





## COLLECTORS CORNER

The Brunswick Model II was a product of Warner Brothers Pictures Corporation. They purchased the radio, phonograph, and recording business of the Brunswick, Balke, and Collender Company in May, 1930. Brunswick, Balke, and Collender Company was a well established firm whose roots date back to 1845 when, as the Brunswick & Balke Company, they were among the first manufacturers of billiard and bowling supplies and equipment. They remain in that business today.


Brunswick's earlier radios were manufactured by RCA. In the late 20's, however, Brunswick bought the Bremer-Tully Manufacturing Company and Farrand Loudspeaker Company and manufactured their own complete sets. It was an unprofitable venture and in May, 1930 sold out to Warner Brothers. They fared no better and discontinued radio manufacturing in January of 1932. A 1933 line of Brunswicks was marketed by Brunswick Engineers Inc. of NYC. The machinery was sold in 1936 and the stock interest was sold in 1941 to Decca records.

The Model II was introduced in June, 1931 selling for \$79.50. It included two very unusual features. Most noticeable is the Brunswick "turret tuner". The tuning condenser is horizontally mounted. The rotors are mounted radially on the shaft like a three bladed propeller and the stators are mounted around the outside. The assembly is completely shielded.

Another feature is the "color tone control". Push the volume knob in and the tuning dial turns blue and treble is accentuated, pull to the middle and the dial turns gold and tone is natural, pull all the way out and the dial turns red and bass is emphasized. A rather Rube Goldberg affair accomplishes all this and it works quite well.

The Model II circuit uses seven tubes and is a superhetrodyne. 51's are used in the R.F. and I.F. stages, 24's as oscillator and 1st and 2nd detectors, a 47 output and 80 rectifier. Later in the year, the chassis was improved as the 11A. The 24 2nd

detector was replaced by a 27 which also served as A.V.C. The same chassis was also used in models 12, 16, and 33 and a similar chassis using nine tubes in models 17, 24, and 42. The Model 10, with a conventional five tube TRF chassis made by Clarion, was Brunswick's low priced offering for the 31-32 season. A two tube short wave convertor and direct current models were also available.

The Brunswick II is a fine chassis with excellent sensitivity and selectivity. It's extremely difficult to work on due to its depth and the placement of bypass capacitors. The speaker is prone to problems and doesn't seem to have held up as well as it's contemporaries. However, the unusual cabinet, mechanical design, and good performance of the Brunswick make it a worthy addition to a collection.

The next radio featured will be a 1930 Jackson Bell Model 62. I'd like to thank Alan Douglas for the historical background on the Brunswick Company.

## COLLECTOR PROFILE



In doing this "Collector Profile" the thought occurred to me that there must be a reason why I haven't lost interest in radios over the years, that there was something about radios and radio collectors that keeps me going.

Like a lot of people, I got interested when still in school, but college, the service and that first job occupied mental energy for several years. However, when I moved to Massachusetts several years ago, my mother-in-law gave me a little Philco she had, and I had to find out about how to get out that hum...then there was a set at the local church sale for \$5, and it worked...then the landlady gave me a Radiobar if I could move it...then a Philco 71, then and then...Also, like a lot of people, I collected things that I liked the looks of, and began to learn about models and manufactures and history. Eventually I became a member of the infamous "Vacuum Cleaner" organization of Eastern Mass., and my wife opened serious negotiations with me about space and financial commitment. With experience have come knowledge and refinement of my collection, which covers most of the important developments from 1917 to about WWII, the period which interests me the most. I still collect what I like, but also what is interesting for the history of this technology, such as neotroynes, superhets, good performers like Philco 111, cathedrals, depression compacts and so forth.

What I eventually discovered about radio collecting was that it offers three things: "thrills per pound"; a challenge to learn new things; the opportunity to know some very interesting people.

"Thrills per pound" is still a realizable concept in radio collecting, although some people in New York are working hard to spoil the thrills in collecting plastic radios (high prices). There are still radios out there to be found in large numbers at prices everyone can afford. As many phonograph collectors acknowledge, the thrills per pound are much less than they were, and for my money, complicated radio circuits are more interesting and can be had in a console versions like RCA 813K for peanuts. Occasionally one hits a real rarity, too.

The learning end of things took me through servicing to some physics and a lot of electricity, all of which is still going on, and into how to work with veneer, how to do plating, how to duplicate and restore finishes, how to use an engine lathe and a miller, and on and on.. The number of interesting areas that have opened up is simply amazing.

Most important is the number of good friends and contacts that have come through radios. Having been involved in other hobbies including antique cars, model railroading, trolleys and trains and others, I can say without question that the radio hobby has some of the finest and most interesting people I know in it. I have even been fortunate enough to get to know collectors in France.

Radio collecting is a most pleasant disease. I hardly ever come away from a flea market empty handed. In finding sets I have been very fortunate - a couple of good pieces of wireless gear, some rare sets, some fine superhets, an interesting group of Boston sets. More than that, it has taught me, a language teacher and a shop teacher, some new skills and opened up a lot of new ways to keep the mind alive. Most important, it has brought us new friends.




# CROSLY REVIEW

Of all the radio manufacturers, one of the most popular with collectors is the Crosley Radio Corporation. 
**MODEL X**-The Model X (ten) first appeared in the summer of 1922 and sold for \$112.50 with everything needed to operate the set. It sold extremely well for the next two years. For \$55 you could have it without the trimmings (antenna wire, tubes, phones, and "A" + "B" batteries). It used one more stage of audio frequency amplification than the Model VIII.



**MODEL XL**-The Model XL was in reality the Model XJ, but drastically rearranged to fit inside a tall cabinet. Fabric covered doors hid the receiver controls at the left, and the wooden horn resonating chamber to the right (not a speaker). Crosley merely suggested what brands of drivers to use on the small, cast metal adapter just forward of the horn. The top was hinged for tube access.



**MODEL VIII**-Crosley's Model VIII (eight) was a 3-tube receiver with one stage of tuned radio frequency amplification, detector, and one stage of audio frequency amplification. It was tuned with two wood-type book condensers and a cylinder style coil tapped seven times. In 1923 this set sold for \$99 and Powel included the works...(batteries, phones, and tubes).



**MODEL XJ**-Crosley's Model XJ was a later improvement of the Model X and appeared in 1924 at a price of \$65. Inside were the two new molded hard-rubber book condensers, four black molded tube sockets, and a flat, fixed spiderweb coil to replace the older cylinder type. All binding posts were moved inside. A phone jack and a filament control switch were added to the front panel.

# COLLECTORS VALUE GUIDE

This "Value Guide" is an attempt to establish a relative value of many of the more common radios of the 1920's. The values expressed are the result of past market trends as indicated in recent auctions, flea market sales, sales by individual collectors, as well as information provided by other established collectors in the hobby. The factors affecting a value of a radio are many. One must consider the more obvious factors, such as condition of the radio, whether it is complete with tubes, in working condition, originality, age, rarity and etc. Other factors contributing to value include collector demand, collecting specialties (such as collecting wireless items, crystal sets, etc.), and geographic area. Thus when using this guide, you must consider these multitude of factors when valuating your radio. Of course the final value in the end, is the price another person is willing to pay for an item. 




# PHOTO REVIEW



## CLASSIFIED ADS—HOW TO GET THE MOST OUT OF THEM

Just what is a Classified Ad? They are a medium of communication advertising your desires, whether it be buying, selling or trading. They are meant to provide to the advertiser a means of advertising on a low cost dollar figure verses display ads which are more costly and larger in size. The main disadvantage of the classified ad is the small physical size, which may cause readers not to see them. The problem is how to convey your message fully without the use of many words while at the same time getting the readers attention. In a hobby such as ours, with many people wanting, buying and selling the same general type of items, how can one increase the response to his classified ad.

Seeing how this publication deals mainly with the emphasis on classified ads, I thought I would present "my views" on the subject of increasing reader response to your ad. Why is it that some collectors get great response to their ads and others none at all. The answers are as varied as the types of ads placed. I have been placing and reading ads in the radio hobby publications for 17 years and like others, I have had my share of successes and failures in placing classified ads. Now that I am publishing *Antique Radio Classified*, I have to read every ad that comes my way. I can usually judge which ones have a good chance of getting a response. Just what are the reasons for the success of an ad? Perhaps it is easier to show a few examples and then to comment on ways to improve them.

For my first example, lets use an ad that is commonly seen—"Wanted: a power transformer for an Elephantine Model 695 made in 1934". In this case the seeker is being too specific in his wants. The chances of another collector having this model radio or the transformer is very slim. Then there is the problem if a person did have this transformer, would he respond to the ad. Perhaps he sees the ad but feels it just isn't worth the time and effort to respond. What is the answer? On this subject I have a very simple view—do unto others as you would like them to do to you! Getting back to the ad requesting the power transformer, I suspect the only chance the person has is to change his ad stating in general what type of transformer he needs and the estimated voltages on the windings. He will find in most cases a general replacement will work satisfactorily.

Another example would be—"Wanted: A wooden knob for a Zenith model 5S267". Here the problem is not so much of finding the knob, as these particular knobs were used on many models, and chances are someone would have a few lying around. It is a problem of finding a person willing to ship a fifty cent knob for all the time that is involved in finding it, boxing it up and shipping it. I don't have too much of an answer other than perhaps stating in his ad his urgent need for this knob and his willingness to pay extra for the shippers time and efforts. If you really need a small value item expect to pay a lot more than its actual value.

Case number three—"For Sale: A Freshman Masterpiece 5 tube TRF battery radio, \$125." Here the answer is quite obvious. The sellers views on the value of the radio is probably much more than the average collector is willing to pay for this item, in addition to this item being very common. The solution is to keep abreast on market values and price your items accordingly. In some cases a person may be selling a common radio but have many hours of time in restoration of the radio to excellent condition. Here is the case of a radio not being worth the price, but finding someone willing to pay for your labor. You will find most collectors a little hesitant to pay for a persons labor, so keep this in mind when you plan on selling a radio that has been painstakingly restored.

Another commonly seen ad is—"Wanted: A schematic for a Blooperdyne TRF battery radio." Unfortunately responses to this type of ad will be few. Here again it is the problem of finding a person willing to find the schematic, photocopy it, and mail it out. Then again I have seen in the same issue that the above ad appears, three to five other ads offering to provide schematic services. I wonder if this person will check out these sources? Chances are the person needing the schematic will think one of the sources will write him. Most likely they will not. If you need something you have to be the initiator!

How about this ad—"Wanted: WD-11 tubes, bakelite or brass base, must be good emission." As we all know these tubes are very much in demand. Here you are facing competition from many other collectors all with the same needs.


Because of the scarcity of these tubes you are not likely to get a response to your ad. To increase your chances of getting a response you are going to have to "sweeten" the deal somehow. Perhaps your offer to pay top dollar or the offer to trade items of equal value from your collection would help increase the chances of getting a response.

Here is an ad that is seen often—"For Sale: Radios, speakers, and tubes for sale, send SASE for list". Here the advertiser will get a response, but not as good as he should. He may have a truck load of rare receivers and tubes for sale, but unless he conveys this message in his ad, he will lose many potential buyers. The point is to give the reader some idea of what you have for sale, maybe a few examples with prices, and a fairly neglected point—your phone number. There are many buyers out there, its just a matter of conveying your message correctly. An important point is to fairly grade your items for sale and not overstate the condition of them. This will surely create dissatisfied buyers and lead to a bad reputation. (While on this subject of fair dealings, it is the policy of Antique Radio Classified to be let known of any unfair dealings you may have had through transactions with others as a result of ads in this publication. Too many complaints received will lead to the cancellation of the A.R.C. subscription.)

To sum up our findings, we can find many reasons for low response to some classified ads. These may include ads that are written poorly not fully conveying the persons message, looking for items that may not exist in large quantities or hard to find items, and trying to sell items that are not realistically priced or which there is no demand for. Other reasons may include advertising items for sale or wanted that are not easily shipped. If you are looking for console radios don't expect too many people willing to ship these large items across the country. One must also consider running ads that are unrealistic in nature, whether it be a wanted or for sale ad. You should not get the idea that certain types of ads are to be avoided. Who knows—you may just find that person or item you are looking for. After all, it doesn't hurt to try.

The above examples are meant to help you think of new ways to increase your responses from the classified ads, not to reflect on a particular person or ad. Remember Classified Ads are a means to communicate your wants or items for sale, to other people with the same general interest. With a well thought out ad you can be assured of getting a better response from your ad. Good luck in your collecting interest—Gary B. Schneider.


