





EENBERG TAKES ABC-F

New York-ALLEN B. SHAW, JR. has announced his resignation as President of the ABC owned FM Stations. In making the announcement. Shaw said. "I feel the need for a change and this is the right time to develop some business ideas I've been contemplating for some time. I definitely will remain in radio."

Replacing Shaw is MARTIN GREENBERG, currently Vice-President and General Manager of WLS/Chicago.

BEN HOBERMAN, President of ABC Radio. commented on the changes. "Shaw was responsible for the development of the ABC owned FM Station group from its inception as a separate profit center in 1970. Under his leader-

ship, the group pioneered the popular Album Rock format which thrust us into the position of the most listened to group of FM radio stations in the country."

On Greenberg's appointment. Hoberman commented, "This action underscores ABC's major commitment to the FM Station Group, and its position as a major contributor to the continuing success of the Radio Division. Martin Greenberg has proven management expertise and a long history of success with ABC Radio."

Before joining WLS. Greenberg was with ABC owned WXYZ/Detroit as General Sales Manager from 1971-1973. He joined ABC in 1964 as Advertising/Promotion Director at XYZ.

NATHAN RESIGNS SIRE

Los Angeles---MARC NATHAN has left Sire Records and will be forming his own Independent A&R company called Between-The-Ears that will essentially try to marry hit songs with artists that are willing to record outside material.

"In the radio and music industry, you run across songs that have exhibited really high hit potential either via sales and requests or passive research, but, for one reason or another, the record company was not able to bring the record home or something happened to keep the record from surfacing. I am basically going to try and hook these songs up with an artist. I'll be acting as kind of a broker," explained Marc to FRED.

The way Between-The-Ears will work is this concept, "Let's say that a label needs songs for one of their artists. Between-The-Ears will deliver to them a

tape of four songs for possible use by an artist. If any of those four songs are used by the artist, a certain fee is paid. If they pass on the songs, the label will sign a waiver saying that they have no intention of using them in connection with that artist or any artist connected with that label or producer. That way, I'm in a nothing ventured, nothing gained type of situation. If they use the song or songs, I receive a kind of finders fee.

"On the other hand, I will also hit the angle of approaching the publisher and saying, "Look, you have a copyright in your catalogue that I feel has hit potential. Let's say it was a mid-chart record in the late 60s and the publishing is controlled by someone who hasnt worked the song for 9 or 10 years. I will either offer to buy the copyright or ask for a percentage of

the copyright fees if I get the song re-recorded. I could also ask for a flat rate finders fee, again without telling them what the song is so that they dont go out and work it themselves."

Nathan went on to explain that his publication, Between-The-Ears, will continue to come out and will become an integral part of his game plan.

"I'm going to do everything I can to promote those records I'm working without really involving myself in the day to day you have to close and get out a spiff and act like an asshole."

The situation with RICH SARGENT and the rest of the Sire staff will remain status quo for the present. "I'm real happy working for SEYMOUR STEIN and Sire Records and have no plans to change at all," stated Sarg when FRED talked with him about his personal future.

LIVE NATIONAL NET WMMS AND RSO ROCK THE COUNTRY

Cleveland-RSO Records and WMMS got together and staged one of the largest live national radio hookups in broadcast history with The Rockets Live from the Agora Ballroom in Cleveland.

On May 9th, through the WMMS facility FRED reporters across the nation broadcast the Rockets' performance. The broadcast was made possible through the work of MICHAEL ROSE, RSO's Cleveland Promotion Manager with the aid and cooperation of JOHN GORMAN, WMMS Program Director. KID LEO, Music Director at WMMS as the onstage announcer for the concert broadcast.

The crowd came to a fevered pitch as Kid Leo took the microphone to announce the Rockets:

"Welcome to a very special night out at the Agora.

I'm Kid Leo and I'm here to usher in a show of shows. We have a nationwide audience of over one million people.

And it's time to rock and roll, And that's a term that has taken its toll.

And I mean Rocket roll.

Here is a band with a harder kick in the ass than a mule.

If this country ran on them you wouldnt have a shortage of fuel.



"We're programing a Spectrum III, Group Three type of format and the talk on the street is good. Things are really looking good for us."


"For the first time, the commitment from NBC is there and we think we'll really give some people a run for their money in this town."

Beast of Burden

Washington-The National Radio Broadcasters Association (NRBA) will begin publishing a weekly Editorial Service focusing on the inhibiting burden of overregulation. NRBA, with this move, recognizes the ability and power of radio to communicate and inform the American public of the negative effects of the ever increasing amounts of government regulation.

The Editorial Service will be distributed to all of the NRBA member stations. The Association anticipates that the information will reach millions of Americans weekly.

The Service is another part of the NRBA's ongoing effort to focus Congress' attention on the ever growing problem of government overregulation. This effort was spearheaded by the Broadcaster's Rally Against Overregulation held last February.

INSTANT ON

Washington-The FCC will establish an Instant Licensing system that will speed up the time it takes for an applicant to work in a position that requires a Restricted Radiotelephone Operator Permit.

When the system is implimented person will become temporarily licensed for a 60 day period as soon as the application for the permanent license is in the mail to the FCC. Thus, the applicant will be able to begin operating immediately with all the authority of the Restricted Radiotelephone Operator Permit while the FCC processes the application.

The FCC estimates that this procedure will benefit the more than 200.000 applicants this year. It will be a few months before the system is operational.

THINK IT UP

Miami---MIKE HARVEY at WFTL has set May 25 as the date for his national telekinesis experiment.

He is encouraging stations that want to participate to contact him immediatley so that phone lines can be hooked up. Phone fees for the experiment are \$90 to cover the installation of a line to each station participating.

The idea for the experiment is to see if the decaying orbit of Skylab can be affected by the use of the mental energy (telekinesis) of thousands of radio listeners across the country. Maybe you can prevent thousands of pounds of material from smashing into your town. Scientists are not sure where the pieces of Skylab will crash, so this will be a mass news item.

LET IT IN

Washington-The FCC has announced that, starting in July 1979, it will make available to the general public a revised and expanded notice to be known as the "Sunshine Agenda". The purpose of the agenda is to provide brief summaries of items to be discussed at open Commission meetings. The "Sunshine Agenda" replaces the former type of public notice which only listed the titles of the items before the Commission for deliberation.

The Commission intends this "Agenda" to be a major part of its compliance with an executive order on Improving Government Regulations. The FCC has determined that the establishment of the "Sunshine Agenda" will serve the public interest by providing greater opportunities for understanding FCC rulemaking and decision making.

FRED came out in favor of such an action some time ago. The public has the right to understand the goings on of government agencies, especially in the areas of mass communications.

The "Sunshine Agenda" can be obtained from the Office of Public Affairs, Room 207, at the FCC offices.



QUEST by Buzz Bennett

I spend about 50% of my time dealing with programers and listening to radio. When I say programers, please dont confuse the word programers with the words "program director". A programer is someone who studies programing and contributes to its art form. A Program Director may or may not qualify to be a programer.

I just arrived at my home in Carmel and I will spend the night here and catch a plane to Los Angeles in the morning. I spent last night in San Francisco with LES GARLAND and DAVE SHOLIN doing an interview that will begin in FRED next week. In my quest to understand as many programers as possible, I talk to many medium market program directors on the phone while I'm visiting larger markets. I have perceived in both large and small markets during this Arbitron a defeatist attitude and much fear. So while I was interviewing Les last night I brought up the subject of fear. I asked Les if there was anything that he was afraid of. Les replied that he was afraid of nothing. I confessed that I had one fear, and only one--the fear of failure. I stated that death itself did not frighten me--nothing frightened me except failure and that many times I was motivated by the fear of failure.

Les said that he was not afraid to fail. He stated that KFRC was to him the greatest radio station in the country and if it failed it would still be the greatest radio station in the country. The attitude was so positive that the word 'failure' seemed somehow out of place.

I've always considered myself one of the most positive people on earth but I failed to remember that we have nothing to fear but fear itself. I've spent the last twenty hours reconsidering and I now fear nothing. Yes, FRED is now and was to me the greatest magazine in the country. But aside from that, through Les' example I have eliminated the fear of failure and know even more now that I cannot fail.

In my conversations with many other programers, I hear them say, "Damn it they ran a massive TV campaign and I couldnt, so I dont think I'll do well in the book", or "They had a much bigger budget for giveaways", or "They had a great outdoor billboard campaign". They, they, they. These all seem to be confessions of fear. I know that a massive TV campaign can give an advantage to a station, but certainly not the advantage it gives if it psyches the other program director or programer into fear. All-that-money-can-buy cannot beat a fearless persevering programer, proud of himself and the people he works with.

It seems that we too often create our own hell stimulated by fear. This very fear is our biggest competitor in radio and in life. We're quite capable of letting our subconscious or conscious fears destroy the magic that is necessary to win and be happy at the same time. If you're afraid because you're on AM, if you're afraid because your budget is too small, if you're afraid because your spot load is too big, you are wrong. AM, a small budget and a large spot load combined will not hurt you as much as fear itself will. Let's all do away with this stupid thing called fear--it's trying to stifle our creativity.

CIPHER by C.C. Courtney

There are some very critical elements that were never mentioned to me by anyone at anytime during my formative period in radio. The reason for this is that there are few, if any, persons in radio who know how to teach this vital information. This week I would like to focus on an element that is so basic that it is hard to believe that radio does almost nothing to train personnel in this area. I am talking about the voice.

I am going to give you a couple of extremely simple things to do which will strengthen and deepen the voice to a degree you never thought possible. Sir Laurence Olivier, the world's greatest actor, used this technique in preparing for his role in OTHELLO and lowered his voice an octave. It works! For men and women.

You may want to get off somewhere by yourself the first few times you try it because it requires some strange gestures until you get used to it. What you do is make the Boy Scout salute. (For you Girl Scouts, that's three fingers.) Now take those three fingers and stick them in your mouth like this:




As you can see, this requires you to open your mouth very wide. (This alone is an amazing improvement for the average announcer!) You only have to get the tips of your fingers in, by the way. Now, leaving your fingers in, say "Guide". Actually, the only part of the word we're interested in is the first half of the diphthong "ahee". The "ah" in guide is guite different from the "ah" in box or father. This may not seem to be important, but it is, because of the throat muscles. (Pronouce the words 'box' and 'quide' back-to-back with your hand around your throat and you can feel what I mean).

Now practice saying guide with the fingers in the mouth as illustrated. Just forget the second half of the word. Just say, "Gah" and forget the "eed" part. In other words, it is the "ah" we are interested in here but you need to think the word 'guide' so that you will use the correct throat muscles.

The final point is this. You must speak the "gah" as loudly as you can and hold it for five seconds. Take a quick breath and hit it again and again and again. It's almost like singing. but much harsher. Do it at a pitch that is very comfortable for you and work your way higher and higher until it is no longer comfortable. Do it absolutely as loud and harsh as you can. When you reach the top of your range your voice will crack, you will choke and your eyes will water. This is not dangerous to your voice. When this happens, do it over a time or two at that pitch then return to the original lower pitch and work your way up. The lower pitches will not be as loud but dont worry about it, just do it as loudly as possible.

Like all good exercises, this will only work if you practice. After you get used to how wide the mouth must be open, you can stop putting your fingers in your mouth and do it while driving. This seems to be the best time because you dont have to worry about anyone else hearing you and it sounds so loud and powerful in a car. If you need more help with this, call me. I will be giving more details later.

Profile

TAKING OFF THE SHACKLES John Smith/MCA Records

I entered the business working for Stax Records as Director of the Statistical Department, which was really research and planning. I was dealing with analyzing the demographics in the marketplace, determining the target markets that we were going after, the buying power of that particular market, and how we can best exploit the market. I went into the Promotion Department first as the local person in Memphis, then Southern Regional and then went to become the National Director of Promotion.

From there I went to New York. I worked with BILL KRASILOVSKY, who wrote the book "This Business Of Music," getting some idea of what record contracts were all about, what was geared for the record company, what was best for the artist, different kinds of production deals and label deals. This gave me an opportunity to see the record business more than just through the mind of promotion.

I went to United Artists Records in 1975. I worked with RAY ANDERSON, AL TAYLOR and ARTIE MOGUL. I started as National Director of Promotions and went on to become Vice-President of Marketing for Blue Note Records in 1976. In 1978 I went to ABC Records as Vice-President of Promotion/Special Markets.

With the acquisition of ABC Records by MCA, I was asked by MCA to take the job here as Vice-President of Black Product. This now brings me back to a position where I was with Stax, in that I am able to work more across the board, involving myself in the planning and implementation of marketing campaigns and programs. It's such a broadbased kind of thing that my duties and responsibilities arent limited strictly to promotion. And that's where we are today.

I think as we look at the trend in music today, we see that Disco has offered another avenue of exposure for Black releases and we've had quite a few Black hits come out of Disco. But I dont see one record that we can say was broken by Pop radio. I do stand to be corrected on that, man, but Pop, generally, is out early on the more established acts. Some of the Black product crossing over from Disco, I wouldnt say to be broken by Pop radio



but exposed the traditional R&B to Poproute.

I feel like it is easier to cross a record because of the attitude of Pop radio today, but it can also be attributed to the attitude of the producers today. I think the producers are taking the shackles off their minds and the shackles off their creativity by just incorporating general market kinds of ingredients into their creative process. I also think that as society becomes closer together so does every component part of society, and music, of course, is a very integral part of that.

I think the young programers of today are not so guilty of tunnel vision. I think it's much broader based now. They have been exposed to all forms of music without a lot of the stigma that has been attached to Black music. For example, B.B. King, B.B. King for years has been playing basically the same music, but with using the Crusaders, Styx and others as musicians and in production, you'll find that it's exposed and directed to a broader demographic audience. That's what I meant by the shackles off the minds of creativity.

I think we should eliminate the word crossover and go after the word simultaneous. I think a simultaneous release, or the release of product to be worked simultaneously with all formats, is really where we should start. I think in too many instances the industry itself puts labels on its music. I dont know if that is for convenience or whether we really feel that way.

I think at the consumer level they're demonstrating to us over and over again that they dont care. They want good music. Look at the Black formated radio stations that were into Rod Stewartbig, big, big record. It is the responsibility of the record company to listen to what the consumers tell them. The message is there loud and clear. The second point is to make sure that this simultaneousness of working the product is exhibited throughout marketing campaigns. Point of Purchase material, the racking of the product, all of these things have to be paid attention to. We should not limit our advertising to a specific kind of campaign.

What I really love in FRED is your section called Universals. I think that that just captures it all. This is Universal Music. It is not designed for specific format; it is designed for the popular audience.

I think we're all going to get to a point where we're all going to be above labels, if you know what I'm saying.

I find that there are too many disc jockeys who limit themselves to one type of radio. They dont set their sights high enough and they are not as well rounded as they need to be.


I'm not saying necessarily that everybody that's a disc jockey needs to be a manager, or have goals to be a manager. But there are too many in this business who do only enough to get by. You dont find that many that are out hustling off the air anymore.

Let's look at the very basics. I dont find that many disc jockeys taking an absolute interest in production. That's one of the most elementary parts of the job. Every job! Most key disc jockey iobs in the country involve on-air work in addition to a certain amount of production. I've hired some of these jocks who go in and are just very content to grab a piece of music and to cut a commerical. And that's a very basic example of too many opportunities that are slipping by that our people are not taking advantage of. They are pushed against the wall and made to perform. And there are so many people who are not using even an ounce of their real potential.

Most of us have abilities that we're just not using and we get locked in. We're all creatures of habit. We need to recognize the fact that we're creatures of habit. There are too many of our people who are scared to try other things. How many disc jockeys that read your magazine have ever been

with a salesperson on a call? How many people really understand what that sales guy had to go through to even get that order? How many can really appreciate the manager?

Copy! Copy the best. Establish a standard, feel the limits and explore the limits of your own abilities. But, learn the craft! Dont just learn the tricks of the trade, learn the trade. As you become confident in another person's style then you'll develop your own. Every artist starts out painting other people's pictures and then develops his own style, his own personality. But you cant really develop your own style until you've studied the elements of style I dont think in anything.

Dont lose sight of the fact that you are an entertainer.

You know, we went through a period where everybody said "Be yourself". I kept telling my jocks, "For God's sakes, we're all so boring!" Please dont be yourself! Be an entertainer! Be something that you are not but dont get lost in it."


I dont care what you do-AOR, Country, Beautiful Music-if you cannot feel, if you cannot show an emotion (whether that be contrived or real or whatever), if you cant put that intangible something that makes you a a winner across to the listener, you're going to have a rough time.

Dont give up. So many guys get discouraged because they seemingly arent making fast enough progress. I've seen this over and over where guys will leave the business to go into something else and I think the thing that they have to remember is, once they have given up on radio, they for sure wont make it.

So, I think the whole key to it is, besides working real hard, dont give up. Hang in there until you make it pay off for yourself! It's the only thing that's paid off for me because God knows I'm not a real talent. I just hang in there every day and keep on pitchin'.

Interview **The Contemporary Window** Rick Sklar/ABC Radio

There is a natural tendency for discussions on music formats in radio to center on the songs and the artists. In some situations that kind of emphasis can be helpful. But if you're an agency or an advertiser looking for a better understanding of how to make music formats work for you, it is also practical to focus on the audiences those formats generate. It's an approach some of us in broadcasting use.

For instance, when we bring our ABC Radio program directors together for meetings the sessions are not called "programming meetings", they're called "audience meetings". We focus on the audience goals that our formats are designed to produce. It's important to know what kinds of audiences are being generated by these formats as well as asking "how? and why?". When you put the audiences for each format under a magnifying glass you get to see what is being delivered to the advertisers in the way of buying power.

Radio formats act as giant sorting devices that separate people into groups. These groups are very useful to us because the people in them share common lifestyle characteristics along with their common listening habits. And we know that people with common lifestyles frequently perform in common ways. If we talk about a format where a weather report is followed by Stevie Wonder segued into Chuck Mangione, call letters, a three unit commercial cluster and contest, we'll also have to think of how much appeal this sound has for heavy users of soft drinks.

Looking at formats this way, a well done contemporary station becomes a particularly fascinating operation. Contemporary stations, by definition, play something called top tunes. They were called top hundred stations in the early days of rock and roll and were intended very deliberately to appeal to teenagers, and in the beginning that is exactly what happened.

When ALAN FREED started playing the music on WINS/New York, 25 years ago, the station got big ratings but it was a tough sell. They couldnt give the spots away. The agencies said it was all the kids listening and the music wasnt



respectable. That's first hand. It was my first big job after college...the kid writing copy in the corner...and I shared an office with Freed. Radio kept playing the music and you know what happened. That sound moved in on the mainstream of American popular music and sometime during that first decade of its life...sometime between Freed's arrival in New York and the landing of the Beatles ten years later, that sound had become the mainstream of American popular music...accepted, enjoyed and listened to by almost everyone.

The teenagers of those days now have teenagers of their own. There are now two rock generations and therein lies the secret and the strength of contemporary formats. Contemporary stations still play the top tunes. Not a hundred of them. It's closer to top thirty or less, but they are the top tunes...the same songs, accepted and recognized and enjoyed by children, many teens and their parents. That adds up to a concept: Families. Contemporary stations are the closest thing you will find in the age of segmentation and fractionalization to a family music station.

I cant talk for all contemporary stations, but I can tell you something about how WABC was targeted and aimed during the 12 years (1962 to 1976) that I programed the station. During that time my goal was to build the largest curnes, shares and average quarterhours in the number one market so I would make the station first in America. This was done by attracting enormous numbers of each of the listening groups that make up the family audiences. This meant giving equal attention to the needs of each of the segments of that family audience, particularly avoiding being a "teen sounding station"-even Cousin Brucie at night had as many fans among the mothers as the daughters.

To understand the contemporary format it is important to remember that at many times of the day and in many situations...around the breakfast table, in the car...listening is frequently a group activity often dominated by the younger or even the youngest members present. We even programed for the children. That is a pity. Those undertwelves are in control of some portions of the family budget.

When Pulse was still in business there were many years when they did measure children. There were rating books in which WABC had as high as a 50 share of the under twelve market. One station in a market of four dozen with a 50 share of children and a good deal of it exclusive cumes. Kids probably still listen as much as ever but nobody is counting them. What a disaster! Eight thousand radio stations in America and nobody is counting the children. If you look at the rating books of WABC, even some fairly recent ones, you can see how the station's appeal holds up consistently across the board demographically—even the 44 to 54's. The game plan for the air product of contemporary radio is: try to please them all. That's about as close as you can get to a formula for contemporary.

Always search for common denominators...the common denominator air personality whose appeal cuts across the demos and the ages-common denominator ways of presenting the common denominator news and contests and promotions. But most of all, common denominator music, And that's the real toughie. No product is going to please all of the people all of the time. When it comes to music there absolutely is not that much musical material around that appeals to even most of those target groups without getting into a lot of repetition.

Does it have to be so repetitive? Even when you find a record that works you cant play it too early in its life because the older listeners arent comfortable with it yet and tune out. You cant keep it on too late in its life because the kids get tired of it. Contemporary has a smaller window in time. WABC used to drive record companies nuts, because it wreaks havoc with their marketing system. Finally they learned how to break product elsewhere and then sell an extra 750,000 to a million copies on WABC airplay while the window was open for that product on the station.


By contrast today's Album Rock stations aim for an 18-24 year old target and pick up many of the upscale sophisticated teens who abandon contemporary by age 14 or 15. They play entire albums and much new music along with entire concerts by a single group. Some of that music becomes so popular it crosses over at a later point in time when it reaches the contemporary window. So does disco music. A lot of contemporary music today started as disco, but that doesnt make the contemporary station a disco station when it plays that piece of music.

Sometimes the distinction between disco and contemporary starts to blurr in some minds. It never happens with Album Rock formats. You know it if you just go to a Grateful Dead concert and see all those T-shirts that say "Better Dead than Disco." Look at it this way: We know disco stations build their market shares, among other ways by listening spans long enough to build smaller cumes into large metro shares. The shares are metro, by the way, not TSA or ADI. The data we have seen so far shows great contrast in audiences between contemporary and disco. Remember there is a common music blanket that wraps the family and delivers them in contemporary.

Some research on the disco phenomenon in New York has shown

unheard of skews in demographics. Listen to these unusual items: A single station in the New York market, playing pure disco, with a 21 share in single listeners. One station out of 48. That's incredible! The next nearest station, a semi-disco, had a 9.5. The big contemporary only a 6.5. The pure disco station also had a 17 share of divorced listeners. Life is rhythmic. People are rhythmic. The heart beats to a rhythm. The lungs open and close in rhythm. Rhythm is a great companion for lonely people.

The most important factor which will determine which musical formats are the most successful in the years to come may be the methodologies by which the music radio audiences are being measured. There appears to be evidence that differences exist in music format preferences among the types of people who respond to different methodologies or ways of being measured. An older, more sendentary person who



will agree to and actually keep a 7-day diary may not like the same type of music that a person who is on the run, and whose listening habits can only be captured in a single telephone interview.

The more the act of measuring gets in the way of the truth, the more distortion there is in the results. The more things you ask people to do in order to measure them, the more people you lose. The more the original, pure sample is lost by the methodology, the more you have to substitute more cooperative types of people, the farther you get from reality.

Diary response rates among younger people are particularly low. If most young people in the original, pure random sample refuse to keep diaries and they go back again and again and finally get some atypical young people who will keep diaries, it is likely that those young people also behave atypically in their listening. Radio audience measurement response rates vary

depending on the methods used. We have one-day diaries and seven-day diaries. We have one-day phone calls, two days of phoning, and up to seven days. We have personally kept diaries, telephone reported diaries where one person reports by phone for a family, and personal placement and retrieval diaries where the rating service comes to the home. Each system seems to result in different shares for different music formats. If a station shows a 6 share under one methodology and a 9 share under another...that's not a difference of 3 percent, that's a difference for that station of 33 1/3 percent...one third bigger audience.

Contemporary, disco, soul, country and album rock, if added together, constitute the largest portion of the listening fare on radio. These formats were very big in the days when we determined listening by means of interviewers who knocked on the door, caught the listener before the listener could get away and recorded their radio listening.

The relative popularity of these formats vis-a-vis other formats seemed to shrink somewhat when we found a less expensive way of doing ratings, via the U.S. mails and started asking listeners to keep seven-day diaries and write down their listening habits... perhaps not the wisest request in the world to make of people with busy lifestyles who listen to pop music in its various forms. After a number of years of this shrinkage in listeners, the operators of Black and Spanish format music stations spoke up and the problem was addressed for them. As you know, Spanish speaking listeners are now visited in their homes and listening in predominantly black zip codes is retrieved by telephone by the major rating service. When this was done many more listeners were found.

A few years ago, after many complaints by our program directors, I had a researcher simply lay out the ratings done by all types of methodolgies covering a full two years in New York, Los Angeles and Chicago, for all stations. If you grouped the shares by format you could see that systems that used techniques like quick telephone interviews to catch the elusive on-the-move pop music listeners found 30 percent more listeners in contemporary, 25 percent more in album rock and substantially higher for country. Black formats performed over 50% better.

The future of contemporary music and all the other pop music formats depends not on the programers but on the advertisers. You know that the name of the game is not how well contemporary or album rock is doing out there, but how well it is reported doing.



same: to be the hip leader in your market

Hip image is different things to different people. If you dont have it all the way, if you are weak musically or promotionally, you will suffer in the ratings. So the ultimate goal becomes more specific; it is to make what Buzz calls the "extraordinary connection" (Quest 5/7). When "you are not totally controlled by the perception of the audience, you have become the creator of perception and the juggler of illusion, allowing you to pluck the responsive chord at will". Sounds obvious enough, but the stations that do exactly that, KMET or WLRS or WMMS, are able to "pluck the responsive chord" and they do it at will, usually during ratings.

Disco continues to be in the center of the image controversy and image. good or bad, is a large part of disco's success. Disco is usually actively loved or actively hated, and in AOR's case, it is most often the latter. It would be rare to find an AOR programer or jock who hasnt experienced the age old listener reaction to the occasional R&B or Disco record. "Why are you playing that boogie shit?" or "Get that disco shit off the air!" That is to be expected given that the target audience of most AORs is white 18-34 males.

A few weeks ago, C.C. spoke of rolls and stingers and their value to programing. They tell the listener that something special is coming and it makes them pay attention. C.C. was refering to news and public affairs as well as promotions, and now JOHN McGHAN and the staff of WDVE are using many of those elements in a great image building promotion. It's called "Disco Destruction on WDVE" and you can bet your last dollar that the target listeners, those active males, love every minute of it. What is great is that they give nothing away and rely solely on the creativity of the air and production staff. Featured are promos declaring that "WDVE dumps on Disco" with the sound of mirror balls crashing to the floor, "In The Navy" being blown up on the air, and snatches of Disco hits being machine-gunned into oblivion. Disco is probably as healthy as ever in Pittsburgh, but to that town's AOR listeners it is being destroyed singlehandedly by WDVE who are defusing a threat and "making the extraordinary connection".





EDDIE JEFFERSON was born in Pittsburgh, Pa. in 1918. The 60 year old jazz singer was honored in 1975 by the Downbeat Magazine Critics' Poll as the Top Male Vocalist of that year.

Jefferson enjoyed an active recording and concert career, with his current album, Live-Liest, getting increasing amounts of airplay around the country right now.

On the morning of May 9, after doing a show at Baker's Keyboard
