EDITOR'S COMMENTS

In our zeal as collectors to concentrate on sets, hardware, prices, restoration techniques, and the like, we tend to forget about the importance of another aspect of radio history — listening. Our lead article on applause cards by Michael Banks reminds us of the excitement folks felt in those early days about listening to their radios, the prime connection to worlds beyond their own.

These postcards offered by stations, dealers, and manufacturers gave listeners the opportunity to respond to the programs they heard. They were eager to do so; in fact, they not only bragged about picking up faraway stations, but also sometimes planned "radio parties" via the cards. In turn, the stations and manufacturers used their responses for programming and sales initiatives.

Though short-lived as a research and advertising tool, the cards tell us more about the importance of radio to ordinary lives. Unlike the more professional surveys gauging audience responses that soon replaced them, the applause cards give a personal view of the meaning of radio to early listeners.

Also short-lived in radio history were some companies formed to respond to a specific need of the times. In his ongoing research on companies of the Pacific Northwest, Art Redman has come up with the Shorty Manufacturing Company. Established by the enterprising Reid brothers, Shorty made two short-wave adapters, which allowed an ordinary broadcast receiver additionally to tune the shortwave bands. In the Depression years, these adapters were a cheaper alternative to buying expensive all-band radios.

The concept seemed a sure thing in such hard times. However, the adapters were designed for particular tube types. And, since additional tube types often came onto the market, the adapters soon became obsolete. Thus, the end of another brief success story. It was also the end of a company name, which, though perhaps intended to mean "shortwave," ironically, came to mean "short life."

Even seemingly modest success stories may have surprise, even shocking endings. Both Steve Auyer and Tom Pamula tell stories of sets that appeared to be functioning well enough with no major calamities in sight. Both were stunned by unforeseen events and offer their experiences as food for thought to us all.

Of course, we have reported on other kinds of disasters and their effects on the radio-collecting community. Examples are the California earthquake, 9/11, and Katrina. Steve and Tom report on disasters in their own homes. Steve's overheated capacitor resulted in an explosion that even broke the vacuum tube, while Tom's incorrect pilot lamps destroyed the dial face and caused a potentially serious fire.

Usually, our restoration articles offer practical step-

by-step procedures and are far less dramatic than Steve's and Tom's experiences. But, they offer another side of the story — the potential pitfalls that lurk behind any restoration effort. We're grateful to them for alerting us to situations that could happen to any of us.

Marvin Hess presents a more pleasant surprise ending in his story of an estate sale acquisition. What he thought was a tube portable radio, as the tube diagram label shows, turned out to have transistors professionally installed in a new chassis. The set is the kind of puzzlement that collectors love to decipher, and Marvin would welcome responses from fellow collectors.

Ray Chase reports on another successful Estes Auction. The Fred Bright collection totalled more than \$100,000, including many items over \$1,000 each. An unusual Echophone 3-tube set went for \$2,700, while an Atwater Kent neon sign in excellent condition was a highlight at \$4,300. Ham, paper, and other advertising items also made a good showing.

Ray makes an interesting point about the need to remember the old adage "One man's trash is another man's treasure." Richard Estes salvaged some items which had been considered not salable and destined for the trash. They added a few thousand dollars to the auction total.

RADIO EPHEMERA

Early Radio Applause Cards

BY MICHAEL A. BANKS

Listener appreciation of radio broadcasts in the form of "applause cards" had to be of great value to early radio's programmers, as well as to manufacturers and dealers who were eager to take advantage of this way of seizing public attention.

Michael Bank's article has been augmented with two cards from your editor's collection. Donald Ignatius also had sent in cards earlier, suggesting an article on Crosley applause cards. Here at last is a combined finished product. (Editor)

In the early days of commercial radio broadcasting, listener reports were a valuable source of information on listener demographics. Broadcasters encouraged listeners to write in, and sometimes offered prizes. But radio audiences in the 1920s didn't require much prompting; most radio fans were so enthusiastic that they were glad to share their listening experiences with anyone.

The simplest way to send a listener report was with a penny postcard, and this quickly became the preferred medium for listener reports. The typical listener report consisted of the date and time, along with the name of the show received, and a brief comment or two. The cards became known as "applause cards," because they were used to convey appreciation of a station or specific show.

A few enthusiastic radio fans had special postcards printed. These carried a note of appreciation and blank spaces for time, date, and station/program information. The standard card carried a message along the lines of

PROMOTION

A few enterprising individuals got into the business of printing applause cards for sale; however, the fledgling industry died almost before it got off the ground. Competition was too keen from the radio and radio equipment manufacturers who seized on the idea of applause cards as a means of promotion.

Companies such as Crosley Radio Corporation and Zenith Radio packed several applause cards with each new set. As seen in the accompanying illustrations, manufacturer applause cards noted the brand of set used.

The Crosley Radio Corporation took things a step farther and included several invitation cards for new Crosley owners to use to invite their friends over for a radio party (a popular urban event in the early 1920s). As can be seen, these cards also plugged Crosley sets, hopefully encouraging the friends of the new radio owners to buy the same. A 1924 marketing survey indicated that current radio owners were the biggest influence in new radio purchases.


As shown here, applause cards were also distributed by dealers, such as the Parkside Electrical Shop and the Dictograph Company, which made radio speakers. The messages encouraged the public to come in and load up more cards for free.

Applause cards were sometimes used to advertise nonradio goods, usually by companies that sponsored radio programs. Among many others, the Waterman Ink Pen Company and Happiness Candy Stores distributed free applause cards through its retailers. Radio stations often sent out preprinted applause cards for their listeners to use as well.

Radio applause cards were a relatively short-lived phenomenon. They came into existence when radio first became popular in 1922, and faded around 1926. By that time, radio was no longer the novelty it once was, and stations began relying on professional surveys, advertiser results, and other means of gauging the extent of their audiences.

Applause cards turn up now and then on eBay. When they do, they usually sell in the \$5 to \$8 range, used or unused. Used applause cards are sometimes of greater value if they mention a specific, well-known performer or were sent to a

popular radio station like WOR, WGN, WLW, or KEAF. Applause cards advertising nonradio merchandise are the rarest.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Shorty Manufacturing Company

Art Redman is a source of serious research on radio manufacturers of the Pacific Northwest. His previous articles in A.R.C. were "Northwestern Radio Manufacturing Company" in September 2005 and "Hallock and Watson" in June 2006. (Editor)

In the early 1930s, interest in shortwave listening increased when several radio manufacturing companies had a police band feature on wavelengths above the standard broadcast band. The nation was in the midst of the Great Depression, and a low-cost alternative to expensive shortwave radios and converters was needed. Sparton and Stewart-Warner were already manufacturing shortwave converters by 1933. This demand prompted thirty-five year old Ray Leith Reid and his brother George S. Reid to manufacture less expensive shortwave adapters. The idea of adding a low-cost, plug-in tuner box to an existing radio was a sure thing.

The Reid brothers' Shorty Manufacturing Company was located at 2730 East Burnside Street in Portland, Oregon, where the market for shortwave radios was especially strong. KGPP or "Government Portland Police," the 500-watt police radio station, was located on the southwest slope of Mt. Tabor at Water Reservoir No. 5. It was on the air at 2.442 MHz beginning in 1932. In addition, the airport radio station at Swan Island created strong local interest in shortwave, thereby creating an additional selling point for the Shorty adapters.

THE SHORTY PRODUCTS

The Shorty Company produced two shortwave adapter models — the Shorty and the All-Aire. These adapters, shown in Figures 1 and 2, were designed for use with broadcast-band radios that used either a triode or a screen-grid tube as a detector. Closeups of the dials for the Shorty and the All-Aire mod-




Figure 4. Close up of the dial and knob for the All-Aire shortwave adapter.

els are shown in Figures 3 and 4.

B+ and filament voltages for the adapters are obtained from the broadcast radio by means of a cable and tube socket. Figure 5 shows the cable and the tube socket with the broadcast radio's triode detector tube plugged into the tube socket. The tube's pins extend through the inverted wafer socket, and the tube and socket are then plugged into the radio's detector socket.




Figure 6. The schematic diagram for the Shorty model adapter.

The schematic diagram for the Shorty model is shown in Figure 6. It is a regenerative detector. The antenna and ground wires are connected to the broadcast radio's antenna and ground terminals. If the broadcast receiver used a triode detector, the black and red wires are connected. If a screen-grid detector is used, then the black and green are connected. The adapter could also be used with receivers having 6.3-volt tube filaments. The company recommended a good

35-foot outside aerial and a good ground.

What was unique about the Shorty adapters was that the radio's detector tube remained in place and was not removed and replaced by a socket plug. The wafer connected the adapter to the B+ supply and filament voltages of the broadcast band radio. Also the antenna and ground wires were connected to the radio receiver, unlike other adapters of the 1930s which had separate antenna and ground posts.

THE SHORTY COMPANY MODELS

The Shorty model adapters were housed

in tombstone style wood cabinets. The company interchanged model names so a collector could find an adapter with a Type 36 or a Type 24A screen-grid tube, or a Type 37 triode, depending on which label was placed on the bottom. Cabinet labels are shown in Figures 7 and 8.

The Shorty model with the Type 37 triode tube measured $6\frac{5}{16}$ " high x $6\frac{7}{16}$ " long x $4\frac{5}{8}$ " wide. The label on the underside had a space to write in both the police and airport frequencies. This model had a 72-ohm RF choke in the plate circuit and two controls — a variable 0.00016 mfd, 7-plate tuning capacitor, which controlled regeneration, and a 2-plate trimmer capacitor.

The All-Aire model used only a Type 24A or 36 screen-grid tube. It measured 7" high x $7\frac{1}{4}$ " long x $4\frac{5}{8}$ " wide and had a "patent pending" stamp. It weighed two pounds, and had an additional variable 92K resistor controlling screen grid voltage and thereby volume.

The 2.5-megohm grid leak resistor was made by the International Resistance Company. The 0.00025 mfd grid leak bypass capacitor mounted under a 40-gauge galvanized sheet metal chassis was made by the Girard Hopkins Company of San Francisco.

SHORTY ADAPTERS IN USE

Mike Parker, an owner of the All-Aire adapter with a Type 24A screen-grid tube, reports that it works well with his Atwater Kent Model 40 receiver. The reason for this is that his receiver has a Type 27 triode tube detector,

which is not always the case with other receivers.

Poor shortwave reception often resulted from using an improper receiver. Using the plate voltage of standard broadcast receivers often leads to over 180 volts being applied to the plates of the detector tube or voltages too low in the case of resistance coupled amplifiers. Also the amplification of the broadcast radio's RF amplifier is lost and not enough audio gain is provided in receivers with only one stage of audio amplification. Alfred Ghlardi in his book *Radio Physics Course* went so far as to recommend a shortwave converter instead of an adapter "unless the receiver is of such design that proper voltages are provided for an adapter."

The Shorty Company adapters were intended for receiving local shortwave stations in the Portland area, such as the police and airport stations described earlier.

THE SHORTY COMPANY 1934-1940

According to city directories, the Shorty Company was in the manufacturing business only in 1934 and 1935 with production limited to two models. By 1936, Types 27, 24A and 37 tubes were obsolete and were replaced by the octal type. It is not known wheth-

er the Reid Brothers ever tried to market their adapters beyond the Portland area and how many adapters were sold outside Oregon and Southwest Washington.

From 1936 to 1939, as the Shorty Radio and Electric Company, Ray Reid sold radios having shortwave bands, which helped to make the original adapters obsolete. In 1940, the company was no more. Today the former factory site on 2730 East Burnside Street is a barber shop.

The Reid Brothers, outside of local radio collectors, are not known for their entry into the radio manufacturing business. Ray worked as a barber and cab driver in Oregon City, Oregon, and died in 1966 at the age of 67. He was an active sports fisherman. George died in 1982 at the age of 79 and worked for the Colyear Motor Company in Salem, Oregon, for 35 years.

RESTORATION TOPICS

The Big Bang Capacitor

Our hobby is divided over the matter of capacitor replacement. One school of thought says "replace them all," while the other believes that only the suspicious or known faulty capacitors should be replaced. This article may give you a different perspective. (Editor)

While I was at the AWA Convention in August I picked up two radios. There was nothing special about them – they were just GE 5-tube, AC/DC sets from the 1950s and 1960s, but I like to play with the old table-top radios occasionally.

Neither set is anything special, but one has a two-piece, brown/cream plastic case, and several of those "atom" symbols that you saw on things in the 1960s. There is no model number on the set, and the only identifying mark is the inscription on the tuning dial "Dial Beam," a GE feature which was really just a plastic dial that rotated in front of the pilot light. The radio is shown in Figure 1.

When I opened the set up, it didn't need too much work done on it. The electrolytic filter capacitors had to be replaced, of course, and one paper capacitor had dried up and lost value. But other than that everything appeared to be in order — note the word "appeared." The radio began playing as I slowly brought the voltage up with a Variac. A little adjustment of the alignment and the set played nicely.

THE BIG BANG




Figure 2. What I found inside the cabinet after a loud "BANG."

I decided to let the set play for a while in the kitchen and went into the next room to watch a little TV. I was very surprised several hours later when I heard a loud "BANG" from the kitchen, followed by the tinkle of broken glass. Going to investigate, I noted that the radio had stopped playing. When I removed two screws and pulled off the back of the cabinet, broken glass and pieces of aluminum foil fell out. Figure 2 shows what I saw. More inspection revealed that the 35W4 rectifier tube had been blown apart, and the chassis was covered with scraps of




Figure 3. A close look at the radio's printed circuit board and components. Note the fractured 35W4 rectifier tube and the remains of the paper capacitor.

paper and aluminum foil, as shown in Figure 3.




Figure 4. An example of the type of black plastic-encased paper capacitor that failed.

Figure 4 shows a similar type of black capacitor that was missing from the top of the circuit card. A little checking revealed that this capacitor was rated at

0.47mF/200VDC and was directly across the B+ line. It was not marked with a manufacturer's name, but it was a type that indicated value by a series of color bands around the capacitor, much as was done with resistors. Unfortunately, it was destroyed in the explosion, and the only unit I could find in my junk box to photograph did not have the color bands.

Apparently what had happened was that the capacitor had developed high leakage and heated up internally. The resulting pressure was contained in the plastic case until it built up enough to burst the case, spread the innards of the capacitor all over the radio, and take out the 35W4 tube in the process.

I had heard that while these black plastic-cased capacitors look nice, they fail at least as often in these old radios as do the paper-cased capacitors. But this is the first time that I've ever had a capacitor other than an electrolytic build up enough internal pressure to literally explode. Anyone else have an experience like this?

Zenith 9S55 Console — "Fire It Up!"

After a harrowing experience, Tom Pamula is able to share some safety measures for all of us involved in repair and restoration projects. (Editor)

It was a Wednesday afternoon when Mike, a long-time friend and collector, stopped by for a visit. After talking for a few minutes, he asked, "You still having trouble with that Zenith?"

"Yes!" I said, "Still can't figure out its problem."

HISTORY OF THE SET

First, some background. The radio, a 1936 Zenith 9S55 console, was given to me years ago. The cabinet is shown in Figure 1. It was in bad shape. The cabinet and the chassis needed total restoration, and the Zenith sat in my shop for years. One day I decided it was time for it to come back to life.

After a month of work, the radio is in like-new condition, and was playing great. I had restored the

cabinet, which required replacement of the veneer and total refinishing, as well as the electrical system, which included recapping the chassis, replacing out-of-tolerance resistors, and alignment.

About a week before Mike dropped by, I had powered it up. I regularly power up the few consoles I own to "keep them going." Well, "Surprise!" — the dial belt was broken. OK, no big deal. Back down to my shop for a repair. With the dial belt replaced, the radio was back in good shape, except I kept hearing an arcing sound coming from the speaker.

I set the line voltage with a Variac to 90 volts. The arcing noise disappeared. Turning the Variac to 120 volts, the arcing noise reappeared. I checked all kind of things and never could find the source of the problem.

THE PRESENT

Now, to the present. Mike was here to bail me out.

Down in my shop, the chassis was on the bench, and, of course, Mike said, "Fire it up."

Well, I explained to Mike that on 90 volts it played well, as I demonstrated to him. No arcing noise. But at 120 volts, an arcing noise was heard.

Mike reached over and turned the Variac up to 120 volts and instantly smoke poured from inside of the cabinet — the dial scale had caught on fire! By the time I grabbed the fire extinguisher and fumbled to release the safety pin, the radio now had two-foot flames coming from it, and the dial scale was fully engulfed in flames. This all happened in less than five seconds! I pulled the trigger on the fire extinguisher and put the fire out.

After the massive amount of smoke and the cloud of yellow dust from the fire extinguisher settled, both our hearts were racing. We just looked at each other. What the heck had happened?

I don't know what kind of plastic that the dial scale was made of, but it went up in flames quicker than a dried-out Christmas tree! It was extremely flammable.

We looked over the damage. Mike said, "Did you notice how bright the pilot lamps were?"

"Yes," I said, "I did see that." Just before the fire, the pilot lamps had appeared white hot.

Examination of the dial assembly showed that the solder on the lamp sockets was melted and the wires badly burnt. Just for the heck of it we removed the pilot lamps and checked their continuity. They were good! We couldn't believe it. We had assumed that the arcing noise was from one of the sockets or that the lamps got so hot it caught the dial scale on fire.

Examining the pilot lamps, we found that they were rated at 2.5 volts. Just for the heck of it we connected




Figure 2. A close-up of the dial remnants — only about 20 percent remains.

them to a power supply at 2.5 volts, and they lit up fine. Still not believing that they could get as bright as they did and not burn out, I ran the supply up to 15 volts. The bulbs just glowed white hot, but did not burn out. Still a mystery to us.

I told another friend about our experience. He said, "Hey Tom, those pilot lamps are supposed to be 6.3 volts not 2.5." A quick look in Rider's proved him correct.

I had played this radio for years and there never was a problem. I never replaced the pilot lamps because they had come with the radio, and the dial scale never seemed too bright. Why would I check something that was working? Could an incorrect dial lamp have been causing the arcing problem all along?

In over 30 years of repairing radios this is a first fire experience and, hopefully, a last. But, here are the lessons learned:

(1) I will never leave my shop, not even for two seconds, with anything powered up on the bench.

(2) I will never leave a radio powered up in one of the rooms in my home without being in that room. What if I had left the room with this radio powered up as I usually do?

(3) I will always keep a fire extinguisher on every floor (which I do anyway), as well as smoke detectors.

Looking back on this I'm not sure which is worse — the loss of my radio, or cleaning up the drywall-like dust from the fire extinguisher, which will take me weeks.

It all worked out, and it could have been a lot worse. As you have probably guessed, I am in need of a restorable chassis for this 9S55. Any help would be much appreciated. This radio is not gonna die — yet!

The bottom line — I guess this story puts a new meaning to the phrase, "Fire it up!"

Sentinel Model IU-355P — One-of-a-Kind

Radio purchases made in flea markets, yard sales, and estate auctions frequently contain a surprise or two. Marvin Hess's find proved that to be true. (Editor)

I was late arriving at an estate sale, but as luck would have it, a tube portable was still there for sale. It was a Sentinel portable radio, shown in Figure 1, and it looked very good.




Figure 3. This view of the professionally made chassis

When I got home, I opened the back to check the inside. The inside label read, "Model IU-355P," as shown in Figure 2. To my surprise, there were transistors in the radio, not tubes! See Figures 3 and 4.




Figure 5. The label shows the tube layout for the Model IU-355P.

Figure 5 is the chassis layout for the Model IU-355P and shows the location of where the tubes would have gone. The rod antenna and speaker also are shown.

However, the chassis is not a worked-over tube chassis. Someone had very professionally formed a new chassis and stamped out holes for the transistor sockets, the IF cans, the speaker, and all other components generally in the same place as on the chassis layout for the tube radio. The volume control and variable condenser are positioned to use the original holes in the case.

The work is most professional. The chassis has all the appearance of an engineering development model. The placement of the ce-

ramic trimmer capacitors on the rear apron of the chassis also suggests that this radio was not a production model. I can only assume this was a lab-built model that got out in the trade somehow.

AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auctions — The Fred Bright Collection Burbank, Ohio — June 24, 2006

The June 24th Estes Auction featured the collection of Fred Bright of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. This was a large auction with a great number of phonograph items, paper goods, and quality radios. The total value of sales that I recorded was \$99,946, not including the 5 percent buyer's premium charged at this location. I missed a fair number of items, especially at the end and at side auctions, so the total sale value was well over \$100,000.

As usual, the main auction started at 10:00 A.M. and lasted until about 5:50 P.M., although I stopped recording at about 5:20 P.M. However, an auction of low value items was held at 9:30 A.M. off to the side in the checkout area. Most of these items sold in the \$1 to \$5 range, sometimes in groups of two or three. This part of the sale was not recorded.

Another variation in this sale was that the paper items were sold by the piece, along with the tube and radio items, rather than

being sold "choice." This allowed me to record their prices for the first time, some of which were surprisingly high, especially the Western Electric pieces. There were over 20 crystal sets, a fair assortment of Ham gear, but very few console radios. Some of the better radios did have minor modifications.

Richard Estes commented that when he went to pick up the estate, he noted that the owner had tossed some items into the trash, commenting that they were not worth anything. Richard pulled quite a few of them out and brought them to the auction. All told they contributed about \$2,000 to the sale bottom line, including a Fine Arts Gabriel cone speaker frame that sold for \$800. Remember that saying: "One man's trash is another man's treasure!"



This auction also had an unusually large number of tube lots,

and during the main auction, several side auctions were held to dispose of bulk tube lots and batches of test equipment. The weather was fine for this Saturday auction, but this part of Ohio had suffered severe rainy weather for two days prior, and flooding was evident in some locations. There was a good crowd present for this noteworthy sale, and most bidders went home with new acquisitions of one sort or another.
