Watchdog association founded for family entertainment

The groundwork has been laid for an association comprising performers and members of the family entertainment and recording industries to increase public awareness of family entertainment.

The new organization will be known as the Family Entertainers, Performance and Recording Association (FEFRA).

Earlier this year an informal group of concerned entertainment people, including those from Disney, Western Publishing, CHP,

Priscilla Wright picks up impressive AC recognition

Dogged determination through personal promotion, and a heavy phone and mail pitch by Anya Wilson, is beginning to pay off for Priscilla Wright.

When *You Love Somebody*, Wright's debut for Attic Records, was released last year. *Midnight Man* was the first single, but it was unable to spark interest with AC programmers.

Wright was confident that *Woman's Intuition*, a Shirley Eikhard original, was the natural follow-up to *Midnight Man*. The track was included on Attic's Focus Trax CD compilation No. 34, which was shipped to radio in April.

Wright was determined this release wasn't going to fall through the tracks and, after almost four months of mounting an all encompassing and soft-sell campaign, a pattern of acceptance with AC programmers has now taken form.

Even though Wright had a hit back in 1955, she was nominated for a Juno this year for most promising female vocalist. Kevin Doyle, who engineered the session and mixed the final master, was also nominated for a Juno for his work on the Jack Lenz-produced album.

Oak Street, Saturn, Tanglewood, McCarthy-Tetrault and two other related companies, outlined their plans for the basic association.

Bruce Davidsen of The Tanglewood Group says, "Our segment of the entertainment industry has been neglected and it is our feeling that the best way to focus the industry is through a formal association of those persons directly or indirectly involved with the family entertainment industry."

The non-profit organization is now looking to build a core membership which they hope to have in place by late summer.

Armedia Communications launches new indie label

Armedia Communications, through its music publishing interests, has established an independent label called Forty-Seventh and South Park Way.

Armedia, which is known for its audio/video production and broadcast services, will develop publishing and catalogue product through the label. The first project for the new label will be a compact disc from singer/songwriter David Partridge.

East coast radio veteran T.C. Robertson dead at 86

T.C. Robertson, better known as Robbie, a veteran on-air personality for more than 64 years, died in hospital in Sydney, N.S. on July 11 after a lengthy illness.

Born in Boston in 1907, Mr. Robertson joined CJCB Sydney when it first went on the air in 1929. At that time the station was only equipped with a 50-watt transmitter. Except for a four year switch to CJFX Antigonish, he remained with the Sydney station until he retired in 1971. However, he continued to work part-time until 1991.

Mr. Robertson was named Atlantic Broadcaster of the year in 1987 by the Atlantic Association of Broadcasters.

During his on-air years, Mr. Robertson not only excelled in special news events, but he became a popular host of daytime music programs. Among his most memorable news specials were two royal visits and the Springhill mining disaster in 1958.

Mr. Robertson is survived by his wife Mae, two daughters and a step-daughter.

Brian Stutz appointed to Backstage Pass position

Brian Stutz has been appointed director of sales and marketing for Backstage Pass.

Stutz, a veteran of promotion, booking and merchandising in the entertainment field, held previous positions as marketing consultant to Backstage Pass, director of marketing for Brockum Canada, and promotion manager for Concert Productions International (CPI). In his new job, Stutz will direct all sales and marketing initiatives and will report directly to the firm's partners, Brent Kopperson and Joel Rabinowitz.

Backstage Pass, with headquarters in Downsview, Ont., is the exclusive Canadian distributor for two of the world's largest entertainment merchandising companies. Included among its more than 500 name acts in music and entertainment are Madonna, the Beatles, Aerosmith, U2 and the Red Hot Chili Peppers.

Jim Campbell moves up to director post at BMG

Jim Campbell, a veteran in the A&R and promotion field, has been appointed director of artist and international marketing for BMG Music Canada.

In his 17 year career in the music industry, Campbell first gained recognition in promotion and A&R for Warner Music, which led to a position as label manager for RCA. In 1985, Campbell was appointed Arista label manager. He was upped to senior manager of artist and international marketing in 1992.

Midnight Oil protests Clayoquot Sound logging

Midnight Oil expressed its condemnation of logging Clayoquot Sound in B.C. last week when it held a press conference and an early morning performance at the site.

The Australian band joined local activists the Friends of Clayoquot, who began blockading the road to one of the largest remaining tracts of temperate rainforests in the world on July 5.

"We all have a stake in the future of the world's forests," said Midnight Oil lead singer Peter Garrett. "It never fails to amaze me that we people can act with such little regard for what is to come."

Garrett is on the board of directors of Greenpeace International and was formerly the president of the Australian Conservation Society, an advisory body to the Australian government on environmental and indigenous issues. The band itself has been actively involved with socio-political issues for 15 years.

Midnight Oil's current Columbia/Sony album, *Earth And Sun And Moon*, spent two weeks in the Top 10 of the RPM 100 Albums chart when it was released in May. The band's new single is *My Country*. Midnight Oil is currently part of the Another Roadside Attraction tour with The Tragically Hip and others.

Man of La Mancha ready for Toronto's Royal Alex

Michael Burgess and Susan Gilmour are returning to Toronto's Royal Alexandra Theatre from July 26 to Sept. 8 as the stars of Man of La Mancha.

Burgess, who set a record appearing as Jean Valjean in more than 1,000 performances of Les Miserables, plays Don Quixote. Gilmour, another Les Miz alumnus, co-stars again with Burgess as Aldonza in the musical.

The Canadian production was first mounted at the Citadel Theatre in December 1992 and was directed by Robin Phillips and Susan Cox. Ed and David Mirvish were so impressed when they attended the Edmonton opening that they picked it up for the Royal Alexandra Theatre, where they share production credits with the Citadel Theatre.

To coincide with the Toronto opening, a four-song EP of music from Man of La Mancha will be made available nationally as well as at the Royal Alexandra and Princess of Wales theatres.

The EP, which was recorded at Toronto's Manta Sound, features Burgess performing Dulcinea and The Impossible Dream. Frank Mackay joins him for a duet of the title song, and Gilmour performs her version of Aldonza. The EP qualifies as two-parts Cancon (AP).

Man of La Mancha was written by Dale Wasserman, with music by Mitch Leigh and lyrics by Joe Darion. It was first mounted for the Broadway stage in 1965.

Red Skelton sues over use of A Tribute To Canada

According to a Canadian Press report, lawyers for Red Skelton have filed a suit in the Federal Court of Canada on behalf of the American comic and the Canadian distributor of a tribute song he wrote about Canada.

The suit names Regal Capital Planners, Regal's owner Paul Rockel and Electrohome Ltd. It is alleged in the suit that Regal and Rockel reproduced 400 copies of the recorded tribute as well as an unknown number of copies of the written version and that a copyright notice was removed.

The suit further alleges that a copy of the tribute was given to Electrohome and broadcast on CFCA, its Kitchener radio station, in 1992. Skelton is suing over what his lawyer, Mark Walker, says was the unauthorized use of a recorded song. Skelton wrote the song, A Tribute To Canada, in 1989 after hearing the Canadian national anthem on a visit to Ottawa.

In the CP report, Walker is quoted as saying that Skelton "is not bringing this action because of the money involved. His intention is to demonstrate his outrage at the use of an artistic work in a commercial setting."

Walker also revealed that any money Skelton recovers from the suit, beyond the costs, would be donated to the families who lost relatives in the Westray mining disaster in Nova Scotia.

Regal, its owner and Electrohome, in a joint statement of defence, denied the allegations, specifically that Skelton is the author of copyright or that his copyright registrations are valid. They further argue that

O Canada, the song that is the subject of Skelton's tribute, is in the public domain.

Moe Koffman appointed to the Order of Canada

Veteran Canadian hornman Moe Koffman was appointed to the Order of Canada on July 6.

Koffman was recognized for his "outstanding achievement and service to the arts and music community." Koffman has been at the forefront of popularizing jazz music for more than 30 years.

Koffman was one of the first musicians in the world to experiment with electric woodwinds and to play two saxophones at the same time. His instruments also include piccolo, flute and baritone saxophone.

Koffman's Swinging Shepherd Blues was originally released in 1958 and it enjoyed impressive chart action in the American trades. The song was re-released on the GRT label in Canada in 1973 where it became a Top 40 item on the RPM 100 in June of that year.

Koffman, who continues to maintain a hectic schedule on the club circuit, is working on a new album expected to be released on the Duke Street label in the fall.

Jon Secada dropped by EMI Music Canada's headquarters to receive double platinum for his self-titled debut album. He's holding an award along with Ady Ordiales of Estefan Enterprises with the EMI gang in the warehouse.

Jumping the gun!!! The CRTC has proposed changes to the criteria that defines Cancon. Somehow there is an impression that these proposals have been passed and are now valid. The CRTC is quick to point out that the proposals HAVE NOT been passed, and when they are the industry will be made aware of what they are. A number of record labels have been playing with the MAPL logo to indicate the suggested changes. This too is illegal. When the proposals become law, the owners and originators of the MAPL logo will make available the revised MAPL design. Meanwhile, tampering with the logo could create difficulties. So for now, the ruling remains the same as it has for a couple of decades, and the MAPL logo and system remains the same and cannot be used without permission or revised or edited or re-designed. (EC: It couldn't be more clear!!!)

We're about to be inundated with the northern brand of that Nashville smooth-as-geese-shit hype. Columbia's Blue Shadows are Coming On Strong

I once dreamed I was on a ferry 'cross the Mersey with the Everly Brothers and a bunch of cattle rustlers. When I came to I realized I had just dozed off in my beer while listening to the Blue Shadows at a favourite local watering hole.

But the sounds coming from this Vancouver quartet can put you into a dreamlike state, evoking fond memories of The Beatles, Hank Williams and some of the sweetest harmonies this side of Don and Phil. "Hank goes to the Cavern Club" is how Jeffrey Hatcher describes the sound his band was going for when recording its debut Columbia album, *On The Floor Of Heaven*. "We'd give it a little more Cavern if it was too much Hank, and we'd give it a little more Hank if it was too Liverpool."

Hatcher's partner Billy 'Bud' Cowsill says, "It's kind of like western English. It's raw. It's a little nasty. And it's real sweet too. I call it lush but ugly. But it is country music, which is part of rock and roll. It reminds me of a musical smorgasbord."

Cowsill was a rising star as a young man in the '60s singing with the rest of his family in the Cowsills. The group had two songs, 1967's *The Rain, The Park And Other Things*, and 1969's *Hair*, hit the top of RPM's charts. But Billy found himself performing in Las Vegas in 1969 and, after an argument with his father about the group's musical direction, he was unemployed.

"I looked around at all this schmaltzy bullshit and it was not my cup of tea," he recalls. "I ended up being fired from my family and the band, which was fine because I had had enough. I had a lot of fun with the Cowsills when it was going, and I don't regret one thing except that the music, after a while, was not my idea of what I wanted to play."

For the next 20 years, Cowsill went from place to place across North America working odd jobs, performing in clubs and getting in touch with his country and rhythm & blues musical roots. He even drove trucks in the Northwest Territories for three years during

the early '70s. "I drove during the day and played bars at night," he explains. "And the reason I drove all day was to keep me from being in the bars then too."

Cowsill met stand-up bassist Elmar Spanier in Vancouver in 1982 and the two of them formed a number of different combos over the next few years. Drummer J.B. Johnson joined them and stuck around in what became known as the Billy Cowsill Band. The trio peddled demos with the help of Bumstead Productions' Larry Wanagas, but they attracted little interest. It wasn't until two years ago when Wanagas introduced Hatcher, who had recently broken up with The Big Beat, to the rest of the band that magic started happening.

Hatcher auditioned and found that his low harmonies blended with Cowsill's high harmonies so well when they sang that it often sounded like one person. "He doesn't sound like me and I don't sound like him," Cowsill says, "but a third cat crops up when we merge."

Hatcher's deft touch on the guitar and his prolific songwriting also inspired the band, which ending up changing its name to The Blue Shadows. "It wasn't the Billy Cowsill Band any more," Cowsill says, "and I was delighted to just be a member of a quartet just like my faves, the Fab Four. All I ever wanted to be when I grew up was a Beatle, and it's getting mighty close."

Within nine months of Hatcher joining the group, it had enough songs to record an album. And when Rick Camilleri, who had been appointed president of Sony Music Canada only days before, saw the band play in Vancouver in February, it was just a matter of weeks until a deal was struck between Bumstead and Columbia. The majority of *On The Floor Of Heaven* was recorded and mixed in 12 days in March at Vancouver's Bullfrog Studios. Cowsill and Hatcher produced.

The first single, *Coming On Strong*, has been serviced to country and AC radio. But Cowsill says he doesn't like music being formatted into new country, old country, AC

and other pigeonholes. "It's all rock and roll," he insists. "It's an attitude. Hank Williams was really the first Beatle."

The Blue Shadows should be touring across Canada later this summer.

MCA Records Canada to revamp sales department

MCA Records Canada will make several realignments to its sales department effective Aug. 1.

Iain Taylor will take over Pye's former Roblan/Sam The Record Man account in addition to his work with Sunrise and Pindoff.

Jeff Siemens will retain the Saturn and Handleman accounts in addition to handling HMV Canada.

Mark Whiteson will take over Taylor's Records On Wheels account in addition to his current retail responsibilities.

Brian Hetherman will take over Taylor's duties at CD Plus.

A new retail specialist for the head office will be named in early August. Another retail specialist will also be added in MCA's Alberta branch.

Michael B. & The Power to tour through summer

Ottawa's Michael B. & The Power have been taking their R&B and dance music on the road through eastern Canada, Ontario and Quebec this summer.

The band played June dates in Nova Scotia and made promotional visits to Charlottetown, Fredericton, Saint John and Bathurst. An Ontario tour begins July 21 in Kingston.

Mychael Danna firmed for Du Maurier Theatre

Toronto's Du Maurier Theatre will be the setting for a performance on July 20 by Mychael Danna, one of Canada's leading film composers.

Danna, who hasn't appeared in concert in Canada in more than three years, is probably best known for the film scores he has written for Canadian director Atom Egoyan. These include original music for *Gross Misconduct*, *Family Viewing*, *Speaking Parts*, *The Adjuster*, and *Montreal Sextet*.

Danna's 1991 release of *Sirens* gained him an international window with listings on New Age charts in American trades. His latest recording, *Skys*, was released last December and includes the themes for Egoyan's films *Speaking Parts* and *Family Viewing*.

Danna was born in Winnipeg in 1958. He began piano studies when he was 8 and sang in church choirs as a teenager. Unfortunately

he suffered a hand injury when he was 16 which ended his piano career. This was only a minor setback for the youngster, who bought a synthesizer and directed all his energies at writing music.

Danna went on to gain a degree in music composition from the University of Toronto where he won the Glenn Gould Composition Award in his final year. He recently completed five years as composer-in-residence at Toronto's McLaughlin Planetarium.

Joining Danna for his Harbourfront date will be Tim Clement on synthesizers, Ron Korb on flutes and Paul Ineson on synthesizers and bass guitar. They will perform music from *Sirens* and *Skys*, and *A Gradual Awakening*, which Danna wrote with Clement. A new work will also be introduced.






VOIVOD - Hard Rock
The Outer Limits

 The Outer Limits sees Voivod's drummer/lyricist Michel Langevin writing science fiction-inspired words to music which combines progressive rock, speed metal and a few things in between. The Lost Machine is the first single from this veteran Montreal-based power trio. Fix My Heart is loud and fast but has the structure of a pop song, which makes it my personal pick. A cover of Pink Floyd's The Nile Song is another highlight. For those who look fondly back on the early '70s, there's the 17 1/2 minute epic, Jack Luminous. The Outer Limits was produced by Mark Berry and features a 3-D cover and graphics along with a pair of mini-glasses. - SM

Award, and touring coast-to-coast with The Wonderful Grand Band (WGB) that he co-founded in the late '70s, Hynes is as solid a songwriter and performer as the rock he comes from. 
THE BLUE SHADOWS - Country/Pop

 Vancouver's Blue Shadows take traditional country music and mix it with British invasion pop, American rockabilly and timeless harmonizing. Vocalist/guitarist Billy 'Bud' Cowsill was part of the Cowsills as a teenager in the late '60s and fellow vocalist/guitarist Jeffrey Hatcher is probably best known for fronting the Big Beat. These two veterans wrote most of the material and also produced the album. Bassist Elmar Spanier and drummer J.B. Johnson make up the subtle rhythm section. The first twangy single, Coming On Strong, also features Gary Comeau on fiddle. The song has crossover potential, as do many of the 12 tracks here. Greg Leisz adds steel guitar to the title song and a country weeper called Embers. Is Anybody Here is a Roy Orbison-influenced ballad. Hatcher stands out with some fancy guitar pickin' on I Believe. The Fool Is The Last One To Know, If It Ain't Rockin' and When Will The Heartache End are all top drawer tunes. The album isn't quite as dynamic or as overtly poppy as the group's live show, but those are just quibbles. This album is stamped with my seal of approval. - SM




VIRGINIA STOREY - Rock


DINNER IS RUINED - Rock


RON HYNES - Country/Pop

 Victoria's No Means No have enjoyed more success in Europe than here at home, and this album won't attract many new fans since the only exposure it will receive will be through campus radio. The music is a melange of rock, jazz, punk and funk held together by the exemplary rhythm section of brothers Mr. Right on drums and Mr. Wrong on bass. These two instruments dominate the album and take it through a number of odd tempo changes which are augmented only slightly by guitar. The dark tones of the album are evident through such titles as Madness And Death and Kill Everyone Now. But even on songs like those, a warped sense of humour creeps through. Lullaby borrows a bit from Martha & The Vandellas Dancing In The Street and is one of the album's highlights. Machine, I Need You and Cats, Sex And Nazis are also recommended from this collection of 10 long-ish songs. - SM

 This four-piece band formed in Toronto four years ago and has since seen the world by touring through Europe and Russia. For the past 20 months the group has been signed to EMI Music Publishing Canada and this debut compact disc shows why the company has kept its faith in it. There are Led Zeppelin textures, Living Colour arrangements and Grant Davidson Ford's vocals which, at times, conjure up comparisons to Eddie Vedder of Pearl Jam. But the hybrid still comes out pretty fresh. The Top is the focus track. Rose Parade makes use of the word 'Evermore.' A small tribute to Zeppelin perhaps? Some effective tempo shifts in Legendary Love take it from pop to rock and back again. Tomorrow Comes is a biting funk-rap number about taking control of your own destiny. Shuffle Demon Perry White contributes some tenor sax to Man That Crazy Jazz. The band also covers Jimi Hendrix's Spanish Castle Magic. - SM



SCOTT WOODS - Instrumental
Fiddle Magic
 McLeod Music - 20292
 The title says it all. Scott Woods is a master

of the fiddle whether performing traditional jigs and reels, jazz standards, old-time waltzes or his own brand of jigs, reels or waltzes. Excellent material here for early morning wake-ups, introing and extroing the news or talk shows. The fiddle, without question, demands instant attention, but there's an urgency connected with Woods' flat-out simplistic performance that adds an ingredient of charm and a recognizable musical signature to each track. All tracks are key, although Pat's Country, written by fellow fiddler Roy Warhurst, is a priority track. So are Joe Garland's In The Mood, the Hamm/Bennett/Lown/Gray penning of Bye Bye Blues, Gerald Hamilton's Fergus Rag, and Woods' originals like Sarah's Waltz, Lassie's Jig, and Kendra's Wedding Waltz. Great stuff. Produced by Woods and recorded at Pizazzudio in Weston, Ont. The following session people can also take a bow: Kendra Woods Norris (harmony fiddle), Carolyn Woods (piano), Eric Mahar (guitar), Kim Brandt (bass), Steve Smith (steel guitar, dobro), and Paul Stouffer (keyboards). Lead vocalist/keyboardsist Harry Hess and guitarist/vocalist Pete Lesperance wrote these 11 songs without outside help this time, and they also produced the album along with Kevin Doyle. No Justice is the first single and video. Drummer Darren Smith takes over lead vocals on Sentimental Blvd. Lesperance gets to show off his guitar skills on the instrumental Mandy. Just Like I Planned offers something you wouldn't expect on an album like this, an a cappella performance. Change Comes Around, Had Enough and Jealousy are other tracks with airplay potential. - SM

A Wiseman isn't enough, he wants to be a Prince

The music industry could soon have a new Prince to crown.

Warner Music Canada recording artist Bob Wiseman says he is preparing to legally change his name to Prince since the pint-sized purple one has given it up in favour of something which utilizes the male and female symbols. He has also claimed that he has retired from recording and releasing new

The Fox's 25th party draws 25,000 rock fans

Wiseman says his lawyer has contacted Warner Brothers and representatives of the Minneapolis eccentric in the United States to obtain permission to use the name.

"Since he's changed his name, it's just sitting there in limbo," Wiseman says. "People make a lot of waste and they take it to a big dumpsite or something. At least I'm going to do something with it. There are a lot of people who are upset because they don't have a face any more for that name. So I think I'm helping out the world by doing this."

Wiseman's decision isn't totally based on his pro-recycling stance, however. "I've been trying to get a deal in the states for a little while now and a lot of people don't know who I am. And most of them know that name so it should help me."

Entertainment lawyer Paul Sanderson says Wiseman changing his name to Prince "creates a few entertaining legal wrinkles that would have to be overcome. If they approached Prince and he consented, then it could probably be done."

But Sanderson doesn't think Prince would agree to abandon the name because it's still used on back catalogue items, even if he won't use it in the future. "Trying to trade off on someone's reputation is what it boils down to. There's no question that Prince is a trademark whether it's registered or not.

"It's a fundamental issue in the trademark law that you can't cause confusion in the marketplace resulting from the use of the name. And in this case I think there would be."

Wiseman told his parents of his plan before revealing it to anyone else. "They were quite excited. They said they thought it would be a better name than Bob anyways."

Wiseman is currently composing music for The Kid's Wildlife Show which airs on the Nickelodeon network in the United States. He also produced the new Andrew Cash album which hits the streets on July 27.

Even if the announcement of the attempted name change ends up as little more than a way to stir up some cheap publicity, it's already achieved early success. Wiseman claims to have done interviews with the New York Post and Rolling Stone, and other publications are also apparently interested.

Warner Music Canada spokesperson Steve Waxman was unaware of Wiseman's bid for the royal name.

But if Wiseman is successful with the bid to change his name to Prince, he was asked if it could mean heavier grooves and a more dance-oriented approach to his music.

"There's never been a question of funkiness in my shows," was the reply.



Greg Haraldson, program director of Calgary's Country 105, CKRY-FM, reported an impressive industry turnout on July 5 for the launch of a charitable recording project called A Song For Brent.

Brent Berezay, for whom the society was founded, was severely injured in a rodeo accident at age 15 and became a quadriplegic as the result of his injuries. Although he is

unable to communicate, the youngster apparently responds to country music, particularly those images portrayed on videos.

When Berezay's story unfolded at a songwriting workshop held during Canadian Country Music Week '92 in Calgary, the response was overwhelming. Ron Irving, Ralph Murphy and Rick Beresford, well-known songwriters and producers, who were taking part in the workshop were so inspired they took on the project of writing A Song For Brent.

Cindy Church, an Alberta singer/songwriter who was also attending the conference, was approached to record the song. The recording session took place at Calgary's Soundwerkes Studio with Gilles Godard producing. A CD single has been


