KLOS GETS A PD

Los Angeles—Finally, ABC-FM has a PD at KLOS. Long time air personality DAMION has been named to fill the long vacant position. The question of who would take over the coveted spot was answered this week by BILL SUMMERS, General Manager of the ABC rocker.

"I had talked to people from all over the country, and felt that Damion was the best qualified to take the programing postion. He's been with the station for seven years, so I felt that he obviously knew the marketplace.

"ABC Radio has a training course for programers, which Damion has been through. He has been helping us while we've been without a PD, so he was in a natural position to take over the job," explained Summers.

"During the time that we had no PD, I just began assuming some of the music responsibilities," said Damion

when contacted by FRED, "along with RUTH PINEDO, who has been invaluable in keeping this station together. I've been slowly osmosing into the position.

"There's a lot of work to do to make up for the time without a PD. What I'm trying to do is get the station in synch with 1979. I feel that we're out of time in many aspects of the music. There will be some new music as well as more tracks from the tried and true albums," Damion said. "Hopefully, we'll make the station more exciting."

"When I was a kid I used to play king of the mountain, and it's time for the king, KMET, to be deposed. We'll give it a flying shot, anyway, "laughed Damion.

"KROQ, which was the only station in town dealing with New Wave, has gone into a top album tracks type of format. I think we'll pick up some of that audience. Plus we've just hired a personality, FRAZIER SMITH, who is very well known in this market. He's presently working part time, but I hope to have a full time slot open for him in the near future."

WOL Plugola Hearing

Washington—Sonderling Broadcast Corporation's WOL-AM looks like the latest candidate for a sale to a minority group under the FCC's Distress Sale clause. That possibility came to be after the commission, with a 7-0 vote, designated the station's license renewal for hearing on evidence uncovered in a payola/plugola investigation. It is plugola, rather than payola, that is the center of the hearing.

The action will, apparently, not affect Viacom International's proposal to acquire Sonderling in a stock and cash transaction that is valued at \$27,675,000. The proposal did not include Sonderling's motion picture chain or WOPA-AM and WBMX-FM/Oak Park, III.

One option is the distress sale of WOL. At the conclusion of the meeting, it seemed that Sonderling would

dispose of the station under the commission policy allowing broadcasters facing revocation or renewal denial to sell the station(s) in question to a minority at a decrease from the fair market value.

CHARLES KELLEY, Division Chief of the Hearing Division, Broadcast Bureau of the FCC told FRED that the hearing still had not been set and that his office wouldnt know Sonderling's decision until that time.

When asked about the possibility of the distress sale, Kelley commented, "That would hardly surprise me because it seems that everyone who has been designated for hearing has sold or is trying to sell the station in question. Sonderling has not filed for that, as yet, but they certainly have plenty of time to make that decision."


The Big "F"

DUNCAN FIRED

Worcester—JOHN DUNCAN has been fired as Program Director at Album rocker WAAF/Worcester. Duncan was let go after slipping on the air with one of those seven little words that it is verboten for broadcasters to use.

At the end of his show, Duncan back- announced a TED NUGENT cut with, "Ted Nugent on AAF. That fuckin' song blows my mind."

"I sat down with the GM and said, 'Steve, I've been a broadcasting professional for eight years. This is the first time that something like that has slipped out.' It happens," explained Duncan to FRED.

"It's inevitable and unfortunate, but it happens. We've all heard it on the air before," stated Duncan. "I felt that a fine or a reprimand would have been in order, but firing me was a little extreme."

Duncan went on to explain that, although he feels GM STEVE MARX to be very good at his job, they have had programing differences over the past few months.

When FRED contacted Marx he said, "I dont think that this is a proper topic to be aired in the press. It's really between John and me."

NEW NEWS NET AT NBC

New York—NBC Radio is putting another news network together. The name of the net is yet to be decided, but stations are already showing interest in airing the news feed from New York.

The network is the second for NBC which already has a national network of wholly owned and affiliate stations. The new net will get off on May 28.

NBC spokesman, PETER HAM-ILTON explains the operation to FRED. "Right now, it's set up with newscasts. That's the first thing a network does is get their news staff together. JIM CAMERON from WCOZ/Boston is going to be our News Director. He'll also be one of our on-air anchor people. His approach to news is totally conversational. It's nowhere near as formal as NBC News On the Hour or Television newscasts."

The new network will not necessarily be carried by the members of the NBC Radio Network. To date they have

21 stations signed, most of which are Album formated.

"The network is going after the 12-34 age group. We feel that this will be a major step in news broadcasting for the younger audience," stated Hamilton.

"The news will be fed out of New York at quarter past the hour initially from 3:15pm (EST) to 8:15pm. The newscasts are each two minutes long. By August, we expect to expand to a 12, 18 and then 24-hour operation. Stations will be allowed to delay broadcasts for only ten minutes after they receive it from New York, "Hamilton went on to say.

"We have retained Burkhart/ Abrams as consultants in programing the new network," ended Hamilton.

The stations that will be carrying the new network are: WKLS/Atlanta, WEBN/Cincinnatti, WLRS/Louisville, KQRS/Minneapolis, KDKB/Phoenix, KGON/Portland, WPRO/Providence, KISW/Seattle, KBPI/Denver, WLVQ/Columbus, Y-100/Miami, WMJQ/Rochester and KPRI/San Diego.

Rocks On!

Louisville—E. ALVIN DAVIS has been brought in to act as Program Consultant for WKLO-AM and FM sister WCFM/Louisville.

In his first move, E. Alvin replaced General Manager BERNIE THOMPSON with JOHN OTTING, from WEBN/ Cincinnati.

Another immediate change was to take WCFM from its automated Beautiful Music format to a live Universals approach. "Rock, and Roll records hit the airwaves May 17," Davis announced. With this new format came a call letter change to WKJJ-FM.

E. Alvin is presently looking for talent to staff WKJJ and feels that once the transition is made and the station is running smoothy, a new Program Director will be hired. Davis himself will remain as Program Consultant.

Davis was most recently corporate Program Director for Affiliated Broadcasting. He also worked as PD at WSAI-AM and FM, both in Cincinnati.

Z93 Sues WQXI

Atlanta-Hot 'Lanta' is getting hotter as the American Rafting Association and WZGC Radio file suit to prevent efforts by WQXI to profit from the Annual Raft Race on the Chattahoochee River.

WZGC and the ARA have a contract between them for the promotional rights to this year's race. These rights formerly were held by WQXI under an expired contract.

The two count lawsuit asks the court to enjoin WQXI from inducing the public to participate in a 'WQXI-Budweiser Fleet" contest for cash prizes in the raft race.

The suit also asks that the court require WQXI to broadcast retractions of its media campaign to offer \$25,000 in cash prizes to rafts displaying advertising in the name of WOXI and Budweiser.

The actions of WQXI, as charged in the suit, include advising the public that no registration is necessary to participate in their fleet. This has caused some confusion among race entrants about the ARA requirements for race registration and could cause havoc at the start of the race.

The suit seeks \$1,250,000 in actual and punitive damages on each count.

San Jose-RALPH COLE, KLIV Music-Director, is leaving the station to take some time off from the radio industry.







QUEST by Buzz Bennett

This is the last time I'm ever going to write about Disco in Quest because it's over. When I say it's over, it must be understood that I'm not saying we should all stop playing records that have a heavy bass line or a hot four-four dance feel. I'm just saying there is an urgent need to stop overindulging in this image. It is not hip anymore. The illusion is now ineffective in mass-appeal, music radio.

The term disco should be taken away from the airwaves except for stations indulging in disco exclusively and prepared to settle for tenth place or less. I must of course exclude New York City because it is so loudly ethnic and WKTU will continue to do well but will be less effective month by month unless a balance is initiated. The new book is not out yet but I will give my opinion now. WKTU will slide. 99X will come up some. WNBC will come up some. WBLS will come up some, and smaller fragments will be given to other stations. There is no doubt that album radio all over the country will reap success because of disco burn. Now let's get to the basics of what disco type music was/is and where it's going.

WHERE DID IT COME FROM?

I can take my mind back to the roots of tribal dancing where the drum was king, or back to the American Indian who thrived on the sound drug called the drum. With our advanced technology we added the electronic bass and other throbbing techniques but the best example is still the art of Haitian heart beat thythms which link directly to a voodoo ritual.

In Haitian drumming there is one member of the group called centerpole. He is the ultimate drummer taught since childhood to work his drum in conjunction with the human heart. He is responsible for maintaining the unity of several musicians around him who usually play another drum or piece of pipe. This is merely for variation and repetition. The centerpole drummer has been taught so well, for so long, to play this one consistent rhythm that he cannot even conceive of creativity. He is so oriented that individual variation is impossible.

So he consistently plays the rhythm of the heart and all cult members listen closely as a hypnotic effect takes place. Through concentration, trance is self-induced. Through hypnotic trance, the drum becomes connected to the heart

and euphoria is found. The being is now almost mindless. The centerpole drummer has almost reached his goal. He continues and continues, then the payoff.

One by one the victims of ultimate overindulgence begin to have what we call brain seizures. They flinch and jerk and lose control of all mental faculties. The drumming then stops and those who didnt swallow their tongue return to consciousness and treck to the ocean to meet the Great Spirit. Just another diversion from reality like Studio 54.

WHERE IT IS. We are in the advance stages of orientation where tuneout begins. In the western world, this music we call disco is not a religion and people are not in seek of hypnotic trance and seizure. We are constantly in search of conscious alternatives. The appeal for disco is narrowing day by day.

WHERE IT'S GOING. It will lose its dominance and become part of the mix. No, it will not go away and it was never not here. It will merely be put back into perspective.

Footnote: This article has no bearing on disco clubs or any other form of alternative media, just mass appeal radio.

CIPHER by C.C. Courtney

This is a clear-up-some-points article. I would first like to pass on some tips to female jocks as promised many issues ago. There will be whole articles on the subject, but let me make one point here that will require a lifetime of work but show immediate results.

Sex. A subject more difficult for women to approach on the air because of prevailing societal norms. Sex is, however, absolutely impossible to avoid seeing as how two-thirds of the music and half the commercials are drenched with it. You can ignore it or you can play with it, but you cant not be aware of it.

Believe this to be true, however: Getting close to the mike and talking breathily or so quietly that the saliva clicks louder than the voice is not sexy. It is boring after awhile. This is only one of many techniques that you should use. Back off and speak up.

And for God's sake laugh a little, ladies. I mean really laugh. There is something about real laughter that makes anything you do alright. And I so seldom hear women laugh on the radio. Dont just giggle either---laugh! I once heard Beverly on WKBW segue

from "Get Down Tonight" to "That's The Way I Like It" while laughing this full-throated laugh as she said, "That's the way I like it, uh huh, uh huh!" Instant love.

Now, another point to clear up. First I said that 99X sounded quiet but maybe quiet was what New York needs in a radio station since everyone else is playing disco. Then I turned around and said that the radios I heard in Central Park were all on WBLS or WKTU. These two statements are not contradictory. In the first place, people walking in Central Park carrying radios are not truly representative of the universe of the Metro Survey Area which includes five big, totally individual sections of which Manhattan is but the center.

In the second place, I believe BOBBY RICH is a programer who does his homework and surely he has found something that urges him to program 99X as he does. Only time and the ARB will tell, and even that will not be a crystal clear statement of fact.

One last point to clear up is about last week's voice strengthening exercise. In case you missed it, I gave the main part of the exercise Sir Laurence

Olivier used to lower his voice an octave when he played Othello. The exercise does not have as its main function the deepening of the voice---its main purpose is to strengthen and fatten the voice. It makes it fuller and more resonant.

There is an additional part of the exercise that really aids in this process. With the same three-fingersin-the-mouth approach, belt out a nice falsetto oo-oo. Falsetto is the way Mick Jagger sings in "Miss You" when he goes hoo-oo-oo. You will be making that same sound but with your mouth open as widely as possible and you must do it as loudly as you can.Go up the scale as far as it is comfortable for you. Then take a deep breath and start at that high point and let your voice slide like a whistle lower and lower in falsetto. It will have to get quieter as you go until finally you are very quiet.

After a week of two of these two exercises you will be able to slip back and forth from falsetto to chest-voice without a break or cracking in your voice.

This really works, by the way, and I'll show you more about it at the FRED convention.

Winning An 80 Teen Share

JIM SUMPTER, PROGRAM DIRECTOR CK-101/Cocoa Beach

I was raised in a suburb of Los Angeles. I went to the BILL WADE School for Disc-Jockies. He was on KHJ at that time. It took four months and 89 airchecks to land my first job in Holbrook, Arizona at KDJI, located in a house trailer on Route 66. I owe my life to WALT LOWE, the GM, who made me PD without even listening to my tape.

Then I was offered a job at WKXY in Sarasota, Florida. I ended up bouncing around several stations and then landed at WQAM in Miami for two years. JIMMY DUNLAP was an incredible person to work with as is TOM BURCH, who really got me into programing. Finally, CK-101 offered me the freedom and responsibility I had been looking for.

These people in Cocoa Beach are very, very receptive. They feed back to you immediately. If you're doing something here that people dont like, they let you know immediately. We only do outcalls to measure marketing, not for testing music. This is one place that I cannot even do outcalls and still be on target, if I just listen to what the people have to say.

If there's a song that is really hitting home with me or STEVE OCEAN, my Music Director, a song that relates to a personal experience, we have to eliminate that immediately just to get to the facts of it. Of course, that can play a part in your decision-making, because if it connects with you, there's that chance it could connect with someone else in the audience. I would no more want to add a record that I psychologically or emotionally fest



attached to than I would want to pull a song off the playlist simply because I was burnt out on it. I am not the typical listener.

When considering powering new records, you have to continuously ask yourself, "Does this tune accurately reflect both the market that we're serving and what we hope the radio station is to whoever's listening?" The sound is most important.

As far as being aggressive, BUZZ BENNETT said it best in Quest, "First, Right & Hard." I really agree with that. I know there are a lot of programers sitting out there waiting...and waiting... and waiting while the competition is hammering them home. By the time these stations get on new product, it's already lost its programing "explosion value."

Every record, if it's played correctly, has a built-in cume factor to it. The

rotation is of the optimum importance and you've got to find out what that is and get a gauge on it. If you take a song that you know will need time to break and put it in a Pluto rotation, you may invest three or four weeks' worth of airplay just to learn that it's a stiff. I cant understand that logic.

Programing a radio station is really a very simple process. Everything has been laid out for us. What happens is that all too often we stray from what we know to be right. There have been some incredibly great minds that have been involved in radio programing long before I or some of today's biggestname programers even got started.

All of the mistakes have been made. All of the right techniques have been demonstrated. The key is taking as many of the right things we *know* will work for us and adapting them to the individual market while being careful of the compromises we are forced to make.

If we know something's wrong in our hearts and minds, we stay away from it. If we know something to be right, we've got to lock in and make sure those things that are right are indeed a part of our radio station.

CK-101 enjoys the best record service in the radio industry for one reason only—because we try to be honest. If promotion people reach a dead end with Steve, I ask them to call me—at 3 AM if it's necessary. Some people think that's weird, but I dont, because I love radio. It's my life. If I dont hear a record as a hit, I'm ready to dissect it, at length, to study the mix, structure, momentum—whatever it takes to communicate to the record industry my reason for not adding the record.

Cart Eq-ing

The subject of equalization is fraught with subjectivity—that is, it varies with the listener. There are some strange theories around and some of them bear investigation. For example, it is said that 2000 cps is a frequency irritating to women because it is in the range of a baby's cry. Therefore, radio stations should do what they can to control that frequency.

There are other points worthy of investigation and the entire subject of how to equalize is not that clearly understood by the average person doing production in the average radio station. FRED will cover this subject thoroughly in this space during the next few weeks. We are starting this week by asking engineers at stations with excellent onair processing to tell us the engineer's point of view. We will also cover equalization for stations that do not have decent on-air audio chains.

BOB SMITH WRKO-AM/Boston

What is the proper equalization for carting spots or music?

Flat. Totally flat. Unless there is an obvious problem on a commercial take that's coming from outside. Which does happen sometimes.

Do you find any specific frequencies that cause problems that you try to take out?

The usual problem is sibilance. Sometimes outside tapes have been hyped a little in the upper midrange, which causes sibilance. And we try to bring them back.

We have an extensive audio processing system and that will do most of the real necessary corrections as it's played on the air.

BILL MASSEY KPOL-AM, KZLA-FM/Los Angeles

What is the proper equalization for carting music or spots?

Well, you're asking a question here that is a matter of philosophy for different people. And we dont equalize period. Not in the recording process.

Do you find that there are any specific frequencies that cause you problems?

It depends on what you're trying to do. The question that you're asking is a pretty general question. Different people are going to answer it differently, depending on what they're trying to do.

If you're going for loud, it's one problem. If you're going for quality, it's another. The only thing that we do at all is compensate for the hundred and fifty

Dereg Plan Threatens Co-op Advertising

The following article, found in Advertising Age Magazine, aptly describes another facet of the deregulation question being posed to the FCC. This is a side of this issue that FRED has not yet touched on and we feel it to be of the utmost importance.

Deregulation talk that is welcomed by broadcasters is causing consternation among experts on co-op advertising.

The worry is that the Federal Communications Commission will stop investigating reports of double billing and other frauds by radio and tv stations against advertisers.

● That would send manufacturer confidence in tv and radio as co-op advertising media into a tailspin, Armstrong Cork's R.D. (Bob) Wilcox predicted last week, adding that the Assn. of National Advertisers probably will file the "strongest kind of comments" with FCC.

• "FCC has been marvelous at going after stations and keeping them honest." Mr. Wilcox said.

The FCC debate over policing of co-op is part of the overall review currently under way at FCC to find ways of cutting back government involvement in broadcasting. The most publicized segment involves virtual deregulation of radio for a five or six-year experimental period. FCC's decision to withdraw from the policing of co-op is part of a separate project that also considers whether FCC should leave

If we were programing a different format and targeting a different audience, we would have a different philosophy. But, we're not in the loud game right now.

DON AMELL WLS/Chicago

Are there any specific frequencies that cause problems when you're carting.

Records are the way the producer wanted them to be when he made them, so if you equalize, you're changing that concept. There may be flaws somewhere in duplication and you may want to correct by adding some highs or lows or taking them out. But, there's no proper settings.

other broadcaster/advertiser issues, such as double billing and "clipping" of commercials, to private litigation of the Federal Trade Commission.

The major radio deregulation proposal, which would also eliminate any government restriction on the number of commercials carried by stations, got a boost from an FCC staff study that shows moderate commercialization levels on stations in both small and large markets.

The FCC staff study showed the great majority of stations in 14 Georgia and Alabama markets operated at 50% or less of the FCC 18-minute standard.

The same survey also showed that the stations aired more than FCC's recommended percentages of news and public affairs programs.

The possibility that FCC might hang up its "policeman's" hat caught Mr. Wilcox unaware, but debate on what role FCC should play in protecting advertisers has been simmering inside FCC for some time. The issue will go public in the next several weeks when FCC officially publishes a notice seeking comment on what it should do.

The debate will put the co-op advertisers in the position of advocating continued government intervention in the marketplace, while FCC staffers favoring deregulation argue that advertiser-broadcaster disputes are best resolved by themselves.

"The question is whether the commission should spend its limited time chasing these people (broadcasters) when the courts are available to advertisers," one top FCC staffer said.

But Mr. Wilcox contended that the threat of a vigilant FCC, with its power to revoke a broadcaster's license, is the glue that makes co-op advertising on tv and radio work.

● When the FCC revokes a license for fraudulent billing, as it did not long ago to two Berlin, N.H., radio stations, the entire broadcast industry takes notice, Mr. Wilcox said. "There's nothing we're going to be able to do in a court of law that will have that impact."

An FCC staffer countered that the agency would still consider revoking the licenses of stations involved in fraud. But the commission would act only after someone else—such as the advertiser—had investigated and proved the case.

Interview

LES GARLAND and KFRC/San Francisco, Part One:

THE GAR MAN SPEAKS

FRED: Creativity in radio is under seige. How do you see the gut vs research issue?

LES: Creativity is instinct. When that instinct is on, it'll outdo research any day; it'll win. Research can tell you a lot of things, but maybe not always the right answers. It's how the expert who's reading that research applies it. It's his own thinking, his own creativity, his own instinct that makes it a winner or a loser.

FRED: KFRC is a music station, but you also have useful information. How do you blend the two?

LES: Any given segment of a radio station—if it's 15 minutes or 60—is just a block of time to a listener. Everything that happens has to be as good as the thing that precedes it and the thing that follows it.

People on the street like to hear you talking about a subject that is very relative to what's going on—like the gas shortage—like asking your listeners "What's your opinion of Linda Ronstadt and Jerry Brown hanging out together in Africa?" You know, talking about that can be as strong as a record produced if it's produced right. A promo can be a mini-program in itself—if produced right. That should be the objective!

A promo should shine above the radio station. As great as the radio station is in its air personalities, in its music, its news, its national commercials, its local commercials. The promos, in my opinion, should tower above all those things and be the finest piece on your radio station. It's a stage that



people will look at with their ears and hear the very essence of your radio station. You have to expose that in your promos.

A lot of programers make mistakes when they build promotions because they're so close to the radio business, but not so close to what's going on, they think the reason you put together a contest is to make people pick up the phone and call and maybe win. That really, in my opinion, is not the objective. The objective is to get people to participate in a contest with their ears, not with their fingers.

It doesn't require picking up the telephone and dialing the number. It doesnt require something on a postcard. It doesnt require going to a certain place to participate. If it's done right, it's entertaining to listen to even though you're not participating. You can do it just for the kick. Watching game shows on television is the same thing. Hopefully radio has a little more imagination than "Let's Make A Deal" and can make it more theatre of the mind where the person almost sees something visually. That generates interest and loyalty to a radio station. FRED: How do you deal with the constant pressures of the ratings and the inevitable ups and downs?

LES: We dealt with the problem last

summer. All of a sudden the Giants got hot. It was ridiculous. Giant fever had taken over San Francisco and I was fully aware that we were going to feel the effects of that in the summer book. We went through that book with what I felt was excellent programing but there was nothing we could do against a phenomenon like a baseball team as hot as that one was. That's not admitting loss, that's admitting reality.

Sure enough, the book delivered and KSFO which carried Giants baseball went from, I believe, a 3.5 to an 8.8 and took the market. We went from number one back to number three-still a number one music station but from first place in the 12 plus share back to number three. Quite a blow, but our GM, PAT NORMAN, said it best when I was a little depressed about the book, He said, "Put that one in the wastebasket", which I thought was a great reaction from a general manager. He understood the situation and though not content with the radio station being where it was, knew that we had performed as well as could be done under those circumstances.

That wasnt defeat—that was just the situation, but as a program director you suffer from the wounds of taking a book like that and you can start thinking defensively. You know, if

people dont know enough to look into the situation, that's their problem. You dont owe them an explanation. The intelligent people out there understand. They could have very well been in a situation just like that. If you're the number one music station, then you really have won. You cant go to bed thinking "I didnt win". FRED: When baseball comes on the air what demographics are hit the hardest?

LES: Last summer it was appealing to 12 plus. I saw that happen in Detroit. too, when I was at CKLW. Believe it or not, WJR, a station most of whose audience was scored a 19 in teens in a summer book because Mark "The Bird" pitched three games during the book. They kicked our ass in teens and that was baseball.

FRED: It's a rating phenomenon, isnt it?

LES: The methodology of the ARB is simple to understand. If a baseball game draws a very small percentage of the people holding diaries and they listen for two and a half hours consecutively-that station is going to skyrocket in the book. If they've got six games, then you go from a 3.5 to an 8.8.

FRED: Who do you consider your primary competitor?

LES: I think you have to look at all stations as competition, AM and FM. although I believe when you're in a situation of a KFRC you cant counterprogram too much. You have to let them counter-program you. If you're in the winning seat, then you continue to take the initiative and set the pace. Make them follow you and try to attack you at your own game. Be the leader! The minute you start following, you'll find yourself in trouble.

People say that KFRC sounds more FM-ish or AOR-ish than it ever has before. That may be true but that's not because of FM competition. That's because that's where the media's going and I think that's what you have to do to get 18-34 year olds to listen today. It's got nothing to do with what belongs on FM or AM. Hit records are hit. records and hit radio stations are the same.

FRED: Do you feel there is a decline in AM radio?

LES: There certainly is a decline. A lot of people have said FM radio killed AM radio. I dont happen to be one of the believers of that theory. I think maybe AM radio has caused its own decline through bad programing. If it's good it will get ratings as proven with KFRC. CKLW just made a comeback in Detroit, a market where "AM radio is dying." I believe this is possible anywhere with good programing.

I think the most important part of AM stereo is the fact that radio stations will be able to say "AM Stereo". "Stereo" is a very important word in the listeners minds. It's proven that about 75% to 80% of the people who listen to FM dont even listen in stereo. so it's not technical, it's that it is stereo that's important.

Technical things do come into play but if you've got a decent AM signal and you're a programer worth your weight, you'll take it and do good in any market. I think it's admitting defeat to say the AM dial doesnt make it anymore.

FRED: Let's get back to the baseball issue. Can you confront the situation? Is there anything you can do about baseball at all?

LES: Yeah, after sleeping on that summer book when the Giants and KSFO did so well, I said "Man, next year I've got to come up with something!" We came up with this idea: The 610 Thousand Dollar Baseball Team. 610 is the frequency of the radio station and the \$10,000 was the hook. There was \$10,000 at stake total. The promo started on the air about the same time as exhibition baseball started. The

pre-promo, you know, "The All-Star Baseball Team is coming to KFRC". We started talking baseball, and then promos hit. Our Allstar baseball team was made up of ten All Stars Baseball Team. (You can hear the whole thing next week on the KFRC aircheck to be included in each copy of FRED.) The Giants at the time were happening. They were selling out 55,000 seats at home while the contest was in full swing. People were winning money right and left. We put an airplane up over all the home games that said, "The 610 Thousand Dollar All Stars are playing on KFRC right now." Hopefully, people do take transistor radios to ball games and people when they get out of that game would tune to KFRC to see what that was all about. Maybe we would have a chance to generate some new listeners and we would at least be relating to baseball. KFRC listeners who were into baseball, and there were a large number of them. formed a certain loyalty to KFRC for recognizing baseball instead of ignoring







Question: How long has it been since the Jefferson Starship (Airplane) played a free concert in Golden Gate Park? I really wouldnt know the exact amount of time but I know that it's been a long. long time. Or had been a long, long time.

In a shining example of positive subterfuge, KMEL held the Northern California Frisbee Championships in Golden Gate Park and guess who showed up?

Apparently the Starship had been seeking permission from the board of supervisors to do a free concert and had run into some strong opposition, most likely because of the huge crowds such an event would attract. Meanwhile, the people at KMEL had spoken with the Starship but were vehemently denying that they would play at the frisbee championship, instead promoting the Greg Kihn Band who would appear as announced

KMEL had all the necessary permits including a permit for a "local" band to appear, and sure enough, the "local" band was this year's version of the Starship, featuring ex-Elvin Bishop vocalist at the mic. Marty Balin and Grace Slick were reportedly in attendance but did not perform. The event received good local media coverage, a real bonus during the ARB, including a mention in S.F. Chronicle columnist Herb Caen's column. Herb summed it very well, concluding that "officialdom was had, but good."

Next question: How often does a record need to be played before any kind of reaction surfaces? Obviously, it depends on the record and on the audience but JERRY OSTERTAG of KGON threw some interesting statistics our way. Proceeding on the premise that 20% of your audience determines maybe 60% of your total share, if a record is played three times a day, Monday through Friday, between 6 am and midnight, the record will be played 15 times in a one-week period, Approximately 50% of the audience will hear that record once and approximately 15% will hear it three times (whew). It would appear, then, that the same 15% who heard the song three times would make up the lion's share of that same 20% that determines 60% of your quarter hour share. So theoretically the active listeners would react positively or negatively in a relatively short period of time because their exposure rate is about three to one over the rest of the audience.

This also lends credence to the theory that a record could be heard a grand total of zero times by a good portion of the audience and still fulfill relatively high record company expectations. In any case, it's solid food for thought. which is rare these days.





Radio Free Jazz magazine has put together a scholarship fund for music students at the prestigious Berklee College of Music. Annually, they have two \$2000 and two \$1000 scholarships to be used towards two semesters (1 year) of study.

Berklee, located in Boston, has been internationally hailed as a major center of education for career musicians, composers, arrangers and music educators. The college offers a 4-year program of study leading to the degree of Bachelor of Music or a diploma in Professional Music. In either program students may major in Jazz Composition and Arranging, Performance, Audio Recording, Electronic Music, Film Scoring, Composition Music or Education.

RFJ's scholarship competition is open to anyone who meets Berklee's entrance requirements. Applicants must submit (1) a tape recording of their playing, (2) a summary of their

academic and music background and (3) a brief outline of their professional or semi professional experience, if any.
