

## **GASOHOL**

To FRED:

This is a follow-up letter to a press release you should have received about KEWI's Gasohol sale. To date, no radio station has promoted Gasohol.

Since Gasohol went on sale in Topeka, over 25,000 gallons have been sold. KEWI did a follow-up on several drivers who purchased Gasohol during our sale. The response varies: "I cant tell the difference between Gasohol and gasoline" or "I like using Gasohol because the alcohol comes from our farm produce" or, "My car runs better on Gasohol".

Let me give you a little background on how KEWI got involved. One afternoon News Director, MIKE MANS, noticed a Gasohol truck at a service station, (the service station is located 100 yards from our radio station). His sources had told him that Gasohol was not due until after July of 1979; because of federal and state tax purposes. We contacted the owners of the station and found they were going to put Gasohol on sale the next morning. Since the federal tax examption for Gasohol does not go into effect until July; the owners expected to lose five to eight cent per gallon. The owners of the service station were committed to Gasohol; KEWI felt a radio commitment was needed. In less than one hour, announcements describing Gasohol and the reduced price were on the air. In less than 18 hours the programing and news staff was mustered for a full scale community promotion. Disc jockeys walked among the cars shaking hands and introducing themselves. Newspeople gathered information for follow-up reports on Gasohol. The point I'm trying to make is: this was not a promotion in a sense that many promotions are put together. There was no time for week-long promos, lines, and ad libs. We expected no national or local television coverage. The money we spent was inconsequential. But the amount of effort and enthusiasm contributed by the staff of KEWI brought an energy alternative to the ears of Topeka. No amount of advertising could have been purchased to equal the effect of this Gasohol sale.







## The FRED Conference Calls:

The FRED SPECTRUM III, PLATINUM, GOLD, SILVER and BLACK Communicator Networks are designed chiefly as programing tools for radio decision-makers. Of all the product released by new or developing artists, the songs nominated and selected by these Networks represent the strongest and most valuable to programing.

By policy and/or by strategy, most programers analyze a sales or chart base before deciding on new music. The Network members reflect today's aggressive, insightful and independent Trendsetters.

### HOW EACH NETWORK OPERATES:

During the week, each Network member nominates up to 5 songs by artists who have NOT had a Top 20 record in 1 year. The members may or may not already be playing these nominations. Any album cut is also eligible. The most-nominated songs become eligible for final voting on the Conference Call. In final voting, Network members vote 'Yes' or 'No'. A 'Yes' vote on a song means that member is willing to add it to a heavy rotation, averaging between 4 and 7 plays per day. If the member votes 'No', he rejects that song from the heavy exposure. If ALL Network members vote 'Yes', then the song is automatically added for HEAVY EXPOSURE for three weeks at all stations. A single 'No' vote removes unanimous Network obligation on that song, although any individual member may add the song. Any Network nomination can reach the "final voting" status three times.

# **MORK & MINDY & JAY**

New York—JAY THOMAS is a man with a peculiar problem, how to be a regular on "Mork and Mindy" in LA while keeping one of New York's hippest radio shows going.

FRED contacted 99X PD BOBBY RICH for clarification on the solution to Jay's problem. "The general plan is that he will be there until into July. Then he'll have three weeks free, at which time he is going to come back to New York. This is their schedule, not mine. It's ironic that he'll be here for three weeks of the summer book. It could have been a lot worse.

"After that, he will go back to LA, and we're not sure how long that trip will last. While he's been guaranteed a minimum of ten episodes, it's possible that he'll be used more than that. He could be gone as much as 26 weeks all together.

"We obviously want to take advantage of the publicity. In the last two days, his picture and a write up have been in the NY Post and the Daily News. We're getting calls now from People Magazine and even the local TV stations are asking about it. There's a lot of excitement just talking about

it on the air. All of a sudden, the listener hears that Jay is not here because he's on 'Mork and Mindy', and that can sustain it for a little while.

"In the last 6 months or so, we've worked at making the morning slot a show, rather than just Jay Thomas. He's definitely the star of the show and the one that pulls it all together, but there's much more. We have personality news, weather and the Amazing Needlebaum who interact with Jay during his show. What we're experimenting with now is that we've moved DICK SLOAN,

our midday guy, into the morning slot to be a sort of anchor man while increasing the participation of the various characters that appear.

"We dont have enough time to develop something new and we dont want to hurt what Jay has built up. We're trying to find a way to keep Jay a part of this show. There are any number of things we can do, including having Jay do his show live from LA."

The station will keep calling the slot the "Jay Thomas Show" and will try to work out his various bits, ie Stupid News, phoned in from LA. Rich feels that this can work out to a real plus for both Jay and the station.

The possible effects to the whole of radio broadcasting seems to demand more attention than a rulemaking proceeding can give. The NAB noted that the matters covered in the National

Telecommunications and Information Administration petition are much more complicated than NTIA has indicated and could affect all radio broadcasting.

Revision of FM rules should be treated in the more informal, free and open context of an Inquiry, rather than the tightly structured Rulemaking Proceeding where restrictions on presentation and discussion would apply. An inquiry would allow exploration by engineering and broadcast experts and the public.

## K PLUS TWO BOOKS

Seattle—KVI-FM has changed their call letters to KPLZ (K-PLUS Radio) to help give it a separate identity from their sister station, KVI-AM, one of the top AMers in the market.







## **WASTING NO TIME**

Started in 1968 as music assistant at KSFO/San Francisco. Worked two years in San Francisco as mailboy, gopher and generally the lowest rung on the independent local promotion ladder. Then I worked at Chess-Janus Records, first as a local person in San Francisco and then as regional.

In March of 73 went to work as local promotion manager for Epic Records in San Francisco, in 75 moved to New York as regional northeast promotion manager. In 76 became Associate Director of National Promotion for Epic. 77 moved on to be Director of National Album Promotion for Epic/Portrait and the CBS Associated labels.

One year ago this week went to work with RON ALEXENBERG, at the as yet to be named MCA label that became Infinity Records, as Director of National Promotion. That's ten years, how's that?

## What steps do you feel a label has to take to establish an identity in the radio community?

Credibility! Giving straight answers when asked straight questions, providing first class service of first class music, trying to be one step ahead of all of the major competition and showing the radio community that a new label like Infinity can provide the same services with as much clout and with as much follow through as a major label under the CBS umbrella.

## How does the rating period affect you and how do you overcome it?

First of all, in a ratings period, if you look at a ratings period as a time when radio stations are not going to add your record, you automatically provide an excuse for yourself. Psychologically you've already put a barrier in front of some of your momentum. We try not to pay attention to it, to tell you the truth.

The New England record which we're working right now was released one week before the ratings period started. As long as the product is there it doesnt affect us

What we try to do is also realistically look at the fact that radio people have report cards two or four times a year depending on the marketplace. Those report cards are as important to us as they are to them because we want to support them and have them keep their jobs. If we walk in there and ask them to play a stiff or we ask them to play a record that really isnt ready for them to play, then we're asking them to risk their jobs and that isnt fair.

So in the ratings period we promote them on the record that we most feel will service their station the most positively and fit the format they are trying to construct—give them the music that fits into their game plan as well as ours. If a radio station is looking for a 25-49 audience, then we're going to promote them very heavily on a

Spyro Gyra record which we know has an adult contemporary influence. If we know they want to go for heavy rock and roll, we're going to beat them over the head with New England or Orleans.

## Then you're as selective with product as programers are with format?

Sure in a ratings period. In the end we want that hard rock format to be playing that Spyro Gyra single if it happens to show that it's a mass appeal hit. We just try to cater our game plans to the areas where we know we're going to get our breaks.

What it breaks down to is we dont want to waste anybody's time and we dont want them to waste our time and so it's a very business oriented thing. We do our business in a very business oriented fashion, realizing that radio programers dont have enough hours in their day to program their radio stations. We don't have enough hours in our day to promote our records. So if we're wasting radio people's time, then we're wasting our time and we're hindering our mutual jobs.

## PROMOTIONS THAT PAY



## **HOW TO** LISTEN

from a BME article by G. Mark Durengerger

Let's assume you're establishing some communications, you have an idea of what you want, and you want to see how your station stacks up. How do you go about listening to your station?

First, where do you listen? It's as important to listen to your station on several different radios as it is to listen in some sort of non-varying listening environment. You probably listen every day at home and in your car. You should also make it a point to see how you sound at various audio stores around town, both on the big systems and on the \$9.95 portables.

Back at the station, as a tool for the PD and the chief engineer, you should a calibrated monitoring environment. The production studio is the ideal place so the gear can do double-duty. A minimum requirement is an up-to-date modulation monitor. hopefully already installed, a set of professional monitor speakers, a good power amplifier, and a room equalizer. Most pro-audio dealers can furnish you with the hand-held spectrum analyzer and pink noise generator with which to make a fair check of the room response, or you can obtain the more sophisticated gated measuring devices. The important thing is that you want to know what your room sounds like.

A listening room that's very bassy, for example, may lead you to thin out

There are promotions that the station pays for and then there are those that pay for themselves or even make money for the station. FRED wants to pass along information about the latter type of promotion.

WKIX put on what is called a 50% Fair. The idea is one that is copyrighted by BILL ALFREDO, and KIX paid for the right to do this type of promotion. The promotion works this way: the advertiser gets booth space at the fair area for X-amount of advertising with the station. During the course of the fair, the booths have the advertiser's merchandise at 50% off the list price or the actual selling price.

TOMMY WALKER, of WKIX. explains some of the rules that he used when he did this promotion, "All the merchandise had to be first quality, no seconds, and it had to be good merchandise. It could be stuff from last year that they were trying to sell off. The retailers were allowed to use items with a high markup. So, in some cases, the retailers still made money even with the 50% off. The people that did lose money still felt that they had gained with the increased traffic caused by the fair. Many of them gave out certificates that entitled people to discounts when they come to the store itself."

When we asked Tommy about the cost to the station he explained. "Of course, we had to pay the expenses out of the advertising revenue. We came away picking up a nice amount of money, and more importantly, we came away knowing that it will be much more successful next time. There were so many elements of doubt with this first one, but it was so successful that we erased any of these questions. To give vou some idea of the success, we signed up all but three of this year's participants for next year. We figure to double the size of the fair next year. We had 18,000 to 20,000 people pass through the fair that day."

"We raised the station visibility by having our own booth where we gave away stations promo items, like bumperstickers. We dont do remotes but we did newscasts from the fair every hour or so. We would interview one of the visitors or advertisers and cut back to the station."

the bass on the air until it sounds right in that room. And if any equalization is used in the processing chain, complementary (reverse) equalization must be used in the audio feed from the modulation monitor. You can establish a calibrated stereo reference monitor system, using bookshelf speakers, for about \$1000. This system becomes the frame of reference for the sound of your station and doubles as a valuable production tool, for it's just as important when you're tailoring audio as you dub it to cart. Such a calibrated monitoring environment is a long first step toward establishing a consistency of air sound.

While we're in the production room, an easy way to compare your FM sound (AM too, within limits) is to install an A/B comparison switch so you have an instant means of switching between console and modulation monitor. This switch can be expanded to monitor every point of the processing chain. If you're relying on the audio from your modulation monitor as a source, be sure its response is flat, quiet, and distortionfree. In a remote location, take steps to ensure the RF amplifier isnt degrading the signal. Some measurements can be made through the monitor, installed both at the transmitter and at the remote location, to see whether the RF amplifer is adding anything. In an AMdirectional operation, remember that where the monitor is connected to the antenna system will have a bearing on the sound you hear. Modulation parameters may vary widely between the common point and, say, each of the towers. Today's breed of modulation monitors make this device an extremely important tool, but it must be installed properly and interpreted correctly.

Now...how long must you listen? Particularly when comparing stations in your car, it's important to listen for more than a few seconds if you punch back and forth. The psychoacoustic loudness factor makes some records sound louder than others, even on the same station. So it's important to listen to more than one stretch of music before making a comparison, if compare vou must.

# The Conclusion of FRED's Interview with KFRC's Les Garland and Dave Sholin:



## **MORE FROM LES**

FRED: Let's talk about the UFO promotion.

LES: Star Wars and then Close Encounters had done very well. This UFO phenomena was everywhere, so we came up with this crazy idea of pausing for 8 seconds to allow extraterrestrial beings to communicate with Earth on our frequency, 610 kilocycles.

We spent about a month researching Gallup Poll studies, how many people actually believed in UFO's. We spent a good month and a half writing it. PAUL FREES is the voice on it and RON HUMMEL put the music behind it. It was one of the most incredible pieces of production I think I ever heard in my life! It is probably one of the best pieces of work I have ever been involved in. We used it in segues and the end of it had maintenance in mind. It said that this announcement will be repeated in 60 minutes. So we submitted it for a Cleo Award of 11,000 entrees and it's in the finals.

FRED: What are some of the major problems out there with jocks? How can they improve themselves?

LES: The biggest problem I hear about

is Program Directors who dont work with their jocks. Most jocks out there that I've communicated with are dying for some input, they're dying for somebody to tell them what they're doing right and what they're doing wrong, just give them some feedback.

I dont like to call these critiques because that infers that I'm going to criticise. I'd rather say "a little constructive feedback is going to go on." Most jocks say they dont get any instructions and they're left to learn on their own, so they start picking up bad habits which become crutches and those crutches can make a difference between being good and being bad. It takes someone to come along and remove all those crutches and leave you standing on your feet to make you good. That's when you go on and become a communicator and a personality. That's where I think radio is today. You've got to be a personality.

FRED: The jock out there who doesnt have a program director that's going to help him, what can he do?

LES: That's an almost unanswerable question, a sad situation. That's why the

business has evolved slowly in some areas. That's why maybe a lot of us view it as a business that hasnt progressed for awhile. There is some pretty backward sounding radio out there but it's our own fault because so many people keep so many secrets.

There's a lot of information that we spent years and years and years learning and it's easy to think "I shouldnt give this away. I had to fight to learn it. No one gave it to me." There were a few, the BUZZ BENNETTS the BILL DRAKES, the PAUL DREWS that shared, but there were also a lot of guys that didnt share anything.

A lot of guys out there have more brains than I do programing, but they've never had the opportunities so thus never got the shot to prove themselves. They can be on a deadend street. It's true in any business.

FRED: Do you call the station on the hotline?

LES: Rarely. I dont believe in that, unless it's absolutely necessary. If I call the radio station, it's with something positive to say. I dont call and say something was not good. The

middle of a show is the wrong time. You can ruin the next two hours and why do that? You're dealing with a delicate thing, an ego, a talent. You have to treat them like they are stars.

If they were on stage working for you before 300,000 people and they boobooed, you wouldnt walk out and say "It was terrible!" You got to wait til they get off. The director does not belong onstage. He sits back and when the scene is over, then he describes what was right and what wasnt. And that's the way to do it.

Maybe it's not something you want to do verbally because you want them to think about it first. So you leave a note and you split. Let them have time to take that note home and digest it and think about it some and say "Yeah, he's absolutely right".

And then, you can be wrong! Admitting that you're wrong is pretty hard to do for a lot of people but you've got to be able to do that.

FRED: What's your philosphy behind the announcer versus the more human, personality type thing?

LES: There's a level of communication that's almost announcery, it's almost hype but there's a point that you can go to that isnt dangerous. It's the point of success. If you fall back too far.

is make it easy to listen to, make it entertaining, dont make it boring, dont make it so passive that it's not attractive, make it appealing, make it unoffensive, dont cause fatigue to set in, just be enjoyable, let the music be heard and you'll be heard.

DAVE: I think a lot of people would say a lot of those things but it's very tough to put it into practice. It's easy to say, but it's hard to do.

LÉS: That's the flow we were talking about earlier, I dont know what causes it. Maybe it's not Dave Sholin or Les Garland or a format or a budget or a bunch of clocks or a bunch of bullshit—maybe it's San Francisco!

FRED: I disagree. I think it has to do with programing period.

LES: I'd like to think that that's correct.

FRED: Everybody that's into it perceives you not as Dave Sholin "The Duke", the Music Director, but a music freak. How do you explain how you defy research, just go after the music and win? Are you defying research? DAVE: It does defy research. I hate to say that I agree with that to make it sound like research is not part of what we do because it certainly is. But there is something about hearing a record and getting a feeling. There' something you

you're trailing. If you lead just a little bit and be what you're calling "announcerish", that's a standard of communication that I think you have to be to be that smooth-running, flowing, never-stopping, never looking back radio station that communicates. I think you have to be smooth to a certain point. Radio stations have to be formated which requires a certain number of things that might sound "announcerish" but that's only setting it up. That's staging it. That's a bit of show business. Radio is show business!

The philosphy we try to get across

hear in certain songs that causes a response, something that is so unusual—and generally it's automatic.

As a teenager I was into music a lot. A lot of people I hung out with were in the same trip, music freaks. I always said when I was a kid, "If I was independently wealthy, if I had money to burn I would do this because I really dig doing it."

FRED: I think it's a great blessing in our lives when we get to do what we love to do on one hand, and on the other hand it's such a great obsession that it's painful.

DAVE: You wish that you could turn it off at certain times, You cant do it so you just get into it and enjoy it. We're fortunate that we can do what we want to do and be successful at it. FRED: Failure! That word! The important role it seems to play in our lives. A common bond that radio freaks seem to have. Does it scare you?

LES: Failure is not a possibility. If you deal with your position from the things that you are paranoid of—failure— how are you going to win dealing with that?

I am much less worried about failure than I am about being apathetic about failure. When I get to the point that I dont care whether I win or lose, that is a much bigger fear for me than failure.

If given the autonomy to run a radio station the way that you think and you have the support from management, and if the ratings dont come in you're ready to accept being fired-if those are the standards that we're going to play by, if those are the rules of the game, then you can deal with that. You can live with losing the ratings because you were allowed to do it on your own. That's not failure. You can walk away from that situation and say, "Who gives a shit what Arbitron said, that radio station sounded the way I think it should have sounded". That very same radio station could be an ass kicker in some other market. So it didnt work. That's not failure. That's not even a remote possibility because I'm self-

DAVE: You see how you feel comfortable listening to Garland talk about his perception of no failure? And that's what I think he puts out to a lot of people at the radio station. The fact that they're really comfortable immediately opens a lot of doors to a lot of people.

LES: There are no bad days. Bad days are created by yourself. There's no such thing as pressure. You create that yourself. All those things that you hear people bitching about in this business are fabricated out of the mind. They're made up. They're things that you put on yourself. They dont exist, you only LET them exist. That's wrong.

There aint no way I'd program a radio station thinking I was under pressure. I do it because I love it. I work 14 hours a day seven days a week because I love it! I love all the things that we sat here and talked about, those are all fun. Those arent work!

If you've got a great idea that you want to do on your radio station, work has no bearing on how much time's involved in doing it. If it's good and you love what you do, then you'll do it because you'll be so proud of it when it's done. It's dedication that makes the difference.







### JEFF'S GREEN

ccasionally, things screw up.

Just when you sit back to enjoy the fruits of your efforts—the satisfaction of a job well done—some glaring blunder sticks out and says "You fucked up!" If you're lucky, you catch it in time, straighten out the problem, back on the track and on you go.

However, if you're not so lucky, someone finds out the problem before you, and that's when you're in the doghouse. You become afraid. You begin to lose the power to create, because your energy starts to reverse. One becomes defensive, nervous and,

depending on what you did that got you in trouble, you fear for your job.

More than one programer and jock tell me that they examine the Openings section nervously from time to time. And these people are not slobbering paranoids, either. They work their asses off and are completely committed to their work. These are the only people that make it in this industry. But fear burts them.

How confident are you really? Sure, it's easy to say "Yeah, I know what I'm doing," but is that the truth? Whenever I talk with someone and I say "How's the station sound?" they sometimes reply "Oh, great—really tight. You should hear it!" when in actuality the signal is screwed up, the staff is uninspired and the GM thinks he knows more about the music than the PD and wants to "help out" a little. Now is the time to be honest. Now is the time to talk, to share and to listen. Fear cannot fight against honesty. The Master Programer knows this.

People in this industry tend to be perfectionists, because there are so many details to a good performance, and each performance can be measured by applause, sales, laughter, ratings or whatever. It is natural to expect some of us to be riding ego stallions. The Master Programer is neither a perfectionist nor is he awed by shadows. The ego grows suddenly defensive and stubborn when fear is applied and soon a suffocating wall of resistance kills all growth. Then one starts being too careful and just "does the job" without "getting the job done."

Truly getting the job done means working together, extending yourself and enveloping yourself within the resources of the world, not without them

As an example, a record company that brings home a hit by a new or developing artist basks warmly in the success of "a job well done." It's well deserved—less than twenty records made it to #1 last year. No record reaches the top by itself. It takes the energy and interest of thousands working together to make it happen. So if you make a mistake, be honest. It may not cure the problem, but it sure blows fear all to hell.

With that in mind, let me apologize to Chrysalis Records for the accidental deletion of Blondie's "One Way Or Another" from last week's FRED. It should have been included on the back cover NEXT, which has 90% accuracy in projecting Top 20 records. Blondie is in NEXT this week. I also apologize to Warner Brothers for deleting the Doobie Brothers' "Minute By Minute" from the Universals chart on page 1.



Graham Parker is one of the more influential artists in rock today and his new album for Arista, his new label, has been making a strong showing. The flip side of his new single is a remake of the Jackson Five classic "I Want You Back" but it is currently not on the Ip. In a shrewd marketing move, Arista is going to press a limited number of blue vinyl seven inch singles with "I Want You Back" on one side and the infamous "Mercury Poisoning" on the flip. The only way to acquire one of these rare items is to purchase the album, clip the corner from the innersleeve (which will be marked) and send it to Arista. When the current batch of "Squeezing Out Sparks" Ip's are sold out, it will become a twelve cut album. A great marketing idea for an extremely deserving artist.

Finally, a deserving artist that definitely should get your unlimited attention is Jeremy Spencer, I suppose it is relevant that he was Fleetwood Mac's guiding light in the post-Peter Green, Pre-Buckingham-Nicks days, but what is even more relevant is that his new Atlantic album is incredible. with lots of hot material, not only for AOR, but for Top Forty and Spectrum III. Atlantic San Francisco rep STEVE FELDMAN brought the tape along with Sniff & The Tears (killer) and his clubs. Not only am I convinced but I'm betting that you will be, too.



### **TRI-ANGLES**

The reason Spectrum III is turning into the most valuable 18+ programing tool is because we keep adding stations like these: KUGN/Eugene; KZUE and KTOK/Oklahoma City; WHLM/Bloomsburg, Pa; WECQ/Geneva, NY; KLDN/Eldon, Mo; WAYX/Waycross, Ga.

The most common topic of conversation I've indulged in these past few weeks dealt with the fine line that barely exists (in many cases) between Universals and S-III. With more and more S-III stations Dayparting such things as; Kansas, Van Halen, Cheap Trick, Jay Ferguson, Bad Co., Peter Frampton, Supertramp and Abba, it becomes increasingly difficult to draw that line.

Dayparting has been around for ages, but as programers are shaking the Soft Rock approach and/or attemtping to grab those important 18-34 demographics, its practice is on the upswing. Although category 3 stations are not indulging to any great extent, those in Categories 1 and 2 are putting this valuable tool to good use. A warning: this can be effective if used properly. Misuse it and you can blow off those upper demos and females that are available in the later part of the day.

To further complicate matters, most Universals stations are beginning to use a S-III approach during their mid-days. In part two of FRED's LES GARLAND interview, he states "Mid-day (at KFRC) is almost mellow...the music does slow up a bit, but yet you also hear Foreigner because that does appeal to 18-34 year olds, and that's who the radio station is trying to appeal to (in mid-days)."

All this adds up to a massive identity crisis, particularly for S-III stations! After all, nobody will accuse a Universals station of going too soft middays, where they will accuse a S-III station of getting too heavy with their nightparting.

We'll look at this further in upcoming weeks.



### TELESCOPE

My key concern this week happens to be with promotion departments and their attack on radio stations' PDs & MDs. I think too often quite a few promotion persons key in on their target without knowing the kind of people they are dealing with. Some promotional people scream and use tactics of harsh persuasion to get a record played on the station they are attacking. This may be well & dandy for some PDs but it can create a dislike for artists. If a person in promotion can take time to learn who he is dealing with, it will probably get better results, not only for him, but for others who may follow him in the future.

If some record people have trouble getting a hit played, here are some

suggestions. Try getting the record played on one of the competitive stations. They may be smaller and not important to the trades, but a lot of PDs & MDs ears listen to all types of radio stations. Sometimes hearing a record on the air makes it sound different than in one's office.

Perhaps taking the record to a very popular disco, or nightclub, can get you a shot. If the record is as good as you think it is, the people will respond and watching the response firsthand gives a great indication of what a record is going to do for a radio station. The club jock probably has some kind of communication with a radio station and perhaps your record can get started through the one on one.

There are so many avenues to retreat to, when brute force fails, as most often it does. It includes begging and pleading and very dramatic gestures to get a record on in the category of force

Just as radio is becoming a science, so has promotion. Record people should learn about formats and images, and attack from professional levels with positive approaches. It's guaranteed you will get more positive results. During this month of black music awareness, let us strive to strengthen our professionalism from both ends of the business, and maximize to the fullest the effect of where black music & black radio can be headed, together.



"It's not the cover, it's the music." "It's not the music, it's good cover graphics." STOP! You're both right.

Why do so many jazz labels feel that it's so important to make all of their covers look exactly the same? The radio stations generally file records by artist, as does the retailer. Thus, the only people who keep the catalogue of the label together (giving that "esoteric" library effect) are the execs of the label. Right? Well, sometimes.

Familiarity can breed airplay. Programers know that certain labels have consistently good, airplayable product and will look for the familiar cover art when deciding their listening priorities. By the same token, jazz programers who utilize a strictly fusion or mainstream format may not put certain labels on a high priority because they recognize the cover art format and feel that the bulk of that label's product does not fit their sound. Sometimes it could fit, and they are missing it because of the visual turnoff.

Practically every other format of music utilizes distinctive, new graphics on their releases. Sometimes, an artist logo will be developed over two or three albums but the covers stay a piece of art

in their own right. This part of a record's life takes up a major part of the marketing plans of a label, especially with Album rock or Black-oriented product.

Listeners are into what artist is being played, which is why they are listeners. When listeners become buyers, they become more susceptible to visuals and can be "hooked" by good graphics. Don't get so hung up in being "esoteric" that you forget why we're all here, to make money, to turn listeners on to music.

### QUEST by Buzz Bennett

I was having a discussion with STEVE RIVERS and JOHN VOLPE at KOPA in Phoenix last week and we were probing into the age old problem of the request lines. It is a fact that most request lines are packed with lower demos as they are the most responsive to this type of opportunity. Not only are they the most responsive, but they are the most persistent and tolerant callers. It is not uncommon for 12-18 and the subteens to call a request line over and over until the line is no longer busy, and then go through the same ritual again just to get more requests in for the same song. It is also common for cults of teens to team up and go for the same song or the same few songs all nite long.

Problem 1 is to determine a repetitive caller and nullify repeat requests. Phone turkeys in too many cases are more interested in the amount of requests they accumulate. Many times a station employee will strike out at teens who call over and over by saying something like "I know you're the same person so just stop calling!" Wrong. They are as valuable as they are irritating.

A research study showed that the repetitive caller is also a repetitive listener, listening around eight to ten hours a day. Someone who sends in a contest card or a letter is customarily a four to five hour listener. The norm is a one to two hour listener. So, "incessant caller" becomes about 40 points in an Arbitron. "Card sender" is worth about 20 points and "norm" is 4 to 8 points (points, of course, meaning quarter hours). If you offend an incessant caller and they happen to have a diary you just cost your station plenty.

Now a few thoughts on attaining 18+ information on the request line. Not all stations experience this problem. Most album stations have superb 18+ call-in. I spent some time with BOB HAMILTON at Universal KRTH/L.A. last week and his 18+ calls were superb. It may also be of interest that Barbra Streisand's new record was far and away number one request 18+. I'd say from that small amount of information that the song is a smash, a projective technique.

There are two things I have done in the past that helped accumulate more

18+ information. I, on several occasions, installed as many as sixteen request lines and then instructed everyone to answer the lines backwards. The 18+ caller is not very tolerant of a busy signal or a long ring. If the lines are answered backwards and quickly, many more 18+ callers will get through. It is also true that most of your 12-18 will tune out during the newscast while 18+ stays for the most part. In turn it is a good idea to plug the request lines in the middle of and at the end of newscasta and cover them immediately.

Another good idea is an outcall roster for 18+ listeners. It is in hundreds of stations a problem that cannot be completely overcome so we must then do as Arbitron does---weight the value of an 18+ caller against 18 and under. If ten times as many teens as 18+ call, teens should be worth a point or two, and 18+ should be worth 8-10 points. This system is certainly not a definitive answer, merely perspective.

Only the interpretation of an experienced programer will lead to the closest correct balance. There is no panacea, a fact that we can all be thankful for.

### Cipher by C.C. Courtney

You dont have to love everybody you work with. In fact, it's probably impossible to love everybody you work with. In our business where personalities are so strong yet must work so closely with other strong personalities, clashes are likely to occur.

Of course, its nice to be surrounded by people we like, but sometimes very talented people are not likeable. To let our personal likes and dislikes determine our choices to fill critical positions can be a serious mistake. A program director who fires a disc jockey because he doesnt like that disc jockey, could be making a serious mistake, especially if the disc jockey has high ratings.

It's exactly parallel to choosing the music for a radio station. A program director who lets his personal likes determine what goes on the air will soon be a program director without a radio station. But by the same

token, if the program director refuses to play hit records because he doesnt like them, he'll lose. It is necessary that we deal with people that we dont like. How well we do that is, to a great extent, the determining factor in success.

Some of the best ideas I ever heard came from people that I personally did not like. If you focus on exactly what a person says AND exactly what they mean to say, and if you respond to the person in as simple, direct, straight forward and brief a manner as you possibly can, the chances for exchange of communication without personalities becoming involved are greatly increased. Often it is the way a person says things that causes us to recoil. That's where we have to pay attention to what they mean to say.

I remember a study that was done in which ten nationalities were listed and

people were asked to say which nationality they liked most and which nationality they liked least. The nationality that was chosen as the least liked was a nonexistent nationality. The agency giving the test just made up the name and put it in the list.

What this shows is that what people are unfamiliar with they dont like. We've proven this again and again in our callout research. The unfamiliar songs generally get much higher negative rating. People will say that they dont like it when what they really mean is, I dont know it.

The same thing with people. Often we dont like someone because we dont understand them. We're not familiar with their way of thinking, and their way of acting. We can still exchange the information that needs to be exchanged to perform the function that needs to be performed.
