





MUCHOW AUCTION

Muchow Collection Memories


The June 2000 issue of A. R. C. paid tribute to Dr. Ralph Muchow in a "Collector Profile" written by his son Steven at our request. Now that the Muchow collection is slated for auction in August, Steve has graciously consented to add more memories of the evolution of the collection and some thoughts about the upcoming auction, certainly a major event for collectors. (Editor)

It has been a little over a year since the passing of my father, Dr. Ralph Muchow of Elgin, Illinois. An avid collector and historian, "Doc" Muchow assembled what many consider to be one of the finest private collections of radios in the world. Radios from this collection will be auctioned on August 3, 4, and 5, 2001, in conjunction with the annual Antique Radio Club of Illinois (ARCI) "Radiofest" to be held in Elgin, Illinois. *Antique Radio Classified* asked me to share some personal thoughts about my dad, the radio collection, and the upcoming auction.

A COOPERATIVE EFFORT

Clearly, this collection was a result of my dad's passion to preserve radio history. However, he also understood that it could only have been realized with the enthusiastic assistance of family and friends. He welcomed those who wanted to become involved, and those that did participate enjoyed it tremendously — despite sore backs from carrying consoles up flights of stairs!

I can't begin to estimate the number of wooden shelf units we assembled during the past 30

years! He was fastidious, and only an item that he felt was "museum quality" would find its way to a shelf for display. This often meant many hours of restoration (mechanical and electrical) before the piece would earn his approval. Often my brother Dave was enlisted to help with cabinet restoration, while I nursed the radio chassis back to good health. As a result of this attention to detail, the items on display are truly fine specimens and worthy of any museum environment.

Many sets in the collection are considered quite rare and, indeed, some are one of a kind. Several fine pieces from the collection are pictured in this article.

PREPARING FOR RADIO MEETS

Doc truly wanted to share his enthusiasm, and those completing a tour of this incredible collection would walk away with a new appreciation of wireless and radio history. As I think back over the past three decades, I can remember him preparing for radio meets where he would enter radios in contests, and often assemble the accompanying display documentation in the hotel room the night before the event.

His radios often won 1st Place and "Best of Show," and there were colorful ribbons and awards that he brought home and proudly displayed. Many of these same radios will be available in the August auction. He developed numerous friendships at these meets and, although I had not met these collectors, I felt that I knew them through his stories. I remember the smile on my dad's face when he walked in the

door with a new "treasure," and we always looked forward to the story that accompanied the acquisition.

I think of the many ARCI Radiofests when the "radio museum" was opened one full day for visitors. Somehow, even with little existing space, we managed to add a new radio display to the collection each year for that event. Without fail, the weekend prior to Radiofest would find the

entire family (including the children) dusting the rooms, building display signs, and ensuring that all hands-on displays were working properly.

EARLY WIRELESS SETS

To me, one of the most impressive parts of the collection is the number and variety of early wireless sets and related accessories. This can only be appreciated by the view of floor-to-ceiling radios one encounters when entering the "wireless room." Many visiting collectors claim this to be their favorite room as they find themselves surrounded by sets representing the true roots of radio.

Names from the radio history books like Marconi, Kennedy, Western Electric, Grebe, Leutz,

Atwater Kent and others "come alive" in this room. Many of these sets won ribbons and awards in contests at the numerous radio meets Doc attended over the years. Some of his favorite pieces were those manufactured by the Thomas E. Clark Wireless Telegraph & Telephone Company based in Detroit, Michigan, in the 1900s.

Auction Progress

Time is flying by as we approach the August dates for the Ralph W. Muchow estate auction. We have journeyed to the museum several times in preparation for the actual moving of all the items to the auction site at the Hemmens Convention Center in Elgin, Illinois. Among the logistical problems are the many large ornate consoles to transfer. We hope to have these beautiful radios lined up at the outer perimeter of the auction ring to afford the best possible viewing.

We have requested 100 tables to be used to display the other types of radios and related items. All the display units, cabinets, and shelving used in the museum will be used for the same purpose at the auction. As the items are removed and the display unit becomes empty, it too will then be sold.

For the Friday auction on August 3rd, Bob Dobush will test the tubes so that before you bid on any tube or lot of tubes, you will know their condition. Hopefully,

this will help the buyers and eliminate any confusion.

We have received the Hemmens Center's permission to hang as many of the advertising pieces as possible. There are some large tapestry-type dealer showroom pieces, and we hope to have these arranged for easy viewing. We will set up as much of the display advertising we can, as well as light up the neon signs and any other electrified advertising.

The actual moving will begin on July 27 and will continue each day until completion. Prior to the moving, we will spend several days wrapping and tagging items. Response to our ads in A.R.C. is nothing short of outstanding.

Dave and Steve Muchow have provided us with the history and data on many of the items. When possible, we will try to pass this information along to the buyer.

Trying to find any early wireless equipment once used in the Midwest is a challenge, and he felt that Clark items truly represented early radio from that region. Clark started building wireless sets in 1901 and outfitted several Great Lakes passenger boats in the early 1900s. He is considered a true wireless pioneer, and several of his company's pieces are on display in the collection.

Another unusual item is the 1906 Wireless Telephone designed by A. Frederick Collins. Collins was an inventor who also authored many books and articles on wireless topics. This wireless telephone uses an induction coil and is a product of his Collins Wireless Telephone Company. Also available in the auction will be a rare hardbound book containing a complete set of informative *Collins Wireless Bulletins* for the year 1909.

ATWATER KENT A FAVORITE

Doc was especially fond of Atwater Kent radios and related advertising materials. One of the unique Atwater Kent sets is a Model 90 chassis built into a decorative water fountain manufactured by the Electric Radio Clock Fountain Co. of Irvington, New Jersey. Most likely, this custom 1932 piece was intended to be placed in a hotel foyer, or perhaps it was owned by a wealthy entertainer.

I remember the excitement when he first brought this set home. There was anxiety about getting it to work, and it was also clear that we were in for some restoration work. The vintage rubber tubing carrying water to the fountain section was brittle, and so had to be immediately replaced. After a bit of lubrication, the

water pump started rotating and soon water was shooting high into the air. The radio required only minor attention, and new green foliage was placed around the water basin.

The real story here is that this restoration took place in our family kitchen with parts spread all over the counter for over a week! I'll never understand how my mother was able to work around this pile of "stuff" and keep her composure for that length of time. She was very understanding, and this fact (perhaps more than is realized) contributed to my dad's ongoing commitment to preserving radio history through his collection.

E.H. SCOTT AND OTHER COLLECTIBLES

Another room in the collection that is a favorite is the "Scott Room." This room features striking wooden consoles, each containing a classic E.H. Scott chrome chassis. Not only is it fun to tune in stations using a "magic eye" tube, but the sound quality is far and above what you will hear on today's modern AM receivers. Operating these receivers is a real treat!


Often overlooked amidst the radios are the many advertising and accessory items that are, by themselves, very collectible. These include

items such as the Majestic Eagle, hanging banners, radio lamps, neon radio service signs and even a workbench from the Atwater Kent Manufacturing Co.! Visitors claim that it is these "extra" items that enhance and set this collection apart from others containing only radios.

PERSPECTIVE ON THE AUCTION

We are now focusing on the auction in August and trying to put it all into perspective. Suddenly





NFWA-ARCA Meet Memories — 1985

Over the years, the late Ralph "Doc" Muchow was a "presence" at many, many meets. The interest excited by the upcoming auction of his extensive collection prompted me to look through old photos of meets past that I knew he must have attended. I struck gold with three rolls of film taken at the Antique Radio Club of America and Niagara Frontier Wireless Association (ARCA, NFWA) meet at Grand Island, New York, in 1985. This was before ARCA merged with AWA, and — though it's hard to remember such a time — even before I took over publication of *Antique Radio Classified*.

This meet ran from Wednesday to Saturday, June 5-8, 1985, and though not as large as today's Rochester meet, it drew several hundred people. One of the highlights was a major exhibit by the NFWA, the host club, mounted at a bank in Buffalo, New York. Among the items displayed, many in glass cases, was an almost complete collection of sets made by the Federal Company, a local manufacturer from the Buffalo area. Outstanding wireless items were also on display.

THE MUCHOW ENTRIES

When it came to contest items, as usual, Dr. Muchow was prominent. His Atwater Kent display shown on the following page revealed how far he would go in pursuit of perfection and of a completely rounded picture. In fact, the story is that Dr. Muchow won so many contests that another contest category was established — the "museum category" — so that others might have a chance at the regular contest.

Dr. Muchow had at least two other items on display at this meet. One was the World War I Cohen Signal Corps crystal set; the other, a marble Lenzola horn speaker. These sets and the Atwater Kent display are indicative of the quality of the Muchow collection. It will be interesting to see if they are still part of the collection.

MORE MEMORIES

A more personal memory was provoked by the photos of the late Paul Giganti and the late Charlie Byrnes, both well-known collectors. In fact, I was pleased to meet Paul in person for the first time at this meet, though over the years, I had purchased many sets from him.

Both Paul and Charlie were from California, and I offered to show them one of the sights of the region — Niagara Falls. My own photo at the Falls attests to the passage of 16 years —

note the beard before it turned gray, now gone altogether.

Many other folks who still frequent meets were caught in these photos. Examples are Marcia and Jerry Simkin and Ed Taylor pictured at the flea market. In photos not shown here, Jim Kreuzer, Jim Troe, and others familiar to meet aficionados appear in scenes of heated discussion or serious viewing.

In all, my cache of photos is just one small way of tracing the pervasive influence of Dr. Muchow on the radio events of the past 25 years. Viewing his collection for the last time will be a stroll down "memory lane" for many in the antique radio community.

An Early Telephone-Dial Remote Control

Home-brew radios and unknown devices are part of the fun of radio collecting. The "whatzit" described in this article was found by Wally Worth during his early days of radio collecting. Recently, Wally took a second look at this unusual item and shares the results with us. (Editor)

Quite a few years ago I acquired the odd looking instrument shown in Figure 1. At first, I thought it was some kind of telephone. The person I got it from thought it was a telephone because of the telephone dial on the slanted front of the cabinet.

However, I decided that it was radio-related because at the center of the dial, in the area normally reserved for the telephone number, there is a list of call letters for eight radio stations. Table I provides a list of these stations. The two push buttons at the left of the dial are marked "ON" and "OFF," and those on the right are marked "SOFT" and "LOUD" — another clue that this thing might be some kind of radio.

I decided to open the cabinet and see what was inside. At the time, I was new to radio collecting, but when I spotted two Type 199 tubes, fixed condensers, coils and spaces for batteries, I was certain that my mysterious box was some form of radio.

A SECOND LOOK

Recently, I decided to have another look at my odd-looking instrument. It is housed in a cabinet made of mahogany with a dark walnut finish. The cabinet measures 8½" wide x 9½" deep x 5½"




Figure 2. The underside of the sloping front of the cabinet shows the mounting arrangement for the push buttons and the contacts for the telephone dial.

high. This home-brew device is self-contained without any connectors or wires coming from the cabinet. Figure 2 shows an underside view of the front panel with the four push buttons and the four terminals for the telephone dial.




Figure 3. This interior view shows the main chassis at the top and the B battery compartment at the bottom, which includes the leaf springs and dial contacts.

Electrical contact between the front panel and the main chassis is made by the four spring contacts shown at the bottom center of Figure 3.

The tubes and component layout can be seen in the top half of Figure 3. The two cylindrical forms at the upper left are fiber tubes used as D-cell holders.




Figure 4. Another interior view shows the loop antenna that is wound around the cabinet interior.

Space is provided for B batteries. Wires leading to the space are marked "48 volts." The leaf-type, push-button switches are located on each side of the spring contacts for the telephone dial. Figure 4 provides another interior view, including the loop antenna wound around the interior of the cabinet.

CONSTRUCTION

While the unit seems to be a home brew, its quality of workmanship is high. The wiring is laced, and the components are neatly arranged. The four spring contacts are riveted to a Bakelite strip that is mounted on two Bakelite arms. This arrangement allows the assembly to swing up for access to the B battery compartment. The cabinet is of excellent construction with carefully joined corners and a good finish.

IDENTIFICATION

The questions that came to mind were, "What is it?" and "How old is it?" The use of the 199 tubes and the leaf-spring

switches indicated the 1920s. But why did the telephone dial carry more recent call letters, such as WNBC and WCBS? Obviously, it is not a receiver since it does not contain a speaker or headphone jack. A telephone dial usually actuates relays, but there are no relays in the unit. What is the function of the loop antenna if not to receive?

Then the answer hit me. This home brew is a transmitter, not a receiver. I remembered the Philco remote control that uses a simple pulsed transmitter with a telephone type dial. It uses a single Type 30 tube and is battery-operated. My unit is probably a home-brew version of a wireless remote control. But the mystery is not fully solved. What radio did it actuate? Was it an engineering model or prototype?

WITH THE COLLECTORS

A Horse Radio Tale

Even if it takes a few years and many miles, the fun of a radio chase is irresistible, especially when it results in trophies like a horse and a moose. Ray Windrix tells an enjoyable radio-hunt story. (Editor)

The story I'm about to tell is a true one. A couple of years ago, on a trip to South Dakota, I passed through Kansas. The plan was to check junk and antique stores along the way for radios. I have a brochure that tells me where the antique and junk stores are, and I consulted it when I stopped in a small town.

I had parked in front of a dry cleaner store next to a junk store on a corner. It turned out that the junk store had nothing, but the dry cleaner was operated by a "radio nut," as most of us are. Radios were everywhere — stacked throughout the place!

Most of the sets were pretty ordinary. However, there was a nice 1920s, 6-tube TRF Radiodyne WC-11B made in Racine, Wisconsin. It was complete with tubes, a headset, and a Trimm horn speaker. The cabinet also had a built-in




The horse radio with removable saddle found in Kansas. The manufacturer is unknown.

section at the bottom for the batteries. The price was a little too steep for me, so I passed on it.

Radiodyne Model WC-11B

The Western Coil & Electrical Company's Radiodyne Model WC-11B is a 6-tube battery set with some unusual features and history. It shares its name with the Atwater Kent Radiodyne. Because Western Coil had registered the Radiodyne name one day earlier than Atwater Kent, Western Coil's claim to its trademarked name prevailed. Also, Western Coil was able to show prior use, and Atwater Kent discontinued the use of the name.

The Radiodyne Model WC-11B illustrated at right is from your editor's collection. From the front panel view, the WC-11B looks similar to many other 5- and 6-tube "3-dialers" that used 01-A tubes. But, a look at the interior view shows that it is different. There are additional operating controls "under the hood" — a filament rheostat, an

antenna coupler, and a wavelength adjustment.

Although the panel is engraved "WC-11", on the set's station log, "WC-11B" and the serial number are handwritten. Western Coil also offered the WC-11 in a console model.

Ben Horner, the owner of the dry cleaner store, told me he had hundreds of radios at home. He was especially proud of a horse radio with a wooden base, but he didn't know who made it.

A year later, I took the same trip. The Radio-dyne, horn, etc., was still there. I offered a lower price, which was a little more fair, and bought it. [It happens that your editor has this set in his collection. See the related box.]

The subject of the horse radio with the wooden base came up again. I wasn't interested as I have a Globe horse radio with a wooden base and figured that this one was probably a Globe too. The subject of "hundreds of radios" also surfaced again. Since I was on my way to South Dakota again and returned a different way, I didn't check out the story.

THE HORSE RADIO — FIRST TRY

Several months later — July of 2000 — I discussed this experience with my friend Bob Slagle, another radio collector. We decided that it might be worth the 500-mile trip to Kansas. So, we headed out, expecting to find all manner of exciting stuff.

We arrived and visited the dry cleaning shop again. Ben Horner and his wife, Jean, our hosts, invited us to their home. There, we failed to find "hundreds of radios," as I suspect that Ben had gradually sold off his collection over the years. However, in the living room was the horse radio, shown in Figure 1. It was in excellent condition, and it was not the one made by Globe. In fact, it had a removable saddle like those of the Abbotwares sets and was far nicer than the Globe horse.

I was waiting for Bob to make an offer, and I guess he was waiting for me to do the same. The result was that neither of us did. We left without buying anything — a bit disappointed to say the least.

THE HORSE RADIO — SECOND TRY

After we had returned home, it occurred to me that the Horners probably would sell the horse sometime, so I wrote them a letter. I asked, if they should ever decide to sell the horse, to please let me know. I made a fair quality offer, including shipping, as I didn't want to drive the 1,000 miles round trip again.

About a month or so later, I acquired this beautiful set after all. It turned out that the Horner's son drives big freight trucks and would be delivering about four blocks from my house. After my excitement had died down a bit, I went straight over to my buddy Bob's place to tell him the story. The horse radio was up and running following the replacement of a few capacitors.

However, I have taken it out of the chassis, and I can find absolutely no markings inside or out as to who made it. As mentioned earlier, it has a removable saddle, as well as the same knobs as many of the Abbotwares horse sets do. The difference is in the wood base, though I suppose it could still be an Abbotwares. The

tuning condenser is the only part that is marked, "King Electronics — Brooklyn."

This is a cheap AC/DC set. It has five 7-pin miniature tubes: 12BE6, 12BA6, 12AT6, 50B5, and 35W4. My gut feeling is that it dates from the early 1950s and might have been made by Guild who turned out a lot of nice, mediocre novelty sets.

Needless to say, I will always check in with the Horners when I pass through their town — whether they have radios or not. They are now my friends. And I make sure the horse gets plenty of oats and hay. Does anyone know the manufacturer and year of this radio?



AUCTION & MEET REPORTS

Central Ohio Antique Radio Association Cabin Fever Swap Meet Columbus, Ohio — January 27, 2001

Saturday, January 27, 2001, was the date, and 7:00 A.M. to 11:30 A.M. was the time for the annual Central Ohio Antique Radio Association (COARA) Cabin Fever swap meet. This year the event took place again at DeVry Technical Institute in Columbus, Ohio, after a single meet in January 2000 at Reynoldsburg's IBEW Hall due to construction at DeVry.

The old DeVry venue has changed a great deal and is much cozier than it used to be. Tables were somewhat smaller than in the past and the rental price reflected the change. The cost was lowered by five dollars for both dealers and members.

About 30 dealers accounted for the 41 tables rented. The crowd was a little smaller than usual, presumably due to terrible winter weather and a nasty flu bug that had been making itself felt in the Midwest. The weather we have experienced this winter has proved that "Cabin Fever" is certainly an appropriate name. The night before the meet brought an ugly mix of precipitation complete with ice covered roads and sidewalks.

The level of enthusiasm of the participants who braved the winter slop, however, was not dampened in the least. Many fine deals were struck and all participants had a good time. Several very fine radios found new homes, including one that this author moved too slowly on — a National NC-140. Several people new to our peculiar passion found radios at prices any seasoned collector would envy.

Most noticeable was the steady stream of DeVry students, some of whom were visibly

stunned that people still wanted these ancient relics (the radios, not the collectors), and some of whom were genuinely interested in our "hol-low-state" technology. Outreach to potential new collectors and enthusiasts should always be one of the goals of any club, and the indoor DeVry meets help COARA spread the word.

A word of thanks to DeVry is in order. They have been more than generous to our club and have a genuine interest in helping to maintain interest in and preserving our technological heritage.

COARA did not hold an auction this year simply because the silent auctions we have held in the past garnered only lukewarm response. The flea market prices listed below were reported by dealers.



So. Calif. Antique Radio Society Auction Van Nuys, California — February 17, 2001

Fortunately, the Southern California Antique Radio Society (SCARS) auction on February 17, 2001, again just missed the beginning of this year's major rains, allowing an unfettered start to the activities. Forty sellers consigned a total of 310 lots for the auction. These lots included a wide variety of equipment, with many items of exceptional quality. The auction room was filled to capacity with 102 bidders. David Spear, a professional auctioneer in his second year with us, kept things moving throughout the day aided by many SCARS volunteers.

The auction continued for about five hours without a break, but catering services rendered some nourishment when needed. The top dollar item was an Atwater Kent Model 10C breadboard (#4700), with tubes, selling for \$825.

New owners claimed 291 lots, while 15 were buy-backs, and 4 lots failed to realize a bid. This year, the combined no-sale and buy-backs represented only 6 percent of the total lots, less than the average in previous auctions. Buy-

backs and lots selling for less than \$20 are excluded from the auction results. All items are rounded up to the nearest dollar. Total sales, not including buy-backs, amounted to \$20,938. The comparable figure for 2000 was \$22,743 for 293 lots.

Tube Testers and Classic Electronic Test Gear By Alan Douglas

The title says it all. Tube testers are the major topic of Alan Douglas' new book. But, he covers other types of test equipment as well. The book contains a total of 166 pages, and Part I, with just over 100 pages, is devoted to tube testers. Other test equipment is covered in Parts II and III.

Douglas makes a convincing case for acquiring old vacuum tube test equipment, either from a pure collecting standpoint or on the basis of its utility. With the advent of smaller and lighter solid-state test equipment, commercial users of test equipment disposed of their vacuum tube equipment. And as a visit to a Ham or old-radio flea market will attest, there is a lot of good functional test equipment for sale at reasonable prices. If you are a test equipment freak — and I confess that I am a member of that tribe — you may want to preserve some of these classic items just as you would an old radio.

PART I — TUBE TESTERS

The stated purpose of Alan's book is "to give an overview of the [test equipment] field." He does that and more in his coverage of tube testers. As in his *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's* series, he utilizes illustrations and advertisements taken from old radio publications to portray the history of tube testers.

To this historical coverage he has added useful information about tube tester basics. He describes the differences between emission type testers and mutual-conductance models. He also offers some helpful hints regarding the purchase of a tube tester that can be useful, especially to the first-time buyer.

The section dealing with the Hickok circuit and calibration should be of interest to the technically inclined reader, but may be challenging to the less experienced technician. The same is true of the coverage of curve tracers — instruments used to display the operating characteristics of vacuum tubes. The point is that this part of the book is more than just a tube tester primer.

Thirty manufacturers of tube testers are included. Some will be familiar, such as B&K, EICO, Heathkit, Hickok and Supreme. Others, with less than household names, include AVO, an English manufacturer; Bettorf & Funke, makers of a German military model; and the Anko Manufacturing Co. of Milwaukee



that produced the "Teletest" model in 1952. The Teletest used 30-plus tube sockets to test TV tubes, including picture tubes, and thus did not require a tube chart or switches.

Early tube testers from Hoyt, Jewel and Sterling are covered. A.R.C. readers may recall that the Hoyt Electrical Instrument Works was the subject of an article in the July 1997 issue. Jewel and Sterling are well known names from the early days of radio. In addition to the commercial tube testers, Douglas provides excellent coverage of testers built for the military.

The complexity level of the described tube testers runs from the low-end filament testers through the low-cost emission testers and up to the multi-featured mutual-conductance testers.

No matter what your degree of technical skill may be, you will find something of interest in this part of the book. Likewise, readers contemplating the purchase of a tube tester will find useful guidance and advice.

PART II — COMPONENT MEASUREMENT

Part II covers those instruments used for testing components and circuits: Volt-Ohmmeters (VOMs), Vacuum tube voltmeters (VTVMs), Q-meters, grid-dip meters and bridges.

VOMs have been around for a long time, but the model that usually springs to mind when we think of VOMs is the famous Simpson 260. The history of its maker, Simpson Electric, is covered nicely. Representative VOMs from other manufacturers are illustrated.

As part of the VOM section, Alan covers a few of the once-popular set analyzers. While these analyzers are of historical interest, they have little practical value today. In a historical vein, he describes the origins of the D'Arsonval meter and supplements it with some early drawings and photographs.

Alan relates some of the VTVM's history and notes that John F. Rider is to be credited with producing the first "modern" VTVM, the "Voltohmyst." After Rider sold his test equipment line to RCA, the voltohmyst was heavily marketed by RCA. There were many knock-offs based on the Rider/RCA design including the popular Heathkit versions.

Ballantine, Hewlett-Packard and General Radio laboratory-quality VTVMs are included in the book.

Q-meters are laboratory instruments used mainly for design and development work, and not commonly used as radio service instruments. But their history and that of the Boonton Radio Corporation make good reading. Alan's book includes some interesting photographs of the Boonton operation, circa 1935. A picture of the more affordable Heathkit QM-1 Q-meter is shown in the book.

Like Q-meters, grid-dip meters are not commonly used in radio servicing, but find greater use in the Ham Radio field. Douglas describes a number of GDMs including the much sought after Milien version. It might have been helpful to the uninitiated if Alan had explained the GDM's principle of operation. However, the reproduced advertisement for the Heathkit "dipper" does list some uses for the instrument.

The book covers a host of capacitance and inductance bridges, many of them of laboratory quality. For the typical radio collector, the capacitance bridge is probably of the greatest interest. Just about every manufacturer of capacitors also produced capacitor testers that used the bridge-circuit principle. But the Sprague "Tel-Ohmike" models seem to be the most versatile. These Sprague testers utilize both a tuning eye tube and an analog meter. Alan describes these models along with others.

This section of the book also provides practical information regarding the measurement of capacitor leakage and the reforming of electrolytic capacitors. Also mentioned is the equivalent series resistance (ESR) test to determine the condition of electrolytic capacitors. This test method was described in greater detail by Alan in the May 1998 issue of A.R.C.

For the hard core test equipment junkies, there are photographs and descriptions of several laboratory grade bridges.

Substitution boxes are also included in this section. Although these handy devices are not truly measuring devices, they are certainly worthy of mention.

PART III —SIGNAL MEASUREMENT

Part III covers signal generators, signal tracers and oscilloscopes. Along with VOMs and tube testers, these test instruments are the work horses of radio servicing.

Vacuum tube type, radio frequency, signal generators came on the scene in the early 1920s. For example, RCA A Victor Service Notes from that period include a schematic diagram for constructing a modulated oscillator capable of covering the broadcast band. A Radio Marine Corporation of America unit, circa 1929, is shown in Alan's book.

A short tutorial and history of RF signal generators appears at the start of this section and is followed by several pages of illustrations. The RF signal generators included in Part III extend from bare bones units to some elegant models made by Hewlett Packard, General Radio and other manufacturers. Good coverage of military units is included with special attention to the URM-25.

Douglas notes that while most RF signal generators also provide an audio signal in some form, dedicated AF signal generators provide a number of features that are indispensable for audio work. He also describes how Hewlett Packard outgunned General Radio with its R-C type audio signal gener-

ators. In addition, the book touches briefly on RF and AF sweep generators.

The merits of signal injection versus signal tracing for radio troubleshooting have been debated over the years. Alan expresses the belief that signal generators won the battle. In any event, a signal tracer is still a handy instrument to have on the bench. The book contains photographs of two representative units from EICO. The book describes the Rider "Chanalyst," the first multi-channel signal tracer, as well as similar units from Meissner, Hickok and Superior. Also covered is a related test instrument — the field strength meter.

The book closes with a section dedicated to the oscilloscope. Alan provides a brief history of the development of the oscilloscope. And we learn that General Radio did much of the pioneering work that produced a practical oscilloscope but later lost its market share to DuMont. Included is a reproduction of a page from a General Radio catalog supplement dated May 1931 that shows an early 'scope.

Alan goes on to explain how Tektronix revolutionized the oscilloscope field in the mid-1950s. Tektronix and DuMont models are covered in detail and lists of models, along with prices and model years, are included. Other scopes included in this section are a Heathkit "Professional," an RCA TMV-122B, circa 1935, and a Waterman "Pocketscope." I wish he had included the National unit with the one-inch CRT.

How would you write a book about vacuum tube test equipment? Think about the number of basic instruments and then multiply that by the number of manufacturers and models. The result is overwhelming. No wonder Douglas' goal was to provide "an overview."

Readers may question why a particular piece of equipment was included, or not included. Alan does state that he has favored some laboratory-grade equipment over commercial grade testers. But authors must make these choices. Overall, Alan's selections and his degree of coverage for each test equipment type seem well done.

The book has some production problems. A few blank pages make it difficult to tell whether the printer failed to print both sides of the page or if the page was left blank intentionally. If the blank pages are meant to be filler pages, then the inclusion of a page number or some logo would make the publisher's intent clear.

Another nice touch would have been to key some of the illustrations to the text.

Overlooking these problems and considering content, collectors should find this book informative and useful. It contains many illustrations to supplement the text, and the quality of these black and white illustrations is good, except for the schematic of a B&K tube tester. Obviously, the original blueprint was equally illegible. The book's cover is printed in color, but has a lackluster quality.

RESTORATION & REPAIR

Restoring Radio Knobs and Dials

BY DALE DAVENPORT

A request for suggestions on rewhiting radio dials in the "Help" section of Antique Radio Classified's want ads prompted Dale Davenport to explain the techniques he uses for restoring radio knobs and dials. When a fellow collector picks up on such a request and writes a detailed article on solutions to the problem, we are all in luck. (Editor)

Restoration efforts on early sets from the 1920s can be diminished by crummy looking dials with white paint filler that is damaged or missing. Worse yet, the dials have been restored with smeared white paint, too bright in color, and caught in places that it shouldn't be. A little thought and planning, along with a few evenings' effort, will produce show-winning dials that you will be proud of and that will complement the rest of your restoration efforts.

Before commencing restoration of these early dials, you must ask some questions about the material used in each dial and its overall condition. Next, you must determine the extent of the restoration desired to produce a finished piece compatible with the rest of the set.

DIAL MATERIALS

Early "skirted" type dials were made of many different materials, including Bakelite, hard rubber, "composition," ceramic, Pyralin (celluloid), wood, and metal. Bakelite, like that on early Atwater Kent sets, was fairly common, as were hard rubber and a molded composition material that the early repair guys called "Molded Mud."

The easiest material to bring back to a near new condition and "look" is Bakelite. Hard rubber, ceramic, and molded mud knobs and dials are quite porous and make restoration a nightmare. Metal and Pyralin produce the very best restored dials with near-new results. Each wood knob presents a rather special case and requires some thought as to just how to proceed.

I'll try here to discuss each type of material, talk a little about expected problems, and recommend some procedures to obtain the best possible results.

Bakelite: Bakelite is quite commonly used. It is hard, resists many cleaners, and will take re-polishing very well.

Atwater Kent knobs and parts are some of the best examples of quality, early Bakelite work. These knobs and dials are much easier than most other types to bring back to near original condition. To assess the dial's condition, look at the front surface and compare it to the back or underside where it has been kept in the dark and protected by its proximity to the panel.

Hard Rubber and Molded Mud: Both these materials were used in earlier sets and often in less expensive or home-brew sets. These materials present the greatest challenge to restoration efforts, but they can often be saved. Hard rubber knobs and dials are often warped and both types tend to be very brittle and or fragile. Again, a comparison of the dial or knob's front and back sides will help determine the extent of its deterioration.

Pyralin: This material is actually a type of celluloid and was used on sets like the Garod Model IV and Model EA. Though occasionally showing some mild warping, these knobs and dials polish out to a jewel-like luster and are most striking when finished.


Metal: This material is used as skirt material on such early sets as the Westinghouse RA, DA, or RC models. It is also used in the knobs and levers on the early products of the Freshman and Michigan companies. Each metal knob or dial presents its own unique problems.

Ceramic: Seldom but occasionally used, ceramic knobs present a unique challenge. In each case, careful determination of the best methods for restoration of the knob will be required.

CLEANING PROCESSES

Each knob or dial should be carefully looked over and a determination made as to the extent of required cleaning and repairs. A decision also needs to be made about how much restoration effort is to be expended. Complete restoration of the knobs and dials may not be necessary after a simple clean up of the rest of the set. In this case, cleaning and detailing may suffice.

Try cleaning with a soft toothbrush and cool distilled water. (Warning: Do not use soap or other cleaners, at least at this stage.) Soaps, household cleaners and the like will often attack the material, removing not only the dirt but much of the surface material as well.



Repeated brushing of the flutes and numbers may be needed to remove years of caked grunge. Only after every attempt has been made to remove the dirt and grime by this method should any stronger measure be taken. When the knob or dial is cleaned to your satisfaction, pat it dry with a soft paper towel. Once it is dry, look the part over carefully to determine its condition, and then plan the next step.

You may find that when the part is dry, the dirt you thought you'd removed is hidden in the lettering and flutes, requiring further scrubbing. Once all traces of the dirt and grime have been removed, observe how much of the original "whiting" remains in the dial markings and numbering. If your best efforts have left some stubborn dirt in the bottom of the flutes and engraving, then and only then is it time to drag out the heavier cleaning methods.

Often stubborn grime and dirt will yield to plain Johnson's brand paste floor wax. (Caution: do not use this method on porous materials.) Apply it with a soft bristle toothbrush and work and work and work it into the depressions till it liquefies. Surprisingly, you may be rewarded for your efforts.

Wipe off the wax and sludge with paper towels or pieces of an old T-shirt, and then with a dry soft bristle toothbrush, remove the remaining wax and grunge in the flutes and dial markings. Repeated scrubbing with the dry brush will remove the dried wax residue, producing a clean part with a soft luster. Dials and knobs with the whiting in good condition may need little if any further attention.

POLISHING

If inspection shows that the front and back surfaces of the knob are still considerably different in appearance, polishing is required as a next step. I do almost all of the polishing by hand first with No. 2 Novus red plastic polish. I then finish off with either the Novus blue or jeweler's rouge. The application, polishing and final buffing are done with 6-inch squares of old T-shirt material.

Power buffing can be accomplished with a soft cloth buff and rouge, but go lightly, using a gentle touch. Too much effort here can ruin a part in a hurry. A soft radial brush loaded with rouge in a slow-speed Dremel tool can be used for those particularly difficult spots, but again, I urge you to go cautiously.

Determine at this point how much rewhiting of the part is necessary. If most of the original whiting material is still in place after the above scrubbing, you may decide to fill in only the missing bits. If the original whiting material is largely missing or badly flaking, it's time to remove the remainder. I suggest use of round wooden tooth picks to dig out the remaining white material.

The difficult places may be helped by using something small, sharp and at the same time rounded. Resist the urge to use sharp points like the end of your X-acto knife. A slip will leave a scratch that will drive you nuts trying to remove it or to keep it from becoming white when the dial is filled. A reshaped nut pick works well, and I have a tool purchased in a ceramics craft shop that's nearly perfect for the job. Made to remove flash-

ing from greenware molded clay, it looks as if the edges are rounded to prevent digging in. Go slow. A slip will leave a scratch that will diminish your finished dial.

It is not absolutely necessary to remove every last bit of the original filler since the new whiting can be applied over it, and with a correct color choice, it will blend right in. When all material has been removed from the dial's numbers, scale lines and the like, wrap the center part of the knob with the flutes (where you grab it) with a couple of turns of masking tape. The tape will prevent later problems requiring digging out whiting from the fluted part of the dial.

THE "WHITING" PROCESS

Now to the actual whiting to bring the knob or dial back to its former look and luster. Originally filled with "Chinese White," old dials are no longer a bright white but rather a more mellow color produced by age and usage. The best material I've found for filling in missing dial whiting is Liquitex brand acrylic artist's paint in parchment color. Available at art supply stores, the acrylic paint is water soluble, and mistakes can be easily removed or corrected.

Place a very small amount of the paint on a fingertip and work into the grooves and numbers of the knob. Remove the excess with a slightly damp piece of cloth or paper towel and set the knob aside to dry for a few minutes. Excess paint then can be removed from the surface of the knob with, again, a slightly damp cloth or piece of paper towel. Major mistakes can be removed with a soft brush and water. Missed spots can be filled again and the cleaning process repeated.

The parchment color of the acrylic paint is a subdued color, not the garish white so often produced by using lacquer sticks or other paint materials. Beware of using lacquer sticks, typing white-out, paints and the like. These soak into the surface of the knob or dial and make removal of the excess a nightmare.

Let the painted knob dry over night and remove any remaining smears or mistakes, again with a dampened cloth. A little more polishing and a light wax coat may be added at this time if further luster is desired. Your reward will be a knob to be proud of.

HARD RUBBER TREATMENT

Treatment of the knobs and dials made of hard rubber varies depending on the individual item to be restored. The wonderful Mahoganite hard-rubber panels, knobs, and dials are brown with black graining to simulate wood. Though often heavily oxidized, with a little extra work and polishing, they will shine with a soft luster that is very attractive.

Mahoganite, such as used in the panels of early Zenith models, will respond remarkably to the previously described cleaning and whiting techniques. Early Zenith knobs are also hard rubber but made with a different formulation. Frequently these knobs have oxidized to a greenish gray color that goes too deep to allow the part to be returned to its former color. A little polishing to

remove surface oxidation and then a good buffing will allow the acquired color to remain, but look clean and "old."

One other type of hard rubber is occasionally encountered — the very hard material used to manufacture items like early telephone ear pieces. This material is very brittle, often granular in surface texture and should be treated like molded mud.

MOLDED MUD

Molded mud was advertised as "composition," and just what it was made of is a mystery. More than likely it varied in composition from one manufacturer to another. It has usually deteriorated, has a very porous surface, and breaks or crumbles easily. It is the most difficult material to restore to acceptable condition.

A good cleaning with cool distilled water has proved to be the best method of removing the dirt buildup. Once clean and allowed to dry thoroughly, the porous surface can be sealed to provide a better appearance and resist the tendency of the material to soak up the paint in places you don't want it. Without surface sealing, the paint produces a cloudiness wherever it touches — a product of the paint soaking into and being trapped by the porosity of the material.

Seal the knob or dial with a satin or matte finish spray lacquer such as Defthane. A couple of light but wet coats allowed to dry will produce a finish that may not be exactly like the original, but to me, very acceptable. Allow the lacquer to dry thoroughly — a couple of days hopefully — and fill with the Acrylic paint mentioned previously. If you are impatient, try to allow at least 24 hours of drying time to make sure the lacquer seals and produces the best possible surface.

PYRALIN

The Pyralin or Celluloid knobs produce perhaps the most striking results when cleaned and polished. The usual cleaning with distilled water and polishing with the Novus plastic polish will produce a brilliant luster much like Catalin.

Occasionally Pyralin knobs are warped, and one I repaired was so badly bent that it had to be installed fully a half inch from the panel to keep it from rubbing. These knobs are thin and hollow, and the material is slightly flexible. I filled the depression in the back of the knob nearly full of a slow setting epoxy. A piece of plastic soda straw inserted into the screw hole from the side and held in place with a bit of modeling clay provided access to the knob attachment screw.

I covered the front of the panel with a piece of thin, plastic, sandwich wrap to protect it, and then installed the knob firmly against the panel, overcoming the warp. You must, of course, work with the panel held face down. I supported the panel by placing its ends on a couple of suitable cardboard boxes and fit the knob, nearly full of liquid epoxy, as far on the shaft as possible. Weights or clamps can be devised to hold the panel and knob together while the epoxy cooks off.

The flexibility of the Pyralin material allowed it to sit flush against the panel. Twenty-four hours of cure time for the epoxy produced a knob that is

still flat after five years. Whiting the letters and scale markings is accomplished with the same Acrylic paint previously mentioned. A final polish of the whited knob, buffing with a soft cloth, and you will have the crowning achievement to your restoration.

METAL AND OXIDIZED PARTS

Metal knobs, dial scales, and the like must be assessed on a piece by piece basis. Some of them are painted black and some are blackened with an oxidized finish. A little experimentation on the back side of the knob or dial with a drop of paint stripper will indicate what you're dealing with. If the stripper removes the finish, it's paint. Stripper doesn't seem to have much effect on oxidized finishes.

Notice too if the numbers and dial graduations are painted on or are white paint, fill-in, stamped indentations, like those on molded knobs and dials. Numbers and markings that are painted on will require silk screening and much extra cost. The painted knobs and dials with filled indentations can be cleaned, stripped, and painted. The whiting then is done as on other types of knobs and dials.

The oxidized finish knobs can be cleaned and sprayed with the matte finish lacquer to brighten them up. Again the whiting is done as before. Areas where the oxidized finish is worn thin may be helped with a little black color from a permanent marking pen such as a "Sharpie," applied before the matte finish. The lacquer will even everything out and you'll be surprised at how good it looks.

CERAMIC

I've not had any experience with ceramic dials and knobs but some do show up from time to time. The glazed versions need little more than a good cleaning and possibly filling with white or black paint. The unglazed models likely will require some thought and development of a technique suitable for the individual knob or dial at hand. The same thought and technique development will be required on those few painted wooden knobs you may encounter.

FINAL THOUGHTS

Every restoration is different and sometimes experimentation is the only sure way to find a cure for a specific problem. In the rush to click the mouse and acquire more and better sets for our collections, take time to do a really detailed restoration, and the reward will be a set you are proud to own and display.

If anyone can suggest new or different methods and materials for dial and knob restoration, I'd like to hear from you.
