Extra! *Antique Radio Classified* finally has an index! Frank R. White spent many hours developing a complete index to photos and articles which appeared in A.R.C. from the first issue in June 1984 to December 1987's issue. In addition, references to company names and important persons in radio history are also indexed. The index fulfills a need of A.R.C. readers who have often requested an index in letters and on their renewal coupons.

As the index is too long to be included in a single issue (it runs 20 pages), it is serialized to appear in this and the next three issues. The first six pages and the front cover are included in this issue. Hopefully, this is the only issue where we run short of pages; the index and the large number of ads allowed for only a few articles.

For those who cannot wait or who would like a separate bound index in a cover like the monthly A.R.C.'s, it will sell for \$4.00 postpaid in the U.S. and Canada, \$5.00 to other countries.

Now A.R.C. also offers out-of-print back issues in photocopy form, for \$2.00 each. Unfortunately, early issue artwork is no longer available for reprinting purposes. All You Need To Know About Repairing AC Radios - Part 1

This is the first part of a series on basic AC radio repair. Jim Fred has been involved in radio for over fifty years, and in this series will have useful hints for both the new collector and the veteran. Antique Radio Classified is pleased to have Jim contribute this series. (Editor)

Hi! I'm Jim Fred. I first became interested in radio in 1931. In 1935, I graduated from the high school in Mishawaka, Indiana. My major was Vocational Electric and Radio Shop. I had already started a part-time radio repair shop in the basement of my parents' home.

After working nearly two years in a furniture factory, I had saved enough money for an automobile and had enough left to rent a small store building on the edge of the Mishawaka business district. This is where I established my first radio repair shop. Since this was near the end of the 1930's, I couldn't charge a lot to repair a radio. I can remember repairing radios for 50¢ for labor plus retail price for parts. In the middle 1930's, you could buy an Arvin AC-DC radio for as little as \$6.95.

During WWII I was employed by the War Department as a radio instructor and as an Air Corps and Signal Corps electronic materials inspector. After WWII ended, I spent 8 1/2 years as a design engineer in a small "Private Brand" radio factory, in Kokomo, Ind. Following that job I was a test equipment design engineer in a guided missile plant. My next job lasted 25 1/2 years as a product and reliability engineer in the Resistor Division of the P.R. Mallory and Company in Frankfort, Ind. Part-time jobs included being an adult vocational education electronics teacher, and for two different periods of time I was a transmitter engineer for two different broadcast stations.

Another part-time endeavor was writing "how to" magazine articles for electronic and mechanical magazines. I've been published in *Popular Electronics*, *Radio News*, *Popular Mechanics*, *Science and Mechanics*, *Elementary Electronics* and others. I wrote a series titled "Antique Radio Corner," for 7 1/2 years, which was published in *Elementary Electronics* magazine. I've also been published in collector club magazines provided by ADCA, AWA, IHRS, and CARS. I also published the first collector newsletter titled "Antique Radio Topics." Later I published the "Add-A-Page" catalog and the *Antique Radio Collectors Newsletter*.

Now through the pages of *Antique Radio Classified*, I am going to take you step by step through

the basics of AC operated radio set repairs. To get you started, here is Part One.

BEFORE YOU START

Before starting to repair radios, there are certain things to do. As much as possible, I will write in a nontechnical manner, but where it is necessary I will present some basic electronic theory. First, you must have a place to repair radios, some basic hand tools, some simple test instruments, a source for service literature for the radios you collect, and a place to get parts and radio tubes for the set you want to fix. Most important of all, you must first find a radio to repair.

YOU NEED

A place to repair radios
Basic hand tools
Simple test instruments
Source for service literature
Source for parts & tubes
A radio to fix

WHERE TO LOOK FOR RADIOS

Before we go much further, I am going to suggest some places to look for radios. You can go to auction sales, yard sales, tag sales, and flea markets, as well as read newspaper ads and listen to radio want ads. There are literally hundreds of places to find radios.

I want to emphasize again that this column will be for the beginning collector. However, sometimes there will be material that will be interesting to older and more experienced collectors. Collectors come in many sizes, ages, educational and occupational levels. I hear from collectors who are from 14 to 84 years old. I know collectors who are doctors, college professors, lawyers, engineers, and laborers. Many are still employed while many are retired. Most have had no previous experience repairing radios. As yet I haven't met many women radio collectors. I think as time goes by women will become more active in radio collecting, just as they are in art, furniture, and glass collecting.

WORK AREA AND TOOLS

We will now assume that you have found a radio and want to make it play. If you don't have a collector friend or know an old-time radio repairman, read on. However, you cannot rush over to

the nearest wall outlet and plug it in without some knowledge. You should have a table or work bench on which to place the radio; it should also hold your volt-ohm-meter, a soldering iron, three pairs of pliers (i.e. a pair of long nose, a pair of side cutters and a pair of slip jaw pliers), several sizes of screwdrivers, and several AC receptacles. These are the basic tools without which you cannot expect to repair a radio.

A word about volt-ohm-meters. We are trying to keep this simple, but it is necessary that you know a few basic points of theory. A volt is a unit of electrical pressure. An ohm is a unit of resistance. A resistor slows down or impedes the flow of electricity. In other words if we have too much voltage at one point in a circuit, we can insert a resistor and measure a lower voltage at the other end of the resistor.

VOLT-OHM METERS

VOMs come in two different forms, analog and digital. The analog type has a calibrated scale with a moving pointer to indicate a value; the digital type reads out in numbers. The digital meter is the darling of high tech electronics, but since we are into low tech radio, it makes more sense to use the same type motor as was used when the radio was made. I recommend the analog VOM for the beginner. A VOM with a sensitivity of 20,000 ohms per volt is best for radio troubleshooting. A good meter can be found at a Radio Shack store for less than \$30.00. Before you use the meter, read the manufacturer's literature. While you are at Radio Shack, you can probably get the tools you need and a soldering iron. Yes! I did say soldering iron, not a soldering gun. Also get some 60-40 rosin core solder about 1/16 inch in diameter. Never use acid core solder or solder past on a radio. A radio can be destroyed by acid core solder.

DON'T PLUG IT IN!

LINE CORDS

Don't plug the radio in until you inspect the line cord and plug. This is to protect your house wiring as well as your radio. In fact, it would be a good idea to buy a "power strip" with four receptacles, an on-off switch and a circuit breaker, to protect your house wiring. If the line cord is bad, it must be replaced before proceeding. The early




Figure 1. Typical resistance line cord.

1930s' radios had a two conductor line cord with a silk fabric covering. When AC-DC radios were introduced, many had a resistance line cord as shown in Figure 1. The resistance wire was made by winding resistance wire on an asbestos core, insulating it with a wrap of asbestos yarn, laying it alongside the two current carrying conductors and enclosing it all in a silk fabric covering. You can identify the resistance line cord because it has more than two conductors, and it will have a larger diameter than a regular line cord. The line cords haven't held up well over the last 50 years, and since no new ones have been made for over 30 years, this may be one of the most serious problems you may have. Resistance cords were only used for a couple of years because engineers soon saw that they weren't practical. The next line cords are like the present ones, two conductor insulated with either rubber or vinyl. In a later column I will discuss all the optional ways to replace a resistance line cord.




Figure 2. Circuit to check tube filament continuity.

TESTING THE TUBES


The next step is to determine whether or not the tubes are good. Try to find an old tube manual, one printed before 1950 will be best. You can use your ohmmeter to check the continuity of the tube filaments as shown in Figure 2. This is the only test you can make without a tube tester. The tube manual will identify the filament pins. Set the VOM on the "X 1" (times one) scale. If the filament is good, the meter will read a low resistance. If the needle does not move, the filament is open; just throw the tube away. If the tube filaments are good, the tube will probably at least work poorly. This is the time to find an old radio-TV repairman who has a tube tester which will test the old tubes more completely. Before you go any farther, be sure that the radio has a set of good tubes.

I know that this is a bad place to stop, but I've run out of space for this time. I can only recommend that you spend the time between now and the next column in finding more radios, planning your work area, making a workbench, and getting your tools and VOM.





WITH THE COLLECTORS

GRADING SYSTEM FOR ANTIQUE RADIOS

One of the issues that keeps nagging us at major auctions is the lack of a widely adopted grading system for antique radios and speakers. Often when auction prices and grades of equipment are published, the grades are not defined. Another concern is the existence of replica parts in the trading of high quality equipment. Even with the most ethical of intentions, this information can slip from recollection after a few trades. In the spring 1984 issue of *The Antique Radio Gazette*, Andrew Mooradian describes a simple grading scheme. The following issue contains another scheme proposed by Richard Jehlik. Although Jehlik's system is much more thorough than the other one, it is somewhat difficult to learn and use.

Yet another scheme is proposed here. It does not claim to be the best one ever proposed. I offer it rather in the spirit that our hobby would benefit greatly by adopting a grading system. Hopefully, if we keep the issue alive, a grading system will

come into common usage. Jonathan Hill mentioned in one of his talks at the AWA Canandaigua meet in 1986 that values of British sets are much more sensitive to set condition than are they in North America. Our situation does seem undesirable.

This grading scheme assumes that some detail is necessary to describe the levels although, for convenience in common use, the utmost simplicity is desirable in describing a set. For example, a plastic radio just a bit short of mint in appearance and, with new filter capacitors installed, would be described as "cabinet 4, chassis 2," or else just as condition 4-2. A separate classification for speakers was considered, but for simplicity the cabinet grades for the appropriate material are used as the guide.

The ideas of many collectors, especially Ron McNeill in Yorkton, helped with this grading concept. I take the blame for its deficiencies. I hope this grading system will help our hobby a little.
