



EDITOR'S COMMENTS

For antique radio collectors, summer is the high season. Despite soaring temperatures, roaring forest fires, and a madly fluctuating Dow, they will come to see, to bargain, and to buy. That should be especially true in this month of August when the two major events of the year are scheduled — Radiofest in Elgin, Illinois, and the AWA Conference in Rochester, New York.

Collectors from coast to coast and abroad have always come to at least one of these events. One year, the two were scheduled back-to-back, and some took this opportunity to attend both. This may be possible again for those who can plan extended vacations in August. Usually held in September, the AWA Conference has been moved ahead due to scheduling at the hotel, now a college dormitory. Obviously, AWA has decided to give this venue another try, despite the many complaints last year.

One difference is that we supposedly will have the entire hotel, unlike last year when many had to stay across town. Another carrot offered is the reopening of the former cocktail lounge. If you were unhappy last year, these changes may make it worth trying this still very popular event again.

Long before last year, however, we, among others, had challenged AWA to make things better. For example, we urged the adoption of the weekend schedule that Radiofest, Extravaganza, and others already had proved to be the way to go. This choice has led to high activity throughout all three days of the meet, instead of diminishing action by Friday noon, as at AWA.

Collectors not able to adjust their work schedules to free up three weekdays now could attend. On weekends, there is also the opportunity to attract the general public — potential buyers, sellers, and future collectors. As the largest collectors' club in the world, AWA needs to do the same — step up to the plate, focus on a weekend schedule, solve its location problem, and make this a world class event.

Whether at a big event like AWA or Radiofest, collectors are always looking for the unusual. James O'Neal is no exception, even on a trip to Moscow. How he discovered an RCA receiver with Cyrillic labeling in a Moscow museum and then traced its history to a deal between RCA and the Russians is a fascinating story.

Richard Arnold writes about another set with a little mystery about it. Not much is known about how his Philco 60 came to be painted, and he would like to find out more. How Richard acquired the set is also a good road map for beginner collectors.

Malcolm White's Kennedy Model 26 is a very unusual set in that its style belies its function. At first glance, you might not know which is the front, as it is almost identical to the back, and the controls are hard to find. What was the designer's intent — to discourage children from playing with knobs or just to give the user a challenge?

Our *Collector Profile* is a tribute to the late Ralph

Williams, collector, historian, worker in the industry, and longtime contributor to the antique radio community and to A.R.C. I had known Ralph and his wife Elinor for a number of years and had the pleasure of visiting his impressive museum. I also feel that I have a small piece of Ralph's history because he made eight repros of the rare Atwater Kent 5 breadboard, and I was able to purchase one of them years ago.

In addition, we remember Ralph and Elinor's daughter Kathryn Lee whose last major outing with her parents was the 2001 AWA Conference. She was a World Trade Center victim. We extend the sympathy of the radio collecting community to the Williams family for their double loss in the past year.

Though it looks like a table model, the Zenith "Mystery set" in *Photo Review* could very well be a cut-down console. And how about the RCA item that has all the appearance of a receiver but is really a tube tester for very early tubes?

Gary Clayton's Canadian Old Tyme Radio Centre in Belgrave, Ontario, sounds like a shop we all wish we had nearby. Gary's love of taking a piece of junk and turning it into a work of art appealed to Managing Editor Dorothy Schecter who put the material he sent into an article.

Jim Boellstorff reports on the annual Harris vintage radio auction, always a well handled and successful event. And Erwin Macho lets us in on the international scene with his report and photos of the vintage radio section of the Dorotheum auction.

Radio Miscellanea this month proves that our readers really pay attention. Last month's cover comment about a DeForest O-T-3 transmitter brought an immediate response. Earlier articles on Wurlitzer, Lyric, and Flavoradio also engendered more information.

VINTAGE TELEVISIONS

RCA's Russian Television Connection

One article and one career may make a connection to another article and career. James O'Neal, whose bio reflects his career in television, was prompted to write the following article by Ray Bintliff's January 2002 article on the RCA-Soviet Union TV connection. Ray serviced prewar TV sets after joining RCA in 1946. A.R.C. is all about making such connections. (Editor)

The January 2002 *Antique Radio Classified* article by Ray Bintliff about the rather puzzling discovery of photographs of an early RCA television set with Cyrillic labeling did not escape my notice and brought back some memories of a discovery of my own. I would like to offer the following account, which may solve this mystery.

Some years ago, on one of my travels to Moscow, I had the opportunity to tour a large museum dedicated to science and technology. I naturally sought out the section devoted to broadcasting, and among the fairly large collection of artifacts there, I could not help but notice the rather large "mirror in the lid" television receiver, shown in Figure 1. I thought that it was a Russian reverse engineered clone of a similar American or British set until I moved in for a closer look. (The museum had a dandy Russian copy of an early Polaroid camera and what could be easily mistaken for a 1950s American 21" round tube color set.)

There, as Figure 2 shows, front and center on the large wooden cabinet, was the unmistakable RCA "meatball" logo. This was indeed a strange thing to find in a museum where virtually everything was labeled and branded in Russian.

No one was around to answer my questions about the set's ancestry, so I took my share of photographs and resolved to try to find out how that particular RCA set had wound up with Cyrillic labeling and why it was spending its retirement days in a Moscow museum. I pondered the matter on the long trip back to America and realized that I had seen a similar, if not identical, set somewhere else.

U.S. CONNECTIONS

Reviewing photographs I had taken at the AWA Electronic Communications Museum in Bloomfield, New York, I located that receiver. Minus the Cyrillic lettering, one control knob, and a few minor cosmetic details, the AWA set was a dead ringer for the Russian museum model. My photograph of the AWA set appears

in Figure 3. A placard with both sets indicated that they operated on the 343-line standard. That dated the receivers fairly well, as this was an intermediate standard of sorts that predated the U.S. 441-line standard with which television premiered at the 1939 New York World's Fair.

A chance conversation some time later with fellow television enthusiast Nat Pendleton revealed that he not only knew the model number of the set, but actually owned one. He was working to restore it both electrically and in appearance. His set is shown in Figures 4 and 5.

Sometime before the set passed into Pendleton's possession, the original CRT had been removed and replaced with a more modern (shorter), direct-view tube, placed in the horizontal position atop the set. The controls inside the cabinet top compartment had been relocated to the front of the set, and the original top had been discarded in favor of a simple cover over

the replacement CRT. This early RCA model was revealed as the Model RR-359 and sported a 9" picture tube.

(I offer this bit of speculation. Could the Model RR-359 be the forerunner of later RCA television model identification nomenclature? In the case of the famous postwar Model 630TS, 1946 was the year of manufacture and the set contained 30 tubes. Was the Model RR-359 designation a coupling of 1935 and the size of the CRT?)

Pendleton informed me that the set was also made with a 12" tube and that variant was labeled the Model RR-359B. Both receivers would have to be classified as field test models, as there were no attempts to market them, at least in this country.

The set was now identified as to its model number and dated fairly closely. However, I still wanted to know how it had gotten to Moscow and had learned to speak Russian.

I vaguely recalled reading an article about Russian television in a *Society of Motion Picture and Television Engineers* (SMPTE) journal years before. It had been penned by an American television engineer who had returned to Moscow after a hiatus of some 30 to 40 years. His article basically dealt with the changes in that city since his first trip there in the 1930s. However, as it had been over 20 years since I last looked at the journal, the article was a bit fuzzy

around the edges. There just might have been something in it about his working with the Russians on a television project. My next priority was to dig through my SMPTE publications for that particular issue.

I finally located what I sought in the September 1972 number — the article by one Waldemar J. Poch. Yes, he had been part of an RCA mission to Moscow in 1937 to install an all-electronic television system. The main thrust of the article was the great change that had taken place since Poch's first 10-month stay in 1937-1938 and the state of the USSR television broadcasting and motion picture industries in 1972. He also mentioned an intermediate trip made in 1959 on behalf of his employer RCA.

On reflection, I thought this a bit odd, as the U. S. had broken off diplomatic relations with the onset of the Socialist revolution in 1917-1918, and only re-established them with what was then the USSR in late 1933. I found it hard to believe that such a technology transfer could take place in light of this country's distrust of that communist society.

THE RCA-SOVIET DEAL

Additional research proved me wrong. An excellent book on the life of Vladimir Zworykin, RCA's legendary television pioneer, was published in 1995. In one chapter, the author, Albert Abramson, traced the path of Zworykin as he returned to his native Russia to give a series of lectures in 1934. Abramson states that during this stay, Zworykin was twice asked about the possibility of RCA's selling a television system to the Russians. On his return to the U. S., Zworykin met with David Sarnoff about the Russians' interest in television equipment. Abramson reports that contacts were made with the Russian embassy, and the Soviets ordered a complete television equipment package.

However, this television equipment deal resulting from the 1933 thaw between the U. S. and the USSR was given only limited publicity. An investigation of all pertinent issues of RCA's house publication, *Broadcast News*, turned up several television-related stories, but no mention of the deal with Russia or the sending of its television engineering personnel to Moscow.

The New York Times carried a brief report in late 1935 from the Associated Press that RCA had signed agreements with the USSR for some \$2 million (U.S.) worth of radio-related equipment to be manufactured in its Camden and Harrison, New Jersey, plants. Abramson reported that a Russian commission journeyed to the U. S. in 1936 to inspect and accept the equipment. They remained until 1937.

Efforts to locate Waldemar Poch were in vain. I did learn that a friend of mine had once served on a television standards committee with Poch, known to his associates as "Wally"; however, Poch never talked about any of his Russian experiences. The trail was similarly cold as concerned other RCA engineers who might have been part of that 1937 contingent.

One element of Poch's 1972 article was rather intriguing. He described the present Moscow Ostankino television broadcasting center, mentioning that it replaced the original 1937 television complex where he had worked. He added "... it was with mixed feelings that I saw one of the vintage 1937 receivers on display in a museum devoted to technical developments. This particular model had cost me many hours of work in the middle 1930s."

I have little doubt that this was the same receiver that I encountered in Moscow's Polytechnic Museum.

Indeed, these early television receivers are rare, with only a handful still accounted for. It must be assumed that the Russian variant is extremely rare, with possibly the only one in existence residing in that Moscow museum.

MORE ON RUSSIAN TV HISTORY

A Russian television Web site offers additional information on certain aspects of Russian television history. While most of the 1972 Poch translated article is centered on the development and construction of the present day Russian television tower at Ostankino, Poch does state that plans for the first Moscow television broadcast center were made at the end of 1936. A site was selected on Shabolovka Street, as a 150-meter antenna tower was already located there. Poch notes that the first experimental transmissions took place on March 9, 1937 and regular broadcasting commenced on December

31, 1938. These dates tie in well with the other information.

MORE ON THE MODEL RR-359

The keen-eyed observer may note that the placard atop the Russian Model RR-359 calls the set a "TK-1" and dates it as a 1939 model. As the "TK-1" designation is incorrect, it must be assumed that the date was also an approximation.

Other details should be noted too. The first is the difference in the channel selector escutcheon appearing in the upper center of the set's front panel. There are two distinctly different types — one with a vertical orientation and the other horizontal. The AWA museum's Model RR-539 and the one shown in the first photo of Ray Bintliff's article are equipped with the former. The Russian variant and Pendleton's set have the horizontally oriented window type escutcheons.

The difference is indicative of a production change in the set's tuner. The horizontal "window" variant was used with a "continuous" tuner, while the vertical escutcheon covered a "detent" or switch-type tuner. It is speculated that the continuous tuning model was chosen for export to Russia, as television broadcasting channel allocations were probably not the same as in America. According to Pendleton, the switch tuner has eleven channel positions.

The tuning knobs on the Russian museum set are not the light color shown in Bintliff's photograph. However, they appear to be mismatched and probably are not original. One knob is missing completely. The channel selector knob is interesting in that it is engraved with the Cyrillic lettering "ДИАПАЗОН." The word is sometimes used in Russian to indicate tuning.

The saga of the Model RR-359 was not quite over even after I had pieced together the above information. I had been following Nat Pendleton's restoration efforts during the intervening years and learned that he would be displaying his set in operating condition at the 2001 Charlotte AWA meet. Figure 5 provides a look at the innards of his restored set.

Pendleton had performed a very complete and difficult restoration, and I must admit it was quite a thrill watching television images on such a primitive device! It should be noted that the RR-359's horizontal oscillator had no trouble running at 15,750 Hz for 525-line television instead of the 10,290 Hz mandated by the 343-line standard. The horizontal "speed" control had more than enough "stretch" for this difference. Slope detection of FM audio left a lot to be desired, though.

Pendleton was rewarded for his efforts by receiving top prizes by the meet's judges.

COMMENTS ON THE BINTLIFF ARTICLE

While Ray Bintliff did very skillfully deduce several things about the Model RR-359 from the photographs, I need to offer a bit of correction

on some points. First, the article suggests that the RR-359 was electrostatically deflected. Even though this may appear to be the case from the photograph, Pendleton assures me that the RR-359 uses electro-magnetic deflection. What appears to be the neck of the CRT in the photo is in reality a shield. The yoke, which is a somewhat "long and skinny" affair, is concealed under the shield.

There is only one other chassis associated with the Model RR-539. This is a large and heavy affair located at the bottom of the cabinet. It provides both low and high voltages via the interconnecting cable seen in both Bintliff's chassis photo and in Figure 5. The set's tuner, IF, deflection, video/audio detection and output stages are all contained on the main chassis. As was typical of television receivers of this era, there was no RF stage.

Bintliff speculated on the unusual mounting of some of the set's tubes. RCA had mounted a portion of the tube sockets at right angles to the plane of the chassis. This effort was not to save space or otherwise to make the chassis more compact, as the RR-359 cabinet is quite large. It was, however, an effort to reduce capacitance effects associated with the tubes' grid circuitry. These are grid cap tubes, and while shunt capacitance to ground didn't matter much with radio applications, the engineers apparently were doing everything they could to get decent high frequency response with the materials available in television's "cave man" days.

I would like to acknowledge Mr. Pendleton's kind assistance in providing information for this article and also Elliot Sivowitch of the Smithsonian for assisting me in my research efforts.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

1934 Philco Model 60

How collectors acquire their radios is often as interesting as the sets themselves. Richard Arnold shows us how to combine business with pleasure and come up with a nice addition to his collection. (Editor)

I sold my coin collection and started collecting radios in the summer of 1985. Why radios? I don't know. But what I do know, is that it turned out to be a very good decision. As Rush Limbaugh says on his radio program all the time, "I'm having more fun than a human being ought to be allowed to."

I was an insurance agent for over twenty years, and some of my customers came by my office and brought me radios and tubes. I used to include my radio cards in their monthly statements.

I knew in about six months after starting to collect that my main interest was going to be in cathedrals. One of my insurance customers sold me my first cathedral. It was an Atwater Kent Model 84, which I purchased for \$75. I still have it.

THE PHILCO MODEL 60

In late 1985, I started getting radio sales catalogs from Ron Boucher. He sent out a nice list of radio and related items that included pictures and a short description of each item. This Philco 60

was item #18 in his March 1986 catalog. He stated in his description of the radio that this version of the Philco 60 was the only one he had ever had.

Well, that statement impressed me (as a new collector) enough to go ahead and purchase it. I bought the set for \$125. I purchased a number of other cathedrals from Ron over the next few years. He was very honest, and I never had any problems in my dealings with him.




Figure 2. This rear view of the Philco Model 60 shows the compact arrangement of the radio's components.

This version of a Philco 60, shown in Figure 1, is the second cabinet style for the year 1934. The first design looks a lot like my Philco Model 89, except for the escutcheon. The Model 60 is a 5-tube superhet that uses a 42 output tube, an 80 full wave rectifier, a 6A7 detector/oscillator, a 78 IF and a 75 as a second detector. The IF is 460 Kc. A rear view of the radio is shown in Figure 2.

The Philco 60 tunes the broadcast band from 530-1500 Kc. It also has a short wave band from 1.5 to 4.0 Mc. This band does not seem to have too much on it any more, but I do manage to pick up stations from time to time. Both the early and late versions of this radio are rated by Ron Ramirez as "somewhat difficult to find."

Over the years I have seen, mostly on television, pictures of various cathedrals that were painted in a flat looking paint that gave them a pastel

appearance. I remember seeing a black and white picture on television of Bob Hope and some other people standing around a Jackson Bell "swan" cathedral that was painted and had this same look. A movie about Babe Ruth hitting his famous designated home run for a sick boy in the hospital shows a painted cathedral by his bedside.

This Model 60 was also finished in a special off-white paint and highlighted in white paint. The painted knobs are wooden, round and flat. The set has a special sun ray grille cloth. I think the cabinet with the Deco design is pretty sharp looking.

It is interesting to note that Ron Ramirez's book *Philco Radio 1928-1942* does not show any of the factory-painted Philco cathedrals. But, in a recent conversation with Ron, I found out that he doesn't mention the Philco 60 because he can find no evidence of its being painted by the factory. The first sets to show up painted were done in 1938-1939, as evidenced by the 39-6 and 39-7 table models.

I would like to find out more about these sets. If any one has any of the painted cathedrals in his

collection, please tell me what you have. A picture would be nice, along with any information. I will try to gather enough facts for a future article in *Antique Radio Classified*.

I like to play all of my radios on a regular basis, but when I get to this one, a favorite, I really enjoy listening to it.

The Kennedy Model 26

The 8-tube Kennedy Model 26, shown in Figure 1, was manufactured in 1930. The tuning and volume control knobs, not shown, are located on the right side of the cabinet. The on/off and tone control knobs, also not shown, are underneath, near the front edge.

The set uses the following tubes: in the tuner, (1) Type 27 and (3) Type 24As; in the power supply/amplifier, (2) Type 45s, (1) Type 27, and (1) Type 80 rectifier. The illuminated dial is in the tiny escutcheon at the right. On the left side of the grille is the familiar Kennedy crest. Although it has only one front speaker, there are two speaker grilles — one on the front, and one on a rear panel which is detachable for servicing the chassis.

Found at a recent Michigan meet, it was in very bad condition. I had to replace most of the trim and part of the top veneer. The chassis was rusty, so I sanded it and repainted it the same light gold color. Now it looks good and plays well.


Ralph O. Williams — Atwater Kent Authority

The antique radio community has been deeply saddened by the news of the passing of Ralph Williams on May 31, 2002, after a long battle with cancer. Widely known as a leading authority on Atwater Kent, Ralph either wrote or contributed to many articles on that company for *A.R.C.* from 1985 to 1999. In addition, a complete issue of the *AWA Review* — Volume 12 — featured his writing on Atwater Kent, while four more articles appeared in other issues. *Radio Age* also published a 37-part series by Williams. Clearly, his generosity in sharing his knowledge with us all will be greatly missed.

After graduating from high school in New Jersey, Ralph attended Cooper Union in New York City until

the war intervened. He volunteered for the U.S. Army Signal Corp in 1943 and served a long tour of duty with a radar unit in China. After the

war, he completed his degree in electrical engineering at Northeastern University in Boston and joined the General Electric Co., working in aerospace, first out of Syracuse, New York, and then White Sands, New Mexico. Later he managed field service units at Vandenberg Air Force Base and Cape Kennedy.

For 16 years, until his retirement in 1980, Ralph was a senior systems engineer at GE in Philadelphia, during which time he also earned a master's degree in engineering science from Pennsylvania State University. While living in the Philadelphia area, he

developed a strong interest in radio art and historic materials related to manufacturers formerly located there. Among these were RCA Victor and especially Atwater Kent. In October of 1996, he participated in the opening of the 1927 Atwater Kent time capsule in Philadelphia. (See *A.R.C.*, May 1999.)

Kathryn Bristow Lee

The Williams family has suffered two great losses in the past year. Kathryn Bristow Lee, Ralph and Elinor's daughter, was a World Trade Center victim. She and her husband had only recently relocated from the West Coast. As a senior vice president with Marsh, Inc., she worked on the 96th floor of that fated complex.

In the *New York Times* "Portraits of Grief," she is described, at age 55, as a "self-taught elder stateswoman in her information technology group. But in a field dominated by youth, she stayed a step ahead."

She is also described as a person of great energy who made every aspect of life a special celebration.

Many collectors recall meeting Kathryn last August at the AWA Convention to which she had insisted on driving her parents. Her mother Elinor remembers that as their last happy time together.

THE VOICE OF THE TWENTIES MUSEUM

After his retirement, Ralph and his wife Elinor moved to Orient on Long Island, New York, where they labored long to restore her 300-year old family homestead, the Terry-Mulford House. The house has been owned by a family member ever since the 1600s, and with each century came a new addition. In one very large room, added in 1910, Ralph opened his "Voice of the Twenties" private museum which contains about 220 Atwater Kent receivers, including what has been called the country's finest collection of breadboards. Another 250 sets of other makes are also on view.

However, Ralph's purpose in collecting was not simply quantity. Instead, he was interested in the study of companies and the progression and development of their products. His collection represented even the most minute variations; each set was different in some respect.

Atwater Kent was his focus, but such competing products as RCA, Grebe, Crosley, Kennedy and others were counterpoints to Atwater Kent. Ralph Williams was, indeed, a scholarly collector.

ARCA, AWA AND OTHERS

Williams was a founder and former president and board member of the Antique Radio Club of America (ARCA). He was also very active in AWA, and for many years, he and his wife organized the equipment contests at the annual conference. He and the late Bruce Kelley were the only holders of the AWA Houck Awards for both preservation and documentation.

Ralph was a member of the IEEE, and a founder and active member of the Peconic Amateur Radio Club. As a Fellow of the Radio Club of America, he received the Ralph Batchelor Memorial Award. He held an Amateur Extra Class license as N3VT and remained active in the area of VHF repeaters and license coordi-

nation until recently.

Obviously, radio in any form was a primary interest for Ralph. But, he was also an active volunteer in town affairs. He was a member of the Landmarks Commission for 20 years, a director of the Suffolk County Historical Society, and a favorite teacher in the AARP55-Alive driving classes.

Ralph is survived by a large family: his wife Elinor, well known to AWA members, seven children, 14 grandchildren, and four great grandchildren. According to Elinor, the children are all committed to taking care of his collection. Only "attic" items are apt to be disposed of and the wonderful collection will remain intact.

In all, Ralph Williams was a "man for all seasons" who will be remembered for his many contributions to his local community, as well as to the antique radio community.





ZENITH MODEL 5S319 – This 1939 Zenith wood table model with a gold oval dial has a wraparound left horizontal grill, four white "Z" knobs and five push buttons (*Tom Zenisek – Cedar Rapids, IA*)



ATWATER KENT MODEL 708 – This 8-tube cathedral was manufactured in 1933 by the Atwater Kent Manufacturing Co. of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. It measures 12½" high and 16" wide. The dial appears behind a small window opening at the top. (*Wally Worth – Wollaston, MA*)



RCA TUBE TESTER – This is an early 1920s tube tester made only for RCA radio dealers and service centers and not sold to the public. It is battery-operated and tested RCA tubes, such as WD-11, WD-12, 199, 200, and 201A. (*Ross Mason – Mason City, IA*)

MUSIC MASTER HORN SPEAKER – This horn speaker was manufactured by the General Radio Co. of Cambridge, Mass. It has the hard-to-find spruce, wooden bell with a 13 $\frac{3}{4}$ " diameter, and it stands 22 $\frac{1}{4}$ " tall. (*Wally Worth – Wollaston, MA*)



HOME TYPE CT RECEIVER – This unique receiver was sold in 1922 by the Home Radio Corp. at 100 Madison Avenue in New York City. The operator could either use the catwhisker crystal detector viewed behind a glassed-in dome (above center), or flip the center bottom switch to the one internal tube for detection. (*Merrill Bancroft – Townsend, MA*)



ZENITH MYSTERY RADIO – This big black dial radio cannot be found in any radio identification books. What is known is that it is of 1938 vintage and has a 6-tube chassis. The fact that there is no speaker makes one wonder if it is the top section of a console radio made into a table model. (*Milt Margolis – Springfield, VA*)



PHILIPS MODEL 936A – This 4-tube cathedral was manufactured in 1930 for the European market. It has a cabinet made of laminated sheet Arbolite, which is similar to Bakelite. (*Jim Taylor – Bouremouth, England*)

RESTORATION & REPAIR

The Old Tyme Radio Centre Belgrave, Ontario



It's good to know that the radio collecting/restoration business is alive and well even in our good neighbor Canada's small towns. The following story has been a subject for more than one Canadian publication, so we thought A.R.C. should tell it too. (Editor)

As he describes it, Gary Clayton has always been a hands-on type of guy. In the past, he would start a business, build it up, and then sell. Well, the Old Tyme Radio Centre has been another story. The business started as a hobby in 1988 in Walkerton, Ontario, Canada, when Gary restored an old radio for a friend. He then bought himself a 1938 RCA radio and restored it. People began to admire the set in his living room, and before he knew it, he was in business.

By 1992, the business had outgrown his Walkerton home, and Gary and his wife Nellie began to look for a new location to set up shop. The former hardware store in Belgrave, Ontario, was a perfect fit. The old store had an ambiance that suited the collection of old radios, and the attached workshops afforded plenty of room for what then seemed a large collection — more than 300 radios, over 13,000 tubes, and on a smaller scale, old gramophones, clocks, and telephones.

In the beginning, Gary would restore the cabinet and repair the radio to fine working order for a customer. He would also sell his own restored table and floor models, some Bakelite and plastic models, and tabletop, wooden radio/phono com-

binations. Now, the business has grown to include more than 20,000 tubes and 700 radios in storage, some for parts, others for the showroom.

Gary says he has enough parts to last a lifetime — "100 years, of course."

Customer service continues to be a focus for the Old Tyme Radio Centre. Gary restores antique radios for customers, while he also repairs and sells radios, gramophones, vintage car radios, antique clocks for car and home, and antique telephones. His love for old cars is evident in his possession of a 1955 Ford Victoria and a 1953 Pontiac coach. The company panel truck is a fully restored 1969 GMC with the company logo on the sides.

In other words, Gary is a true lover of everything antique. As he says, "I love to take a piece of


junk and make it a masterpiece." According to a *Kitchener Record* newspaper article in March of 2001, he has succeeded in doing just that many times over. The finished products are described as "works of art."

WORKS IN PROGRESS.

To be in this business, Gary has to have great perseverance. He says that he never gives up on a piece, no matter how far gone it is. An example is a 1934 Philco floor model AM and shortwave radio that sat for years in a tobacco kiln in all kinds of weather. Though the metal parts were rusted and the wood warped, Gary was able to bring it back to life.

Another example is the 1947 record player that hadn't worked for years and required vacuuming the chicken feathers out before replacing all the parts. Gary prides himself on making such sets sound as good as new.

In more straightforward cases, he gets at the

guts of the machine — replaces tubes and capacitors and adds a new power cord. In refinishing a wood case, he saves the veneer by using steel wool, not sandpaper, and follows up with coats of stain and varnish.

A typical restoration for a table radio costs between \$250 and \$350. The cost of a larger floor model will range from \$450 to \$650. Gary Clayton's growing business testifies to the fact that his work is worth the price. For collectors traveling in Canada, a visit to the Old Tyme Radio Centre is a must.


HARRIS VINTAGE RADIO AUCTION Marshalltown, Iowa — April 6, 2002


The 12th annual antique and collectible radio auction was held at the Gene Harris Antique Auction Center on April 6, 2002. Seven hundred lots of antique radios and related items were ready for sale to the 133 registered bidders from 11 states. The auction was called by Julie Harris-Stern, Gene Harris and Tony St. Clair.

Very few battery radios were offered so a good test of this market did not occur. However, it appears that there is strong demand for early battery radios. The number of horn speakers was the largest in several years, and prices were good. A general market comment is that there is a bit of softness on the top end of electric sets (economy impact?) but good quality still brings good prices with the middle and lower levels being good and improving. One reason may be the increasing number of collectors vying for the available pool of "stuff" to collect and restore. Another interesting trend was the stronger market for early small-screen TV sets.

Some highlights from the sale are the following: a Scott 23 console, selling at \$2,700; a Sparton 1476 Deco console, at \$2,000; a Scott Masterpiece, at \$1,300; a Mir-Ray, at \$1,200; a Majestic 20 grandfather clock, at \$650; and



As in previous years, some procrastinators consigned very good merchandise one or two days before the sale thereby missing the best possible advertising exposure. Even without many early battery radios, the sale grossed \$40K. Next year's annual auction will be April 5, 2003.







Dorotheum Auction Vienna, Austria — May 29, 2002

Auktionhaus Dorotheum held its second combined radio and photo equipment auction in the tenth district of Vienna on May 29, 2002. The photo equipment section consisted of 164 lots, which were moved along rapidly between 4:00 and 5:30 P.M.

The radio section began with a rare Radione RS2 tube portable, which sold for \$150. This set was of particular interest to Radione fans because it was an unknown Scandanavian version. Another

What did not engender interest at this auction were the four completely restored cathedrals from the 1930s. Unfortunately, these were so overly restored with new cabinets and electrical parts that no serious collector in search of original parts would find them interesting.



You got my attention with the articles on Wurlitzer by Wally Worth and on Lyric by Richard Arnold in the June 2002 issue. Both articles were fascinating because I have two radios in my very modest collection that are connected to the subject matter. One is a Lyric TRF floor model, ca. 1929, with two stages of 24-A RF, a 24-A detector, a 27 1st audio, a PP-45 output, and the ubiquitous 80 rectifier. The words "All American Corporation" are on the fuse cover, "Lyric" is on the escutcheon for the drum-style tuning dial, and on the back of the cabinet is a brass plate advertising "Product of Wurlitzer."

The second set looks like a dead ringer for the Lyric 546T, except that instead of "Lyric," "Knight" appears under the tuning pointer. The only other difference I detect is that it uses the more common 50L6 audio output tube rather than the 50A6 of the 546T. I had always connected this set with the Knight Kit line associated with Allied Radio, but I don't know if this set was a kit radio. I cannot locate a model number on either radio. Interestingly, the Lyric was acquired in New York State, about 100 miles from Buffalo, the home of the All-American Mohawk Co., and I found the Knight set about the same distance from Chicago, home of Allied Radio and the later Lyric.
