EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Selling a product in the highly competitive days of early radio had to be a challenge. After all, print was the major medium, as even radio had not realized its potential for direct selling. The kind of advertising that saturates us today was not part of the picture. So a catalog, like Buscher's, the subject of our lead article, was a vital marketing tool for a manufacturer or supplier, and, no doubt, the cover had to be an eye-catcher.

That must have been why the Buscher catalog leapt to mind when we were preparing Jack Gray's Hopalong Cassidy radio article for publication. It is one of over 100 catalogs in my collection, but I must have remembered it because the cowboy graphic did a good marketing job. Elghty plus years after its publication, the image has had lasting effects.

Of course, the question arises — why did C.A. Buscher use this image when it had no direct relation to his products? We have to conclude that he was sold on it when the artist presented him with the rearing horse, the cowboy with headphones, the lassoed letters, and the radio waves. He must have seen this as a unique way to get the attention of his potential customers.

Certainly, that was the goal of Arvin Industries when that company made the happy connection with William Boyd, the actor who controlled the rights to the Hopalong Cassidy character. Thanks to Jack Gray we have the story of the two versions of the Hopalong design on the front of this 1950 Arvin radio. In addition, Jack is offering for sale the foil fronts in both styles to restorers of the Hopalong radios. These are not repros but new old stock — a great find for any collector.

Great finds are a way of life for Richard Arnold. This time Richard started out to write about his RCA Model T-10-1 which he had acquired almost 20 years ago. But, a 1935 ad for the Model 10-T, which superseded the T-10-1 within a year, caught his attention. Richard compares the two, accepts the superiority of the updated version, but remains firmly committed to his older set.

That kind of commitment is part of every collector/restorer's thinking. In Claude Chafin's case, he carefully evaluates a set's chance of making it back to its

original condition before committing time to a repair job. For the Fada Model 290C, the subject of his article, he did not have to address electrical or mechanical problems, as with other sets he has written about for A.R.C. Instead, he had to deal only with the cabinet, a major undertaking in itself. He offers many good tips and techniques that will be useful to all cabinet restorers.

Steve Auyer's article, *Glow-in-the-Dark Radios*, in the April issue prompted Loren Ashworth to remind us about his similar set pictured in the July 2004 *Photo Review*. Though both are GE sets, Loren points out significant differences. We're always glad to have an article extended to yet another level of discussion.

Estes Auctions, of course, as reported so well by Ray Chase, often take us to several levels in variety and price. The Larry Flegle collection offered an interesting variety of items from traditional radios to phonographs, military equipment, parts, and even citizen band sets. Highlights were the numerous Scott sets, of both E.H. and H.H. varieties. The E.H. models were from the chrome-plated, classic radio era, while the H.H. sets were part of the early hi-fi era.

Among the top prices were \$1,600 for the E.H. Scott 32 Philharmonic side-by-side and \$6,000 for a McMurdo Silver V in a Clifton cabinet. The total proceeds were over \$60,000.

And to add to my trip down memory lane with the Buscher Catalog, an AC Dayton Radio sign in this auction really jumped out at me. The name on the sign "J.H. Orr, Jr." took me back 25 years to a lucky turn of events that led to my attending the auction of the J.H. Orr collection in Opelika, Alabama. That was such a significant moment in my midcollecting years that I felt compelled to write an article about it.

Our cover this month is a reproduction of the cover of a 1923 Buscher catalog from the John V. Terrey collection. Located in Kansas City, Missouri, Buscher supplied complete sets, instruments, parts and supplies, and claimed to be the largest wholesale radio distributor in the Southwest.

RADIO IN THE TWENTIES

Buscher's Radio Catalog

BY JOHN V. TERREY WITH DOROTHY A. SCHECTER

We seem to be into cowboys and horses in this issue. The following article makes the connection. Unfortunately, the illustrations here are of poorer quality than usual because they had to be reproduced from an 84-year-old catalog. (Editor)

We've said it before — one thing often leads to another in the pursuit of radio history. The foil images of Hopalong Cassidy and his horse in Jack Gray's article in this issue jogged my memory about a catalog in my archives. Of course, the search was on, and a 1923 *Buscher's Radio Catalog* surfaced.

The catalog's cover drawing of a cowboy on his rearing horse appears on this month's *A.R.C.* cover because, though there is no direct connection to Hopalong, it is an interesting parallel. It suggests that images of dashing cowboys had sales appeal from the very early days of radio, to the midcentury popularity of William Boyd as Hopalong Cassidy, to today, when collectors still seek out the 1950 Hopalong Cassidy radio.

"BUY FROM BUSCHER"

The slogan "Buy from Buscher" heads every page of this excellent early catalog. To excite product interest from the start, the cover artist presents a man of action whose steed is rearing to go as he lassos the letters in the word "catalog." We wonder what he's listening to on his headphones.


Radio waves electrify the air as a backdrop to

the cover title and even under the horse's hooves. Obviously, the artist did not have William Boyd's concern that such a pose for the horse might be considered animal cruelty, as suggested in Jack Gray's article.


A "Personal Message" from C.A. Buscher to his "friends in the Retail Trade" introduces this Radio Catalog No. 5 extolling the products of his company, which was located at 1219-1221 Locust St., Kansas City, Missouri. Business via catalog must have been good because this is the fifth Buscher

catalog since the company's founding, and the second published within six months.

In it, Buscher claims to offer one of the largest stocks outside of New York. He gives the example of 21 different styles of headphones waiting on his shelves for orders. He also calls attention to the inclusion of diagrams to facilitate hooking up parts for such sets as Atwater Kent breadboards and A.C. Dayton products.


In addition, dealers would find a dictionary of radio terms and a listing of broadcasting stations useful in their transactions with customers. Furthermore, they could show this catalog to customers because prices are quoted at list, and a separate discount sheet would guarantee their profit. One caveat is that prices could not be guaranteed.

A 1923 TREASURE


Looking through this catalog, we were moved to say, "Wow!" What a great thing it must have been in to know that such a range of supplies and information was available in the relatively early days of the radio industry. In addition to Atwater Kent and Dayton products, among the other products offered are those of Echophone, Busco, Federal, Atchison, and Day-Fan.

A Little Gem crystal receiving set priced at \$6.50 is so easy to install and operate even a child can do it, or so says the catalog blurb. Crystal sets by Kleerton, Radioceptor, Fullatone, Busco and Atchison are also offered. The lists go on: vacuum tubes and sockets, rheostats and potentiometers, variable plate condensers and dials, panels, binding posts, contact points, and switch levers, loud speakers, antenna equipment, soldering irons, etc., etc. — a veritable radio smorgasbord.

In today's world of instant information, we may find it hard to imagine how valuable such a catalog

must have been in 1923. C.A. Buscher perhaps thought only of his sales, but maybe he had an inkling of the contribution his catalog might make to radio history.

PRODUCT REVIEW

Hopalong Cassidy The Radio and the Actor

The image of Hopalong Cassidy on his white horse has been around for so long that it is almost an American icon. The popularity of Hopalong from the 1930s through the 1950s and even beyond made him a natural to be incorporated into the design of a radio in this period of the medium's greatest growth. Jack Gray brings us that story, and, as his A.R.C. ad says, he has now made replacement panel foils for the radio available. (Editor)

The Arvin Model 441-T or "Hopalong Cassidy" radio, originally priced at \$16.95, was manufactured in 1950 using two styles of embossed, paper-backed, aluminum foil fronts. One "Hoppy" front shows his horse Topper rearing with both forelegs in the air, as shown in Figure 1. The other style, shown in Figure 2, has Topper with one foot on the ground and the other in the air. The Topper with two legs in the air version was the earliest design and was ordered by Arvin on February 22, 1950.

However, this front design had not been reviewed and approved by William Boyd, the actor who had bought the rights to the Hopalong Cassidy character after having played the role in several films. My information indicates that Boyd felt that this pose could be considered animal cruelty, and he had the design redone.

The revised design foil with Topper standing with one foot in the air was approved by Boyd and was ordered by Arvin on August 21, 1950. Having followed sales of these radios for several years and having personally restored quite a few of them, I believe that there

is little difference in scarcity, value, or desirability between these two styles today.

HOPALONG CASSIDY

William Lawrence Boyd was born in Cambridge, Guernsey Co., Ohio, on June 5, 1895.

He moved with his family to Tulsa, Oklahoma, in 1902, and to California around 1918.

By the 1920s, William Boyd had already starred in several silent films. He made his first cowboy feature in 1931 and his first Hopalong Cassidy movie in 1935. It was "Hoppy," derived from the novels and pulp stories by C.E. Mulford, who would come to define the Ohio native's career. Always dressed in black and decked out with silver spurs, he rode his trusty horse "Topper" and became the leading character in many "B" movies.

The "Hopalong" moniker came about due to Cassidy's being injured in a shootout. In *Hop-A-Long Cassidy* (Paramount, 1935), the first film of the series, Boyd/Hoppy is recovering from a gunfight, and is asked about his wound. His response is something like "I'll manage to hop along."

In 1937, William Boyd married Grace Bradley (his fifth wife), and at the same time, he acquired a new white stallion. He asked his new wife to name the horse. At the time, Grace was reading a series of books by Thorne Smith, and the series was called "Topper." Thus, Grace asked Bill to name the horse after her favorite book, and that's how Topper got his name.

William Boyd and Grace remained married until his death in 1972 at the age of 77. Grace is 93 and lives in southern California. She participated in the 16th annual Hopalong Cassidy Festival in Cambridge, Ohio, in May 2004. I found that she had logged on to her "My Space" blog today (1/28/2007), while I was writing this article.

Boyd bought the rights to the Hopalong Cassidy character in 1948. He released edited versions of the films (totaling more than 100 by the time he retired) to the then young medium of television, first through KTLA in Los Angeles and then nationwide through NBC. Additional new episodes were shot as well, with Hoppy's popularity increasing all the while.

Hopalong Cassidy sagas were also on the radio from 1950 to 1952. A long-running Hopalong Cassidy comic book series, published by Fawcett, added to this marketing success story.

In fact, Hopalong Cassidy merchandising was more than successful and varied in scope. Pajamas, bicycles, watches, toy guns, cowboy hats, cowboy outfits, candy bars, pocket




Figure 3. The "new old stock" foil designs available from Jack Gray.

knives, bread, butter, cookies, milk, other food products, toothpaste, wallpaper, and literally thousands of other items were produced for his adoring public. My research shows that Hopalong endorsed some 2,400 items, many of which are still being marketed today.

FOIL FRONTS AVAILABLE

I have recently purchased the remaining new old stock of the foil fronts in both styles originally ordered and used by Arvin in manufacturing the Hopalong Cassidy radios. Since they are relatively thin aluminum pressings, the majority of the existing Hoppy radios have become damaged or have pieces missing from the foils.

The paper-backed 441T foils, either style, may be ordered at \$125 each, shipping included, from me at the address below.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

RCA Models T-10-1 and 10-T

You acquire a particular model, and, if you're lucky, fellow collectors lead you to more information, not only about that model but also about the next one. Once again Richard Arnold shares his discoveries. (Editor)




Figure 1. The author's 1936 RCA Model T-10-1, which sold for \$69.95, is a 10-tube, 3-band radio.

I acquired the RCA Model T-10-1, shown in Figure 1, some time in 1989. A friend who owned an auction business used to either bring me radios or call to tell me of some radios that he had at his storage buildings. He brought this particular radio to my office one day, and I remember his saying that he wanted \$100 for it. But, on second thought, he said, "No, give me \$75 because it doesn't work." Needless to say, he got his \$75.

I suppose what impressed me the most about this radio when I first saw it was its near mint condition. The next thing that impressed me was its size. Measuring 19" x 16½" x 13½", it is a very impressive looking radio. The Model T-10-1 was RCA's top-of-the-line table model for 1936.

While researching the Model T-10-1, I came across an RCA advertisement in a November 1935 edition of *Radio News* magazine. The title of the ad is, "As Things Ease Up." I suppose that it was referring to when the hard times of the Depression (1929-1939) were "easing up."

The ad goes on to say that you should get an "up-to-date RCA radio, with all RCA Victor's new and striking developments in radio engineering." The ad asks, "Is your present radio an old war-horse? Battle scared and worn from too many hours of playing? If you are like many people, that's the case. Yet programs are more sparkling than ever... and the newest radios give a lift to even the finest programs." The RCA T-10-1 must have been one of those sets.

THE RCA MODEL T-10-1

The RCA Model T-10-1 is a 1936, 10-tube, 3-band, superheterodyne that covers the frequency range of 540-18,000 Kc. This very large table model tunes the domestic, foreign, police and Amateur bands. Back in 1936, it sold for \$69.95.

The set has five Bakelite knobs including a combination low frequency tone control and power switch, a treble tone control, a volume control, a tuning knob, and a range selector. The range selector has three positions with red, green and white band indicators. Red is the standard broadcast band (540-1800 Kc), white is shortwave (1800-6,000 Kc), and green is Amateur, police, weather and aircraft (6,000-18,000 Kc).

The RCA T-10-1 uses an 8-inch electrodynamic speaker and delivers 8.5 watts of "undistorted power." The grille cloth on my set is original.

The tuning drive ratio is variable by means of a push-pull clutch arrangement. A tuning ratio of 10:1 or 50:1 may be selected. The tuning dial also includes a vernier pointer for logging and fine-tuning stations.

Some versions of this set used a universal trans-

former capable of operation on a wide range of line voltages.

The tube complement consists of metal tubes, except one — a glass 5Z3 full-wave rectifier tube, which was housed in a black perforated metal can. RCA was having problems developing this tube, and the metal version was not ready when the new line of radios came out. Perhaps the Type 5Z3 tube in a can was an attempt to hide the fact that it was not one of the new metal tubes.

The other tube types in the radio are the following: two 6F6 push-pull power output tubes; two 6C5 audio amplifiers; one 6J7 oscillator; one 6H6 second detector and AVC; two 6K7s, one as an RF amplifier and the other as an IF amplifier; and one 6L7 first detector.

COMPARING MODELS T-10-1 AND 10-T




Figure 2. The RCA Model T-10-1 was superseded by this 1937 Model 10-T. The Model 10-T is also a 10-tube table model, but features a tuning eye tube.

The October 1936 *All-Wave Radio* magazine contains an article which compares the Model T-10-1 with the later 1937 Model 10-T, shown in Figure 2. The claim is that the two models were subjected to technical and accurate laboratory tests in order to illustrate the degree of engineering advancement made in a year and the increased value per dollar in the 1937 model.

Having reviewed the Model T-10-1 in a previous issue, the magazine justifies comparing it with the Model 10-T on the basis of their both being table models, employing the same number of tubes. They also sold at around the same price and were designed to fulfill the same general reception requirements and

employ much of the same mechanical design. However, the Model 10T has a more distinctive appearance, in the magazine's opinion, (not mine).

ADVANTAGES OF THE MODEL 10T

The 10T has the advantage of an electron-ray tuning indicator and an improved dial mechanism having ratios of 20 to 1 and 100 to 1. Although the tone control is the same on both models, the 1937 model has a 2-position selectivity switch or "Fidelity Control," not present on the Model T-10-1.

The circuit diagram of the Model 10T shows that it uses the following tube types: a 6K7 RF stage, a 6L7 converter, a 6J7 oscillator, a 6K7 1st IF amplifier, a 6K7 2nd IF amplifier, a 6H6 detector & AVC, a 6F5 audio amplifier, a 6E5 tuning Indicator, a 6L6 audio output, and a 5Z4 rectifier. This 1937 model also has a built-in antenna coupler and wave trap. One improvement of note is the use of a 6L6 as a beam power output tube, instead of the push-pull 6F6.

The Model 10T provides continuous coverage from 530 to 60,000 Kc, plus the new X band coverage from 150 to 410 Kc, well over three times the frequency range of the T-10-1. The 10T also has a provision for electric phonograph operation; the T-10-1 does not.

The 10T has two new Magnetite (special iron-core) IF transformers, whereas the T-10-1 has but one air core type. This feature produced better selectivity. The new 6L6 power beam tube supplies almost as much power as two 6F6 tubes in push-pull.

One point of interest here is that the chassis used in the 10T is also used in the Model 10-K, a console. However, the console has the Magic-Voice feature not found in the table Model 10T.

CONCLUSION

I'm sorry to say, but it is clear that the additional new and striking developments in the 1937 RCA Model 10T make it superior to the 1936 T-10-1.

Nevertheless, the RCA Model T-10-1 is a beautiful and well-built RCA radio. It seems to be hard to find. I have been collecting radios since the summer of 1985 and up until a few years ago when it began to show up on eBay, mine was the only one that I had ever seen. They are a prize and sought after by many collectors.

Well, after all of that, I will have to say that I am still proud of my "very distinctive" looking RCA T-10-1. While the 1937 model 10T may have more whistles and bells, the T-10-1 is still one of my favorite radios.

I keep my T-10-1 in my radio room where I can see it all of the time and where I can play it on a regular basis. Heck, it picks up all of the stations that I want to hear. I sure am glad that Mr. Carpenter brought it into my office that day back in 1989.

METAL TUBES

Metal tubes first appeared in the new Allwave line of General Electric sets at the end of 1935. They were manufactured by RCA for General Electric and others. Six of the original 10-tube types made were the 6A8 as a pentagrid converter; a 6C5 as a detector amplifier triode; a 6D5 as a power amplifier triode; a 6H6 as a twin diode; a 6J7 as a triple-grid detector amplifier; and a 6K7 as a variable-mu, triple-grid amplifier. Four more were Types 6F5, 6F6 and 6L6, and 6L7.

Some ads that I have come across say the following about the new metal tubes:

- "Sealed in steel — Made like a fine watch."
- "Metal tubes — The sign of an up-to-date radio."
- "1935 goes down in radio history as offering a new, revolutionary and permanent improvement — Metal Tubes — Already adopted by the vast majority of radio manufacturers. Progress cannot be stopped, get what you want — a new radio — a Modern Radio — a radio with Metal Tubes!"

Metal tubes were already on the market in Europe for some time prior to the American tube announcement. The Catkin tube was made in England. It had a different construction, however, and the American tubes were considered a great improvement.

RESTORATION TOPICS

Refinishing a Fada Model 290C Cabinet

BY CLAUDE CHAFIN

With patience, muscle power, and the right materials, Claude Chafin turned a pitiful looking cabinet into showcase condition. (Editor)

The 1937 Fada Model 290C is a 9-tube, 3-band radio. It features vernier tuning, a tuning eye, selectivity switching, off-on tone control, and a hi-fi 12-inch speaker. Photos of the restored console are shown in Figures 1, 2 and 3.

I found this radio in Boone County, Missouri. It had been completely recapped with an amateurish restoration job; in other words, it played well but looked pitiful.

I had never seen this radio here in the Midwest, so I thought I would buy it and restore it to showcase condition — all new lacquer, toner and black lacquer trim, just as it had been originally.

THE PROCESS

Refinishing a console is quite an undertaking.

There is a lot of surface area to strip off and refinish. But, if you are up to the task, then start by stripping it in sections; i.e. top, sides, etc. Use 150-grit sandpaper to get down to the wood, and use a wooden block so you don't sand unevenly. Once the old finish is removed, allow the cabinet to dry for 24 hours.

Check for cracks, missing veneer, or poor glue joints on and under the veneer. A host of different glue clamps is handy to have at this point. (When I am out collecting, I always look for glue clamps.) Be sure to sand off any excess dried glue.

The next step involves a sanding sealer which seals up the pores in the wood prior to applying the lacquer. Otherwise, the lacquer will soak right into the wood. This is how you

get that "piano finish." Use 0000 steel wool to get the dried sanding sealer smooth. Then apply the lacquer and toner. Once the lacquer is applied and dried, buff it with a buffer polish to get that smooth glossy finish. Since this radio has black lacquer trim, I decided it would be a good idea to do the black sections first.

Always avoid using oils and furniture polish. They will soak into the wood and the lacquer will trap it there forever — not to mention turning everything white.

REPLACING THE GRILLE CLOTH

I tried to restore the set as close to its original state as possible. The only thing not original is the grille cloth. The original cloth was too far gone to restore, and I didn't like the original cloth style anyway. I used a swirl type reproduction Zenith cloth for the new grille cloth.

Centering the swirls to the grille is a tough job.

To do this, I reinstalled the grille board without the cloth to see first how it centered up. I drew a line around the outside so I could see where the edges were after I removed it again. Before removing it, you should mark on the back which edge goes to the top. (This is important later.)

Now it's easy to see where your cloth is to be glued down. Use a fast-tack adhesive very sparingly and a bit of Elmer's Glue around the edges. Once the cloth is glued down and dry, take a pencil-pointed soldering iron and burn holes through the cloth where the screw holes are located. This prevents the screws from snagging on the cloth or even small fibers when installing the grille board. Burning those holes is very important. If you do it any other

way you're asking for trouble. (I learned the hard way.) Your mark on the back tells you which edge is up before installation; if you got it backwards, the screw holes won't line up right.

Glow-in-the Dark Radio Follow-Up

Steve Auyer has a great article in the April 2007 issue — *Glow-in-the-Dark Radios*. The reason I am writing is that I have a GE Model 501 ivory clock unit, shown here in Figure 1, one of the several mentioned in Mr Auyer's piece. He featured the GE Model 64, shown here in Figure 2. My radio appeared in the *Photo Review* section of A.R.C. in July 2004.

The Model 501 appears to be identical to the Model 64, except for the cabinet, which is a different color, and has a different design and speaker grille arrangement. Also, the Model 501 doesn't have the hour marks on the inside dial like the one in the article, and it has Roman numerals. Using a flashlight in a closet, I confirmed that only the hour and minute hands glow in the dark.

The ivory-colored knobs appear identical on both sets. GE must have purchased only ivory-colored knobs.

Also, there is a subtle difference between the hands on the two models. A close look at the hands on my clock reveals that they are rather dark, not at all as light as those on Steve Auyer's set. Also, under a magnifying glass, the glow coating seems uniform — sort of the consistency of fine sandpaper, but no spots. The Roman numerals and dark tipped hands are evident in the photo.

AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auctions — The Larry Flegle Collection Burbank, Ohio — December 9, 2006

REPORTED BY RAY AND EDITH CHASE

This auction was primarily the collection of Dr. Larry Flegle from the Atlanta, Georgia, area. It was held at the Expo Auction Center in Burbank, Ohio, which apparently will be the site for all future Estes auctions. The collection contained many Scott, Silver-Marshal, and McMurdo Silver radios. Viewers ought to have had dark glasses handy to offset all the chrome-plated chassis on display.

Other good items were for sale as well, including nice Ham gear, advertising and phonograph items, and the usual good assortment of battery and 1930s radios. A large selection of novelty radios were offered. Some of the better ones were scattered through the main auction while many of the later transistor models were dealt with at a side auction that I prevailed upon my good wife to record.

Additionally, there was an early auction of low value goods that seems now to be a regular event at Estes auctions. This is a good way to deal with the bottom-end stuff that is always present and a lot of fun, but does not warrant taking up time at the main auction.

During the main auction, some of the paper goods were sold "choice" and I could not record them. Also there were several side auctions in

the afternoon to handle bulk tube lots and test equipment. These also I could not record.

There had been a snowstorm on Thursday preceding the weekend that left several inches on the ground, and the weather was quite cold. Nevertheless, a good crowd turned out and hung in there until well into the afternoon. Very few additions came in on Friday evening or Saturday morning.

Since this was a few weeks before Christmas, one might have assumed that some collectors would be buying themselves an early Christmas present, but surprisingly, there were quite a few bargains left here. Perhaps they were there to purchase the Scotts, Silver-Marshalls and McMurdo Silvers and passed up the other items. Maybe they held back the money in order to do the family holiday shopping. Still, the prices of these Scotts and others have been falling over the past few years, as more of them have come into the marketplace. It seems to be a very good buyer's market.

Whatever the case, it was wonderful to see and touch so many of these grand old radios, especially the very rare and seldom seen Mc-



Murdo Silver Masterpiece in the Clifton console that sold for \$6,000. I never seem to be able to judge the mood or electricity of an auction crowd, and this one was particularly difficult to gauge. Anyway, it was a pleasure to be in the company of all these fine high-end radios and I hope that the new owners get as much pleasure from them as Dr. Flegle probably did.

I recorded about 550 lots and stopped note-taking at 5 P.M. with maybe another 20 minutes to go. The total sale of the main auction was somewhat over \$60,000, not counting the early auction, the side auctions, or the novelty auction. The three featured brands accounted for nearly 40 percent of the main auction sales.

A separate novelty radio auction of 73 items totaling \$475.50 was recorded by Edith Chase. A number of novelty radio items, apparently the higher-value ones, were also included in the regular auction. All novelty radios are combined in the auction listing.

The early auction of low value items started at 9 A.M. and was held off in the corner


where the sold items are normally accumulated during the main auction. This arrangement was certainly more pleasant than standing in the rain as has happened at one or more of the Auction Barn sales. It is basically a "stand up" or "walk around" auction, and there were about 75 lots offered that sold for a total of something over \$550. I have not provided a detailed list of the sales.

The early auction was the place to be if you needed parts sets, or if you like a challenging repair job, or even if you have a bit of open storage space that needs some radio detritus to fill it in. While the average lot sale price was about \$9, two-thirds of the sales went for \$5 or less, and 19 lots sold for \$1. Sometimes lots were combined, and I noted four radios that sold as a lot for \$1 or 25 cents each. The most expensive item, a McIntosh tuner that drew a bid of \$90, must have gotten in this group by mistake. Anyway, a lot of fun and a good way to warm up the crowd before the "big stuff" was run across the auction block at 10 A.M.







The John Herbert Orr Collection Auction

Memories of 25-Years Ago

The A.C. Dayton Radio sign that was sold at the Estes auction of the Larry Flegle collection brought back memories of 25-years ago — an auction of the John Herbert Orr collection that I attended in Opelika, Alabama, in November, 1982.

Although for nearly 20-years prior to 1982 I had been picking up an occasional radio at a New England antique shop or flea market, my collection was very modest. The year 1982 changed that — I became hooked for good!

By 1982, I had subscribed to several radio collecting publications, I had found the book, *Vintage Radio*, the "bible" for battery set collectors, and I had made contact with several local radio collectors. Attending my first radio meet — the October, 1982, AWA Conference in Canandaigua, New York — was the beginning of my conversion. It was the first time that I realized that lots of others were interested in collecting old radios, too. Walking the flea market, seeing all those radios, viewing the contest exhibits, and talking to other collectors was an amazing experience.

Then, I noticed an advertisement for an upcoming auction in Opelika, Alabama — over 900 old radios and phonographs were to be sold. Sometimes luck is on your side, and this time it was. I had a business trip scheduled to Georgia just before the auction, and a side trip to Alabama was easy to fit in.

I arrived at the preview and had plenty of time to peruse the vast display of old radios and phonographs. And, I met and talked with collectors, all of whom were new acquaintances then, but I still know them today.

I had targeted one item in the auction to buy — a Federal Model 61. I was successful! To take it home, I wrapped it in rug padding, fitted a box around it, and checked it as baggage on my return flight to Boston. Fortunately, it arrived in fine shape. My records show that I paid \$650 for the Federal 61, and it is still a

featured set in my collection.


It is interesting to look at the change in values for some of the sets over these last 25-years. Surprisingly, many sets are worth only what they sold for in 1982, or even a bit less. For example, in the Orr sale, an RCA Radiola III sold for \$60 and a Crosley 51, for \$100.

Today, some of the rarer sets are worth two to three times their selling prices in 1982 when an Atwater Kent 50 sold for \$450, two Model 10 breadboards for \$350 and \$400, and a Model 12 breadboard for \$700.

Very rare sets are selling today for five-times or more what was paid in 1982 when an RCA Radiola VIIB sold for \$600 and a Western Electric CW-938 sold for \$1,000.

I will never forget the experience of my first big radio auction, what I learned there, and the wonderful collectors that I met. Only four years later, I began publishing this magazine, now in its 23rd year, and my collection now numbers over 800 items.
