

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

It's a new year, and like the rest of the country, A.R.C. is ready to ring in a year that is full of change for the better. But change usually involves a bit of the old to mix with the new. First, the old — we intend to put greater emphasis on growing our original base — classified ads — as our name, *Antique Radio Classified*, signifies.

Recognizing that classified advertising has largely migrated to the new media, we believe, nevertheless, that there is still a place for print advertising. In addition, we are aware of the need to reach those collectors who are not on the web, though their numbers are diminishing.

Now for the new. To encourage you subscribers to increase your advertising, here are the new rates: 50 words free on your first ad, up from 20 words free, and ten cents for each extra word, down from 29 cents. If you add a photo to your ad, the price will drop more than one-half — from \$23 to \$10. As we all know, sometimes a picture makes the sale. Actually, these rates hark back to 1986 rates, so we could say that there is something old here mixed with the new.

More good news — we will not raise subscription rates this year, despite the continuing rise in costs of production, printing, and postage. Obviously, like all publications large and small, A.R.C. wants to do everything possible to survive in today's challenging economic climate. Your increase in advertising will help us to reach that goal and move us beyond a major milestone in our immediate future — the celebration of our 25th anniversary in June.

Another note of good cheer — Radio XL (40 to us non-Romans), our annual radio show in Westford, Mass., is scheduled for February 15. If you haven't already noticed, details are on the inside cover. We hope all of you who can make it will join us in celebrating the 40th gathering of collectors for this major show, which always seems to give everyone a lift in the midst of the winter doldrums.

Discovering new information about a special radio is the greatest lift to an interested collector. Once again, Dan Schoo has been presented with more information about the uncommon, high-end Leutz Phantom, this time in the form of a dealer circular. This set in a metal cabinet is obviously unusual enough to excite a lot of interest, as Dan has received unsolicited material enough for a second follow-up. Dan does a great job sharing whatever comes his way with our readers.

Your easiest way of sharing favorite sets is through *Photo Review*. Dave Crocker's Atwater Kent 92 cathedral has an eye-catching trim, and Clark Trissell tells us a little more about the history of the Westinghouse Model RC. Information,

big and small, is always welcome.

New information in the horn speaker department is always forthcoming from Dave Crocker. Dave has picked up Floyd Paul's enthusiasm for horn speakers, and at Floyd's request, has continued his special speaker column in the *AWA Journal*. Floyd has also written for A.R.C., and many of you know his excellent books on horn speakers. Dave tells us about the unusual Town Crier speaker, a classic case of marketing failure in the 1920s.

Failure is not in the lexicon of the Kutztown Radio Show sponsored by the Delaware Valley Historical Radio Club every spring and fall. We have Stan Saeger's official club report and John Hagman's very personal take on the event. Both convey the success of this event and the pleasure everyone takes in it.

It so happens that these reports contain photos of collectors whose names appear fairly often in A.R.C. It's always interesting to be able to put faces with names — in this case, John Hagman, Mike Koste, and Mark Oppat.

Another familiar name, Ron Ramirez, is the byline on a report of a familiar annual auction — once Eric's Auction, now the John Wiley Auction. Bargains were plentiful at this well-attended event.

Ron reminds us of how important it is to keep a traditional event like this one going even when the original operator can no longer do the job. In this case, Wayne Martin found the Wiley Service to take over from Eric Bruner, and everyone in the hobby is the better for his effort.

More on the Leutz Universal Transoceanic Phantom Special Type 9

The Leutz Universal Transoceanic Phantom seems to be an inexhaustible subject of interest. New information has surfaced, and, luckily, Dan Schoo is always willing to share it. The set in this article is the same set as in the previous two articles. The full name is "Phantom Special Type 9." (Editor)

Following the publication of my restoration article on the Leutz Universal Transoceanic Phantom Special Type 9 in the October 2007 issue of *Antique Radio Classified*, I received a letter with some photographs from another Phantom owner. This information allowed me to compare notes and verify a few details, resulting in a follow-up article which appeared in the June 2008 A.R.C. Well, here I am again with some more recently acquired details.


Several weeks ago I received from Jay Thomas, another A.R.C. reader, an original 1929 C.R. Leutz advertising circular once sent to dealers. The circular was in the form of a double-sided poster 22" wide by 17" high, and it referred to the C.R. Leutz, Long Island

City, New York, address. I was delighted to get this particular document because it had vital bits of information that I had not seen anywhere else.

There were several lingering questions that I had sought to answer when I wrote the original article. As many of you know, tracking down trivia about a radio manufacturer from over eighty years ago is based on a lot of hard work, a lot of luck, and sometimes the generosity of other collectors. If verifiable information is unavailable, it is necessary to make a few experienced guesses and present the information as such.

SOME ERRORS AND PREVIOUS ASSUMPTIONS


With this Leutz circular I can verify some of my previous assumptions, correct a few others, and add to the details about pricing and options. One blatant error that I would like to correct is my assertion that the UX-222 screen grid (tetrode) tube was the only 4-pin tube with a top cap. I should have known better, having forgotten about the RCA Types 32 tetrode and 34 pentode, both of which are battery tubes with a 4-pin

DURING the past two years, Universal Transoceanic Phantoms have been shipped to points in every state in the Union, every province of Canada, Alaska, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, and practically every foreign country in the world. In practically every instance the new owner of the Transoceanic Phantom has written to us expressing complete satisfaction and reporting results far superior to any competitive makes used in the same vicinity.

There is no mystery connected with the superior performance of Leutz radio receivers. In 1922, seven years ago, Leutz had 8 and 10 tube Super-Heterodynes on the market, while the nearest competitive set had three tubes. Likewise, Leutz had the first Shielded Set, First Single Control License under the Hogan Patent, first resistance-coupled audio, first interchangeable tuned radio frequency transformers, first metal cabinet, and many other original features used two years ahead of other designers.

Powerful radio receivers, each perfect in every respect, cannot be built hurriedly. Each

Leutz radio receiver is made to special order only. The average time required for delivery is three to six weeks after receipt of confirmed order. Leutz receivers are not sold on a trial basis; anyone contemplating the purchase of a Leutz receiver need only inquire from any of our customers and they will be assured that they will obtain the best radio receiver in the world.

The present Universal Transoceanic Phantom Special has the most powerful tube arrangement one could desire, viz., Four 222 Screened Grid Radio Frequency Stages, 200A Super-Detector, four audio stages, two of which are in a push-pull system using either two 210's or two 250's, output adjustable for a small room, or sufficient for six Dynamic Speakers distributed over a battleship.

Only a limited number of Transoceanic Phantoms can be produced this season, and our production is already sold considerably ahead. We suggest placing Phantom orders three to four weeks ahead to prevent disappointments in delivery.

UX base and a top cap.

The tube lineup in most of the Phantom advertisements that I had found highlighted the fact that UX-222 screen-grid tubes were used for the radio frequency amplifiers. At the time of its release in October of 1927, the UX-222 screen grid tube was a breakthrough development and far superior to the traditional UX-201A triode. The UX-222 had the ability to provide much more gain than a UX-201A simply because the addition of a second grid made the tube a lot more stable in radio frequency circuits. It was thereby able to amplify

the signal to a much higher degree without oscillating.

Other tubes often mentioned in Leutz ads were the UX-200A detector and either a Type UX-210 or UX-250 used as push-pull audio outputs. However, there was no mention of the two audio preamp tubes.

I had assumed that the two audio preamp tubes were the usual UX-201A types that everybody used at that time. Actually, the audio preamp tubes in the Phantom were Type UX-240 voltage amplifier triodes that RCA had announced in February of 1927. They




Figure 3. "The photographic reproduction here of the interior of the Shielded Grid Tube Set gives you an idea of the delicacy, yet sturdiness of its construction. Leutz Receivers are built like watches, yet wear like locomotives." (From the Leutz circular)

were pretty much the same as a UX-201A, but they had almost four times higher voltage gain. In this particular application, they were not necessarily any better than a UX-201A. In the operational tests I had performed on the Phantom, I found that UX-201A tubes worked perfectly well.

Another assumption that I had made was that I could change the frequency coverage by changing the TRF interstage coils with other coils wound for a different frequency. The coils supplied with the Phantom were marked "A" on the bottom along with the number of the stage that the coil was intended to be plugged into. The Leutz ad specifies the Type A coils as having a wavelength range of 200 to 560 meters or 1500 KHz to 536 KHz. This range is almost exactly what I had measured in the operational tests.

Other coils were available for the short and long-wave bands for an extra charge. Regrettably no specific information is given on what other frequencies could be tuned using these coils.

POWER SUPPLY DETAILS

The Phantom was designed primarily to operate completely from AC power for "A" (filament), "B" (plate), and "C" (grid bias) voltages. While it could be operated from batteries, it would have been very inconvenient.

The AC filament current for the audio output tubes and the various plate, screen, and control grid bias voltages were provided by a separately available Leutz BC power supply. The BC supply used two Type 81 rectifier tubes and a resistor divider to provide the various operating voltages necessary for the operation of the Phantom. It also had AC receptacles on the back for a separate A battery charger or A battery eliminator. Power switching in the BC supply controlled both the B and C power supplies and also switched an A filament battery, an A battery charger or an A battery eliminator, whichever was used.

A 6-volt storage battery could be used as the A supply to power the DC-operated filaments of other than the audio output tubes. Preferably, a Leutz A supply, also available separately, was used to power the filaments for full AC line-powered operation. The Leutz A supply used a "dry type" rectifier, such as a copper oxide stack. Plugging the A supply into the special AC socket on the Leutz BC supply switched it on and off with the rest of the power to the set.

MORE GENERAL LEUTZ DETAILS

Back in the early radio days, long distance reception was the big selling point. Radio stations were generally not as powerful as they are today, and long distance reception depended on sensitivity. Leutz boasted a five to seven-day air test of every Phantom to receive stations as far away as 2,500 to 3,000 miles before it was shipped. The company claimed that one of its receivers in Los Angeles received stations spanning from Brisbane, Australia, to Pittsburgh. Another set located in Guayaquil, Ecuador, received stations ranging from Rio de Janeiro to New York.

Another interesting note was that in addition to the basic satin aluminum finish, the Phantom, along with an associated BC power supply, could be finished with an imitation mahogany, walnut, or marble at no additional charge. American walnut was reported to be the most popular finish.

Rounding out the package, a number of other optional accessories were available, including walnut cabinets. Russ Mason's Phantom, shown on page 16 of the June 2008 issue of A.R.C., is one such package of accessories. That particular model was called the No. 700 Console Complete and included the Phantom, a BC power supply, an A supply, a set of tubes, a dynamic speaker mounted in the console, and the console itself. See Figure 5 for both Russ's set and the set as advertised in the circular.

Number of Tubes

Nine radio tubes, of which four 222 shielded grid are the radio frequency amplifiers, one 200A is the detector and two Hi-Mu lead to the two 210 or two 250 push-pull audio amplifiers.

Wave Length Range

Type "A" radio frequency transformers are supplied with the set which has a wave length range from 200 to 560 meters. Additional plug-in Leutz made transformers can be supplied, extra, for the short and long waves, used all over the world.

Single Control

Each of the radio frequency units as well as the detector has a separate tuning control. These five tuning drums may be linked up quickly to operate the Receiver as a one control set, if desired.

Venier Control

Venier condensers under the tuning drums are supplied for extra fine tuning on stations over 1,500 miles from the Receiver.

Shielding

The Transoceanic Phantom Shielded Grid tubes are 100 per cent. shielded. Shielding is provided in the powerful radio frequency amplifiers, the detector, audio amplifier and the entire receiver is shielded as a unit.

Radio Frequency Amplifiers

Four of the new 222 special radio frequency amplifying tubes are used. In this Receiver, the tubes give a minimum amplification of 30 per stage as compared with a maximum of 10 with the old type 201A tube. The total theoretical amplification with four 222 stages in this new Leutz set, now is, 810,000 as compared with 10,000 before.

Detector Stage

This new Leutz Transoceanic Phantom uses the new 200A super-sensitive detector which has a separate tuning dial.

Audio Unit

This standard audio unit has four stages, two Hi-Mu and two stages of push-pull amplification. Either the 210 or the new 250 power amplifiers may be used. By using these two power tubes in push-pull, the total undistorted output available for the loud speaker is at least five to seven times greater than with one single power tube. (For maximum results, a dynamic speaker should be used).

Meter

A unit Weston two scale volt meter, which in connection with a nine point meter switch, reads

all the "A," "B" and "C" voltages, is a built-in part of the Receiver.

Musical Reproduction

The audio amplifier in the new Transoceanic Phantom is as near perfect as it is possible to make an electrical device. All the low notes are reproduced faithfully and the notes which are ordinarily blocked in a regular amplifier, are marvelously retained in this new Leutz achievement.

Testing

Each Leutz Receiver receives a 2,500 to 3,000 mile air test before being shipped. For from five to seven days prior to the shipment of these new Leutz Receivers, expert engineers are constantly at work testing electrically and mechanically as well as using the Receiver for actual broadcast reception.

Simplicity

This new Transoceanic Phantom with shielded grid tubes and push-pull amplification is as simple to operate as any ordinary receiver when it is used with one control. Local stations march in endless parade through the loud speaker, with a twist of the wrist, and the distant stations roar in with a volume of local when the set is properly tuned. Complete instructions are sent with each Receiver, including a calibration sheet showing exactly where to find ten or more of the most popular broadcasters, so that when the Receiver comes to you, you will be ready at once to operate it.

Finish

The Transoceanic illustrated is finished in Satin Aluminum, lacquered. We can also finish the Phantom (and B/C Supply to match) in Imitation Mahogany, Walnut, or Marble. American Walnut is the most popular special finish. These finishes are available at no extra charge. Any other special metal finish can be supplied at a nominal extra charge.

All Electric Operation

While this set will operate on batteries, it is recommended that the purchaser who wishes to get the full benefit of the push-pull audio unit use a Leutz B/C current supply. This current supply delivers 450 volts, and also supplies the other "B" and "C" voltages necessary for the Receiver. This is the most powerful full-wave "B" and "C" current supply ever made for a broadcast receiver. For the "A" supply, either 6 volt storage battery and charger or a Leutz "A" Current Supply can be used. The Leutz "A" Supply gives 3 ampere at 6 volts with absolutely no hum. Full description of both the "A" and B/C current supply units appear on this page.

For the ultimate, the No. 800 Console Complete, shown in Figure 6, was also available. It included all of the No. 700 electronic components, plus a larger, much more ornate cabinet with a bench seat. In addition, the No. 800 could be ordered with an AC-operated record player mounted in the cabinet for an additional charge.

For a less expensive setup, the No. 500 dynamic speaker cabinet highboy accessory provided an enclosure for the user to mount a dynamic speaker and to have a tabletop to hold the Phantom. The No. 500 was also available in package form with all of the standard electronics, including a dynamic speaker.

Daniel Schoo, a frequent subscriber to A.R.C., is an electronics design engineer with a lifetime interest in antique technology, especially radio and television equipment. In addition to his collection of 1930s and 1940s radios and video cassette recorders, he has a large collection of vintage vacuum tubes, neon lamps, and tube data books.

THE ADVERTISING CIRCULAR

Intended for dealers, this Leutz advertising circular includes both list and wholesale prices. Factory orders were accepted on a cash basis with full payment expected up front. Alternatively, they would accept a 25 percent deposit with the balance to be paid by cash on delivery. Each Phantom was guaranteed to be free of electrical or mechanical defects for one year.

This advertising circular illustrates the high-end marketing of the Leutz Phantom and accessories. Very impressive prices and typical glowing descriptions showcase the Phantom. One wonders how long the pricey Phantom lasted after the stock market crash of 1929 — especially in light of the rapid advances in radio design and the introduction of compact low-priced superheterodyne sets of the early 1930s. These sets challenged the old TRF sets quite well in performance and devastated them in ease of operation.


WESTINGHOUSE MODEL RC – This 3-tube receiver was manufactured in 1921 by Westinghouse Electric Manufacturing Co. of East Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. The Model RC is a combination of the Type RA short-wave tuner and the Type DA detector/amplifier in one cabinet. The earlier 2-cabinet model was called the Type RA-DA. (Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NB)



ATWATER KENT MODEL 92 – This beautifully styled cathedral was manufactured by Atwater Kent in 1931. It has distinctive "rope-twist" trim on the front. An 8-tube Superheterodyne, it tunes the broadcast band only. (Dave Crocker – Mashpee, MA)



ZENITH ROYAL MODEL 810 – The 9-transistor AM/FM Model 810, ca 1966, uses a broadband RF amp and three IF stages in FM. It has lots of audio negative feedback and a transformerless output stage driving a 45-ohm speaker. With its chrome-plated, die-cast chassis, the Cracker Jack box-sized radio weighs over a pound and a half, including batteries. It is regularly taken on beach vacations in our carry-on bag, and on our last trip, it received considerable scrutiny when going through the airport X-ray. An older inspector commented, "Boy I haven't seen one of these in a long time!" (Chris Jones – Fairport, NY)



PHILCO MODEL 40-120 – Manufactured in 1940 by the Philco Corporation of Philadelphia, the Model 40-120 has a wooden, painted ivory cabinet. It uses one each of the following tube types: 7C7, 7A8, 7B7, 7C6, 35A5, and 35Z3. It tunes the broadcast and the police bands. (Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NB)

HORN SPEAKER REVIEW

The Town Crier Horn Speaker

BY DAVE CROCKER

A salespitch doesn't always live up to expectations, as we learn from the following story about an unusual speaker. (Editor)




Figure 1. The Town Crier horn speaker.

The "Town Crier" horn speaker, shown in Figure 1, was manufactured by the Gale Radio Laboratories of Chicago, Illinois. It is a most unusual shape for a radio speaker of 1925. Billed as "Radio's Most Beautiful Speaker," it came in either a dull golden or dull green polychrome color. The finish can be best described as "goose-bumps" all over. The front label is shown in Figure 2.




Figure 3. The SAAL driver, made of pot metal, attaches to the bottom of the horn structure.

Figure 3 shows the SAAL driver, which is made of pot metal, and attaches to the horn on the bottom of the structure. From there the sound coils around and exits at the rear of the concave front. See the cut-away view in Figure 4.

This unique piece of "sculpture" is 17¼ inches tall and weighs in at a whopping eight pounds! What makes it so heavy is the construction of heavy plaster and (whatever)

molded into a single form, which might be described as a "cave." It almost feels as if it was molded from pure cement! There is no grille cloth in front, and you can put your finger down the horn opening at the inside front.

In 1925, the Town Crier speaker sold for \$17.50 (\$18.50 west of the Rockies). Gale

Radio Labs said that it had, "...the voice that thrills."

Evidently sales didn't reach Gale's expect-




Figure 5. The Town Crier was later offered by a wholesaler as "The Echo."

tations because later that year the same identical speaker was advertised by a wholesaler as the "Echo," shown in Figure 5. It appeared in a radio catalog with no manufacturer's identification, except number 563R 758. The price was reduced to only \$7.95 (with shipping only 22 cents), and the one color choice was a dull black.

Even though many collectors consider this speaker rather ugly and think the homeowners of the period must not have liked to see it in their living rooms, Figure 6 shows an advertisement claiming "The town Crier — Radio's Most Beautiful Speaker." And another dealer described it as: "It is very attractively shaped and won't look out of place in the finest homes." That prediction was never to be.

Kutztown Fall Antique Radio Show Kutztown, Pennsylvania — September 19-20, 2008

Renninger's Antiques and Farmers Market and the Delaware Valley Historic Radio Club (DVHRC) held the fall 2008 edition of the Kutztown Radio Show in Kutztown, Pennsylvania, on September 19 and 20, 2008.


the show, I was able to find all the missing parts. I also bought a sawed-off Zenith console for parts.

John Wiley Auction Service 19th Annual Antique Radio Auction Olney, Illinois — October 26, 2008



The traditional fall auction of antique radios and related equipment continued in east central Illinois, but it did so this year under the auspices of a new auctioneer — John Wiley of Olney, Illinois. However, the auction was actually held some 12 miles south of Olney, near the town of Parkersburg, on Illinois Route 130. The venue is a large building of recent construction, simply called “Wiley’s Place.”

The ladies and gentlemen who regularly attended Eric’s Auction in the past apparently had no trouble finding the new location, as the auction drew its usual crowd.

Auction organizer Wayne Martin of Perryville, Missouri, made an excellent choice in selecting John Wiley to replace Eric Bruner, who had to bow out after 18 years of conducting this annual auction. John did a great job of going through the various lots in rapid-fire succession.

The level of quality was a bit down from previ-

ous years, perhaps as a reflection of the current economy. Highlights of the auction were an RCA Model 140 tombstone which sold for \$200; a Zenith 6V27 that had been converted to operate on AC for \$135; and another Zenith tombstone, Model 6S229 with excellent photofinish, at \$125.

Nearly 500 lots were consigned to this year’s sale, and a sampling of the items are listed on the following page. As in previous years, no model numbers were called out during the sale, making it impossible to list every item accurately. 
