





EDITOR'S COMMENTS

What a way to start the summer radio events season — at least in New England! We've had so much rain that it's hard to imagine outdoor events other than under water. But, we have faith that we will dry out, and, one way or another, we hope to meet you at one or more of these events.

Meanwhile, perhaps summer will get you in the mood for finding fun items like the Pepsi bottle novelty radio that Ray Bintliff reluctantly returned after he had repaired it for its owner. Today, most collectors think of *transistorized* novelty radios, such as McDonald's hamburger, Big Bird, and Snoopy. But Ray's subject is different. It's a *tube* novelty radio dating back to the 1950s. Ray describes the construction and takes obvious delight in its quality, as well as interest in its value today.

Of course, other tube novelties such as sailing ship radios and Crosley book radios sometimes surface in the marketplace. But, a radio apparently inside an oversized Pepsi bottle with the cap as a tuning dial would make any collector sit up and take notice.

Another pursuit at summer flea markets could be radio-related postcards, such as those Dave Crocker uses to continue his story about what Marconi did 100 years ago on Cape Cod, Dave's home territory. In the early days of radio, postcards depicting radio stations and their antennas were popular, and often collectors today find that the postcards add to their historical perspective.

Dave can even relate the Cape Cod Marconi history to his own family history. This kind of personal, "down-home" connection makes our pursuit of radio history even more interesting.

Another such adjunct to a collection is an advertisement, like Stan Shelofsky's 1929 ad, which gives him a world of information on his Radiola 33. Not only does it place the set in the context of the period, but it gives the price and a clear picture of the marketing spiel that attempts to convince the consumer to buy the set. It also reminds us that the need to read the small print is nothing new.

Some collectors mount and frame advertisements and place them near the appropriate sets. In this way, a more complete story of the set is told to anyone viewing the collection.

Speaking of collections, each one gives some clues as to the collector's goals. Some may buy only sets that are already restored and working. Others may decide that even a basketcase is worth restoring, both for the challenge of the work involved and for the feeling of accomplishment in preserving a piece of radio history.

Ozzie Aasgaard is in the latter group. He describes a prolonged effort to save an old collector's deteriorating radios. Unfortunately, he failed

to convince the old fellow that he should give up his dream of restoring the sets himself. But, Ozzie did manage to salvage and restore one set — a L'Atro Model 465 that, among others, was headed for the dump after the collector's death. Kudos to Ozzie for doing his bit for preservation.

Ray Chase reports on another Estes Auction, this one totalling over \$50,000. Big ticket items were not plentiful, but a rare Unito Nightingale sold for \$1,800, while some other battery sets went for solid prices. An Atwater Kent Model 10 sold for \$750, a Federal Model 59 for \$1,100, and two Kennedy sets for a little over \$1,000 each.

One notable aside is that home brews sold for up to \$150. Many auctions offer home-brew sets, but here the prices reflect that some of the sets were unusual and well-crafted.

Getting back to novelty radios, Paul Farmer, obviously a knowledgeable novelty radio collector, reviews Debby Weaver's *Novelty Radio Handbook*. This book is a tribute to Debby's father-in-law Ray Weaver's collection, and it is a useful supplement to the Breed and Bunis books. Paul feels that, as with all such books, there could be more information on the radios and current price trends; however, he praises the photos and concludes that collectors need all the photos they can get. So, this book could be a good investment for you novelty radio collectors.

ON THE COVER

To tune the Pepsi-Cola bottle radio in Ray Bintliff's article in this issue, you twist the bottle cap. What's interesting about this set is not only its construction, but also the fact that it is a tube radio, dating to the early 1950s, before transistorized sets took over the novelty radio market. Constructing a tube set as if it were inside a bottle ranks among the more unusual of collectible radios. And, the colors are in keeping with this patriotic month of July.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Pepsi-Cola Novelty Radio

Novelty radios always seem to be in demand. Ray tells about his encounter with a Pepsi radio. (Editor)

Novelty radios always seem to draw a crowd at radio meets whether in a flea market or a contest exhibit. Although novelty sets sell for premium prices, the radios inside the cabinets, or in this case, a large bottle, are not usually impressive. Typically, they are a run-of-the-mill 5-tube, Broadcast band, AC/DC TRF or superhet. The same chassis in an ordinary

cabinet will sell for much less.

PEPSI COLA HITS THE SPOT

The Pepsi radio shown in Figure 1 was manufactured in the late 1950s and is shown in the current edition of John Slusser's *Collector's Guide to Antique Radios* with a value of \$600-\$650. Not bad for an AC/DC 5-tuber.

Alas, I can only claim temporary possession of this collectable radio. The radio came into my hands to be repaired, and it is now back in the loving arms of its owner. But I did have a

chance to dig into its innards

CONSTRUCTION

The bottle cap is actually a calibrated tuning dial, as Figure 2 shows. The speaker is located in the base of the bottle and faces downward. The base has six legs that raise the speaker about three inches above the bottom of the legs. There is a cardboard disc near the bottom of the base that protects the speaker cone. Figure 3 provides a close-up view of the base, legs, and sound ports. The volume control-on/off switch is at the right side of the picture.




Figure 5. The loop antenna is sized to fit in the Pepsi bottle, and one end is notched to provide clearance for the tuning shaft.

Figure 4 shows a top view of the chassis and its tube complement: Types 12BE6, 12BA6, 12AT6, 50C5 and 35W4. The loop antenna and the extender shaft that connects the tuning dial to the variable capacitor are to the left of the chassis. A close-up view of the loop antenna and the extender shaft is shown in Figure 5.




Figure 6. The bottom cover provides a tube layout and operating instructions. An external antenna may be connected to the Fahnestock clip, which can be seen on the lower left of the base.

As Figure 6 shows, the operating instructions and a tube layout diagram are printed on the cardboard disc that protects the speaker cone (and keeps out prying fingers). Note the Fahnestock clip for an external antenna. The radio's sensitivity is very good, and it is hard to imagine a need for an external antenna. Even with the speaker aimed downward, the radio's audio quality is good.

This is a fun radio, both aurally and visually. I hated to give it back.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Marconi at Cape Cod Postcards from the Edge

A radio history buff, Dave Crocker also revels in the history of his native territory, Cape Cod, Mass. Here he puts the two histories together with postcards that tell an interesting story. Dave's March 2003 article on the centennial of Marconi's wireless message to England from Wellfleet, Mass., also records a piece of radio history. (Editor)

I guess I'm kind of lucky, living here on Cape Cod, known as "Old CC," where my family history can be traced to 1635. The real lucky thing is that not far away is the actual site where Guglielmo Marconi built his transmitters and




Figure 2. "Marconi Wireless Telegraph Station, South Wellfleet, Mass." (1908) — a slightly closer view than the card in Figure 1. Note the added pole atop one of the towers.

towers high on a bluff overlooking the Atlantic Ocean in South Wellfleet, Massachusetts. It was there, on January 19, 1903, that Marconi sent the famous wireless message from President Theodore Roosevelt to King Edward VII in England. And, he was rewarded with a reply.

The Marconi station here on Cape Cod is long gone, except for a few concrete footings used to fasten the masts' guy wires. There are, however, a few postcards that exist to remind us of the historic event that happened here over a hundred years ago. These postcards show the second array of wooden towers used at the station. The very first towers were a series of twenty wooden ship's masts erected in a circular pattern. Each mast consisted of four poles reaching a height of 200 feet, all wired together for stability. However, as fate would have it, one of the Cape's worst storms toppled the masts in November, 1901. History would have to wait.

The second set of masts built by Marconi consisted of four masts arranged in a four-square pattern. Each tapered tower was four-sided with lattice-type reinforcement. See Figures 1 through 6. Also added was a series of steel guy wires with turnbuckles to keep the wires taut. These wires were anchored to footings buried deep in the sand. It was this antenna system that brought success to Marconi early in 1903.

Other postcards, shown in Figures 7 and 8, are of the later Marconi radio station located in Chatham, Mass., some 16 miles south of the Wellfleet site. These cards date from the mid-teens. The station building and the companion building, shown in Figure 8, are currently used as affordable housing.

Notice the message on the bottom of the Marconi




Figure 5. This view, taken in 1910, is similar to the previous view, but shows the slowly eroding sand cliff to the right.




Figure 6. "Marconi Wireless Station, South Wellfleet, Mass." (1906) The tower guy wires are clearly visible in this card.

tower card shown in Figure 6: "Presented by Franklin Crocker, May, 9, 1906." This was my great-great uncle Franklin Crocker. No doubt about it, this card is truly a family treasure.

Now, just to show you how close I may have come to family fame (and fortune?), I have to tell you a little known story. It seems that when Guglielmo Marconi went looking

for a site to erect his now famous wireless towers, he hired a local "character" by the name of Edward Cook to show him possible sites on Cape Cod.

The very first site he was shown was an empty beach area in the village of Barnstable, Mass. This 20-plus acres of land was on the bay and was previously the site of the "Crocker Salt Works," which was in operation from 1799 to 1874. This land was passed down to my great grandfather who had it up for sale at the turn of the century. It was the only large area, waterfront site available for sale in Barnstable at the time. However, as luck would have it, Marconi turned it down and decided to check out another piece of land in South Wellfleet instead. Man! How close we came to rubbing elbows with Marconi! And now you can see why there's radio in my blood — I come by it honestly.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Radiola 33 and Advertising in 1929

Old radio newspaper ads sometimes trigger memories and serve as real sources of information. A 2004 A.R.C. article containing a 1942 GE ad reminded subscriber Stan Shelofsky of a 1929 ad, and the result is the following article. (Editor)

In your December 2004 issue, an article entitled "Enjoy a new GE Radio — Let the Boys in Service Enjoy your Old One" included a newspaper ad. It reminded me of my own experience of several years ago.

I have been in the television and radio repair business since 1948. However, I didn't start collecting until 1990 after reading an issue of A.R.C. that had been given to me. Since then, whenever I do a TV house call, I always ask my customer if he or she has any old radios to sell.

Sure enough, one day a customer said that he had a radio in the attic and that I could have it for free. I took the radio minus the speaker, which has never been found, and returned to my shop.

I put the radio aside, but about a month later, I got around to testing it. Troubleshooting the set, I found an open resistor. I substituted a different speaker for the missing one, hooked up an antenna, plugged the radio in, and it played beautifully!

About a week later, a friend said he had an old

newspaper containing an advertisement of a radio that looked just like mine. He gave me the paper, which was the *New York Evening Journal*, dated Thursday, September 26, 1929. At that time, I was three months old!

Lo and behold, the ad featured my radio — a Radiola 33! All the usual claims of contemporary ads are present, such as a slashed price (\$77.50 to \$54); "Extra Liberal Trade-In Allowance"; "Real Bargain if there ever was one." However, in the tiniest print next to the set, is the note, "Speaker and tubes excluded." It seems that advertising was deceptive even in the old days.

RESTORATION TOPICS

L'Tatro Radios

BY LAUREL "OZZIE" AASGAARD

Sometimes an old barn tells a sad story when it has been the storage place for antique radios. However, Ozzie Aasgaard was able to salvage at least one interesting set from such a place. Every item counts in the ongoing saga of radio preservation. (Editor)

The radio described in this article and shown restored in Figure 1 is a L'Tatro Model 465. The "4" in the model number indicates it is a 4-tube model. The set originally had a 6VDC "Elkonode" power supply, but it was missing. As a result, I installed a 117VAC transformer, a vacuum tube rectifier, and new filter capacitors for the required voltages. All other components are original, and the restored radio plays very well with a long wire antenna, or aerial, as it was called back then.

THIS MODEL'S HISTORY

Over the years I made several offers to buy some vintage radios from an old-timer in our community who was known as an electronic wizard of his time. He repaired home radios from their earliest days through the golden years of AM. That was an era before "throw-away," when electronic repair was not only economical but an absolute

necessity. This was especially true during the years of World War II, when new radios were not made for civilian use.

But, the old-timer refused my offers saying he planned to repair and restore them himself. He lived in nearly hermit-style conditions, providing better shelter for his cache of radios than he did for himself.

In his later years, he was relocated through an eminent domain buy-out by the highway department, and his radios were moved to the hayloft of a barn at his new location. Even then, he declined my offers to buy any

of his radios, still insisting he was going to restore them.

After his death in his mid-nineties, his family offered his radios to anyone who would remove them from the barn. Unfortunately, after many years under a leaky roof and layers of pigeon droppings, his collection of radios was pretty much ruined.




Figure 2. Shown are the skeletal remains of the L'Tatro Model 465 farm radio.

However, amid this mess I found remnants of a radio of a brand I hadn't heard much about. It was a L'Tatro, the subject of this article. Very few parts of the wood cabinet were intact as can be seen in Figure 2.




Figure 3. The radio's dial seems to have survived better than the cabinet.

The chassis was in fair shape with some parts missing, but the dial was in excellent condition as seen in Figure 3.

L'TATRO RADIOS

L'Tatro radios were made in Decorah, Iowa. They would be considered "farm radios" because almost all models were designed to operate from either a 6VDC rechargeable battery or from a 32VDC farm electrical system. Rider's *Perpetual Troubleshooter's Manuals*, Volumes 4 through 10, contain data on 54 models, with the only differences among them being whether they were table or console models. I believe the name has sometimes been incorrectly formatted, as I have seen it as L. Tatro. This may have been the case when the Rider manuals were published, because the data is indexed under the letter "T" rather than the letter "L."

Most of the 32VDC models had the tube filaments in series, a few operated with 32VDC plate voltage, and some used 45-volt B batteries. However, most of the 6VDC and 32VDC sets were designed with self-rectifying vibrators trademarked "Elkonode" to provide the B+. A few models had vacuum tube rectifiers. Of the 54 models listed in the Rider volumes, only five were designed to operate from a 117VAC source, and even they were convertible to either 6VDC or 32VDC with minor jumper or plug-in modifications.

AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auctions — Several Collections Burbank, Ohio — December 17, 2005

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

The Estes auction on December 17, 2005, at the Expo Auction Center, Burbank, Ohio consisted of several collections from Ohio, as well as another private collection and additional consignments. This "just before Christmas" auction was heavy on battery sets, horns, loops, nice 1930s radios, tubes, books and paper. It had little in the way of Ham gear, military, novelty or transistor radios. There were fewer than the usual low value goods and box lots, yet there were plenty of items for sale.

I recorded about 550 lots and stopped writing at 3:45 P.M., as the weather was threatening, and I wanted to get on the road. At this time, there was still nearly an hour's worth of goods to sell. The total that I recorded came to \$52,575 and does not include the last hour or the books and paper sold "choice," which I could not record.

There were no real "high flyers" in this auction, but one set that drew a lot of speculation was a Unlto Nightingale 4-tube small battery set with four 201-A tubes. This set is normally known as the "Nightingale," but there were other labels on the set indicating Guthrie Co., Grafton, Ohio, and also the United Factories Co., Cleveland, Ohio. The tuning dial did not appear to be correct as there was an old newspaper advertisement along with it which showed a different configuration. Nonetheless, it sold for \$1,800.

All in all, this was a nice auction with many desirable items and some good bargains, all in time for Christmas 2005.

A warning: Auction prices are not current values. Our selection of auction items is not necessarily complete. A listing such as this cannot adequately include the condition of cabinets, chassis, transformers, tubes, the operating status of the set, and the inclusion of incorrect, restored or replica components, etc. Auction prices are the result of the excitement of the auction process, the skill of the auctioneer and the specific interests of the participants. 







BOOK REVIEW

Novelty Radio Handbook By Debby Weaver

REVIEWED BY PAUL R. FARMER

Debby Weaver teamed up with Schiffer Publishing to create this tribute to father-in-law Ray Weaver's collection of modern, solid-state, novelty radios. *Novelty Radio Handbook* is the fourth collector's guide to be published in this category since 1990.

There are over 600 transistor novelty radios from Ray Weaver's collection pictured, and the quality of most of the photography is excellent. It will be a useful supplement to the three volumes authored in the 1990s on this subject by Robert Breed and Marty Bunis. Even with the 1,600 photographs in those previous books, some of the radios in the Weaver book are bound to be outside the experience of all but the most ardent novelty radio collectors. For collectors, there are never enough published photographs of radios.


The Weaver book clearly borrows its format and look from the Breed-Bunis collaborations published by Collector Books, Schroeder Publishing. As in those books, the radios are grouped into chapters based upon useful topical categories; there is an index to help the reader hunt down a specific set; and the captions include an estimated range of retail value.

My primary disappointments in Weaver's *Handbook* are the same ones I have with many radio collector picture-book price guides: There is very little information in the form of text, and the prices do not reflect my experience in the marketplace.

When I examine a book like this, I invariably hunger for more information about collecting the topic radios. A collector's guide should reflect greater depth of research on the history of the collecting area, the manufacturers, the origin of themes and designs, the marketing approaches and consumer perspectives, the cultural significance of the genre, and the importance of both the whole subject and specific sets to collectors.

The earlier books by Breed and Bunis did a better job of putting novelty radios in commercial, technological, and collecting context. In addition, the authors went to greater lengths to identify sponsoring companies, countries of manufacture, and marketing distributors. None of the books, including Weaver's, list dates of manufacture or original prices, and none cover set advertising, packaging, and ephemera.

The collector market for novelty transistor radios crashed in the late 1990s. Estimated values in the



Weaver book do not sufficiently reflect the drastic downward adjustment of prices that resulted from a decline in the number of active buyers. As with any price guide, the reader should take a very skeptical approach and rely entirely upon his or her own experience.

So, should you add this new book to your library? The main thing you need to ask yourself is, are you interested in modern novelty transistor radios? If you are, you should buy this book, even though it will set you back \$30. Also, I am a believer in having every radio collector book close at hand. If you deal in vintage radios or communicate regularly with other collectors, having the book will

put you, literally, on the same page.

But if you do not own any of the novelty radio collector guides, begin with the Breed-Bunis books; they will give you a better start in this collecting area, will cost you two-thirds the price of the Weaver book, and will very likely be out of print and generally unavailable far sooner than the Weaver book.

Transistor novelty radio collecting was not a high-interest collecting area prior to the publication of the Breed-Bunis books. The collecting area gained momentum during the early 1990s as a result of those books and the Marty Bunis monthly publication, *Transistor Network*. Interest in the genre waned in the late 1990s. Will it catch fire again as a result of the Weaver book? I doubt it. Been there, done that.
