THE MUSIC MEETING

We generated some good dialogue with last week's MUSIC MEETING column. Re-defining the term 'mass appeal' as it applies to today's music, lifestyles, demographics and your particular market is something that's happening more and more, it seems. Certainly the music being made available has a great influence. The number of contemporary music radio stations in each market has become more of a factor in 'niche' programming. Many programmers are still struggling with the abundance of urban-based music dominating right now. If there's an urban-slanted station in the market already, - how do you reflect a 'mass appeal' approach without becoming the second urban-music station? Now redefining 'mass appeal' comes in - and breaking stereotypical thinking. With so much music sounding alike - it's important to have enough time to do some quality I don't think most PDs/MDs listening. enough listening time to he discerning about the they're music considering each week. There really is enough music to fit what you need, whether you're super-serving a particular 'niche' or reaching for the great 'mainstream' ... it takes an open mind - enough quality listening time - good research - and sharing of information to make the task a little easier.

A look at some of our biggest hits still show a wide variety of music styles - but all are 'mainstream' in their genre..that is they're not the extremes of the style. That's how different music styles become acceptable to the mass audience - when they evolve from their extremes. Major mass appeal hits right now include THE B-52S, BAD ENGLISH, TAYLOR DAYNE, GLORIA ESTEFAN, JANET JACKSON, BILLY JOEL, MILLI VANILLI and ROXETTE. Moving into that category are ALANNAH MYLES, JANE CHILD, LUTHER VANDROSS, MADONNA.

Records that have especially strong appeal for adults on top 40 formats include the ELTON JOHN, especially and consistently strong for 18-34 females; the PHIL COLLINS, which actually gets response from adult males & females, is still dayparted for most; the BELINDA CARLISLE continues to show it has good female appeal..from about 16 to mid-30's. It's not a highly reactive record in comparison to the urban\dance type hits - but it fares well in call-outs after a while and very well

on formats skewing toward the 22+ female. Coming up in the adult-female-demo area is the song by SADAO WATANABE & PATTI AUSTIN. Song is strong, already successful on adult-appeal formats - starting to make its move on the T40/urbans that court females.

D-MOB is a solid pop/mass appeal hit that originated on the dance formats. So many of these records really don't get the early attention from top 40 programmers, I believe, simply because they're all lumped together description-wise and that 'discerning listening' mentioned above doesn't take place. While this may skew young initially - it's totally acceptable to the 'mass audience' on the pop/top 40 station. Demographic response spans 12 to 34, male & female.

TOMMY PAGE is the #1 response record for young females. No surprise. Most playing the record identify it as "TOMMY PAGE with the NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK". Huge requests - very little dayparting.

DEPECHE MODE has successful been everywhere it's been played. probably not see a big national chart reflection because it's already coming down some stations charts while still being added on others. National charts of necessity reflect the activity of only that week - rather than cumulative response. During any one week from now on it may lose stations simply because it's run its course, not because it wasn't successful - but that will still affect the national listing. Suffice it to say it is a hit record for those who deal with it. Strong response from the young adults initially - but it does open to include up to mid-30's. No comments on the title it's just the 'sound' of the record they like.

Some more hits moving into mainstream from the urban formats include "Whip Appeal" by BABYFACE. This album cut has been getting airplay at a handful of urban-slanted top 40's with extremely strong requests. It's a soulful ballad that finds a receptive female audience. CALLOWAY is a goodnatured, uptempo record that's also finding success on top 40. Stations also use the title as a tie-in for contests. Title is "I Wanna Be Rich".



And of course, STEVIE B continues to show it's a strong love song for the teen and young adult female especially.

JAYA - from that same label is another uptempo/dance hit that's compatible with mass appeal formats. While it started on the urban formats - it's not a heavy urban sound.

The 'novelty' by BIZ MARKIE keeps racking up #1 requests from teens (& pre-teens now). Highly dayparted, running it's course quickly, gets some negative response from adults in a few instances.

TECHNOTRONIC's "Get Up" is continuing where "Pump Up The Jam" left off. Audience wasn't tired of it yet - and this is like 'part 2'. Most response is teen-25, female.

The sensuous dance "The Lambada" is still getting attention via consumer press, TV etc. The record by KAOMA pulls strong phones from adult females on some of the urban-slanted top 40's that are on it now. The dance is a sensation - dance studios are now giving lessons and exhibitions. It would behoove a station playing the record to get involved somehow with the dance.

MOTLEY CRUE's "Without You" had been getting top 5 requests with just limited airplay as an LP cut for months. Single's just been released. The 'power ballad' is getting instant response on the rockleaning top 40s.

Check out H FACTOR - song is "I Love You" - it was a hit by the CLIMAX BLUES BAND in 1981. Seems to be compatible with urban, pop or top 40 leanings. Quick response comes from 18-34 primarily - does have familiarity - initially being dayparted for days.

A cut from the AEROSMITH LP is beginning to spread & pulling quick top 10 phones on the rock-leaning top 40s...cut is "What It Takes".

NEW RECORD NOTES

ATCO

A very nice - kind of progressive sound from <u>BIG NOISE</u> on their new single "I Can't Live Without It". It's from their LP "Bang!".

ATLANTIC

"Blue" by GEOFFREY WILLIAMS sounds like an urban "Soul Searchin'" - the GLENN FREY tune. It's very inviting - even reminds some of the classic "Dock Of The Bay".

I.R.S.

A little country, a little pop, a little rock - but a lot of 'very good' is a single by the duo KENNEDY ROSE ...titled "Love Like This". From their LP "Hai Ku".

H FACTOR has a version of "I Love You" that's steadily gaining ground on top 40 with good response from young adult females especially. The song was a hit in 1981 by CLIMAX BLUES BAND - the new version has similarities to that hit.

GEFFEN

Their power ballad introduced them to a wider top 40 audience - now TESLA's back to rock with "The Way It Is" - their new single.

ELEKTRA

My personal favorite record "Volare" by GIPSY KINGS is total entertainment. Artists are major international stars - and offer a very viable, commercial Latin sound on this real oldie. Song was originally a hit in Italian by DOMENICO MODUGNO - and in English by DEAN MARTIN - both in 1958. Then 2 years later by BOBBY RYDELL. This version is actually very contemporary - it's rhythm is appropriate for "The Lambada' - the Brazilian dance that swept Europe & is growing in popularity in the U.S. This single is from their LP "Mosaique".

EMI

Rocker TIM KARR has a single titled "Rubbin' Me The Right Way" - just being released to top 40 - but has already had AOR attention.

EPIC

Label has serviced a 'Special Hit Radio Version' of JOAN JETT's "Dirty Deeds". It's hotter - with the rhythm emphasized for dance relatability.

MCA

A very pretty urban ballad is "Master Of The Game" by <u>JAMES "J.T." TAYLOR</u>. It's the title cut of his current LP.

SBK

A pre-release cassette of a single soon to be released has been getting 'spiked' and featured on some top 40's & generating very active response. Artists are WILSON PHILLIPS - they are the daughters of BRIAN WILSON (of the BEACH BOYS) and MICHELE & JOHN PHILLIPS (of the MAMAS & PAPAS) respectively. Single is "Hold On". Artists appear to have potential to become a major pop entity.

WARNER BROS.

An active 'fun' dance record is KYZE (pronounced Kay-Wise) "Stomp (Move Jump Jack Your Body)". It's one of those dance songs that gives you directions - inviting lots of participation. Already getting good reponse on urban-dance formats.

BEST NEW RECORDS OF THE WEEK

MICHAEL BOLTON - HOW CAN WE BE LOVERS - COLUMBIA

New single from his LP "Soul Provider". There are
two versions on the promotional CD - a'single version'
and an A/C mix, which has softer guitars. Both versions are 3:55. Again produced by one of my favorite
producers, DESMOND CHILD. This follows his #1 mega-hit
"How Am I Supposed To Live Without You" - which has been
nominated for a Grammy and which he'll perform on the
telecast of the awards show this Wednesday night.
He now has some familiarity with his husky, plaintive
voice after the huge multi-format success of "How Am
I...." This song also expresses the painful side
of a relationship - a bit more uptempo this time...
but has the same type of appeal.



LINEAR - SENDIN' ALL MY LOVE - ATLANTIC

Very active dance record picked up by ATLANTIC originally on Futura. Strong, emphatic dance
track - made interesting instrumentally with
some really hooky and bright string and keyboard
work. Simple, basic vocal is more pop than urban
and clearly invites quick recognition and singalong. Already beginning to spread from the
dance-oriented formats to mainstreams.



COLIN HAY - INTO MY LIFE - MCA

The familiar lead voice of the MEN AT WORK hits - this is from his new solo LP "Wayfaring Sons". Has that familiarity because of his distinctive voice - and that same catchy, quirky sound he achieved with MEN AT WORK's "Who Can It Be Now?" Again a very pop and different sound for those mass appeal stations not wanting to lean too urban.



ANIMAL LOGIC - AS SOON AS THE SUN GOES DOWN - I.R.S. From their self-titled album - this follows a single out a little while ago that introduced them to the pop /top 40 audience to a degree. But this uptempo pop-dance sound should stretch even further. It certainly offers a different sound-it's bright and fresh, to balance the abundance of urban sounds. But more important than the balance it provides - it's simply sounds like a potential mass appeal hit.
