live performances and a lot of good interviews, but the fact is that people saw that show when it came on (eight years ago), and it was a video music show. They still had it in their heads that someone introduced the video and then they played it.

"People who loved the show and were fans of the show watched it. And the other people who had gone on past it never came back to find out that it had changed. It was impossible for it to grow. They did everything right but there was just no growth. The same thing happened with Good Rockin' Tonite.

"I was sorry to see those shows go, but they really had no reason to be any longer. MuchMusic is on basic cable and every station has a music video show because they're cheap. We just don't feel that, with 50 other channels, that they need us to play Madonna and Sting videos. Everyone else can do that."

Though Video Hits has been cancelled, Gallagher has been kept on contract and Anthony says there are certain projects he has

in mind for him. "I think he's got a great people connection and a great audience connection and I just want to see if we can plug it into the right thing. He always has a lot of ideas and he's got tremendous energy."

One video show that will remain on air is Country Beat. Although it airs American videos, it tries to focus on Canadian country artists through airing their videos and featuring them in interviews. "That one still has growth," Anthony says.

Ear To The Ground, a half-hour show which profiles and features live performances from up-and-coming acts which might not otherwise get national mainstream exposure, is a show that Anthony confesses to being "addicted to." The show has been shifted around the weekly schedule and has had fluctuating audience numbers, but it's assured of returning for its second season next year in a yet to be determined time slot.

"I think it can draw pretty well wherever it is," Anthony says. "It's had a pretty low-key profile because the more you contain it, the better the show seems to be. It's more of a surprise and a treat for people. But we may have to give it a higher profile because we may have been too modest and too Canadian in our handling of that particular show."

CBC had a huge ratings success with the recent Anne Murray in Nova Scotia special which drew 2.8 million viewers. To follow up, the network would also like to have specials revolving around Cohen, Dion, Michelle Wright and George Fox. Anthony is convinced that such artists can attract a lot of attention from television specials, where as big name rock acts usually can't.

"Rock and roll, as a rule, does not work for a mass audience on television. They know that their experience is a stadium experience and that television, if it's not done properly, can reduce their impact instead of enhancing it."

One show that rock fans probably haven't even heard of is Jubilee Years. The show features clips from old episodes of Don Messer's Jubilee and Sing Along Jubilee and is hosted by Bill Langstroth. Though the show was only supposed to last a year, it has proven so popular that a second season's worth of shows has already been ordered.

After the May 31 Big Country Awards, the next variety/music program scheduled for the CBC is a Canada Day special on July 1.




13 ENGINES - Rock
Perpetual Motion Machine

 Perpetual Motion Machine is the best Canadian album I've heard this year, if not the best album period. This four-piece Toronto band's fourth album was produced by singer/songwriter/guitarist John Critchley and co-produced by engineer Glen Robinson at Le Studio in Morin Heights, Que. The band's last album, A Blur To Me Now, was recorded at Neil Young's northern California ranch and, for the uninitiated, some similarities can be heard among Young's Freedom or Ragged Glory albums and Perpetual Motion Machine. The guitars are in your face and Critchley's somewhat nasal vocals can bring Young to mind. But fear not, 13 Engines are able to surpass comparisons and the first single, More, shouldn't be overlooked by CAR, AOR or alternative radio programmers. There's not a single weak track here, but Smoke & Ashes and Saviour -- a song about Christ's return to earth being validated by television coverage -- stand out. Jim Hughes debuts as a lead vocalist on the (initially, at least) sweetly melodic, acoustic What If We Don't Get What We Want. Anne Bourne (Loreena McKennitt, Jane Siberry) plays cello to Lift You Up and the more subdued Moment Of Clarity, to which she also contributes harmonies. - SM




HAZE - Wicca 'n Roll

 Leanne Haze is apparently one of Canada's most famous witches and has been called upon to make predictions for such publications as the Los Angeles Times. She is also a Green Party candidate in Toronto. And now, after years of writing and performing, she is also a recording artist. There is some fairly heavy yet accessible rock music on this collection, which was produced by guitarist Neil Chapman (Pukka Orchestra, The House). Haze wrote all the lyrics except for Christ After Christ, which was written by Toronto poet/singer/songwriter/performer Robert Priest. Haze's recent concerns show up on the lead track, an environmental song called The Cure. Her Wiccan practices and lifestyle are also touched on lyrically. Wayawheta uses native-sounding drumming and chanting of the song's title. When Haze sings Don't Call Me Baby, she means it. The liner notes show novices how to cast a spell using the rite of the Hexagram. This album shouldn't be regarded as strictly a novelty item, as the music could also appeal to those with little interest in or knowledge of witchcraft. - SM



THE BARRA MACNEILS - Folk/Pop

 Though it may not be totally fair, it's almost impossible to talk about The Barra MacNeils without comparing them to another sibling-comprised act from Cape Breton, The Rankin Family. Both groups combine traditional songs, instrumental medleys and original compositions on their albums and both had strong independent followings before signing to major labels. Polydor has re-released all three of The Barra MacNeils' independent albums, with Timeframe being the most recent. It was named album of the year at the 1992 East Coast Music Awards, where the group was also chosen for the best recording artist prize. The group is comprised of Sheumas (keyboards, backing vocals), Kyle (guitar, violin, lead and backing vocals), Stewart (accordion, tin whistle, lead and backing vocals), and Lucy (bodhran, violin, harp, lead and backing vocals) MacNeil. Guest musicians occasionally fill in the gaps to round out the gently pleasing and melodic arrangements. Stewart and Dave Cross wrote four of the songs, another Cape Bretoner named Alistair MacGillivray wrote two, and the rest is made up of instrumentals and interpretations, including setting Robbie Burns' My Heart's In The Highlands to music. Stewart performs lead vocals on Banks Of The Roses, Isle Of My Dreams




GREEN JELLŌ - Heavy Rock

 Originally Green JellŌ was supposed to be a video-only band, releasing a 60-minute long-form concept video featuring a brand of warped hard rock music. But apparently the demand was so great that the band elected to release this album as well. An information sheet says Green JellŌ is a 15-member group which includes two guitarists, two bassists, two drummers, two percussionists and "a cavalcade of interchanging human puppets and screamers." Three Little Pigs, a parody of the nursery rhyme, is the first single and video. The title track sends up Toucan Sam, the Froot Loops mascot, and that pesky Trix rabbit. Anarchy In The U.K. uses the music from the Sex Pistols classic, but substitutes lyrics about the Flintstones. Electric Harley House (Of Love) uses a riff from Heart's Barracuda and then throws in a Kiss reference for good measure. Trippin'. On XTC is a rap/rock number which has nothing at all to do with Swindon's swinging popsters. House Me Teenage Rave is a sado-masochistic dance track. The album is fun in an offbeat way, but I think you probably have to see the long-form video to fully appreciate it. "Live shows which have left stunned onlookers paralyzed" are scheduled for Vancouver and Toronto. - SM




SAMMY KERSHAW - Country

 Sammy Kershaw has everything to make it into the winner's circle of today's new breed of country artists. He's young, good looking and he's already struck gold in Canada with his debut, Don't Go Near The Water. This follow-up is an extension of his debut, but Kershaw appears to be more in charge with this release. He's already making good chart inroads with his single, She Don't Know She's Beautiful, which was written by Bob McDill and Paul Harrison. This release wasn't the one being touted as a hoped-for chart single, but logic prevailed and the track was taken as a single and yes, it was a good choice, moving up to No. 15 this week. One of the problems with a great new talent like this is critics who have to rely on comparing him to someone else. Kershaw isn't a copy. He's an original and his shyness with vocals and youthful projection are major factors in his success pattern. Kershaw has a lot of character, more traditional than new country, but the country roots are more than obvious. He does a great job on the Dean Dillon/Donny Kees penning of What Might Have Been, as well as the title track, which was written by Buddy Brock and Kim Williams. Don't overlook the Jimmy Newman/J.D. Miller writing of Cry, Cry Darlin'. Produced by Buddy Cannon and Norro Wilson. Front-rack this one, country fans are already building. - WG



In just the second week of release, Yoakam's album topped the RPM Country 33 Albums chart and is already in the Top 20 of the RPM 100 Albums chart. The Yoakam vocal charm, with its new country feel, has captured a good chunk of that all-important mainstream pop field. Ain't That Lonely, taken as a single, is already bulleting up the charts. There's something for everyone here, including a demonstration of how the country boys can let loose with a rock assault. Should be a few singles deep with this one. Priority tracks include Home For Sale, the rocker Wild Ride, the title track and A Thousand Miles From Nowhere. Great cover shot will attract if front-racked. - WG



SEAN BRAY - Jazz
Another Point Of View
 Counterpoint/Trend - RDRCD-301
 Guitarist Sean Bray attended the Manhattan School of Music then taught at Red Deer College in his native Alberta before returning to New York to pursue his musical career. However, he has been based in Toronto since 1991 and makes regular appearances at jazz clubs around the city. Except for Beautiful Love, the rest of this instrumental album is comprised of Bray originals. Bray's classical influences are evident and, at times, similarities to Pat Metheny also show up. While Bray's guitar work is the primary focus, the other musicians on the album are certainly no slouches. The professionalism of Pat LaBarbera on tenor saxophone, Brian Dickinson on piano, Mike Downes on bass and Mike McClelland on drums ensure consistently high standards throughout this 51-minute collection. - SM



DAVID BOWIE - Pop/Dance
Black Tie White Noise
 Savage - 74785-50212-2-N
 Bowie has returned to work with Nile Rodgers, who produced Let's Dance a decade ago, and getting people dancing again seems to be a prime concern. Black Tie White Noise fuses elements of funk, rock, jazz, pop, soul and modern dance music to come up with an original sound. Original doesn't always mean entertaining, however, as it takes the two 'bonus tracks' to help salvage the album. The alternate mix of the first single, Jump They Say, is a more bass-oriented number aimed at the clubs. And Lucy Can't Dance might convince her to learn. Bowie's marriage to black model Imman has obviously had an effect on him, as two songs are dedicated to his wedding. And the title track, in which Bowie duets with Al B. Sure!, examines racial boundaries. The most stirring song on the album is a cover of Morrissey's I Know It's Gonna Happen Someday, which is highlighted by the vocals of a 13-piece choir. As a nationalistic bonus, Toronto guitarist Tony 'Wild T' Springer contributes a solo on the song. A funkified version of Cream's I Feel Fine is another of the album's covers. Bowie plays saxophone throughout and is surprisingly adept at it. Not surprising is the fluidity of Bowie's namesake, Lester, whose trumpet playing is one of the album's strong points. Though I'd be one of the last guys to go to bat for 'classic rock,' I'd still

 This new country quartet obviously has a great deal of potential, but their first couple of entries (Why Baby Why and The Best That You Can Do) were a bit limp. The harmonies are exceptionally hot and well-balanced on this release, produced by Thom McHugh, Keith Follies and Chuck Howard. Lead singer Ronnie Guilbeau is also a vocal power to take note of. A little more emphasis on country and a little pop might better suit programmers. Other tracks that might attract play are Over And Over, No Time To Stop Believing and It Works Both Ways. Perhaps the third release from this set, hopefully one of the above, will click at radio. It's certainly a band to watch. - WG

Jim Witter continues to bullet up the charts with his FRE debut single, *Everything And More* (No. 28). The single, written by Witter and Johnny Douglas, was taken from his self-titled album which was produced by Douglas. Born in Hamilton, Ont., where he still lives with his wife and son, Witter learned and performed his first song, *Yesterday* by the Beatles, at age seven. He wrote his first song, *Maybe Someday You'll Be Mine*, at age 14. He has been performing as a solo artist on the southern Ontario club circuit for the past 10 years. Among Witter's most memorable performances was opening for Roy Orbison. Also memorable was his performance as a featured vocalist and pianist with the Hamilton Philharmonic. Coming up for Witter and his band are several concerts in southern Ontario. Included is an April 24 date at Lulu's in Kitchener, a June 26 appearance at Waterloo's Sounds of Summer Festival, and Hamilton's Friendship Festival on August 6. More dates are being filled in, which should make for a busy summer. Witter's band is made up of drummer Jim Scotland, bassist Curtis Cripps, guitarist Robin MacQuarrie, keyboardist Peter Nunn, pedal steel man Ed "Pee Wee" Ringwald, and Witter on keyboards and guitar.

Rick Sieben is laying the foundation for international recognition with the release of a single on the Nashville-based Stargem label. The new and rare 7" vinyl single, *Poison Love*, was written by the late Elmer Laird. The song was first recorded a couple of decades ago by

a Nashville duo known as Johnny & Jack. This is one of four tracks Sieben recorded at Edmonton's Homestead Studio with Barry Allen at the board. Production supervision was by Merv Buchanan. The tracks were taken to Nashville where they were mixed by Denny Knight. Sieben's music is described as "dance, pure and simple." The flip of the 7" single contains a karaoke version. Sieben gained early recognition in the industry through two singles he released on his own Uptown label. The singles opened many doors for him on the club circuit. But after 18 years of the six nights a week bar grind, he made moves to expand. He contacted entertainment producer Merv Buchanan of Kelowna, B.C. and together they mapped out a new direction for his career, resulting in his recording session and a deal with Stargem. Sieben now lives on a 10-acre property just outside of Edmonton. He is now busy writing new material for an album he hopes to release in the fall. Buchanan has mailed Sieben's single to 108 country radio stations in the U.S. as well as to more than 100 country stations in Canada.

Reba McEntire and Vince Gill move into the No. 1 slot with their duet of *The Heart Won't Lie*. McEntire is still holding on the chart with *Take It Back* (No. 71). There is no information as to what the follow-up single

might be. Both tracks were taken from McEntire's MCA album, *It's Your Call*. Gill's last chart single, *Don't Let Our Love Start Slippin' Away*, enjoyed 23 weeks of national charting. His follow-up, *No Future In The Past*, which he co-wrote with Carl Jackson, was taken from his MCA album, *I Still Believe In You*, which was produced by Tony Brown.

Ricky Van Shelton is the biggest mover this week with *Just As I Am* jumping to No. 65 from No. 80. The track is included on his Columbia album, *Greatest Hits Plus*.

Marty Brown's new single, *It Must Be The Rain*, a Brown original, is shaping up as one to watch (No. 93). The track was taken from his MCA album, *Wild Kentucky Skies*, which was produced by Richard Bennett. Some country pundits are already predicting that Brown could be one of the big country names of this year.

The Bobby Lalonde Band has caught the ear of several programmers with the release of *Fiddle Man*. The track is included on Hillcrest CD compilation No. 9.

The Rankin Family's follow-up to *Fare Thee Well Love* (No. 48), the title track of their Capitol album, is titled *Gillis Mountain*.

Michelle Wright honoured with Canada 125 medal

Michelle Wright has been awarded the Commemorative Medal for the 125th Anniversary of Canadian Confederation.

The award was given to Wright in recognition of her "significant contribution to compatriots, community and Canada" through her music. The Arista/BMG artist had a concert commitment in Texas and was unable to attend the April 3 presentation ceremony in Tilbury, Ont. so Debbie Malott, the president of Wright's fan club, accepted the medal on her behalf.


On April 12, Wright and manager Brian Ferriman left Nashville for a week of promotion in Europe. Wright did two days of press and radio interviews in Dublin, Ireland before heading to Manchester to tape a popular British national noontime television show called *Pebble Mill*.

Wright then moved on to London for two days of media interviews and to meet top

management from Arista's United Kingdom company. She also attended a seminar and reception for the British music industry hosted by the Nashville-based Country Music Association and sponsored by Country Music Television (CMT), which has recently expanded its video operations to include the U.K.

Wright then flew to Belfast in Northern Ireland to tape the 'Kellys' television show, which is seen throughout Great Britain. She then hit the continent to perform with her band in Switzerland at the Zurich Country Music Festival. She ended the hectic week by returning to Nashville to start work on her next album.

Wright's current album, *Now & Then*, has gone platinum in Canada and has sold almost 300,000 copies in the United States. It will be released by Arista U.K. on May 4. The lead single, *He Would Be Sixteen*, was released on April 13, and the video for the song is currently in hot shot rotation on CMT Europe.
