EDITOR'S COMMENTS

"Please stop!" was the passionate plea of one reader who objected strenuously to our recent articles on "new stuff" — the MP3 portables. Of course, we will continue to write about the new as well as the old, but our lead article and cover this month will certainly please that disgruntled reader. Thanks to Art Redman and his expert source Sonny Clutter, we take you back to 1921 and the birth of the Northwestern Radio Manufacturing Company in Charles L. Austin's backyard in Portland, Oregon. The company produced the basic battery sets well illustrated in the article, and it flourished until patent litigation initiated its demise in the Depression years.

This article also touches upon Charley Austin's biography and illustrates the kind of entrepreneurial spirit we associate with radio pioneers. Despite the ultimate failure of his company, Austin carried on with other communications projects, and seemed always ready to move on to the next challenge. Though not radio household names, Austin and his company are examples of the courage of those early manufacturers in taking the risk of investing in the new and exciting technology of radio.

And how rapidly this technology developed and changed! Within the next two decades, sets like the Philco 41-225, the subject of Richard Arnold's article, flooded the market. This 6-tube, AC set sported the latest trend — push-button tuning — which proved to be the most effective selling tool of the late 1930s.

Richard also points out that his set's push buttons still work very well. Since the company promised "long trouble-free operation," we have to conclude that there was some truth in advertising in those good old days.

Though the technology and styling in later decades took over the radio market, the 1920s linger on in collections, whether of obscure sets like Northwestern or radio-related postcards, like those from Erwin Macho in Vienna. These charming cards by artist W. Fialkowska are a follow-up

to our February 2005 cover; however, at the time, we did not know his name. Again another piece of information from a responsive reader like Erwin enriches us all.

Estes Auctions are a prime source of information for many of you readers, and so we are reluctant to disappoint you whenever our intrepid reporter Ray Chase can't cover a particular auction. Fortunately, Richard Estes himself has come up with two reports on events Ray missed. They were not record-breaking, but had respectable totals of \$57,000 and \$60,000. Items ranged from breadboards and other battery sets to cathedrals, tombstones, consoles, and communications equipment, some from Japan and Germany. Ray was back on the trail for spring auctions, so his reports will appear in future issues.

In *Photo Review* this month, Dave Crocker also contributes detailed information about a National receiver. In the spirit of A.R.C., Dave hopes that more info is forthcoming from you readers. Also shown are two similarly styled, "for the lady of the house" radios from the 1920s, one British, the other U.S.-made. They provoke thought about cabinet styles on each side of the "pond."

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Northwestern Radio Manufacturing Company

BY ART REDMAN

The Northwest Radio Manufacturing Company was an early entry into the construction of radio sets. Art Redman describes some of the company's history and its products. And, thanks to Sonny Clutter for providing additional information about the company. (Editor)

The Northwestern Radio Manufacturing Company began manufacturing radio sets for Amateur use in 1921 with Charles L. Austin as President and Frank Philppi as Vice President. They conceived of the idea to manufacture radios and to take advantage of the \$5,000,000 Amateur radio business existing after World War I.

The company began in the backyard of the Austin home at 1556 East Taylor Street (now 5830 SE Taylor Street), Portland, Oregon. The initial output was three sets a day. The plant had all the machinery to manufacture the dials, knobs, engraved panels, transformers, and other parts of the radio receivers and transmitters from raw materials. However, in some cases, the company bought parts, such as Western Electric phone jacks used in their detector and amplifier units or transformers by Acme or Federal.

AUSTIN'S EARLY CAREER IN RADIO

Charley Austin began his radio career as a thirteen year old when he read an article in a 1903 *American Boy Magazine* describing the construction of a receiver using a coherer as a detector and an induction coil as a transmitter. Five years later, Austin and four other young men of the local wireless club demonstrated radio at the Portland Public Library. The local paper, *The Oregon Journal*, reported messages transmitted and received, as well as the footsteps of a fly heard with the use of a sensitive microphone.

In 1911, Austin became the wireless operator aboard the *S.S. Rose City*. When home, he used the call C2, which derived from the fact the *S.S. Rose City*, was a station of the Continental Wireless Company of Tacoma, Washington. Since there were no federal regulations at the time to prohibit it, Austin communicated with many of the ships from his Amateur station in Portland.

During World War I, Austin enlisted in the United States Navy serving as chief electrician and radio inspector of the Portland Naval District for three and one half years where he helped build a Naval radio station in Northwest Portland. He also hired all the wireless operators and was in charge of all the Naval codes in the district.

MARKETING NORTHWESTERN RADIOS

In the 1920s, Austin decided that the best way to sell Northwestern radios was to start broadcasting programs and create demand. He bought several stacks of phonograph records and began playing them, reaching the vessel *Reuce* 1,400 miles offshore on his station 7Z1.

Hearing these musical broadcasts, the manager of a local record store made Austin a deal. All Austin had to do to receive a new stack of records was to announce, before the playing of each record, the name of the record and the phonograph it was played on, the price of the record, and the name and address of the Portland Remick Song Shop where the record was for sale.

Austin later started broadcasting at a regular schedule on 7XF becoming the second station in Oregon to do so. At the same time, he also designed the transmitter of station 7XG, rated in 1922 as the finest Amateur station west of Chicago and the first station in Oregon to broadcast on a regular schedule beginning on March 4, 1922.

NORTHWESTERN PRODUCTS

The Northwestern Radio Manufacturing Company built and marketed a Variometer Type SR-7, a Variocoupler Type SR-8 with aluminum castings, Type SR-9 machined aluminum tube sock-

ets, and Type SR-10 Bakelite knobs and dials. The knobs were turned from one-half Bakelite Dilecto Grade XX. The front panels were engraved on a Gorton Pantograph machine. Metal parts were nickel-plated brass in a satin finish, except for the cast aluminum brackets. The coils consisted of Bakelite Dilecto tubing and kiln dried hard maple. The grid and interstage capacitors were made of mica alternating with thin metal plates compressed between $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch thick Bakelite.

Figures 1, 2 and 3 show a cabinet version of the SR-7 variometer, called the Type SR-23.

Northwestern manufactured two complete products, ca. 1921, utilizing the components they man-

ufactured — the Type SR-1, a shortwave regenerative receiver, and the Type SR-2, a detector and 2-stage amplifier. The cabinets were oak and had a waxed Flemish finish and $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch thick Bakelite front panels.

THE TYPE SR-1 SHORT WAVE REGENERATIVE RECEIVER




Figure 4. An oblique view of the Type SR-1 regenerative receiver, which is actually a tuner only. The SR-1 uses a Type SR-8 variocoupler and two Type SR-7 variometers.




Figure 6. An interior view of the Type SR-1 showing two variometers at the bottom of the panel and the primary circuit's tuning capacitor and variable inductor at the top. The inductor is tapped, and tap selection is accomplished by the 12-position switch.

Despite its name, "shortwave regenerative receiver," the 5-dial Type SR-1 is really a tuner that is used in combination with the Type SR-2 detector and 2-stage amplifier. The Type SR-1 sold for \$60, weighed 13 pounds, and had a wavelength range of 170 to 850 meters. The SR-1 is shown in Figures 4, 5 and 6.

The primary circuit of the receiver consisted of a variable inductance in series with the antenna tuning capacitor. The switch controlling the tapped inductance was on the back of the panel. An antenna capacitor connected across the front binding posts in parallel with the primary coil allowed




Figure 7. The Type SR-2 detector and 2-stage amplifier is housed in a cabinet $10\frac{1}{2}'' \times 12\frac{3}{4}'' \times 6''$. Peepholes are provided to view the tube filaments. Note the elaborate rheostat knobs,

the listener to receive lower frequencies with a shorter antenna.

The secondary circuit is tuned by the SR-7 Variometer connected in series with the SR-8 Variocoupler. When shunted by a small fixed capacitor furnished with each receiver, the secondary circuit allowed reception of maritime stations on long wavelengths. Regeneration resulted by tuning the plate circuit with a second SR-7 variometer.

THE TYPE SR-2 DETECTOR/AMPLIFIER




Figure 8. Type SR-2 shows the component mounting shelf and the fold-down cabinet lid.




Figure 9. An inside view of the SR-2's chassis shows its components, including the open frame Acme interstage and audio transformers. The unit's on-off switch is located at the far right.

The Type SR-2 detector and 2-stage amplifier, shown in Figures 7, 8 and 9, sold for \$70 weighed 10 pounds. Three SR-10 dials were used on the filament rheostats for the detector and two Type 201 audio amplifier tubes. The tubes plugged into SR-9 tube sockets mounted on a sub base of $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch thick Bakelite. The grid leak is adjustable

and is made a part of the grid condenser.

The Types SR-1 and SR-2 units had the same outside dimensions $10\frac{1}{2}'' \times 12\frac{3}{4}''$. They were touted as "the combination of all combinations" when used together making the ideal receiver for the radio relay man or separately in conjunction with any receiver, either short or long wave.

After the company grew and moved to SE Division St., it discontinued manufacturing some individual components because it was more economical to purchase them from outside suppliers.

THE TYPE SR-21 REGENERATIVE RECEIVER




Figure 10. A front view of the Northwestern Model SR-21, a 3-tube regenerative receiver. Peepholes are provided to view the tube filament, and large calibrated knobs are used on the filament rheostats. Battery connections are on the left, and the antennas and ground binding posts are on the right side of the panel.




Figure 11. An interior view of the SR-21 shows the tidy layout of its components and the bus-bar wiring.




Figure 13. This close-up of the SR-21's tuning coil also shows its tap switch.

Shown in Figures 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14, is the 7-dial, SR-21, ca. 1923. It is a 3-tube regenerative receiver, using three Type 01-A tubes as a detector and a 2-stage audio amplifier.

THE NORCO 77 TRF RECEIVER




Figure 16. A close-up of the Model 77's escutcheon. Manufactured by NA-ALD, it depicts an early carbon microphone atop a globe. Musical instruments are grouped at the top of the escutcheon.

Among the better known Norco products was the 1925 Norco 77, a 7-tube TRF shown in Figures 15, 16, 17 and 18. It has four tuned stages, three RF amplifiers plus a detector, all using Type 01-A tubes. The audio circuit has two AF amplifiers, using Type 01-As, plus a Type 71-A for output. Voltage requirements are the following: A, 6 volts; B, 45, 90 and 135 volts; three C sources, one for RF and detector circuits, one for two audio amps, and one for the output stage.

Following Models SR-21, SR-25, and Nor-wes-co, the brand name became Norco and included receivers with a 2-stage triode regenerative detector, followed by the neutrodyne. Exporting their Norco Models D, Deluxe, and 55, to Japan and other countries became a sound business practice because the

company received payment when the radios were on board ship.

THE DEPRESSION AND BEYOND

Patent litigation was the main factor in the company's ceasing business in 1929. In all, the company sold over 100,000 sets. In 1930, the company became the Model Aircraft Works and Radio Apparatus after the city of Portland hired Austin to install the first police radio station in Oregon. The call letters were KGPP standing for Government Portland Police, which operated on

2.452 Mhz.

Next, the City of Portland hired Charley Austin to engineer the installation of a more powerful 500-watt police radio station in 1932, but he did not build it. Instead, the manufacturer was the Portland firm of Hallock and Watson. The station was located on the southwest slopes of Mount Tabor at Water Reservoir No. 5, and Austin became its chief radio engineer. He held that position with the police bureau for 25 years until retiring in 1955. He also taught Morse code classes at the YMCA.

After retirement, Austin constructed model train locomotives. His pride and joy is a perfect scale model of the Hudson type 4-6-4 oil fired locomotive used by the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific Railroads. The boiler maintained 150 pounds of steam. Austin said, "I've got more than 3,000 hours of hard work in that baby."

An Oregonian newspaper reporter asked Charley in December 1968 if he had any radio stuff around the house. Except for a scrapbook comprising of catalog sheets, faded photographs and newspaper clippings, the seventy-eight year old Austin replied, "Heck, no. I have had enough of that for this life. All I want to do now is sit in an easy chair and watch the idiot box."

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Push-Button Tuning and the Philco 41-225

BY RICHARD ARNOLD

Push-button controls became a big selling point for radio salesmen of the 1930s. Here Richard Arnold talks about a favorite set in his collection which still has working push buttons. (Editor)

An article in *Radio News* magazine for December 1937 tells about the latest trends in "touch tuning" or push-button control systems for the year 1938. The article starts out saying, "push-button station selection gives the ultimate in convenience and simplicity of tuning to the owner of a 1938 model receiver. These advantages are so immediately evident that radio dealers and servicemen consider this feature the most forceful selling point offered in recent years.

"The vast improvement in the performance of present-day push-button tuning over the expensive, complicated systems in vogue years ago is due in considerable measure to other developments in receiver design that bear no direct relationship to push-button tuning. In particular, automatic frequency control and high frequency, broadband IF transformers overcome the mechanical difficulties of hair-line tuning which caused designers of push-button systems so much distress in years gone by, while modern oscillator circuits have a degree of frequency stability not hitherto realized.

The new systems show ruggedness in design and construction, which promise long trouble-free operation. Their freedom from delicate relays with light spring contacts eliminates a source of trouble found in earlier models."

There were many different systems of push-button tuning available in 1938 and subsequent years. General Electric had one that operated by a special 6-volt reversing-type motor. RCA had one where the motor was mounted on top of the variable condenser gang. Other companies like Knight (Allied Radio Company) and Lafayette, just to name a few, had their own systems.



This Philco Model 41-225 is a 6-tube, AC/DC radio that tunes from 550 kHz to 3.3 MHz in two ranges. It features push-button tuning on the BC band.

THE PHILCO MODEL 41-225

The 1941 Philco Model 41-225, shown above, is a good example of the push-button sets popular in this period. This model has electric push-button tuning in addition to manual tuning and two tuning ranges. The electric push-button mechanism consists of six push buttons. One push button is used to turn the power off and on, and the remaining five to tune for the automatic tuning of broadcasting stations.

The 1941 Philco 41-225 is a 6-tube, AC/DC superhet that uses one each of the following tube types: a 7C7 RF; a 7A8 detector and oscillator; a 7B7 IF; a 7C6 2nd detector, AVC, and 1st audio; a 35A5 output; and a 35Z3 rectifier. The 35Z3 is a half-wave, high vacuum rectifier, while the 35A5 is a power beam amplifier. The 7C7s, the 7A8, and the 7C6 have 6.3-volt filaments; the 35Z3 and 35A5 have 35-volt filaments. The radio uses a single 6-8v bayonet type dial lamp

The radio tunes the broadcast band from 540-1600 Kc and a shortwave band of 1.6 to 3.3 Mc. It uses an airplane dial pointer with a red plastic pointer. Of the three original knobs on the radio, the first one on the left is the

volume control. The center knob has three positions: one for activating the push buttons, the other two for the broadcast and police bands. The third knob is for station selection. The grille cloth is not original.

Rider says that this model was introduced prior to April 1941. Ron Ramirez, in his book *Philco Radio 1928-1942*, has described it as "somewhat hard to find."

I think that the radio has a nice design and seems to be quite popular. Watching for these sets on eBay, I find that when they do show up — which is not very often — they are selling for between \$67 and \$75.

The radio plays really well, and the push buttons still work after all these years. I guess the promise that was made for the push buttons to have "a long, trouble-free operational life" was true. This very interesting radlo has become a part of my collection,

and the hunt goes on.



TEMPLE REPRODUCER – This one-piece, extremely lightweight horn speaker is made of molded fiber, even though the manufacturer called it a ceramic material. The driver is mounted in the bottom. Manufactured by the Chicago Signal Company for Parcels & Company, also of Chicago, its color is a speckled or mottled green, and it sold for \$21 in 1925. (*Dave Crocker – Mashpee, MA*)



CROSLY MODEL 739 "MAGNETUNE" – This 1939 AC/DC radio was manufactured by the Crosley Radio Corporation in Cincinnati, Ohio. It uses 7 tubes, including two Type 25Z6 rectifier tubes in a voltage doubler circuit. The Magnetune feature is a solenoid-operated electronic tuning system that moves the tuning capacitor to any of the five preset positions. The solenoid operates from the B+ supply. The set tunes both broadcast and SW and is housed in a stylish inlaid wood cabinet. (*Bob Lackey – Carlsbad, CA*)



R.I. MODEL V4A – This is a 4-tube radio manufactured in 1922 by Radio Instruments, Ltd., an early quality radio maker. It has an ebonite control panel, a lift-up lid, and a mahogany cabinet. (*Jim Taylor – Bournemouth, UK*)




PARAGON TYPE III-A – This rather compact receiver was manufactured in 1924 by the Adams-Morgan Company of Upper Montclair, New Jersey. It is a 3-tube receiver, which Alan Douglas' *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920s* says is a repackaged version of the Paragon Type RB2 of 1923. It has two front doors and a top cover lid, all of which, when closed up, don't look like much, but it's a rare set, nonetheless. (Dave Crocker – Mashpee, MA)



PHILCO MODEL 37-60 – By the time this 1937 radio was made, the era of the tombstone style was coming to an end. When I found this 5-tube, 2-band set in a local antique shop, I decided that it was still a reliable example. (Carl D. Sutton – Ironton, OH)



G.E.C. "UNIVERSAL MAINS THREE" RADIO – This is a 3-tube, Bakelite, TRF radio, manufactured in 1934 by the General Electric Company, Ltd., not to be confused with GE, U.S.A. It has a brown Bakelite cabinet measuring 13 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 13 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ ". (Jim Taylor – Bournemouth, UK)



NATIONAL CO. NBS-3A – This 16-tube receiver was built for the National Bureau of Standards by the National Co. The set is similar in appearance to National's 13-tube NC-173 communications receiver and is built on an NC-173 chassis. It has fewer front panel controls than the NC-173 and does not have a phone jack. It also lacks a BFO and noise limiter. The set's mechanical layout and circuitry have much in common with the NC-173, but again there are differences. The NBS-3A has two tuned RF stages and a push-pull audio output stage, while the NC-173 has a single RF stage and a single-ended audio output. The NBS set has a smaller tuning range and uses the band-spread dial as a logging scale, whereas the NC-173 has a band-spread dial calibrated for the Amateur bands. The receiver is housed in a steel enclosure with handles at the rear and falls into the "boat anchor" class. Can any A.R.C. readers provide a schematic diagram or other information on this unusual radio? (Dave Crocker – Mashpee, MA)





Estes Auctions held a radio auction at the Expo Auction Center in Burbank, Ohio, on Saturday, January 22, 2005. The sale included items from several collections. Interesting offerings came from a collector from the West Virginia/Virginia border. Many of these were German and Japanese World War II military pieces, which were incomplete or had accessories missing. Still, some of the items received strong bids.

The sale also had a large offering of tubes which brought good prices. Books and magazines were plentiful, as were consoles and table radios. A Scott All Wave 23 brought the highest bid — \$1,100. A Zenith 12S262 sold at \$650 while a Stellar baseball radio brought \$750. The sale total was \$53,700.
