BMG and Zomba embroiled in 'N Sync dispute

A group including BMG Entertainment, BMG Ariola Munich, Trans Continental and Trans Continental head Louis J. Pearlman have filed a \$150 million lawsuit against Zomba, company co-founder Clive Calder, and the members of 'N Sync, alleging breach of contract and potential trademark infringement.

The lawsuit is derived from 'N Sync's recent decision to sign with the Zomba-owned Jive Records label in September. According to the papers filed in US District Court in Orlando, Florida, the group was signed to BMG worldwide and RCA in the US, via a production deal with Trans Continental.

The suit is also aiming for an attempted injunction, which would prevent the band or Zomba from any activity that would utilize the 'N Sync name or image in connection with any activities such as recording, live performance, merchandising and television appearances. According to the suit, Trans Continental is the 'sole owner of the 'N Sync mark' in over 20 countries.

Also included in the suit are allegations that the band members, whom Pearlman 'assembled', received various services including songwriting, vocal coaching, choreography, publicity and private

Toronto Star Television to begin webcasting

Beginning November 30, Toronto Star Television will begin broadcasting video over the internet from its new facilities at One Yonge Street in Toronto. Internet surfers will be able to take in full-motion streaming video of news, documentaries, promotional pieces, live events and interviews at torontostartv.com.

The programming will be distributed over the 'net via the Intervu Network, a patented delivery network for streaming media content. The network is owned and operated by Intervu Inc., the leading service provider for internet audio and video delivery solutions.

According to Toronto Star TV vice-president and general manager Don Shafer, "With the advent of cable modems and high-speed access, adding video into web sites will be the norm, not the exception, in the new millenium. TSTV is an expert in direct response television marketing, as well as digital video production. With our new studio and production facilities, we can produce all types of quality programming."

Toronto Star Television currently serves approximately 1.3 million households in the greater Toronto area on the Rogers and Shaw Cablesystems.

tutoring, all paid for by Trans Continental after the band entered into an exclusive agreement with the company in 1996.

The initial agreement led to a European/Asian distribution deal with BMG's German affiliate, BMG Ariola, for the group's first album, which sold more than one million units in Europe and southeast Asia. The group debuted in the US in March of '98.

That agreement with Trans Continental granted the company all merchandising rights relating to the group, according to the suit, and called for the group members to receive 50% of net royalties and net receipts.

In March of this year, the group began renegotiating their deal with Trans Continental, but were apparently unable to come to terms. The group then exercised what they claimed was a "right to terminate the (contract) and refused to record and deliver to the plaintiffs any further records", on the grounds that Trans Continental had not secured a US distribution deal within 18 months of the original agreement signed in '96.

Trans Continental counters with the statement that the deal signed with BMG Ariola was in fact a US distribution deal. The band disagreed, and promptly signed with Zomba/Jive in September.

The members of 'N Sync released a press statement on October 13 in response to the suit, commenting: "Trans Continental's conduct with regard to 'N Sync is the most glaring, overt and callous example of artist exploitation that the music

industry has seen in a long time. We look forward to the opportunity to air the full facts and will do so in the weeks to come."

In response, BMG Entertainment issued a statement saying, "'N Sync is a BMG act, and our marketing and distribution resources helped to make the group into a global sensation, particularly in the United States, where the group has sold more than eight million albums. 'N Sync is a terrific act with enormous potential, and we hope that everyone will do the right thing so the group can be where it belongs, which is onstage, rather than in a court of law."

What adds to the confusion of the situation is, of course, that BMG is Jive's North American distributor, and owns a 20% stake in Jive. Also, the addition of 'N Sync to the Jive label has apparently not gone over well with Jive headliners the Backstreet Boys, who are rumoured to be looking for a way out of their deal with Jive.

According to published reports, attorneys for the Backstreet Boys have supposedly issued a letter to Jive co-founder Clive Calder, claiming that the act is no longer on the label, since Jive committed a breach of their initial contract. Although the proposed move of 'N Sync to Jive is cited as one of the reasons for the Backstreet Boys discontent, there are apparently other factors involved.

Representatives of BMG Music Canada and Zomba/Jive Canada declined to comment on the proceedings.

The Barra MacNeils join the Oasis roster

Oasis Entertainment have announced an agreement to distribute the next two albums from Nova Scotia artists The Barra MacNeils. The first release from the former PolyGram artists will be The Christmas Album, due out on November 9.

The natives of Sydney Mines, Nova Scotia released their first independent album in 1986, while still earning their music degrees at Mount Allison University. After two more independent releases, the group signed with PolyGram.

Their PolyGram debut, Closer To Paradise, featured a crossover hit in Darling Be Home Soon, which pushed the album to gold status in Canada. That album was followed by 1994's The Traditional Album, showcasing the group's top-notch musicianship.

The Question, released in 1995, took the group in a more pop-oriented direction, led by the radio success of The Ballad Of Lucy Jordan. However, many felt that their move into the pop vein took

away from the group's distinctive celtic feel. The Question was also the group's last album for PolyGram. The most recent Barra MacNeils release was the 1997 indie compilation Until Now.

Despite not having a new release in the last four years, the band has continued to tour throughout Canada, including an impressive 100 dates in the latter half of 1999. One of their most recent gigs was before 2,000 people at the World's Largest Thanksgiving Turkey Dinner in Weyburn (Sask.), an event now entered in the Guinness Book Of World Records.

Oasis has also planned for a February 2000 release of a new studio album from the group, timed to coincide with the East Coast Music Awards.

Oasis president Bill Ott commented, "When it comes to Celtic music, there are none better than the Barra MacNeils. I'm proud and pleased to welcome the MacNeil family to their new family at Oasis Entertainment."



Universal claims Labatt staging concerts despite agreement

Despite putting the likes of the Red Hot Chili Peppers, Moist and Smash Mouth on stage in front of fans, Labatt Breweries claim they are not putting on concerts and are not in the concert promotions business, according to a Financial Post article.

The claims were part of a statement of defence filed with the Superior Court of Justice the week of October 11th, refuting allegations made by Universal Concerts Canada in a \$10.6 million lawsuit they brought against Labatt. The allegations claim that Labatt breached an agreement in which they promised to stay out of the concert business.

The battle began with the 1996 sale by Labatt of BCL Entertainment Corp. to Universal, and the non-competition pacts which were a part of the sale.

Universal, who are concert promotion partners with Labatt beer rival Molson Inc., claim that Labatt are violating the agreement by staging concerts. In response, Labatt say that they are not, in fact, concerts, but 'musical performances'. They claim that the only attendees were BlueLine contest

winners, and that no tickets were sold for the event.

According to the Financial Post story (Oct. 18), Labatt said, "These events have to do with the business of selling beer, which is Labatt's principal business and in respect of which it engages in competition with Molson and others."

According to Labatt, the non-competition deal struck with Universal/Molson does not cover its 'multi-faceted advertising campaign', which includes live music. And even if the non-competition clause is found to impose a restraint, Labatt argues that "it is not unenforceable as an unreasonable restraint of trade."

In the same statement, Labatt said that it became

apparent that Universal's objective is to extend the terms of the non-competition agreement beyond the scope of the live concert promotion business, thus limiting Labatt's ability to promote beer sales, in competition with Molson and others.

Universal, in response, pointed out that Labatt launched three shows to promote Labatt's Blue beer - the Chili Peppers in Toronto, Moist in London (ON) and Smash Mouth in Ottawa.

The Universal suit is claiming general damages of \$10 million, special damages of \$500,000, an interlocutory and permanent injunction to keep Labatt from staging other live music events, and exemplary or punitive damages of \$100,000 plus costs and other relief.

First portable MP3 player ready for car

Atlanta-based digital interactive equipment provider i2Go.com has announced the introduction of the world's first portable digital audio (MP3) player designed for interactive use in the car. The player is expected to be available, via catalogues and regular retailers, by the holiday season.

The new player, called the eGo, will allow customers a variety of audio and digital options in their car, in addition to managing and listening to music. When combined with i2Go's MP3Agent desktop software application, the eGo enables consumers to plug into a personal computer, and select programming and play lists from the i2Go web site (which can be downloaded for later play on the car stereo).

The new player will also have unique features such as MP3Mail, MP3Chat and e-mail2Go, which will allow users to convert e-mails into audio, and record responses or notes as MP3 files, which can then be attached to an e-mail when the eGo is re-connected to your computer.

At the moment, there are approximately half a million MP3 portable players in the market, with forecasts pushing that number to 32 million units by 2003. MP3 refers to the technology which compresses high-quality audio into a smaller computer file for transmission and distribution over

the net.

According to Sam Johnson, founder and CEO of i2Go.com, "Imagine being in your car on the way to work and being able to listen to a program of audio content that you produced: you listen to your e-mails, and respond to them, switch to a different menu and hear an audio product briefing that you can append with dictated notes. Next in your program are some songs you scheduled, followed by news and information on your selected topics.

"Our web site will enhance the personalized listening experience by providing a wide variety of audio content, from financial and business news and your hometown sports team update, to audio books and more. It's the internet to go, in the car."

The eGo player will retail for approximately \$299 (US), with a 64 MB Compact Flash II memory card.

The World Is Not Enough once again features Pierce Brosnan as 007, alongside Robert Carlyle (The Full Monty), Denise Richards (Wild Things), John Cleese and Dame Judy Dench. The film premieres on November 8th.

The score for the soundtrack was composed and performed by David Arnold (Tomorrow Never Dies, Independence Day). The lead single by Garbage is being targeted at CHR, AC and modern rock radio. The video for the single, featuring footage from the film, will be serviced to MuchMusic in October.

According to MCA president Jay Boberg, "Every James Bond film is a vital piece of popular culture, and, as a life-long Bond fan, I'm thrilled that we will release the soundtrack to The World Is Not Enough. Garbage is one of the best contemporary bands, and they turned in a bravura performance on the title track."



In a recent interview with the Toronto Sun, 'N Sync's Justin Timberlake (in Toronto filming a made-for-TV movie) commented on the proceedings publicly, saying, "It's a screwball business and there are a lot of players who will straight-up lie to you.

'N Sync, who have sold more than 8 million albums in North America, recently wrapped up their seven-month tour at Toronto's Molson Amphitheatre (Sept. 4). A new album that was tentatively scheduled for late 1999 has been pushed back to the year 2000.

This could very well be the hottest compilation of "rock" artists of the '90s. The headliners that brought the fans to Rome are featured on this 2-CD, 33-tracks set, with some obvious non-rockers who were on the bill to appease the minority of concert goers. It's hard to capture the stench of Woodstock99 and blazing heat that heightened the intensity of the weekend festivities on CD, but it was the music that drew everyone there, and this set compliments the talent of the artists that were part of it, including tracks by Korn, Offspring, Red Hot Chili Peppers, Kid Rock, Bush, Megadeath, Metallica, Dave Matthews Band, Rage Against The Machine, Limp Bizkit, Creed, Everlast, Everclear, Live etc. On the domestic front, Alanis Morissette's So Pure and Our Lady Peace's Superman's Dead are on the set but NO HIP. A must for the 200,000+ ticket holders and everyone else who had the misfortune of missing it. Nicely packaged with a 16 page booklet featuring shots from the weekend of the bands. - SL




MELANIE C

Ever since the Spice Girls reached the big time, the inevitable question has ensued - who is the best singer in the group? While there are still some stubborn Scary Spice supporters out there, the masses seem to agree that Sporty does have the best pipes going amongst the five (including the now-departed Ginger). With the release of this solo outing, Virgin is hoping that Spice-mania hasn't died, and that Melanie can do considerably better numbers than those posted by the aforementioned Geri. What is clear from this release is that Melanie C is going for a slightly tougher, more aggressive sound than her former Spice pal. There's plenty of whiplash-type guitar sounds on this record, and the rhythm section has also been given a decidedly strong push. These traits are most noticeable on the first single, Goin' Down, in which Melanie's voice is channelled through some type of

computerized fuzzbox, which adds to the rough hewn effect of the song. If they're looking for a second single, the most obvious choice would seem to be the more pop-sounding title track, which features a terrific hook in the chorus, and is probably the most Spice-sounding song on the album (very similar to Viva Forever, off SpiceWorld). Elsewhere, there's some other nice ditties here as well, including I Turn To You, If That Were Me and Ga Ga (not to be confused with Radio Ga Ga). If there's one quibble, it's that the production on some of these tracks tends to overwhelm her voice at times, and her voice is the one thing that separated Mel C from the rest of the Spice ladies. That was also apparent at her recent showcase at Toronto's Warehouse, where the mixing board mavens once again had the instruments so cranked up that Melanie's voice was barely audible. Why not turn it down, just a tad, and let the girl sing. Afterall, that's why she's there. -RR

ERIC CLAPTON
-Rock/Pop
Chronicles: The Best Of Eric Clapton

He's over fifty now, he's survived addictions, near-death experiences, tragic personal loss, and a host of other woes, and he's emerged from it all with his career in better shape now than it's ever been. Like that proverbial fine wine, Clapton seems to be getting better with age, and he's settled into a comfortable



existence in the pop adult market. The eerie strains of Layla, the hefty, bombastic sounds of White Room and Sunshine Of Your Love, have been replaced by the more simplified accessibility of recent efforts like My Father's Eyes, Change The World and Tears In Heaven. Clapton's career, in many ways, can be viewed as the prototypical rock and roll story, but unlike doomed contemporaries like Hendrix, Moon, Morrison and so many others, Clapton miraculously lived to tell the tale. Unlike previous Best Of collections, this latest release focuses on the more recent stages of Slowhand's career, deriving much of its content from his trend-setting Unplugged album, his movie soundtrack work, and his most relevant studio work. Scanning over the list of tracks on the album, it may surprise you to see just how many top hits Clapton has provided in just the past several years. We all know about songs like Change The World and Blue Eyes Blue (the most current hit, from the Runaway Bride Soundtrack), but it's easy to forget about other recent favourites like Pretending and It's In The Way That You Use It, which are also included here. Of course, a current Clapton Best Of wouldn't be complete without the Unplugged version of Layla, not to mention the sweet Unplugged rendition of Before You Accuse Me. In addition to the aforementioned Blue Eyes Blue, the other notable new addition on this record is I Get Lost, written and recorded especially for this album. Clapton, himself, would probably be the first to admit that it was questionable whether he'd ever make it to the end of the seventies. Now that the end of the millennium is here, it's good to see that the man they call God is still producing some great music. -RR



SPIRIT OF THE WEST
Hit Parade

Over the course of their surprisingly lengthy history, Spirit Of The West have been one of the most decidedly underrated bands in the country. Oh sure, they've culled something of a cult following, although cult may be too minute a word for it. Whenever the band played a gig in any part of this country, particularly western Canada, they were bound to attract a very loyal legion of fans, one that soaked up anything the group decided to release. While grade A commercial success always seemed slightly elusive, the fine folks at Warner never ceased in their unwavering support. And make no mistake, that support was well deserved. Messrs Kelly and Mann have always rated a place amongst the upper echelon of Canadian songwriters, and the evidence is clear for all to see on this latest release, a tidy summation of the group's efforts over the past decade, from Save This House to the most-recent Weights And Measures. In their earliest incantations, SOTW was clearly building on their celtic roots, which can be traced through tracks like Save This House, Home For A Rest and Goodbye Grace. But by the time the band had shifted full-speed into the nineties, their music began to take on a more pop-oriented flavour. The most obvious results were found on Faithlift, perhaps the most commercially accessible album they've ever done, highlighted by tracks such as Five Free Minutes, And If Venice Is Sinking and Sadness Grows. That commercial/pop tinge was carried over onto Two Headed, symbolized here in *Wishing Line* and *Unplugged*. And with the ambitious *Open Heart Symphony* album, the band took their celtic/pop style to a more dramatic setting, represented here with

Williamson's Garage. For serious SOTW fans, the bonus here is the inclusion of a quartet of previously unreleased tracks recorded with the Vancouver Symphony - *Political, Venice, The Crawl* and *That's Amore* (yes, that *That's Amore*). We hope this doesn't mean the end of the westies with Warner, because their songwriting talents are too rich to be discarded hastily. -RR



CSNY
Looking Forward

That was how much for concert tickets...how much? Okay, so maybe CSNY have surpassed The Eagles in the overpriced-tickets-for-a-'70s-act category. But at least the good news is that the group has released an entire album of new material, which at least provides solid motivation for the tour. There's never been any doubt as to the talents of these four songwriters - clearly, four of the best that have ever come down the pike. The only stumbling blocks, in terms of a reunion, were whether the four of them could actually stand in the same room together, and whether they'd all still be alive (and out of jail) by the time the chance for a new project came around. That's not a shot - it's merely a statement of fact that this foursome has been through the ringer, and then some, and it's a minor miracle that they're able to come together 30 years after they first worked together to do this record. The music is reasonably predictable, still banking on the pop/country style that served the group well back in the *Judy Blue Eyes*, *Helpless*, *Our House*, *Ohio* days. The ability to harmonize has wavered somewhat in the three decades since, which is only natural, given that all of these guys are nearing senior citizenry. Some of the tracks were recorded as far back as 1996, including the calypso-esque *Faith In Me*

STONE TEMPLE PILOTS
No.4

After many trials and tribulations, which shall go unmentioned here, the infamous Mr. Weiland is back with his crew, providing further evidence that this band is among the best of the modern rock genre. STP doesn't need much of an introduction to most of its fans, as loyal a fan base as there is in the rock empire. But with this new release, the Pilots may actually push the edges of the envelope on that fan base. No.4 is one of the best rock releases we've heard yet this year, a far cry from the normal guitar-bashing melodrama that's heard from most of today's modern rock mavens. STP can get down and dirty, but they have a good sense for a clean hook and strong chordal lines, as evidenced on the lead track and single, *Down*, which churns along atop a wicked bass and drum line which kicks the rear end of most of the competition. But, although the Pilots can ram it down your throat with the best of 'em, they can also provide some fine melodic moments. Tracks such as *Heaven & Hot Rods*, *Sex & Violence* and *Sour Girl* represent some of the finest examples of Robert DeLeo's musical creativity. And bringing all the tracks a notch higher is Weiland's inspired lyrical content. Weiland doesn't go for the ambient, articulate ambition of other modern rock writers. Instead, he has a keen knack for blending lyric with music, with the phrasing perfectly matching the rhythm of the track. Weiland's pipes, occasionally shaky on some of their earlier work, are in full-working order on this release, giving hope that maybe all his earlier troubles are behind him. Given the band's track record, and the superb quality of the work here, this album should be bound for the top of the charts. -RR



(written by Stills), which leads off the album in fine style. In fact, Stills provides some of the best work on this release, with his *Seen Enough* and *No Tears Left* (the lead single) being top-notch material. Neil Young's *Slowpoke* is also worthy single material, although it sounds eerily similar to *Heart Of Gold* (right down to the guitar chords). However, the work provided by Nash and Crosby isn't the most potent pop we've heard lately, sounding a tad frail and hasty. *Dream For Him* (Crosby) provides some interesting reflections on Crosby's relationship with his son, but the song surrounding it doesn't do the words justice. spree. The sound is decidedly hard, as is all the Bush material, and Rossdale doesn't waste a lot of time on little things like hooks or melodies. This is just straight-ahead, gut-crunching stuff, that the kids will just eat up. The *Chemicals Between Us* has been taken as the lead single, and it's about the most radio-accessible track on the record, other than perhaps the first track on the disc, *Warm Machine* (that's Warm, not War), which is the kind of deep, sombre stuff that today's melancholy teens just love. After the punishing sounds of *Jesus Online*, *Chemicals*, *English Fire* and *Space Travel* (featuring vocals from Gwen Stefani), the album takes a brief, quiet, time-out for the almost placid *40 Miles From The Sun*, featuring a very plaintive voice atop a near-naked background. But the fun begins again with *Prizefighter* (an obvious second-single choice), followed by the equally tasty *Disease Of The Dancing Cats*. *Altered States* is just that, a mind-twisting track exploring numerous different sounds and 'scapes. But then *Dead Meat* provides a solid segue into the closing tracks, *Letting The Cables Sleep* and *Mindchanger*. Rossdale appears to be at the top of his game, and Bush will be tough to beat at rock radio. -RR



KIM MITCHELL -Rock

Beer guzzlers take note, Mr. Mitchell is back, and he's landed at a brand new residence. The fine folks at Oasis are hoping that this latest release from Mitchell will be just the kickstart the new company needs to make a mark in the business. Mitchell has been a mainstay in the business for some twenty years, ever since those wonderful glory days in the seventies with Max Webster (forget that fear of gravity). In fact, it seems hard to believe that Mitchell's first solo record (*Akimbo Alogo*) came out all the way back in 1984, led by the anthemic *Go For Soda*. Now, 15 years later, Mitchell has produced this, his eighth solo effort, and he and Oasis are hoping that it will reestablish the Wild Party at rock radio, where he was locked in for so many years. The title track, a straight-ahead Mitchell-esque rocker, has been taken as the first single, although the *Lone Ranger* title might scare some programmers off. Another obvious single choice is the lead track, *Monkey Shine*, which has a strong hook emblematic of Mitchell's best work. Mitchell wrote many of these tunes with longtime southern Ontario rocker Andy Curran, who also provides some backing vocals. And another old cronic, Lisa Dalbello, chips in with her backing talents as well. Most of the tunes here are what you'd expect from Mitchell - no frills rock with the emphasis on simple guitar lines and clearly-defined melodies. After the aforementioned title track and *Monkey Shine*, the other obvious single candidate is *Cold Reality*, a fine song containing the most poignant lyrics on the record. So for all you old Webster/Mitchell fans out there...check...check this out. -RR

It goes without saying that the rising (or falling) fortunes of many a band tend to hinge on the impressionable image of their lead vocalists. Rossdale's fuzzy-wall-of-guitar sound is the mainstay of this band, and it's clearly evident on this latest release on the Trauma label, which the Universal folks are hoping will score some serious numbers during the fourth-quarter holiday spending

Factor in the producer names of Chris Farren, Humberto Gatica and J. Richard Hutt, who also enjoy producer credits, and you get the idea. Foster, of course, is the magic word. Is *Lace* destined for the mainstream of country? Time will tell. They are not, as some broads have to hide behind their first names?) and Texas bombshell Corbi Dynann, have secured a niche with country programmers (on this side of the border) and they aren't remotely similar. Firstly, Mahood is numero uno when it comes to upfront vocals and the added fiddle enhancement by Dyann brings their moment in the spotlight into full bloom. Corbi's contribution goes without question. Her's is the Texas drill, full-bodied vocals and a Texas honky-tonk connection that gives this trio that extra nudge up when it comes to capturing that rich southern belt of the US that's so important to country artists looking for that breakout market. Whoever programmed this CD was a true visionary. If they get out and do the old promo trip thing, they could realize at least four singles, which

isn't too bad for a debut. That could be accomplished with *You Could Have Had Me*, *He Can't Talk Without His Hands*, *Swept Away* and *True Love* (Never Goes Out Of Style), all dynamite tracks. But don't overlook *Kiss 'Em All*, and I'll tell you why when it's a hit. The Cancon properties are a little hazy, but don't let that stand in the way of great country programming. -WG





Lang's vocal depth and projection enhanced by her flawless interpretation of the song message borders on being of divine right as she attracts the listener into her inner sanctum. Interesting too is that this is Lang's sixth album, dating back to only 1991 with the release of *Live At The Yellow Door*. Lang, of course, has been doing her folk thing since the '60s and '70s where she became popular as a performer at festivals and clubs in both Canada and the US. Eight of the tracks here are Lang originals, our favourites being the title track, *Hidin' & Denyin'*, *King Of The Castle* and *Lost & Found*. Those who dare to cover a Bob Dylan song, do so at their peril, and not many succeed. However, Lang's spin on Dylan's



Love Minus Zero/No Limit, one of his lesser known works, is a finely crafted tribute to the folkmaster of the '60s, before he was influenced by Edison. Lang also does a masterful job on interpreting the lyrics of David Perett (aka Danny Farmer) on *You Gave Me A Rainbow* and *Bob Snider's When The Wind Blows*. The session players are superb: son Jason (lead, electric, acoustic, baritone, slide guitars), David Baxter (other guitars, bass), Michelle Joseph (drums) and Bazil Donovan and Matthew Poulakakis (bass). Lori Yates, Linda Feijo, Lang and Baxter supplied backing vocals. Produced by Baxter and recorded at The Rogue in Toronto. -WG

A CD reissue from 1981 in which Warren Vaché joins his smooth but occasionally blistering cornet and flugelhorn with the piano of Hank Jones, the bass of George Duvivier and drums of Allan Dawson in a tasty and tasteful, short - only eight tracks -- programme of pop standards save for the title cut by Hank Jones. Four masters on the same enterprise might have clashed artistically, but all is as it should be here as they meld together beautifully. Which isn't to say there are no solo breaks. There are indeed and all of them excellent but it's the ensemble work that leaves one admiring and enjoying. -BW

Currently, CD Warehouse is the third-largest music retailer in the United States, behind Minnesota-based Musicland (1998 revenues of \$1.85 billion US) and New York-based Trans World Entertainment Corp. (1998 revenues of \$698.5 million US).

The key element in the deal is the merging of the two companies web sites. The CDPlus.com site specializes in new releases, while the CD Warehouse site specializes in catalogue marketing.

Shania Twain maintains her superstar status with *Come On Over*, the title track of her Mercury album, debuting on the RPM Country 100 at #1. The album, which has sold more than 17 million units worldwide, two million in Canada alone, continues to command the top of the album chart after 101 weeks. Twain's albums have collectively sold more than 30 million units worldwide. Universal/Mercury adds to the promotion with the release of Twain's *Come On Over Video Collection*. Besides a tour this past summer where she was seen by an estimated two million fans, she's been on the cover of *Rolling Stone*, *People*, *Glamour* and *Cosmopolitan*. Her second CBS television special is scheduled for Nov. 25 and she has appearances on *Letterman* (Nov. 22) and *Rosie* (Nov. 23). The Video Collection features nine music videos from her current release including an exclusive new version of *You've Got A Way* which has yet to be aired on CMT and M3.

The **KAT Cool New Country** (CKDX-FM) in Newmarket, Ontario, has received approval from the CRTC to increase the station's "effective radiated power" from 500 to 11,300 watts. Station Manager Gary Gamble indicates the power increase will allow the station "to compete effectively within the

market," which will take in all of York Region and surrounding area which includes a major share of the very lucrative Toronto market. The station switched formats from dance to new country in July of this year, a format that has obviously found favour with country music fans.

Country legend Hoyt Axton passed away at his home in Hamilton, Montana this past Tuesday (Oct. 26). Mr. Axton, who was 61, had suffered several heart attacks in the past which were complicated by diabetes. Mr. Axton first gained recognition as a folk singer and writer in the early '60s, with the penning of *Greenback Dollar* and *The Pusher*. His first #1 hit on the RPM Country 100 was his A&M single *When The Morning Comes* (June 29, 1974). He also charted with *Boney Fingers*, *Flesh Of Fire* and *Evangelina*. He released 26 albums over his career. Axton was the son of Mae Boren Axton, a noted songwriter and entertainment executive who died in 1997.

Denise Murray is on release with *Boom* written by her band's drummer Murray Melanson, the first single taken from her upcoming *Loggerhead* album

titled *Under The Moon*. Produced by Jeff Nystrom, the single was recorded in Hudson, Quebec with what is fondly referred to a "Denise's house band": Melanson; guitarist Dan Mailllet; keyboardist Mario Robichaud; and bassist Etienne LeBlanc. Since the release of her debut album in 1997, Murray has been nominated nine times for CCMA Awards, East Coast Music Awards and Big Country Awards. The highlight of her career came in February of this year when she was named Artist of the Year at the East Coast Music Awards. Murray, who is the mother of two children, lives on the outskirts of Moncton, New Brunswick. Paul Kennedy of Kennedy Artist Promotions in Dartmouth/Halifax is tracking the new single. One of the first to add the single was Kim Lacroix, music director at Radio Thunder Bay (K1XX 105).

Cancon single (AP) was taken from Gracie's album Identity released on the and is the follow-up to She's All I Got, now descending the chart (#63) after 19 weeks. Paul Kennedy (see above) is doing the tracking.

Cathy Booth introduces herself with a three-song CD that showcases her exquisite vocal properties targeted to the country-rock market. Tougher Than Steel is key, a cosy, fall/winter outing that should attract country programmers if released as the focus single. The A/C crossover possibilities are also obvious with this track. Showbiz has a harder edge and Dance, should gain prominence at the club level. All the songs are originals from Dave Bacha who produced the album and is heard on guitars and background vocals. Bacha is accompanied by some of the best pickers in country: steelman Al Brisco; drummer Wally Cameron; Ken DeSantos on keys; bassist Darel Peterson; saxman Rick Morrison and Sharon Lee Williams on background vocals. The tracks were recorded at Phase One Studios in Toronto. Booth's classically-trained voice is further enhanced by the free-form creativity of musical theatre gained through numerous roles she has played over the last few years and which adds to her immaculate vocal control. Tragedy struck Booth early in life. Her husband's life was taken tragically shortly after they were married which left her to support twins, a boy and girl, which she does as a high school teacher by day and performing by night. She admits however to finding inspiration from her experiences which led her into songwriting. She hopes to include some of her own material when she releases her full-length CD. Booth is currently mapping a marketing campaign with Phil Meagher hoping to map out a time-line and business plan for her CD which will include the funding and producing of a video and the release of a single.

Dan Nash who releases on the Calgary-based Boa label, has taken Dreaming Of You as his next focus single, the follow-up to So Easy that charted on both the RPM Country 100 and A/C charts. Nash has also gained recognition in Europe where he is charting on the Hot '99 Independent Country Artists Chart. The new single, a Nash original, was taken from his self-titled album which he also produced.

Farmer's Daughter should pick up retail action with the release this week of their Best Of CD on the Universal label. The CD includes the most successful songs in their career. Two new songs were added: Walkin' In The Sunshine, written by legendary Nashville writers Kostas and Jeff Hanna (lead singer of the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band) and You And Only You, a solo penning by Kostas. Sunshine has already hit hard with country programmers and bullets up to #50 this week on the RPM Country 100. The trio won numerous awards over their

career, their first, a Big Country Award in 1997 as Group of the Year, followed the same year with a CCMA award in the same category. The following year (1998) they won a Juno as Best Country Group and this year won six British Columbia Country Music Awards.

Lonestar has the biggest mover this week. Smile, the latest single taken from Lonely Grill, their new BNA release, jumps up to #39 from #83 after only three weeks. Smile follows Amazed, which is now slowly descending the chart (#42) after 28 weeks.

McRhea, who debuted on the chart last week at #89 with It's Your Life, bullets up to #81 this week. It was reported last week that the single is included on their album Smoking Can Kill You. The single will actually be included on their new album as yet untitled which the band is currently putting together. It's Your Life was released as a CD single.

Inside Country will launch its fifth season on Country Music Television (CMT) on Nov. 2 at 8 pm (to be repeated at 11 pm). The premiere episode features exclusive interviews and performances by Canadians Ian Tyson and Heartbreak Hill, along with John Lloyd Miller, director of the Johnny Cash biopic. Chas Hay, who created, produced and writes the series, continues as host. This season, for the first time, is being produced by higherground productions corp., of which Hay is president, and who explains; "By taking over full control of the program, I am able to tell the stories that I'd like to tell and focus on the best in country and roots music. I can spend more time shooting and editing so that we get the look and feel that I think Inside Country should have." The series is also broadcast in the US on Great American Country (GAC) where it will be premiering its second season in January of next year. higherground productions was established in February of this year as a full-service television and film production company. Other current properties include the Blue Rodeo television special, the Canada Comedy Awards, and the documentary film King for a Day, an examination of Elvis tribute artists. Sean Hogan continues to make chart progress with his latest single, Tired Of Leavin, which bullets up to #29 this week. Hogan, who lives in Victoria, has also firmed a number of upcoming dates for himself and his five-piece band, appropriately named Sean

Hogan & His Rockin' Quintet. A Nov. 5 date has been firmed for a concert in conjunction with CJVR Melfort, Saskatchewan, followed by a showcasing at the Western Canadian Fairs and Rodcos Convention at The Radisson in Saskatoon (6), a concert at The Pump in Regina (9), and Winnipeg's Club Regent Casino (Dec. 3) and at the MacPhillips Street Station Casino (4).

Michael T. Wall, The Singing Newfoundlander, has released a 26-track CD of Christmas Memories which features his daughters Sarah and Sabrina.
