

Purpose

This is the first issue of ANTIQUE RADIO CLASSIFIED and represents over five months of effort to get it going. I hope you are satisfied with the progress being made. As you no doubt realize it takes many months for a publication to grow and to get the format finalized.

I have received many letters with suggestions for future issues, along with many compliments and words of encouragement. However, it is not the words of praise that will make this publication a success. What will it take? I would like to answer that question with a few general comments that I have concerning the hobby. I apologize as this is taking up two pages in this issue, but I figure it best to express my views right from the start.

I have been in the radio collecting hobby for over 14 years and have met over a thousand different collectors and many more through written contact. It has been a very exciting experience to be involved in such a unique hobby. My biggest objection has to do with non-participation of those in the hobby. Why is it that people are afraid to get involved and remain so secretive? Is there a fear that the general public will be informed that there is such a hobby as "radio collecting" and cause market prices to go up. I strongly disagree. I get the feeling the public thinks radios in general are scarce, however in my involvement in the hobby I see just the opposite. The radios are out there with many more yet to be found. A little diligent searching will turn up many leads, plus the keeping in contact with other collectors.

Could it be that some collectors are against involvement in the hobby because of exploitation and commercialization (including this publication). Yes, I believe that is on the minds of many. Commercialization of any hobby is unavoidable as the hobby gains popularity. If it wasn't for this aspect, I doubt any hobby would grow. As far as this publication is concerned, I am publishing it because I strongly feel there is a need for it. I am not out to use it for a stepping stone to enable me to add radios to my collection, as suggested by a few. This is the most illogical reason I ever heard! My investment and reputation is by far more important than any addition to my collection.

I was at the A.R.C.A. Radio Meet in Elgin, Illinois this past June promoting this publication. I worked very hard in making the sample issue which I had available for the collectors there to examine. Their attitude in general was that it was more important to race up and down the flea market than to take a few minutes to comment about this publication. No hesitation was seen in the collectors when it came time to spend a hundred or more dollars for a radio, but to spend \$15.00 for a subscription that would provide them with a years worth of knowledge and contact with the hobby is a different story. It seems some people have tunnel vision and don't care about anything except certain priorities.

There are many persons who do not fit into the above descriptive categories. It is to those subscribers that I would like to extend my thanks for their prompt attention and sincere interest in ANTIQUE RADIO CLASSIFIED.

Well let's get back to this publication. The complexities of doing this publication are many. Dealing with a large circulation dictates that everyone know exactly what to do and expect. This is a monthly publication with many tight deadlines and schedules to meet. I will do my best to give you a quality publication, but in order to do so things must go smoothly. Late ads and articles cannot be tolerated. They must be in by the 10th of the month for inclusion in the next issue to be mailed on the first of the coming month. If you wait to receive your monthly issue before sending in your next months ad, you most likely will not make the deadline. You should be sending in your ads well in advance.



I have noticed that most of the ads being received are short in order to fit the 20 word free limit. Don't forget that additional words are only 10 cents each and a few extra words added to your ad will help to get your message across. Also there is an abundance of "wanted ads", however don't be discouraged. This can work in your favor. Knowing what collectors are looking for can enable you to access that person with something he wants that you may have (or know where to get) and work out a deal or trade. I have known deals where 3 or 4 people are involved, with each person ending up with what he was looking for.

There has been many requests for separate sections of "for sale and wanted" ads. There is a very good reason for keeping them mixed. As most ads are usually "wanted" ads and most collectors are looking to buy, the normal thing is to look at only the "for sale" ads and to skip the others. This causes many ads to go unnoticed. By being forced to read all ads everyone gets maximum exposure to his ad. I am asking for your opinion on this subject, so when sending in your next ad please state your preference as to whether you want separate sections or mixed ads. Your vote will determine the format in future issues.

As stated before, the purpose of ANTIQUE RADIO CLASSIFIED is to provide a means for communications within the hobby. Besides being a classified ad format publication, many subscribers asked for articles to appear on different subjects. This is a great idea and any articles are welcomed. However, it is impossible for me to do everything. If you wish to see articles, then why not write one yourself. Don't depend on someone else. This publication is made up of information provided by you the collector. Again the emphasis is on being active and participating.

The purpose of any hobby is to add pleasure to one's personal life, as well as any other benefits that can be attained such as knowledge and possible financial gains. We are all in the same hobby and must take an active interest if the hobby is to grow. There is a wealth of equipment and knowledge to be shared by all, let's get active. You have paid for this publication and I am sure you would like to receive the most out of it. Support this publication like you were to have stock in a company, and you will receive the maximum benefit. Again the emphasis is on being active and participating.



THE COLLECTORS CORNER



The "Collectors Corner" will appear as a regular feature of Antique Radio Classified. It is an attempt to build knowledge and interest of radio collectors primarily in AC home receivers of the late 20's to the 1940's, with emphasis on the lesser known and more unusual styles and brands. Helpful restoration hints will be given where possible. Any questions, comments, or suggestions on this column, the radios featured, or on any other radios may be sent to Frank Heathcote, 1235 N. 3rd St., Logansport, Indiana 46947. This month's featured radio is the Fada model 43, a seven tube compact receiver released in February 1931 by Frank A.D. Andrea Inc. of Long Island City, New York, radio makers since 1920.

This was Fada's first attempt at a compact radio, and selling for \$84.50, it was priced \$20 higher than many of its contemporaries. It was advertised as a high quality receiver to "reach that vast public who want to pay less than \$100 for a radio and still want a good one."

The heavy gauge, well shielded chassis uses 4 variable tuning condensers. One a pre-selector to eliminate cross-over by powerful local stations, two RF stages and a detector stage using type 24 tubes. It uses a 27 in the first audio stage, and push-pull 45's in the output stage. The rectifier is an 80, well filtered by 4 solid-dielectric condensers, choke and speaker field coil.

The cabinet is of walnut veneer and the front panel of a decorative molded material similar to the "repwood" used by Crosley. The case and trim around the arch is of solid carved walnut. The cabinet's dimensions are 18" high, 15 3/4" wide, 12" deep, and weighs 38 pounds.

The schematic for the Fada model 43, chassis model KF, is found in Rider Vol. 1 on pages 1-21 in the revised edition, and Vol. 1 page 84A in the earlier book. Voltage data is given in Vol. III, page 3-2.

Very little trouble should be encountered in restoring the mechanical and electrical aspects of this set. The friction driven tuner is well designed with no pot metal being used. The power transformer is oversized, and although tucked into the front corner of the chassis, it is well vented.

In case histories of the model 43 noisy reception is caused by shorts in the primary of the interstage transformer. Intermittent reception is commonly caused by open circuiting of the by-pass condensers. All should be replaced.








Next month's receiver will be an EKCO Model A22 from Great Britain. Happy collecting! - Frank & Diana Heathcote.

"RADIOFEST '84 - A.R.C.A. CONFERENCE BIGGEST EVER"

The National Conference of the Antique Radio Club of America held in Elgin, Illinois on June 21-23 attracted collectors from across the U.S., Canada and Japan. This resulted in an attendance of over 700 people. Early birds started arriving Tuesday and by Wednesday night the swapping and selling was in full gear. Speaking of gear - seven (thats right-seven) Marconi wireless sets in the flea market, in addition to sets such as Eggert Wireless, Penn Wireless, Sub Chasers and receivers, and a few DeForest goodies. Don't forget the IP501A and all the early British, French, and German receivers, plus many battery and electric radios of all types - a collectors delight! One person sold 83 sets in three days! The 92 sellers in the flea market only wish they had brought more.

Auction time Saturday morning, 200 items to be auctioned off. Collectors managed to swoop everything up in a quick three hours. Prices varied with average sets selling below market value. Good name sets brought slightly above market value. Examples: John Firth Vocophone - \$1000, Zenith 4R - \$370, Crosley XJ - \$210, Crosley woodgrain 51 - \$105, AK-10 breadboard - \$300 and a Grebe RDRK - \$225. (Will try to get a full list of auction prices in a future issue of Antique Radio Classified.)

There are displays and then there are displays! One of the greatest was Jerry Vanacik's fabulous tube display with over 300 tubes from the period 1904 to 1920. This display was backed up by a display of English sets from 1920 - 1935 era, as provide by Frank Heathcote and others.

The contest was a fierce battle with many fine sets being entered in the eleven categories available. Space limitations prevent a complete listing, but some of the sets that won ribbons were: Marconi 101, Marconi 106, Zenith Tuner & AGN3, early Grebe CR-3, DeForest T200, Norden Hauck Super 10, Bristol model "O", Grimes Duplex, Scott World Record 10, Western Electric 4B, Hallicrafters SX-15, Marconi MSL5, Echophone 5, Atwater Kent 84, Echo-phone mechanical scanner TV, plus many others.

Over 400 people had a chance to see one of the greatest radio collections in the country. Dr. Ralph Muchow put on a real treat for those that walked thru his museum. When they left they were at a loss for words to describe his fantastic collection of radios and related items.

A banquet and awards presentation on Saturday night with over 100 people attending concluded the conference. Everyone left feeling this had been the best conference ever. Already plans are being made for next years meet in Buffalo, New York. Mark your calendar - this will be a meet not to miss! (This report provided by Joe Willis of Chicago, Illinois)
