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


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

It's been a while since I've written anything, but as you may or may not have heard, I have been a DJ in transition for the last few months. Where this transition mode will end me up, I don't know, but right now I'm pulling five shifts in three clubs plus a Friday night mobile about twice a month. Right now, the list of clubs is the Cove, Candide, and on Saturdays, Petrus, but here in Atlanta, you never know these days if you'll be working from one day

to the next. At least my program has settled down, but the music has changed dramatically (as I think you'll see as this column progresses).

Way back at the New Music Seminar, I had the privilege of being blown away by a live performance by SARAH MCLACHLAN. Up until that time, I had only heard one cut by her, called "VOX", a brilliant piece of music that served to whet my appetite for more. Her new single, "STEAMING", is much more danceable, but doesn't overwhelm the awesome voice and heavenly melody that set the

mood for this record. Needless to say, I think it's From the dramatic (albeit difficult) intro to the acappella end, "DRAMA!" by ERASURE is the most refreshing piece of dance music I've heard in a long, long time. Also included on the disc is "SWEET, SWEET BABY", a track that sounds like Giorgio Moreder meets Mickey Oliver meets Erasure. Cool stuff! Use a break of your choice to connect the two or, if you have two, just connect 'em. D'ATRA HICKS can sing her butt off and her debut single, "SWEET TALK" is an excellent showcase for her talent. Of course, I prefer the Sweet Revenge mix, but ya'll know how I am. PAJAMA PARTY'S "OVER AND OVER" is a feelgood jam that was an instant success for me. Some say the album version is best, but I like the House mix (of course). MARK ANTHONY THOMPSON'S "DOG IN THE ROAD (OF LIFE)" teeters on the edge between

funk and alternative and makes it work. The

"ATOMIC DOG" thefts give it familiarity, but don't

dominate. Very good!

The THOMPSON TWINS' "SUGAR DADDY" is a right-on-time return to the scene for this duo, thanks mainly to Shep Pettibone's Velvet Rail mix.

The "GOT MY MIND MADE UP" samples are inspired. Where's the third twin? "WELCOME TO AMERICA" by DIE WARZAU is hard and driving and fun, not to mention twisted. Just what the doctor

ordered out of "HALLOWEEN" or "RIGOR-MORTIS" or "STATE FARM" or "ROCKIT"!

At first I was skeptical about the pairing of PATTI

LABELLE and PRINCE, but then I remembered Patti's early days with Nona and Sarah and it started to make a little sense. The end result, "YO MISTER", is the best thing either has done in years. The album mix is excellent -- hope they don't screw up the remix. Worthy of note is "HAPPY" by PUBLIC IMAGE, LTD. Even worthier of note is "WARRIOR" -- the B side of the second servicing of

the "HAPPY" 12 inch. Hopefully they used the

import mix, cuz it's killer dance music that takes no

My token rap record of the week is "SOMEBODY FOR ME" by HEAVY D AND THE BOYZ. Pack away that MILLI VANILLI and check out a real rapper, whose rhymes are just as accessible and whose music doesn't sell out. Try it out of "JAZZIE'S GROOVE". If you don't know what "JAZZIE'S GROOVE" is, then you JUST DON'T

KNOW! ICE T gets the honorable mention for

"LETHAL WEAPON" (his mind). Do yourself a

favor and check out what he has to say on "THIS

ONE'S FOR ME" on the B side.

The "Attitude" record of the week is "SELF" (What the hell do you expect me to be?) by FUZZBOX. Don't know what the original sounds like, but I'm sure it sounds nothing like this. Great stuff! I can just see Joseph lip-synching and vogueing to this from her DJ booth.

Mike thinks it will be another 2 to 3 months before the club is cosmetically back to normal, but I'm sure he's just glad to be working again, which isn't the case for Scotty Davis who works at the Spanish Galleon in North Myrtle Beach, S.C. Scotty went to his club after the storm passed to find his dance floor almost FIVE FEET under water; not to mention a foot of sand everywhere else. The reason is because the Galleon is right on the beach and during the storm there were reports of 12 to 18 foot swells. SURF'S UP! The water ripped apart the back wall of the club and also demolished a deck that had just been added on. Luckily, Scotty's booth is elevated and didn't have any severe damage. But they are having to remove all the light and sound system because it's full of sand. Scotty said it will

probably be January before his side of the club reopens, but fortunately the Beach Music side has already opened back up. Now, how's this for a winning effort. Jimmy Salcedo who works at Sh-Booms in Winston-Salem, N.C. lost power at his club when the storm hit there. So before they opened that night, Jimmy ran a drop cord from his booth to a First Union bank across the street to get power for his sound system. Everything was lit by candlelight. They still did \$7200.00 in sales that night. Sounds like one Hell of a Hugo party to me!!

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There were several other clubs that suffered minor damage from Hugo, mainly broken windows and lost shingles at Xanadu and Streamers in Mytrle Beach, but the good news is only one DDK jock is out of house and work and none were injured!

So how about some good news (please). There is a new club, opening up in Milledgeville, Ga. A good friend of mine, Brad Ward, will be spinning there. The club is called Shooters (where have I heard that name before?!). He says that all DDK jocks get VIP treatment and invites everyone to see the club.

Challenge Mix (Courtesy of Scotty Davis from Mytrle Beach). This mix is intended for people that use Technics 1200MK2 turntables. Start with "WILD THING" by TONE LOC, 8 beats before the break, turn the ON/OFF switch to the OFF position. Quickly turn it back on. You'll notice that the RPM light has changed from 45 to 33 1/3. On the 8th beat, right before the break, press the START/STOP button to start the turntable again. On the first beat of the break, start mixing SOUL II SOUL'S "KEEP ON MOVIN" at +4% and hold it for 32 beats. It's a great mix that will freak your crowd out! Thanks Scotty! Until next time...
