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Getting Greased With "The Coug"

There isn't much hope for John Cougar Mellencamp to ever grow up. After spending 32 years of his life trying to prove a grocery list of things to a supermarket full of people, all the eggs are in his basket. But you'd never know it to speak to him. As his career has snaked through the rock and roll mire, he's gathered some impressive accolades. He's sold enough vinyl to give every man, woman, and child in his hometown of Bloomington, Indiana, a stack of 20 or more. John's become a teen idol, and also stemmed the tide of critics by showing that he's nobody's fool, American or otherwise. He's also done, by his own account, some pretty dumb things.

Stupid human trick number one was signing with David Bowie's management and changing the Mellencamp to "Cougar" and calling himself "Johnny." Writing "This Time" isn't one of John's favorite remembrances either. Another disaster in the making is Cougar's straying from the formula that led to the commercial success of *American Fool* in making his current record, *Uh-Huh*.

To find what's so dumb you would have to understand J.C. If you had his phone number, you'd call him up right now and go ridin'

Harley's or take a hike to the local cafe. This down-home, good-natured naivete has gotten John into some embarrassing situations; however, his no-compromise approach has been musically rewarding. (After being hounded by the host of a TV interview show, John got up and walked out, only to see the show later on with his on-camera temper tantrum the only uncut part.) He's more concerned with what his high-school buddies are up to than what he ought to be doing to insure his reign as one of rock's better songwriters.

John Mellencamp loves America. This feeling is the subject matter, the fire behind, and the reason for his success. Much of his material, up to this point, has been rooted in America's heartland. With the notable exception of "Pink Houses," the songwriting base of *Uh-Huh* is much broader. Rather than take you into the midwestern back yard, John's developed the ability to open the door to your neighbor's house. Instead of becoming the cosmopolitan prince, John's happier holding court as the jester in the kingdom of Bloomington. Where many people spend their lives trying to grow up, you might say that John's more concerned with getting back into the womb.

Pop Star of the Month

Rich Sutton: How would you describe what 1983's been like for you?

John Cougar: Where have I been? Where have I been; that's pretty much the truth, too. When we did this record we said, "Let's go in and cut some tracks, and if we come up with anything we'll put it out, and if not we'll wait until the first of the year." We recorded about 15 songs; we liked nine of 'em, and we said, "Hell, nine's an album; let's put it out!"

RS: Didn't you write a lot more than that? Didn't you write like 200, or something like that?

JC: Well, what the deal was with that was, Howard Bloom (Cougar's publicist) was talking to me and said, "How many songs do you think you wrote for this thing?" And I said, "Well, I wrote a million 'cause I'm always writing, y'know?" We did 170-something shows last year, and I'm always writing on the road and always writing at home, so that was just a rough guesstimation of how many times I sat down and wrote something and committed it to paper. Hell, John Prine came over to my house; him and I sat down and wrote in two days probably ten songs. We threw all of 'em away.

RS: Why'd you throw them away?
JC: They weren't any good!

RS: What do you think about Uh-Huh? Do you like it?

JC: I think that overall it's the best record I've made. The thing about this record is that it was really fun to make. What was being played and what was being said became kind of secondary. It was more the spirit of the thing. We were all so afraid to fall into that, "Uh-oh, we gotta follow up our big album with a better album." And we all just kind of thought, "F— that! We're gonna go in and have fun with our record for the first time in our lives." I think that's what the record reflects.

RS: Why is it so short?

JC: Well, next time around you'll hear more, but it will be different. We really felt like this will be the last record in this style; I mean, hell, the next record might sound exactly the same. I'm really anticipating the next record taking a lot longer to make and a whole different approach to songwriting.

I think I want to start from scratch in some other direction.

RS: Do you have any idea what that direction might be?

JC: No, I'm just floundering at the moment. That's what I plan on doing for the next two years and decide where to go from here. I think that there's a song on the album called "Pink Houses" that is kind of like the pinnacle of what I can write about America. When I wrote the song, I thought, "This is the kind of America you don't see on postcards." And that's what I wanted to get across. 'Cause I'm always infatuated and in love with America, because of the way it is. We're all so funny here.

RS: Let's talk about "Play Guitar."

JC: That song was written originally with the guy who cuts our hair. He's more involved with new music than people would put us. He has a long blond duck tail and that was basically his idea for the thing. It was talking about "What you think's gonna happen when the big-time deal falls through?" And he said, "Learn how to play guitar." Because that's always been the joke about John is that he doesn't know how to play guitar. So learn how to play guitar because his idea was that you're gonna be called on to do so.

RS: In "Crumblin' Down" there's a reference to "When the walls come crumblin' down." What kind of walls?

JC: To be real honest about these songs, I don't know what any of them mean. There wasn't a lot of thought put into them. I don't think the song is stupid by any means. I think when "the walls come crumblin' down" is like, what are you gonna do when the big-time deal falls through? I think that was the spirit of the whole record. It was like everybody wanted to put a lot of pressure on us to follow up the last record with a big commercial

success. I don't think this record is nearly as commercial as the last record, and that's very intentional. It would have been very easy for us to go in there and make a heavy record. This album is basically acoustic guitar oriented with electric guitars behind it. I don't think this record is safe, if you know what I mean. We could have played it safe, I could have written

some more songs like "Jack And Diane." Fell right in line just like everyone wanted us to.

RS: There was an incident where you rode in to Bloomington, and all of a sudden there were a swarm of college kids around you and you were a little bit surprised. Do you remember the incident?

JC: Yeah, it's like it's almost become a way of life around here now. A few years ago, when my records were on the radio but they weren't any big deal, it was like, "Oh, there's that guy that makes records; Hi, John, how you doin'?" But now it's kind of a little bit different. I don't know, it just embarrasses me is what it does. You and I have talked before; you know how I am.

RS: So you feel pretty much the same way when people regard you as a teen idol?

JC: Yeah, I don't know how to act. Hey, let's face it, I don't know how to act in public, period. So when people start treating you that way, who knows how to act? Jagger said it best; I did an interview with Lisa Robinson, who's like a Rolling Stones expert. I said to her, "I think it's good that I took so long to build to the place where I am now, because I can see it for what it really is." It happened to me later than it does to most people. And she said, "Well, Jagger's rap is that he's glad it happened to him when he was 19 years old, because he didn't know what the hell was going on so he just thought it was stupid anyway." So I guess from my side of the pinnacle, not saying anything about me an' Jagger, I'm just showing you two different perspectives. Last year I thought, "Boy, I'm glad I'm not 19 years old and having a record happen this big; I'd probably blow my brains out!"

RS: Here's a question that I know you've been asked by newpeople: "Okay, now you're in the public eye, you must have some responsibility." Do you feel that you have a responsibility of any kind?

JC: Well, like I said, I get embarrassed and I think it's all when you first start out, when you first start making records all those kind of things sound great. Signing autographs, seeing yourself on TV, doing interviews, hearing



your songs on the radio. But that's not why I do this anymore. Let's face it, I'm 32 years old and I'm not interested in picking up girls

anymore. That's not my life. I don't live to pick up girls, I don't live to sign autographs, and I don't particularly like seeing my

self on TV anymore. It's really embarrassing. I feel like I'm always making an ass out of myself. Even with interviews — I get worse and worse with interviews as time goes by. It's all real embarrassing to me. I can barely control my own personal life; how can I be any kind of example to any young kid on the street?

RS: I know that this subject has been beaten in to the ground, but people really do want to know about you changing your name. Why did you pick now to do it?

JC: I don't know; afraid, maybe, to go to the record company. Afraid of what the repercussion would be; other things on my mind. Some times it didn't matter and some times it did. The funny thing about it is that when it didn't matter, is when I did it. Par for John Cougar, par for the course. I don't know; I just think, more than anything, my friends around me expected me to. I don't mean the people who work for me and around me, shaking their heads "yes" all the time; I mean the guys I hang around with. "When are you gonna get rid of that stupid name Cougar?" These guys' attitude is, "F— everything." So that's why I did it, I guess. I don't even know that it'll be on the next record at all.

RS: You mean, it might be just "John" the next time around?

JC: Or it might even be, well, I'll tell you what, I get a lot of letters from people who call me "The Coug," right? I think I might go with that, next time. What I'm really trying to do is to become... to hold the world's record for the most bins in a record store. "We got John Cougar Mellencamp, we got John Cougar, we got Johnny Cougar, we got this, we got that."

RS: While we're on the subject of names, why did you decide to name your daughter "Butch?"

JC: That's her nickname actually. Her real name is Teddy Joe. It's just because of the way she is. The first time I saw her she was in an incubator, but she had this look on her face like, "What are you lookin' at? Why are you standin' around looking at me?" I said, "Boy, she's Butch, isn't she?" The name just kind of stuck. The older people in the family call

her Teddy Joe. She's got a lot of names. We just can't figure out who we are around here.

RS: Is that still really a problem for you? We spoke about this a little bit last time, and you mentioned your need for individuality. Do you feel like you have a better grip on that now, or hasn't it changed much?

JC: Yeah, I feel like I do. I'm getting fatter; I'm at that age where your body starts getting a big gut on you. I look in the mirror and I say, "Yup, that's me!" No problem recognizing me anymore. With this record, particularly, I feel that. This is the first record that I can honestly say I didn't really care what anybody would think of it. All I thought about was how much fun we were having and if we liked it when we were done with it, and that was pretty much it. So I would say that to me, as far as the music goes, it's a pretty good indication that I'm doing what I want to do, which is important to me.

RS: It doesn't seem to me like you're too interested in being a rock star in the traditional sense of the word. Why is that?

JC: Don't misunderstand me here. I love coming to New York, I love coming to Los Angeles, I love going to London or Rome or wherever I'm at, because those big cities are all real interesting to me, but that's not where my bed is. I could say to you, "Hey, Rich, for the next two years you're gonna have to come and live in Bloomington, Indiana," and you'd say, "Forget you!" Because that's not what you want to do. It's the same with me. I like going to the city for a month at a time, but I really don't know that I could come home to there because that's not where I live. I live here, and I think that there are a lot of artists and a lot of people who make records, who spend their entire lives trying to get away from their roots. I've kinda donated my whole life to trying to find out about my roots. That's the difference between me and a lot of other people. I want to know America on this level, too. I want to know what makes me excited when I wake up in the morning. And I think that's why I live here, because I can keep better contact with myself.

RS: Tell me if I have this right: after speaking to you again, it seems to me that your philosophy for John Cougar and for your success is, "the squeaky wheel is the one that gets oiled."

JC: Yep. Did I say that? I don't know. Do you remember in the movie "Cool Hand Luke": "Are you right with the program yet, Luke?" As they beat him some more. As they kick his face, "Get down in that hole, Luke, and keep digging. Keep digging until you get right." Get right. Get right with

what? What other people want you to be right with? I don't know; I don't like that. I mean, there's a certain amount of kiss-ass that everybody has to do, and if you gotta do it to get by, then by all means do it. If that's just the way you are, if you fall right in line with what's going on around you, perfect. When you got a big mouth like me and you get yourself in trouble with all the stupid things that you say, then on every level, the squeaky wheel will get oiled.



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

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Peter Schilling

No Error In The System

The American success of "Major Tom" and the album it comes from, *Error In The System*, have German-born Peter Schilling brushing up on his English and smiling in American dollars.

German made rock 'n' roll has, up to this point, always been linked with the cold man-machinations of groups like Can and Kraftwerk. Their music was like their cars, precise and reliable. This impression is slowly changing. Stuttgart-born Peter Schilling is the person most responsible for this change in our perception.


From his start as a worker in an auto assembly plant to his current status as the only musician with a German language top ten song in his homeland, Peter Schilling's story reads like a rock 'n' roll fairy tale. He tells it like this: "First I met Armin (Armin Sabol) at 4 o'clock in the morning in a bar. He, this heavy metal-haired guy and me this mellow songwriter. So we began to talk about music and decided we would meet the next day. We met and we had the

same wavelength and from that moment we started to work together. First we wrote songs, and they weren't too good. Then suddenly, we both, he played the bass and I played the keyboards, not too well, but I played them and wrote the lyrics. Then we wrote the song 'Only Dreams,' the first song on our album, and suddenly we looked at each other and smiled and we said, 'What's going on? There's something in this music that we don't know, what is it? And then we wrote song by song and after the first good playback, 'Only Dreams' Ralph, our bassist, comes to the band — he's from Stuttgart where I am from. And then all three of us write out the project with a rhythm machine — but only for the demos. Then we had the tape and the record company was interested, WEA in Germany released it and that's the story."

The band in its present five man form has been together about a year and a half. Peter calls Armin Sabol the head of the band who, along with the bass player, produced *Error In The*

System. The other two players came to the band later on. Considering the big business that rock and roll has become, that seems like a quick rise to the top. Says Peter, "Yes, but it functions. Success normally brings bands apart. The success and the touring really put us closer than before. It's great to work with the band."

Peter Schilling's modesty is only outdone by his warmth and energy. He exudes both from his warm-up draped 5' 10" frame whose constant companion is a soccer ball. The man and his music seem to be from different planets. The other worldly, future tech sound of "Major Tom" belies the work of any two man drum machine band. Peter quickly (and justifiably) sets his sound apart from the techno-hipsters. "First of all, we don't use a rhythm machine, we use a natural drummer. The second thing is that we use guitar. Guitar is a very important instrument in my music. Rock 'n' roll guitar. The bass man plays an original bass. And there's only the sound of di-di-di-di-di and

the keyboards playing only that for a small section of the song. And that is nearly rock 'n' roll music, I think."

Herr Schilling composes from his thoughts on an acoustic guitar, which is unusual in the face of the trend toward computer composing. Peter adds his lyrics after he gets the backing track together. "When I have a backing track and I listen to it, I have a feeling, if I have no feeling the backing track is no good. If I have a feeling, then I write the lyrics and I get totally involved in the music and so it fits together afterwards. I put my inner feelings in to the music. It's like a tennis game, tac-tac-tac-tac. The music gives me inspiration and I have in my mind things that I've thought a lot about and I put it in the music. I have a lot of themes in my head waiting for the right backing track."

It was a decade after seeing the motion picture "Marooned" that Peter wrote a backing track which conjured up the themes from that film. The result was the world wide hit, "Major Tom". "I am a type, I see something, I put it in my mind, and I forget it. I don't forget it really. This was a film I saw when I was a child, 12 or 16, and I was impressed by it.

When I heard the playback of a backing track I remembered the story and it fit perfectly. It only took one hour to write the lyrics."

"Major Tom," the first single from *Error In The System*, spent eight weeks at number one on the West German charts. While Peter watches "Major Tom" scale the U.S. charts, he is enjoying his position as the only German performer on the West German top ten. Peter may find it sadening that American language songs dominate the German charts, but he's enthralled with America. "The scene and the people who work here in the media, in radio stations are more open-minded. They are friendly, they... you know when you come to a German radio station you don't know who is the artist — the man who interviews you or the artist. The people here are faster and tougher."

Peter explains the difference between the American and German scene by comparing how our interview would have been conducted at a German radio station. "Okay, you ask me about my music, you say 'Peter, da-d-dumb' and now I talk. In Germany it goes 'Peter, I have heard your record and the production

seems to me very good because I think that...' and now he starts to talk and you sit there for five minutes and say, 'Yes, you are right.' That is one example. Because most people who make interviews are... here it's a private radio station we're in. For Germany it's public controlled and most of the time the announcers are musicians who have failed." Failure's not a word that is part of Mr. Schilling's repertoire.

It's logical that a man who takes only an hour to put the lyrics together for "Major Tom" might fit in well with the fast-paced American music scene. We're not sure if Peter's ready for that change, in fact, he's pretty happy with his current lot. "The system, the working system, is perfect and we won't change that. What we do depends on many things. The result is important." As for the follow-up to *Error In The System*, "we have four songs ready. I'm not in a hurry to do more. I know that my record company wants me to write songs and release the album, but I don't care about that because music is important. I want to make it a good album and I want to say when the album is ready, 'would you buy this record?' and that's important to me."

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

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Dionne Warwick

Soul Star of the Month

By any standard, 1982 was a landmark year for Dionne Warwick. It marked the 20th anniversary of her first hit "Don't Make Me Over," and she celebrated that career milestone with the release of an album, *Heartbreaker*, that became a musical sensation. It sold millions of copies throughout the world, and topped charts in Great Britain, Germany, Canada, The Netherlands, Denmark, Australia and the U.S.

In addition, the title song was a smash single, and was followed by "Take The Short Way Home," a record that became Warwick's 50th chart hit. During the past year, Warwick also performed at two very special functions — a gala in Los Angeles for Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip, and a benefit concert that she organized in Boston for the stricken ex-Red Sox star Tony Conigliaro. At this latter event, Warwick shared the stage with Frank Sinatra.

With these achievements added to the string of her triumphs, Warwick has now made an album that will undoubtedly take its rightful place among her greatest recordings. *How Many Times Can We Say Goodbye* is an album that exemplifies Warwick's unique ability to stay as contemporary as the times, and yet remain true to her distinctive talent.

This lp was produced by Luther Vandross who brought Aretha Franklin back to the top recently with *Jump To It* and *Get It Right*. The first single from Warwick's album is the title cut, in which she duets with Vandross. As of this writing, the song was already an across the charts hit, where it was making a steady climb up both the pop and soul charts.

There are also a number of other Vandross originals on the lp, including the shimmering "So Amazing" as well as the sizzling "Got A Date," with rocker Peter Frampton on lead guitar. There is also a beautiful rendition of the Goffin & King classic "Will You Love Me Tomorrow," on which Warwick is joined on vocals by the original artists, The Shirelles. This marked a reunion of sorts, considering Warwick and The Shirelles used to appear together at the legendary Brooklyn Fox concerts hosted by Murray the K.

How Many Times Can We Say Goodbye is another significant chapter in what is proving to be a decade of one great accomplishment after another in the career of Dionne Warwick. To date, the '80s have brought her two Grammy Awards (for her Barry Manilow-produced debut Arista lp), a television series (*Solid Gold*), a first-ever duet with Johnny Mathis (on '82s "Friends In Love"), a live lp that encapsu-

lated her career (*Hot Live And Otherwise*), and *Heartbreaker*, produced by Barry Gibb, Karl Richardson and Alby Galutin, which is the most recent chapter in Dionne Warwick's story.

Born Marie Dionne Warwick, the singer grew up in a gospel oriented family. Her mother was a manager of the famous Drinkard Singers, a church choir group that gave Dionne her first musical experience as organ accompanist and occasional vocalist. Together with her sister and her cousin, Dionne went on to form her own trio, The Gospelaires while studying under a scholarship at the Hartt College of Music.

Doing background singing in New York City, she caught the ear of then fledgling composer Burt Bacharach in 1960, on a session for The Drifters' "Mexican Divorce." As Bacharach told *Ebony*, "I couldn't help noticing her. Dionne had something — it was there when I first met her: a kind of elegance, her flow and feeling for the music."

Warwick started cutting demos for the songs that Bacharach and his lyricist partner Hal David were trying to sell. The result was that the threesome wound up with a Scepter Records contract. In December, 1962, "Don't Make Me Over" became a top ten hit. It was the first of a breathtaking catalog of smash records.



"Anyone Who Had A Heart," "Walk On By," "You'll Never Get To Heaven," "Reach Out For Me," "A House Is Not A Home" were all hit singles in just the first two years of this producing-writing-singing partnership.

Warwick was personally introduced at the Olympia Theatre in Paris by Marlene Dietrich, named the top r&b singer of 1964 by the music trade magazines (this at the height of the British Invasion in rock & roll), and crossed the categorical borders between pop, r&b, gospel, blues and jazz audiences. The emotionally and

technically demanding ballads that Bacharach and David provided her to sing were among the most sterling recorded performances of the era.

More hits followed. These included: "Message To Michael," "Trains And Boats And Planes," "Alfie," "Say A Little Prayer," "(Theme From) Valley Of The Dolls," and "Do You Know The Way To San Jose." By the end of 1966, she had sold more than 12 million records. Her accomplishments by that time included a four month European tour, numerous TV shows (Hullabaloo,

The Tonight Show, A Eurovision special, Ed Sullivan and Kraft Music Hall). For "San Jose" she won a Grammy Award, and highlights of 1968 included a Copacabana booking, an attendance record set at the Newport Jazz Festival, and filming her screen debut in the film *Slaves*.

More successful recordings for Scepter followed. "Promises Promises," "This Girl's In Love With You" and "I'll Never Fall In Love Again" were added to the growing Warwick list of classics. She also began receiving impressive honors such as being invited to the Apollo 11 astronauts' celebration in Houston, and being the first singer ever named "Woman Of The Year" by Harvard's Hasty Pudding Club. After another Grammy, and an NAACP Image Award, Dionne spent much of the '70s as a recording artist for Warner Bros.

During her tenure there, she cut albums with such excellent producers as Bacharach, Thom Bell and Steve Barrie and Michael Omartian. Except for "Then Came You," a single she made with vocal group The Spinners (a Gold #1 and Grammy-nominated song), and a collaborative "A Man And A Woman" tour with Isaac Hayes, this period of Warwick's life was marked by creative and commercial disappointment.

A new phase of her career began auspiciously in 1979 with the million-selling *Dionne* album. For "I'll Never Love This Way Again" and "Deja Vu," two gold singles from the lp, she won Grammy Awards for Best Female Vocal Performance in the pop and r&b categories, becoming the first woman to win simultaneous awards in both pop and r&b.

Then came *No Night So Long*, *Hot! Live and Otherwise*, *Friends In Love*, *Heartbreaker* and now her newest triumph, *How Many Times Can We Say Goodbye*.

"I'm extremely happy," Dionne said recently. "Everything is just going beautifully for me. Arista is a label dedicated to its artists, my records are selling and everything is just the way it's supposed to be. I hope it never stops."



Country Star of the Month

In September, 1980, Gary Morris released his first Warner Bros. single, "Sweet Red Wine." The music trade magazines predicted that Morris would be a hit and he was. With a succession of five top ten singles and his first lp on the Billboard charts for six months, this prediction

proved true. Singer/songwriter Gary Morris has created quite a name for himself in a very short time.

Morris' string of hit records began with the smash country rocker, "Headed For A Heartache," followed by "Don't Look Back" and "Dreams Die

Hard." These three tunes paved the way for Morris to be named New Male Singles Artist Of The Year in 1982 by *Billboard*.

The hits have continued with "Velvet Chains," the beautiful "The Love She Found In Me," "The Wind Beneath My Wings" and "Why Lady Why." These hits have established Morris as a most unique country music artist — not only can he sing up a country storm, but he can deliver ballads with unforgettable style.

Industry recognition has been arriving with regularity for Morris. In 1983, he was nominated for New Male Artist Of The Year by the Academy Of Country Music. Also in 1983, the CMA nominated him for the Horizon Award, for both single and song of the year for "The Love She Found In Me."

Morris' first album was the self-titled *Gary Morris*. This lp provided country music lovers everywhere with the chance to sample the breadth and freshness of Morris' formidable musical talents, including his songwriting. Original tunes included such ballads as "When I Close My Eyes," "Dancin' The Night Away," "Day By Day," as well as the uptempo "No Place To Hide."

Why Lady Why was released in August, 1983 and featured four of Morris' hits: "Velvet Chains," "The Love She Found In Me," "The Wind Beneath My Wings," and more samples of Morris' songwriting, including the title cut, "Why Lady Why."

Arriving in Nashville in the spring of 1980, Morris signed a recording contract with Warner Bros., with little fanfare, almost the same time he signed a publishing contract with Warner Bros. Music.

From the very beginning of his recording and songwriting career, it was obvious that a new artist of stature had arrived on the scene. Appearing in February, 1981 at the Nashville Songwriter's Association showcase singing an original, "Fire In Your Eyes," *Billboard* singled out Morris' "magnetic performance" and a voice that was unbelievable in its power and range.

Morris' songwriting ability has also been singled out. A rodeo song, "Playin' Cowboy," was featured on an ABC-TV *Wide World Of Sports* Cheyenne Frontier Days soundtrack. "Don't Look Back" was Morris' own first top ten effort, while the single "The Wind Beneath My Wings," reached the same heights. In addition, Reba McEntire and Randy Parton recently cut songs written by Morris.

Not only can Gary Morris write, sing and record, his live performances draw rave reviews wherever he plays. Hot dance tunes combined with his incredible ballad singing proved as fine a performance as country music can offer.

Morris' band GMO, was nominated by the CMA as Band Of The Year for 1983. This is no surprise, considering that they are a hot group of talented players who never fail to leave an audience begging for more. The same can be said of that portion of the show in which Morris steps out with just his acoustic guitar.

From the Palomino in California, the Lone Star in New York, Gilley's and Billy Bob's in Texas and Duke's in Tulsa, to festivals and theme parks, Gary Morris is one of the most appealing live performers on the country circuit.

Also helping to spread the wide appeal of Morris is the television shows he has appeared on. These include *Austin City Limits*, *That's Country*, NBC's *Fantasy*, *Inside Country Cookin'* (Gary cooks up great Mexican dishes), *Nashville Now*, *The Bob Braun Show*, *Nashville Alive*, NBC's *Academy Of Country Music Special*, as well as many syndicated radio shows.

Born and raised in Ft. Worth, Texas, Morris' musical roots run deep. His paternal grandfather was a musician who could "play anything with strings on it." On his mother's side, his grandfather was a vocal teacher who wrote several songs in the baptist hymnal. Morris' mother was a singer as well, so it only follows that it didn't take long before he too was performing.

He began his musical career in his church choir. Although he was a talented athlete who earned letters in football, baseball, basketball and track, it was music that became the dominating force in his life while he was attending junior college in Cisco, Texas on a football scholarship.

Although his choir activities continued through high school, he began playing guitar, writing his own songs, and singing professionally around Ft. Worth in small groups as a solo artist. Since becoming a full-time musician in 1969, Morris has worked alone and in bands all over the U.S., polishing his craft and winning a fervent following.

Morris now lives just outside Nashville in Franklin, Tennessee, but credits Denver as the place where he gained his most valuable experience. Performing initially in a trio called Taylor's Cowboys, and then traveling all over the country as part of a duet for two years, Morris returned to Denver and formed a seven-piece country rock band called Breakaway. Not content to follow the same road as most club bands and perform only over tunes, the band featured original material written almost exclusively by Morris. With Gary's writing and vocals as the driving force, the band soon became Denver's favorite. Their success eventually led Gary to take a shot at the real music business in Nashville.

When Morris is not writing, recording, or performing he is most likely to be found hunting or fishing, or skin diving in Key West, the Bahamas or wherever the water is warm and clear. The mountains and streams of Colorado, Wyoming and Montana are also among his favorite hunts — elk, deer and rainbow trout are his preferred game.

Above all, Gary Morris loves to write and perform his music. The size and scope of his talent is providing country music fans everywhere with some of the best sounds around. Doing what he does best, and getting only better with time, Gary Morris is sure to be around a long time to come.
