# RADIO STATS

OUR RELATIVE CHARTING, AS SEEN BELOW, RESEMBLES BASEBALL'S BATTING AVERAGES. IT ESTABLISHES A RATIO BETWEEN THE IDEAL, (HEAVY AIRPLAY AT EVERY STATION WHICH REPORTED); AND THE WEIGHTED COUNT THAT A RECORDING HAS ACTUALLY EARNED. THIS MATHEMATICAL FORMULA IS APPLIED TO EACH RECORD—FIRST REGIONALLY, THEN NATIONALLY. A DUAL WEIGHTING SYSTEM IS USED TO DERIVE THE COUNT. IT ADJUSTS FOR MARKET SIZE AND FOR HEAVY OR MODERATE AIRPLAY. THESE CHARTS SHOW THE RELATIVE INTENSITY OF RADIO AIRPLAY FOR BOTH NEW AND ESTABLISHED RECORDINGS.

Well as Walrus goes to press there appears to be a somewhat happy ending to the story of the Clamshell Alliance vs. the Seabrook Nuke.

When last we spoke the Clams were organizing their occupation which, as you know came off peacefully. But 24 hours after it had started it ended with the arrest of 1414 of their members, and many members of the press. Ironic that some reporters who've served as war correspondents behind enemy lines would find more hassles in covering news here in the 'land of the free' than in foreign countries. But such is life in Meldrum Thompson's New Hampshire.

We covered the occupation and arrests extensively, then followed thru with smuggled tapes from inside the National Guard Armories where the Clamshellers lived in squalor for 13 days. Bad food, no beds, disease rampant... but their bail solidarity remained intact.

A personal reflection... the occupation at Seabrook was truly one of the most moving events I've ever seen. Spirits and energies were incredibly high even during the arrests. The arguments against nukes were secondary. It was the motivation and organization that inspired me.

We're planning a format change for public affairs which should allow for shorter, interesting documentary type things. Hope it works out.

As it turned out, we got the phone call from George about 5 minutes after the first bomb blew... but we did not broadcast anything until calling the cops to see if anything blew. Fun and games and shades of the 60's.

##### NEWS & PUBLIC AFFAIRS:

The question of decriminalization of marijuana in personal amounts still remains unanswered in Washington State. So far, the response from local law enforcement officials has been good with many speaking in favor of decriminalization including Seattle's police chief agreeing that there are higher priorities for law enforcement personnel. Clark County, in Southwest Washington, has a county prosecutor who in the past year has reversed his opinion on decriminalization. One year ago, James Carty opposed the idea but has now asked the Washington legislature to legalize possession of marijuana in specific amounts. Under his direction

The volume level was loud enough to effectively fill the large auditorium, yet was sharp and clear with virtually no distortion. The timing with lights, film loops and production gimmicks (i. e. a gigantic 20 foot inflatable pig floating across the audience) was perfectly synchronized, yet there were many instances where the group was able to play without such props, allowing them a bit more flexibility. The material was mainly from Animals and Wish You Were Here, with encores from Dark Side and Umma Gumma. One aesthetic touch which this reviewer appreciated was the lack of the standard production company announcer hyping all the company's upcoming shows for the month. To say that the audience was exceptionally exuberant is a gross understatement. After P. F.'s first "finish," the crowd clapped, cheered, and stomped for a full 10 minutes (making more noise than the group) to pull them out for an encore of "Money." Two encores later, the excitement and energy were still there, and the crowd shrieked for over 10 minutes after the last number, even while the sound crew was shutting down the system. The overall performance was one of the slickest, most classy shows in a while - this reviewer's first rave concert since December.

Well, I wasn't sure about Tom Waits being in the jazz file until last night, and now I'm positive. His entire format, his group, his gruntin' scat style, is more jazz than not. The ensemble is a basic quartet, with Frank Virci on sax (fine solos), Fitz Jenkins doing excellent work on stand-up bass, straight ahead drumming by Chip White, and vocals, piano, jazz-poems and pantomime by Tom. From the first tune, appropriately enough "Step Right Up", the show was an enthralling blend of grunts, moans, scat-poems, gravel-voiced ballads, and great solos by the section players. I've never felt an audience try so hard to listen to every word. To hang on to every note. It wasn't easy, but well worth it. What resulted was a shared experience between artist/audience - Tom gave us a guided tour through back street bars and sleazy scenes, occasionally throwing in a phrase from a show tune or old standard (just like Dexter Gordon might...). The lights provided the perfect atmosphere with a red or a blue wash down low, and Tom would choreograph a dance with a shapely phantom lady or light a cigarette during a blackout scene. Next Tom and the sax or bass would plan a duet on a mysterious ballad. Then he'd be up scatting again. Non-stop. But not too much to deal with either. After a standing, pounding ovation, Tom and group came back to do "Waltzing Matilda" and after that no one could ask for more. And yes, Tom is real. No hype, no put-on-act, just an intense and highly personal way of communicating on and off stage with style and voice all his own. A very special evening was shared by all.

Martin Bogen and the Armstrongs are possibly the last surviving exponents of a style of string music popularized in the 1920's and 30's by groups like the Mississippi Sheiks. They played an amusing, engaging set, completely winning over the audience, bringing to life a tradition that today exists only in books and records.

The Waylors with only two exceptions - Richie Albright on drums and soulful Ralph Mooney on steel - have changed personnel from a year ago; the sound is still there - the Waylors tighter than ever but Duke Goff's amazing rolling bass riffs were sadly missing. Still, that didn't make any difference to the audience who'd come to experience the Ol Waylon they knew and loved. Midway into the show, Waylon broke into his latest single "Luckenbach, Texas" in which he sings about Willie, Waylon and the boys going to Luckenbach, Texas - and sure enough, Uncle Willie joined Waylon and the boys on stage. The audience creamed in its collective jeans! Waylon and Willie together proceeded to sing "Luckenbach" (with Willie Changing the lines slightly, i. e. Jerry Jeff's train songs instead of Newbury's), "Good Hearted Woman," "It's Not Opposed to Be That Way," "Heaven Or Hell," "Jambalaya," "Good Night, Irene," and the rousing finale, "Will the Circle Be Unbroken." A truly memorable Austin-ta-tious evening.

Bob Marley & The Wailers/EXODUS/Island ILPS 9498 (Without affectation, Marley relaxed and did not try to make the eternal album. The result is irresistible. It is no longer a fascination with an odd rhythm which draws attention. Now the attraction is the absolute purity of the man's melodies.)

## MERIT PLUS ALBUMS

(All Merit and Merit Plus Albums are recommended for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all of these recommendations are suitable for all stations. The Merit Plus Albums distinguish themselves with an extra vitality.)

The Gary Burton Quartet With Eberhard Weber/PASSENGERS/ECM 1092 (A fine recording on all levels. The expected sonic quality is complemented by a gregarious musical adventure. Modern but, not strange, Gary's sense of joy is captured here.)

John Coltrane/AFRO BLUE IMPRESSIONS/Pablo 2620 101 (Documenting his first European tour in 1962, this live album displays a 'Trane making his move on the jazz world. He works inside, then slides outside. Accompanying him are McCoy Tyner, Jimmy Garrison and Elvin Jones - just some guys from the neighborhood.)

The David Grisman Quintet/Kaleidoscope F-5 (Grisman is close to a breakthrough. His music is like Texas swing played inside out. He and guitarist Tony Rice are what John McLaughlin might have been had he listened to bluegrass. But, they show more restraint. Distributed by Flying Fish.)

Illusion/OUT OF THE MIST/Island ILPS 9489 (Previously reviewed as an import. Illusion is basically the original formation of Renaissance with a few changes. Three lovely ballads stand out of the album making the project much more than merely a look back.)

Greg Kihn/AGAIN/Berserkley PZ 34779 (Street musician makes good in rock and roll. Greg Kihn's practiced unsophistication contrasted with consistent material, elevates him beyond bar band. Basic but, always right there.)

Danny Kirwan/DJM DJLPA-9 (Previously reviewed as an import. Most of Danny's songs are good journeyman efforts but, there are a few special tunes which demand extra attention. "Angel's Delight," "Misty River," and "I Can Tell" are among them. He gets a nice instrumental sound too.)

Steve Kuhn & Ecstasy/MOTILITY/ECM 1-1094 (Crisply presented, Steve gets some mobility into Motility. There is an equal concern with mind and body in his music. It is clearly elevating.)

Steve Miller/BOOK OF DREAMS/Capitol SO-11630 (Steve Miller follows his last album with a confident statement. It moves easily with light, airy quality and superior sound.)

Danny O'Keefe/AMERICAN ROULETTE/Warner Bros. BS 3050 (Though Danny's album loses intensity in spots, it comes out a winner overall. The feel is so good. His "voice is a marvelous instrument" which separates him from a million other singers. Danny is a thoughtful writer too.)

Oregon/FRIENDS/Vanguard VSD 79370 (In their mixture of East and West, tradition and avant garde, it is sometimes hard to find the music. Still, the delicacy and sophistication of Oregon is intriguing. In the best communication's sense they have found a unique musical approach. Classy.)

Outlaws/HURRY SUNDOWN/Arista AL 4135 (Consistency is the ace card which finally bends the ear. Their sound and their round songs break you down because they rarely break down. Smooth.)

Jim Post/LIVE/Mountain Railroad Records MR 52778 (A few years back Jim Post was guilty of releasing some moderately boring albums. In stark contrast, his live set is enticing. The Lp's presence captures his warm voice, good humor and fine songs. It'll take you back to those comfortable nights on those always wooden folk club seats.)

The Jess Roden Band/BLOWIN'/Island ILPS 9496 (Previously released as an import. The songs are right and that band is firmly rooted in essential music. Jess Roden's live set is obviously the place to be.)

The Rubinoos/Berserkley PZ 34778 (Yesterday's top 40 today. Jumping out of the grooves is genuine rock and roll ala The Rubinoos. Off car radios and into the studio they harness every stroke of the past in a modernish configuration.)

## MERIT PLUS ALBUMS CONTINUED

Ben Sidran/THE DOCTOR IS IN/Arista AL 4131 (Singing in his simulated Mose Allison voice, with better songs, Ben continues his career of fine music. Though it tries to sound casual, a cruise through the credits reveals a really produced record.)

Joe Stampley/SATURDAY NITE DANCE/Epic KE 34732 (Sure it's a country album. Still, producer Norro Wilson and Joe Stampley have combined a hot Lp built on punchy presentation of a surprising array of strong songs. Well done.)

Donna Summer/I REMEMBER YESTERDAY/Casablanca NBLP 7056 (Accepted thought would say that Donna Summer's Munich sensual rock doesn't belong in progressive radio. And through a portion of its tracking time that thinking is reinforced. However, there is little denying the Phil Spectorness of "Love's Unkind" or the old Motown quality in "Back In Love Again" or the joy of "Black Lady" or the Kraftwerkness of "I Feel Love." Further, this album is a sonic boon to the ears. What is usable is superfine.)

Pat Travers/MAKIN' MAGIC/Polydor PD-1-6103 (Previously reviewed as an import. The studio keeps Pat Travers off the streets. Maybe his power packed, raucous, bottom heavy, blues rocking relieves his psychic pressures. What Rory Gallagher wants to be.)

Jesse Winchester/NOTHING BUT A BREEZE/Bearsville BR 6968 (Jesse is always entertaining. His sensitivity, on one hand, and his good humor, on the other, combine to yield art. Add style and consistency and Jesse becomes a man of stature.)

## MERIT ALBUMS

Rex Allen, Jr./REX/Warner Bros. BS 3054 (Rex's album sets up a battle of the producers, Norro Wilson's respect for the bass line defines the winning stroke in the face of Larry Bulter's popness. In spite of the subtle undercurrents Rex Allen, Jr. country music comes out as genuine. He's a fine singer.)

Attitudes/GOOD NEWS/Dark Horse DH-3021 (Here to find the audience which Area Code 615 and Stuff could not find is Attitudes. The West Coast studio composite comes out funky and, like the others, shows little identity. A couple nice songs - "Drink My Water" and "Sweet Summer Music" - elevate the first side. Side two is fairly flat.)

Gary Bartz/MUSIC IS MY SANCTUARY/Capitol ST-11647 (An arresting player when he plays, Gary sometimes involves his music in extraneous areas. The musical settings are very spiffy but, the Bartzness is Gary's best credit.)

Bee Gees/HERE AT LAST... LIVE/RSO RS 2-3901 (The list of Bee Gee hits and near hits, from their old repertoire and new, is staggering. Just listen. This album is a fairly casual performance which runs the gamut.)

Roy Buchanan/LOADING ZONE/Atlantic SD 18219 (Stanley Clarke's production lends some class to Roy's presentation. But it does it without solidifying his direction. It's a search for a style other than blues, which is a dead end for Roy. The problem, of course, is that blues is what Buchanan is.)

Jonathan Cain Band/WINDY CITY BREAKDOWN/Bearsville BR 6969 (Aside from a missing hook the Jonathan Cain Band establishes itself as a solid rock unit. Their material, like the band, is good but, not exceptional.)

Captain Beyond/DAWN EXPLOSION/Warner Bros. BS3047 (A basic power band constitution belies the name Captain Beyond. They are beyond no other band. Dawn Explosion is a further overstatement, the album being more like a mild cherry bomb. "Midnight Memories" is a song which gets down to business.)

The Vassar Clements Band/MCA 2270 (This album attempts to unify the rangy talent of Vassar Clements. A necessary move. We all know of his dexterity but, his musical contribution remains in question. Here he takes only the first step. An unfortuitous mix renders the album inarticulate at times.)

Alice Cooper/LACE & WHISKEY/Warner Bros. BSK 3027 (It gets by. One cannot escape the impression of contrivance even in the successful tracks. Alice seems afraid or incapable of coming out from under the cover of musical facade.)

Raul De Souza/SWEET LUCY/Capitol ST-11648 (An extraordinary lesson in rhythm arranging translates, with the melody line fitted on top, to a fine record. Latin and intense it is an exotic spice.)

The Dictators/MANIFEST DESTINY/Asylum 7E-1109 (A muddy recording communicates little more than The Dictators' blasphemous intentions. The "little more" suggests that the band's unapologetic, rock 'n' roll tunes are pretty good and pretty basic. It feels O.K.)

Lamont Dozier/PEDDLIN' MUSIC ON THE SIDE/Warner Bros. BS 3039 (Some of his production takes Lamont out of bounds but, on the whole the production balance shifts to favorable. He has already established himself as an impressive singer/songwriter. Up to now it has been the oversweetness alone which built our resistance.)

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## MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Charles Earland/REVELATION/Mercury SRM 1-1149 (Not at all a stagnant performer, Earland is taking on new challenges with each album. His songs are here because he seems to have a direct message which music alone cannot convey. Yet, it remains for two or three cooking instrumentals to breathe vitality into the album.)
- Galdston & Thom/AMERICAN GYPSIES/Warner Bros. BS 3037 (This album of middle of the road rock is as revealing about the American Song Festival as about Galdston & Thom. Like another winner, Tim Moore, their music is ultra-clean-cut. A pattern emerges. Missing here is any sense of flair. Instead G & T deliver a stamped out, oat Lp.)
- Barry Goldberg & Friends/RECORDED LIVE/Buddah BDS 5684 (Intrigue marks this set exhumed from Lewis Merenstein's archives. It purposely avoids all possible credits while implying that all kinds of luminaries might be the "friends." Musically, this stuff returns to Goldberg's blues roots and, as a result, feels right. The applause sounds phony but, the music doesn't.)
- Gonzalez/OUR ONLY WEAPON IS OUR MUSIC/EMI ST 11644 (Previously reviewed as an import. Gonzalez is an interesting mixture of R&B and Latin influences. They can work a straight R&B or Latin groove as well as combinations of the two with equal comfort. Assured songwriting makes the listening easy as these Europeans export American sounds to America.)
- Merle Haggard/RAMBLIN' FEVER/MCA 2267 (Back to the basics. Merle's album is understated country folk music content to depend on its organic quality for its acceptance. Easily digested, if a little depressing.)
- Heart/LITTLE QUEEN/Portrait PR 34799 (This is their first finished album. In it Heart confirms that their assets center around contrasting folkish and rock intensities and Ann Wilson's Slickish vocals. Their songwriting is adequate.)
- Mark Henley/RIVERSONG/Sanskrit SR-0763 (Coming out of what must be a remarkably fertile folk community, Mark spins a smooth yarn. Though Leo Kottke is most famous, many small independent productions start in the Minneapolis area. Clean cut and sensitive folk music. Write: 7515 Wayzata Blvd., No. 110, Minneapolis, Minn. 55426.)
- Abdul Rahim Ibrahim/AL RAHMAN!/Tabughi TBL 100 (Even as Doug Carn, Ibrahim was fairly musical and funky. That hasn't changed with his name. Now he works in the song format, he's a preacher, while before he was more of an instrumentalist. Write: Box 1987, Studio City, Calif. 91604.)
- Bruce Johnston/GOING PUBLIC/Columbia PC 34459 (A tentative but, skillful, first step as a soloist. Admittedly self-conscious, Bruce has done everything to hide in the middle of his own album. All manners of artificial stuff on his voice and a mix which accentuates the accessory gloss leads to an inside-out Lp. Johnston is a rock and roll survivor who should take his own advice not to be scared.)
- Paul Kelly/STAND ON THE POSITIVE SIDE/Warner Bros. BS 3026 (To his credit Kelly is able to contain the usually outrageous arranging sweeteners of Gene Page. Because of that his colorful music stays down to earth. Though it could have been more interesting instrumentally, Paul's album delivers its basic message.)
- Reggie Knighton/Columbia PC 34685 (On the verge of style. Reggie seems to be working toward a goal which is not totally realized here. There is a Ron Mael twist of logic in his lyric writing but, the arrangements bend in many other ways. Search for tomorrow.)
- Max Webster/HIGH CLASS IN SHOES/Mercury SRM 1-1160 (The music had to be better than the cover. Max should be ashamed. While playing to power they do dare to try some musical things showing depth that might have been unexpected.)
- Mac McAnally/Ariola America ST-50019 (Shades of Prine, Goodman and Sweet Baby James color the work of Mac. He's a good singer/songwriter who gets lots of mileage out of clean recording quality. A journeyman presentation on all levels.)
- Darrell McCal/LILY DALE/Lone Star-Columbia BL34718 (It seems incongruous to have to say that this country album comes from the land. Amazingly, there is a less organic form of country music. Anyhow, Darrell sings with a proper twang and his Lp's whole presentation follows the lay of the land.)
- Sergio Mendes & The New Brasil '77/Elektra 7E-1102 (The newness here is a harder, funkier sound. But, this is not an abrupt, unnatural change; it grows out of the Mendes musical tradition. A track like "Mozambique" harkens thoughts of his unsung masterpiece Lp called Roots. Other tracks are more or less appealing.)
- Bette Midler/LIVE AT LAST/Atlantic PR 275 (This sampler excerpts a two record live set which captures Bette at home on stage. It's undoubtedly the best vinyl done under her name and produces the best versions of those songs she so effectively co-opted. It's very possible that the double Lp won't be as good as this sampler, but, that's idle speculation at this point.)

## MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Moody Blues/CAUGHT LIVE + 5/London ZPS 691 (The "plus 5" refers to previously unavailable tunes which included here add some spice. Without the excessive sweetening the Moodies are even more appealing. An important group gets posthumous life with this release.)
- Moxy/RIDIN' HIGH/Mercury SRM 1-1161 (There's nothing subtle about these bone rattlers. Moxy is spouting a reasonable brand of thickened rock. Power on power.)
- Idris Muhammad/TURN THIS MUTHA OUT/Kudu KU-34 (Sonically sophisticated but, conceptually immature. David Matthews writes jive lyrics which he arranges like cotton candy, artificially sweetened. What he does well is arrange a tight little rhythm track. There is some good music here in "Camby Belongs" and "Crab Apple" and "Say What." Just be sure to avoid the vocal half.)
- New Grass Revival/WHEN THE STORM IS OVER/Flying Fish FF 032 (New Grass Revival is undoubtedly most fun when they are churning their way through a speed burner. Good songs and warm harmonies support and enhance the pickin'.)
- Oklahoma/Capitol ST 11646 (If we all last long enough cities and states will become the endangered species of rock and roll names. The temptation is to say that in Oklahoma the corn is as high as an elephant's eye. They invent nothing in an album which merely fills in the blanks. A cross between hard rock and Southern boogie they succeed by not failing.)
- Paice, Ashton, Lord/MALICE IN WONDERLAND/Warner Bros. BS 3038 (Previously reviewed as an import. Though bottomy like Deep Purple, P. A. L. front a new band strikingly more fluid than their prior aggregate. A mediocre batch of tunes limits them. Sonically muddy.)
- P. F. M./JET LAG/Asylum 7E-1101 (It is hard to pick up the drift from P. F. M. Their uncoordinated musical form spreads across the turf between Yes and jazz. It remains for their acknowledged playing ability to make up the difference. Hence, the instrumentals tend to be best.)
- Maddy Prior & June Tabor/SILLY SISTERS/Chrysalis CHR 1101 (Previously reviewed as an import. Two beautiful voices intertwined, delivering delicately harmonized traditional English music. Singing, at times a cappella, Maddy and June turn an ear.)
- Jerry Reed/RIDES AGAIN/RCA ADL 1-2346 (The cover is country but, Jerry Reed's music is a nominal brand of rock and roll. He even sings the line, "I am the spirit of country music" to a jazz accompaniment. Everything but, country.)
- Cliff Richard/EVERY FACE TELLS A STORY/Rocket PIG-2268 (At his most pleasing when clinging to a speedy basic rocker tune. Richard does have an ear for a good tune and he keeps the level up throughout his Lp with it.)
- Ruby Starr/SMOKEY PLACES/Capitol ST 11643 (Ruby is a rock and roll woman and Deke Richards is a rock and roll producer. They converge around some good songs to make Ruby's best album. Side two loosens up.)
- Strapps/SECRET DAMAGE/Harvest ST-11621 (Previously reviewed as an import. With illusions to S-M, Strapps powers through some brass rock and rock. Melody is a second class citizen as dynamism comes to the foreground.)
- Teresa Tull/THE WAYS A WOMAN CAN BE/Olivia LF910 (Anita Bryant just wouldn't approve of "Woman-loving Woman." The striking thing about this album is a combination of the fine singing by Teresa and the fine sound reproduction. Both the arranging and the Tull songs are good, not more. Write: Box 70237, Los Angeles, Calif. 90070.)
- Bonnie Tyler/THE WORLD STARTS TONIGHT/Chrysalis CHR-1140 (A fine singer, Bonnie could be likened to a female Rod Stewart, if she had material as good as his. Hence the question, are these producer written songs the best songs in the universe for Bonnie to be recording?)
- UFO/LIGHTS OUT/Chrysalis CHR 1127 (The sign of a class rock act is if and when they can deliver a song like "Try Me." Not that it will be a hit but, it shows depth with a high degree of difficulty. UFO rocks pretty well too.)
- Ultravox!/Island ILPS 9449 (Previously reviewed as an import. Produced by Brian Eno, Ultravox! gets the perfect guide into the recording wilderness. He must have jumped at the opportunity when he saw their song title "I Want To Be a Machine." Musical second cousins to Lou Reed, Ultravox! would fit in nicely at CBGB's. Some good tunes.)
- Howard Wales/RENDEZVOUS WITH THE SUN/Costal CST ST-1000 (Howard Wales is a keyboard commadore who spans vast musical horizons. An almost religious tune starts a side one which ends ala Jimmy Smith. Side two touches Keith Jarrett momentarily and goes to funky from there. Wales is always musical. Costal is a San Francisco label.)

# NEW RELEASES

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## MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

Randy Weston/BERKSHIRE BLUES/Arista-Freedom AL 1026 (This is Randy Weston circa 1965. He shows his humor, "Three Blind Mice," and a more melancholy facet, side two. Somehow the Ellingtonian production class comes through the speakers.)

## SATISFACTORY ALBUMS

(Albums of acceptable quality, which, of themselves, require only secondary progressive radio consideration.)

Alexis/MCA 2260 (Elements of success are subverted by immature writing. They can play and that is the cornerstone around which their sound should be built. Outside material to augment the decent things they do generate would elevate their work also. Side one is passable, side two isn't.)

Lazarus/Midsong International BLL 1-2297 (The reggae rhythm here barely shadows the real thing. It sounds like the players heard a Jamaican record once before they tried this. Finally, Lazarus' songs do not always fit the pattern.)

The Memphis Horns/GET UP & DANCE/RCA APL 1-2198 (Purposeless and sometimes listless, the Memphis Horns had no musical reason for leaving the stable. The result is a merely competent Lp which fills in the disco blanks.)

## UNDISTINGUISHED ALBUMS

(In our opinion, below standard Lps except where noted.)

Cameo/CARDIAC ARREST/Chocolate City CCLP 2003 (Cardiac Arrest is a joke of a title. Their disco needs a dose of Geritol most of the time, not to mention a dose of inventiveness.)

Universe/PBR International 7002 (If this is the state of the Universe, we are in trouble, friends. This cosmic quantity is pompous, phony and unmusical. By the end you'll feel aurally assaulted.)

## FRINGE ALBUMS

(Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some interest for progressive audiences.)

Hamilton Bohannon/PHASE II/Mercury SRM 1-1159 (Bohannon's brand of symphonic disco is pretty classy. A serious melody line expands the meaning of the insistent rhythm adding character to a much maligned form.)

Billy Butler/SUGAR CANDY LADY/Curtom CU 5015 (A smooth operator. Tunes which draw attention to themselves and thoughtful arrangements, even if they are pop, generate a fine recording.)

Jerry Butler/SUITE FOR THE SINGLE GIRL/Motown M6-878SI (An artful album which binds itself together around a concept which grows from reality. Good songs are given a glossy pop R&B treatment. The fourth track on each side, however, sheds the production cocoon.)

Stanley Cowell/BLUES FOR THE VIET CONG/Arista-Freedom AL 1032 (Mild and airy, Cowell's album is a refreshing pause from intensity in spite of its title. It is not an album built solely on the past, happily it does muster some very contemporary bends.)

Bob Crewe/MOTIVATION/Elektra 7E-1103 (A beautifully crafted pop album. The only negative is a batch of cliché ridden lyrics. Adult bubblegum.)

Ted Curson/FLIP TOP/Arista-Freedom AL 1030 (Mostly mainstream, especially the live side two, Ted's music shows no fear of the future. Recorded in 1964 the first two tunes here explore the outside bounds of modern jazz.)

Barbara Dickson/MORNING COMES QUICKLY/RSO RS 1-3022 (Barbara's album, another in the ever growing list of finely crafted Lps, is right on the line of acceptability. The weight of the presentation tends to be a little too pop, too glossy. It rarely transmits the realness of "Stolen Love," for example. Well done in any case.)

Andy Gibb/FLOWING RIVERS/RSO RS 1-3019 (Eighteen year old Andy Gibb starts his career at a point his brothers abandoned a couple years ago. Partially produced by Barry, the album features a Gibb voice, decent songs and a fairly big pop production.)

Joao Gilberto/AMOROSO/Warner Bros. BS 3053 (MOR.)

Jim Gold/Tabu BQL 1-2308 (In this case you can judge, at least, the direction of this album by its cover. Buried in the popness are two playables, the third position on each side. Still, it's tough to play a track which, out of context, will misrepresent the artist to your audience.)

Milt Jackson/AT THE KOSEI NENKIN/Pablo 2620 103 (Milt appears live in Japan with sidemen like Ray Brown, Teddy Edwards and Cedar Walton. A comfortable, easy groove plays to an enthusiastic audience measuring the American musical influence in Japan.)

Barry Manilow/LIVE/Arista AL 8500 (The Manilow show is primed and ready for Las Vegas. However, his fans are in for some subpar recording quality in the Lp of that show. He's corny but, he's having a great time, so who are we. Does he or doesn't he?)

## FRINGE ALBUMS CONTINUED

Houston Person/HARMONY/Mercury SRM 1-1151 (Mashed potatoes.)

Eddie Rabbitt/RABBITT/Elektra 7E-1105 (Eddie Rabbitt's smooth country-folk rock tends to slip into the middle of the road. As a result a wealth of nice music in this Lp is lost to us. A couple things survive but, many more would have if Eddie leaned toward a harder sound.)

Merrilee Rush/United Artists UA-LA 735-G (When you see the names Michael Colombier and Jimmie Haskell together in the credits you should be alerted to the potential for heavy handed orchestrations. That potential becomes reality as Merrilee truges through a batch of chosen songs. Everything is crowded.)

Starland Vocal Band/REAR VIEW MIRROR/Windsong BHL1-2239 (Bill Danoff, especially, has always shown a solid melodic sense, so it is not surprising that the Starland Vocal Band should maintain high quality in that area. They are just too sweetly presented. MOR.)

## SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

(Spoken, poetry - comedy and extraneous-musics.)

Anthony Braxton/THE MONTREUX-BERLIN CONCERTS/Arista-Freedom AL 5002 (Live Braxton is only a few percentage points less challenging than when the audience is not an immediate concern. He doesn't lay it out there for all to appreciate. You must tune up to him. Difficult and spunky.)

Egberto Gismonti/DANCA DAS CABECAS/ECM 1089 (Alternating between random, spaced episodes and energized guitar/rhythm pieces Gismonti causes a schizoid response. He exerts and challenges and delights also.)

The Harlemons/POETRY OUT LOUD - NO. TEN/Out Loud OLP 110 (Practicing their own form of witchcraft the Harlemons conjure a creative aural potent. Their improvisational, poetic chants reach mind bending at their best. A programming challenge. Write: 39 Ridgetop Dr., St. Louis, Mo. 63117.)

Julius Hemphill/DOGON A.D./Arista-Freedom AL 1028 (More exploratory in nature than the kind of music we're all used to. The title tune is not as difficult as the rest and serves as a good introduction to Hemphill's music.)

Glen Moore & David Friesen/IN CONCERT/Vanguard VSD-79383 (The very idea of a duet staged by two bassists is at one time intriguing and foreboding. Their music is serious, intellectual stuff which, by its nature, tends to work the darker side.)

The Gabby Pahinui Hawaiian Band/VOL. 1/Warner Bros. BS 3023 (A cross between pure Hawaiian folk music and traditional folk music. The melodies and language are Island while the instrumentation is Mainland. Pleasant.)

Richard Teitelbaum With Anthony Braxton/TIME ZONES/Arista-Freedom AL-1037 (Teitelbaum and his synthesizers are plugged into the same cosmic energy source as is the mind of Anthony Braxton. The interaction of man and machine was never so compatible. These time zones are not earthly.)

 Bert Jansch/A RARE CONUNDRUM/Charisma CAS 1127 (It is rare these days to find a folksinger and guitarist who hasn't taken on the accoutrements of rock music. Bert just sits and strums and sings with some notable exceptions. In any case, he has made an articulate pure album of enjoyable music. Merit Plus.)

Duncan MacKay/SCORE/EMI EMC 3168 (A pleasant, if pedestrian, classical rock piece. It could be the score to an unshot film. The tracks on the second side seem to go to the front more than those on the opener. Steve Harley's lyrics are a puzzlement. Merit.)  
 Pell Mell/RHAPSODY/Venus VB 76-1Pma/b (Irreverently borrowing from the masters and adding their own brand of spice draws favor to Pell Mell. Not pompous or stuffy, they rock it up while showing real facility. They, therefore, respect both traditions. Merit Plus.)  
 The Saints/(I'M) STRANDED/EMI 5C-062-82359 (Needless to say The Saints aren't. Taking Lou Reed to his logical extension yields a guitar-blur accompaniment in support of nonsong lyrics. This mindless sound wave is suited to those pre-teens of great strength and little discretion. Fringe.)

## NO LAUGHING MATTER

You probably have all heard the joke about the psychiatrist who shows his patient a drawing of 4 horizontal lines, and asks, what do you see here? The patient quickly replies sex. Next the doctor shows his patient another drawing, which this time depicts 4 vertical lines, and again he questions what the person sees. The patient, positive about his conclusions, again responds "sex." The doctor's assumption from this is "I'm sorry sir but you have a definite problem." "Me" the patient cries in astonishment, "but doctor, you're the one drawing all the dirty pictures."

Perhaps it would be timely and apropos to paraphrase this joke. You see there's this promotion man who holds up his own picture (the graphics to the Lp of say, a Stevie Wonder) and says what do you see to the AOR Program Director. The Program Director calmly replies - an R&B album, and we don't play R&B. The promotion man looks puzzled since he knows from retail store responses that Stevie Wonder is not just R&B. He then holds up the platinum Lp "The Commodores," and again inquires what the AOR P.D. sees. The P.D. looks at the name Commodores, and the label Motown and then logically deduces "an R&B Lp," adding his pleasant reminder "and we don't play R&B." The Promotion man is a bit frustrated and he proclaims "you have a problem in what you're seeing because you only see the Lp and don't listen to it." The P.D. politely excuses himself and goes back to playing album oriented R&B by the Bee Gees, Boz, Hall and Oates, and other white artists who are considered progressive because they have stepped into the soul chamber and have come out sounding black. Oddly enough, black artists who have achieved the same musical transformation in reverse are still stereotyped as R&B. This stigma has got to be adjusted especially if there is to be any kind of balance and sanity in the music world, which is what the original joke of the shrink and his patient was all about. That joke illustrates the insanity of perceiving something in a biased one sided way, which can never create a happy balance. It's interesting to note here in our analogy of the psychiatrist and the patient, the Promotion Man and the AOR P.D., the balanced and unbalanced etc., that the original meaning of the word idiosyncrasy is a whole Greek phrase wrapped up into one. The word idio, "private," syn, "together" and crazy, "mixture." Therefore most AOR playlists is an idiosyncrasy; their own "private mixture." Unfortunately, AOR radio, the pioneer of liberalism and innovation doesn't seem at the moment to be mixing the races. The private playlist seems to be somewhat segregated. And in keeping with our study of definitions and semantics, the word abnormal is from the Latin "ab" meaning "away from" the normal for "pattern." The general pattern reflected in the AOR market place, the actual retail stores across the country, shows that music consumers are in fact buying Stevie Wonder, Marvin Gaye, The Commodores on levels which

transcend the limited R&B status. Sure Stevie, Marvin, The Commodores, etc., sell R&B records but there are also cuts on their albums which are definitely progressive. However, going back to our opening illustration, the joke which isn't a joke, the essence of a very significant issue is the fact that a P.D. has got to do more than just look at an album cover and record label and then via his past associations derive at a cursory evaluation that the product is only rhythm and blues. What is required is at least an open shot of having product listened to, with an open mind (which is what the early formation of underground, or progressive formats was all about, and which was the philosophy which made this type of radio so exciting.) Right now, I firmly believe that P.D.'s are not legitimately listening to albums, from start to finish reviewing every track. They more or less have relied on a "one track" mind based on preconceived notions.

What I'd particularly like P.D.'s to be aware of is the inequity represented between the AOR programmed top 20 Lp's in the country and the AOR top selling albums. The Walrus charts point out (on their progressive retail chart) that Stevie Wonder, Marvin Gaye, Commodores, etc., are all top sellers. In the southern region alone, The Commodores' album is being outsold by only two of the top 20 AOR Lp's, Fleetwood Mac and The Eagles. They are outselling Boston, Atlanta Rhythm Section, Bob Seger, etc. Even with this kind of sales impact at the progressive level, P.D.'s are still ignoring statistics, they retort, "but the album is selling black." This answer is incredulous. I can understand this quote pertaining to say sales in Harlem, but in Manhattan, where black artists are indeed selling progressively, I have yet to see a retail salesperson keep a record of the color of each consumer purchasing an album, i. e., one black, one white, etc. Maybe this would be a good thing for at least then, there would be some sort of honesty in saying, "the album is selling black." To summarize: I'm asking that AOR Program Directors give a serious listen to new product regardless of what they already think it might be and also for these stations to remember what their own roots are; how they started and what their purpose was in free form, underground programming. Then they may realize that they are presently neglecting black product. Let's make AOR mean what its origins intended for it always to be, open, eclectic and free. Mind you, I'm not advocating an AOR station becoming an R&B station, what I do advocate is recognizing the fact that there are progressive black artists in the country and that because an artist is black does not make him R&B.
