





EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Looking over the editorial pages this month, I realize how many of our contributors either own or have access to rare and unusual sets. When they share these treasures with us through their articles in A.R.C., we all become even more aware of the depth of antique radio history. We are grateful for their generosity and for their contribution to our avocation — the preservation of antique radios.

An excellent example is the report by Dave Crocker about the Alan Douglas Museum in Pocasset, Massachusetts. Though most of us associate Alan with his widely read books, *Radios of the 1920's*, many may be unaware of the range of his eclectic collection. Dave has visited Alan's museum many times, but he still conveys a sense of awe when he describes the contents of Alan's house and barn.

Rare and unusual radios abound here, but beyond that, Alan's interests extend to communication receivers, mechanical musical instruments, including a pipe organ, early gas engines, and, of course, a vast library. All are meticulously restored and preserved. It's a pleasure to take this tour through Alan's museum, which most would agree is a vintage collector's wonderland.

Two other articles this month also touch upon the unusual. John Eckland writes about a Remler 88 from 1935, which he had faithfully restored. The set is an example of his larger subject — early efforts by many manufacturers to improve the fidelity of audio and radio equipment.

The Model 88 was Remler's attempt to achieve the best sound in a small cabinet, while most such efforts by other companies, according to John, were made with larger consoles. The Remler speaker system is an example of the early use of speaker types and combinations that became common only years later.

In the second article, a radio with a somewhat misleading name, "The El Personal Cordless," is described by Jerry Wieland. This set looks like a typical, plastic, tabletop radio. However, it turns out to be a true portable in its use of transistors and enclosed batteries in a table radio, which certainly put it in the "unusual" category. The identifying mark "TOPP Model RT-6" is also a mystery that Jerry would like help in solving.

There is no mystery about the success of the November 2006 VRPS convention in Mesquite, Texas, reported by George Potter. This event is one of the largest in the U. S. and contains all the usual elements of multiday meets: auctions, seminars, contest, flea market, and banquet.

VRPS differs from other meets in that the auctions precede the flea market. In fact, the flea market occurs only at the end, as a Sunday morning event, and the leftovers from the auctions show up

there. I have attended the VRPS convention in the past and appreciated this arrangement because it means that everyone has a chance at choice items since they come up at the auctions. It also means that you don't have to get up pre-dawn to compete in the dark of the flea market with a flashlight!

VRPS features multiple auctions — three main and two silent. The grand total was over \$40,000. Celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Audion tube, the old equipment contest featured "Anything DeForest" resulting in some outstanding displays. This is an event well worth making the center of a plan for a fall vacation.

Jim Moneghan's review of Alfred Balk's *The Rise of Radio — from Marconi through the Golden Age* makes it clear that this is a book to enrich your library. The book's focus is the evolution of broadcasting, but as Jim says, there is so much more, including the history of the industry. Furthermore, Balk's writing style makes for pleasurable reading. We appreciate Jim's insightful comments.

Radio Miscellanea offers a variety of welcome letters. The discussion about editorial choices is a reminder of the old cliché, "You can't please all of the people all of the time." We strive for variety so that, at the very least, we please all of you some of the time. Of course, we welcome letters of appreciation, as well as those with additional information. Please keep your comments coming.

We referred to Volume 1 of his *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's* to learn that the set was adapted from the Chinese Chippendale style and sold for \$94 in 1929.

COLLECTOR PROFILE

A Visit to the Alan Douglas Museum

When collections become too large for homes, the next step is to find space elsewhere, and sometimes that space becomes a "Museum." Here's the story of the impressive Alan Douglas museum. Alan is a historian who is quick to share his knowledge with fellow collectors. We are pleased that Dave Crocker has compiled this tour through Alan's museum for us. (Editor)

Passing by the house in Pocasset on Cape Cod, you would never guess what treasures lie inside the walls. It's just a quiet, rural neighborhood, and the house is a standard white Victorian with a porch and a barn out back that looks like nothing special. Not the exterior, anyway!

But, this is the residence of Alan Douglas, known for his three-volume set of books *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's*. We all know them and refer to them constantly. He is also the author of another book on test equipment called *Tube Testers & Classic Electronic Test Gear*. Alan is well known and respected in the AWA and most other radio circles. He was one of the first radio collectors I met when I started collecting.

This house and barn hold a wealth of historic and antique radios, many of which are pictured in his three-volume set of books. If Alan has it on display, it has been carefully selected, and it is in fantastic original condition.

THE HOUSE

First the house. On the first floor rear, is Alan's library. It is pictured on the back of Alan's book, Volumes 1 and 2. In this library is everything you ever wanted to know about the history of radio, but were afraid to ask. Volumes and volumes of books and reference material are on the shelves along side of some truly rare radio items. Figure 1 shows Alan next to his DeForest Renaissance backed by some of the books in his library.

Step carefully, as scattered on the floor are open books, radio advertising pieces, rare tubes, and projects in progress.

Most of the radios here are vintage wireless and battery sets. If there is a plug-in set, you can be sure it's a first in AC receivers. You will also notice what looks like a Marconi Multiple Tuner sitting atop a pristine Atwater Kent Model 812 console, all shown in Figure 2. Alan built the Marconi years ago from plans in a 1915 Issue of *Scientific American*.

Look some more and you'll see a rare Western Electric 3B receiver. And over there is an ultra rare DeForest W6 "Renaissance" console — and, amazingly enough, the actual Zenith radio that Commander Donald B. MacMillan took aboard his ship the *Bowdoin* on his historic 1925 Arctic expedition!

We won't go there, but down cellar is where I always end up when visiting Alan. When I

get into trouble restoring a radio, I know I can depend on Alan to find the right part in his cellar, which is absolutely filled with — everything! — including manufacturers' literature and catalogs.




Figure 3. Clockwise from the top left is a "Flex-O-Dyne," a British Birmingham Small Arms set, a Crosley Showchest, and a Clapp-Eastham RHM.

Upstairs, there are bedrooms with displays of things like a Clapp-Eastham RHM, a bright red Crosley Showchest, and a Flex-o-Dyne. These sets are shown in Figure 3. This latter set was manufactured by Charles G. Hall of New York City in the mid-1920s and used Telos Vario-Transformers (the same as in the more common Melco Supreme set). The bottom drawer still has the original batteries.

Alan, having an interest in any British set with U.S. connections, has a British Birmingham Small Arms (BSA) set on top of his Crosley Showchest, also shown in Figure 3. BSA is better known for motorcycles and made a short foray into wireless in the mid-1920s using parts and circuitry from Western Electric (or Standard Telephones & Cables, STC, as it was known then). This set uses three peanut tubes (Wecovalves) and a Type 101.

To mention just a few more, a NESCO CN-112 submarine receiver, a National Airphone Monodyne, and an Atwater Kent TA amplifier connected to a Radak HR (sold that way), are shown in Figure 4. A back bedroom displays a couple of consoles and four ship cone speakers, such as a Na-Ald, Vitalitone, and two Tower speakers.

Around the corner is a room jammed with incredibly rare pieces. You can barely walk as the radios are everywhere. Early radios of the teens, dealer display signs, old TVs, Ham receivers and, yes, more radio literature.

As Figure 5 shows, on a shelf is an original Liberty BC14A airplane crystal set, along with an aviator's helmet and phones. Looking around you have to take your time because I guarantee you'll miss a lot.

THE BARN






Figure 6. This unassuming barn behind Alan's house is the main part of the museum, started in 1970.

Now, the barn! Alan began digging a foundation beside the original barn in 1970. Figure 6 shows the barn and the addition. It was here he was to develop his "Museum." Now you pass through the big barn door and past a room filled with (what Alan calls) "ordinary stuff." Not so, as there




Figure 7. In the rear is the swell box for the Aeolian-Skinner player pipe organ; in front is the Mason & Hamlin melodeon; and at far right, a DeForest D-10. The long radio above the keyboard is a 1924, home-brew Receptrad superhet.

are some fantastic pieces stored on those shelves, all awaiting space to be displayed — someday.

Into the main room of the barn, heated incidentally by solar, is a mind-boggling array of items, all of which are in perfect working order. Prominent is the gigantic 1936 Aeolian-Skinner Opus 947 player pipe organ keyboard and swell box. The front of the swell box is seen in Figure 7, and it is comprised of horizontal slats that open and close to act as a dampener to this organ.

Originally installed in the home of a Woolworth heiress, the Aeolian-Skinner organ consists of two manuals and seven ranks and can operate on paper music rolls. If the weather is warm enough, Alan will be happy to play the Aeolian-Skinner with music rolls. The sound is incredible!

The organ keyboard is seen in Figure 8.




Figure 10. An inside rear view of the Wireless Specialty Apparatus CR 1917.

Sitting on top of the Aeolian-Skinner keyboard is a rare Wireless Specialty Apparatus CR 1917, made in 1918. Close-up views of

the panel and the inside rear of the set are shown in Figures 9 and 10.

Alan's collection also includes several interesting communications receivers. Two Millen sets, a DFP 201 and a DFP 501, were to be Millen's post-war receiver line, but only a couple of 201 prototypes were made, along with the single 501, for exhibition in Chicago in 1947. An E.H. Scott RCH, which was primarily used by the Merchant Marine, covers both long-wave and shortwave bands. These sets are shown in Figure 11.

Another item is a Federal 61, which Alan had wanted since 1960, and he ultimately bought it at an Antique Radio Club of America meet. It is hard to believe that, as Alan says, each of the 18 knobs has a definite function.

A very "uncollectible" set sitting on the same shelf as the Federal 61 is a Phanstiehl "one-eyed" set, which Alan appreciated only after he realized how beautiful the cabinet work is. A close-up view of this set can be seen on page 225 of Alan's Volume 2 of *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's*.

Alan also has the first U.S.-made AC set — a Dynamotive Radio Corp. Dynergy RC250. This set, shown in Figure 11, was

manufactured in 1924 and was powered by 110VDC. A separate power pack converted the 110VAC to DC. A close-up of this set can be seen on Page XV of Volume 1 of *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's*. Of course, many other sets from Alan's collection and other collections are detailed in this 3-volume series.




Figure 12. Above the radio tube display is Alan's first radio, an Atwater-Kent 20C. On the left side of the shelf is the cable testing outfit used by the Bay State Street Railway Co., and on the floor is an early "New Way" 1-cylinder engine which pumped water at a local sanitarium.

This main room also contains the lighted tube display shown in Figure 12. Above it is the first radio Alan got as a collector while in

his teens — his grandparents' Atwater Kent Model 20C. Below the tube display is a mirror galvanometer used to test cables during the construction of the Boston Street Railway in 1910, and an early New Way 1-cylinder engine.

This room is special to me, as whenever I come here, I can still see the very first radio I acquired in 1969 — a 1929 Ampico console radio, the very radio that started me on collecting antique radios. I hope Alan never lets it go.

A few other items in the collection, such as a 1907 Seeburg Nickelodeon, are shown in Figure 13. There's a lot more to see, but I can't mention everything — there's just too much!

Among the many, many items is my favorite — a Curtis & Crocker brass-bladed fan run on 110VDC. (I've got first dibs!). It is shown in Figure 14.

Unfortunately, if you go to Alan's museum, you've already missed the 1968 Chevy that is shown on the back cover of his Volume 3. The car is long since gone, and, sadly enough, the old pickup is off the road.

If you decide to visit, Alan will personally guide you on a tour. However, visits have to be set up ahead of time, as Alan still works full-time. He's a very busy person, and says he doesn't have time to get to all the projects he's planned. Best advice is to e-mail him for a visit at adouglas@gis.net.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Remler 88 and Other Early High Fidelity Efforts

In this article, John Eckland describes how radio manufacturers improved the fidelity of high-end console radios and how he discovered a high fidelity table model manufactured by Remler. (Editor)




Figure 2. The 2-way system speaker system used in the Remler 88. The woofer is a 6-inch, high-compliance, electrodynamic made by Jensen. The tweeter is a 2-cell horn type made by Remler.




Figure 3. Another view of the 2-way speaker system. Note that it uses separate output transformers for the woofer and tweeter.




Figure 4. A partially disassembled view of the tweeter. The dark shell at the left is made of molded Bakelite, also made by Remler.

The Remler 88, shown in Figure 1, is a wood tombstone radio introduced for the 1935 model year. It features a 2-way divided speaker system with a properly designed crossover. This speaker system is shown in Figures 2 and 3. The low frequency speaker is a Jensen X series, leather-edged 8-inch. The tweeter is a 2-cell horn manufactured by Remler. It appears similar in construction to a Jensen "Q" series horn used in the Zenith Stratosphere. Both speakers are of field-coll excitation. The tweeter uses a 1-inch, aluminum dome diaphragm. Figure 4 shows the tweeter disassembled.

The radio chassis features a 15-watt, all-triode, fixed bias, push-pull, class A amplifier using Type 2A3 tubes. The 2A3s are preceded by a 6A6 push-pull driver, preceded by a 6A6 input stage and conventional proportionally fed phase inverter.




Figure 5. The 10-inch chassis and 2-way speaker system used in the Model 88. The black object between the variable capacitor shield and the power transformer is a Bakelite encased electrolytic capacitor block. The capacitor's case is also a Remler product. Remler had an elaborate Bakelite moulding facility, and in 1933, the company made the first Bakelite cabinet radios on the West Coast.

The 10-tube chassis features a 2-position selectivity control — broadcast normal and high fidelity. The amplifier is fully R-C coupled; there are no interstage transformers. It uses the new metal tubes in the tuner section. The speaker grille fretwork is cut out to allow the 2-cell horn to emanate highs, unimpeded in a crossfire, left to right pattern. The radio chassis and speaker are shown in Figure 5.

RESTORATION AND TEST

I spent two weeks at a leisurely pace in restoring the radio chassis which had been subject to a large amount of sloppy repairwork over the years. All of the usual capacitors and resistors were replaced. The coils were removed for inspection and the band-switch needed some repair. The amplifier and rectifier tubes were weak and were replaced with new ones. Finally, the whole set was given a thorough cleaning.

After restoring the set, I can report, that it plays great and does not exhibit any boominess of bass. The treble is clean and articulated. With the selectivity switch in broadcast "normal" position, all frequencies are channeled to the 8-inch speaker. Also a shunt-type treble control is in circuit.

In the broadcast "high fidelity" position, the treble shunt control is disconnected. The tweeter is now connected and series, low-pass, filter chokes are inserted into the plate leads of the output transformer, thus channeling the bass frequencies to what is now an 8-inch woofer. The result is a 2-way system.

The leather edge on the 8-inch woofer makes the cone very compliant or loosely suspended, making for a nice faithful reproduction. When the radio is operated in the high fidelity position, the addition of the tweeter gives a wonderful presence to the reproduction.

OTHER TABLE MODELS

Remler is one of very few manufacturers to employ the Type 2A3 in a deluxe table model set. I once encountered a very Art Deco tombstone radio made by Lafayette at the AWA meet years ago that appeared to use a pair of Type 2A3s. Philco favored the use of triode connected Type 42s in a push-pull, extended Class A amp in its Model 16B and later tombstones. Zenith followed along similar lines. Its Model 9S30 set for 1936 featured triode-connected 6F6s.

A West Coast radio manufacturer, namely Packard-Bell of Los Angeles, came out with a large sideways-oriented table radio in 1937 called the Model 50 HIFI. This radio has to be the most powerful table model ever made, in that it uses push-pull Type 6L6 tubes in beam pentode mode and oper-

ates them at maximum-rated potentials! With approximately 25 watts of power channeled into a necessarily heavy-duty Rola 8-inch electro-dynamic speaker, this set has great sound.

The Zenith Model 10S130 tombstone radio of 1937 also uses push-pull, pentode connected tube Types 6L6s or 6F6s; however, in terms of power output, the Packard Bell will blow it out of the water!

MORE ON EARLY HIGH FIDELITY EFFORTS

It was a slow and arduous process to improve the fidelity of audio and radio equipment. By the early 1930s, the quality of broadcasting stations was improving steadily. AM stations were spaced ten kilocycles apart, and fidelity was very good, especially with live music from hotel dance orchestras. Some of the larger radio manufacturers featured sets with several speakers to help reproduce the wider range of sound. There was a trend toward making sets with same or dissimilar sized speakers, usually wired in parallel.

In 1927, Zenith Radio Corp. of Chicago made a high-end set called the "Zenith Spanish." It used TRF amplification for the front end, grid leak detection, and single-ended audio amplification, all conventional for the times. It is the earliest radio set to use a multitude of five loudspeakers that appear to be a combination of moving-coil and possibly moving armature loudspeakers. The list price of the Zenith Spanish was \$2,500, enough to buy a substantial house at that time.

In the early 1930s, radio manufacturers offered certain deluxe models featuring multiple speakers. A 1931 Majestic used a 12-inch "Super Colotura" low frequency speaker coupled with an early Jensen 8-inch high frequency PM speaker. Zenith sets used twin 10-inch speakers, mounted in such a way as to disperse the highs in a crossfire manner. Philco used a 10-inch, and an 8-inch speaker in a baffle board, set at an incline to direct highs at the listeners' ears. E.H. Scott used twin speakers in the

1932 Allwave Deluxe set. Virtually all speaker compartments were "open backed."

In late 1934, when the 1935 model radio sets were introduced, great strides in the improvement of fidelity took place. Zenith Radio Corp. abandoned the use of power pentodes, in recognition of the attributes of power triodes in the debut of the 25-tube Zenith Stratosphere. This radio set listed at \$750 in the depths of the Depression, enough to buy a small house in Los Angeles. It features all-triode amplification of high power magnitude on the order of 50 watts RMS — more than ten times the power of the average console radio of the time.

The Stratosphere also features variable selectivity.

ity, accomplished by mechanically changing the coupling of the coils of the IF transformers with a dual-lobe camshaft. The speaker system is fully divided with a properly designed crossover at 3,500 cycles. It utilizes two of the newly introduced Jensen A-12 woofers and a Jensen "Q" series horn tweeter.

The next high fidelity radio introduced at about the same time would be the E.H. Scott Allwave 23 Imperial. The Scott 23 also has variable selectivity and a divided speaker system using a Magnavox 12-inch speaker and two Jensen 5-inch cone type tweeters crossed over at 2 Kc.

Philco had a high fidelity model radio featuring switched variable selectivity, a 15-watt triode amplifier using Type 6A3 tubes and a single 10-inch full range speaker of special design of English origin.

The one thing these radios have in common is that they are all rather large in size and they are mostly housed in consoled cabinets. I had not been aware of any self-contained, high fidelity radios available in a table model cabinet; that is, until I happened across the Remler Model 88.

Information on Zenith was obtained from period sales brochures and service manuals. Circuit diagrams and other information from Rider Manuals were also referenced.

The El Personal Cordless Radio

Flea markets often yield intriguing items. Jerry Wieland hopes that fellow collectors can supply more information on his Japanese set with a Spanish accent. (Editor)

While browsing through a flea market, the bright red plastic table radio shown in Figure 1 caught my eye. As I got closer, I noticed a handle on the top. When I picked it up, a chrome nub in the top corner turned out to be a telescoping antenna. A label in the lower right corner proclaimed the radio to be cordless.

More labeling on the lower left and center said it was a Juliette All Transistor. Across the top of the cabinet is a slide rule dial with the words "El Personal" to the left.

Is this a Spanish radio? The dial is calibrated in kilocycles and also has meters in a smaller font. Civil Defense marks appear at 640 and 1240 KC. The only controls are Off/Volume and Tuning.

Looking at the rear of the cabinet, shown in

Figure 2, I found a fiberboard cover with printed information, including a dial stringing diagram. I don't recall ever finding such a diagram on the back of a radio before. Maybe the cord breaks often.

Scanning the rest of the info revealed this to be a

TOPP Model RT-6 — a 6-transistor radio with a frequency range of 530 to 1605 KC, 0.9 watts output power, and a supply voltage of 6v from four D cells. The country of origin was not Spain but Japan.

THE CHASSIS

The rear cover was easily removed without undoing any fasteners. There used to be a latch as part of the plastic cabinet to retain the rear cover at the top, but it had broken off. Two ears at the bottom of the rear cover fit into cabinet slots to anchor the cover bottom.




Figure 3. A view of the chassis shows the large 2-section variable capacitor on the left, the printed circuit board, and the speaker. The ferrite loop antenna is located at the top of the radio. The battery case at the bottom holds four D size dry cells.




Figure 4. In this "enhanced" detail from Figure 3, three transistors can be seen (→). Many of the other components are mounted vertically.

Besides the telescoping antenna on the right, note the horizontal 7-inch ferrite antenna at the top in Figure 3. As Figure 4 shows, the transistors are early cylindrical metal can types. The two audio output transistors have heatsinks mounted on the frame of an audio transformer. It must be an audio inter-stage transformer because an audio output transformer is mounted on a 4-inch speaker. The two-section variable capacitor on the left side of the cabinet is rather massive for a transistor radio. Two jacks on the right side of the cabinet are for an earphone and a 6-volt external power supply.

This is one of the largest Japanese portable radios I have come across. I guess it is from the late 1950s or early 1960s. It is very sensitive and relatively selective. It tends to overload on strong signals indicating high front-end gain. This high gain and telescoping antenna may indicate that this model was designed for rural areas. The ferrite antenna is more than adequate. I easily receive stations around the country at night with or without the external antenna extended.

A Google search did not uncover any info on this model or the TOPP company. I would appreciate further information about this rather odd cordless radio.

The Vintage Radio and Phonograph Society Convention 2006 Mesquite, Texas — November 17-19, 2006



Three main auctions were held with two silent auctions on both Friday and Saturday. Jim Sargent, VRPS club president, was the prime auctioneer, with Michael Sherman from California assisting. Friday's auctions of 453 lots with 77 passes, totaled \$11,227.50. Saturday's auctions totaled \$29,285, with 430 lots and 63 passes, for a grand total of \$40,512. The auction totals included the two silent auctions on Friday and Saturday.

To help keep auction attendees within the area, we again had the hotel management cater lunch outside with prepared sandwiches, salads and dessert on both days. 







BOOK REVIEW

The Rise of Radio From Marconi through the Golden Age

By Alfred Balk



Since I am a radio collector and not necessarily interested in the radio broadcasts of the "Golden Age" of radio, I was not sure how long this book would hold my interest. I found out very quickly — I could not put it down. The actual radio broadcasts from the early days to the early 1960s is the book's primary focus, but there is so much more.

The beginning of radio is covered in the first few chapters, starting with electricity (Volta, Edison, etc.), the start of radio (Fleming, Marconi, etc.), and the inventors and their technical innovations that made radio broadcasting and reception to an entire country possible (DeForest, Armstrong, etc.). Coverage of the formation of RCA, the first broadcasts of KDKA, the battle between RCA and AT&T over broadcasting rights and infringements, and the formation of the networks — it's all here. From the chaotic 1920s, when anyone could get a transmitting license, to regulation, to the eventual deregulation of radio, all are covered in detail.

The "Golden Age" of radio is well represented, from the technical inventions and improvements to the maturity of radio broadcasts and the performers themselves. Coverage included shows like *Amos & Andy*, *Lum & Abner*, *The Jack Benny Show*, and many others that changed the way we listened to radio and brought a slew of new radio stars to our living rooms every week.

The beginning of television in the 1930s and the impact that television had on radio



viewers and radio broadcasting during the late 1940s-1950s are covered in detail. The end of radio broadcasting as it was known in the early 1960s is another part of this story. Also included is the invention of FM radio by Armstrong and its impact on the industry, as well as the battle with Sarnoff that followed.

This book is a pleasure to read and an excellent resource that adds depth to your radio library. It moves along at a good pace and easily holds your interest throughout. In fact, after I finish this review, I think I will read the book again!

Alfred Balk is a writer, consultant and vintage radio collector. Formerly a magazine editor, he has taught

at Columbia and Syracuse Universities. He has also written more than one hundred article for national magazines, including *Harpers's*, *Reader's Digest*, *Saturday Evening Post*, *Columbia Journalism Review* and *Saturday Review*.
