



EDITOR'S COMMENTS

In this issue, we present our special coverage of two major collector events of 2006 — the Antique Radio Club of Illinois (ARCI) Radiofest and the Antique Wireless Association (AWA) Conference. As we look back on these successes of the old year, the beginning of a new year prompts us to look ahead with confidence in the survival of this avocation of ours. The longevity of such events gives us hope for 2007 and beyond. After all, they are basic to achieving our common goal — the preservation of antique radios.

Though there is a definite overlap in coverage by these two events, AWA draws largely from the eastern two-thirds of the U. S., plus foreign collectors, while Radiofest attracts collectors from the western two-thirds of the country. Both events have recognized the changing times and have shifted their opening day from Wednesday to Thursday, making the schedule somewhat easier for work and travel arrangements. Both continue to have outstanding contests, seminars, flea markets, and banquets.

Over the past five years, Radiofest has been particularly adaptable to change, even moving its venue. The real key to its success is the fact that its flea market is open to everyone, not just to club members. What better way to encourage new interest and new membership?

The Radiofest flea market offers the general public the opportunity to shop and view what our radio world is all about. This year, many visitors took advantage of free appraisals and were impressed by the special event operation of Amateur radio station AR9CI. And to encourage the next generation of collectors, Radiofest welcomed about 30 Boy Scouts who earned merit badges in "Radio" and "Collections."

Another major difference between Radiofest and AWA is the size of the auction. The Radiofest auction has diminished in importance over the years. However, its donation auction is a hit event, and a nice plus for the club's coffers.

On the other hand, AWA's auction is still very significant, and this year it was conducted by auctioneer Richard Estes. Some highlights were a DeForest spherical Audion selling at \$1,100, a WE 4D receiver at \$1,950, and a Grebe RORD detector/amplifier at \$1,400. Total proceeds were approximately \$38,000.

At first glance, the price of a Hallicrafters SX-115 selling at \$1,800 might be considered out of line. However, the set sold originally in the early 1960s at a premium price of \$600 — one of Hallicrafters' "last hurrahs," according to reporter Ray Chase. Considering that a near mint SX-115 doesn't appear on the block very often, we have to conclude that the price wasn't too far off the mark.

Although the AWA Conference is still the largest meet in the country, unfortunately, it is close to losing that status. In 2006, registered attendees totaled only 400, down from 981 in 2001. As an example of what's

happening at other meets around the country, the paid attendance at the February 2006, one-day Radio XXX-VII in Westford, Massachusetts, was 453 — including family members, the total attendance was 725.

AWA's attendance has dropped, largely, we contend, because the conference is open only to members. Unfortunately, "walk-ins" are required to join AWA for \$20, in addition to paying the \$29 conference fee, even though they may only want to walk around the flea market. These charges are a serious disincentive to the person with a casual interest in radio who could potentially turn into a real radio aficionado.

Of course, in addition to the auction, there is still much to enjoy at AWA — the wonderful contest entries, the presentations by members who are "gifted in historical knowledge," as Ray Chase puts it, and the camaraderie. Unfortunately, I was unable to attend this year, a rare happening for me, but A.R.C. was represented by Bobby Lyman at our booth, and we're grateful to Ray Chase for his detailed report.

Several interesting items are pictured in *Photo Review* this month. The two speakers are unusual in that the Franklin is made of carved wood, while the Majestic is made of celluloid. The Casa Montes crystal set is unusual in more ways than one, not the least of which is that it was manufactured in Spain. But surely of all the items on these pages, the "Little Squirt" crystal set takes the prize.

One of the great things about antique radio collectors is their willingness to share information. *Radio Miscellanea* includes tips about restoration and sources of covered wire, as well as the availability of a GE video with TV emphasis. And once again we're reminded by readers of the need to watch out for fraud. As more and more people have access to e-mail, the danger of being victimized increases.

MEET AND AUCTION REPORT

Antique Radio Club of Illinois Radiofest XXV — August 3-5, 2006

The Antique Radio Club of Illinois (ARCI) held its annual Radiofest meet beginning Thursday August 3, 2006, at the Holiday Inn of Bollingbrook, Illinois. The hotel is conveniently located about 30 miles southwest of Chicago's O'Hare airport on Remington Road near the intersection of Illinois routes 55 and 53 with easy access from the metro Chicago area and suburbs.

A number of recommendations from last year were implemented including a more centrally located hospitality tent, improved signage and better layout of the flea market area to improve the traffic flow. These and other improvements made this year's event much more comfortable.

Radiofest officially started on Thursday afternoon with preregistration from 4 to 6 P.M. New this year was an opening party held outside on the grass near the hotel pool at 7 P.M. Approximately 70 people attended the party and were treated to free hors d'oeuvres and a cash bar. Everyone had a great time meeting and getting

acquainted with fellow radio collectors.

Flea market trading officially began on Friday morning at 7 A.M. The weather could not have been better — partly to mostly sunny skies with highs in the mid-80s every day. This year 202

seller spaces were sold, about the same as last year. I was there at 6:30 A.M., and the activity was already brisk. The general public was welcome to come in for flea market shopping at no charge.

Registration was available beginning at 7 A.M. with Julia Bart and Judy Huether greeting sellers. The hospitality tent also opened at 7 A.M. hosted again this year by Janet and Jack LaVelle. Cold drinks, chips, some of Janet's homemade cookies, and a shady place to sit down were available, all for a goodwill donation. For lunch the hotel served hot dogs, burgers, fries and side dishes under the tent.

The special event Amateur station AR9CI, coordinated by Jim Novak, WA9FIH, began operation at 8 A.M. The station used all classic tube type equipment generously loaned for the occasion by Dale Svetanoff WA9ENA. Dale, along with Chris Farley, KC9IEQ and Ed Schumacher, WA9GQK, took turns operating. They made 32 contacts and special event QSL cards will be sent.

George Wilder did free radio appraisals again this year. The appraisal booth is a walk-up service for anyone who would like to know what a particular radio is approximately worth. This year 29 appraisals were done. We were very happy to have about 30 Boy Scouts participate again this year — twice the number we had last year. Merit badges in "Radio" and "Collections" were earned.





Chuck Schwark, assisted by Toni Blesy and Mike Bart, conducted the Radiofest antique equipment contest. There were 30 entries this year in the following categories: Commemorative, Character, Planes-Trains-Automobiles, Military, Pre-1930s, Cathedral, Tombstone, Transistor, Hidden, Speakers and Open.

An all day series of excellent one-hour programs began at 9 A.M. John Bart assisted the presentations by providing technical support for the computer-based multimedia system. Attendees numbered 35 to 50 at the discussions on four interesting topics.

Opening the day, Felicia Kreuzer and her son James presented a slide show about their collection of very early Marconi wireless equipment. Felicia and her husband Jim have a museum quality collection of Marconi wireless transmitters and receivers. She explained how and where pieces were acquired and related amusing anecdotes about finding and transporting rare and unusual old wireless gear.

Because of the Kreuzer's Marconi knowledge, the Titanic Museum in Branson, Missouri, contacted them for help. The facility, then under construction, is a half scale reproduction of the famous *Titanic* ocean liner anchored in water to create the illusion of being at sea. For a historically accurate display, the museum sought to acquire genuine Marconi wireless equipment identi-





cal to what would have been used on the ship. Felicia explained how she and Jim had supplied equipment and worked with the museum staff to recreate the *Titanic* wireless room faithfully.

Charlie Stinger hosted a fascinating presentation about entrepreneur and businessman Powel Crosley, Jr. Charlie is a retired engineer who worked at Crosley radio station WLW. He told the history of Powel Crosley's growing up, his first businesses, and his fascination with anything automotive.

Crosley's business interest was drawn to the rapidly growing radio parts and manufacturing business. Radio station WLW followed in order to serve the market for radios. Charlie explained how WLW initially went on the air with a makeshift 50-watt transmitter. Always wanting more power, Crosley upgraded the transmitter several times, reaching 50 kilowatts in 1928. He petitioned the government and received permission to upgrade WLW to 500 kilowatt operation. With this goal reached, he contracted RCA to design and build the world's largest transmitter.


Using numerous original photographs, Charlie discussed the construction of the transmitter and erection of the huge WLW broadcasting tower, (Continued on following page)

which is still standing. The new transmitter officially went on the air in the spring of 1934. Charlie listed a number of interference problems it caused as far away as Canada. The 500 KW transmitter remained in regular service until March 1, 1939, when the semiannual renewal for the high power permit was denied. WLW and all other broadcasting stations were henceforth limited to 50 kilowatts by law.

Noted Zenith enthusiasts Alan Jespersion of Great Northern Antiques and Frank Rasada hosted a history of the Zenith Radio Company. A rare Zenith promotional film produced in the late 1920s showed the construction of a Zenith console radio. Beginning with the raw materials coming into the factory, everything involved with the construction was shown. The various departments all contributed to the manufacturing of electronic components, punching chassis parts, assembly line construction of the chassis, cabinetmaking and finally alignment and crating. Alan and Frank continued with the history of Zenith and the company's major accomplishments.

For the final presentation, Marc Ellis explained the early spark gap days of Amateur radio around 1910. He related the story of how Hiram Maxim and Clarence Tuska founded the American Radio Relay League. He described and compared the basic vacuum tube oscillator circuits, such as the Hartley, Colpitts, Tuned Plate-Tuned Grid and Tuned Plate-Untuned Grid.

Marc explained that low power, one-tube Amateur radio transmitters using these circuits are built today using only parts and tubes that were available in the late 1920s. These transmitters are used in low power DX (long distance) Amateur radio contests. He displayed several samples to illustrate how assembly is done essentially in the same way as it would have been in 1930 using hand-wound coils and the old breadboard style construction.

At noon Janet LaVelle again hosted the very

popular annual Ladies Luncheon in the hotel restaurant at which 21 women were treated to door prizes and a raffle. Raffle items included a 1950s radio theme, print decorated, throw pillow and a porcelain figure. Janet also provided small gifts for everyone in attendance.

Friday evening the banquet opened with a cash bar and presentation of awards. There were 90 reserved seats this year. The President's Choice





Volunteer of The Year Award went to Bill Smith for his outstanding work on the club newsletter for the last four years. The newsletter has undergone great improvements, and his work is greatly appreciated.

Steve Muchow and Chuck Schwark presented the Dr. Ralph Muchow Best of Show award to Tom Burgess for his 1942 Galvin Manufacturing (later to be Motorola) Models SCR511/BC745A "Pogo Stick" military radio display. Geoffrey Bourne received the People's Choice award for his display of an S.G. Brown Sphinx Model 991 speaker, made in the 1920s. Rounding out the evening, the Crown Vics, a retro-

1950s style rock and roll band, gave a great performance.

On Saturday morning, many of the Friday flea market booths were still open. This year the main auction was moved outside to the hospitality tent for a more informal country auction atmosphere with about 60 people attending. The minimum opening bid was \$25. Auctioneer Harry Blesy kept the bidding lively while Art Bilski and Chuck Schwark assisted with showing. There were 41 lots placed up for auction. Twenty lots were sold for a total of \$825. Following the main auction a free auction sellers raffle was held.

The very popular donation auction followed the main auction. Over 30 bidders picked up bargains. I bought a colorful 1960s era store window U-Test-M "drug

RADIO MISCELLANEA

When I do reply to foreign inquiries and explain that shipping costs will likely exceed the price of the merchandise (plus taxes and customs fees), and also the item will not work there because of voltage and frequency differences, it seems not to register with most of these so-called "buyers."

Many are also acting as a "broker" for a second buyer. Most also want to arrange inspection and pick-up through someone else or a cartage company. Some want me to pay this out of the extra money on the check, and one even generously offered to wire transfer the money directly to my bank account. All he needed was the bank account number to do this!

So far, in three month's worth of "For Sale" ads, I've had quite a few e-mail replies, but most were just fishing expeditions looking for a lower price. While I can't prove it, many of these were probably fraudulent. Whenever I started to question these so-called eager "buyers" too closely, I would stop hearing from them.

Please continue to alert your readers frequently to anyone who seems too eager to buy something without knowing much about it and who wants to arrange "creative" shipping and financing. This alert would apply especially to inquiries from any foreign country.

Keep up the good work with A.R.C. I have bought and sold many things through A.R.C. with no problem.

Buffing Wheel Cleans Dial Cover

Dear Editor:

In restoring a Zenith 6D525 wooden table radio, I was able to use a cloth buffing wheel and jeweler's rouge to polish the 4-inch square plastic dial cover to a very clear, acceptable condition. All of the haziness and a good bit of the yellow were removed.

The buffing wheel was mounted in a low speed drill press, the wheel was dressed with rouge, and the dial cover (removed from the cabinet) was pressed lightly against the rotating wheel. Most of the hazing was on the outside surface, but both inside and outside should be buffed.

Use both hands to hold the plastic cover, and do not press too hard or the spinning wheel will "catch" the dial cover and throw it across the room! Always wear safety glasses. If the plastic is cracked, deeply scratched, pitted, or discolored beyond buffing, then a replacement from any of the sources in A.R.C. can be obtained at reasonable cost.

Since the buffed plastic is still very slightly yellow, it matches the well-worn cabinet and the two aged, original, miniature, white plastic "Z" knobs. Also, it does not scream, "new part, new part."




FRANKLIN CONE SPEAKER – This pressed-wood cone speaker was marketed by the Franklin Radio Co. of Chicago. It is 18" in diameter and stands 20½" tall. If you look in Chidester's *Classic Cones*, you will notice that this speaker is identical to the Trimm Model 80B. The Trimm Co. may have sold the rights to Franklin in order to sell out its stock. (John Drake – Madison, CT)



CASA MONTES CRYSTAL SET – This rather unusual crystal radio was manufactured in Spain by Casa Montes of Madrid. It has the unique double-swivel detector with catwhisker-type wire. The slide tuner has cotton-covered wire. The hardware, including the nameplate, is all brass. It measures 8¼" x 5½" at the base and stands 4¼" tall (David Pope – Plymouth, MA)



CHANNEL MASTER MODEL 6263 – This bright lime-green, plastic clock radio operates using six transistors. It was manufactured sometime around the mid-1960s. (Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NE)



GENERAL ELECTRIC MODEL GD-52 – Manufactured in 1938, this 6-tube radio sold originally for \$125. It has six push buttons and two thumbwheel controls. It tunes the broadcast band. (Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NE)

MAJESTIC GGH MODEL WG-10 – Manufactured by the Grigsby-Grunow-Hinds Co, this horn speaker has a metal base with black Pyralin (celluloid) upper horn and neck. The horn's diameter is 12½" and the speaker stands 22" tall. Other celluloid models were offered in mahogany, Japanese pearl and mother-of-pearl. (John Drake – Madison, CT)



LITTLE SQUIRT CRYSTAL SET – This unique crystal set was fabricated by a radio collector with imagination. The detector is an inexpensive catwhisker type missing the glass dome. The Fahnestock clips and an adjustable, "squeezeable" coil of wire were all mounted to a ceramic base depicting a little Bulldog using the services of a bright red fire hydrant. The complete unit measures less than 3" wide x 2½" tall. (David Pope – Plymouth, MA)



CRC RADIO CO. "KING" – The only clues to the identity of this small cathedral are the word "King" on the dial escutcheon and "CRC Radio Co., Chicago, Illinois" on the chassis. About 13 inches tall, it is a 4-tube, transformer-operated TRF, using two Type 24A tubes, one Type 47, and one Type 80. If you recognize it, please send details to A.R.C. (Tom Ackerman – Germantown, IL)



PHILCO MODEL 630X – This 6-tube console was manufactured in 1936 by the Philco Storage Battery Company of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. It tunes broadcast and shortwave bands. (Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NE)

MEET AND AUCTION REPORT

Antique Wireless Association Conference and Auction Report Rochester, New York — August 23-26, 2006

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

The 45th AWA conference was held August 23-26, 2006, at the RIT Conference Center, Rochester, New York, as it had been for many years. However, a different schedule was in effect. The flea market opening was moved to Thursday, and the auction was held on Saturday with programs on Thursday and Friday. Nevertheless, on Wednesday evening, one program was held and flea market setup was allowed. Selling was prohibited until Thursday, but this rule was not enforced, and selling did take place during the Wednesday setup.

Thursday, the opening day of the flea market, was blessed with excellent weather, but the flea market area was further reduced from last year and there were many spaces unoccupied. Still, the action on Thursday morning was brisk, and some good gear changed hands.

The Thursday morning lecture by Bengt Svenson on his new book was very well attended. A sellout at the auction, the book is about early 20th century engineer Ernst Alexanderson and his important work on the development of telegraphy, telephony, radio and television.

There were two full days of programs on Thurs-

day and Friday and most of them were exceptionally good and well attended. Fortunately, AWA has a membership gifted in historical knowledge and a willingness to put together presentations that enlighten and entertain the rest of us. A lot of effort goes into creating this exchange of information, and that makes the conference well worth attending.

Thursday evening was rainy, and Friday morning was gloomy and cloudy with light intermittent

rain. Nevertheless, in the flea market, a few vendors opened for business at around 7:00 A.M. The weather cleared for a little bit, and it appeared that the flea market might be busy again, but at 10:00 A.M., the rain came down, and that killed any further flea market activity for the meet. The hope may have been that the market could be sustained through Saturday, but the weather caused many sellers to pack up for home on Friday.

The contest theme this year was Military Radio, and there were some outstanding entries, along with others in the rest of the usual categories. I expected more entries in the military category, but perhaps the size and heft of some of the military equipment held some people back. On Thursday, there were a couple of enthusiasts with some operating World War II field communications rigs set up at the rear of the flea market. Nonetheless, the contest entries were excellent and well worth the trip to the conference to see them.

Member Peter Yanczer never ceases to amaze us with his mechanical abilities. In addition to his previously shown working mechanical TV that was operating in the contest (see also the auction report), Peter had fabricated from scratch a "Radio Love Message" arcade machine that actually dispensed a printed message upon deposit of a coin. Peter had seen such a machine in a museum some years ago and was so captivated by it that when he could not find one to purchase, he decided to make a replica himself. This was truly a labor of love and an outstanding piece of work.

THE AUCTION

The auction was moved to Saturday with no separate sales of tubes on the previous evening. The start was moved back to 8:30 A.M., and the auctioneer was Richard Estes, assisted by his brother John, along with Bob Dobush to handle the tube sales. Estes Auctions brought a new level of professionalism to the sale. Overall, there were 380 lots entered and the total sale proceeds were about \$38,000, which is down from last year and

on a par with 2004. Only 328 of the 380 lots were sold due to failure to meet seller reserves. The auction concluded at 2:50 P.M.

An interesting note is that Peter Yanczer had entered his 60-line, mechanical mirror, screw TV complete operating system in the auction with a \$20,000 reserve. Considering the work that went into it, this was an amazing bargain for some museum, but there were no takers. Peter did offer two prototype mirror screw assemblies, one of which sold for \$200.

Overall, the conference was enjoyable, and the shorter scheduling did cut expenses a little. This is the meet where you still see old friendly faces that you don't see anywhere else. Reunions and socialization dominate in a venue that is clean and comfortable. The house restaurant offers an informal, casual atmosphere with good food, and an indoor/outdoor pool and exercise room give attendees options when they hit radio overload.

Still, the trend in attendance continues on a downward spiral with only about 400 registered attendees. Some of the prior problems with this venue have resolved themselves simply by virtue of the reduced participation (lack of parking, need for shuttle buses etc.). One attendee reported on the Internet that he had "a great time and can't wait until next year." Plans for the 2007 conference indicate that it will be at the same place at the same time of year.








