The Lady Finds Success Early



Liz Kiley, First Lady Air Personality WABC, New York...

RMR: Liz, you're 22 years old and you've reached a position that most people work for the majority of their career. How did you get into radio in the first place?

Liz: When I was little, I fistened to the radio all the time. I had a transistor radio when I was about four, and from that point on. I was hooked on it. When I was in high school, I never could figure out what I wanted to do; but I wanted to go to college for something. I knew I wasn't going to be a nurse or a secretary or anything like that, so I figured radio would be the smartest thing to do. But at that point in New York, where I grew up, there weren't lady disc jockeys on the radio. except for Allison Steele. I had really nothing to go on that I could really be a jock at that point. I decided that was what I was going to do. They had an internship program there. The first year, my internship was at WPOP in Hartford with Charlie Steiner who was the news director. I met a lot of people there who would later help me with contacts and the right motivations. One of those people was Ron Lake, who gave me my very first job. When I graduated from Endicott in 1976. I had been around to all the advertising agencies in New York and it really wasn't what I wanted to do; but yet I didn't really know what I wanted to do. Ron called when he was at WLAV in Grand Rapids and said, "I've got an opening for you to do part time...15 hours per week for \$2.50 an hour." I packed my bags and went. I figured I could waitress to make ends meet, but I wanted to do that.

RMR: So you were dedicated to radio and were going to get into it no matter what kind of low wages and circumstances you had to take?

Liz: Right. You have to. You have to have the drive to do it and be willing to move wherever they want you to go.

RMR: It certainly paid off for you. How did the internship at WABC happen?

Liz: I was in my senior year at Endicott and I felt that my radio training was weak... They were very hot on TV, but in radio they concerned themselves a little lesss. I wanted to go out on my own and do an independent study on Top-40 programming. They gave me some honor thing and I went through radio stations from WRKO in Boston all the way down the East coast into New York. and sat with all kinds of program and music directors. I got their different philosophies on how things worked. I went to see Glenn and he was very nice to me. He spent lots of time with me and explained the whole ABC philosophy. The first day, I sat in with Dan Ingram. It was great. They taught me so much. Glenn really helped me a lot. At that point, he told me that even to make it to a major market would take me about five years....and here I am.

RMR: Were you star; struck at the beginning? Was that one of the things that got you motivated to get into radio?

Liz: Not really. After I was in it and I met people that I had listened to for years, I became a little bit star-struck in the way. I was so impressed to meet these people and finally see what they were really like. Most of them are just like they are on the radio. I wasn't star-struck in the beginning, but as time went on, I really respected the people and was really pleased when I finally did get to meet them.

RMR: Glenn told us that he was surprised when he offered you the position at WABC, that you had been there on internship some while before. How surprised were you to hear from Glenn?

Liz: Well, very, to say the least. The whole thing started last August when I called Glenn's secretary to make an appointment to come see him when I was on vacation...just for future reference...meaning a few years from that point in time. I wasn't job hunting because I was very happy at WPGC. WPGC is a fabulous station and I miss it very much now. It was such a good place to work. But I came up and saw Glenn and he said, "Well, sure. Bring a tape and come to see me." So about a month later, I went in to see him. We were talking for a while and he was very nice. He said, "Well, how long have you been in the business?" And I told him about two years. He said, "Well, thank you for stopping by." And I said, "Please listen to my tape." He put it on and didn't say a word while he listened to the whole tape. I was so nervous. When he stopped the tape, he asked me a few questions, then he brought me in to see the general manager. He then played the tape again for some other people at the station and I knew he liked it. I got really scared. He said to keep in touch, that I still needed to improve and to get some more experience. He said that he really liked where I was. He

was very happy that I was at WPGC, to stay there, and to keep in touch. Then he called me in February and said to get out a pencil and a piece of paper..."I have some things I want you to write down." So I figured he wanted some more information for me. So I started to write down shifts and I just freaked! I couldn't believe it at all, and that was it.

RMR: There's always a period when you go to a brand new station where you're a little bit nervous because of a new board or new people, new surroundings, new call letters, and so forth. How frightening was it to go into ABC for the first time?

Liz: I was absolutely terrified. Later, people have told me I looked like a little puppy dog on a leash. I was so scared, I just looked like a lost puppy. But that is over with, I think. When I first went in. of course, I was going to work with legends—everybody that works here is so good. I felt this is what I've got as the rest of the team and I was very scared. I think anybody in my position would have been just as scared as I was.

RMR: Do you get tense thinking about it...or do you think about it much anymore?

Liz: Well, I'm always just a little nervous before I go on the air, anytime. The anticipation and that whole thing. But I'm not really scared anymore. I respect it in the way that I know I have to be always on top of things. If you don't feel good or you're upset, it doesn't matter, you have to be on top of it, no matter where you are and especially at ABC. That's really important. But I try not to think about it and I try not to think that people out in Ontario are listening (I got a call from there the other day.) I don't even think about that when I'm on the air...that people in 38 states are listening. I just don't even think about it. I can't.

RMR: Is there anybody you patterned yourself after in the radio business?

Liz: No, there really isn't. Because, obviously, I can't come off sounding like a guy; and I can't or won't come off sounding like a sexy lady (because I can't). I don't know how, and I wouldn't anyway. But there's nobody that I could pattern myself after. I know that when Paulie was at 99X, I really liked her and thought she was good, but I don't think there was anybody I patterned myself after.

RMR: It's very hard for a lady broadcaster, anyway, because it's a predominately male business and always has been. Do you think the fact that you're at WABC is going to make it easier for other lady broadcasters?

Liz: I hope so, although I was always very lucky. I got really good gigs. I was able to get the jobs that I went after and I think if you really work hard and you know what you want (and you know what you have to do to get that position), I think you can do it—if you're good—male or female. You've got to keep trying.

RMR: What about the future? You're so young now. You've got a lot of years left in broadcasting, if you want to spend them in broadcasting. Is it going to be behind the microphone, do you think?

Liz: I hope so. I'm going to stay at WABC as long as I can, because it's where I've always wanted to go. I've always wanted to be there; it was my dream, my goal. So I'm going to stay here, but at some point in time, I suppose I will want to branch out a little bit. Maybe do a little TV, but not news, although I don't know exactly what. In coming to ABC, I reached my goal. So I'm in the process, basically, of resetting them...trying to figure out what I want to do next. But for right now, and for as long as I can see, I hope to stay at WABC.

RMR: Tell us the stations you've worked for.

Liz: The first one was WLAV, Grand Rapids; then I went across the street to (then it was WZZM) WZZR. They changed call letters while I was there. Then Dan called me and said, "Come on down to Washington. Pack your bags and come on." So I went to WPGC.

RMR: How many years in professional broadcasting?

Liz: Two and a half. Three in July.

RMR: It's amazing.

Liz: I know. It happened so fast and I look back and three years ago I was in college. It doesn't seem like that, and yet it seems like its been a hundred years. And I've worked very hard. I've always volunteered for things to do, just to learn. I used to help Jim Elliott with some of his research, because I could learn so much from him. And Dan...I went to Arbitron to try to figure out what to do with the Arbitrons, once their in. ...how to pull the material from them. Dan helped me with that...just general helping out and learning other things that weren't part of my "job."

RMR: You mentioned earlier that you did a lot of street research, observed people on the street. How do you prepare for your show?

Liz: I read a lot. I read the newspapers and there are different things I read in each of the newspapers here. I get all three of them and I read a ton of magazines. There's a whole long list of them that I try to read every week. I try to put together little information things. I'm not funny and I can't try to be. I guess some people try to make themselves funny and they don't do a real good job of it, so I don't try. Once in a while, I'll say something that's a little humorous. But other than that, I really try to stay away from that, and go on information things...about bands and backgrounds and that kind of thing. I 'people watch' a lot. New York is the only place in the world where you can sit on the corner and be totally amused by just the people that walk by. It's a crazy city. If you've never been here before and you're coming here to work, especially from a smaller area, you can be completely surprised by what you see. People don't even bat an eye here, anything goes. A New York audience is such a special type of audience, that you've got to really know what's going on in the city and what people are liking. I like to go into record stores and just watch what people are buying and what they turn away from, and what they're wearing, everything. It's all part of New York. I think it's important to know.

RMR: How much preparation do you do for your show?

Liz: I consider all that reading prep. You have to know what goes on. I try to do as much as I can as far as prep. It helps me. Some people don't have to do it. They can sound great just by walking in and sitting down. I have to do something and I do as much as I can every week.

RMR: The fact that you do work on your show, and you do prepare, and you do a lot of street research, I'm sure, has helped you to ABC as fast as it did.

Liz: I hope so. I'm just glad to be here. I'm thrilled.

Modal Programming!



Jesse Bullet, O.M.-WLUP Chicago ...

RMR: Jesse, a couple of weeks ago, we intimated in the magazine that we would have some big news with regard to your new presentation at the Loop Now's the time. What are you doing different?

Jesse: We're into what we have conceived to be the music of the 80's, so to speak One of the nicest compliments ever afforded a radio station I programmed, was the fact that it resembled AOR of the 80's. To me, that's the trend that we are on the threshold of now. When you think about it, 1980 is not that far away. It will be a significant trend year for radio; I do believe that.

RMR: What does 'music of the 80's mean?'

Jesse: It's a trend of society. It is a time of change. We're going through an evolutionary period right now in music, in a small sense of the word This is the lull before the storm. It's the lull before the expansion of music as we knew it when other singular greats came on the scene, maybe ten years ago, with Hendrix and The Beatles, when they went through their evolution.

RMR: In other words, you think this year will be the year we see another superstar group emerge, who will be a leader in the business...Is that what you're saying?

Jesse: I believe so, in 1980 and '81. I believe that we will see significant change in music.

RMR: The term 'modal programming' has been a term we've heard of recent, with regard to the Superstars radio stations. Is that a term that you're familiar with?

Jesse: Oh yes, of course. The first paragraph in which we spoke in this article can be related to this. In the older days, or a few years back, there would be one or two giant powerhouses in town and huge female numbers. So you could add Carly Simon or whatever and put it in a rotation, and the female numbers would increase...or so it was hoped. That was the theory behind it all. Today, there's fragmentation of FM. It was just a couple of years ago where there were maybe one or two FMs in town. Now you can go down the dial and count eight, nine, maybe even ten competitive FM signals going for a bite of the 18-34 market. The time has come now where many of those who are successful in AOR programming choose one particular field to go after. They chose one segment of what they want. In our case, it's rock. We are clean and pure 24 hours a day. There can be no deviation from what we are. Soft rock is the same way. If you wish to be successful, you go soft rock and don't take it to any crossovers, or whatever. You must be as pure as you can. That's a loose description of what we were talking about...'modal programming.' In essence, you choose what you want to be, and you do it as clean as it can be done.

RMR: So the definition of 'modal programming' for you would be a rock radio station?

Jesse: No, not necessarily a rock radio station. It could be whatever you chose it to be. It could be disco or Top-40 or soft rock, any of a variety of combinations of formats on the radio today.

RMR: But for the Loop, it is rock radio?

Jesse: For my particular case in point, yes. It's rock radio and what we would like to perceive rock radio of the 80's will sound like. Just as music is on a stepping stone right now, we as a radio station (by radio station, I'm saying the way that we have formulated the product that goes out on the airwaves) are a stepping stone of what will happen in the early 1980's.



RMR: At one point, you said that the Loop will be the KHJ of the 80's, referring of course to the big success period when KHJ was the ultimate radio station. Do you still perceive the Loop as being the ultimate album rock radio station?

Jesse: Of course. We are going to be the ultimate rock radio station. I always looked up to KHJ because, in those days, I was working at KGB in San Diego, and Ron Jacobs and KHJ was sort of a goal for me. KHJ was the beginning of an evolution. We have seen radio as boss radio, the Bill Drake format. fade. We've seen the Q foramt come, and now, it, also, is beginning to take second place....to what? I believe the time has come, with modal programming, really getting into what you want to be and being as clean and pure as you can in going after that specific segment of the audience. If you get five people trying to do everybody else's thing on the radio, it doesn't work too well.

RMR: Would you say that modal programming is a concept that's being tested at the Loop, or one that's being tried at all the Superstar stations?

Jesse: It's a concept that we've had in the devoping stages at several key stations within the chain. But this is the first time we have concisely applied all of the information in a productive manner.

RMR: In terms of the other elements that make up your radio station aside from the music which is now described in a modal fashion, what are the other components you'll be using?

them and where I knew them from and everything. Then when I heard the announcement of Bob Coburn, I really enjoyed it. I'm incredibly happy to see Bob in the market. I visited with him just for a few minutes the other day and it was great. There was a positive vibe between the two of us, and we just shook hands and thought: this is going to be great for the city of Chicago. I can't think of anything more exciting to happen in the market of Chicago than to have Bob Coburn and myself in the market. Not necessarily that there will be this big war ratings battle or anything. It's just that it will bring freshness to this market. The market has been stale for some time.

Jesse: Above and beyond all this, you do understand that we're a rock radio station?

RMR: Yes.

Jesse: Every damn thing I can.

RMR: Are you still doing the same type of promotions and so forth. Does that still remain compatable, the singular thought, in terms of music?

Jesse: Promotional activities of the radio station, yes. The music...that is something that we're investigating, in the way we're doing it, what we're programming, how often and everything like that. We're using all concepts of promotion, such as concert involvement, merchandising, TV, billboards, the list could go on and on. Then, of course, you go into the already proven Abrams features and you add a little window dressing. The idea is that every time you turn on the radio, something is happening. I don't mean happening by music coming out, but I mean continuously...the announcers informing them of another event that's coming up on the radio...showcasing, it's all done with mirrors.

RMR: What about the staff you inherited...Is that the staff that you're keeping?

Jesse: Definitely. Seven incredible professionals.

RMR: When Jay Blackburn left the station, he left in pretty good shape, in terms of ratings. Jay has said in print in our magazine that he has taken credit for forcing a couple of the album outlets there to change formats. Is there any indication that you have improved on what he did?

Jesse: Well, I would like to say that as indicated by the latest Mediatrend, and going back and checking the trends for the past four or five months, there is a definite upswing in the ratings for the Loop, that began with work done by Jay Blackburn.

RMR: What about Bob Coburn's appearance on the scene with WMET?

Jesse: I think it is absolutely great. There was the big furor in trade magazines and the rumors were flying from the windy city. As the various contenders became known to me. I would sit and think about each person and how I knew of **RMR:** Rumor has it that Sam Bellamy will be consulting WMET. How do you feel about that?

Jesse: Sam's a pretty lady.

RMR: What about Chicago? You've been there long enough now to get a pretty good grasp on the city. Your last huge programming success was in a very different city, from the standpoint of temperament and population makeup and attitude. You're in a cold climate and you've got a lot of different things to contend with in Chicago. How are you adjusting to this?

Jesse: Well, the only way you can get a grasp on a city this size in six weeks is to go without sleep, and I'm not able to do that. The city of Chicago has been personally stimulating to me. We all know what a change it can be, to go from one market to another market. And you can't just do that without any change upon yourself personally, not only as a programmmer, but as a person. There are changes and they will come. The last six weeks have been a real experience for me. I've learned a lot about myself. I've had to learn to be able to effectively deal with a whole new staff. There have been times when either one of us have backed down a little bit to make the change over and the growth better for the whole team. I really appreciate that. I'm sure they feel the same way because the radio station is growing. I've enjoyed the change. It's been very beneficial to me, as I said before, not only as a programmer but as a person. It's an incredibly different city. After having spent time on the west coast for so long and coming here, the difference in the lifestyle...the difference in the perception of your audience, how quickly they react to concerts...what kind of promotions they react to or do not react to ... these are all the things you learn as you go.

RMR: How about bucks. Are you going to get into a money battle? How extensive is the promotional budget you will work with during this book?

Jesse: Basically, we've gone into this book a little less organized than we would like to have been. Primarily, we'd like to use our push through the summer book. This is also a wise move, management wise, for our station, in that being successful, rather than having a tremendous one book surge. We'll be able to develop the property step by step. Therefore, not only be successful, but provide a credible base from which our sales department can operate. This is a business and we are in it to earn.

RMR: Are you expecting a big increase in this book?


Jesse: We would love a good book. We've worked hard and we've done all the things that we could. I go home thinking that I could have done just a little bit more, but you only have so many hours. There will be an increase, we feel.

RMR: You're a friend, Jesse, so I know a little bit about your makeup. I know that you're a student of radio and...

Jesse: Radio is a religion.

RMR: Are you still learning?

Jesse: Every day you learn. And the day you stop learningI just can't ever inivision not growing. Money is not important to me, it's the challenge and the growth. You know the most important thing in life is to grow as a human, to come to the realization that if you had it to do all over again you'd wanna be you.





Artist Profile: Duncan Browne

Duncan Browne, now 32, is no newcomer to the musical scene. His latest Sire LP, *The Wild Places*, is his fourth album in 11 years. And in that time, his career and music have gone through many changes.

The son of a concert violinist, Duncan learned to play the clarinet and guitar at an early age. He branched out into acting, writing and art while in public school and later enrolled in the London Academy Of Music and Dramatic Art to further his talents.

It was at LAMDA that Duncan met David Bretton, a young man with ideas akin to his own. When the pair realized that they'd rather write music for shows than perform in them, they took one of their projects to Andrew Loog Oldham and landed a contract at his Immediate Records. Duncan's first LP, *Give Me Take You*, was released by the label in 1968.

Give Me Take You featured virtuoso classical guitar, distinctive melodies and introspective lyrics. Although Duncan did some touring to promote the album and its "On the Bombsite" single (which led to his "discovery" by actress/script-writer Dagmar Urchs in Munich--she later used Duncan and his music in her film "Zeit Fur Traume"/"Time For Dreams"), it sold poorly in Europe. Ironically, *Give Me Take You* became something of a cult record in New York.

Then in 1972, Duncan met Mickie Most, the top producer of the moment, and they went to work on his second LP. Entitled *Journey* and released on the RAK label, its title cut became a hit single. Duncan launched an extensive tour and appeared on the top British pop TV shows, but his success had a price.

"I had no control over what I was doing, of what tracks went on the album, how they were arranged, played or sung. Mickie Most kept asking me what the next hit was. My music meant more to me than that," Duncan says.

So he decided to try a new direction on his own. Duncan began adapting his classical approach to electric guitar and, while traveling in Paris, came across Peter Godwin. They began writing songs and, along with guitarist Sean Lyons, formed Metro. Their 1976 debut album, released here by Sire in 1977, received both critical and commercial acclaim. Its songs were heavily European-influenced, with wispy vocals, moody lyrics and multi-textured melodies. Before Metro could reach star-status, the trio disbanded in mid-1977. In looking back, Duncan realizes his desire to work more independently caused the break-up.

"It's a totally egocentric thing to admit, but it really has to be my set-up. Maybe that comes from being an only child?...I think whenever I'm into a project on an equal-shares basis, I'm kidding myself. I was dominating Peter and Sean." Duncan continues. He explains: "I'm now reaching out in new directions. Because of my classical background, I can play electric guitar in a way different from most people. It's exciting...all these sounds, colors and power. My songs are better now because they're real. The words are constructed out of my experience. They're not pretentious or posed."




Tashjian Plans Wedding ...Around RMR Convention

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World Radio History

Albums-Dual Reviews by Radio

Grey Ghost..Henry Paul Band (Atlantic) reviewed by Larry Kleinman, MD, WLIR-FM, Long Island

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I first saw Henry Paul about six months ago. I had the pleasure of being m.c. at a Charlie Daniels concert at the 10,000 seat hall in Rockland County, New York and Henry was the opening act. The first tune I heard was So Long and for the first time in an awfully long time, I was immediately blown away by a new artist. By the end of the set, I was asking for a Henry Paul live broadcast at WLIR and I was told to wait for the record. Well, the record was definitely worth the wait. So Long opens the record, and like the show, sets you up for some real tasty material. To label the album as Southern rock really isn't fair. Henry's wailing guitar is at times reminiscent to the Outlaws. But there's material here for the programmer who has had less success with Southern music than we've had here at WLIR. There's some funky stuff, some real pretty harmonies, a few riffs that approach a blue grass field and some plain old rock. Check out Grey Ghost..it's a touching tribute (a touching tribute to the memory of the Lynyrd Skynyrd Band) and also, what is currently my favorite, *Foolin'*. Oh, by the way, we got the broadcast. by the time this is printed, Henry will have been at the Nassau Coliseum (15,000 seats), again opening for the Charlie Daniels Band and we will have done both sets live on the radio.

Grey Ghost..Henry Paul Band (Atlantic) reviewed by Michele Robinson, MD, WSHE, Miami

This album is what I was expecting from the Outlaws. I hadn't realized what an effect Henry Paul had on the sound of the Outlaws. The excellent production by Ron and Howard Albert has made this band sound real tight and the album comes at a good time. when Southern rock seems to be enjoying a healthy resurgence, with bands like Marshall Tucker, Charlie Daniels, Molly Hatchet and Blackfoot. For a few rockers, you might try. So Long or Cross Fire and check out the title cut, Grey Ghost for a moving tribute to Ronnie Van Zant.

Live At Budokan..Bob Dylan (Columbia) reviewed by Ron Sowa, MD, WMIR, Lake Geneva

From the city that is making Cheap Trick a superstar group comes a live album from Budokan but instead of breaking a new group, this album features one of rock's most respected and talented artists..that's Bob Dylan. And on this double live Lp, Bob proves his status and merit easily..this is definitely the best live Lp Bob has done. The recording is fresh and clean while the selection of tunes represents his career well, including one previously unreleased song. Suggested cuts are: All I Really Want To Do. All Along The Watchtower, and a great reggae version of Don't Think Twice, It's All Right. It's one thing to say the Times Are a Changing.. but on this album, Bob Dylan proves it with updated versions of some of his best songs.

Live At Budokan..Bob Dylan (Columbia) reviewed by Mike Tinnes, MD, WFBQ, Indianapolis

This Dylan album is for all of you who wondered what Bob was doing on his last Ip, myself included. The music all falls into place. The band is tight and the arrangements new, that seems to add a new credibility to those old Dylan songs we all remember. There's a new power on songs like It's All Right Ma, Oh Sister and One More Cup Of Coffee. You can drop the needle on Knockin' On Heaven's Door. Simple Twist Of Fate or All Along The Watchtower and you'll like what you hear. It's good Dylan, it's live and you don't have to put up with a routy crowd or bad seats do you need another excuse to play it?



Gimme Some Neck..Ron Wood (Columbia) reviewed by Tony Berardini, MD, WBCN, Boston

The Ron Wood album got immediate response at WBCN as did his previous album so we were not surprised that people jumped on it right away. Having a background with Mick Jagger and the Rolling Stones hasn't hurt anything, but Ron Wood is an artist in his own right, for sure. I think the two cuts that sem to stand out the most at WBCN are the Dylan cut, Seven Days and believe it or not, F.U.C. Her. We don't make a big deal out of the lyrics or anything but it just so happens that in my opinion, the best guitar playing on the album happens to be on that track. Ron Wood has always been an outstanding guitarist..I've loved him since he was with Faces. He does some excellent work on that cut. The thing that I object to on the whole album is that there are no credits on it and we never got any information as to who plays on the album. I can see on the one hand, if it's the Rolling Stones, they don't want to make a big deal of that fact..but not to give any credits whatsoever makes it a bit tough. A lot of people want to know who plays with him. Our audience is one that is very informed on music and would be interested to know who does that kind of thing. As far as programming this album for AOR, I think that's exactly what it was made for.

Gimme Some Neck..Ron Wood (Columbia) reviewed by Mike Belanger, PD/MD, WIOG, Saginaw

We know now what makes the Rolling Stones so successful..their personnel Mick may take the spotlight most of the time but the rest of the band excels even though they are playing in his shadow. And Ron Wood proves that the Stones are more than just a one person band. Ron's latest solo effort is, in a word, excellent. They may miss a Mick Jagger melody here or there, but overall, it's not disappointing. The stand out cuts are Boh Dylan's never before recorded Seven Days, the very Stone—ish Come To Realize, Buried Alive is good and my favorite, though it's not airable is F.U.C. Her. Gimme Some Neck will be getting lots of airplay and lots of sales from the Barbarians tour. A good rock in roll album..just in time for Summer.

WMMR—Defines It And Plays It

Jeff Pollack, PD of WMMR Philadelphia...

RMR: Jeff, you've been there eight months, and in that period you caused quite a stir in the industry by getting an offer from Los Angeles. Do you care to talk about that?

Jeff: Well, there's not a whole lot to say about that except that I was very flattered to get an offer to return to my home state. But I'm so excited by what we're doing here. The potential for growth with WMMR and the fact that Metro Media is such a good company, and that Bruce Holberg, my general manager, has been so terrific to work for—that I really wasn't looking for another situation. WMMR, right now, is, I think, on the verge of even going a step further in stabilizing in the new direction we've taken. I'm really enjoying myself. I like Philly and we're all having a great time.

RMR: What makes WMMR a distinctive radio station? You're in a very competitive market with a Superstar station right across the street. What makes WMMR the #1 album station in town?

Jeff: Well, I think it's a combination of the many different aspects that make up a successful radio station. We have a terrific staff. We promote. We have good public affairs. We have good news. The music is right on target. We're the sort of radio station that is able to communicate with our listeners. All of us here have an attitude that we're no better than our listeners. In fact, we do rely on them to tell us what they like to hear and the kind of things they like to do. We like to be a part of that. It's a very important thing that we're a radio station that doesn't feel like we're talking down to anybody. We feel they can come up to us on the street and slap us on the back and say, "Hey, you guys are doing good," or "you guys are doing bad."...at least be able to have an input to us...feel like they can do that with us.

RMR: What was your background before coming to Philadelphia?

Jeft: I worked for Drake-Chenault for a year and a half as PD at their station in Fresno; also as a national programming consultant with their eight formats out of Los Angeles. I worked at KBPI in Denver; KFML, when it was an AM & FM station in Denver; KMYR in Albuquerque, and I've done a few various other things.



RMR: It's been said to us by several people in album radio that album radio will be the boss radio of the 80's.

Jeff: Isn't it already?

RMR: Your programming background with Drake-Chenault obviously has taught you correct formatic structures. How much have you emplemented from "the boss" or Top-40 concept into your album station there?

Jeff: Well, I think that any format that somebody comes up with is a collection of many of the experiences, and certainly the Drake-Chenault experience was an important one, as well as the one in Denver and other places that I've worked. It's not just the Drake-Chenault experience by itself, but it's the combination of things that you hope to be able to finetune, and find a better way. There's always a better way of doing something. Another important thing is that there is no one successful way of doing something. Stations can be successful just by doing what's right in their market. A lot of people scratch their heads and wonder why a certain station that sounds like they do is very popular; whereas a station that sounded like that might not work in their market. That's the way it goes. There's not one way of doing things. You always have to ask, "What market are you in?"..."What's right for here?"...constantly try to find a better way of doing things.



RMR: You've seen album radio change and with that change, tighten up in terms of presentation. How loose are you in terms of your air personality presentation? How much leeway do they have?

Jeff: Well, as long as they don't speak for five minutes about anything...frankly, it's an area where I don't like to format too much. Obviously, we don't want long speeches or two minute bits on anything, but our people are learning how to say the most in the most concise ways and still be very entertaining to listen to. The air personality of today, or it seems the best ones, are the ones that are able to give the audience an idea of what they're like and what the station's like, without going into a long monologue for three minutes. They can do things in a very concise way, and still be very effective and still communicate.

RMR: We're talking about pieces of music as opposed to albums, in reality, when it comes to album radio. How deep do you go in an album, once it becomes a hit?

Jeff: It depends entirely on the album. On the Cars album, we play every single song on the album. It depends on how many we feel are right. Sometimes there are albums that have two good cuts; sometimes are eight good cuts; it depends entirely on the album.

RMR: What is your own personal feeling about album stations that are programming by and large the prime cut from the albums. Do you think that's too constrictive?

Jeff: I can't judge for them, because it might be right for what they're doing in their market and their competitive situation. It's a big mistake to ever give a sweeping generalization about what's right for somebody. It's extremely important to know your competitive situation before you decide what direction you're going to take.

RMR: Without giving away any trade secrets, again, could you give me just a little synopsis of your programming philosophy?

Jeff: We just try to have a good time and play good music, and be involved in things that people like to enjoy. We hope to communicate with the audience as best as we possibly can.

Hard Work = Success!

Dick Hungate, MD of WMMR Philadelphia...

RMR: Dick, you've been at WMMR about the same length of time as Jeff Pollack. What was your background prior to joining WMMR?

Dick: I spent two years as PD and MD at WKQQ in Lexington. Kentucky, which is a 50.000 watt AOR. Before that, I spent five additional years in the same company in various capacities at WCHL in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. That was mainly while I was in college.

RMR: The radio station's done tremendously well in the Philadelphia market. What do you think is the main reason behind that?

Dick: Well, it probably sounds like an overly simplistic answer, but it all boils down to hard work. It's really a team effort, and everyone puts in 12 to 14 hour days on a regular basis.

RMR: The most successful album radio format is the Superstars format. You've done very well against them in Philadelphia. What are the main differences in your presentation and their presentation in that market?

Dick: I think they do a very good job of presentation. With regard to WYSP. Jeff and I came into the market at a time when their program director. Sonny Fox, was beginning to become interested in some other things. For example, he's very much into video and has been for a year or so. And, of course, that led to a change in regime over there. We just worked as hard as we could to regain WMMR's place in the market as the leader.

RMR: In selecting music, is it a community station? In other words, you involve yourself and the program director. Do you involve anybody else?

Dick: Everybody has input, although there is a weekly music meeting attended by Jeff, Jane Norris (our research person) and myself...the three of us.

RMR: What do you look for in music for Philadelphia? Is it mainly the mainstream stuff, or is there something that's distinct to that market?

Dick: Certainly, the music that you play has to be tailored to the individual market. For us to play the Burrito Brothers in heavy rotation here in Philadelphia might not be a good idea. By contrast, David Bowie and Ian Hunter, with his new Ip are part of that Philadelphia sound that we make sure we play a lot of.

RMR: Aside from local research, do you look to any other markets for leads on new pieces of product?

Dick: There are lots of good indicator stations. We just try to read all of the trades and listen to what all of the record people have to tell us...using as many tools as we have at hand and try to come up with an accurate picture of what is going on nationally.

RMR: WMMR as it stands right now is the number one rated album station in Philadelphia, and WYSP has recently regrouped and obviously is re-structuring their radio station and their sound, to come after you in this ARB. Do you feel pretty confident that you've sand-bagged and got all the bases covered for this new book?





Dick: We believe that the station that works the hardest and does the most things right will, more often than not, be the leader. Certainly, luck always plays a small part in the whole thing, too. We just continue to work as hard as we can and hope that we do well.

RMR: Is WMMR a tightly formatted radio station, in terms of music you play?

Dick: The air personalities have a wide selection of music they can play, but there are certain parameters within which they must stay on a category by category basis.

RMR: The new trend seems to be toward more hard rock around the country at album stations, more up-tempo music, and more constricted playlists. How are you guys handling that?

Dick: Well, first of all, I think tempo is in. In terms of rock radio, if the disco movement has given us anything, it's given us an appreciation of the fact that people want moving music these days. You can play songs like "Something So Right" by Paul Simon, occasionally, but too much of that in 1979 could be deadly. The tight playlist is largely a function of the current retail situation. Very few records are really selling these days, you know.

RMR: The essence of superstars that were supposed to have records out at this time...Ala, the Eagles, Fleetwood Mac, Led Zepplin...the overall absence of a lot of the major superstar acts. Do you think that's working to keep the volume of titles of records that sell in the stores down, because there's nothing there to really draw the people in? Do you think the fact that these type groups haven't delivered their product to their companies has hurt the business overall?

Dick: In terms of overall sales, I believe, yes. As we approach a \$9.98 list price, people are becoming more and more cautious. They are more discriminating. They are willing to shell out that kind of money for a big act, somebody they know they like. But they have to be familiar with a lot of different tracks from a new artist, generally, before they're going to spend that kind of money.

Disco Reviews by Tom Lewis & Keith Mann

It was the music of Motown that really had people dancing even before disco arose as a fully realized contemporary form and that companys long string of 60's hits, (and even misses), have been sighted often and accurately as a primary source of inspiration for todays disco producers. As disco has become a phenomena, it has been unfortunate that Motown producers and artists have not been flourishing on disco playlists. Sporadic ventures into disco like Diana Ross, "Love Hangover" and Thelma Houston's "Don't Leave Me This Way", have met with overwhelming success, but despite other efforts, the company has apparently been disinterested or out of touch..until now. Two new 12" releases prove Motown may have been a sleeping giant. Tata Vega's "I JUST KEEP THINKING ABOUT YOU BABY" (125 BPMs) has been lengthened and strengthened since it's appearance on her "Try My Love" LP. The LP to include a longer intro and an additional instrumental break, as has Bonnie Pointer's "HEAVEN MUST HAVE SENT YOU" (130 BPMs). Tata's exuberant vocals and their type interplay with those of her background singers (among them is Patty Brooks) are matched with dynamic orchestration and driving bass to provide a cut which is identifiably Motown. Mid tempo, this record is at times feverishly intense, building to an energetic peak which then eases down gradually. Outstanding for listening but not so for dancing was Bonnie Pointer's remake of Elgin's 1966 "Heaven Must Have Sent You" on her debut solo album. Producer Jeffrey Bowen saw it's problems and has now revamped this gospel tinged classic which immediately recalls the early Supremes (complete with handclaps), adding a most unusual central break and greatly increasing this record's hit potential. We expect to see both of these singles get extensive play on radio as well as in the discoteques. Suggested Mixes: Tata into Bonnie, Bonnie into Tata, Bonnie into Liquid Gold, Tata into Bunny Sigler.

WORTHY OF ATTENTION:

They had to and they did; Evelyn Champagne King's "MUSIC BOX" (134 BPMs) from her recently released RCA LP has been remixed for disco and she is hitbound once again as is Polydors Gloria Gaynor whose "ANYBODY WANNA PARTY" (120 BPMs) also shines radiantly on a 12", no longer eclipsed by "I Will Survive". Both ladies should have no trouble easily climbing the pop charts as well. It is a toss up between "BODY STRONG" (125-128 BPMs), my favorite, and "STARS" (127-133 BPMs) among DJs in addition to the already charted "I WHO HAVE NOTHING". The Jones Girls "YOU'RE GONNA MAKE ME LOVE SOMEBODY ELSE" (107 BPMs), on Philly International, is a Gamble Huff produced fusion of funk and disco and a handy addition to the club and radio playlist. Arista's Stewart Thomas Group debuts with "TO FREAK OR NOT TO FREAK" (132 BPMs), a 12" single. Chaka's sister Taka Boom has already had two major hits with groups Undisputed Truth, "You Plus Me Equals Love", and Glass Family's "Mr. DJ". "NIGHT DANCIN" (126 BPMs) on Ariola will be her third. A new label, Zebra Records, is hopeful for "I DON'T WANNA LOSE IT" (129 BPMs); so are we. Warner Brothers has two hot records in "HAVE A CIGAR" (139 BPMs) by Rosebud, a remake of Pink Floyd's record and "CUBA" (122-124 BPMs) by The Gibson Brothers. If the latter record is too Latin for your market try the next side.

I have always found it interesting how some producers can conceive the simplest of orchestrations and arrangements. add a few favorable elements and create a truly unique sound. Produced and composed by Frederick Knight, the components of "RING MY BELL" by Anita Ward (127 BPMs), are a consistent bass pattern, rhythm guitar, light percussion, glockenspiel and a catchy syndrum (a la Simon Soussan). Though rhythmically repetetive, the cut has a can't beat quality that makes this TK 12" refreshingly different. Anita's cutesy vocals cast a spell in spite of a dearth of lyrical content. The only lyrics besides "YOU CAN RING MY BELL" occur within the records first minute of example; "Lean Back And Relax While I Put Away The Dishes". Campy? No question about it. The already immense response to this record tells the tale, this is a record which is perfect for transition maintaining interest and lightening the mood, mixed to perfection by Richie Rivera, it's an eight minute respite from discos usual intensity. Suggested mixes: almost anything.

Superlative hardly suffices in describing "HIGH ON MAD MOUNTAIN" the latest offering from the Mike Theodore Orchestra. Responsible in the past for hits as diverse as CJ & Company's Devils Gun, His Own The Bull, and Comic World, as well as notable work with Dennis Coffee and The Fantastic Four, Mike Theodore triumphs once again. The title cut presents a sonic tapestry which fuses elements of each of these yet sparkles with originality. Primarily instrumental the cut progresses gradually through its various segments. Opening with a series of horn blasts and rock solid drum beats the cut is like a musical disney ride..African chanting vocals are presented and a juxeaposition with vocals which are at once gospelish and operatic while we are carried along by rich orchestration including periodic volcanic erruptions of horns. Though I think "HIGH ON MAD MOUNTAIN" (129 BPMs) will be the preferred pick on the LP. Side two presents a near sixty minute medley of what might be classified as cosmic boogie music which may well turn out to be strong.

From Rock To Disco

Ron Olson, PD of WHRK Memphis...

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RMR: Ron, you recently changed radio stations in Memphis, going from FM 100 to WHRK. Of course, WHRK is full-time disco. How do you feel about the change?

Ron: Oh. it's tremendous. It's something I should have done a long time ago. The timing is just right, nationwide for disco. I'm getting the feeling that it's basically one of the neatest things to come along into radio since you got tangled up with Top-40. It's one of those phases that, if you don't recognize it and if you don't pay attention to it, you're going to get lost in the shuffle. It's so unbelievable. The music is so up, and it's just a trip to be working on the air. It's great to be finally working again: where at FM 100.1 had fallen into a rut, more or less of just doing my air shift. I really couldn't get up for anything else. I just got tired of not working, but now I come in early and work late, and work seven days a week.

RMR: There's a polarization...A lot of the die-hard rockers are trying not to recognize disco as a viable form of music. Coming from the rock field into the disco movement, do you find that there's much difference in music?

Ron: No. But for me. it's a real good feeling, because I like it. I'm pretty open-minded about music. As long as it's good music, regardless if it's disco or classical or rock & roll or whatever. I like it. I still like to put on a Bad Company album at home and check it out, or whatever else is going on. But this music is just so unbelievable on the air. It's a rush to be working on the air and playing this stuff that is so finely produced and so slick. This station is right on top of the pulse of everything that's going on in this city, with the area, since the station has finally gone live, there s no reason in the world why a station with the image it already has, can't go ahead and bust balls and be number one in the market.

RMR: Most of the Plough stations were partially automated until you just went live with WHRK. Where did you find your people?

Ron: Basically, we picked up Henry Nelson, who was an old friend and good guy from WNOE in New Orleans. He'd been at FM 100 for a long time and had been at WNOE for about a year. New Orleans has gone through the change, also, where they've picked up a lot of disco formats down there. A lot of stations are acknowledging the presence of disco formats and going ahead and putting it in the bank. We've got a new guy working in the mornings. Ron Wolf, who came in from Norfolk, Virginia. He had been doing afternoons there for a long time and was ready for a change. We got a seven to midnight guy named Leon Griffin, who is from Memphis. He had been out of radio for a couple of years, but has always been a super voice. He's been a producer and worked in TV, doing some producing. We talked him into coming in and giving up what he was doing to get back into radio. So right now, we've got a full-time staff (except we're going to be automated from midnight to six for a while. All three of the Plough stations: V103 in Atlanta, the one in Baltimore and WHRK are all going through the change at the same time, gradually. I think we're a little more excellerated in our going live than the other two stations because the home offices are here

Canadian Intl. Record Pool

Mgrs. Michael Cleary & Michel Zgarka...

RMR: What is the C.I R.P.?

CIRP: The C.I.R.P. is an international promotion network for disco productions in the Canadian market not yet available in the other markets serviced by the C I.R.P.

RMR: How does it work?

CIRP: The C.I.R.P. works on a subscription basis whereby it services the key disco outlets (discotheques, trade publications, key DJs. racks. etc.) with the latest disco releases not yet available in the specific countries it deals with.

RMR: What is the cost of the subscription?

CIRP: The cost is a \$15 weekly subscription fee plus transport and duty.

RMR: What is the usual content of a weekly package?

CIRP: The weekly package contains an average of eight pieces (LP's. 12" and 7")

RMR: Who can become a C.I.R.P. member?

CIRP: Anyone directly connected with the disco industry and serving as a vehicle to help the product be better known. The ideal C.I.R.P. member is a full-time d₁.

RMR: The C.I R.P. has strict rules concerning its members; could you outline a few of those?

CIRP: The C.I.R.P. has definitively strict rules. In order to remain always on top of things, especially when you work with many countries, you must keep a very tight organization. One of the main concerns of the C.I.R.P. is to receive constant feedback on the product shipped.

Members failing to do so after several shipments (if they have no valid reason) are automatically removed from our roster. A C.I.R.P. member is also always asked to help the promotion and the sales of the product shipped. We always encourage our members to get their disco community constantly aware of the existence of the product. Our members are required to send us local charts and to try to get some of the imported product placed in those charts.

RMR: You have branch officers in the different countries you service. how were they chosen?

CIRP: Our branch officers are all top dj's whose professionalism has been proven highly within the disco community. Our choice of officers was very careful. To be a C.I.R.P. branch officer, one has to be a full-time dj, be very well connected to local stores, radio station and local labels.

RMR: You mention local labels; do you work closely with labels outside Canada?

CIRP: The C.I.R.P. has an A&R department whose unique function is to find international releases for the Canadian disco productions. In order to do this, we must keep constant good business relationship with every foreign label which has disco product.

RMR: How does your A&R service function?

CIRP: Early this year, we sent a brochure to most of the international labels with disco product offering this new C.I.R.P. service. (This service is only available to record labels). This A&R department works also on subscription whereby any label interested in being aware of the disponibility of Canadian product free for leasing may join. A weekly shipment of Canadian product is then sent to all of these labels. Both our promotional and A&R international networks have the same goal-general awareness of the world record industry to the excellence of the Canadian record industry.

RMR: What is the next step you forsee for your company?

CIRP: The Canadian disco industry exists, the disco industry is booming, logically the Canadian disco industry must attain a world recognition. This is the goal of the C.I.R.P.



Disco Profile: Amii Stewart

One listen, one look and you too will be hooked on Amii Stewart, Europe's hottest sensation. Born in America, this 23 year old bombshell has been grooming her talents in England, Italy and Germany...sending disco friends throughtout the land to the dance floor in herds.

With her debut American release, a pulsating neon rendition of Eddie Floyd's classic, "Knock On Wood," Amii is relative newcomer to the disco scene. It was hardly a year ago when she made her first major break away from a near lifelong career in dancing; when, while starring in, partly directing and choreographing the London hit show, "Bubbling Brown Sugar", she met producers/songwriters Barry Land and Simon May who immediately sent Amii on her way with her debut British single, "You Really Touched My Heart"/"Closest Thing To Heaven." Matched with a flashy brand of flamboyant stylish outrage that could have put Louis XVI to shame, Amii is ready to conquer.

"I find disco to be very innovative," she reports as an observer and participant. "The rhythmic patterns are fabulous. The whole world was just waiting for something different...Van McCoy started a whole new movement. Now each artist is taking another step forward."

Having begun her professional career at the age of 16, appearing in countless American TV specials as an allaround entertainer with the Washington D.C. Rep Company, then moving on to filmwork in such features as "King Kong", "The Greatest" and "The Return of the Pink Panther", it doesn't take a crystal ball to recognize what's in store for Amii. Quite simply, the lady is a star.

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Bay Area Disco DJ Association—Craig Barney..

This column is concerned with the branch of audio science called "Psychoacoustics". It is meant only as introduction to this extremely complex field. I choose to divide psychoacoustics, or the ear/brain perception of sound into two realms: the first is frequency response, the second distortion response.

The audible range of sound lies in the frequency band between 30-20,000 hz. This is actually a bit wide, but I am talking of the best possible ear. Some important work on the human ears sensitivity was done by Mrs. Fletcher and Munsen. What their work showed is that our ears are most sensitive in the region of 500-4000 hz. This is true at any volume of sound. But there is a catch: as the volume increases, the difference in sensitivity to sound outside that range as compared to sound within it diminishes greatly. The result is that at low levels, our ears are less sensitive to lows and highs than they are at higher levels. This is very important in the disco sound system, because there are different acoustic properties when running a system at low levels than at high

In case of a disco where the volume is always loud, as in a "real" disco, the problem is not really very sticky. The psychoacoustic difference to the dancer between the low/high frequencies and the mids can be fairly well compensated for the equilizer. But in the case of the disco where the volume ranges from soft to somewhat loud (the so called mellow or sophisticated disco), this effect can be devastating on the dancers. During the periods in the program when the volume is low, the lack of bass heard by the dancers will tend to make the music sound somewhat screechy and not move them to action. This is especially true of tunes with an upfront female vocalists. The amount of equalization necessary to balance the sound is not practical for most of these systems. However, if the system is "state of the art" and is bi-amped, the DJ can increase the gain to the bass cabinets when he is playing mellow music. Since most of the "sophisticated" discos don't spend a lot of money on sound equipment, the only solution for the DJ is to select carefully the records he uses during his mellow segments. What he will look for is super hot tight base with subdued female vocals. This, I think, is one secret of the success of Fleetwood Mac and the BeeGees. Other practices such as "gain raiding" by the DJ in an effort to accentuate certain passages and downplay others is usually one only practiced in larger clubs. The final solution is to have a separate person running the sound system via external equalizer and compressor—an approach taken by only very few clubs.

My second division of psychoacoustics is distortion. There are several ways to distort a musical signal, not all of which are equally annoying to the dancers. I will speak of acoustic, harmonic, intermodulation, transient and phase distortion. Unless there have been gross errors commited by a record company, these will arise in the sound system and the DJ has little control over them.

Acoustic distortion is caused by the difference in the room in which the music is reproduced, compared to the room which it was recorded. This includes both the spatial distribution of the music and acoustic anomalies present in any room. But disco music is supposed to sound "alive" rather than "live", the first is not too important. But no disco in the world is built like a recording studio. Some are huge warehouses with incredibly long reverbation time, others are intimate bistros with numerous pockets which trap and echo sound. But the solution to this is really in speaker design and placement and not in amplifier/mixer/equalizer utilisation.

Harmonic distortion is one which is somewhat irritating to the listener. This results from the addition of some harmonic signal to the original signal from the source. It is caused by some non-linearity in the system, and the amount present in high quality sound equipment is generally low. Since this distortion is harmonically related to the original signal, it is not always noticeable.

Intermodulation distortion is more irritable to the listener. This occurs when two signals from different points in time spill into each other. It is somewhat like a bad segue where the music "double beats" momentarily. This is generally caused by low quality equipment or by overdriving good equipment. The result is a discordant sound in a sort of muddled mixture of signals.

Transient distortion is often not noticed in a high quality system which is not overdriven. The nature of music is that the signals are in very large bursts of energy spread over very short periods of time. These bursts are linked to each other by rhythmic patterns. This is especially true of the strokes of the kick drum which provide most of the heat for the dancer's feet. If a sound system has poor transient response, a kind of sonic hangover can occur as one note of high intensity crashes into another. This will confuse the listener and cause the so-called "listener fatigue"


Phase distortion results from incorrect connection of the components of the sound system and generally cause cancellation to occur in the bass region. Sometimes a DJ will profusely cause this to happen for a jet-like special effect, but this should be under his control and not always happening.

If the news on your station sounds like your competition's, you have a real bad problem!

When was the last time you communicated with your listener on a one to one basis? I mean actually informed that listener like he or she was your next door neighbor, or better yet, your best friend? If you want to survive in today's form of radio it is imperative that you do so!

Don't talk down to the listener. Don't put yourself on a plateau above your listener. Don't spread negatives and bring your listener down. Don't use the old balls, or heavy pipes approach on your listener, unless of course you are into tuning out people to be spiteful to the jock who is on during your time slot!

This really isn't as bizarre as it may seem. Next time you're on the air, notice how positive the jock is trying to be. Notice how the jock is giving a human approach to his overall sound. You've got to be just as positive, and human! And if you aren't? You've just blown 55 minutes of credibility that the jock built up. Not only that, you destroyed a very valuable quarter hour by tuning out your listener.

Next time you look over a body of a newscast, look at each story and say to yourself: "How does this relate to the mass audience? Do they really care? Will it nauseate someone? Will it be entertaining? Will it be helpful as well as educational?" For example: Who really cares if there was a bombing in Beirut overnight? Maybe one person, if that many! But who cares about the rising cost of gasoline? Who cares about the high cost of food? Every damn person who is listening, including yourself! So why not lead with something interesting?

Something I used to always get reprimanded for was not leading with a damn murder/blood and guts story...a fire...a domestic stabbing...or a three alarm fire. It's not that important. And if people really are into negatives such as the above, then they can watch the gore on the tube at six and eleven.

If you don't change your ways and begin communicating on a one to one basis, you might as well get out now, because there is no room for you in today's free-form journalism!

Something's happening in news which will make it an extremely important factor in the ratings battles in the next year. I get 50 tapes a week from newspeople wanting better situations; and out of that stack, there's usually one tape worth saving...worth saving for a station who wants to change its news philosophies. News is changing, and to prove it, all you have to do is glance in the back of the trades, including this one, and notice how many openings are available for drive time newspeople and news directorsand during a book, too!

Two Little Words

Yesterday Ron asked me if I had anything for the back page—I said nothing in particular. It's now 4:30am and I have something I would like to put into print that kept me from sleeping...I hope it does mean something to you.

Over the years I've had a lot of people work under me at various radio stations and, on occasion, I've been very rough on them as talent or employees. I've spent many hours listening and critiquing. I've always had my 'hot line' into the control room. Sometimes the person on the air would bend the format so badly it would be necessary to 'bother' that person while he or she was on the air. At times the format violation was so flagrant it would be necessary to make a 'heated' call and at times the dialogue would get strong. The professional could take the call, admit to the mistake and continue on the air sounding as good as their talent allowed. Some even responded to criticism by sounding even better after the call. While still a jock, before becoming a program director, I would dread a phone confrontation with my PD...so I didn't bend the format to the extent that a call would I hated to have anything break my be necessary. concentration while on the air. Everytime I heard something good from any of my air people I would always call and compliment them on a good stop set, bit, post, or whatever. There were two little words that seemed to make the person on the air respond in a positive manner. Those two little words were "Good Work". Those two words were always better than money to me when I was a jock and I've never forgotten that. Since joining RMR, I've heard from many of the people who worked under and with me at various stations and that's always a pleasure. The greatest thrill is to hear that they're doing well and that I had a part to play in their career development by offering that small 'kick in the rear' on the hot line from time to time-and that slight boost to their confidence at the right time with those two little words, "Good Work"

When you're talent you need to hear that you're doing well..you need to know that you're doing well..it's essential and necessary. The most enjoyable calls I get these days are the calls to compliment the magazine. It's great to hear someone say that we're doing good work...the two little words that mean so damn much.

Radio was my whole life. I gave the most years of my life to it and, with all modesty, I did very well in my broadcasting career. The reason was simple—I love radio. Jesse Bullet said to me, "Radio is a religion.", and he's right. If you don't feel that strongly about it then maybe you're in the wrong profession. We all know it requires long hours and total dedication. Because of requirements in terms of that dedication, it's hard to maintain a normal life outside the profession. God bless the understanding 'radio wife'. She is the unsung hero in our business. A few years ago I was in Al Coury's office when he was head of National Promotion at Capitol. One of his promotion people called while I was visiting and Al quickly grabbed a book with an immediate visual as to what stations the promotion man needed to fill in his territory. Al was yelling into the phone telling his man to close this station...do this..do that. The verbal attack was so intense I felt sorry for the man on the other end of the phone. But all of a sudden, Al's voice got soft and he told the promotion man how pleased he was that the man had 'closed' this station and that station, etc. Al ended the conversation with, "Love ya..good work." . The point is that a kick in the rear is sometimes necessary to get us all to respond. But those two words that Al uttered at the end of the call showed warmth, compassion, and appreciation. That was back in 1973 and since then I've told the story a thousand times...Al Coury is the

best promotion man I've ever seen work. He knew when to say those two big words that mean so damn much.."Good Work".


